Sailfishing Has ORC Anglers Hooked

When you think of fishing at The Reef, sailfishing likely comes top of mind, especially during this time of year. With decades upon decades of Ocean Reef sailfishing tournament traditions, there's no question why.

In fact, for the past 36 years, January has been marked by the Club's most popular sailfishing tradition, the Reef Cup Sailfish Invitational. Like much else, in 2022 things will

be a bit different. The last week in January typically slated for Reef Cup will instead host the popular Sailfish Classic tournament (January 20-22), with Reef Cup celebrating its 37th year March 9-12.

With a tradition as lasting as Reef Cup, and a waitlist steadily maintained for years, it's safe to say sailfishing is quite a popular pastime at The Reef.

Reef Cup Defending Champion and 2021 Grand Masters Golf & Fishing Tournament Champion **Mike Rich** agreed, saying its popularity first and foremost stems from the challenge and camaraderie it fosters. Rich, who has competed in the vast majority of Reef fishing tournaments over the past few

picking up the tradition, really makes all the difference."

Avid anglers like Rich and Reef Cup Committee Member Ken Reda will also tell you the sailfish provides a thrill unmatched in other kinds of fishing. The colorful, acrobatic sailfish presents a beauty and a performance when on the end of a line that has granted them the reputation of being the most celebrated and sought-after billfish. As surface swimmers, a hooked sailfish can be easily seen by all onboard, often displaying aerial acrobatics throughout their spirited fight. In Reda's words, "Sailfishing is characterized by hours of boredom, surrounded by moments of pandemonium."

Ocean Reef is fortunate to be an especially prosperous place for sailfishing, as the yearly sailfish migration runs directly through Key Largo waters November through March. ORC's sailfishing tournaments are intentionally arranged to coincide with this migration pattern, resulting in the record-high numbers seen at past tournaments - like 93 releases in one day at Reef Cup 2012. In recent years, the best sailfishing has trended towards the late winter, early spring contrary to what's been seen in the past where fishing was hot in early winter. Reda and the Reef Cup Committee hopes

the new March tournament date will capitalize on these changing sailfish trends and in turn, deliver higher tournament numbers, like the 507 releases in 2009, and an increase in sailfish flags flying.

If you've ever attended the Return of the Fleet, these flags are likely something you've noticed on boats heading in after a day of Reef Cup fishing — each flag indicating one sailfish catch and release. Reda explained that the history of these flags has changed over the years and even differs depending on the region you're fishing in.

"The white flag with a blue fish seen flying from the outriggers of many Reef boats, has always represented a sailfish catch," explained Reda. "As the transition to sailfish conservancy began, some

anglers implemented a red flag to indicate a fish was caught, but released, while others chose to fly their white flags upside down to indicate a released fish.

With the unlawful harvesting of the species in place for the past 15 years, some of this flag etiquette has become obsolete. Now, if you see any sailfish flag flying, you can guarantee it was a catch and release."

Despite the differences

in etiquette, sailfish flags still universally indicate one important thing – an angler's prowess – and there's no doubt this prowess will be on full display during the upcoming Sailfish Classic and Reef Cup tournaments. Who will come out on top is unknown, but the hunt for the breathtakingly beautiful and jaw-droppingly acrobatic sailfish will certainly never become obsolete.

How It All Began

When **Teresa Holmes** was the Board Chair of Ocean Reef Club, she asked if we could offer a "Blessing of the Animals" event for the Club. Thanks to Teresa's initiative, and the work of Kyle Landers and his staff, this annual event has now become a meaningful, established tradition.

A "Blessing of the Animals" event normally takes place on October 4th, and is associated with the feast day of St. Francis. Being pragmatists, our event takes place instead, at a time when most of the Members of the Club are in residence.

Yet, for many of us, the origins of our observance are lost in obscurity. Our image of Francis himself, highly romanticized.

A steep, winding drive takes you to the hilltop city of Assisi in central Italy. The magnificent structure of the Basilica of St. Francis is a kind of ecclesiastical marsupial. Its grandeur enfolds the humble origins of the small chapel like a "joey." That small simple structure far better reflects the life of its namesake, Francis.

If Francis were to make a

personal appearance at our event this Saturday, we would consider him an eccentric. He became the unlikely leader of what a generation ago would be identified as, the counterculture.

Wearing his cheap, roughlytextured, hooded brown robe, Francis would likely have felt more at home in the crowds at Max Yasgur's farm in Woodstock than sipping a cocktail on The Point at Ocean Reef.

The late twelfth century in Europe was a time much like our own. It was a time of great prosperity. Francis' father was a successful merchant, whose fortune had come from the rag business - a wealthy cloth merchant.

Historians tell us Francis experienced a spiritual crisis in his twenties. He had formed an intense, almost obsessive revulsion toward lepers. Yet as he read the Bible, he realized that major figures in God's story – notably Job and Lazarus – had been lepers.

That realization radically changed his perspective. He saw himself, and not the socially stigmatized leper, as the one who stood in need of healing. In response, what a psychologist might label reaction formation, it is reported that he rushed up to a leper and wrapped them in his arms.

