Board Approves Spa Expansion

Plans to renovate and expand the Ocean Reef Spa started following the 2020 Member Census, which highlighted just how vital the Spa is to the overall Member experience. Spa improvements consistently arise in Member Satisfaction Surveys and have remained a top priority ever since.

Last month, this long-awaited project received approval from the Ocean Reef Board of Directors and construction is set to begin in June.

Why Expand the Spa?

In response to consistent Member feedback, Club Management conducted a deepdive review into spa operations.

"We wanted to be sure that if we were going to embark on this project, that this is what the Members truly wanted and that it be done right - checking every box and meeting the needs of our Members," said Alex Tonarelli, ORC President. "We carefully reviewed all Member feedback, brought in an experienced spa consultant, toured a number of leading spa facilities, and used all of that insight to shape a clear and effective expansion plan."

To ensure a comprehensive approach, the Club enlisted Spa Strategy, a nationally-recognized consulting group, to analyze six months of data and validate the Club's findings. The next step was partnering with OZ Architecture, a firm with more than 200 spa projects completed around the world. Together, the team defined the goals of the expansion:

- 1. Meet Member Demand with a First-Class
 Experience Above all, the goal is to accommodate more Members while elevating the Spa experience to the level expected at Ocean Reef.
- 2. Expand and Enhance Key Spaces Including arrival, relaxation, locker rooms, changing areas, and retail, based directly on Member input.
- 3. Offer More Privacy
 Options While the current
 Spa is primarily coed, the
 renovation will introduce
 separate men's and women's
 locker, changing, and
 relaxation areas, including
 dedicated steam and sauna
 spaces.

What Are the Plans for Expansion?

The Spa will expand into the parking area next to the Fitness

Pool, creating a 12,000-square-foot, two-story addition, which will integrate with the newly-renovated existing Spa, making a stunning 21,000-square-feet Spa facility.

The parking area will move to the site of the current ORCAT building (once ORCAT relocates to its new home near Wynn's), allowing space for 60 to 65 vehicles.

This expansion will not only modernize the facility but also significantly increase

appointment availability, both for standing and on-demand bookings.

Where Will Services Be During Construction?

Construction begins in June, once a permit is approved, and is expected to continue through summer 2026. During this time, Spa services will remain fully operational in temporary locations across The Reef:

• Hair, manicure, and pedicure services will be

offered at the Sunrise Villa (101 Andros, next to the Marlin Inn/Lagoon) or at the Residence Club Salon.

- Massage and facial services will relocate to the Marina Fitness Center, which will temporarily operate as the Marina Spa, or to the Residence Club Salon.
- Barber services will remain in the Member Fitness Center building.
- Fitness equipment from the Marina Fitness Center will temporarily move to the Yacht Club Room above the Dockmaster's Office.

Members scheduling back-toback appointments should allow extra travel time as your services may take place in different areas of The Reef.

The Spa is a valued amenity at Ocean Reef, and this renovation ensures it will continue to exceed expectations for years to come. Stay tuned for more updates as the project progresses.

Memberabilia Russell Post....

An Ocean Reef Mover & Shaker

For more than 50 years Russ Post's involvement with Ocean Reef has taken precedence over almost everything else in his life.... In 1974 he became General Manager of the evolving Ocean Reef Club and from 1980 until 1991 he served as the President. In the ensuing years he earned the reputation as Ocean Reef's most successful realtor and as an unstinting supporter of the ORC, not only financially but also with his time and energy.

The year was 1974 and Russ was only 25 years old.... "I had energy but no focus."

Three years before he was just another college graduate and Vietnam vet looking for a job.

His hometown in Indiana was not an option. The choice there was either a factory or a farm and he had no interest in either of them.

Russ decided to move on. He debated between California and Florida and Florida won.

"I had to make a living and I took any job that was available. But every Wednesday I quit painting houses or whatever, dressed in a suit and tie and answered help wanted ads."

On one of those fateful Wednesdays Russ interviewed at Ocean Reef and was offered an entry level job in the Controller's office at the princely wage of \$2.10 an hour. (He did not, as rumor has it, begin as a bell boy. Although he is convinced that he would have made more money if the rumor had been true.)

