Airport Terminal Project Breaking Ground

At the April 11th Annual Meeting, Club Chairman **Charlie Johnston** announced the Club would break ground on the construction of a new Airport terminal in May. The new Terminal will greatly enhance safety and visibility, as well as the experience for Members, pilots and Associates. As you may recall, when the runway was renovated after Hurricane Irma in 2017 using Member donations, a commitment was made to use the remaining funds towards a future Airport terminal building.

As of this writing, the construction fencing has

been installed and a trailer has arrived to serve as our temporary facility. The fully-staffed trailer will serve as the terminal, opening at the end of next week and offering the same support and services currently in place. Entry to the Airport will be through the south gate (Medical Center side). Fuel service will be fully operational and we do not anticipate any restrictions or closures throughout the 9-month project timeframe.

As the Airport has become a destination for all Members and their families with special events like Vintage Weekend and Aviation Day, we know this new facility will further everyone's enjoyment of this special Club amenity.

When ORC Chairman **Charlie Johnston** announced the 2024 Spirit of Ocean Reef winner, he stated that “no recipient has been more deserving” than **Michael Berman**. An Equity Member since 1994, Berman embraced involvement in Reef community immediately and wholeheartedly and has never looked back. Michael, and wife **Angie**, first spent time here as part of an auto “Dealer

20” group (think YPO for car dealers) and Berman noted that he found The Reef and its Members motivational and inspirational from the start. “I cannot imagine another place on earth with the mass of intelligence, talent and humble wealth as there is in our membership.” He found mentors in **Tom Davidson** and **Alan Goldstein** and witnessed their endless commitment to the Club and its Members. He also came across a book

“What Happy People Know,” by psychologist Dan Baker, and adopted its mantra for himself: “You can never be truly happy unless you commit to serving and helping others.” He says Davidson and Goldstein showed him how to “connect the dots” of his passion for service with involvement at ORC.

The Spirit of Ocean Reef Award recognizes an “individual member or group that has had significant positive impact on our unique way of life that cannot be measured by financial or governance contributions.” Berman received it on behalf of the ORC membership from Chairman Johnston at the April Town Hall meeting for his “unwavering dedication to the philanthropy, health and well-being of this community.” In three decades of membership, Berman has proven himself to be a dedicated and a proactive force here at The Reef.

Beginning with working on the committee and eventually chairing the Member-Guest Golf Tournament, Berman also

served on the Membership and Nominating Committees and currently serves on the Marketing Committee. He is the Perpetual Chairman of All Charities, which is the fundraising arm of the Ocean Reef Community Foundation, and he serves as the Community Foundation’s Vice-Chairman. He is past Vice-Chairman and immediate past Chairman of the Medical Center Board, and is currently Chairman of the Medical Center Foundation. Additionally, he serves on the Ocean Reef Baptist Hospital Advisory Board, the Homestead Hospital Board and the Baptist Hospital Foundation Executive Board. Among his numerous contributions to these organizations, Berman had the vision to change All Charities from a single day event to a gala weekend, which has raised well over \$60 million for Ocean Reef entities and the upper keys community. At the Medical Center, he innovated patient options with the establishment of MedFit and expanded private medical services, to improve the lives of the ORC membership.

A native of Chicago, Illinois, where he built a family automotive business, Berman has two sons and four granddaughters. His sons now run day-to-day operations at the dealerships so his community service “keeps me out of their hair!” Reflecting on receiving the Spirit of Ocean Reef award, he acknowledged, “I am humbled and honored (and embarrassed) to receive an award for doing something that bring me so much joy.” Thanks, Michael, for the “happy” way you have benefitted all of Ocean Reef!

A Toast to Tradition

Recognizing Patron Members

This past Tuesday, the Board of Directors offered a toast of gratitude to the Club's Patron Members. This new tradition was created last year to recognize an integral piece of Ocean Reef Club's history – Patron Membership. In 1993, when the Acquisition Committee needed to raise \$58 million to purchase the Club, the idea of Patron Membership was born. At the time, there were two tiers of Equity Membership offered, with Patron Members paying a significantly larger sum and receiving Club benefits. It is certain, Ocean Reef Club would not be what it is today had it not been for the support of this group of longtime Members.



