46th Bag Room Open Begins Today

What began as a way for Ocean Reef's golf professionals to name the best professional on The Reef, has grown immensely to become one of the most meaningful and followed golf events on the Club calendar. In fact, Dan Fabian, the first official Bag Room Champion, remembered seeing only 20 to 30 carts during his final match of the 1977 inaugural tournament. Golf Chair **Jodi Betz** remarked that crowds now regularly exceed 100 carts.

"More and more Members come out each year to support and watch the rounds," said Card Sound Golf Club's Kyle Johnston, who has played in the most Bag Rooms of any professional since starting his career at Card Sound in 1994. "I hear Members talking about the tournament constantly, even planning their days around the rounds. It's really special."

Another part of what makes the Bag Room truly unique is the Golf Mentor Program, founded by the late Stan Ellis, which pairs Member mentors with Golf Staff mentees towards the goal of helping them blossom in their careers. During the Bag Room Open, these mentors also serve as caddies for their mentees.

37th Reef Cup Begins March 9

Since the tradition began in 1986 with 24 participants squaring off for three days of serious sailfishing and nightly celebration, the Reef Cup Invitational Sailfish Tournament has become The Reef's most anticipated fishing tournament of the season. Thirty-seven years later, the tournament is capped at a

60-boat fleet and has been held every year, rain or shine, since the inaugural tournament.

Reef Cup Committee member **Ken Reda** describes the tournament as "amongst the oldest time-honored events we host here at the Club."

With a waitlist steadily maintained for years, it's safe to say the Reef Cup tournament is widely regarded as The Reef's most popular fishing tournament. And for the anglers that participate year after year, the tournament has historically become as much about friendship and camaraderie as the sailfishing itself.

As with every longstanding tradition, there comes a time for reform. This year, for the first time in tournament history, Reef Cup moved from its traditional January slot to March 9 to 12, aiming to capitalize on changing sailfish patterns and deliver higher tournament numbers, like the 507 releases seen in 2009.

- Q: When can I close on a lot?
 A: Closing on lots can begin as early as June 30, 2022.
- Q: What makes up the HOA?

 A:The HOA is comprised of the Cannon Point home and dockage, the marina on The Island, the beach, the Island Beach House, three caretaker quarters, a dockmaster's office, the sport courts, the cart paths, the launches and other equipment.
- Q: What are the HOA fees?
 A:The ownership team is currently working on the budget.
- Q: When will HOA fees start?
 A: HOA fees will begin the later of two years from date of purchase or the completion of the Island Beach House.
- Q: How will buyers be assured the HOA amenities will be built?

 A:The ownership team has agreed to escrow sufficient funds to ensure the HOA amenities are constructed and completed, and equipment is purchased.
- Q: What is the construction timeline for HOA amenities? A: Two years.
- Q: Do ORCA rules and regulations apply when building on The Island?
 A: Yes, although landscape and architecture review requirements are not applicable.
- Q: Can I use my own architect/builder? A: Yes.
- Q: Will there be dockage available?

 A: Assigned dockage will be available to each homeowner.

Faith Matters

It's early Tuesday morning. The movement of palm fronds is just visible in the dark. The jolt of caffeine from my coffee is nothing compared to the jolt of this morning's news headlines. "Putin's 40 miles of killing machines taunt Ukraine." "Russia bears down." "A complete waste of life." Nearby, you see the photo of an innocent six-year-old girl, killed in what looks like her bed.

The courage of the Ukrainian leaders and people in the face of this overwhelming military onslaught is an inspiration to us all. President Zellenskyy's

retort, "I don't need a ride. Send me ammunition," has galvanized the resolve of his people.

As I write this, there are two books next to the laptop on my desk. The author of one, "Homo Deus - A Brief History of Tomorrow," makes an astonishing claim. He writes, "...we have managed to rein in famine, plague and war.... We don't need to pray to any god or saint to rescue us from them. We know quite well what needs to be done in order to prevent famine, plague and war - and we usually succeed in doing it." His books have sold more than thirty-million copies.

The author of the other book titled his, "Flashpoints – The Emerging Crisis in Europe." Last night, I re-read his chapter on "Russia and Its Borderlands." He wrote a sobering analysis seven years ago saying, "The eastern part of the peninsula (European) in 1991 saw a weak Russia

and a strong Europe. Now the reverse is true.... The situation also had opened the door for the Russians to pursue their strategic interests."

If you're as old as I am, you can recall walking out of your fourth-grade classroom and lining up in the hallway. Our teachers instructed us to kneel down on the floor, close to the wall. Your face was down by your knees, while your hands covered the back of your head. These were preparations for a nuclear attack. It never occurred to ask what the teachers were thinking.

Yesterday, knowledgeable experts on FOX and CNN rationally discussed the very real possibility of nuclear weapons being introduced into the conflict in Ukraine. There was talk of World War III. As my head hit the pillow last night, I found myself wondering, "Which of the two authors is surprised by these recent events?"

The written words from a New Testament text went off like an alarm clock in my head this morning. The author, James, was a Jewish follower of Jesus in the midfirst century. He poses the question, "What causes fights and quarrels among you?" He answers insightfully, "Don't they come from your desires that battle within you? You desire but you do not have, so you kill. You covet but you cannot get what you want, so you quarrel and fight. You do not have because you do not ask God."

