Gotta Question?

What is ORCAT's stance on feeding the cats and/or letting them into our homes?

We understand it can be tempting, so we asked ORCAT for the answer! Here is what they

ORCA By-laws state that only ORCAT is permitted to feed the working cats. Homeowners and Associates should not feed cats outside of our designated feeding stations or bring them into their homes.

ORCAT, Ocean Reef's Trap-Neuter-Release program, was created in 1995 to humanely manage our community's outdoor cat population. We maintain 40 strategically-placed feeding stations throughout Ocean Reef. Each day, including holidays and weekends, an ORCAT employee visits these stations to provide food, water and monitor the health of our working cats. These cats are spayed or neutered, vaccinated, and microchipped. Working cats offer a natural and effective alternative to pesticides and baits used for vermin control that could be harmful to the pets of Ocean Reef.

Feeding cats outside of these designated areas can cause them to stray from their established



territories. This makes it difficult for us to track their well-being and ensure their safety.

If a cat shows up at your home unexpectedly, please contact an ORCAT staff member at the Gravvik Animal Center. We will check to see if the cat is part of our program, confirm its health and sterilization status, and determine if it is one of our working cats or a new cat that needs our attention.

We also ask that you avoid inviting outdoor cats into your home as it hinders our ability to monitor population numbers, as well as the health, vaccination and sterilization status of outdoor cats living at Ocean Reef.

If you are interested in adopting a cat, we would love to introduce you to one of the many friendly, adoptable ORCATs living at the Grayvik Animal Center, Home of ORCAT. Call 305-367-4701.

ORCA NEWS

How Businesses Become Chamber Members at Ocean Reef

Have you ever wondered what it takes for a company to become an Ocean Reef Chamber of Commerce (ORCC) member? Chamber membership is not automatic — it's earned through a rigorous process that ensures every business reflects the high standards and values of our unique community.

Ocean Reef Chamber members are not just service providers — they're often invited into homes, businesses, and sensitive areas. To protect the integrity and safety of our community, all applicants must meet rigorous standards of trust, professionalism, and performance.

It is important to note that the ORCC is an operationally independent organization, even though it works closely with the Ocean Reef Community Organization (ORCA) during the membership vetting process.

HOW A BUSINESS QUALIFIES FOR MEMBERSHIP

Businesses seeking to join the Ocean Reef Chamber of Commerce must complete a multi-step review process:

1. ORCA Vetting

All applicants must first be approved by ORCA, ensuring they meet base-level qualifications and community compliance.

As part of the ORCA registration process:

 All companies must carry valid insurance — General Liability and/or Workers' Compensation Insurance,

- depending on the nature of the business.
- Construction companies are required to carry both, with minimum coverage amounts of \$500,000 for General Liability and \$1,000,000 for Workers' Compensation.

2. ORCA Business Classification & Fees

Companies are classified based on their location and size:

- Onsite Contractors:
 Businesses with an office
 or permanent presence on
 Ocean Reef property.
 - *Small Onsite:* Three or fewer employees.
 - Large Onsite: More than three employees, required to have Workers' Compensation or valid exemptions.

• Offsite Contractors:

Companies operating off property that visit Ocean Reef for work.

ORCA fees vary by classification and Chamber membership. Companies joining after the annual dues are processed in June will receive a prorated business fee based on their registration month.

3. Reference Checks & Reputation Review

The Chamber contacts professional references and existing clients to evaluate the business's reputation, service quality, ethics, and customer relationships.

4. Board Approval

Applications are reviewed by the ORCC Board of Directors, who assess each submission carefully and hold full discretion over membership decisions.

5. Ongoing Oversight

Admission is just the beginning. The Chamber continually monitors its member businesses' performance and community feedback. Any business that no longer meets the standards risks having its membership revoked.

ACCESS & BACK-GROUND CHECKS

All individuals seeking access to Ocean Reef through a company must undergo an ORCA background check:

- Day Passes: Checked against regional databases, including Miami-Dade, Monroe, and Broward County criminal records, Florida's sexual predator list, wanted database, and driver's license status.
 - \$15 per day, limited to 10 passes per calendar year.
 - After exceeding the limit, individuals must apply for an annual access card under a homeowner or registered contractor, with proper authorization.
- Annual Access Cards: Require a Social Security Number for a national background check.
 - For those without an

- SSN, a valid passport is required.
- New annual card: \$55 | Renewal: \$45

The process isn't easy — and that's by design. It ensures that every Chamber member reflects the excellence and trust that Ocean Reef residents expect. We are proud to support businesses that not only meet these high standards but continually strive to exceed them.