Embracing the Presence of American Crocodiles

As the vibrant ecosystem of southern Florida thrives, it's not uncommon to encounter the remarkable American Crocodile in our waterways, golf courses, and occasionally even within the confines of our yards.

This is a testament to the native status of these creatures as their home, the Everglades, borders our own of Ocean Reef, providing a distinctive charm to our surroundings. However, with this unique charm comes the responsibility of understanding and coexisting with these shy reptiles.

"Crocodiles are a huge conservation success

story, they've come back in big numbers," said Zoo Miami's Ron Magill during a presentation at Ocean Reef earlier this year.

Protected under the Endangered Species Act, American Crocodiles are known for their elusive nature, typically avoiding direct interaction with humans. Despite their somewhat reclusive behavior, the Florida Fish and Wildlife

Conservation Commission emphasizes the importance of maintaining a safe distance to ensure both human safety and the well-being of these remarkable creatures.

"If you hit a golf ball by a crocodile, drop a new ball. They're not going to come after you, but don't tempt fate," said Magill. "I can tell you that crocodiles will avoid you whenever possible. The problem is when people start feeding them. We don't want them to lose their natural fear of humans."

American Crocodiles, unlike their more aggressive counterparts, are reliant on external heat sources for body temperature regulation. It's not uncommon to spot them basking in the warm sun on golf courses or in yards, showcasing their need for specific environmental conditions. While these reptiles may enter the water with a graceful quietness, a

startled crocodile might make a splash as a defensive measure against potential predators.

To foster a harmonious coexistence, members are encouraged to adopt preventive measures. Keeping a minimum of a 10-foot distance from the water's edge, leashing dogs, and refraining from swimming in areas with reported crocodile sightings are pivotal steps to minimize the risk of incidents.

The Ocean Reef Community Association (ORCA) actively collaborates with the Crocodile Response Program, seeking solutions for safe cohabitation. Among the considerations is the temporary relocation of crocodiles to ensure the safety of both members and the reptiles.

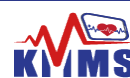

Conservation Association Answers the Call

The Ocean Reef Conservation Association is now in its 16th year of supporting conservation and education in the Florida Keys. The generosity of the Ocean Reef community through the All-Charities Auction has enabled the organization to provide \$225,000 in scholarships and over \$1.6 million in grants over the last five years. One hundred percent of the funds are used to support students from Keys High Schools and organizations off The Reef.

Recent grants have included: support for the History and Discovery Center in Islamorada, the Wild Bird Center in Tavernier, John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park, the History of Diving Museum, Mote Marine Coral Nursery, Bonefish and Tarpon Trust, Ocean Studies Charter School, The Everglades Foundation, Fish and Wildlife Foundation of Florida, National Parks Conservation Association, Audubon Florida, Everglades Outpost Wildlife Rescue, Florida Keys Marine Sanctuary, Biscayne and Everglades

National Parks, Crocodile Lake National Wildlife Refuge and many more.

We were recently contacted by the Lower Keys Guides Association regarding an urgent need for help. An as yet unidentified source is affecting fish, primarily in the lower keys. The affected fish are swimming erratically and spinning around. There have been 49 sightings of sick sawfish with 16 deaths confirmed. Affected species include tarpon, snook, permit, grouper, snapper and baitfish. The Board of the Conservation Association quickly approved the request for funding. It is being used to send biologists out with guides to the affected areas for sampling and research. We had the funding and could react quickly to a very serious problem.

The Conservation Association has worked to develop strong relationships with the numerous State and Federal Parks, preserves and sanctuaries that surround Ocean Reef. We have a stake in working to preserve and protect these environmentally sensitive areas.

The continued support of the Ocean Reef community has enabled the Conservation Association to fulfill its mission of preserving and improving the environment and offering scholarships in the areas of marine science and environmental studies. Thank you for helping preserve this "Unique Way of Life".

