# The Grand Inquisitor

While serving on a committee with a friend during our Los Angeles years, the subject of Russian literature came up in a side conversation. That conversation gave birth to a reading group of half-dozen guys who would meet together five or six times a year for dinner and a book discussion. We dubbed our group, pretentiously - The Gentlemen's Literary Society. Our wives responded with appropriate derisive laughter!

One author we read became like a powerful tide, pulling me along – Fyodor Dostoyevsky. He produced a prodigious anthology of work in his 60 years. The Russian philosopher, Nicolas Berdyaev, said of him, "So great is the worth of Dostoyevsky that to have produced him is by itself sufficient justification for the existence of the Russian people in the world."

I mention this because I've been asked to lead another book discussion at the Art League this season. I've chosen a short work, what many say is Dostoyevsky's finest writing. It is the chapter from his novel, "The Brothers Karamazov," titled "The Grand Inquisitor." My goal is to encourage those who might attend to read that chapter ahead of time. It's available online, so you don't have to purchase the book.

A legitimate question is, "What does a Russian author from the late 19th century have to say to our particular moment in time?" The answer, I suggest, is found in the old adage that those who won't learn from history, are doomed to repeat it!

Dostoyevsky lived and wrote in the decades leading up to Russia's political and social revolution. He died in 1881. Many of us have watched the film version of Boris Pasternak's "Dr. Zhivago." The revolution saw Russia abolish the monarchy, brutally murder the Tsar and his family, and ruthlessly impose a socialist form of government.

A violent revolution in our nation seems unlikely. However, there is a growing infatuation with the notion that we would be better served by a socialist form of government.

Dostoyevsky is important because from his writing, we can recognize the similarities between many of the arguments and assumptions that led to Russia's embrace of socialism, and those being proposed in the unsettling political discourse of our own time.

Berdyaev said, "Dostoyevsky was the first to see things no other had seen and always, he saw further ahead than anyone else."

What he foresaw came to pass less than 40 years following his death. What came to pass has produced more economic devastation, social misery, and religious oppression than any other political ideology in modern times.

What had he seen? He saw that the underground currents of his day, much like our own, would not lead to the promised freedom and prosperity. Rather, they would lead to bondage. He recognized that in core socialist doctrine, freedom was slowly destroyed in the name of providing happiness. Freedom, misunderstood, leads to tyranny.

His argument was that a false equality, what is being called equity today, actually leads to radical inequality. He believed socialism would eventually result in the control of people at large, by a small, centralized minority. Remember "Animal Farm?"

Many may not be aware that the fountainhead of

Dostoyevsky's thought is found in the deep roots of his Eastern Orthodox Christian faith. It was his love of Christ that led him to give up his earlier humanistic philosophy. He wrote in one of his notebooks that "no other expression of atheism has ever had such force in Europe as humanitarianism," or humanism.

At the heart of "The Grand Inquisitor" is the understanding that God-given freedom and its corresponding responsibility, is the key to our dignity as people made in God's image. He believed that "true liberty and true equality are possible only in Christ, in following the way of the 'God-made-man."

For Dostoyevsky, "any idea of world-wide happiness and the common unity of mankind

from which God is excluded, means disaster for humankind and the loss of our freedom."

It is his view that, whenever we think that we can make a better world without God, one in which we eliminate misery, tears and injustice, the logical development is inevitably a campaign against God in the name of the love of good. Humanistic utopian vision ultimately results in a dystopian reality.

The reading group won't turn into a revival meeting. But sober consideration of his concerns may lead us to take stock of how the current tide of our political discourse is taking us further away from the roots of our republic. Something to think about.

# Coming February 15th **DEATHTRAP**

....a play that will captivate you

If you haven't already done so, get your ticket right away for the live performance of **Deathtrap** at the Cultural Center on February 15th.

Deathtrap is one of my favorite plays. I was there for the opening night on Broadway in 1978. And later I had a chance to interview the playwright Ira Levin for Playbill Magazine.

He was a very nice modest man, and not a bit scary, though I still have nightmares from the movie *Rosemary's Baby* (based on his book) and he was a recipient of the lifetime achievement award from the Horror Writer's Association. (Just one of his many awards, including four Tony nominations for *Deathtrap*, which played 1,809 performances on Broadway between 1978 and 1982.)