ORCF Community Grants in Action:

Building Stronger Starts Through Local School Support

As students head back to school across the Upper Keys, Homestead, and Florida City, the Ocean Reef Community Foundation's 2025 Community Grants are already making a real difference, providing support that helps students not only start strong but stay on track all year long.

Before backpacks were packed, many families had already benefited from grant-funded programs. The University of Miami's pediatric mobile clinic, Keys AHEC's dental van, Caring 4 Miami's Project Smile, and In Jacob's Shoes helped students arrive at school healthy, confident, and ready to learn, with new shoes on their feet and access to basic care that many of us might take for granted.

Inside the busy classrooms where many Ocean Reef staff send their children, the support continues. At Key Largo School, funding for AVID college readiness, teacher training, and class field trips is helping kids think beyond their current grade and start planning for

what comes next. A grant also provided new equipment for the weight training room, giving students a space to build healthy habits and self-confidence.

Ocean Studies Charter
School used its grant to launch
"Healthy Minds, Strong Lives,"
a mental health program aimed
at early intervention and longterm wellness. Meanwhile, at
Homestead Middle School,
City Year is putting grant funds
to work through mentoring
and coaching focused on both
academics and social-emotional
growth, an approach that
supports the whole student, not
just their report card.

At Coral Shores High School, hardship assistance helps ensure that teens can participate in athletics regardless of financial challenges. Teachers are also receiving professional development through AVID training, and students are using

new tools to support positive behavior and classroom focus

A new school joins the list this year, Somerset Prep in Homestead, a K-12 public charter school, where ORCF grant funds are helping enhance both a school-wide STEM curriculum and the athletic program, creating more opportunities for students to explore their interests and talents.

Grants are also improving the learning environment in meaningful ways. EnFamilia updated its library space to make reading more accessible and enjoyable. Redlands Christian Migrant Association replaced their Florida City playground for safer play and early childhood development. Renovations at the ARC of South Florida's Palm Drive school, made possible by a significant Impact Fund grant, are creating a more welcoming

and functional space to learn.

STEM education remains a strong focus. The Cox Science Center's Science Passport program and new technology tools for Centro Campesino's youth programs are helping students engage with science and technology in hands-on, exciting ways

Creativity and expression are thriving too. Grants are supporting in-school and after-school arts and music programming, made possible through partners like ArtSouth, the Adrienne Arsht Center, Greater Miami Youth Symphony, and Young Musicians Unite. From field trips to live performances, students are being introduced to new ideas, cultures, and ways to express themselves.

After-school programs continue to provide vital structure and support when the school day ends. Trusted partners like Big Brothers Big Sisters, Branches, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, and the YMCA offer safe spaces, mentorship, and enrichment, helping students grow into confident, capable young adults.

Support also spans the full education journey. Programs like Success by Six and Healthy Start give children a strong foundation before kindergarten. In high school, peer-led health education through the Health Information Project (HIP) equips students with important knowledge to use and share. College scholarships from Take Stock in Children, the Mexican American Council, and the College of the Florida Keys are helping local graduates take the next step toward independence and career success.

This broad and lasting impact is made possible thanks to the generosity of Ocean Reef Club Members and the continued success of All Charities Weekend. See the full list of 2025 Community Grant recipients at oceanreefcommunityfoundation.org/grant-recipients/.







The Last **Blooms**

At Ocean Reef, we have our own twist on the classic fairy tale, "Jack and the Beanstalk." In our version, there aren't any magic beans or mischievous little boys named Jack bending Club rules.

Instead, our story stars an aging agave plant that, in its final phase of life, uses one last surge of energy to send a thick green stalk upward from its center. After years of stillness, it suddenly shoots up this stem several inches a day, reaching towering heights in just a few months. At its crown, tubular yellow-green flowers emerge in densely packed clusters.