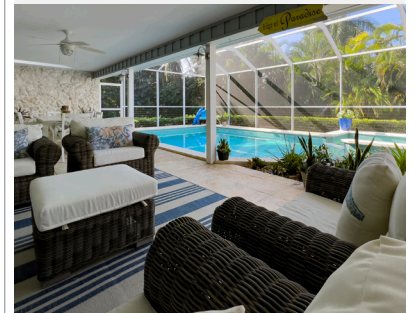

In Step with The Happy Hoofers

The requirements of Happy Hoofers membership are straightforward: Be inclusive, handle touchy subjects gingerly, and have a well-fitting pair of sneakers.

Meet The Happy Hoofers, a sort of informal Club within the Club, made up of a couple of dozen-plus Reefers, who get together daily for walks, followed by coffee and chit-chat at Town Hall, and Sunday dinners at The Burgee Bar.

Mary Zwirn, an ORC member since 1995, started walking with a friend 20 years ago around the Hammock Course. With each passing season, Mary invited new people to join them. They've grown to a revolving band of nearly 30 friends, whose three-mile course, strategically planned with bathrooms in mind, around The Fishing Village and Villa Cay neighborhood, begins at 8:30 a.m. An hour later they end up at Town Hall, where more Hoofers make their way over for coffee, with some lingering until 11.

"We are a family," said Mary, who sends out daily texts to the bunch detailing the day's optional plans. "We all have different political opinions and world views, but we do not fight. We talk about everything from events going on at The Reef to what we thought of last night's dinner. If someone has a problem, they can call one of us. It's a very caring group."

For **Phyllis Gorson**, joining the Hoofers has given her a renewed sense of purpose. When her husband, Murray, died suddenly in January 2020 at Ocean Reef, she went back to Philadelphia. A couple of months later with the onset of Covid, she and her family, who typically

visited ORC a couple times a year, returned to The Reef. It turned out to be a blessing in disguise for Phyllis.

"The Hoofers got me out of bed every day, they gave me a feeling of belonging," said Phyllis, who now calls The Reef her home most of the year. "I have family, but this gave me a sense of community. It introduced me to a whole group of people I never knew before."

Dale Schuble, who started hanging with the Hoofers 17 years ago when her husband, Joe, died echoed Phyllis' sentiments.

"By talking to others who had similar experiences, it gave me a lot of insight," said Dale, an ORC member since 1985. "I learned how to deal with life as a single."

When something happens to one Hoofers, it happens to them all. If a Hoofers takes a fall (and it's occurred more than once), the others go into rescue mode, driving each other to a hospital or doctor's appointment, taking care of another's pet, or stopping by with groceries, whatever it takes. It doesn't hurt that two of the Hoofers are physicians. Drs. **Jon** and **Lori Cilley** support their friends in need with advice and have been known to make house calls.

On average, eight people turn out for the daily walks, double or triple that for the coffee and convo and usually the weekly dinners get the largest turnouts. Made up of mostly Equity members, the door to friendships is always open even for those dropping in for a couple of days or months during the season, or are year-rounders. There are

no real rules- the Hoofers like to keep things fun and flexible, said **Jessica Olefson**, an active participant whose been an ORC member since 1976.

When the group decided to give themselves a name, it came down to a vote. **Joanne Wills** suggested The Happy Hoofers. It beat out the other nominee, The Walkie Talkies. The name Hoofers is slang term for tap dancers, but while nobody's shoes have taps, they are all in step with their view of the importance of social interaction.

Martie Russel credits The Hoofers with playing a role in extending her mother's life. Nancy Strayer died in November- two months short of her 100th birthday. Nancy loved playing bridge, Martie said, and when it became too hard for her to get to the Card Room, some of the Hoofers brought bridge tables over to her house.

"My mother loved The Hoofers," said Martie, tearing up thinking about birthday parties and pot luck dinners they spent together with the group. "We had a celebration of life for her

in January, and so many of The Hoofers were there. That meant everything."

Equal parts social, companionship, and emotional support, the Hoofers' unbreakable bond to keep each other motivated always find ways to circumvent obstacles. During Covid restrictions, they simply pivoted to a Plan B, meeting in their golf carts.

"We'd park around in a circle and talk," said Jessica. "We'd celebrate anything with wine and cheese."

The Hoofers applaud Mary for her ongoing organizing efforts in keeping everyone in the loop. But she admits keeping socially active has been helpful to her, too.

