beauty of it, she was ultimately captivated by a photo she had not recalled seeing before, but instantly recognized as someone very near and dear to her her grandmother, Alice Baker.

"I remember going down the runway in her golf cart as a child," said Sandra. "That photo just took me back and reminded me of what an outgoing person she was. My grandmother enjoyed the Club so much, she loved driving around giving golf cart tours. I'm sure the Airport was always one of her stops."

Sandra remembers her grandmother being initially hesitant about Ocean Reef (mainly because of the mosquitoes!), but as many Members' stories unfold, love for the Club ultimately extended down generations.

Ocean Reef became a significant part of Sandra's childhood as she visited her grandparents often, and it has become part of her daughter's story, who got married here.

If you have not yet toured the new Airport Terminal, you can drop by, say hello to the team, enjoy a cup of coffee and the breathtaking views. During the summer, they are open daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

# **Drive Leisurely**

Whether returning after a day, week or season away, it has often been remarked that the passage through the gate sparks a meditative moment, marked by the casual sign, "Drive Leisurely."

The speed limit across The Reef is 25mph, something rarely reached by most drivers who do travel at a relaxed pace. Despite this, the number of vehicles has been on the rise. With golf carts, cars, trucks, scooters, bicycles, runners, walkers and strollers sharing the roads, safety is always a top priority and consistently being evaluated by the Club and ORCA.

One such area is the four-way stop. Through the years, suggestions have been made and reviewed to adjust the traffic patterns at this location. The latest study, aimed to make the intersection safer for golf carts, yielded recommendations from the traffic engineer that were subsequently implemented with golf cart-dedicated turning lanes and signage added to the intersection. While the addition of a roundabout was also reviewed at this time, it was

determined by both the Club and ORCA that this would not be a safe solution for the Ocean Reef community. Ocean Reef is unique in that it is very much a golf cart community. Not only is it a means of transportation, but for families and young children, a part of the unique way of life. Introducing golf carts, bicyclists, and pedestrians into a roundabout shared with cars and large trucks presents significant safety concerns. Cars and trucks can maintain consistent speeds within roundabouts and accelerate more quickly after stopping, whereas golf carts require more time to pick up speed, creating a potentially hazardous speed differential.

Ocean Reef has operated successfully since its full development, and under normal conditions, the intersection functions adequately. While short traffic delays during weekday afternoons and some mornings, particularly during the season do occur, these brief backups do not outweigh the potential safety risks associated with adding a roundabout. A little patience is always a good solution, and let's remember to **Drive Leisurely**.

# Doggie Do & Doggie Don't

It's no secret that Ocean Reefers love their pets and they are truly part of the family, but Ocean Reef Club does have rules about your four-legged best friends.

The Club's policy states that only service animals, which are defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act as a dog "that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability," are allowed in all Club venues.

If your dog is not a registered service animal, as a courtesy to your fellow Members, Club Management and Associates, please be sensitive to their experience and do not bring your dogs inside areas they are not permitted, including but not limited to Club outlets, the Inn, Buccaneer Island, and more.

Below are some of the most frequently-asked questions on pet rules and regulations.

- Are dogs allowed in Club restaurants and lounges?
  No, dogs (excluding registered service animals) are prohibited in all Ocean Reef restaurants, aside from the Raw Bar deck and Reef Hut patio.
- Can I walk my dog on the golf course? No, taking your dog for a walk on or around the golf course is not permitted. However, if a pet's owner is playing golf during golf course hours, his (or her) dog may ride along in the cart, providing the pet is on a leash.
- What about the Inn, Buccaneer Island and tennis courts?
  - The Inn: The Inn has several pet-friendly rooms, primarily on the ground floor. Vacation Rentals offers a limited number of residences that allow pets. In both cases, the Reservations Team must be informed and approve prior

- to your arrival.
- **Buccaneer Island:** Dogs, leashed or unleashed, are not allowed on Buccaneer Island this includes Palm Court, The Point, the pool area, the Beach and the Lagoon.
- Tennis & Pickleball
  Courts: Dogs or other
  pets are not permitted on
  the courts themselves, but
  well-behaved pets can be
  leashed off to the side in
  designated spectator areas
  by each court.
- Can I have a dog on my boat at the Marina? Boat owners are permitted to have pets provided they are kept on the vessel or on a leash in specially-designated areas.
- Can I take my dog into
  Wynn's? No According to
  their policy, Wynn's Market
  only allows service animals
  in the store. Additionally,
  leashed service animals may
  walk alongside their owner but
  are not allowed in shopping
  carts under any circumstance.
- My dog is very well behaved. Can I walk him without a leash? According to the ORCA Members Handbook, dogs should never be off leash in any area of the

community, outside of the Dog Park or a Member's own private property.

