Investing in Wellness: Spa Expansion & Renovation

Following the Board's approval of plans to renovate and expand the Spa, covered in the May 9, 2025 edition of the Ocean Reef Press, here are some updates on the progress of this project:

Construction

In June, Monroe County issued all the necessary permits

for the Spa renovation and expansion to break ground. The project is expected to continue through the summer of 2026. Craft Construction, a trusted partner responsible for the 2020 Clubhouse renovation and nearing completion on the Associate Housing project, has been selected for the Spa project.

To ensure that the project area looks as desirable as possible during the construction timeline, the Club and Craft have been working on concealing the construction as best as possible. In addition, a new traffic pattern has been created.

The Spa Relocations

It is also important to note that throughout this time, the Member Fitness Center, Member Fitness Pool and Cold Plunge are entirely operational, with the main entrance and The Academy entrance remaining open.

Improvements Underway on the Islander & Buccaneer Island Bridge

As part of our summer capital maintenance program of Club facilities, the Islander is now temporarily closed for upkeep. This year, that work includes replacing the roof, epoxy kitchen flooring, fresh paint and a deep clean.

To make the most of the closure, the Club is simultaneously completing some walkway improvements to the Buccaneer Island bridge. By coordinating both projects at the same time, we are able to minimize disruption by only closing entry to one side of Buccaneer Island once. Buccaneer

Island can still be accessed from the Marlin Inn side.

As of this week, the Amberjack walkway, Buccaneer Island bridge walkway, and the Islander are closed. The restrooms on Buccaneer Island will remain open throughout the project, which is expected to take approximately three to four weeks.

- Islander dinner and Palm Court lunch are being served in the Ocean Room as of Monday, July 21.
- Reef Lounge is open daily throughout the project.
- The Beach Grill will close briefly for roof work on Monday and Tuesday, July 28 and 29, and will resume normal hours on Wednesday, July 30.

ORCF Community Grants in Action:

First Jobs, Bright Futures

This summer, thanks in part to the generosity of Ocean Reef Club Members, local teens are stepping into their first jobs and toward a promising future, through Branches' Climb and Climb Higher Program.

Supported by a \$35,000 Community Grant from the Ocean Reef Community Foundation, students are working as "Summer Shade Guides," serving as camp counselors at Branches' Summer Shade Camp. While the program operates across three community locations with 42 counselors, the Foundation's grant specifically funds the Florida City site, where 10 teens are gaining hands-on experience while developing leadership skills, strong work ethics, and the confidence needed to succeed beyond the classroom.

Before camp began, participants completed intensive training that included a motivational session with Branches President and CEO Brent McLaughlin and a financial wellness workshop led by one of the organization's certified financial coaches. These sessions empower students not only to earn income but also to manage it with intention.

Summer Shade Camp and The Climb and Climb Higher Program exemplify workforce development at its best, providing meaningful employment that enables youth to lead, learn, and thrive. Ocean Reef Club Members help make this impact possible, one bid at a time. Branches has received over \$700,000 in ORCF Community Grants since 2009.

Library Corner



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

ORCA Rules for Moke Vehicles

Earlier this year, the ORCA Board of Directors approved updated regulations for Moke vehicles to ensure clarity in parking rules and establish a formal registration process. These changes are designed to enhance safety and organization within Ocean Reef.

Parking Restrictions

Mokes are prohibited from parking in designated golf cart spaces. Due to their larger size, they must be parked in areas meant for regular-sized vehicles.

Mandatory Registration

As of April 1, 2025, all Moke vehicles in Ocean Reef must be registered through one of the following:

- 1. State Registration Obtain a valid state license tag.
- 2. ORCA Registration Obtain



Mokes are a trendy alternative to golf carts, and though compact, ORCA rules state they should follow the same rules of the road as cars.

a decal from the Ocean Reef Public Safety Department and affix it to the vehicle.

Rental Mokes must also be registered, and owners selling or discarding a Moke must notify Public Safety to update records.

Driver's License Requirement

All Moke drivers must have a valid driver's license to operate the vehicle within the community.

Why These Changes?

Originally used as military vehicles


in the 1960s, Mokes have become popular for leisurely coastal driving. Classified as Low-Speed Vehicles (LSVs) under Florida law, they can legally operate on roads with speed limits of 35 MPH or less, aligning with Ocean Reefs 5, 15, and 25 MPH speed limits.