Russ came to Ocean Reef when the Club was just leaving the cocoon and becoming a butterfly. Harper Sibley (co-owner with Morris Burke) designed a plan for the transformation of Ocean Reef into what he described as "an extremely exclusive private family club".

The extent of the proposed changes stunned the Ocean Reef Members and taxed the existing management. It was a perfect storm for a bright, ambitious, and hardworking young man and Russ, who had already been promoted to the Reservations Desk, was positioned to take advantage of it.

Still Russ was surprised when Harper Sibley (whom he scarcely knew) invited him for a drink and announced "I could run this place but I don't have time. My General Manager is drunk by three in the afternoon. You are here morning to night and you make good decisions. Do you think you can handle the job?"

Russ's response was immediate

– "I was 25 years old and didn't
know my ass from first base, but
that didn't stop me. I said 'Mr.
Sibley, I'll do it. I'll figure it out and
I only hope you are patient.,"

Of course, Russ did "figure it out" but the challenge required a full-time commitment. For Russell Post it was the beginning of a lifetime involvement with Ocean Reef Club.

The day after his conversation with Harper Sibley, Russ woke up with a list of responsibilities that even today he finds difficult to believe.

"I had 500 employees. I was in charge of managing – the Inn; rentals; restaurants; bars; recreation; marina; roads; security; sewers; water treatment– plus every new project that came along. And there were plenty of them."

Russ was on board for the construction of the Hammock (now Harbor) golf course and the Barracuda (now Card Sound) golf course; the tennis center; Fishing Village with new retail outlets; relocated employee housing; refurbished hotel rooms; Snapper Point development; creation of the

Art League, the first resident M.D. The list is endless.

Russell Post suffered through some bad times at Ocean Reef – financial crises, management changes, hurricanes. But mostly he remembers the good times.

"In the 70s the routine was to have cocktails at the Reef Lounge, dinner at the Ocean Room or in Key Largo, often at Marvin's – a very offbeat and insider restaurant (cash only and no reservation unless recommended by a regular). Marvin cooked with the help of many of his patrons ('I was always assigned to frying the bread'). His wife Dottie, who had a mouth like a longshoreman, did everything else, aided by just one busboy."

"The evenings usually ended with night caps back at the Ocean Reef Lounge. The Club was smaller in those days and the Members all knew each other. There was great comradery, and the Lounge was where we congregated."

In this period the ORC was also host to some important visitors.

In 1979 General Alexander Haig, jr., then the White House Chief of Staff under President Nixon (he later became Reagan's Sec. of State) brought the conference of NATO Defense Ministers to ORC. Russ was helpful to the General and their relationship evolved into a friendship. In subsequent years Russ encouraged General Haig to schedule meetings and vacations at The Reef. (Russ named his son Alex after the General.)

Russell Post also shared some unforgettable meals and late-night after-dinner drinks with Richard Nixon, who came to Ocean Reef as the guest of his confidante Bebe Rebozo. On more than one of Nixon's visits to Ocean Reef, Russ joined the former president and Bebe Rebozo for those ritual after-dinner drinks. "Once we saw the sun rise and were served breakfast by the chef, who came in at 3:30 a.m. to prep for the coming day."

Russ is a great storyteller. One favorite celebrity tale is of Sammy Davis Jr., who one Christmas was alone on his boat, which was docked at the Marina.

There was an Ocean Reef holiday party and Russ invited Sammy to come, assuring him there would be no piano and they were not expecting him to entertain. "Twenty minutes after he arrived, he asked us to bring in a piano and it was 'show time'. An evening none of us lucky to be there will ever forget."

After the member buyout in 1991 Russell Post decided it was time to become his own boss and he started Russell Post Properties. He specialized in buying, selling and renting properties at Ocean Reef Club, it's a task that he has continued to do in one way or another for the past 30 years.

Very quickly Russ Post's name became synonymous with Ocean Reef real estate sales. He built a company filled with loyal employees (many of whom he trained and supported when they formed their own organizations).

For four years he served as President of Ocean Reef Club Sotheby's. In 2018 the Club purchased the company from him. He set up an office at ORC Sotheby's and along with his partner Molly Taylor, he continues to offer real estate services to Ocean Reef Members.

He will also be a frequent commuter to his other existing offices in Islamorada, Marathon and Key West.

