Liv Ullmann Awarded an Oscar for Lifetime Achievement

Long-time Ocean Reef resident Liv Ullmann, perhaps the most renowned actress of 20th-century international cinema, will be honored with an Honorary Oscar award for lifetime achievement at this year's Governors Awards ceremony, to be held on March 25th. In announcing the award, the Academy for Motion Picture Arts and Sciences praised the Norwegian-born Ullmann for a career marked by the "bravery and emotional transparency that has gifted audiences with deeply affecting screen portrayals".

Ullmann is probably best known for the films she made during an artistically rich collaboration with the master Swedish director Ingmar Bergman. She starred in some of his greatest works, including

Persona (1966), Cries and Whispers (1972), and Scenes from a Marriage (1973). But her long career is also marked by searingly honest performances in films such as The Emigrants (1971) and Face to Face (1976), both of which garnered her Oscar nominations for best actress.

She has shown equal virtuosity as a film director. Her film Faithless was nominated for the grand prize at the 2000 Cannes Film Festival, and in 2014 she directed Jessica Chastain and Colin Farrell in an acclaimed film adaptation of the Scandinavian classic Miss Julie.

Although best known as a screen actress, Ullmann began her career on the stage in

Norway, where she became one of the leading interpreters of Ibsen, particularly in her signature role as Nora in "A Doll's House". She continued her theater work throughout her career, winning acclaim on both the London and New York stage.

Ullmann is the author of two best-selling memoirs, Changing (1977) and Choices (1984). In more recent years, she has engaged in humanitarian work, becoming a Goodwill Ambassador for UNICEF, the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund, and long working with the International Rescue Committee. She was co-founder and is honorary chair of the Women's Refugee Commission.

generously agreeing to sell it three times, for \$160,000 a pop.

Meanwhile the Silent Auction, co-chaired by Anne Marie Peretz, Barbara Olcott and Kelly Hertzman. generated \$1,717,571, a 28 percent increase over the previous record. And the largest amount ever raised by a single Silent Auction item was \$110,000 for the Augusta Signature Jacket, featuring the autograph of 25 champions who have won a total of 48 times at Augusta, including every winner from 1971 through 2007. That prize was donated by **Dan** and Julie Cronin, and as Dan points out, "Only at Ocean Reef can you donate a unique sports item and then experience the joy

of witnessing the last-minute bidding frenzy of charitable Members!"

Finally, the total in cash donations was \$1,529,302, 20 percent more than the previous high. (And the catalog was 25 percent bigger, too!)

Richard Weinstein, president and COO of the Foundation, calls all this "the blessing of 'enough," as he credits the commitment of ORC's Members.

"We do nothing without them. The way they raised their paddles was an astonishing, amazing and remarkable show of their belief in the Club's Unique Way of Life. Friends of Everglades Hosts "Clean Water Conversations"

As many of you know, the **Everglades Protection Alliance** (Alliance) has been working the last year and a half to stop a proposal to allow nonmilitary aviation at Homestead Air Reserve Base (HARB), sandwiched between two National Parks. We have met with local, state, and federal officials to help convey the significant environmental impacts of such a proposal and have worked with other stakeholders including the Everglades Foundation and Friends of the Everglades to build a coalition of organizations who join us in opposing efforts to bring civil air operations to HARB.

Our efforts in many

ways run parallel to those raising concerns about other developments in South Miami-Dade County, including one that would push the current Urban Development Boundary and allow for the construction of an 800-acre logistics center near HARB. Amazon has a newly completed facility at the foot of the base. And would anchor the additional 800-acre logistics industrial center if approved. The pressure from this encroachment so near the base is not only a concern for the environment, but will over time most likely pose a threat to the core mission statement of the base itself.

On Wednesday, March 30th, Friends of the Everglades will hold a 'Clean Water Conversation' livestream to discuss the danger of unimpeded development pressure in South Florida and the increased pollution, wetlands destruction and residential flooding that will be exacerbated as a result. The panel will include Monroe County Commissioner Michelle Coldiron, environmental land use attorney Richard Grosso, Friends of the Everglades board member

Alan Farago, and Miami Waterkeeper environmental specialist Audrey Siu. Friends of the Everglades Executive Director, Eve Samples, will moderate the discussion. We encourage everyone to tune-in to this important discussion and support the Everglades Protection Alliance and other

members of the coalition as we continue working to protect our environment and quality of life.

