

# Roadway Etiquette

## Be Golf Cart Courteous!

Golf carts are a major part of everyday life at Ocean Reef. For the safety and comfort of your friends, family and fellow Members, it's important to treat carts with the same responsibility as full-sized vehicles.

In honor of February's Golf Cart Safety Awareness Month at Ocean Reef, please review the following tips and remember that being a safe driver also means being a courteous driver.

### Making Turns & Heading Straight:

- **Signal using your blinker or hand gestures** (see below) to indicate your turns.
- **For a left-hand turn**, put your left arm straight out the left side of the golf cart.
- **For a right-hand turn**, put your left arm out the left side of the golf cart, but pointed upwards at the elbow.
- **When stopping**, put your left arm out the left side of the golf cart, but pointed downwards at the elbow.
- **When making a left-hand turn** or traveling straight at

any intersection, all carts must merge into the car lane, including slow carts.

- **When approaching the four-way stop**, signal to merge from the cart path into the car lane at the back of the line of traffic as soon as it's safe to do so.
- Only use the cart lane **when making a right-hand turn**.

### Driving in the Correct Lane:

- **Blue decal carts (operating at speeds of 17 MPH or less)** should stick to golf cart paths, only using roads when no path is available.
- **Red decal carts (with speeds of 18 MPH and above)** can use either roadways or designated cart lanes at the reduced cart path speed limit.
- **When traveling on the mixed-use path**, meaning carts and pedestrians share the path, please follow the painted cart or pedestrian symbols.
- **Paver brick pathways are for pedestrians only** and can be walked on in either direction. No carts are allowed.

### More Cart Etiquette:

- **Obey all traffic signs**, which includes observing

a one-way street and no texting, and painted directional symbols.

- **No driving in parks**, on beach or on golf courses.
- Ensure that you **take your golf cart key** with you upon leaving the cart to prevent others from mistakenly assuming the cart belongs to them.
- All carts should **follow typical car rules of the road** and should not assume right of way.
- **Obey speed limits**: The maximum speed limit throughout Ocean Reef is

25 mph with slower speeds clearly marked with signage.

- **Parking**: Golf carts should be parked only in designated cart parking spots.

The most important reminder of all: Being a responsible driver isn't just about knowing the rules but being courteous enough to follow them.

### Why We Are a Non-tipping Club

When thinking of Ocean Reef Club traditions, events like Festival on the Green, Triple Golf Classic and Vintage Weekend come to mind. However, beyond the special occasions and activities, there are also elements of the Club's service standards, rules and regulations that are also considered long-standing Club traditions. One such element is the no tipping

policy. Common practice at most Clubs, non-tipping policies are designed to ensure favor is not given to one member over another. Most Clubs, as does Ocean Reef, look to include gratuity in the services and activities they provide; this is to off-set the individual tips one might receive in a non-Club environment. Further to that, as a non-tipping Club, Associates are held to a promise to provide all Members equal service. There is no expectation of tipping by Associates nor should members feel any obligation.

### RULES REMINDER - TWO-VISIT RULE

No person, other than a house guest, or child of a Club member, as set forth herein in the sections entitled "Guests" and "Children," shall be permitted to visit the Club more than two times in any five year period, with each visit to be limited to a maximum of 14 days, without becoming a member of the Club. This shall be known as the "two visit rule."

Those not planning to attend but still wishing to browse auction items and bid online can also receive a bid number by taking three simple steps: (1) go to [bidORC.org](http://bidORC.org) on (or after) Feb. 13; (2) click 'Create Account' at bottom left; and (3) enter your name and email and click 'Register'; within moments, you'll be an All Charities Bidder!

**Bidding:** (also see "Online Bidding," below). You can use your own device, but too, touch screens will be available at Carysfort Hall throughout the

Silent Auction; Live Auction bidding will be at the Gala; if you will not be attending that event, but would like to bid, see "Proxy Bids," below. **The Silent Auction** will remain open throughout dinner and Live Auction and **close at 10:30 p.m. Saturday**.







# ORCA Member Survey Results Help Shape 2026 Priorities

During the third quarter of 2025, ORCA members were invited to participate in a comprehensive Member Survey to help the Leadership Team and Board of Directors better understand the community's needs and set priorities for the year ahead. With an excellent response from 701 homeowners, the survey provided valuable insight into member satisfaction, concerns, and expectations.