"You can bring any problem you might have to the group and we will try and solve it by the end of the walk," she said. When her husband, **Mel**, also a Hoofers, was no longer able to join in on the walks, she said still having friends to depend on, whether it was for exercise or a good laugh, makes her days always start on the right foot.

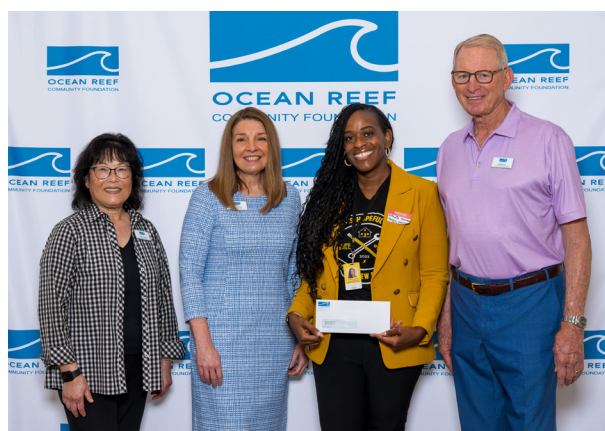

A Passover Lament

The tragic assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King took place in Memphis on April 4, 1968. On that day, our small music group was touring in the Netherlands. The response of the Dutch young people was deep, palpable. At each performance in the days immediately following, students would request that we sing *We Shall Overcome*. It was their way of recognizing the significance of Dr. King's leadership in the civil rights movement. It was their way of expressing grief over the hate behind the bullet that killed him.

Tragic Irony

Today is Passover, some fifty-six years after Dr. King's assassination. On this Passover morning, news shows featured live feed of anti-Israel protests on the campuses of Columbia University in New York City, and Yale University, some seventy-five miles away in New Haven, Connecticut. The protesters were singing *We Shall Overcome*.

The tragic irony is this. During the civil rights movement, the Jewish community was at the forefront of voices calling the nation to overcome the blight of racial injustice that is the sad legacy of slavery in the United States. This morning, those singing *We Shall Overcome* were doing so in support of a movement whose stated goal is the annihilation of the state of Israel, the rightful homeland of the Jewish people.

Dangerously Naïve

If you look carefully, you will see protestors with signs that read, "From the river to the sea,

Palestine shall be free!" Some may naively think of these protests as a legitimate call for justice for the Palestinian people. Sometimes naïveté can be harmless, but not in this case.

The words on the signs come from a speech given in 2012, by the former head of Hamas, Khaled Mashaal. He declared, "Palestine is ours from the river to the sea and from the south to the north. There will be no concession of any inch of the land... There is no legitimacy for Israel... Israel has no right to be in Jerusalem."

Never Again or Ever Again

On this Passover, there are no yellow stars on the clothing of those Jewish students and professors being hounded and threatened on the campus of Columbia and other schools. Yet these actions reflect an alarming increase in both the number and growing intensity of expressions of anti-Semitism today, in our nation and around the world. Given what is happening, is it unreasonable to think we could be witnessing the resurfacing of the dystopian history of the 1930's in Europe?

Empty Chairs

Tonight at Congregation Ocean Reef's Passover Seder, there was an empty chair at our table. My first thought was mundane – someone had messed up the seating plan. But what I first thought mundane turned out to be intentional and deeply moving. There was an empty chair at each of the tables. These empty chairs were a reminder of the Jewish hostages who remain captive following Hamas' brutal attacks around Gaza on October 7th. The latest estimate is that one hundred thirty are still missing, hopefully alive. No one can be certain.

Warnings

In an essay published in the *Wall Street Journal* a decade ago, Lord Jonathan Saks, the chief rabbi of the United Hebrew Congregations of the

British Empire, gave a prescient warning. Quoting a British Tory MP, Lord Saks wrote, "Historically, anti-Semitism has been the early warning signal of a society in danger."

In the essay, he reminded us that anti-Semitism is "only obliquely about Jews. They were its victims but not its cause. The politics of hate that begins with Jews never ends with Jews. It wasn't Jews alone who suffered under Hitler and Stalin. It is hardly Jews alone who are suffering today under their successors, the radical Islamists of Hamas, Hezbollah, al Qaeda, Boko Haram, Islamic State, and their fellow travelers. The assault on Israel and Jews world-wide is part of a larger pattern that includes attacks on Christians and other minority faiths in the Middle East, sub-Saharan Africa, and parts of Asia – a religious equivalent of ethnic cleansing."