#### What's Deathtrap about?

That's a tough question, because *Deathtrap* is filled with unexpected twists and turns and there is a danger that too

much information will give the devious plot away.

Let's just say – The story revolves around an aging dramatist who plots to kill a young rival and steal his new play.

I know, it doesn't sound a bit funny, but it is. And scary too.

This tightrope between giggles and jitters presents a difficult task for the director and the actors. But lucky for us Zoetic Stage, the extraordinary theater company associated with Miami's Arsht Performing Arts Center, is up to the task. Two of Zoetic's founders are involved in the production —

Michael McKeever is playing the leading role of Sidney Bruhl and Stuart Meltzer is the *Deathtrap* director.

I spoke to Michael a few weeks ago when he and the other three actors in the cast had begun rehearsals for *Deathtrap*. "We are loving it," he told me. "What a wonderful play. Ira Levin was the king of

the high concept thriller."

Michael McKeever, who is himself a playwright (his play Daniel's Husband had three NYC Off-Broadway productions), says the experience of acting in Deathtrap has inspired him to write a thriller.

Stuart Meltzer, who with Michael founded and runs Zoetic Stage, is the most acclaimed director on the Florida scene. He has won a full shelf of Carbonell Awards (the Florida equivalent of the Tony) and he directed all of the four productions that Zoetic brought to Ocean Reef – After, Sunday in the Park with George, The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time, The Gin Game.

When I expressed astonishment at what seemed to me a Herculean task of bringing a Broadway quality production to Ocean Reef for a single night, Michael said that the Zoetic gang looked on it as "a wonderful adventure. We get to explore a play that we haven't done before and because there will be just one

performance, we approach it with a heightened focus."

Michael admits that constructing the set, creating costumes, adjusting the lighting, and having two dress rehearsals on the Cultural Center stage makes for a pretty intense 48-hour period.

Still these talented Zoetic theater professionals attest that they love the audience at The Reef. "They are astute," says Michael. "They listen and appreciate the live theatre experience."

Thank you, Michael, Stuart and the rest of your cast and crew. Ocean Reef and Zoetic Stage have formed a mutual admiration society. Next meeting, February 15th at the Cultural Center.

# Medical Lecture Series Presents: "The Genetic Revolution in Cancer Care"

Please join us on February 8th at 5 p.m. in the Cultural Center Theatre for "The Genetic Revolution in Cancer Care" with guest speaker Theodoros N. Teknos, M.D., President and Chair of Jane and Lee Seidman Cancer Innovation, University Hospitals Seidman Cancer Care in Cleveland, Ohio.



Medical Lecture Series guest speaker Theodoros N. Teknos, M.D.

Dr. Teknos came to University Hospitals in October 2017 from Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center, where he has served in several leadership roles since 2008. He served as Professor and Chair, Department of Otolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery. Prior to his position at Ohio State, he was Division Chief, Head & Neck Oncology Division, Department of Otolaryngology at the University of Michigan Health System in Ann Arbor. From 2007 to 2014, Dr. Teknos co-chaired a Task Force on Recurrent & Metastatic Disease for the National Cancer Institute's Head & Neck Cancer Steering Committee.

Dr. Teknos earned his medical degree from Harvard Medical School. He completed his otolaryngology residency at Massachusetts Eye & Ear Infirmary/Harvard Combined Program, Boston and a fellowship in head and neck oncology, skull base and microvascular reconstruction at Vanderbilt University Medical Center in Nashville.

His expertise also includes melanoma, reconstructive surgery, salivary gland tumors, sino-nasal tumors and thyroid cancer.

Dr. Teknos stated in a recent UTUBE video, "A little known fact is that patients who have cancer who are treated at a comprehensive cancer center have a 20% better chance of survival than those that are treated at a community hospital that is a non-comprehensive cancer center." The Jane and Lee Seidman Cancer Center is 1 of the 13 freestanding cancer care centers in the country.

In addition to proudly recognizing the efforts of our students here, we applaud the efforts and knowhow of Mrs. Evans, without whom this project and its successful outcome would have occurred.

As 8th grader Isabella Vazquez recounted, "During this experience, I learned that it's okay to make mistakes and to never give up. It's important to speak your mind if you seek change." Her classmate, Jake Davies, added, "Presenting in front of the Head of School made me nervous, but I was confident because I worked hard and I believed in the change I was proposing." Kameron Holman echoed those thoughts, "One thing I learned is how important a speaker's confidence is when trying to persuade an audience."