Over the years Russell Post has managed the sale of OR

real estate with intelligence, ingenuity and an unparalleled work ethic.

Russ has also been a major donor to the Medical Center, the Cultural Center, the Art League, the Chapel and The Academy at Ocean Reef, where his three children received their early education.

At the Club's Annual Meeting the 2025 Spirit of Ocean Reef award was presented to Russell Post for his involvement in The Academy at Ocean Reef, where he has served as Chairman of the Board for countless years.

The Club, as well as a significant number of Members, have reason to be grateful that Russell Post "found his focus" at Ocean Reef.

Thank you, Russ.

A Toast to Tradition

Recognizing Patron Members

On April 23, the Board of Directors offered a toast of gratitude to the Club's Patron Members. This new tradition was created to recognize an integral piece of Ocean Reef Club's history – Patron Membership. In 1993, when the Acquisition Committee needed to raise \$58 million to purchase the Club, the idea of Patron Membership was born. At the time, there were two tiers of Equity Membership offered, with Patron Members paying a significantly larger sum and receiving Club benefits. It is certain, Ocean Reef Club would not be what it is today had it not been for the support of this group of longtime Members.

ORCA Enhances Stormwater Management & Resiliency Planning

The NKLUC and ORCA Vulnerability Assessment Committee (NOVA) are actively investing in the long-term sustainability and resilience of Ocean Reef. In alignment with a 2023 plan developed by expert consulting engineers, NOVA is proactively assessing infrastructure to ensure it remains strong and reliable in the face of changing environmental conditions such as seasonal storms and higher tides.

Key areas of focus include roadways, bridges, stormwater systems, water supply, essential community facilities, and communication and electrical systems. As part of its forward-



looking 20-year strategy, ORCA is prioritizing enhancements to roadway drainage and incorporating advanced stormwater management solutions into new home construction—reinforcing Ocean Reef's commitment to maintaining a safe, vibrant, and future-ready community.

Both ORCA and Monroe County require that new housing projects include a detailed plan to manage stormwater. Specifically, the plan must ensure that all post-construction stormwater is captured and retained on-site. This is achieved by grading the lot in accordance with the approved plan and installing swales, catch basins, and French drains. For existing homes, homeowners should install swales along the length of their front property adjacent to the roadway to capture runoff from the street. The roadways are intentionally sloped to direct stormwater to both sides, reducing the risk of hazardous driving conditions.

Homeowners with ponding in the streets in front of their properties have several options to address the issue:

- Installing a swale along the length of the front property adjacent to the roadway.
- 2. Installing a swale with aggregate at the bottom to promote infiltration into the ground.
- 3. Installing catch basins or

drainage wells at low points.

4. Installing catch basins or drainage wells with a French drain system, which involves a perforated pipe placed in an aggregate trench.

Details of these four options can be found in the <u>Contractors</u> <u>Section</u> of the ORCA website at <u>orcareef.com/contractors/.</u>

Additionally, ORCA has increased its budget to install catch basins for roadway flooding, having already installed 11 this year. After heavy rainfall events, ORCA will survey roadways to identify areas with insufficient drainage. This ongoing process is part of a broader long-term effort to safeguard infrastructure from future climate-related risks.

A Hero Under Fire:

Jack Jacobs' **Extraordinary Courage** in Vietnam

In the spring of 1968, in the heat of the Vietnam War, First Lieutenant Jack Jacobs led his platoon across a dry rice field in Kien Phong Province. The Brooklyn-born soldier, who originally planned to serve just three years before attending law school, would instead find himself at the center of one of the war's most extraordinary acts of heroism.

As assistant battalion advisor to the 2nd Battalion, 16th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division of the Army of the Republic of Vietnam, Jacobs and his men were advancing to make contact with the enemy when disaster struck. For weeks, intelligence had indicated that Viet Cong forces were increasing their presence in the area. What had been sporadic action months before had intensified, and combat soldiers sensed something significant was coming, even as higher command disagreed with their assessment.

Suddenly and without warning, the lead companies encountered devastating enemy fire from well-entrenched bunkers. Jack instantly realized they were trapped in a killing field. Within seconds, his entire lead company was hit. Ramirez, his number two man, had severe chest wounds with air audibly escaping from the injuries. Jack himself took a head wound and had to continuously wipe blood from his eyes to see while reporting the situation over his radio.