Francis became a disruptive presence in the life of the Church. To quote one historian, "...this playboy son

of an Italian millionaire threw away his money, shouted the Christian message at birds in the graveyard, and threw the Church into a turmoil by saying that Christ was a downand-out with no possessions."

Imagine how you would have responded if he had been your heir!

In time, Francis' followers were formed into an order within the life of the Church. Their life, these Franciscans, is a constant reminder of the teaching of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount. He tells us, "Do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Look at the birds of the air, they do not sow or

reap or store away in barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not more valuable than they?"

Francis reminds us of both the goodness of God's creation, and the generous heart of God's concern for each of us. He reminds us that life does not consist of the abundance of our possessions.

You won't find me wearing a brown robe this Saturday, and you will see us sipping a glass of wine from time-to-time on The Point. But I hope that as we gather with our pets, and thank God for the blessing they bring our lives, we'll also be aware of the impact of the faith and life of the man whose legacy we celebrate together.

One last thing – no snakes please!

NEWS AT THE MEDICAL CENTER

Testing....1,2,3

COVID response from the Medical Center has been the focus of 2020, 2021 and the start of 2022. Monroe County reported a 39.1% COVID positivity test from December 31 to January 7.

As reported on January 7th in the Miami Herald, "Florida's surging COVID case counts are likely to peak by mid-January at about 90,000 new cases a day, scientists at the University of Florida's Emerging Pathogens Institute recently projected. The surge is due to the highly contagious omicron variant."

Last week the Medical Center, again, quickly responded to the ongoing COVID situation, assisting the community with on-site, no charge, COVID testing. Setting up a mobile site location unit

How We Got Here

905's Interesting Past



In October 1962, when the Cold War may have been at its highest peak, a U-2 reconnaissance aircraft took photos of Russian missiles being installed in Cuba. Suddenly the Keys, because of its close proximity to Cuba, became the center of our nation's effort to locate anti-missile missile sites. President Kennedy drew a line in the sand and the crisis only lasted for two weeks, but the perceived threat continued to exist and we, as a nation, were not ready...not even close.

The 6th Battalion (HAWK), 65th Artillery, a unit of the joint STRIKE Command, was stationed at Fort Meade, Maryland and received orders to move to Key West on October 20, 1962 and became operational in early November 1962. In an effort to prepare a defensive ring around the Homestead Air Force Base, the U.S. Corps of Engineers were directed to prepare another missile location outside Ocean Reef's front gates just south of the three-way stop. The technology for defensive missiles advanced rapidly during this time and the then state-of-the-art missile was the solid fuel Nike HM-40 (Hercules). This HM-40 was the missile to be installed in North Key Largo and was to be transferred from Homestead and operated by Battery B.

Typically, these missile sites located the detection (radars) a fair distance away from the actual missiles connected by buried cables and this practice

was followed here. One half mile south of the three-way stop, the road curves to the right as you go south. Part of the HM-40 installation is on the left and was the location of the radar antennas, of which there were three. Three because of flexibility and redundancy. The actual missiles were installed further south on SR-905.

Of note, these types of missile installations were always on the same side of a road because of the cables connecting the radars to the launch sites, however, as you can see on the attached map, the two are on opposite sides. The reason is the road was subsequently changed. The old original highway (designated as 1928) followed the route as shown and the three-way stop was a fourway stop for a short period. Route 905 became the new designation and remains today.

The HM-40 site did not become fully operational until July 1965 and due to the rapid advances in missile technology, was closed in June of 1979. The radar site is under state control and

remains a part of the Key Largo Hammock Botanical State Park. The launch site is under federal control and is part of the Crocodile Lake National Wildlife Refuge.

Also of note is an old pier located a short distance east of the radar site. Back in the early 1900's huge amounts of dynamite were required to build roads, canals and landfills in South Florida (and, of course, Ocean Reef Club used a sizable amount). Instead of using the Port of Miami to unload shipments of explosives which could have been very dangerous, a large concrete pier was constructed and became known as the 'dynamite docks'. Dynamite entered through this pier until an agreement was signed with Dupont Chemical to use their facility at Port St. Lucie. Subsequently, the dock became a popular location for smugglers. Finally, years later, 'dynamite docks' was dynamited; however, some of the concrete is still visible.





Have you ever noticed that you always have an unexpected disaster at 6 a.m. on a Sunday or in the middle of a holiday weekend when most of your normal resources are unavailable? That is, "unavailable" unless you are at Ocean Reef.

Our friends and fellow Members Mason and Candy **Heydt** were visiting for a couple of weeks on their boat in the Marina. They were awakened Sunday morning by their thirteen-year-old basset hound Charlotte, who was gasping and in convulsions. Charlotte had



called Public Safety. Assistance came in ten minutes. The EMTs helped maneuver Charlotte down the boarding ladder in a bedsheet. "It's great they had several strong young men who got her in our car," Mason said with gratitude. Carlos Smith was the doctor on call at the Medical Center. When he heard Candy's message, he rushed to the dock out of concern. He told the Heydt's that the ORCAT Veterinarian, Lora Cummings, lived in Islamorada. They called her at home and left another urgent voicemail.