Please note: Registered service animals, as required by law, are permitted in all Ocean Reef venues. In all areas where dogs are not permitted, including Wynn's and Club facilities, Members can expect to be asked whether their pet is a service animal. Additionally, Ocean Reef Club may ask an individual with a disability to remove a service animal if the animal is not housebroken or is out of control and the individual is not able to control it.

Please remember, Members are responsible for any damage caused by a pet owned by the Member or under the Member's control, and also for cleaning up pet droppings (as per Monroe County ordinance). # 9/11 Remembrance

Those of us over the age of 30 can most likely tell you exactly where we were and how we heard of the events of September 11, 2001. This was personal. No matter where you lived, we all shared the shock, anger and fear while we watched the details of the terrorist attack unfold on our televisions.

The 9/11 Remembrance held by the ORCA Public Safety Department was a solemn reminder to all Members, Club Associates and ORCA employees who attended just how much we lost that terrible day, while simultaneously honoring the heroics of first responders. The morning was opened by ORCA's Ariel Airtime (VP/Director of Public Safety & Operations) and closed with remarks by ORCA Fire-Rescue Chief John Flynn, enumerating the number of people lost. Included was the Pledge of Allegiance, the National Anthem sung live by Cynthia Taylor and ended with "God Bless America". It set the perfect tone.

Living in New York City, just 90 blocks north of the Towers, there are so many stories I could include here about the days, weeks and months that shook my City to its core. And certain things still bring back those thoughts: smoke-filled skies, smells of burning plastic, bagpipes at funerals, Kate Smith's "God Bless America" at the seventh inning stretch of every Yankees game and just passing a fire station.

We should all be proud of our men and women in Public Safety who keep us safe as multi-trained first responders and honor those we lost by remembering the unity we felt that day.



Rochelt - Annia's Gin

Principally known for their fruit brandies, the Austrian house Rochelt has long been hailed as one of the finest and rarest producers of eau-de-vie in the world. This



month, however, we will not be focusing on the Brandy that has propelled Rochelt to stardom, but instead on what was created by Alexander Rainer as a birthday surprise for his wife Annia: Annia's Gin. Rochelt produces the Gin sparingly, its first iteration only consisting of 20 liters. The Gin begins its life as pure Gravenstein Apple Brandy, aged ten years, before fresh, handpicked juniper berries are added, and the resulting mixture is distilled once more. That's all! Just two ingredients comprise Annia's Gin, making it one of the most unique bottlings in the world. Coupled with its hand-blown green Tyrolean glass bottles, Annia's Gin is not only a symphony of flavor in its purest form, it is also a beautiful sight to behold. # Off-Season ORCA Upgrades & Enhancements

Here's what ORCA has been working on while you've been away: progress on building improvements, infrastructure upgrades, and community enhancements—all made possible with the support of our local and county partners and designed to make your return even more enjoyable.

#### **Ocean Reef Drive Bridge**

Electrical lines at the Ocean Reef Drive Bridge were relocated with minimal impact to local traffic. As part of the project the two yellow curbs were removed. The curbs narrowed the bridge, creating safety concerns. With the lines

relocated, the bridge is now wider, safer, and more attractive.

#### **Tree Trimming**

FKEC's certified crews trimmed vegetation around overhead lines to help maintain reliable electric service and healthy tree growth.

# Grayvik Animal Center, Home of ORCAT

Work on the new veterinary clinic and home to The Reef's working cats is well advanced, with interior details, cabling, storefronts, and roofing moving forward, and new drainage now in place on site. The project remains on schedule, with completion expected on time and operations set to begin before the end of the year.

#### **FKAA Water Tank**

The Florida Keys Aqueduct Authority (FKAA) conducted rehabilitation work on the Ocean Reef storage tank as part of a once-in-30-year restoration

project. The work included removing the old exterior finish, repairing leaks, and applying a new protective coating and paint to improve the look of the aging tanks while ensuring their long-term reliability.

