



ORCA NEWS

Managing Invasive Iguanas at Ocean Reef

In Florida, iguanas are classified as an invasive species. As the weather warms up, these reptiles become increasingly active, and during this time of year, it's common to see them digging holes in Ocean Reef golf course sand traps or sandy-soil areas as they search for places to lay their eggs.

Understanding the reproductive cycle of iguanas helps explain their seasonal behavior and the urgency of management efforts. The breeding season typically begins in late fall to early winter (November–January), followed by the egg-laying period in May and June. A single female can

lay between 20 and 70 eggs in one season. These eggs incubate for about 65 to 90 days, depending on environmental factors such as temperature and humidity. As a result, eggs laid in May usually hatch between late July and early September—adding to the population just in time for peak summer activity.

To manage this growing issue, ORCA contracts Iguana Control, a professional wildlife control service that specializes in the humane removal of iguanas, compliant with Florida state law. Their trained technicians use compressed air guns equipped with tactical optical sights—commonly known as pellet guns—to safely and effectively manage the population. The removal is conducted from a short, controlled distance, with the operator aiming from below the hip to always prioritize safety. This method of iguana control is proven to be effective.

For the privacy and protection of homeowners, ORCA does not permit the contracted vendor to enter private property. However, if you're experiencing issues with iguanas on your own lot, you are welcome to hire Iguana Control directly or consult with other licensed experts in the area for private removal services. It's important to note that while pellet guns may appear simple to use, they should only be handled by trained professionals or experienced individuals. Improper use can result in misfired pellets, which pose serious risks of injury or property damage.

ORCA is committed to maintaining the safety, privacy, and overall well-being of the community. By partnering with professional wildlife management services and encouraging homeowners to do the same, we can address the iguana issue without




Time Capsule

The description of the Key Lime Pie could have been









And the Award Goes To

Years ago, while living in Rancho Santa Fe, California, I performed the funeral of a man who'd served as personal attorney for the actor, John Wayne. The service drew a large gathering of people, many from Los Angeles and the world of entertainment. I recognized several famous faces there but the one I remember best was a man in a wheelchair and dark glasses, attended by an aide. His name was Glenn Ford.

Ford was one of the biggest box-office draws of the midtwentieth century, appearing in films like "Gilda" (1946), "The Big Heat" (1953), the "Blackboard Jungle" (1955), and "Pocketful of Miracles" (1961), for which he won a Golden Globe. "Younger" people might remember him as Clark Kent's adoptive farmer father in the original "Superman" (1978) movie.

By many accounts, Glenn Ford was a complicated guy. Brilliant in so many ways, he also skirted the law, secretly taped people, and struggled with sustaining romantic relationships and few people have had so many of them. Wikipedia him and you'll be stunned by all the names you know.

Ford will be remembered by history for his rugged good looks, acting ability, and an ability to woo partners, but there was something more admirable about him that few people probably know.

Glenn Ford wrote thank you notes.

D. Roosevelt had sent Ford a note with an autographed photo when the actor was just 25. It inspired him so much that he later took up the pattern of writing notes to encourage young strivers too.

I know, because he wrote such a note to me, thanking me for the way I'd performed the funeral of his lawyer friend. It was handwritten, heartfelt, and greatly encouraged me during my early years as a pastor. I keep it still.

I'm told that the former CEO of Campbell's Soup took this practice to the next level. Conant is reputed to have written some 30,000 thank-you notes to employees over the course of a decade at Campbell's. He devoted nearly an hour a day to penning these notes, an eternity in the schedule of a Fortune 500 CEO. A busier person still -- President George H.W. Bush (41) -- was renowned for his handwritten thank you notes. Some of YOU may have one of them. Let me know!

Writing missives like this can become a learned practice, even by unlikely people. "Bloomberg Businessweek" carried a cover story in 2014, reporting that Mark Zuckerberg, the founder of Facebook/Meta had set an objective to write "a well-considered thank-you note every day, via e-mail or

handwritten letter." Zuckerberg said: "It's important for me, because I'm a really critical person. I see how I want things to be better, and I'm generally not happy with how things are, or the level of service that we're providing for people, or the quality of the teams that we built." Mark saw thank you notes as a way to build up others and stretch his own heart.

Perhaps It's Time to Write

As the high season comes to a close here on The Reef, maybe it's time to drop a note to express your gratitude to someone who's been a blessing in your life over these past months or much longer.

Is there an associate whose wit, work, or warmth has impressed you? Is there a friend you've enjoyed but

haven't gotten around to telling what it is that you especially appreciate about them? Is it a co-worker, a spouse or a family member whose day might change when they open that envelope and discover that they are more of a star than they knew.