Recently in Villa Cay, the Club's first developed neighborhood, two Agave angustifolia plants, standing in front of different homes, decided to put on their grand finale at the same time. One stalk reached about 15 feet, the other an impressive 20. Likely planted a decade or two ago, these succulents had been biding their time in the sun. Passersby marvel at the spectacle, some even wondering if the plants had been spiked with Miracle-Gro®.

There are more than 200 species of Agaves. They store energy in their stiff, narrow leaves, often gray-green or bluish-gray, sometimes edged with creamy

white stripes, lined with tiny brown teeth, and tapering to sharp points. Their dramatic flowering, known as a death bloom, is the plant's last breath of life.

Around Ocean Reef, these sudden stalks spark mixed reactions. Some residents, thinking the plant has gone rogue, call landscapers to remove them altogether, missing the curtain call the plant has been quietly preparing for decades. Similar to bromeliads, the mother agave produces "pups," small new shoots that sprout at its base, carrying on its lineage. A single plant may leave behind a handful, or even a dozen, successors. Think of it as another Legacy Member joining the Club.

Once the bloom fades, the mother plant dies. At that point, there are a few choices: Remove it, replant its pups,

compost its leaves and stalk, or leave its skeletal remains as an architectural focal point.

"Agaves are natural showpieces," says Nakita Shim, BrightView's Florida Keys branch manager. "Their scale, structure, and colors ranging from silvery gray to cream variegation make them stand out from the standard palette of green."

Of all the Agaves, only the Agave decipiens (false sisal or Florida Agave) is considered native to South Florida and the Florida Keys. The majority, about 70%, originate in Mexico.

True survivors, Agaves store water with ease and thrive in heat. Their towering stalks often make newspaper headlines and TV news segments around the country, drawing horticultural hawks to witness the fleeting spectacle.

Because this rare bloom happens just once in each plant's lifetime, spotting one is always special. It's a reminder that even in the quietest corners of The Reef, magical moments are awaiting to unfold.

Convicted Civility (Part 1)

Life in a Warring World

Nearly a century ago now, W.B. Yeats -- the Nobel prize-winning poet and Irish parliamentarian -- penned this provocative lament:

Things fall apart, the center cannot hold, Mere anarchy is loosed upon the world, The blood-dimmed tide is loosed, and everywhere, The ceremony of innocence is drowned.

Yeats looked at a world ravaged by war, at a civilization divided by cultural conflict, and at institutional religions seemingly unable or unwilling to provide the moral leadership required to stem the bloody tide of anarchy. Our problem, Yeats underlines, is that "The best lack all conviction, while the worst are full of passionate intensity."

It strikes me that we, also, live in an era where there is too little CONVICTION (or too much passivity) from many of our best people. At the same time, those actively engaged in the important struggles of our age often seem to exhibit

too little CIVILITY (or too much aggression) in the pursuit of their ends. The result is a rising anarchy in many societal sectors.

I caught a glimpse of this problem at a driving range near my Illinois home. I was paying for my bucket of balls when the news came in that a certain politician had just been convicted of multiple counts of corruption. "Well, it's about time," I blurted out triumphantly. Suddenly, a voice behind me said with equal intensity, "That's a load of bull--. He got a raw deal." I turned around and looked into the eyes of a man whose whole appearance suggested that he lived out of a cultural background and worldview very different from mine.

Being the loving pastor I am, I immediately thought: "I think I could knock this guy out. Yeah, he's a little shorter and older; I could probably take him." For a few seconds it seemed possible that our obvious political and social differences might get "worked out" on the floor between the rack of demo clubs and the Coke machine. Instead, however, we just glared in disgust at one another, shook our heads and walked away.

How often is this kind of conflict repeating itself across our country today? Somehow, we no longer seem able to find a constructive middle way between seething aggression and resigned passivity when it comes to working out our differences. University of Chicago historian, Martin Marty, once observed that "people who are good at being civil often lack strong convictions and people who have strong convictions often lack civility." What if you and I could model something better?

We Need Courageous Convictions

A text from the Bible suggests that we should "Make every effort to... be holy, [for] without holiness no one will see the Lord" (Hebrews 12:14).