He concluded the essay with these sobering words that hopefully, every thoughtful person will take to heart. "Anti-Semitism has always been, historically, the inability to make space for differences among people, which is the essential foundation of a free society. That is why the politics of hate now assaults Christians, Bahai, Yazidis, and many others, including Muslims on the wrong side of the Sunni/Shia divide, as well as Jews. To fight it, we must stand together, people of all faiths and none. The future of freedom is at stake, and it will be the defining battle of the 21st century."

A Final Question

In light of the above, the final question is this. "Who will overcome?" People of deep faith are not the source of hatred. It was Dr. King's faith that explains his life. It was Rabbi Saks faith that fueled his convictions. Will good people once again remain silent? History teaches us what happens when they do. Something to think about.

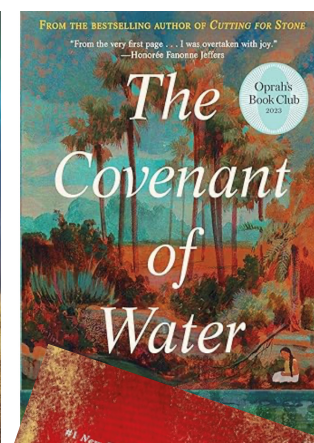
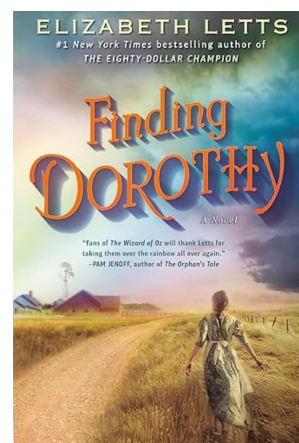
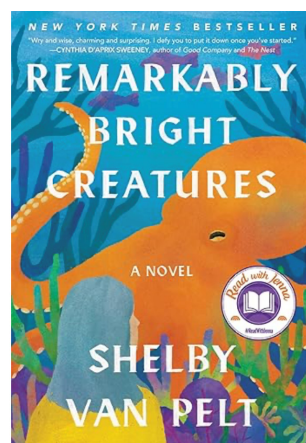
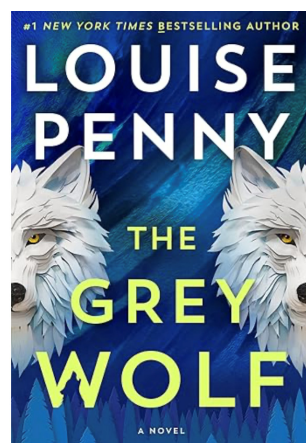
Plan Ahead for the 2024-2025 Book Club

I will forewarn everyone that best seller "The Covenant of Water" is a big read so you may want to get a head start this summer.