And while we're on the topic, I just want to say thank you to YOU. My wife Amy and I started our life here three months ago today. You didn't know us but you welcomed us. You'd had in Jane and Bob Henley an irreplaceable pair of chaplains, but you opened your hearts to us anyway. You've asked us to share a meal or a concert. You've read some of my ramblings in these articles. You've joined me at the Chapel on Sundays or might just do that sometime in the future. Thank you for that.

Medication Reminders

Below are a few important reminders for Members who may be preparing to leave Ocean Reef for the season.

Medication Disposal:

Standard medications can be brought to the Medical Center to be disposed of safely. Controlled medications such as pain medications, opioids or others should be brought to Public Safety for disposal in the conveniently located medication drop box. All medications brought in for disposal should remain in their original containers.

Needle Disposal: The Medical Center can provide you with bio-hazard containers



If you will be leaving Ocean Reef for the season, it is advisable to follow the medication reminders provided by the Medical Center.

for needles and "sharps," and you can drop off those filled containers at the Medical Center for proper disposal by their contracted bio-hazard waste provider.

Medication Review: Now is a good time to

review medications in your medicine cabinet and check the expiration dates. Expired medications can lose efficiency once past their prime, and this is also true of over-the-counter drugs. Expired eye medications can be especially susceptible

to contamination and harmful bacterial growth, including over-the-counter drops for dry eyes, so check these as well.

Automatic Pharmacy Refills & **Delivery:** Please contact your Key Largo pharmacy and update the instructions for your automatically refilled prescriptions that are picked up by Public Safety. Once picked up by Public Safety, they cannot be returned or refilled by another pharmacy. This could leave you in a dilemma, especially when it's a critically needed medication. The Medical Center can support your off-season prescription needs by electronic communication with your preferred pharmacy.



Bavarian Soft Cheese Dip Serves Six

Well...we are going a little out of the ordinary with this recipe but we made this dip for some Members and there were many requests to share it, so here it is.

It is a delicious cheese dip with a touch of caraway seed which bring a marvelous flavor to the mix. I couldn't find Austrian beer so I used Mexican Negra Modelo instead.

Ingredients:

- 8 oz. Camembert, (or other soft cheese like Brie)
- 8 oz. spreadable cheese, (Original Laughing Cow is perfect)
- 1/3 cup butter
- 2 1/2 tsp. sweet paprika
- 2 tsp. caraway seed, ground
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1/4 cup Negra Modelo beer, (most likely will use a bit less)
- 1/3 cup Vidalia onion, finely diced
- 1 small bunch chives (finely chopped, 2 tbsp. for dip and the rest for garnish)



Directions:

- Bring the Camembert (cut in small pieces), spreadable cheese and butter (cut in small pieces) to room temperature.
- In a mixing bowl add the Camembert, spreadable cheese, butter, paprika, caraway seeds, salt and pepper and beer and press using a fork until well mixed together. Start by adding only 2 tbsp. of the beer and keep adding until you reach the desired consistency (should be spread-like not runny).
- Cover with a lid or plastic wrap and refrigerate for three hours to firm up.
- Just before you are ready to serve take the dip out of the refrigerator.
- Run the diced onion under water (use a strainer) and dry off with paper towel before using.
- Add the diced onion and chopped chives to the dip and fold until they are well incorporated.
- Garnish with the remaining chives.
- Serve with pretzels or thinly sliced onions and radishes or sliced rye bread.



With the help of our gracious host and President of the Cultural Center John Hunt, and his professional sound and




lighting team, our children were delighted to learn how stage microphones worked, and even more excited to learn about makeup and dressing



Dolphin Course Upgrades

in their golf cart. This summer, Director of Agronomy Eric Bennett and his staff will be implementing several repairs and improvements to the courses, which will facilitate Member use and further complement the stunning landscapes.

Work on a beautiful new green for hole #5 of the Dolphin Course begins May 5 and will add 15-20 yards to the hole. Repairs will be made to cart paths on both courses including pruning tree roots that impact turf or the paths. There will be extensive tree work on both courses and vine removal on the Hammock Course. As we do in the summer time, we have landscape upgrades planned for both courses.

Other housekeeping measures to improve play include aerating all greens on both courses, which Bennett feels will be the most impactful cultural practices this summer. "We will include



a 'drill and fill' which provides larger deeper holes with sand injection on the greens." Greens, short grass and rough will benefit from aggressive mowing and top-dressing based on those areas' specific needs. All "cultural practices," or the means by which turf is maintained in pristine condition, will be completed by

November 1, 2025.