To be "holy" means to be "distinctly dedicated to God's purposes." Pursuing holiness requires having the courage of conviction to say: I believe this moral choice, this use of resources, this policy or practice lines up with what God in his Word declares as right and good, or else it fails to do so and needs changing. Living with holy conviction is one of the ways we help the world SEE the character of God and the good he wants for everyone.

Individual faithful people will not always agree about which specific candidates or measures best express the character of God and advance his good purposes. If we read the same Bible, however, we ought to be largely unified in our conviction about the major values. Let me try to describe them in terms of some purposeful tensions.

Some Convictions That Might Unite Us

For example, the Judeo-Christian scriptures call us to pray for and support those in government; yet they also caution us against letting government usurp God's ultimate authority or our role as providers for one another. The Bible tells us that to serve as a leader anywhere is a noble task worthy of honor; but God also says that when leaders betray the trust given them, they are to be held accountable. The Scriptures strongly affirm freedom and choice; but also

that this liberty must be coupled with responsibility and self-restraint.

The Bible sanctions the use of force to restrain evil; but it also requires us to do everything in our power to avoid the taking of innocent life. The Bible makes it clear that we have been given dominion over this earth; but it also tells us that because the earth is the Lord's we are to steward its resources carefully. God calls us to respect the rule of law and the importance of boundaries; but he also asks us to show compassion toward aliens and refugees. God is clear that able-bodied people should work and not freeload; but. at the same time, God demands that provision be made for the helpless poor.

The Bible declares that to whom much is given, much will be expected in return; but God also says that even the person who has been given only one talent is expected to invest it wisely. God tells us that we are to honor the elderly; care for the sick; and not forget prisoners. We are to tend to our own household; but also look to the interests of others. We are to tell the truth and keep our vows. We are to worship him alone; but also remember that people must freely choose Him, rather than being forced to believe or submit.

The Creative Role We Can Play

Can you see why politics and religions are complicated? It is hard to keep in mind all the important values or hold the critical tensions without losing our balance. Political parties tend to see one side or the other of these issues. Special interests want to make their topic THE issue. But what if we could be people who advocated for God's whole agenda?

Doing that, I think, requires that we be people of BOTH courageous conviction AND humble civility. It is the second half of that bold blend that I look forward to reflecting with you about in the next edition of this column. In the meantime, all the very best to you.

We Mourn the Loss

Thomas Hayward Jr.



Thomas Z. Hayward Jr. passed away peacefully at home surrounded by his family on July 24, 2025 at the age of 85. Tom's integrity, wisdom, kindness and exemplary commitment to family, friends and service defined every role he filled — as a devoted husband of 61 years, a guiding father, a proud grandfather, a Northwestern Wildcat to the core, and an inspiring leader and legal mind to many.

Tom was a man of true grit steadfast, courageous, and unshakably strong in the face of every challenge life placed before him. In his long battle with Parkinson's, he showed the same quiet determination and inner strength that defined his entire life. Never one to complain, he met each day with dignity, resilience, and the grace of a true gentleman. His strength was never loud, but it was undeniable — a steady presence that inspired those around him and offered a model of how to live, and how to endure, with character and courage.

For nearly five decades, Tom left an indelible mark on the legal profession and business community. He was widely recognized for his expertise in real estate, zoning, and corporate law, counseling developers in more than 200 Illinois communities and many privately-held corporations. He was part of the legal team behind Illinois' first planned development and went on to advise on major

residential, commercial, and industrial projects across the state. Tom practiced law at several prominent Chicago law firms, including Bell, Boyd & Lloyd (later part of K&L Gates LLP), from which he retired in 2013. While actively practicing law. Tom also served as President and CEO (and later Chairman) of TC Industries, a worldwide industry leading manufacturer of cutting edges, wear parts and fabrications, beginning in 1984 and helped lead the company for over forty years. Tom was widely respected for the clarity and wisdom of his legal and business counsel, always striking the right balance between integrity, practicality, and sound judgment guidance that left a lasting impact on colleagues, clients, and friends alike.