Reflecting further on the effectiveness of the 8th graders' persuasive speeches, Mr. Murphy was pleased to share that he has since scheduled a faculty meeting this week to discuss changes to some of The Academy's policies. As he shared with the students at the end of class on Friday, they are an integral part of our school community and we always want them to use their voices to responsibly advocate for themselves and student life at The Academy.





On a chilly Saturday afternoon, we realized the Burgee Bar was open and we were pleased to find a table on the porch looking out at the Main Channel. The view was lovely, and the food just marvelous.

Kudos to Chef Jazzmine King, who was recently promoted from Burgee Bar Sous Chef to Chef de Cuisine, and is adding a variety of "American Regional Cuisine" along with retaining traditional menu items at the Burgee Bar. Jazzmine began cooking at age seven, inspired by her mom and grandma, and went on to graduate from the Mississippi University

# How We Got Here

"There's Oil in Them Thar Keys"

In 1938 during construction of a bridge in the lower Keys. a huge rock was blasted loose by dynamite and the deep hole immediately filled with crude oil. Tests were made, surveys were conducted and many geologists believed the oil came from the same strata as the huge oil fields in Louisiana and Texas.

World War II had underlined the importance of oil for our country's future. Refined oil was needed for the production of

toluene for synthetic rubber, gasoline, lubricants, tar, and bomb making. At the end of the war we were about to enter the golden era of the post war economic boom.

The State of Florida was anxious to participate, a sign of which was the passage of the Florida Oil Discovery Award Bill in 1941. That bill awarded the first company to strike oil in the state the sum of \$50,000. Humble Oil Company (later ExxonMobil) won the prize

striking oil east of Naples in 1943. Numerous wells were drilled in the next few years, some as deep as 12,000 feet, all showing favorable signs of oil bearing strata, but no flow.

In 1948, Sinclair Oil Company began drilling a short distance from Ocean Reef's front gate (not far from the end of Coral Lane in the Hammock area). The land was under lease from the Florida Internal Improvement Board and the 150-foot derrick is pictured

left. The 'wildcat' driller was Harry Morgan Company from Shreveport, Louisiana, and they ceased drilling at a depth of nearly 12,000 feet which was comparable to the strike depth of the Naples well.

Drilling continued in the Keys in other areas such as Barnes Sound, Plantation Key, Big Pine Key, and Key West. All were dry, however, each produced enticing results that showed 'oil stains' and tar. By the mid '60's, all efforts to drill slowly faded away as did Florida's dream of becoming a major oil producing state... thankfully.

#### **HISTORY BUFF?**



# Lower Crossed Syndrome & What We Can Do About It

One common complaint among golfers that come to see me for Golf-Fitness Consultations is of lower back pain. Although the first instinct may be to try and directly strengthen the back, the cause for pain can typically be attributed to weaknesses and imbalance elsewhere. One such condition is called Lower Crossed Syndrome (LCS). LCS is a muscular imbalance resulting in postural changes that leads to lower back pain over time.

Prolonged sitting, poor posture, and a sedentary lifestyle are all causes of LCS. The prolonged sitting can lead to shortened hip flexors which leads to tightened lower back muscles, which then creates weakened core and glute muscles. With poor posture, muscles can end up being stressed from one side more than the other, or create higher tension in some areas. Some symptoms usually experienced by people with LCS include reduced mobility of stiffness in the lumbar through pelvic

region, pain in the hip flexors, groin, spine, and glutes, a protruding stomach from an overly arched low back, and tension in the lower back/glutes.

Exercise is the most immediate fix to LCS, while lifestyle changes can help prevent it from becoming a problem. The first step in treating LCS is loosening the hip flexors and lower back, which can be achieved using foam rolling and floor stretches. The next step is strengthening the weak abdominal and gluteal muscles. Things like glute bridges are an excellent and simple exercise that can be done at the gym or at home. The Cat-Cow stretch can also start to incorporate flexibility in the back and hips. Some lifestyle changes that can help prevent LCS from becoming an issue include incorporating more movement into your daily life. Getting up every 20-30 minutes and walking or stretching can help keep your hip flexors a little less tight and wake the glutes up.

If you do feel like you suffer from LCS or want to have a more flexible and functional body, contact the Member Fitness Center and schedule a session with a personal trainer today!


them go repeatedly through the maneuver with growing confidence.