Mokes are significantly larger than golf carts. At 131 inches long and 65 inches wide, they exceed the typical golf cart's 92-inch length and 48-inch width, making them unsuitable for golf cart parking spaces.

Safety & Compliance Guidelines

Ariel Artime, ORCA's Vice President/Director of Public Safety and Operations, emphasizes the importance of safe Moke operation. He offers the following reminders:

- Register the vehicle with ORCA Public Safety and display the decal.
- 2. Follow passenger limits and avoid overcrowding.
- 3. Do not let children sit on adults' laps, especially the driver.
- 4. Wear seat belts. Seat belts can be installed at the Club's Cart Repair shop.
- 5. Turn on headlights at night for visibility.
- 6. Drive cautiously, following all traffic laws.
- 7. Alert passengers before turning to prevent injuries.
- 8. Adhering to these rules will ensure a safer, more orderly community for everyone. For more details, contact the ORCA Public Safety Department at 305-367-2222.

ORCA's Guide to Mini Lobster Season

One of the busiest events in the Florida Keys is fast approaching: Mini Lobster Season, taking place this year on Wednesday and Thursday, July 30–31. This popular two-day tradition offers a unique opportunity to enjoy our waters and harvest spiny lobster ahead of the commercial season. While it's a highlight for many, it also brings mixed feelings due to the surge of visitors to the area.

Whether you plan to dive or snorkel, preparation is essential. Stay informed and follow all state and local regulations to help ensure a safe, responsible, and enjoyable experience for everyone.

Key Rules & Reminders:

- **Daily Bag Limit:** Six lobsters per person, per day.
- Minimum Size Requirement: Carapace must be over three inches and measured in the water. A measuring device is required.
- Night Diving: Prohibited in Monroe County during mini season (one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise).
- Restricted Areas: Lobster harvesting is prohibited in:
 - John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park
 - Everglades National Park
 - Dry Tortugas National Park
 - No-take zones within the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary
 - Biscayne Bay/Card Sound Lobster Sanctuary
 - Coral Reef Protection Areas in Biscayne National Park

Review maps and local guidance to ensure you are operating outside restricted zones.

License Requirements

Participants must hold a valid Florida recreational saltwater fishing license and a spiny lobster permit (unless specifically exempt by state law).

Please adhere to these guidelines:

• Dive Flags: Always display

- a dive flag when divers are in the water and remove it when underway
- **Essential Gear:** Gloves, a tickle stick, a net or lobster looper, and a catch bag are required tools.
- No Egg-Bearing Lobsters: It's illegal to harvest lobsters carrying eggs.
- No Harmful Devices: Tools that puncture, crush, or damage lobster shells are prohibited. Remember: harvesting responsibly helps preserve this tradition for future generations.

If you miss the mini season, the regular spiny lobster season begins August 6 and runs through March 31.

Boating Safety

With increased boating traffic, ORCA reminds Members of key boating safety tips from Pete Liashek, Flotilla Public Education Officer, USCG Auxiliary, Ocean Reef Flotilla:

- **Keep a Lookout:** The primary cause of accidents is not having a lookout. Ensure someone is watching the water to alert you to nearby boat traffic.
- Situational Awareness: Stay aware of your surroundings, including other boats, swimmers, and obstacles.
- **Safety Equipment:** Ensure guests know the location of safety gear like life jackets, flares, and fire extinguishers.
- Life Jackets: Confirm you have appropriately sized life jackets for everyone on board. Standard "red" life jackets are not suitable for children.
- Provisions: Ensure you have sufficient water and food, as dehydration can happen more quickly while boating.
- Boating Card: Boaters born after January 1, 1988, must carry a Florida state boating card. Certification can also reduce insurance premiums. Visit MyFWC.com/boating for info.

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Trash Talking the Raccoons

Let's start with a firm disclaimer: No raccoons were injured, harassed, drugged, or captured for this article.

Without directly insulting these nocturnal nuisances, the fact is, we do not appreciate their late-night trash parties. Nothing spoils a morning faster than seeing your garbage and recycling cans knocked over, with your personal debris for all to see, scattered across your driveway. Pretty embarrassing.

Over the last couple of years, Solid Waste Associates have noticed a trend: Members are fighting back. Not with traps or complaints, but with creativity, determination, and possibly a little too much time on their hands

It's become a battle of psychological island warfare. If you were pitching this storyline to Netflix, you might describe it as "Survivor" meets "MacGyver." Both sides are determined to outwit, outplay, and outlast the other.