Despite profuse bleeding from his head and face wounds which severely impaired his vision, Captain Jacobs assumed

command of the allied company, ordered a withdrawal from their exposed position, and established a defensive perimeter.

With adrenaline surging, Jack wrapped Ramirez's chest as best he could and began dragging him to a small copse of trees about 50 yards away, still under intense enemy fire. After temporarily stabilizing Ramirez in this relative shelter, Jack heard the moans of other wounded platoon members.

Despite his injuries and impaired vision, Jacobs repeatedly ran across open rice paddies through heavy fire to evacuate the wounded. He returned fire with his M16 as he moved, found another soldier in a bomb crater, applied a bandage to his own forehead to clear his vision, and after stabilizing the wounded man, dragged him back to safety.

Four more times, Jack ventured out into the killing field, each time eliminating enemy soldiers while rescuing his wounded comrades. Eventually, the blood loss took its toll, and his adrenaline reserves depleted. A medical evacuation helicopter arrived at great risk, loaded Jack and the other casualties, and departed the hot zone. Several wounded soldiers died en route, but Jack and Ramirez survived.

For his extraordinary gallantry, Jacobs was awarded the Medal of Honor, the United States' highest military decoration. His actions had saved the lives of one U.S. advisor and thirteen allied soldiers. In the years following, Jack would undergo multiple

surgeries on his nose and face to repair the damage from his combat injuries.

After the war, Colonel Jacobs continued his remarkable career, serving as a faculty member at the United States Military Academy at West Point, teaching international relations and comparative politics, and later at the National War College in Washington, D.C. He retired from the Army in 1987 as a colonel.

Today, Colonel Jack Jacobs serves as a military analyst for MSNBC and remains active in veterans' affairs. In 2008, he published his memoir, "If Not Now, When?: Duty and Sacrifice In America's Time of Need," which won the 2010 Colby Award for its contribution to the public's understanding of intelligence operations, military history, and international affairs.

Recently, Ocean Reef was honored to welcome this

American hero, as Colonel Jacobs visited alongside a group of Navy SEALs for special demonstrations showcasing the elite military unit's extraordinary capabilities. The SEALs' impressive display of tactical skills captivated those in attendance, but equally memorable was the opportunity to share time with a living Medal of Honor recipient.

This writer was fortunate enough to experience a truly once-in-a-lifetime opportunity playing a round of golf with Colonel Jacobs himself. Throughout the day on the greens, his humility, sharp wit, and remarkable life perspectives provided insights far beyond the extraordinary heroism documented in his service record. Despite the weight of his historical achievements, Jacobs carries himself with the unassuming demeanor that often characterizes the nation's most decorated heroes.

A Mother's Work

Never Done

Hungry at the end of the day, a 15-year-old found his mother in bed and was suddenly seized with great concern: "Gosh, Mom, are you sick or something?"
"Well, as a matter of fact," the woman replied weakly, "I'm not feeling too well." "Gee, I'm sorry Mom," the boy responded with a furrowed brow. "Don't you worry a bit about dinner. I'm getting pretty big now, and I'll be happy to carry you down to the stove!"

Mothers don't get much of a break, do they? Between provisioning her soldiers, handling firefights, keeping sand out of the barracks, and continually arranging troop transport, most mothers must feel something like weary warriors. Speaking of one such woman, the Book of Proverbs says, "...her lamp does not go out at night" (Prov 31:18). Or, as a more familiar maxim puts it: "A man's work is from sun to sun, but a mother's work is never done!"

When you get right down to it, moms are on the front lines of a battle with work and worry that challenges more than just mothers today. Our weekly schedules and portable devices betray our fear that unless we take charge of

every little detail, schedule some meaningful activity into every little space, stay available to all the people who may need to reach us, we'll fall behind.

Even those of us who are not hyper-programmed often live with an inner voice that reminds us that our kids, job, grades, garden, or golf game, would somehow turn out much better if we just worked longer or tried harder or practiced more.

Work is Good

Don't get me wrong, here. Work is a wonderful thing. Work is one of the ways we imitate the creativity of God, the Master Workman. Whether it is in mothering or managing a portfolio, our work is part of how we make ourselves available to God as instruments He can use to advance His purposes.