A Lesson from the Past

One event from Jesus' earthly ministry can connect us to the deep sense of inadequacy we experience when facing overwhelming human need.

On that occasion, thousands of people had gathered to hear him teach. They had been astounded by his compassion and miraculous works. Having gathered in a remote area, the people had eaten nothing all day. As it was getting late and aware of the crowd's hunger, Jesus turned to his disciples. His words stunned them, saying, "You give

them something to eat."

In response, one of the disciples sheepishly brought a young boy to Jesus. The lad had offered his five small barley rolls and two small fish. Looking at the enormous crowd and the meager resources, the disciple said to Jesus, "But what are these among so many?"

A Tragedy of the Present

For the past five weeks, we have watched a dreadful human tragedy unfold daily. This is no natural disaster. The suffering and devastation being inflicted on the people of Ukraine has come from the twisted mind of an evil tyrant, Vladimir Putin.

We Mourn the Loss

Philip Reed Wills II

Philip Reed Wills II, beloved husband, father, grandfather, and friend, died peacefully on Sunday, March 13, 2022 at his home in Ocean Reef, surrounded by family. He was 82 years old.

Reed is survived by his wife, Joanne Tokarz; their sons, Philip R. Wills III (Trey), and his wife, Christina; Timothy B. Wills, and his wife, Stacey; their daughter Jessica M. Wills, and her husband, Erik; and grandchildren, Maggie, Denver, Sophia, Benjamin, Sydney, and Jackson; and sister-in-law, Kathleen Garrett Wills. Reed was preceded in death by his parents, Gertrude and Benjamin Bowling Wills, and by his brothers, J. Eugene, and Benjamin B. Wills II.

Reed grew up in the Spring Valley area of Washington, D.C. where he cultivated and maintained lifelong friendships. The youngest of three boys, he was born into a family with close ties to the water. Some of his favorite recollections were of time spent as a teenager working at his family's beach resort in Bay Ridge, Maryland and working on his father's excursion boats in Boston, Baltimore, Washington, D.C. and New York.

In the Spring of 1964, Reed met the love of his life on a



blind date. He wooed her with his gregarious personality and smooth dancing skills. Reed enjoyed the music of the '50s and '60s, especially Elvis Presley "Thank you, thank you very much." Married in 1965, the newlyweds settled in Bethesda where they raised three children. Reed became a real estate developer and encouraged Joanne as she pursued her own career in family law and appointment as a Juvenile Court Judge.

The quintessential dealmaker, Reed left an indelible impression on the Washington Metropolitan area, where he literally changed its landscape. For more than 60 years, he developed thousands of lots for homebuilders, built millions of square feet of commercial property and tens of thousands of apartment units.

In the mid-1960's, Reed began his development career building homes in Virginia Beach for Wills and Van Metre, a company founded by his father and brother, Gene. Soon after, he partnered to form Wills and Plank, homebuilders who developed much of Falls Church, Vienna, and McLean. In the 1980s, Reed became a founding partner of NVR, one of the nation's largest homebuilders.

To Reed, nothing was more rewarding than when his children joined Wills Companies in the 1990's. Working together, the family has built upon Reed's vision. With a larger-than-life personality, Reed had a reputation for doing deals based upon your word, a handshake and the 'back of a napkin'. He was a mentor to many aspiring businessmen and women, often very generous with his advice, whether asked for or not. He knew how to listen, and he relished their successes.

In subsequent years, Reed spent his time between St. Michaels, Maryland and Ocean Reef where he could often be found overlooking the water, admiring the passing boats and enthusiastically enforcing the no wake zone. He was a passionate outdoorsman and spent countless days fishing and hunting with friends and family.

Active in the Coast Guard Auxiliary, member of the Anglers Club, Card Sound Sailing Club, Card Sound Model Yacht Club, Knight of the Square Table and avid croquet player. Boasted often that he was known for having the best hair on The Reef. Reed passes on the torch to Bill Gooch.

A true family man, he and

Joanne loved nothing more than to be surrounded by family and friends. Thanksgiving dinner, Christmas breakfast, weekend crab feasts, church chicken BBQ, and pig roasts were Reed's forte. "The bigger the better" and "if you don't cook, you clean" were a few of his many mottos, and "Here is to us, there is no better" was his favorite toast. The ultimate host, Reed was selfless and genuine, willing to go above and beyond to help his fellow man. Reed wasn't happy until all the guests were happy!