The survey generated 26 pages of written comments and suggestions, ranging from requests for improved street lighting in specific neighborhoods to broader concerns about cost management and service levels. ORCA's Leadership has thoroughly



reviewed all comments and both Board Chair **Harry Totonis** and President Juan Perez shared a summary during the joint Town Hall Meeting in January.

As the representative organization of Ocean Reef homeowners, ORCA remains committed to operating with fiscal responsibility while working closely with members, Club partners, and State and County

government agencies to deliver the highest standards of service and infrastructure. For this reason, survey results related to funding priorities, infrastructure maintenance, construction oversight, and communications are directly influencing ORCA's planning this year.

Overall satisfaction across ORCA services remains high, particularly in Public Safety. Survey results reported strong confidence in our community's dependable and professional emergency response, including emergency medical services, firefighting, and 911 dispatch. One key opportunity for improvement emerged in front gate access and the gate clearance app, highlighting the need for an enhanced experience.

ORCA communications continue to perform well. Nearly three-quarters of respondents reported reading ORCA News weekly, and almost all found it informative. At the same time, digital engagement shows room for growth, as many members have not visited our website. [ORCAreef.com](http://ORCAreef.com) is a reliable and up-to-date community resource, and members are encouraged to use it for timely information.

Construction oversight is a significant concern for many homeowners, particularly regarding truck traffic, parking congestion, and extended project timelines. Despite increased enforcement efforts and the work of the Ad Hoc Construction Committee, more

than half of respondents reported concern about construction activity. About half supported limits on construction either by neighborhood or by contractor. In response, **ORCA will meet next week with the Advisory Council** representing Ocean Reef neighborhoods to discuss possible options and next steps. "We want the community to make that decision with us, so we are going to engage the Advisory Council that represents all our members," said Perez.

Landscaping and parks were highly rated, reinforcing their value to the community experience. Residents identified street lighting as an important priority, offering constructive input to guide future planning, particularly around safety concerns. "One of the things we're going to address is street lighting in some neighborhoods," said Chairman Totonis at Town Hall. Any enhancements must be in alignment with environmental considerations. The Hammock neighborhood has restrictions imposed by the county. ORCA will continue to keep members informed as new measures are implemented.




The following are a few of the new reads some Book Clubs are exploring and might introduce you to a few authors worth discovering:

## The Gales of November: An Evening with Author John U. Bacon


### A Special Presentation from the Cultural Center's Campus Series

The Campus Speaker Series is proud to welcome bestselling author and award-winning journalist John U. Bacon on **Thursday, February 12** at 5 p.m. at the **Cultural Center** for a compelling talk based on his book *The Gales of November*. This **complimentary** event offers a rare opportunity to hear the definitive story of one of America's most haunting maritime tragedies, followed by a Q&A with the author.

On the fiftieth anniversary of the sinking of the Edmund Fitzgerald, Bacon revisits the rise and fall of the legendary 729-foot freighter known as the "Mighty Fitz." For decades after World War II, the Great Lakes were the beating heart of the global economy, rivaling the influence and power Silicon Valley holds today. No ship symbolized that era of American strength and ambition more than the Edmund Fitzgerald, the biggest, best, and most profitable vessel on the Lakes.

That legacy came to a devastating end on November 10, 1975, when hurricane-force winds and towering 50-foot waves battered Lake Superior during the infamous "storm of the century." Caught in the worst possible conditions, the Fitzgerald sank with all 29 men aboard, leaving behind unanswered questions and families forever changed.

In *The Gales of November*, Bacon draws on more than 100 interviews with crewmates,

aftermath for those left behind, "the wives, the sons, and the daughters," immortalized in Gordon Lightfoot's unforgettable song.



# Why the New Terminal is Bringing Families Back to the Airport Porch

For generations, the Airport porch was more than a place to catch a flight—it was a gathering spot, a front-row seat to arrivals and departures, and a backdrop for hellos, goodbyes, and everything in between. Over time, as airports became more utilitarian, that sense of connection quietly faded. The

new terminal is changing that—and families are coming back because of it.

I recently decided to take a few out-of-town guests to see it for themselves. What unfolded during that visit perfectly captured why this space feels so special again.