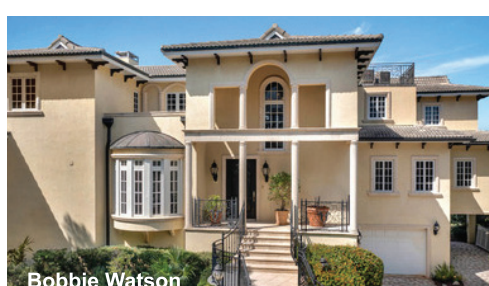

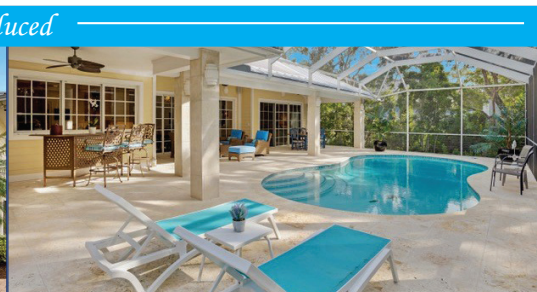

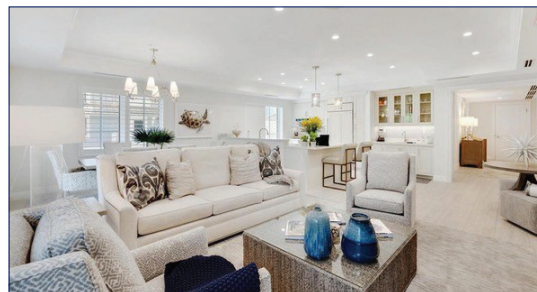

I first learned about golf legend Francis Ouimet (he won the US Open in 1913 at age 20) in my early days visiting Ocean Reef with my husband, **Mike**. Mike loved playing at Card Sound with his dad where he met some great golfers, many 40+ years his senior. One particular story we treasure involved a senior Card Sound member, **Bob Fisher**, who forgot to set the brake on his golf cart and it ended up at the bottom of a water hazard. Both his and his wife's clubs were "hazards" of that event. Fisher said he didn't care about the cart or his wife's clubs (she was not happy), but in his bag was a putter given to him by Ouimet. A crane and divers were engaged and the cart, clubs and Fisher's beloved putter were eventually recovered from the deep. I was reminded of this story when I learned that my good friend's

dad, David Sullivan, was a good friend and golf associate of Ouimet's in Massachusetts.

Sullivan's daughter, **Donna Archibald**, is the 2024 recipient

of the LGA Founder's Award, presented to an LGA member who exemplifies what the LGA is all about. In Donna's case, her active participation since coming to Ocean Reef, her service as LGA President from 2020-2022, her welcoming spirit and warm smile were all part of her nomination and selection for the award. Her passion and respect for golf were instilled by her father at a young age when he taught "Dewey" (his nickname for Donna) to play and love the game. Sullivan competed with the likes of Palmer and Casper in the 1950s won the 1955 New England Amateur Championship, three Massachusetts Amateur

Championships and played with Ouimet at the legendary Charles River Golf Club in Newton Centre, MA, becoming club champion there numerous times. Sullivan attended Notre Dame on a golf scholarship for two years, served in WW2 and finished his college degree at the University of Miami, returning to New England to marry and raise his family. Donna treasures all the golf memories of her youth and the gift her dad lovingly gave her in teaching her the game of golf. Sullivan was also a key player in establishing the Francis Ouimet College Scholarship fund for need-based men and women who have worked at Massachusetts golf courses.

Paul Archibald is the 2024 Burgee Cup Winner for Ocean Reef's MGA. The Burgee Cup rewards players who, according to Director of Golf Mike Leone, "have consistently played great golf all season, and then play their best golf when it matters most in an intense two-day stroke play competition." In this year's field of the top 21 MGA qualifying golfers, Archibald put together one of only three net under-par rounds and was in first place after day one. He carded a net 73 the next day on the Hammock achieving the only cumulative under-par round of the tournament.

Paul and Donna share a mutual affection for golf and each other, celebrating 44 years of marriage next month. You can usually find Paul on the practice green at the Hammock #1 tee, and Donna rarely passes on a game when there is a chance to play.

We all cherish traditions and legacies from our families, but Donna and Paul share one of the finest in the exceptional golfing talent and brilliant example of Donna's dad.

Jude was much

in demand over the week that he was here, working with a wide range of pets from puppies to older dogs, consulting and encouraging.

2024 also saw a rise in activity at the shooting range, in both shotguns and handguns, in part because of the improved facilities and the excellent staffing, including instructor Pablo Montealegre. There was a significant increase in shooting use this season, with over 350 shooters and over a thousand rounds, and new trap machines are arriving just in time to upgrade older equipment, enabling the 5-stand to support the increased loads and throw more diverse and faster targets. Handgun practice was the biggest growth area. The range will close for the season on **April 27**.

There has also been a new level of social activity at the range — a "Reveal" party used the facility to great advantage for a memorable afternoon. The shooters from Rod and Gun also went on a road trip together to visit the Markham Park range.

Also this past season, **Tom Davidson, Jr** passed the Chairmanship of the Rod and Gun Club on to **Carmen Sferrazza**. Tom will stay on as Special Events Chair, while the Shooting Range co-managers will be **Ignacio Borbolla** and **Bud Copeland**. **Ken Reda** remains in charge of the Fishing Program.