'Cappy', as he is known, was an active and involved grandparent. He and 'Grandjo' cherished their time with their six grandchildren; teaching them how to crab, fish, swim and sail and watching them develop their own love of the water. Time spent with family, holidays and special events brought him joy and happiness.

Reed lived his life to the fullest bringing his family along for the ride; and what a ride it was! Many a tale will be told of the adventures of this 'man of action, man of danger' and he will truly be missed.



Archbishop of Denver to Visit Ocean Reef

On **Sunday, April 3**, Archbishop Sam Aquila of Denver, Colorado, will be visiting Ocean Reef on behalf of **Nancy** and **John Sevo**, and will celebrate Mass at 12 noon in the Cultural Center. We look forward to welcoming him.

Samuel J. Aquila was born on September 24, 1950, in Burbank, California. He was ordained to the priesthood in Denver, Colorado, on June 5, 1976, and

served in parish ministry for 11 years. He served as Director for the Office of Liturgy and Master

of Ceremonies in the Archdiocese of Denver from 1990 until 1995. He served the archdiocese as an advisor to the Bishop's Committee on the Liturgy, and was named Secretary for Catholic Education, a position he held from 1995 until 1999.

In 2000, he was named a Prelate of Honor by Pope John Paul II, receiving the honorary title of Monsignor.

In 2002, he became Bishop of Fargo, North Dakota, and from 2005 to 2006 he also acted as Apostolic Administrator for the Diocese of Sioux Falls, South Dakota. In 2012, he was installed as the Archbishop of Denver.

returning to lead the Archdiocese where he had originally served as a priest for 25 years.

Archbishop Aquila continues his ministry, serving on the Bishops' Advisory Council for the Institute for Priestly Formation, the Papal Foundation, and the Board of Trustees for the Augustine Institute. He is a member of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and has served as a member of Conference committees. Archbishop Aquila's episcopal motto comes from the Blessed Virgin Mary's instructions at Cana: "Do whatever he tells you (Jn 2:5)."

Tah-dah - Spring has sprung! As of 11:33 a.m. March 20, Spring has officially arrived, though in Florida luckily, it seems it's here year 'round. So, what makes it "Spring" per se? consummate actress compassionate woman

There is a young girl in me, who refuses to die.

Liv Ullmann, one of the greatest actresses of our time, admits that at 83, she still hears the voice of that young girl. "I don't want to heed it, because I know it has nothing to do with my adult life, but it makes me uncertain."

I have always wanted to write about Liv Ullmann for the Ocean Reef Press, but frankly the "young girl in me" was intimidated about approaching this celebrated actress, who has kept a low profile at Ocean Reef during the 34 years she has had a home here and been a Member of Ocean Reef Club.

Then I heard that Liv Ullmann was to receive an Academy Award for Lifetime Achievement. Surely that was reason for a news story (see page one of this edition).

But I wanted more. I wanted to write about the woman, who is our neighbor at Ocean Reef – not the actress, director, writer, humanitarian and citizen of Norway and the world.

Liv graciously agreed to an interview and we met in the Library at the Cultural Center.

Would I have instantly recognized her? Probably not.

There is nothing "theatrical" about Liv Ullmann. She wears little or no make-up, doesn't believe in cosmetic surgery and dresses simply. When she was looking for a dress to wear for the March 25 Award ceremony in LA, two Ocean Reef friends – Marylou Krause and Barbara Sibley – took her to Zola's, a little shop in Ft. Lauderdale and Liv found exactly what she was looking for.

The Influence of Ingmar Bergman

Of course, like all Liv Ullmann fans, her performances in films such as *Persona*, *Cries and Whispers* and *Autumn Sonata* are etched in my mind. These three and many others were written and directed by Ingmar Bergman, the Swedish film maker of truly inventive genius.

Bergman was a major force in Liv's life. For five years she lived with him on his remote island in Sweden. He is the father of her only child, daughter **Linn Ullmann**. He told her shortly after they met – "You and I will be painfully connected."