The Bible teaches: "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed" of his or her work (2 Tim 2:15). As we undertake this calling, however, it is helpful to retain a sense of balance about what we can control and what we cannot. Without this clarity, even the best work—parenting, for example—eventually becomes a gauntlet of weariness and worry.

Wanted: A Savior

There are moments when many of us feel like the salvation of our children, business, nation, or other significant cause is all up to us. If God just created the world and then went on permanent holiday—as the 18th century Deists and some today have

believed—then there would be little reason NOT to lose ourselves in frenzied labor over the course of human life and history.

The Bible, however, describes reality differently than that.
Genesis 2 reads: "Thus the heavens and the earth were completed in all their vast array. By the seventh day God had finished the work he had been doing; so on the seventh day he rested."

I find it helpful to read that text closely. The Bible says that in creating the world, God completed... not all that he wanted to do... not all that he was going to do... God simply "finished the work he had been doing," and then took a break. The God we meet in Genesis is like a master painter, so filled with the grand vision of what He is going to create, that when he has sketched in the barest outline of his ultimate masterpiece, the sheer promise of it all drives him back from the canvas for a moment simply to admire his work.

He's Not Done Yet

But make no mistake about it, the Master paints on. God would no sooner leave the final fate of our children—or any of the other precious concerns we agonize over—entirely in our hands alone, than Michelangelo would have left the completion of the Sistine Chapel ceiling to the Church Building Committee.

Without a doubt, we have a meaningful role to play in the life of our family members, community, and nation, but we need to keep reminding ourselves that we are bristles in the brush that God holds in His sure hand. And all those amazing coincidences of life, those apparent tragedies, those surprising twists of fate you have experienced are but the colors of his perfect palette. There is no corner of the canvas of your life, or the life of your loved ones, for which God does not have a glorious plan. One day, the Master will take His servants to a place where we will weep tears of joy at the genius of His redemptive work.

So, moms, thank you for doing your best. But give your biggest worries about your children's and grandchildren's ultimate welfare to God. He'll be up all night anyway, waiting for them to come home.

Establishing Healthy Sleep Patterns

Having a hard time falling asleep, experiencing frequent sleep disturbances and suffering daytime sleepiness are the most telling signs of poor sleep habits. This overall lack of consistency in sleep quantity or quality can be a telling sign of poor sleep habits when not related to a medical condition.

Decide on a bedtime and wakeup time that are most conducive to your schedule and stick to them daily. Following a consistent sleep schedule helps train your brain to naturally feel tired at bedtime and reset your circadian rhythm.

Establishing a daily bedtime routine in advance of your sleep schedule helps create habits that signal your brain it's time to sleep. This can include turning off electronics such as your

computer and cell phone, reading a book, meditation or listening to soothing sounds that promote sleep. If you find your mind is preoccupied with something you don't want to forget, write it down, so it's not a recurrent thought to keep you awake. Alcohol, caffeine and sugar can also cause sleep disruption, so be thoughtful on the timing of consumption.

There are many medications and/or medical conditions that can cause sleeping problems, so it's important to address these concerns to your primary care physician. Getting adequate sleep is essential to supporting healthy brain function and physical health.

A drone light show is a collection of UAV (Unmanned Aerial Vehicles) operating in a planned sequence to display 3D images, animations, and lighting. The drones are controlled by a computer program that gives specific commands and communicates to the drones via a radio signal. The ground control engineers monitor each drone that is fully charged and then readied carefully for its flight.

- The drones can fly up to 400 feet above ground level.

• Drones cannot fly in the rain or in windy conditions.



Academy Students Learn About Coral

On April 22, Earth Day, 4ththrough 8th-grade Academy students received a hands-on lesson about coral fragmentation from Ken Nedimeyer, the Director of Reef Renewal.

Mr. Nedimeyer has lived in Key Largo for over 50 years and has four daughters. He has a degree in Marine Biology and recounted that in the 1970s, the Florida Keys coral reef was an "underwater paradise." Not so much the case today.