We have clever raccoons (known to be smarter than dogs) versus inventive Members (known for category five defense skills, even in nonweather-related threats). While the Members are starting to win some battles through ingenuity, it usually takes a few failed attempts.

Simply put, Reef raccoons do not go down without a fight. Motion-activated sprinklers, flashing lights, and highfrequency radio waves may work the first night. But once these rascals realize these are just Member-made distractions, the gig is up. They're back the next night, more determined than ever.

The result of googling "trash can locks" makes it seem like we're not alone at The Reef when it comes to raccoon problems!

"George" Espinoza said his team has witnessed some admirable efforts from Members to secure their cans and lids. But before we get into raccoon-defense highlights, it's worth revisiting some trash prep basics because not everyone has quite mastered the art.

Trash Rules

All trash must be bagged, tied, and placed inside the can. No loose scraps. No flung-in food. No freestyle box tossing.

Small boxes? Break them down and put them in your recycling bin.

Medium and large boxes? Call Solid Waste for pickup.

Recyclables go in the blue containers. They are defined as plastics, paper, cans, and glass.

Sounds simple, right? And yet, the Solid Waste Team has fished out water hoses, metal scraps, pillows, and shoes from recycling bins. The most notable find to date was a halfeaten turkey thrown in the day after Thanksgiving. We assume this was a misguided attempt at recycling leftovers. But we digress.

Keep it Classy, Can it Right

Proper trash prep isn't just about aesthetics, though at ORC, even our garbage is expected to follow a dress code. When

it's done right, it saves the Solid Waste crew serious time. During the season, on trash pickup days, four small trucks empty over 2,000 cans over seven hours. Each truck unloads up to six times a day. If bags aren't tied, boxes aren't broken down, or lids aren't secure, the crew has to stop, re-bag, or clean up debris, which slows evervone down.

Now, back to the raccoons. Some Members have employed genuinely impressive tactics. A few have repurposed golf cart and car seat belts to strap down lids. One added screw-in hooks to the top of their cans that twist-lock the lids in place. Others have gone full Fort Knox and built cages around their containers.

The Solid Waste Department appreciates these innovations as they help speed up collection. But you don't have to be a DIY trash wrap wizard. Plenty of (non-toxic, non-harmful) antiraccoon solutions are available for purchase. Just Google "trash can locks" or "garbage container sheds" for ideas.

And once your raccoon deterrents arrive, don't forget to call Solid Waste to collect the boxes they came in.



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

Taking the Plunge

At the Swimming Pool

It was nearly the end of the summer and four-year-old, Dylan Stitch, still hadn't taken the plunge. His parents had tried everything to inspire him to jump off the diving board but to no avail. As Dylan's mom, Marla, describes it, "We kept saying, 'Hey, you want to give it a shot? You want to give it a try?' But Dylan had no interest in it, ever."

Enter Daniel Bliss. While attending a neighborhood pool party, the 95-year-old heard everyone trying to coax Dylan off the board. Bliss was an Air Force veteran of World War II and the Korean War. He knew a few things about fear and bravery and that sometimes what we need in scary moments is just an example.

So, Daniel asked a neighbor if he could borrow a swimsuit. With cane in hand, Bliss stepped up on the diving board for the first time in fifty years. The people at the pool party gasped and then held their breath. "Will this be a lesson in courage or in the need for first aid?"

Daniel later said: "I was up there

that far, I figured I may as well go through with it." So, at the age of 95, **he dove for Dylan**.

It wasn't a particularly elegant or athletic dive. Nothing close to an Olympian. But it was *enough*, because moments after Daniel Bliss took his LAST jump off of a diving board, Dylan Stitch took his FIRST.

Today, Dylan jumps with no problem. Doing so is one of his great joys. He can hardly even remember the time when he was too scared to make that leap. But that transformation might never have happened, had a much older person not been willing to set an example.

Risks & Rewards

Fear is one of the greatest limiting factors on human joy, growth and fulfillment. It stops us from experiencing so many of the goods that could be ours if we would only take the plunge.