Candy and Mason jumped in their car and headed out with no clear destination in mind, only a need to be active. Doctor Cummings called back within minutes. She told them to turn around and go to the Grayvik Animal Care Center, she would be there in forty minutes. She called several times along the way to check in.

Doctor Cummings arrived with her husband, and Doctor Carlos Smith also dropped by to assure they made the connection. Together they got Charlotte inside and sedated. A sad and harrowing morning ended with Charlotte in peace, and Mason and Candy overwhelmed with appreciation for the efforts Ocean Reef made for them. Candy said, "Lora Cummings is as kind and nice as anyone you have ever met." Even discovering that Lora was a graduate of Duke (bitter rival of Candy's alma mater UNC) did not dim the regard. "She is one special Blue Devil," Candy said.

Protecting Your Skin From Harmful UV Rays

The New Year is a time to break bad habits and to start out on a good note with a more positive and healthier lifestyle. What better time is there to re-evaluate your skincare and sun protection products?! Living in South Florida, the sun is a beautiful thing that many of us enjoy, however, it can also wreak havoc on your skin.

Sunscreen is one of the best ways to protect your skin, but it isn't the only thing you should

do. The sun can cause wrinkles, discoloration, poor skin texture, and other signs of aging, but it can also cause skin cancer. More people are diagnosed with skin cancer each year in the US than all other cancers combined, but the good news is that skin cancer is the most preventable form of cancer, so why not do all you can to reduce the risks?

Below are some healthy skin tips to help you protect your skin better in 2022 and for years to come:

- 1) Wear sunscreen daily, even on a rainy day! UVB Rays are the rays best known for burning or tanning the skin, and most are aware they need to protect from these. UVA Rays however, are what we call the "aging rays". They cut through glass, so it is even important to protect your skin when sitting by a window or driving.
- 2) Know the difference between physical/mineral and chemical sunscreens. Physical sunscreens work similar to a shield, and create a protective

physical barrier on the surface of the skin so UV rays are not absorbed. The active ingredients in these are usually Zinc and Titanium Dioxide. Many years ago, it was difficult to find one of these that was not thick, chalky and white. Now, it is easy to find more cosmetically elegant formulations, and these work well on sensitive skin.

3) Chemical sunscreens

- work differently in that, when applied, your body absorbs the active ingredient, which in turn absorbs the UV rays, convert them to heat, and then eliminate them through the skin. Chemical sunscreens require time for absorption to work properly, which is why it is recommended to apply 30 minutes before you are exposed. Some of the active ingredients you may see in a chemical sunscreen could include: Avobenzone, Octisalate, Octocrylene, Homosalate, Octinoxate, and Oxybenzone.
- 4) Wear clothing that has built in UV or UPF protection, and

wear a UV or UPF protection hat with a wide brim to protect your scalp, face, neck, ears and chest, where skin is thinner.

- 5) **Use a topical antioxidant** that helps reduce free radical formation and photoaging, such as the CE Ferulic from Skinceuticals.
- 6) When outside, sit under an umbrella, or **find shade**.
- 7) **Choose a sunscreen that is SPF 30 or higher**, and is broad spectrum, protecting from both UVA and UVB rays.
- 8) Early detection can save lives see a dermatologist for skin checks and report unusual moles or changes in your skin. If you have a history of skin cancer in your family, this is a must!
- 9) **Avoid indoor tanning**, as this is still UV radiation.
- 10) Choose sunglasses that offer protection from UVA and UVB rays.



Fast4 Tennis

Try It!

Don't have time for a full tennis match? Well, think again! "Fast4 Tennis" could be a game changer (literally!).

Fast4 Tennis, a format initiated by Tennis Australia, is a shortened match format to that of the traditional six-game set.

Fast4 is played as follows:

• First to 4, win by 2 Example: 4-0, 4-2

- Tiebreaker at 3-3 Example: 4-3(4)--tiebreaker score 7-4
- No-Ad scoring: the receiver chooses which side they would like to receive from on the deuce point
- Play lets: if the serve hits the net cord and lands in the box, the let is not called. Rather, the returner plays the serve as usual.

This format is being played on the international professional level. It was most recently used at the year-end tournament for the up and coming pros at the Next Gen ATP Finals in Milan, Italy

Bridge Tip of the Week

When the Bidding Goes:

1 Club - Pass - Pass -?

When a 1club opening bid is passed to you, keep in mind partner was not strong enough to overcall 1 Club.

When a 1club opening bid is passed to you, look at your club length. If you are short, partner may yet have a good hand. If you have club length, a good chance partner is weak.

1) S- Q4 H- 876 D- K976 C- AJ95

2) S- Q98 H-A954 D-KJ87 C- 84

With (1), pass because partner is probably short in clubs and probably weak not to be able to bid at the one level. Opener probably has the 18-19 point balanced hand and wants to get back into the bidding.

With (2), double your club shortness indicates that partner may have a good hand with clubs after all.