Ken and his daughter, who was 13 years old at the time, started the country's first ocean-based coral farm. His daughter was inspired to do it as a 4H project during her homeschooling. Ken said, "You don't need to be a rocket scientist or an adult" to learn how to grow coral. This

shows that even children can make a huge difference in saving our reefs.

During Mr. Nedimeyer and his team's visit, we learned how to plug small porcelain disks into a coral-growing grid. Next, students actually sawed coral using a bandsaw with a diamond-dusted blade. Luckily, Ken demonstrated that while the bandsaw may be able to cut through hard coral, it is not able to penetrate human skin! Last but not least, students learned how to glue coral onto the

aforementioned growing trays. The baby boulder coral will be planted at Carysfort Reef within a year

Leidy Piloto Gimeno, a 5th-grade student, had this to say about the experience, "It was interesting when they explained how they grow coral and the machines, which couldn't cut you, but were able to cut coral."

Another student, Josh Lyons, a 7th-grade student, said, "I worry about the wellbeing of coral, but with more programs like this, we can get coral back to full health."



An icon can be a person or thing that can be seen as a symbol of a particular era, culture, belief or place. Ocean Reef public art includes three sculptures that we can consider symbols of our community and its location in the Upper Keys. The Peering Panther, Lady Angler and Sandhill Cranes in Repose. All three are the work of sculptor Gregory Johnson who has not only shared his talent by creating works of art but also by sharing his passion and knowledge with sculpture students as a visiting instructor here at the Art League for 15 years.

Gregory is a master of both traditional and contemporary sculpture. Born and raised in Chicago, he began his early training at the Art Institute of Chicago. After studying sculpture, painting and art history for six years and spending a summer touring art museums through an International Studies Program, he graduated from Illinois State University with

a Masters of Science in Art. In 1981 he moved to the Southeast, where his sculpture can be found in many public art collections in North Carolina, Georgia and Florida. Other works can be found in museums, and corporate and private collections throughout the United States, Europe, Costa Rica and the Middle East.

His Peering Panther, found near the Water Garden, was sculpted in 2011 and was donated by The Garden Group at Ocean Reef and Ike and Carol Belk. Slow down as you approach the Water Garden on Anchor Drive and you'll see this magnificent symbol of the Florida wilderness. To truly appreciate the power of this piece, turn left off Gate House Road behind the Water Garden in your golf cart and stop on the path to get up close and personal.

The Sandhill Cranes in Repose welcome you to the Art League building. The work was sculpted in 2010 and donated by Irwin

and Carol Belk. You can almost imagine the sound of their loud, rattling bugle calls.







Chef Betania's Kitchen

Pesto Potato Salad Serves Six to Eight Pesto Yield: One Cup



by Betania Salles, Carysfort Kitchen Chef de Cuisine

You still can find beautiful spring veggies at Wynn's, so take advantage and try this amazing Potato Salad. You can also substitute the beans for asparagus if you like; it would taste amazing as well.

Ingredients for Pesto:

- 2 1/2 3 cups basil leaves (preferably small leaves)
- 1 garlic clove, smashed and roughly chopped
- 3 tbsp. pine nuts
- 1/2 cup olive oil, divided, plus more as needed



- 6 tbsp. grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 tbsp. grated pecorino cheese
- pinch of fine sea salt

Pesto Directions:

- Before you begin: Freeze the bowl and blade of your food processor (or blender) for 30 minutes. Refrigerate the olive oil for 30 minutes. This will prevent the basil from oxidizing.
- Add the garlic, pine nuts and 2 tbsp. of oil to the food processor. Pulse a few times until minced. Scrape down the sides of the bowl.
- Add the basil leaves and another 2 tbsp. of oil. Pulse until finely chopped. Add the cheeses.

- With the machine running, slowly stream in the rest of the olive oil and blend until creamy. Scrape the pesto into a bowl.
- Taste, and adjust seasoning with salt, if needed. Stir in more olive oil to loosen the texture, if needed. It shouldn't be too thick.


Ingredients for Salad:

- 2 tbsp. pine nuts
- 3 lbs. baby or fingerling potatoes, halved
- coarse sea salt (like Maldon)
- 8 oz. haricot verts, trimmed
- 8 oz. sugar snap peas, trimmed
- 2 tbsp. pecorino or Parmigiano Reggiano, freshly grated
- 1 cup fresh basil leaves

Salad Directions:

- In a small skillet, toast the pine nuts over medium heat until golden brown, three to four minutes. Transfer to a plate to cool.
- In a medium saucepan, cover the potatoes with cold water and place over high heat.