COAST GUARD AUXILIARY BOATING SAFETY

Channeling Courtesy

At Ocean Reef, the Main Channel (Dispatch Creek) and the Owners' Channel provide safe, marked access and egress for marina slips and many properties on the Atlantic seafront.

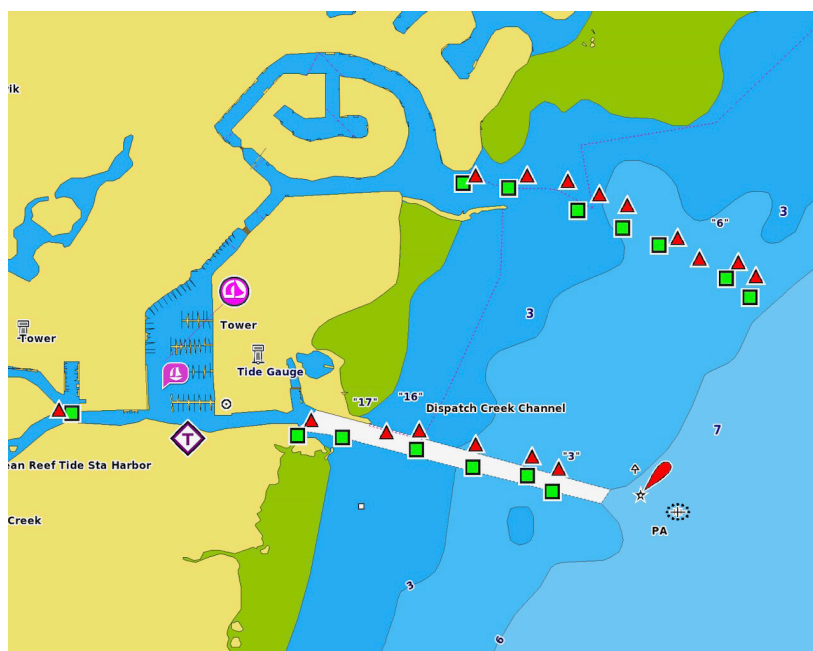
These channels were built many years ago when a 40' sport fishing boat was a "Big Boat." This is no longer the case, and two large vessels will not fit side by side in the narrows between the green and red daymarks.

Multiple signs, posted both inward and outward, dictate that minimum speed is required for your safety and mine. Wakes from any size power boat can be dangerous for paddleboarders and kayakers within the nearby shallows, and for small vessels in the channel.

Please slow down and be courteous. Boaters should monitor VHF 16. Larger vessels should make a Security call declaring their intent to proceed through the channel. If a larger vessel is transiting the channel, wait until that boat is clear before proceeding. The seabed outside the marked channel is extremely shallow and unforgiving.

Coast Guard Rule 9 (Narrow Channels-excerpt) must be followed:

- Vessels shall keep to the

outer limit of the channel on their starboard side.

- A vessel 20 meters or less in length or a sailing vessel shall not impede the passage of a vessel that can only navigate

within a narrow channel.

Serve & Volley Strategy for Doubles Matches

The serve is a very important shot for both singles and doubles matches and is usually not practiced enough. With the serve being one of the shots people tend to avoid the most, it limits players from being able to compete in small tournaments or social tournament events.

I recommend practicing at least once a week with a coach, friend or alone with a basket of balls. If you spend at least one practice a week on just serves -

practicing technique, accuracy and timing - your game will be improved rapidly.

You can start with different types of serves and pace. After you are comfortable with serves being consistent, you can start practicing accuracy, which later can be developed for a strategy in your doubles games.

Serve & Volley Strategy

You can start developing your serve and volley strategy after you become accurate in your first serves. This can be used as a weapon in different situations, allowing you to serve wide to the opponent's weak side, for instance, and charge to the net expecting a weak return, therefore giving yourself an advantage to put balls away at the net.

Serving and volleying is a great shot strategy, especially when we are more offensive in doubles. It gives players the opportunity to open the court right away, putting yourself and your opponent in a winning position.