The final phase of the Sunrise Cay Bridge restoration is underway. Please follow the





The annual event grew out of the Florida Keys Funders Alliance - a longtime collaboration between the Ocean Reef Community Foundation, the Community









# Convicted Civility (Part Two)

#### **Welcome to Part Two**

In part one (page 16 of the August 22 edition of the Ocean Reef Press) of this conversation, I made a bold assertion that what we need today is Convicted Civility. I contended that:

"You and I live in an era where there is too little CONVICTION (or too much passivity) from many of our best people. At the same time, those actively engaged in the important struggles of our age often seem to exhibit too little CIVILITY (or too much aggression) in the pursuit of their ends. The result (of both realities) is a rising anarchy in many societal sectors."

In Part one, I described some of the basic moral **convictions** that have struck people in the Judeo-Christian tradition as essential to healthy individuals or societies. More people need to stand up and speak out for these values if we are to avoid further descent into anarchy.

If you have followed the news cycle since this paper was last published, however, then you will be freshly aware that it can be risky to be someone who stands up and speaks out today. The problem has something to do with declining standards around **civility** and that is what I want to focus on today.

#### **Reflecting on Charlie Kirk**

You've likely heard a lot about the assassination of Charlie Kirk – the young conservative who was rarely shy about expressing his convictions and who called everyone in his audience to carefully consider theirs. Regardless of whether you identify with the moral values for which Charlie stood, he was someone who did his best to engage others in conversation about the beliefs and practices

that they believed would lead to a true commonwealth.

At the same time, Charlie Kirk was sometimes given to "expressional excess." I agreed with many things he said, but he sometimes made ill-considered statements that made me wince. Most of the time, Charlie was a champion for what I am calling "civility" – a respectful way of holding space for those who disagree with you. AND there were moments when he lost that bearing.

A lot of us are like that. We are a complicated mix of wisdom and foolishness. We bring value to the circles we enter AND we do or say things that would make Moses or Jesus or Mr. Rogers wince. THAT, however, is nowhere close to justification for *murder*.

#### Murders in the Building

If you survey a balanced news feed, then you know that over the past month and months, a lot of people who were simply trying to live out their moral convictions were murdered by fanatics who felt they had no right to their beliefs. The people murdered were Jewish and Christian, Republicans and Democrats, young people and older people. They were killed by those who felt that differing with them was "Hate Speech" and must be punished by death.

Some of this is the clear result of mental illness--conditions that deserve a set of thoughtful and careful responses all their own. But some of the trauma of our time is the result of a distorted, disfigured notion of what "health and safety" truly mean.

My parents taught me to differentiate between words and actions. "Sticks and stones may break your bones, but names will never burt you." People will dislike and disagree with you, they said, but that's OK. That won't KILL you. It will make you more resilient.

I was trained as a political scientist at Yale, back when that university was not dominated by any particular ideology. My professors taught me to look at all sides of an issue. They said that entertaining the marketplace of

ideas and values will only make you wiser and more discerning. It won't KILL you to say what you believe and listen to others.

Today, however, it just might.

#### **Uncommon Decency**

Once upon a time, there was no talk radio, ideological television or social media. There was only face-to-face relationship among people whose proximity to one another created a mutual interdependence. People understood that they had to learn how to live with other people in real time and deal with differences.

In his book, *Uncommon Decency*, Richard Mouw, issues a winsome call to a recovery of civility in American life. "Civility," he writes, "is public politeness. It means that we display tact, moderation, refinement and good manners toward people who are different from us."

Mouw stresses that civility is not just play-acting. You don't simply mask your basic hostility toward somebody else with insincere words or grudging concessions. Civility doesn't mean holding a relativistic view that every idea or approach is equally valid. Some ideas and actions are genuinely stupid or destructive, including, perhaps, some of our own.

Civility requires an authentic willingness to respect someone else, not because we believe they are right about everything, but because they are God's creation.

It involves trying to understand what they think and feel and where that came from. It means seeking to perceive the pressures they are under, the experiences they've had, the real-world needs or imagined demons that haunt them. It means listening deeply enough that we earn the right to have our convictions truly heard by them.

Hundreds of years ago, a diverse group of people came together and hammered out a new charter. There were many differences that could have divided them and destroyed their project, but they focused instead on what they had in common – a holy conviction that all people were created equal and endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable rights. They enshrined in a Constitution and then a Bill of Rights the vision of an unusually CIVIL society - one with due process, mutual respect, checks and balances, and a core Judeo-Christian value system designed by a Creator to advance a common good.