Throughout his career, Tom was deeply involved in the American Bar Association, where he served in numerous leadership roles, including Chair of the Standing Committee on the Federal Judiciary and Chair of the Finance Committee. He was also Past President of the Chicago Bar Association and the Chicago Bar Foundation. His unwavering commitment to justice and ethical practice elevated everyone around him — from judges to fellow attorneys — pushing the profession toward greater fairness, clarity, and purpose, and earning him the Justice John Paul Stevens Award in 2012. He made all who worked with him better by keeping the focus always on what was right, not just what was

A proud and devoted alumnus of Northwestern University, Tom served as a Life Trustee, former Vice Chairman of the Board of Trustees, former member of the Executive Committee, and Co-Chair of Campaign Northwestern. He was a Past President of the Northwestern University Alumni Association, the Alumni Regents and numerous other university groups. In recognition for his commitment, Tom received multiple honors from Northwestern, including the Alumni Medal (the highest

honor bestowed on an alumnus), Alumni Service Award, and the Gridiron Network Outstanding Service Award. At the 1959 Northwestern/Notre Dame football game (the Wildcats won 30-24!), Tom met Sally Madden the captain of Northwestern's Pom Pom Squad, the love of his life and the beginning of a Northwestern legacy continued by their sons and generations after. Tom was a fixture at every Northwestern football and basketball game, as well as countless major university events — always proudly in the stands (rain, snow or shine), side by side with his beloved wife Sally, family and friends. His PURPLE PRIDE was not just worn — it was lived.

His community involvement extended beyond Northwestern and the legal field. He held leadership roles with the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum, Economic Club of Chicago, Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation, Presbyterian Church of Barrington, and many others.

He also served on several corporate boards, including The Pepper Companies, TC Industries and Stivers Temporary Personnel. Personally, Tom enjoyed tennis, golf and hunting with family and friends. Tom and Sally were early members of Barrington Hills Country Club, with Tom serving as the President just like his father and grandfather before him. He especially cherished the Western traditions, camaraderie, and spirit of "good old" American fun shared with his sons and countless friends through his involvement with Rancheros Visitadores — where he proudly served as a Camp Captain — and the Charlie Russell Riders.

Born in Evanston in 1940, he was a lifelong resident of Barrington Hills, IL. After attending The Hill School in Pottstown, PA (where he was awarded The Headmaster's Prize and enshrined in the Athletics Hall of Fame), Tom earned his B.A. with honors from Northwestern University in 1962 (where he was a proud member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon), his J.D.

from Northwestern University School of Law in 1965 (where he was awarded the Wigmore Key), and an M.B.A. from the University of Chicago in 1970. He was admitted to the bars of Illinois, Ohio, the United States Supreme Court, and multiple federal courts.

Tom is survived by his beloved wife, Sally Madden Hayward, and their three sons and daughters-in-law: Thomas Z. Hayward III (Lisa), Wallace M. Hayward (Jenny), and Robert M. Hayward (Liz); as well as seven cherished grandchildren, in order of age: Riley, Hope, Trevor, Maggie, Eleanor, Charlie, and Griffin. Despite the demands of a full and accomplished career, Tom always made time for what mattered most. He coached countless Little League games, explored the United States and the world with curiosity and joy alongside his family, enjoyed taking his family to watch their favorite Chicago sports teams, and found immeasurable happiness in every moment spent with his grandchildren. His presence was a gift to all who knew him, and his love for life and family was deep, constant, and unwavering.

The family wishes to express its heartfelt appreciation to Sherwin Lovete, who affectionately called Tom "Big Boss." Sherwin's unwavering love, care, and devotion were a profound source of strength and comfort to both Tom and Sally. One of Tom's greatest recent joys was witnessing Sherwin become an American citizen — a moment that filled him with deep pride and immense gratitude for a man who had so generously given of himself and become a cherished part of the family.

Hurricane Preparedness for Patients with Special **Needs**

If you are planning on staying longer at your Ocean Reef residence this year, or are a full-time resident, the Medical Center encourages patients to plan in advance of a hurricane for their personal evacuation plan.

Monroe County does provide for a Special Needs Shelter; however, it should not be a replacement for having an evacuation plan of your own. You should try and seek help or shelter from family, friends, or neighbors in a hurricane or other disaster. Public shelters should be a last resort for those



who have no other choice. It is advised that you work on a plan that meets your specific medical needs with your doctor or a healthcare professional.

Patients with special needs must register with Monroe County's Emergency Management website. We are now in the peak of hurricane season and anyone with the following special needs should register well in advance.