Even after Liv and Ingmar separated, they remained friends and colleagues. She directed several films scripted by Bergman (including the award-winning Faithless) and she continued to be cast in his films, some written with her in mind. Liv told me her greatest regret is that "I turned him down on Fanny and Alexander." It is a role that Bergman specifically created for her.

Life in the Theater

Liv pointed out that before Ingmar Bergman launched her film career, she was already an acclaimed actress in Norway's National Theater.

Of all her theatrical performances, the role of Nora in Ibsen's *A Doll's House* is the one with which she identifies the most strongly. She played it on Broadway, in London and several times in Sweden.

Though these productions were staged well before

Women's Lib, Liv remembers that "at the end when Nora leaves her husband and children in order to discover who she is, there was a standing ovation and wild applause." Liv, who always suffered pangs of guilt when she had to leave her daughter because of her work in a play or film, told me that in her own head she rewrote the end of the Ibsen play and assured herself that Nora came back the next day and collected her children.

Acting for Liv Ullmann is something more than playing a part. She believes the famous jazz musician Charlie Parker had it right when he advised a young saxophonist, "Don't play it, let it play you."

"The truth of acting for me," said Liv, "is to open myself in such a way that the character is allowed to appear through me."

Liv believes that all actors are "storytellers" and that the audience shares in the story. She was grateful to Ingmar Bergman for always hovering close to where each scene of his films was being shot. "He was the audience and that worked for me," said Liv.

In the theatre her audiences were always enthusiastic, with one exception.

Every Thursday night at the somewhat star-crossed production of the Broadway musical *I Remember Mama*, a man in the back row stood up and booed, when Liv came onstage for her curtain call. No one knew who the Boo Man was or why he did it. Eventually the

boos stopped when the show's manager hired three people to stand up and shout Bravo!

Liv Ullmann later quipped that "even a paid bravo gives pleasure to a star, recently described as a box of cornflakes." (Her reference was to a single bad newspaper review — unfair and possibly her first in a lifetime).

Liv, who starred in more than 50 films, was an overwhelming success with both movie critics and audiences. Never a "boo" and over 40 awards.

Her own favorite films are *The Emigrants* (1971) and *The New Land* (1972). Set in the 1850's, these two films tell the story of a family, who leave their small failing farm in rural Sweden to find a new life in a strange new country, frontier Minnesota.

Liv told me that what appealed to her was a love story where the man and woman "fell in love and spent their life together." She added a bit wistfully that she would have wished that in her own life, which included: an early marriage that ended in divorce, a five-year liaison with Ingmar Bergman, a beautiful but ultimately impossible love affair with a man that she has chosen not to identify by name.

Then in 1985 Liv married **Donald Saunders**, a Boston real estate developer. Donald and Liv divorced in 1995, and almost immediately reconciled. They have lived together at Ocean Reef (in the early days with both their mothers as constant visitors) for 34 years.

A Compassionate Woman

def. of compassion — "having a marked sympathy and consideration for others."

I believe that Liv Ullmann is gifted (or cursed) with an unusually compassionate nature. Possibly it is genetic ¬— her grandfather, convicted of aiding Norwegian Jews, died in a German concentration camp.

Certainly, the empathy Liv felt for every character she played in the theater and films, gave her that special edge of sensitivity that accounted for her exceptional performances.

So it is not surprising that in her middle years she began to question whether it was enough. "I do not want to arrive at the end of life and then be asked what I made of it and have to answer – I acted."


Liv's life changed when in 1981, UNICEF – the United Nations Children's Emergency Fund – asked her to be their ambassador of goodwill. It would be Liv's task to travel to underdeveloped countries and observe UNICEF-assisted projects for child welfare and to contact deprived families and learn about their living conditions.

For Liv Ullmann, it was an experience both heart wrenching and spiritually rewarding. In her book *Choices* she recounts meeting with starving and maimed children. Children without hope. It is not the actress, who embraces a young girl, whose flesh has been eaten away by leprosy, it is the compassionate woman.

In her travels for UNICEF, as well as her work with the International Rescue Committee, Liv encounters thousands of children, whose lives hold so much tragedy that there is no room for choice – "I believe," said Liv, "that choice is the essence of what it is to be human."

Quiet Time at Ocean Reef

Liv and Donald Saunders, accompanied by each of their respective mothers, came to Ocean Reef on a Florida trip in

1988. "For Donald it was love at first sight and a day or two later, he bought our house. It's the one we are still living in."