Obviously, there are some risks not worth taking. I recall jumping off the roof of a shed when I was five years old and getting quite hurt because I'd neglected to read the fine print on my new Superman cape: "Caution: Cape does not enable user to fly!" True story. But some risks carry rewards that we will miss out on if we allow fear to run our lives. To this point, I once read the story of a man who sought to live a very safe life:

"He saw people love each other and he saw that all love made strenuous demands upon the lovers. He saw love require sacrifice and self-denial. He saw love produce arguments and anguish. And he decided that it cost too much. So, he decided not to diminish his life with love.

"He saw people strive for lofty goals and he saw that the striving was frequently mixed with disappointment. He saw strong people fail. And he decided that it cost too much. So, he decided not to mar his life with striving.

"He saw people serving others and giving money to the poor and helpless. And he saw that while they served, the need continued to grow. He saw ungrateful receivers. So, he decided not to soil his life with serving.

"And when he died, he walked up to God and presented Him with his life. Undiminished, unmarred, and unsoiled, his life was clean from the dirt and danger of the world, and he presented it proudly saying, This is my life."

And the great God said: 'What life?"

In Pursuit of Courage

All of us live with some measure

of fear. We and those we love are not stupid to do risk assessments. Some leaps should not be taken no matter how red our capes. But life is, fundamentally, an adventure that demands some measure of faith and daring.

I love what Franklin D.
Roosevelt observed about this:
"Courage," he said, "is not the absence of fear, but rather the assessment that something else is more important." Establishing a life filled with love, reaching lofty goals, serving others, experiencing the thrill of victory—all of these things are more important than the occasional agonies of defeat.

It strikes me that one of the greatest gifts we can make to younger generations (as well as our peers) is to help them understand the risk-reward relationship and to help bolster their courage to take some leaps. As Daniel Bliss seemed to perceive, sometimes that requires getting up on the diving board ourselves and taking a plunge.

May you have a splash-filled summer.

Mindfulness

We live in an age of ceaseless information, with a cacophony of distractions. At any given moment the mind is processing too many "to do" lists in everyday life and we are rushing, forgetting and causing an even more distracted and chaotic mind.

And those distracted, overwhelmed, tired moments are ripe for accidents.

Tripping on a stair, a throw rug, dropping and misplacing things- easy to do when you are not paying attention.

Creating a habit of mindfulness takes on the onus of reminding ourselves to be mindful, especially when rushed, tired and overwhelmed. Practice creating "the pause"-stopping to take a breath or two to reset.

A daily practice of mindfulness might look like this:

Set aside moments each day



for quiet reflection. Turn off devices, close your eyes, and simply observe your thoughts.

- Creative Breaks: When stuck on a problem, step away from active thinking. The mind often finds solutions in the quiet after effort.
- Nature Walks: Spend time in natural environments where

human noise is minimal and allow the soundscape to refresh your senses.

Chef Betania's Kitchen

Cheese Shrimp Spring Rolls (12 rolls)



by Betania Salles, Carysfort Kitchen Chef de Cuisine

This dish is so yummy! We made this recipe during the Kids Camp and it was everyone's favorite. It is crunchy, cheesy and amazingly flavorful. I really recommend to marinate the shrimp in advance—it is a game changer. It is a perfect recipe to make on a family-fun cooking night. Enjoy!

Ingredients for filling:

- 1/2 lb. shrimp, 16/20 size, peeled and deveined
- 1 tbsp. Shaoxing rice wine
- 1 tbsp. soy sauce



- 1 tsp. ginger, grated
- 1/4 tsp. white pepper powder

Ingredients for Spring Roll:

- 12 tsps. green Onions, finely chopped
- 12 tbsps. mozzarella cheese, shredded
- 12 spring roll wrappers
- 4 cups vegetable oil
- 2 tbsps. all-purpose flour + 2 tbsps. water

Ingredients for Sauce:

- 4 tbsps. ketchup
- 2 tbsps. rice vinegar
- 2 tbsps. Sriracha sauce

• 2 tsps. honey

Directions:

- Chop the shrimp into 1/2-inch pieces. Transfer to a bowl. Add Shaoxing wine, soy sauce, ginger and white pepper powder. Mix well and let marinate for five minutes.
- Set up all the ingredients before assembling the spring roll.
 Discard any extra marinade from the shrimp. This is very important so the shrimp won't be too wet to cause the wrapper to break apart.
- Mix flour with water to a paste,

- use it as a glue when closing the rolls.
- Divide shrimp into 12 equal portions. On the lower of the wrapper add one portion of shrimp, 1 tbsp. mozzarella cheese and 1 tsp. green onion on the lower third of the wrappers. Fold the bottom to cover the filling.
- Then fold both sides of the wrapper towards the center, smear with the flour/water "glue." Tuck and roll the filling upward to seal the wrapper until it forms the spring roll.
- Place each spring roll in a tray, seam side down. Pour the oil onto a medium pot, at medium heat. When oil gets hot, start frying the spring rolls four at a time.
- Fry them until rolls are golden brown, about 2-3 minutes, then transfer them to a tray lined with paper towel.
- In a small mixing bowl, combine all ingredients for sauce, stir until well combined.
- Serve springs roll while still hot with the sauce.