- Season generously with salt. Bring to a boil, then reduce the heat to a simmer and cook until potatoes are tender, about 20 minutes. Drain and cool.
- Meanwhile, bring a large pot of heavily salted water to boil. Season with 1 tbsp. of salt per quart of water. Prepare a large bowl with ice water. Add the green beans to the boiling water and blanch for two minutes or until bright green and crunchy.
- Using a slotted spoon, transfer the beans to the ice water to stop them from cooking further. Add the snap peas to the pot and blanch for one minute, or until bright green and crunchy. Transfer to the ice water to cool. Drain the beans and peas.
- In a large salad bowl, toss the potatoes, green beans, and sugar snap peas with 3/4 cup of the pesto and season with a pinch of salt. Garnish with the pine nuts and cheese, and basil leaves. Place the remaining pesto on top of the salad.

See the layout for the standard croquet court:







It is important to note that there are north, south, east, and west boundaries in croquet. This is helpful to know especially as it will always be the case regardless of the orientation of the court.

Rule 2.2 Boundaries

2.2.1- The boundaries are known as the north, south, east and west boundaries, regardless of the geographical orientation of the court (see diagram).

The boundaries are to be clearly marked, the inner edge of the marking defines the

actual boundary. Now you know your orientation, no matter where you're standing!

Commodore Chip Hillyer's calendar was packed with on-the-water fun and new destinations. It was a grand season!



This year Bud Copeland and Ignacio Borbolla, Range co-chairs, have added wobble traps and handgun ranges. Next year will see added amenities at the Range — shadeprotection on the handgun range, and an added berm to separate fields. Members have responded in droves, with almost 400 shooters blasting 1200 rounds

at the Range, or 30,000 clays broken! Next year, one of the top sporting clays instructors, Anthony Matarese Jr, will be available for lessons.

The club has brought gun specialists for a Gun Show at the Range, to demonstrate the best wares in both new arms and embellishment old weapons, and the show will be repeated next year, larger than ever. Outside our own range, this year the R&G introduced sporting clays trips to Markham Park, which were immediate hits. Next year will see more of these, but also a golf and sporting clays trip to one of the large sporting clays facilities, such as the South Florida Shooting Club, with a competition, golf, and clays. Organized by **Had** Fuller, Quail hunting trips to the Lightsey's Family Ranch were very popular and quickly filled up. Next year will see more of these, as well as possibly a dove hunting trip to Estancia las Palmas in Argentina.

In fishing, the Rod and Gun Club's **Ken Reda** runs fishing contests every month that are designed to highlight the fish in our local waters. Anyone can win with a good-sized grouper, wahoo, dolphin or snapper. Bigger quarry means bigger tournaments, where Rod and Gun members vie for Reef Cup glory. More sociable relations are cultivated at overnight fishing trips to the Everglades at Flamingo Lodge and next year, hopefully farther afield at Casa Vieja Lodge in Guatemala.

Some fishermen don't have to go far afield or band up in numbers to find the ideal fishing experience. Long-time Rod and Gun Club member **Russ Fisher** reports a spectacular year of going out just with his guide and chasing the elusive bonefish. This year, Russ caught 100 bonefish! He reports that the fishing is getting better every year, and the bones are not just more numerous, but also larger, and we all know that bigger is better...

April 24, 2025: The Ocean Reef Community Foundation awards Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 13-04 more than \$6,000 of funding towards boating safety initiatives.

We would like to thank the Ocean Reef Community Foundation and its donors for supporting our efforts to improve local boating safety and emergency preparedness. Other than dues from volunteer members, our Flotilla relies on community and individual support, and we are grateful for this significant contribution.

The grant enables us to continue to provide free boating safety classes and materials, to install a new Communications Facility supporting emergency networks, and to equip Surface Facilities (Flotilla vessels) with operational equipment.

expanding its ranks, with 15 new members since January, and we continue to recruit, train and enroll additional volunteers. Our unit is training new and tenured members in practical Coast Guard certifications to increase the variety, frequency and amplitude of our boating safety initiatives.