When asked if he had any tips for Members on how to keep their personal landscaping green and gorgeous like the golf courses, Bennett said the use of native plants is key as

they offer ease of maintenance and thrive in our harsh summer environment. He notes the best grass choices are Zoysia or St. Augustine. Zoysia has a finer leaf texture and is more aesthetically pleasing but is more difficult to maintain. Both require close to the same amount of watering. He suggests that "appropriate grass choices, proper maintenance and a good variety of native plants will provide a beautiful backdrop for more showy and exotic plants that will capture the eve and become the focal point of the lawn."



Paul Flanigan, A Life of Fitness & Meaning

Paul Flanigan is a lifelong athlete, adventurer, and wellness champion. We wanted to learn more about his fitness and sports history, habits, and what keeps him energized and inspired to keep working hard and challenging himself to stay physically and mentally strong.

Let's start at the beginning. What was your background in sports growing up?

I played almost everything in high school — football, basketball, tennis, lacrosse. I wasn't great at any of them, just average, but I loved to play. I tried to play lacrosse in college but gave it up to focus on my studies. What's always driven me is personal challenge. I've raced bicycles, cars, and sailboats. I've captained boats, scuba and skin dived, flown planes, and ridden motorcycles. I never wanted to look back and say, "I wish I had..."

Have you always been as active and healthy as you are now?

It started when I was a sophomore at Notre Dame. My roommate was a football player and a Chicago weightlifting champion. He introduced me to strength training, and I've never looked back. Even as a young accountant and later in law school, I committed an hour a day to my physical health—lifting or running—and a few minutes to my spiritual health.

That routine has stayed with me through every phase of life: career changes, marriage, kids, and now grandkids. I've been lucky to work out with all of them.

These days, I warm up on a shoulder bike or Peloton, then do eight exercises—three sets each—alternating muscle groups,

with a lap walk between each set. I get about 1.5 miles of walking in per workout. I like my sessions to last around an hour and be of good intensity.

I also ride a hybrid road bike about 25 miles through Ocean Reef roads when I'm here. It gets my heart rate to 130–145 — easier on the knees than running. And now, I'm working toward a 5K by the end of the year. I'm up to jogging a mile at a 12–13 minute pace before my knee complains.

What's one standout memory from your fitness journey?

Years ago, my wife **Michelle** and I used to run about three miles up A1A and walk home on Sunday mornings. One day, I asked her if she wanted to run the Fort Lauderdale Half Marathon with me — she passed, but I signed up.

Unfortunately, we both got food poisoning the night before. It wasn't good. But I thought about my grandfather, a frogman at Normandy Beach on D-Day. I imagined the sea sickness, the nerves. They couldn't call in sick. They were committed. I decided that if he could do that, I could do this. So I hydrated with four bottles of Gatorade, walked to the starting line, and took it one mile at a time. I finished in about 1:50.

That experience reminded me that you are capable of so much more than you think.

What does your wellness routine look like — fitness, nutrition, mindset?

I've been blessed with a strong body, a sharp mind, and a

compassionate heart. Every morning, I spend a few quiet minutes listening for guidance from the Holy Spirit and reflecting on my blessings and the responsibilities that come with them.

I eat and drink everything in moderation. I enjoy wine every night while making dinner for Michelle. I aim for an hour of exercise a day and eight hours of sleep. That's my core.

What advice would you offer to fellow Members and colleagues?

I wouldn't presume to advise anyone here — everyone at Ocean Reef has accomplished so much. But I can share a few

principles that have worked for me:

- Be authentic like Popeye said, "I am what I am."
- Be happy it's a choice.
- Be kind and care for others.
- Don't waste time.
- Be the best you can be; in the time you've got.

Anything else you want to leave us with?

There's a quote from the Navy SEALs I love: "The only easy day was yesterday."

That spirit — showing up, staying strong, and embracing life's challenges — has carried me through it all.

Led Zeppelin for Cruising Couples

When summer cruising season starts, we turn to Led Zeppelin's iconic song, "Whole Lotta Love," to inspire preparations for another ocean odyssey. You probably remember the wisdom of the rocker refrain from 1969 that goes like this:

Wanna Whole Lotta Love Wanna Whole Lotta Love Wanna Whole Lotta Love Wanna Whole Lotta Love

Safety at sea on a doublehanded voyage with your roommate, spouse, partner and co-captain begins with a candid assessment of the crew's physical and mental fitness for navigating your vessel within a challenging geography.

Body batteries must be fully charged and minds fully focused. This shared commitment to preparedness is part of what creates that whole lotta love that keeps you both safe and safely aboard.

There are no passengers on board for partner voyages. Everyone is the coxswain, deckhand, meteorologist, engineer, navigator, lookout, naturalist, cook and medic. The crew of two is united in actions that carry the ship through all the vagaries of the sea, turns of the tide, weather whims and marine traffic.

Experienced partnerships find a whole lotta love, and reliable ways

to communicate, using practiced and efficient methods to anchor or dock. Adherence to proven routines reduces stress and surprises. Each partner should be able to handle the boat, call for help, and anchor or reach port safely if the other becomes incapacitated.