Project Dolphin: A Fresh Take on Hole #5

This summer, Dolphin Course Hole #5 is undergoing a thoughtful redesign as part of the Club's ongoing commitment to elevating the playing experience for Members and guests.

To execute this project, the

Club hired renowned golf course architect Andrew Green, who has designed a handful of celebrated courses including Congressional Country Club, Oak Hill Country Club East Course, and Manasquan River Golf Club. Of Ocean Reef's new Hole #5 design, Green said, "When working on an established property with so much tradition, it is important that smaller projects fit the fabric of the whole. On the Dolphin, the 5th hole looked to

benefit from a more interesting yet usable surface, a distance that helped the par 3s on the course be more diversified, and a green site that offered a balance of challenge and playability."

One of the most noticeable changes golfers will experience is the increased length: Hole #5 will now play approximately 20 yards longer on average.

Additionally, and to better withstand seasonal King Tides, the lowest portion of the green has been raised by 13 inches, a change that will significantly reduce stress on the turf and surrounding areas. Alongside this elevation, the green itself has been expanded by over 1,000 square feet. As Eric Bennett, Director of Agronomy, notes, "the new green will have a lot of character."

Grassed with TifEagle Bermuda, the green promises smooth, true putting conditions, while the surrounding areas feature Celebration Bermuda, known for its durability and lush appearance. The reshaping of Hole #5 also involved the removal of the left and back bunkers, replaced by strategic mounding along the entire left side and front approach. These natural ground hazards will introduce new decision-making elements.

As of now, all grassing is complete, and the course has moved into the grow-in phase, an important period where turf establishes root systems and conditions are fine-tuned for play. The entire project remains on time and on budget.

Hammock Course Update: New Tiki Hut at the Starter Area

Also, the Club will soon begin work on enhancing the Hammock Course Starter Area, where a new tiki hut is being constructed. The hut will feature a hydration station and sand bottle storage, with fresh pavers being installed beneath and around the structure. A landscape refresh will complete the upgrade.

This area will be ready by November.

GOLF COURSE MAINTENANCE TIP

Maintaining Our Golf Courses for **Better Play**

Although Ocean Reef's golf courses are currently in their off-season with less than usual play due to the high temperatures, it's still imperative to look after yourselves and repair any damage that you encounter.

playing a round of golf, there are a few important tips to ensure you're carefully entering, exiting, and repairing the damage caused by your feet and club. Always enter and exit the bunker from the low side. This helps maintain quality turf

conditions that live on the face of the bunker, as well as ensure a steady level of sand across the entire area. Climbing up the face of the bunker causes unnecessary wear and tear to the soil holding the face of the bunker in place.

When raking the bunker after your shot, do your best to leave the conditions in better shape than you found them. Sometimes, this may require you to clean up some missed footprints from a golfer in front of you. Paying it forward on the golf course always leads to good karma from the 'golf gods'!

Pitch Marks

It's common for a high-lofted shot to come crashing down onto the putting green and create a crater from the impact into the grass. This is okay!

Much like creating divots in the fairway, this damage can always be repaired. However, the timeliness of the repair is what's most important. When left unattended for just 24 hours, an unfixed ball mark takes approximately 14 days to heal back to its natural shape. However, when a pitch mark is fixed on the green once it's made, only 24 hours are needed for the green to revert to the shape it was in.

Care for the golf course plays such an important role in the golfers' responsibilities. As staff, we always want to ensure we have pristine conditions for our Members and their guests to enjoy. If we all join together to help each other, we'll maintain those conditions for many years ahead!






As we step into the second half of 2025, it's the perfect moment to reflect on how far you've come this year and set your sights on where you want to go next.

Wishing you a powerful, energized, and fulfilling second half of 2025. Keep showing up for yourself – your future self will thank you.