By November we anticipate having three Coast Guard certified member-owned vessels as Surface Facilities available for patrols. We are training boat crews and Coxswains for these at-sea operations. Close ties with the Coast Guard at Station Islamorada allows us to understand how best to provide relevant logistical support.

We have increased the number of public education instructors and classes, and class attendance locally and outside our gate is growing. New this year is a guest presenter program focusing on topics of maritime interest for the entire Ocean Reef community.

We are training additional Vessel Examiners to augment the number of private boats inspected locally as well as initiating safety checks at rental boat fleets within Ocean Reef and the Upper Keys.


A new radio communications facility at Ocean Reef is being planned, to relay and enhance

emergency communications within our area of responsibility.

The Ocean Reef Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla was founded in 1972 and has actively served our community and neighbors for more than 50 years. An Interview With Steve Levin

MFC Swimming
Member of the Season

Steve Levin is our Member of the Season for Swimming. He regularly attends the ORC Swim Club sessions with Coach Jon Olsen and participates in numerous gym classes, such as "Sweat" and "Cycle Strength." Steve is thoughtful and cheerful, making him an MFC favorite among Members and associates. We asked Steve to tell us about his love for swimming and fitness.

Tell us about your fitness history. What sports did you play growing up, and when did you start swimming?

My heroes as a kid were Johnny Weissmuller swimming faster than crocs as "Tarzan", Lloyd Bridges in "Sea Hunt", Jacques Cousteau, and Mark Spitz—a bit of a water theme there. Lucky for me, the town pool was less

than a block away. There, I could feel my talent and challenge my friends who were great at baseball and hoops. The end of summer pool celebration was the release of hundreds of goldfish we dove to catch and take home for the winter. When I got to high school, I joined the swim team and swam freestyle distance and butterfly. The workouts were grueling, and there was a sense of camaraderie as everyone went through the toughness together. As a competitive swimmer, you learn to exercise alone. You're on a team, but it's all you when you're in the water. In college and law school, I became a runner, doing 6-8 miles a day, and kept that up for decades until my knees dictated that I head back to the pool. I attribute my success as a runner to endurance gained in my younger years in the pool.

What is your current fitness routine?

I love the fitness opportunities at ORC. I swim in the ORC Swim program, coached by 4-time gold medalist Ion Olsen, twice a week. The workouts include stroke drills, HIIT interval training, and endurance swims. Jon powers the workouts by blasting Phish and The Grateful Dead. I enjoy the core group of swimmers, Susanne Kramer and Bill Salisbury. We push each other to swim better each time. I combine the "Sweat" class with "Cycle Strength" when I don't swim. Both classes have a positive impact on my swimming and overall fitness.

Tell us more about the role that swimming plays in your life, health, and fitness, and any swimming events you have participated in or are considering participating in.

Swimming plays many roles in my life. It provides a place to exercise without joint trauma, peaceful meditation, a place to solve problems quietly, or respite from them. I enjoy meeting fellow swimmers at the Fitness Pool and getting their life swimming stories. I've met brand new swimmers to D1 College athletes, and it's enjoyable to find their connection to swimming.

Swimming provides a path back to youth and vitality, which I've loved since childhood. And it connects to the earth, marine life, and the ocean. I've been a scuba diver for over 50 years, and keeping fit in the water is essential for safe diving.

What message do you have for fellow Members considering swimming as a fitness activity?

If you're looking for an exercise that will strengthen your cardiovascular health with minimal trauma and much joy, get in the pool. Do not be intimidated about showing up to be coached by Jon Olsen; even if you've never swum, he will help get you comfortable in the water.

Anything else that you would like to add:

Yes, definitely! Watching the sport of swimming is incredibly exciting. The last Olympics were spellbinding, called by the great Rowdy Gaines and our own Mike Tirico. If you haven't yet watched competitive swimming, I recommend you take 3 minutes and watch on YouTube the greatest swimming relay of all time: the 2008 Beijing Olympics 4 x 100 Men's Freestyle Relay. The French team, anchored by Alain "The Horse" Bernard, famously said: "The Americans? We will smash them." Michael Phelps led off for us. I leave it to you to watch the Great Race. I get chills thinking about it.