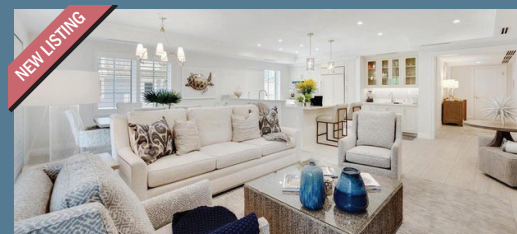

SWING TIP

Find Your Best Balance

Before I get into my final tip for the end of the season, I wanted to share that this has been the most memorable season of all, being in this incredible position as Director of Instruction in the amazing Ocean Reef Club with you all! It was the most wonderful winter and it went by in a flash!

Now, here's a simple tip that I find can help ball striking immediately.

Hold your balance. Hold the pose. Watch the ball. Enjoy the shot.

I find that if I'm in balance while I'm swinging, I can hold my balance after I've hit quite easily. Finding your best balance all starts at setup and with your feet. Feet do so much in the golf swing but balance is the most important.

Here's something fun to try on the range:

Start with 5 continuous swings all the way through and all the way back without stopping in between. Let your feet move and lift or do what feels comfortable. After the 5 swings, look down and see what position your feet have moved to. This usually puts you how your feet should be at setup! For example, when I do this my left toes point out and my stance has widened.

How wide should your stance be?

Take a small jump and see where you land. Your body wants to land in its best balance. This can help you decide how wide your stance needs to be.

Proper Golf Posture

It's all about the posture. Good posture allows you to make solid contact by helping stay in balance and hit the ground.

Bow forward from the waist

so your arms are hanging below your shoulders.

Take out the tension. Step your feet.

The next time you watch golf on tv, watch what they do with their feet. Once they are set up, they step their feet continuously until they feel balanced and comfortable. Try including this in your routine before you hit.

Getting Ready for the Course

Practice taking balanced practice swings. This sounds simple but is extremely effective.

1. Simply take practice swings on the range and hold your pose for as long as you can.
2. Focus on bowing forward from the waist.
3. Step your feet to get comfortable.
4. Take a practice swing and hit the ground.
5. Hold your pose after you swing.

BRIDGE TIP

Opening Preempts

Preempts are weak bids that are designed to a) interfere with the opponent's bidding and b) describes your hand to partner in one bid. Once a preempt bid is made, unless forced, only the partner may continue bidding for his side.

Requirements

1. 0 to 10 HCPs (If you have more than 10 HCPs, consider opening at the 1-level).
2. At least a 6-card or longer suit.
3. No 4-card outside major.

Now count your tricks:

Count the number of winners you should receive from the honors in your hand and the number of cards over 3 in any suit.

Examples:

Open 1♠

Vulnerability ("Rule of 2, 3 and 4")

If your side is vulnerable and the opponents are not, then you can open the preempt missing 2 tricks.

Open at the 3-level if you have 7 tricks. Open at the 4-level if you have 8 tricks.

If both sides have equal vulnerability, then you can open the preempt missing 3 tricks.

Open at the 3-level if you have 6 tricks. Open at the 4-level if you have 7 tricks.

If your side is not vulnerable and the opponents are, then you can open the preempt missing 4 tricks.

Open at the 3-level if you have 5 tricks. Open at the 4-level if you have 6 tricks.

Responses

Since the preempt bid shows a weak hand, the responder will usually pass. But if the responder has a better than an opening hand and a strong 5-card suit, he can bid at the 3-level. This bid is forcing! The opener will either raise the partner's suit if he has support or repeat the preempt.

Examples:

East	West	North	East	South

With this hand, East responds with his spade suit. If West has 3 spades, then he would rebid 4♠ otherwise he would repeat clubs, 4♣

East	West	North	East	South
♠AQ974	3♣	Pass	3♠	
♥AQ965				
♦4				
♣32				

Clearly East wants to be in a major, instead of diamonds. He bids 3♠ then will bid 4♥ to give his partner a choice.

But be careful! Always check the vulnerability. If partner opened on favorable vulnerability, then he will probably opened light. Have more than an opener if you decide to respond.

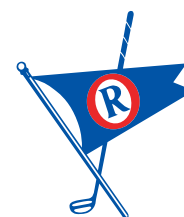