While there, I encountered a young man of two named Graham Kinney, the grandson

of **Sarina Kinney**—his beloved “Grandy.” Young Graham was absolutely enthralled by the planes coming and going, many of them practicing for Vintage Weekend. With a toy plane in hand and headphones perched just right, he raced back and forth across the expansive porch, disappearing into his imagination as we sat and watched. Every so often, he would pause, look up, and exclaim, “Wow!” or “Plane take off!”

At one point, Graham grabbed my guest’s hand and eagerly pulled her toward the railing to show her the fire coming from behind the plane as it lifted into the sky. He was pure joy—an enchanting throwback to a time when simply watching a takeoff or landing was entertainment enough. As the breeze moved gently through the porch, we realized nearly two hours had passed, unnoticed, spent doing

nothing more than enjoying the view and this little fellow’s wonder at planes arriving and departing.

At its heart, the new terminal was designed with people—not just planes—in mind. Open sightlines, shaded seating, and a welcoming porch-style layout invite families to linger rather than rush. Parents and grandparents watch aircraft taxi in while children press close to the railings, wide-eyed and curious, much like earlier generations once did.

Comfort plays a meaningful role as well. Cooling breezes, comfortable seating, and easy access to refreshments and restrooms turn the porch into a place where multiple generations can relax together. It’s no longer merely a drop-off zone—it’s a destination.

Perhaps most importantly, the porch restores something emotional. It reconnects travel with storytelling—grandparents recalling first flights, parents sharing memories, and children imagining adventures yet to come. It transforms travel from a transaction into a shared moment.

In bringing back the Airport porch, the new terminal has revived something deeply familiar and warmly human. It slows us down just enough to reconnect—with each other, with our surroundings, and with the simple beauty of a plane taking flight. And that’s why families are finding their way back—one arrival, one departure, and one heartfelt “Wow” at a time.

# If Character Was Our Strategy

In my article last week, I reflected upon the strange phenomenon that some people deemed to be "GREAT" in their *public* performance turn out to be far less than great in their *private* life. I don't say this to throw stones. There are too many inconsistencies or contradictions in my own life that should keep anyone from idealizing me.

The "hero-icizing" of very flawed people would be less rampant, I think, were American culture and popular psychology not so adept at compartmentalizing human life. What we do in private and what we do in public are often

conceived as separate realities – almost like the apparently distinct compartments in a great ship. By this reasoning, issues of personal character and professional performance are always distinct.

The difficulty is that the various compartments of our psyche or external life are not *really* so neatly sealed off from one another, any more than the various holds of the Titanic turned out to be. A tendency towards dishonesty, disloyalty or any other moral weakness may be contained for a brief period in one compartment. Left unaddressed, however, it will eventually rise over the tops of our convenient walls and flood the adjoining compartments of our lives. The ultimate consequences for an individual or society, as for a ship, can be catastrophic.

Psychologists Henry Cloud and John Townsend urge us to recognize that we are already living in a flooding culture: "In a world that has begun to explain away people's behavior with a variety of excuses, people are left wondering why their lives do not work. [But] *most of our problems result from our own character weakness...*

"Where we do not possess inner strength, we either get stuck or fail. If a relationship requires understanding and forgiveness and we do not have that character ability, the relationship will not make it. If a difficult time period in work requires patience and delay of gratification and we do not possess those traits, we will fail... Character is almost everything."

"Character refers to a person's ability and inability, his moral makeup, her functioning in relationships, and how he does tasks... Can he love? Can she be responsible? Can he have empathy for others? Can she develop her talents? Can he solve problems? Can she deal with failure? How does he reflect the image of God?"

Imagine how much better life

in our home, communities and nation might be were a revolution of character to take place among our public figures and private players alike. Reflecting on and trying to grow our personal character is a big part of what healthy spiritual communities are for. If you haven't lately explored any of the ones that meet at the Ocean Reef Chapel & Fellowship Center, I invite you to make that investment and see what happens.

The late (and I will say "great") Army General, Norman Schwarzkopf, once remarked: "Leadership is a potent combination of two things: character and strategy. If you have to be without one, relinquish strategy." What if we made the development and exhibition of great character our personal and national strategy?

## Eight Ways to Love Your Heart

February is American Heart Month, and heart disease is the leading cause of death in the United States. Some risk factors are beyond your control, such as genetics and age, however there are eight important heart prevention strategies to help lower your risk of heart disease.