Over the years Liv and Donald have had lots of visitors. Liv's friends from Norway and Donald's friends from Boston all appreciated the pleasures of Ocean Reef and the Florida weather. "My daughter Linn and my sister's five children always looked forward to spending school vacations here."


Liv has friends at The Reef, who are into things she doesn't do — "sports like golf and tennis. But I like hearing about their activities."

Liv attends the cultural events and lectures (She is a generous patron of the Cultural Center) but admits she spends much of her time here reading scripts and writing notes for another book. (She's a wonderful writer and does not use the computer and rarely a typewriter – she writes the old-fashioned way in longhand.)



Jazzing Up The Burgee Bar

My friend Jody Steele is my sister-in-arms when it comes to reporting new foodie developments. Jody tipped me off to our new Chef de Cuisine at the Burgee Bar and how good that cuisine had become. This is the kind of news I find hard to resist, so I stepped into my phone booth, and came out... *qastronomy man*.

I met our new rising star, Jazz King, while the Burgee Bar was being cleaned for nightly dinner service. As we ducked the mops and brooms, she told me about her journey. Her mother had been a cook in the US Army for 21 years. "So cooking was in my

blood," Jazz said. Her mother said, "I always knew Jazz would be a chef. As a kid she invented experimental dishes in her EZ Bake oven and cut up my house plants for salad." Jazz was part of her High School team that did cooking competitions (and went to the state finals). She won the "bake-off" two years in a row, famously creating a "Lightning McQueen" cake honoring Cars.


Jazz attended Mississippi University For Women where she earned a joint BA and Culinary degree. Then (like many of our interns) she began seasonal work in resorts and clubs as a line cook. At Sankaty Head Club in Nantucket, she worked for Chef Damian Gilchrist, who filled her with stories about how wonderful Ocean Reef was. He helped her grow into Lead Line Cook, doing banquets and weddings. In time, Damian recommended Jazz to the Executive Chef at Card Sound. She spent two years as Pastry Chef and Garde Manger (cold items, salads, tureens, tartars) while she revamped the entire dessert menu.

One year ago this week, Jazz became the Sous Chef (second in command) at the Burgee Bar, until recently, when she gained the coveted title Chef de Cuisine. If she sounds like a shooting star, you got it right. Club Executive Chef Jared Reardon said, "The Burgee Bar has gone from an occasional dinner spot to a frequented favorite. Jazz is creating real Regional American Food from scratch, including desserts." Jazz credits "listening to Members. Burgee Bar customers have their favorites - don't mess with success, but they were also asking for healthy eating. We added more salads, and expanded the choices of salad toppings." Next week Jazz is introducing new menu items.

She calls it "American Regional meets Southern Fusion."

"We all come from different places," she said, "I want to have a little bit for everyone. We invite you to come for a nice meal, not just (the best) burger and fries." Some of the new items are: North Eastern Seafood Chowder (Clams, Scallops, Fresh Catch, Corn, Potatoes, Carrots); San Francisco Oriental Crunch Salad (Artisan Lettuce, Almonds, Shaved Cabbage, Carrots, Edamame, Florida Oranges, Red Bell Peppers, Wonton Strips, Sesame Vinaigrette); Wet Wings with Honey Chipotle Sauce/ Dry Wings with Spicy BBQ Rub; Cornmeal Crusted Fried Grouper Po' Boy sandwich; Texas Brisket Grilled Cheese (House-Smoked, Pepper Jack, Pickled Red Onion; Chipotle Aioli, Texas Toast); Roast Chicken with Red Eye Gravy; Smothered Pork Chop (Rich Caper-Lemon Sauce, Summer Garden Vegetables, Creamy Grits). Jazz insists, "Southern Fusion does not have to be high in salt or fat. It just takes the proper spice choices and lighter cooking. Come find out."

I probably have you eager to try it already, so I won't even mention desserts (but she was a Pastry Chef after all...).