This James likely didn't have global political conflict on his mind. Yet, what he wrote remains an accurate, though often unwelcome analysis, of the central issue at the core of our human condition.

At Ocean Reef, there are two thoughts you should never entertain. The first, that you're the wealthiest person in the room. The other, that you're the smartest person in the room.

Last Sunday, our guest speaker, almost in an aside,

said, "You can't have faith without humility. Humility is a pre-condition to faith."

It doesn't take a MENSA intellect to recognize that humility is a character trait suffering from its own "supply chain" crisis. The chain connects the boundless supply from the gracious heart of God to the inexhaustible need of our human hearts. The problem is not limited supply. It's just the demand is quite low.

Let me be quick to add this can be as true of religious leaders as of tyrants like Putin. Sadly, with the latter, the consequences in terms of human suffering scale up exponentially.

The first book's author claimed, "we don't need to pray to any god or saint to rescue us." Maybe your response is the same as mine. "Really?"

A Psalm from the Hebrew Scriptures, recognizing our human need, humbly appeals to God. The Psalmist prays, O God, "Gird your sword on your side, you mighty one; clothe yourself with splendor and majesty. In your majesty ride forth victoriously in the cause of truth, humility and justice; let your right hand achieve awesome deeds."

No matter what happens, don't expect to find me kneeling down next to the walls of our new chapel, with my face to my knees, and my hands behind my head.

Instead, let me invite you to join me in doing something else we did in the fourth grade, every day. What was that? We said the Pledge of Allegiance, and began the day with prayer.

It reminds us of the great opportunity we have as a nation, and the tremendous responsibility that comes with it. It also reminds us that ultimately, we are not in charge. That's humbling. That's a good thing.

Something to think about.



Passionate Catering

The stars are continuing to drop down from the sky to populate our kitchens. I recently sat down with Chef Catalin Munteanu, our new Executive Banquet Chef. It was an inspiring visit.

A month or two ago, I reported on Catalin's trial-by-fire audition preparing a multi course dinner in the Ocean Room kitchen under the appraising eyes of all the Ocean Reef Chefs. The pressure was higher than any television cooking challenge I have watched. I would have been unnerved, but Catalin never showed any sign of tension. Today I learned his secret: he starts every day with ten minutes in an ice bath. He says it calms him and releases any negative thoughts. He says, "Cooking is me infusing you with my energy. No good food comes from negative people." Fortunately for us, Catalin got the job.

Catalin was born in a picturesque mountain town, Brasov Transylvania, a part of Romania. His home was 18 miles from Vlad the Impaler's castle (now a tourist attraction as "Dracula's Castle"). Catalin chuckles, "We lived so close, I may even have inherited some blood from Vlad." I asked him

if he does shish kabobs, but he didn't get the joke.

Catalin came to the United States at 18. He grew up with dreams of America. "You have the chance to do anything you are capable of," he says (in very good English). He remembers arriving with three entire sentences of English, but "read, read," to build his vocabulary. He worked in a kitchen in Boca Raton where they had a program to rotate you through all the stations (similar to our J1 Visa program I wrote about last month). He moved to Vail, Colorado to cook in Three Basil. He was Sous Chef for four years. He joined the Ritz Carlton Organization and became the Chef de Cuisine of the Beach Club at the Sarasota Ritz. He made four more moves with Ritz, building kitchens and menus, then spent three years at the JW Marriott in Traverse City, Michigan, where he initiated a farm-to-table program. He personally planted and tended the raised-bed farm.

Catalin was about to take a job in Nashville. The papers had all been prepared to hire him as Executive Chef at Nolle.

Our Ocean Reef Executive
Chef Jared Reardon and Tammy
Adams of Human Resources
rushed to intervene. They called
to say, "Stop the presses." They
sent Catalin a plane ticket. As
he stepped into Ocean Reef,
Catalin says, "I saw a place
where greatness can occur." If
you sampled the lamb stew at
the Film Festival Dinner, or the
succulent duck at the Cultural
Center dinner before Chris Isaak's
concert, you will know how
Catalin has already raised the bar.

Catalin oversees two Chefs de Cuisine, several department managers, and more than two-

dozen cooks. "You have to make peace with hard work and long days. You have to be as good as your people, we are true colleagues. When you have a room with hundreds of diners, you must try to make sure everyone receives a little bit of love that you put there. I know I did my job when I go into a dining room and all I hear is utensils against plates."

Chef Catalin's ambition matches his philosophy. "We want to make this the best banquet and catering experience in Florida. The Board gives us all the tools, now it is up to us."







The sailors were fantastic in their preparation and the big red button on the starting horn system was activated at 10:03 a.m.

Even though we did have a few in-between race delays for tuning and tweaking of one's sail setup, we managed to get all five scheduled races run by 11:30 a.m. with nary an issue with the tide. The winner of the day was Al Mast who displayed his usual consistency and excellent race craft. Second Place went to Sim Wooten who spent the early two races on his birthday chasing Al and yours truly only to "flip the script" and have us chasing him for the final three races. Finally, one point adrift of Sim finishing in Third for the day was your author, Windsor Coffin. A few fundamental errors kept me from finishing further up the order, but it is always fun to try to work your way back from being behind.

Early forecasts for Sunday at the time of this writing are looking like the winds will be on the stronger side, so we might have to break out our smaller, heavier air "B" rigs. We will find out on Sunday what we have in store for racing.