Eligible conditions for the Special Needs Shelter include, but are not limited to:

Being dependent on

supplemental oxygen

- Limited mobility
- Needing assistance with daily activities such as feeding, medications and hygiene
- Moderate dementia
- Cognitive impairment
- Immobile or wheelchair bound
- In need of wound care and/or in need of constant supervision

Special-Needs-Registry.

From there, you will be directed through the registration process. You may also download the Everbridge® App for your smartphone at everbridge.com/app. Registrants will be notified by telephone, text or email of a pending evacuation and be given specific instructions to follow when you need to evacuate to the Special Needs Shelter.

If you have trouble registering on the portal, please contact Keith Young at the Medical Center. In the event of a hurricane, the Medical Center and Public Safety work together to assist with the appropriate transportation for those with special needs, however, you must be registered with Monroe County, or you may not be allowed into an appropriate shelter.

Vanilla Panna Cotta Yields Six



by Betania Salles, Carysfort Kitchen Chef de Cuisine

This dessert is a party pleaser. I haven't met anyone that does not enjoy a good Panna Cotta.

Here we have a lovely and simple recipe with that perfect jiggled texture that you can have ready in the blink of an eye. You will love it!

Ingredients for Panna Cotta:

- 4 sheets of Gold gelatin
- 360 ml half and half
- 80 gr honey
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 15 ml vanilla bean paste, vanilla extract or one vanilla bean pod scraped
- 360 ml heavy cream

Directions:

- Fill a small bowl with cold water and submerge the gelatin sheets. Set aside for at least four minutes until the gelatin softens.
- Remove gelatin sheets and squeeze excess water out.
- Place the half and half in a small saucepan, along with the honey, salt, and vanilla.
- Place over medium heat and stir the mixture while heating.



dissolve and mix into the base. Do NOT allow the mixture to come to a boil.

- When the half and half is steaming, remove it from heat.
- Add the bloomed gelatin into the hot mixture and gently whisk until the gelatin has completely dissolved.
- Stir in the heavy cream.
- Divide the mixture into six dishes (with a 3/4 cup capacity).
- Make sure to stir the panna cotta mixture each time you pour it into a serving dish so that the vanilla seeds are properly dispersed.
- Allow the panna cotta to cool down slightly, then cover it with plastic wrap and store it in the fridge overnight.


Ingredients for Berries Compote:

- 2 cups fresh mixed berries (strawberries largely diced)
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 tbsp. honey
- 2 tbsp. lemon juice

Directions:

- Combine all ingredients in a small sauce pot.
- Bring to a boil then reduce the heat and let it simmer until most of the liquid has evaporated.
- Turn off the heat and let it cool down.





Protecting the Florida Manatee

International Manatee Day is Sept. 7

Seeing a manatee in its natural habitat is a special experience, and with the warm waters of the Keys, it is not unusual to have manatee sightings in our own Ocean Reef channels. With International Manatee Day approaching on Sunday, September 7, now is a great time to review how to handle this threatened species with care. So, what should you do the next time you see a manatee?

Keep Your Distance

The rule of thumb is keep your distance and simply watch the manatees without interaction. Manatees are protected by state and federal law, making it illegal to annoy, harass or disturb a manatee in any way – an act that can face fines or imprisonment.

This includes touching, following, feeding or giving them water - any activity that alters their natural behavior. While you may want to turn on your hose to attract a manatee you see swimming nearby, remember not only is this illegal, but it puts the animal in danger. If manatees become accustomed to being around people, they can lose their natural fear of boats, which makes them more susceptible to injury.

Be an Aware Boater

As manatees are very slowmoving creatures (on average they swim 3 to 5 mph and slower if they have a calf with them), they have a hard time getting quickly out of harm's way. When boats are traveling faster than the indicated speed in channels, canals and regulatory zones, manatees are vulnerable to impact and injury by the boat and propeller. This makes it very important for boaters to pay attention to and follow the boating speed signs, and to actively look out for manatees in

the water around them.

Practice Passive Observation The next time you see a manatee, whether from your boat, paddleboard, or swimming, you're encouraged to appreciate this creature through passive observation. Avoid splashing or making loud noises, move slowly, and do not follow or touch them. It is also very important to never do something that will separate a mother and her calf, as baby manatees are dependent on their

• Floating high in the water, unable to swim down

mother for at least two years.