**Tobacco Use:** Don't smoke, use vaping devices or any other type of tobacco products and avoid second-hand smoke. Cigarette smoke lowers oxygen in the blood, raises blood pressure and heart rate. No matter how long you have smoked, you can reap immediate rewards once quitting.

**Being Overweight:** Maintain a healthy weight, especially in the abdomen. Excess weight can lead to diabetes type 2, high blood pressure and high cholesterol.

**Quality Sleep:** Maintain a regular sleep schedule and aim for seven hours nightly. If you are consistently tired during the day, even after feeling like you've had a good night's sleep, ask to be evaluated for sleep apnea. Overweight individuals can be at a higher risk.

**Stress:** Everyone experiences stress, but ongoing stress plays a role in high blood pressure and other heart disease risk factors. Use healthy coping tactics such as meditation, relaxation exercise, yoga or other mindfulness activities. If you cannot manage ongoing stress, this could also be a sign of depression or anxiety and

you should see your healthcare provider.

**Exercise:** Aim for 30-60 minutes a day. The recommended weekly amounts are 150 minutes of moderate aerobic exercise and 75 minutes of vigorous aerobic activity. If you can't meet these guidelines, any exercise will be of benefit. Start out with a brisk walk for 10 minutes a day and work up to more. Gardening, housework or team sports can be greatly beneficial.

**Diet:** The Mediterranean and DASH (low sodium) diet are examples of heart healthy plans. Whatever diet you ascribe to, just remember to include vegetables, fruits, lean meats, whole grains (unless gluten intolerant), low-fat dairy and healthy fats like olive oil and avocados. Avoid as many processed foods as possible and limit sugar and alcohol intake.

**Health Screenings:** Regular blood pressure monitoring, cholesterol (lipid) testing,

diabetes screening, dental exams and a yearly physical exam should be part of your routine health monitoring.

**Infection Prevention:** Staying up to date on your recommended yearly vaccines and follow your physician's guidance on additional vaccines, such as pneumococcal, RSV and COVID-19 and shingles.







#### National Sweater Day on Monday 2/2/26

Last Monday, I personally celebrated National Sweater Day by buying a new sweater ...or two.

(Note: Don't be too quick to dismiss this "momentous" holiday. It might catch on like Ugly Christmas Sweater Day.)

I confined my "no sweat" sweater search to just 5 of the many wonderful Ocean Reef stores, which offer a selection of beautiful, interesting or just plain "goofy" sweaters.

I started in the Fishing Village. First stop was **Leggiadro**, which has delicious short-sleeved cashmere sweaters that come in many colors. I love the pale violet (\$595).

Just down the road at **J. McLaughlin**, there is a lovely, draped shawl, not exactly a sweater but it serves a similar purpose – it's fashionable, warm and comfortable (\$348.)

There is a kinky sweatshirt (\$79.95) on the porch of **Dockside Living**. Check out the slogan that appears prominently on the front of the shirt. (Pictured).

At the **Burgee Shop** there are any number of sweaters that I would like to buy and one I couldn't resist. It is a red Spanx quarter zip (\$148). Like the soft, featherweight beauties pictured here (\$125), that all say *Ocean Reef* in one way or another, my new shirt has a small OR burgee.

I completed my day of sweater shopping on Barracuda Lane, which I think of as Ocean Reef's Mini Mall.

Located there are two big women's clothing stores – **The Dress Code** and **Sandpiper**. Both are the source of a treasure trove of interesting sweaters.



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# Chef Betania's Kitchen

## Yucca (Cassava) Soup (Serves Four)

This soup is perfect for the surprising Florida winter we are going through.

Yucca is not a very common ingredient but give it a try, you will be surprised at how flavorful it is in stews and soups. Just remember, yucca has way more starch than potatoes so feel free to add more water or broth if you want your soup a little runnier. Enjoy!

### Ingredients:

- 500 gr. frozen yucca (cassava)

- 1 tbsp. olive oil
- 300 gr. ground beef or shredded cooked meat
- 1 tsp. garlic, minced
- 1 cup Vidalia onion, chopped
- 1 cube beef bouillon
- 1/2 tsp. cumin powder
- 1/2 tsp. coriander powder
- 1 tsp. sweet paprika
- 1/2 cup tomato puree
- 1 tbsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. peppercorn, freshly ground
- 1/4 cup cilantro, chopped
- slices of red onions for garnish

### Directions:

1. Place yucca in a pot and cover with water. Let it cook until very soft.
2. Remove yucca from the pot and save the water.
3. Using two forks, remove the hard fiber from the center of the yucca pieces. It is easy to spot.
4. Place clean yucca in a blender, add some of the cooking water and blend



for a couple seconds, does not need to be completely smooth. Reserve.