For boats, as for people, running on near-empty severely limits options. Just as your relationship needs that whole lotta love, your vessel needs full tanks and well-maintained systems. Top-up fuel, coolant, and lubricants regularly. Keep water tanks replenished even if you have a water maker. Maintain batteries, systems, equipment, safety and survival gear in a state of readiness. Know where things aboard are located, and how to access and use your equipment.

Redundancy of systems and spares can keep a boat in motion. Changing parts on people is complex and requires a hospital. Vessels should be kept shipshape and organized, with equipment secured, and decks and passageways clear to prevent falls. Protect feet, hands and heads when necessary. Feed each other, and communicate your intentions clearly, whether underway, at anchor, or in port. Watchkeeping and situational awareness involves a whole lotta love which means keeping an eye on your surroundings, and on your partner aboard.

Bad things can happen fast on boats. Crew and vessel preparedness can prevent one unexpected but containable event from becoming a cascade of failures leading to catastrophe.

Whatever psychology exists in terrestrial partnerships is magnified at sea, particularly when difficult passages and circumstances arise. Books have been written on the subject, but you probably already know that a *whole lotta love* is eternal and can survive beyond the boundaries of normal experience.

Partners share responsibility for good fortune and for bad, including errors and accidents.



The Cruising Club of America's excellent book for cruising couples, provided by Chuck Cook, offers in depth and detailed advice.

Six Rules for Cruising Couples:

- 1. Wear a PFD (life jacket) on deck with an installed water-activated locator beacon.
- 2. Do not go overboard underway or unexpectedly.
- 3. Always know where your partner is aboard.
- 4. Share responsibility for all events aboard.
- 5. Communicate as if your lives depend on it.
- 6. Find yourselves a whole lotta love.

TENNIS TIP

"The Serve: It's Not Just a Ball Toss..."

Listen... if you're still just lobbing the ball up like you're offering it to the tennis gods and hoping for a miracle, we need to talk.

Your serve is the only shot you control 100% — no opponent, no pressure, just you, the ball, and hopefully not a double fault. So why are you still serving like it's amateur hour at a ping-pong tournament?

Work on your toss, your rhythm, your motion. Practice those second serves. Make your serve a weapon, not a liability.

Here's what you need to do:

- Toss like you mean it –
 not too far, not too close.
 Somewhere between "I'm a
 pro" and "Oops, I dropped
 it."
- **2. Use your legs** this isn't just an upper-body arm fling; bend those knees! Think of it like launching a rocket, not flipping a pancake.
- **3. Hit Up & Through the ball** we're not swatting flies here. Visualize smacking that fuzzy yellow ball into next week.

Bonus Strategy: Mix up your serve placements. T into the body. Wide to open the court. Make your opponent guess, doubt, and suffer. You're not just serving — you're starting a psychological war.



BRIDGE TIP

Basic Bidding – Overcalls

by Gregg Van Dyke, Bridge Director

When you've been playing bridge for a while, it's very tempting to experiment with new conventions, but it's actually much more valuable to ensure that you're playing a simple system properly and giving accurate and useful information to your partner. Familiarity breeds contempt, and players often forget the principles on which the bidding rules they were taught were based, so it's a good idea to refresh your memory occasionally.

Suit Overcalls

When the opponents have opened the bidding, it's usually only worth competing if you are (a) very strong, or (b) have a good quality long suit, or both. The sort of flat hand on which you would have opened a (12-14) 1NT is often better suited to defense.

A simple suit overcall doesn't require very many points, but it promises a good quality suit of at least five cards. If you're considering whether or not to overcall, always ask yourself "if my partner ends up on opening lead, do I want him to lead this suit?" If you overcall on J10976 and your partner dutifully leads

that suit, declarer may be able to cash AKQ and discard a loser in another suit in where your side holds the top cards. Without your overcall, your partner may well choose a much better lead.

Measuring 'Quality'

To get a rough idea of the quality of a suit, you add the number of cards in the suit to the number of honors in the suit, only counting a Jack as an honor if you have a higher honor as well. For example, AK875 is quality 7 (five cards with two honors), AKJ763 is quality 9, but J10976 is only quality 5.

A simple suit overcall requires:

- At the one level:
 8-16
 HCP (High Card Points)
 and a 5+ card suit of quality
 at least 7
- At the two level:
 10-16
 HCP and a 5+ card suit of quality at least 8

But note:

- 1. Do not overcall at the two level if you can overcall at the one level unless your hand meets all the criteria for a jump overcall.
- 2. With 18+ HCP, double first and show your suit on the next round. That tells partner that you doubled because you were too strong to overcall.