- Fresh, open wounds (pink/red)
- Rapid breathing breathing every minute or so
- White lesions, emaciation (thin, visible ribs/skull), lethargic
- Tidally stranded (do not attempt to push the manatee back into the water or move it yourself)
- Lone, orphan calf (manatee less



than five feet in length) Entanglement

Pop Tennis:

If tennis and pickleball feel a little too serious—or if chasing balls across a full court makes you feel like you need a nap halfway through—there's a new racquet sport on the rise that might be just your speed: Pop Tennis.

Think of it as tennis, pickleball and paddle's fun younger cousin. The court is smaller, the balls are softer, and the racquets—well, they're paddles, so you don't have to worry about broken strings or restringing. Even the

serve is underhand, which means no more double-fault drama or trying to perfect that 120-mileper-hour ace. Pop Tennis keeps things simple: get the ball in, rally it out, and laugh when your friend misses a sitter.

The sport has actually been around for decades under the name "paddle tennis," but it got a rebrand in 2015. The new name, Pop Tennis, is fitting—not only because the ball makes a satisfying "pop" when you hit it, but also because the game itself is quick, lively, and, let's face it, a little addictive.

Rules are mostly the same as

tennis (love, 15, 30, 40, game), but the pace is different. Since the court is about half the size of a standard tennis court and is played with a low-compression ball, points develop fast, players stay closer together, and rallies feel like they are in fast-forward. It's great exercise, too, though you might be laughing too hard to notice how much running you're actually doing.

Pop Tennis is also refreshingly approachable. Beginners pick it up quickly, seasoned tennis players get their competitive fix, and people of all ages can jump right in without feeling like they've signed up for a triathlon. Basically, if you can swing a paddle and enjoy friendly banter over whether a ball was "just out," you'll fit right in.

PICKLEBALL TIP

"Win the Kitchen with Patience"



'Pickleball Tip" By Alex Mabred, Head Pickleball Professional

One of the biggest advantages in pickleball comes from controlling the non-volley zone (the kitchen). Instead of rushing to attack too early, focus on

consistency and ball placement:

- **1. Dink with Purpose** Don't just get the ball over. Aim at your opponent's feet or wide to pull them out of position.
- 2. Stay Low & Balanced –
 Bend your knees, keep your
 paddle out in front, and stay
 ready for a quick volley.
- 3. Patience Wins Points Many players try to "end the rally" too quickly. Often, the team that waits for the right high ball before attacking ends up winning.

Key takeaway: Think of dinking as "setting the trap." Be patient, wait for the pop-up, then finish strong.

Slowing Down the Aging Clock



'Fitness Focus" by Luis Bracamonte, Director of Fitness & Wellness

Lifestyle is the most powerful level we have to influence how fast we age. From a fitness and wellness perspective, this means focusing on maintaining muscle mass, cardiovascular capacity, joint health, and metabolic function while minimizing chronic inflammation, oxidative stress, and hormonal decline. Here is how to achieve it:

Strength & Muscle
Preservation: Muscle mass is
one of the strongest predictors
of healthy aging. Perform
resistance training two to five
times per week, focusing on
compound movements such as
squats, deadlifts, presses, and

pulls. Gradually increase the resistance to reduce the risk of injury and maintain progress. Resistance training can be performed with machines, free weights, and other functional equipment. Bodyweight exercises are practical in improving strength, muscle mass, and joint stability, and can be performed anywhere.

Cardiovascular Conditioning: Cardiovascular capacity, as measured by our ability to utilize oxygen during a VO2Max test, is another strong predictor of longevity and healthy living. Perform two to four sessions of moderate-intensity cardio per week, plus one to two sessions of high-intensity intervals. This combination enhances mitochondrial health, promotes fat oxidation, and improves insulin sensitivity, among other benefits. Include at least two activities (swimming, cycling, running, rowing, dancing, etc.) to provide variety, reduce the risk of overuse injuries, and

improve overall capacity.