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

Five Winning **Doubles** Strategies for **Tennis Players**

Hello and happy summer from the Tennis & Games Center! We are staying busy here with a full schedule of camps. With many summer leagues and sectional events happening in the next month, the pro staff and I thought we would highlight a few important strategies when playing doubles. Enjoy!

Doubles tennis is as much about teamwork and strategy as it is about strokes. Whether you're a weekend warrior or an aspiring league champion, these five strategies can elevate your doubles game:

1. Dominate the Net

Control of the net often decides doubles matches. When both players move forward together, they cut off angles and force opponents into risky lobs or errors. Practice split-stepping and volleying in sync with your partner.

2. Prioritize a High First Serve Percentage

Starting a point with a strong, well-placed first serve immediately puts pressure on returners. Instead of going for

risky aces, aim for consistency and placement—especially targeting the weaker returner or setting up your partner at the net. A high first serve percentage allows your team to dictate play and keep opponents on the defensive.

3. Poach with Purpose

A well-timed poach can instantly change momentum. Don't just guess—read your opponents' body language and anticipate their shot. Communicate with your partner so the server knows when you plan to cross and cover.

4. Use Lobs Strategically

The lob isn't just a defensive shot—it's a weapon. Mix in topspin lobs over aggressive net players to push them back and create openings. Following a lob with a quick transition to the net can give your team the upper hand.

5. Communicate Constantly

The best doubles teams talk between every point. Decide who takes middle balls, call out switches, and offer encouragement. Non-verbal signals—like hand gestures behind the back—help plan tactics without tipping off opponents.

By combining these strategies, players can make doubles more dynamic and fun while winning more matches.





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

PICKLEBALL TIP

Control the Middle - Own the Game



Pickleball Tip" By Alex Mabred, Head Pickleball **Professional**

In doubles, the team that controls the middle often controls the point. Why? Because most shots that land in the center are lower-risk and harder to poach or attack. Here's how to take advantage:

• Communicate Early – Call "mine" or "yours" to avoid

confusion and hesitation.

- Paddle Up & Ready -Expect the next shot to come fast and straight down the middle.
- Forehand Takes the Middle - When in doubt, the player with the forehand in the middle usually has the easier play.
- Avoid the Dead Zone -Balls that land between you and your partner can cause indecision. Step in with confidence and close the

Pro Tip: When you're in a tight rally, play a soft, controlled dink toward the middle—it neutralizes angles and resets the point in your favor.

As the saying goes, "Down the middle solves the riddle."

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



Croquet Tip: Borderline Position in a Hoop

Here is a tip to consider while you're on the court and experiencing one of these "borderline" moments:

If a ball is determined to be on the borderline between having run a hoop or not, the ball has run the hoop! Likewise, for a ball playing back through a hoop to scoring position, the ball ends in a borderline position, it can score the hoop on the next turn. In a borderline case, the decision favors the ball owner.



Conventions You Should Learn & Know

Level One:

Stayman, Jacoby Transfers, Texas Transfers, Limit Raises, Weak Two Bids, Negative Doubles, Unusual 2NT, Weak Jump Overcalls, Michaels Cue Bid, Blackwood, Gerber, DOPI. Jacoby 2NT, Splinter Raises, New Minor Forcing, 4th Suit Forcing to Game.

Level Two:


Minor Suit Transfers/Stayman, Preemptive Raises, Reverse Drury, Suit Responsive Doubles, Maximal Doubles, A conventional defense to 1NT openings (Meckwell is my preference), Jordan 2NT, Key Card Blackwood, DEPO.

Level Three:

Lebensohl, Smolen, 1NT Forcing (or semi-forcing), Any system over Reverses, Inverted Minors, McCabe Adjunct over Weak Two Bids, 4th Suit Forcing, Unusual/ Unusual, Support Doubles, Puppet Stayman (3C) over 1NT.

Beyond Level 3 are numerous expert treatments and agreements (Exclusion Blackwood, BART, Upside Down Count and Attitude, etc.) but if you and your partner can get through the lists above, you are certainly well on your way to potential confusion. Despite these recommendations, I totally agree with the 90-year-old advice quoted:

"For those players ambitious to improve, I should proffer the following advice: study card valuation, develop your imagination, rely on your common sense, and adopt as few conventions as possible." – Lelia Hattersley, Contract Developments, 1928.