Let's refresh that dream.

This will require a level of humility, courage, sacrifice, and compromise that will be a stretch for all of us. But let it begin. Let this convicted civility be the newfound passion in our homes and religious communities, in our neighborhood and civic circles, in our workplaces and government. Let's become again a people of both truth and grace (John 1:14).

Sheriff Ramsay's devotion to public safety spans nearly four decades. Over the years, he advanced through patrol, investigations, special operations, corrections, and the South Florida High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area task force. In 2004 he was appointed undersheriff, and in 2012 he won election as Sheriff, earning overwhelming support from Monroe County voters and continuing to serve in that role today.

Ramsay is the most decorated deputy in the agency's history, receiving more than 150 commendations, including the prestigious Medal of Valor for saving a man trapped in a drainage pipe filled with lethal fumes. He has completed advanced training at the FBI

National Academy, the Southern Police Institute Command Officers Development Course, and the National Sheriffs' Institute Executive Training Program, underscoring his lifelong commitment to professional excellence.

Community involvement is equally central to his legacy. Ramsay volunteered as a firefighter in Marathon for 15 years, rising to the rank of deputy chief, and he continues to champion community policing—an approach credited with reducing crime rates and restoring environmentally distressed areas across the Keys. He serves on numerous nonprofit boards, including the Florida Keys Children's Shelter, United Way of Monroe County, and the Monroe Association of Remarkable Citizens, and has earned honors such as the Community Foundation Unsung Hero Award (three times), the Samuel's House Men of Valor Award, and the Imogene Synon Award. Under his leadership, the Sheriff's Office earned the National Sheriff's Association "Triple Crown" accreditation, one of only a few dozen agencies nationwide to achieve this distinction.


Not to be outdone, we are also delighted to incorporate





# Chef Betania's Kitchen

Cheddar & Scallion Pancakes (Serves Four)



by Betania Salles, Carysfort Kitchen Chef de Cuisine

This savory pancake is perfect for breakfast, a fun brunch or simply a quick snack. They are fluffy and full of flavor, and served with scrambled eggs and bacon, they are just perfect!

#### **Ingredients:**

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 tsps. sugar
- 1 1/2 tsps. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. baking soda
- 1 tsp. kosher salt
- 1/4 tsp. black pepper, freshly ground
- 2 eggs, room temperature
- 1 1/2 cups buttermilk, room

#### temperature

- 2 tbsps. grapeseed oil, + 2 tbsps. for skillet
- 1 cup sharp white cheddar, shredded
- 1/2 cup scallions, thinly sliced
- To serve: scallions chopped, crisp-cooked bacon, whipped cream cheese

#### **Directions:**

- Whisk together flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, salt and pepper in a bowl.
- Add eggs, buttermilk, and 2 tbsps. of oil. Whisk until just moistened. Do not overmix; a few small lumps are fine. Fold in cheese and scallions.
- Heat a large nonstick skillet over medium. Drizzle skillet with oil; rub with a paper towel to evenly coat.
- Cooking in batches, ladle
   1/4 cup batter per pancake
   into skillet, spreading in an
   even circle. Cook until edges
   begin to set and undersides are
   golden, two to three minutes.
   Flip; cook until golden and
   crisp, two to three minutes
   more.
- Top with more scallions, bacon, cream cheese.

# Limitless



'Fitness Focus" by Luis Bracamonte, Director of Fitness & Wellness

Life is a blank canvas, and we are the artists. Our dreams and goals are often met with barriers, but those limits can be removed through consistent effort. One of the most significant limits we face is what our bodies are capable of doing—whether it's a lack of strength, endurance, or mobility. The good news is that these limits can be overcome. Through training, we can build the qualities needed to expand what is possible.

Yes, it becomes harder to build muscle, improve flexibility, and increase cardio-respiratory capacity as we age. But it is equally true that improvement is always possible, at any age.

#### The Role of Strength & Conditioning

Regular strength and conditioning training is one of the most powerful tools against rapid aging. Movement becomes difficult not simply because of age, but because of the loss of muscle mass and strength. Falls become more likely when our fast-twitch fibers aren't trained, reducing our ability to react quickly. Stiffness creeps in when we neglect strength,

mobility, and flexibility work.