Mobility, Balance, & Joint Longevity: Joint function and proprioception often decline before strength. Perform mobility exercises and stretching daily. Regular yoga, Pilates, or other bodyweight functional movement is very effective in maintaining mobility and balance. Soft tissue work, whether through self-massage or assisted massage, ensures the best results.

Recovery & Hormonal Health: Recovery capacity declines with age, making it more critical to focus on this aspect. Begin by aiming for 7-9 hours of sleep with a consistent sleep schedule to support the production of growth hormone and testosterone. Manage stress through breathwork, meditation, cold exposure, sauna, or gentle cardio to reduce cortisol levels.

Nutrition & Metabolic Support: The foods we eat can reduce inflammation and provide essential nutrients for our muscles and organs. Important nutrition targets include consuming 1.6 to 2.2 grams of lean protein per kilogram of body weight, limiting ultraprocessed foods, sugar, and sodium, increasing consumption of vegetables and fruits, and staying properly hydrated by drinking water and electrolyterich beverages. What we eat fuels our bodies and our brains.

Longevity Lifestyle Factors: Through studies such as those in

the Blue Zones, we have learned that social engagement, spending time in nature, and maintaining a challenging intellectual environment can reduce mortality risk and enhance the quality of our lives. It is also essential to limit smoking, alcohol, and other toxins.

Slowing down the aging clock isn't about one magic solution. It involves weaving together several key factors, including strength, endurance, mobility, balance, recovery, nutrition, and lifestyle. With consistency, these habits bring youthful energy and clarity to our lives.





On Tuesday, August 5, Captain Peter Liashek teaches boating fundamentals and safety to 16 Ocean Reef Club Associates.


In Florida, if you were born after January 1, 1988, you must have a Florida Boating Card to operate a boat, and rental companies require it.







BRIDGE TIP

Penalty Double

Doubling a contract where you think the opponents cannot make is known as a Penalty Double. The Penalty Double is not easy. It does take a lot of experience to master the Penalty Double. Let's take a look at three basic examples of when to use the Penalty Double.

Doubling Notrump

Almost all doubles of Notrump bids are for penalty. (Except if you play D.O.N.T. or some other convention over the opponent's Opening NT.)

To double a notrump partscore contract, your side needs the majority of points.

1♥ - Pass – 1NT – Double = Takeout.

Pass $-1 \nabla - 1NT - Double =$ Penalty. Partner opened, you should have 10+pts

To double a notrump game

contract, you need a source of tricks in multiple suits.

- **★** 53
- **¥** 843
- ◆ AKQJT
- **♣** 742

Yes, you can take 5 tricks in diamonds, but a double here may tick the opponent into another contract, such as 5♣. Pass.

- **★** 53
- **♥** A43
- ♦ KQJT9
- ♣ QJT

Now you have tricks in hearts, diamonds and clubs. Once the ◆A is played, you have 4 diamond tricks with the ◆A and club winner. Double.

Doubling Partscores

In order to double a low-level contract, you need:

- 1. Majority of points
- 2. Good trump (either six trumps between you and your partner or four good pieces in your hand).

Penalty or Takeout?

To help distinguish a penalty double from a takeout double, use this guideline:

A double is for penalty when:

- Your partner has bid or doubled (excluding situations in which the negative or support double applies).
- 2. There is no unbid suit.
- 3. The doubled suit is artificial. (such as doubling 2♥ when transferring to spades)
- 4. You originally passed the enemy's suit and then doubled any game bid, any NT bid or an unraised suit at the 3-level or higher.

Doubling Sacrifices

If your side belongs in game, you must double or bid. It is important to identify these situations when your opponents are bidding on trump length and not on points.

Example:

- **♠** 76
- **♥** K65

West North East South ◆A43

1♥ 1♠ 2♠ ♠ AQ765


4♠ Pass Pass ?

With this hand, you know you belong in 4♥, but your opponents have bid 4♠. It is clear they went to game based on the trump length and not on HCPs. Double!

When NOT to double

- 1. Never double a freely-bid slam. Normally when you set a slam contract, you will get a good score. There is no reason to double and have your opponents "look" for another suit to play.
- 2. If you have 15 points and your opponents are in game, don't double. Not only will your opponents know where the points are, but your partner will have nothing to help you.

Do not double a low-level just on points. You need trump length too. A surprising number of tricks can be made with a fit and very few points.