5. In a medium pot, add olive oil and heat up for a couple seconds. Add ground beef and cook until the meat is no longer pink. Add garlic and onion, continue cooking for about three minutes.
6. Add beef bouillon and dry spices. Sauté for two minutes. Add tomato puree and two cups of water. Bring it to boil, reduce the heat, add salt and peppercorn, and
7. Now, add the blended yucca and stir constantly, being careful not to scorch the bottom as yucca is a very dense starch. Let it simmer for another five minutes, always stirring.
8. Add more of the yucca cooking liquid if the soup is too thick. Adjust seasoning if necessary.
9. Turn off the heat. Add cilantro and serve it hot, garnish with red onions and more cilantro.

## PADEL TIP

## Play Your Best Padel

by Hannah Fleckenstein, Director of Racquet Sports

Padel is easiest to enjoy when you let go of the "tennis swing = power" mindset. The court is smaller, the ball rebounds off the glass, and points are built on placement, angles, and patience more than pace. Think compact swings, soft hands, and high-percentage shots. Use the walls to your advantage instead of rushing the ball — sometimes the best shot is the one you let come off the back glass so you can reset the point. Players coming from tennis tend to overhit early

on, but in padel, control and positioning win way more rallies than big winners.

Court positioning is just as important as shot selection. After you serve, work your way to the net with your partner and move as a pair — if one goes, you both go. The team that controls the net usually controls the point. Communication is huge in doubles padel, especially on balls off the glass where hesitation causes errors. Call everything, stay patient in transition, and remember that defense is part of the game — great padel points often include resets, lobs, and second chances before anyone goes for a put-away. Once players embrace the chess match aspect, they get hooked fast.

The Bonefish Bonnies gathered at Key Largo Angler's Club last week to honor, thank and wish Tight Lines to **Nancy Zakon**, their founder. Nancy and her husband, **Alan**, are leaving The Reef after 30 years for new adventures. Beloved by everyone who knows her, Nancy founded the Bonefish Bonnies in 1999 when she invited seven women to lunch to meet

Joan Wulff, renowned as the First Lady of Fly Fishing. That small luncheon became Bonefish Bonnies, Inc. with a roster of almost 200 members.

As a teacher, mentor and friend, she has shared her knowledge and passion for the sport of fly fishing. **Kristina Ersek** began the program by saying, "As president of the organization you founded it is my honor to thank you on behalf of all the Bonnies, not only for the community you built but also for the doors you've opened and the pathways you've made possible for so many women anglers." Ersek also announced that the Bonnies have made a donation to the American Museum of Fly Fishing (AMFF) in Nancy's honor.

The Oceanaires Singers delighted the group with a serenade for Nancy. Clever lyrics written by **Sherley Newell** and

sung to the tune of *My Bonnie Lies Over the Ocean* brought smiles, laughter, a few tears and three hip-hip-hoorays for Nancy. During her comments, Nancy said "she was incredibly grateful for all of the Bonnies who have found the joy of being out on the water and appreciating nature". Speaking of their namesake, Bonefish Bonnie, who was a pioneering fishing guide in the Keys, she described Bonnie as adventurous and courageous and then closed by saying, "We are sisters; we are courageous; we are curious and we are the embodiment of the spirit of Bonefish Bonnie."

Nancy's dedication to the sport of fly fishing hasn't only impacted our community. While working at Orvis when she lived in New York City, she was part of the team that put together Orvis' first line of fishing clothes for women.

It was in midtown Manhattan that she founded Julianas\* Anglers in 1995; a women's fishing group now called Julianas Anglers Sporting Club. The waters of the Florida Keys are in perpetual motion, shuttled by Moon and Sun in tide cycles and fetched into frothy fathoms by winds

Last year the Ocean Reef Coast Guard Auxiliary addressed the lawless weather of the Florida Keys with a presentation on Tropical Storms. This year we offer a

chance to understand dynamic laws and regulations impacting navigation within the Keys.

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