Strength is the foundation of freedom in movement. The stronger and more resilient we are, the more options we have for living life on our terms.

#### **The Changing Return on Investment**

In our teens and twenties, the return on investment from training is exceptionally high. Recovery is fast, and gains come quickly. These are the years to build as much physical capacity as possible.

In our thirties, forties, and fifties, recovery slows and progress requires more intention, but the ability to maintain high levels of fitness is still within reach. With consistency, these are decades where we can do just about anything.

From our sixties onward, fitness declines more rapidly, making it critical to double down on strength, mobility, and conditioning. Training becomes less optional and more essential if we want to maintain independence, vitality, and quality of life. Having said this, the difference that strength, conditioning, and mobility training can have during these decades regarding athletic performance is substantial. Just a few months ago, an 80-yearold became the oldest runner to complete the Badwater 135mile desert race. The oldest

competitive bodybuilder is a 100-year-old World War II veteran, the oldest person to summit Everest did it at 80 years old, and the oldest person to swim the English Channel did it at 73 years old. Fitness training is a game-changer.

# **Training for Body & Brain**

The benefits of physical training extend beyond the body. Conditioning at higher intensities has profound effects on brain health. For decades, science has reminded us: what is good for the heart is good for the brain.

Cardiovascular conditioning is built gradually through consistent lower and medium-intensity training. The capacity for high-intensity effort is not given; it's earned.

#### **Removing Your Limits**

Your body is an intricate, organized structure of cells, tissues, and systems working together to allow you to live, move, and experience the world. The gym is not just a place to build strength, it's a laboratory for removing limits.

Every hour spent building muscle, improving strength, enhancing mobility, and training your conditioning expands your capacity for life. Every rep, every set, every effort removes a barrier between who you are today and who you could become tomorrow.

The key is daily improvement, regardless of age or fitness level.



# Taking the Measure of the Sea


Maritime navigation relies on a practical system of measurements which have evolved over centuries of practical seafaring and geographic calibration.

# The Nautical Mile: Not Your Average Mile

The distance of one **statute mile**, or 5,280 feet, is ascribed to the Romans who named 1,000 soldiers' paces a *mille*. The **nautical mile** of 6,076 feet aligns logically with Earth's geography: 60 nautical miles equal one degree of latitude globally, and one degree of longitude at the equator. If Legionnaires had taken slightly longer strides, we might all be using the same nautical mile.

Most maritime distances are calculated in nautical miles, however, U. S. Intracoastal Waterways and navigable rivers are measured and marked in statute miles, conforming to adjacent land measurements.

A **cable length**, used by navies and commercial

mariners, is 1/10th of a nautical mile or 100 fathoms (see above) equaling 600 feet in a convenient decimal correlation.

Sea distances in the English world were original measured in **leagues** of three nautical miles. Jules Verne, however, used **French metric leagues** of four kilometers aboard the submarine Nautilus to recount the distance, not depth, of approximately 44,000 nautical miles travelled.

#### **Knots: Speed with a Twist**

Prior to the 19th Century, a vessel's speed was determined

by a Chip Log: a piece of weighted wood attached to a knotted line played out from a ship's stern. The number of prespaced knots passing through a sailor's hand, timed by an hourglass, indicated a ship's speed in **knots**.

Today we use electronic logs that report a boat's speed through the water, which, because of sea currents, are often quite different from GPS speed over the seabed.

Navigators and aviators employ nautical miles per hour, or **knots**, for time-speeddistance calculations just as miles per hour is used on land.

#### **Fathoms: Deep Thinking**

The **fathom**, a measurement equal to six feet, has its origin in the length of outstretched arms, and is widely used by fishermen, the Sailing Directions, cartographers and anyone wishing to project a nautical aptitude. We often see lines of equal depth (Isobaths) drawn on nautical charts. Depths are reported in fathoms, meters, or feet, sometimes in combination, and it is vital to know which datum is being published.

Anchor chains are often measured in **shots** or **shackles** of 90 feet, and our exploration vessel carries five shots of chain marked in five-fathom increments.

The U.S. Naval Institute offers many historical details of The Nautical Mile in the November 1949 edition of *Proceedings* magazine (digitized) for those wishing to fathom the entire story.





# Play Cornhole with Your Paddles

## How to Apply It

- Imagine the kitchen area as your cornhole board.
- Your goal is to "land the beanbag" (the pickleball) softly into the target zone.

#### Drill