ForgetMeNots **Hear Directly** from Member **Founders** on Cure Alzheimer's **Fund**

Members of the Ocean Reef ForgetMeNots, a caregiver support group, were very grateful to hear the excellent presentation by Member **Jeffrey Morby** at its monthly meeting on March 15th. Jeffrey, Co-founder and Chairman of the CureAlzheimer's Fund, prepared a detailed report on the history of the foundation and the progress being made

in a multitude of research projects around the world. **Jacqueline Morby**, his wife and partner in many important not-for-profit efforts, was also on hand to add her perspectives on their dedication to the CureAlzheimer's Fund, since its founding in 2004. Since then, over \$143,000,000 has been raised to support well defined research in carefully chosen

areas, for example, genes and DNA. Genetic insights drive the research strategy with careful vetting of research proposals prior to approval.

It is possible that the CureAlzheimer's Fund leadership will speak to the community as a whole during the next season of medical lectures. There is much hope for the future treatment of this condition, which currently effects 6 million people diagnosed in the United States and 50 million worldwide. Estimates are that another 10 to 15 million are not diagnosed. Other statistics to keep in mind: there are more than 18 million unpaid caregivers; 67% are women and 20% of Medicare dollars are spent on Alzheimer's.

Following Jeffery's address, many questions were raised and a lively discussion followed. Caregivers, both spousal and professional, spoke about being on the front lines in dealing with the challenges of Alzheimer's. The conversation continued during lunch and everyone felt very blessed to have been present.

Recycling at Ocean Reef Part II

Last week, we highlighted the importance of recycling by increasing the value of waste from Ocean Reef as raw materials for new goods to avoid the damaging, expensive option of letting our sluggish, increasingly compromised environment do it for us through historical processes of burial, incineration, landfill, atmospheric and aquatic dilution in rivers, oceans or subsurface well injection. This week, we review what items should and should not be recycled.

Ocean Reef Club operates a Solid Waste Department under the direction of Israel Salgado

that exceptionally well serves Ocean Reef residents and other Club sources in the removal of solid waste. This service is provided three times per week for trash (garbage) and recycle pick-up of once per week for subsequent transportation to the Monroe County recycling station, located eight miles south of Ocean Reef, for further classification, processing and transportation. These are the

second steps in the noble process of converting waste into raw materials. Ocean Reef waste and recycle pick-up service does not require the common inconvenience practiced in other communities of placing and replacing containers at the curb with unintended spillage or scattering from animals or fast golf carts in the walking lanes. Pick-up is usually at your garage area.

The first step that sends Ocean Reef recyclable waste to the appropriate final user occurs within each private Ocean Reef household, restaurant and business – the readers of this article who make the decision, "Is this waste in my hands recyclable, garbage or something different?" The classification can change as wastes finds new uses.

As your sensitivity to recycle is increased and should your existing bins become full and messy, consider purchasing for your weekly trash and recycle contributions, the well-made 64-gallon bins that are available through the Solid Waste Department for only \$40.00. These will make your garage tidier. Call 305-367-5992 to purchase.

The combination of such an active, informed public and an excellent pick-up service would be the delight of many communities. Comments from Members directed to Israel Salgado are especially welcome.

So, What Can We Recycle?

At the present time, the Solid Waste Department collects the following waste categories:

The following are recyclable:

- Cardboard (please break down boxes and fold flat to save space)
- Newspaper
- Letters and envelopes
- \bullet Cans (rinsed of food) label left on is OK
- Plastic containers (rinsed of food)
- Glass (rinsed of food)
- Aluminum waste and cans

The following may be recyclable, first call 305-367-5992 for pick-up:

- All paints
- All liquids
- All oils
- E-waste (electronic equipment) Also watch for special days for community-wide pick-up locations.

The following are NOT recyclable:

- Garbage (food waste, diapers, diaper waste). Must be bagged for pick-up
- Shoes
- Clothing
- Chemicals
- Wastes generated by contractors and landscapers should be removed as generated by each.
- The time lost returning to households by the Associates of the Solid Waste Department who must recollect the weekly recycle donations that were not set out in time for the initial collection attempt. Consider determining when your Associate will likely be in your area to timely set out your trash or recycling.

Wrestling with Dinosaurs

Mid-February myself and longtime fishing buddy Gary Narramore headed back for another trip to Upper Essequibo region of Guyana. Our primary target was the 23 million year old, and the largest freshwater fish in the world, the Arapaima.

Traveling in Guyana isn't easy. For example, our flight from Miami arrived at 1 a.m., our charter flight was to leave at 8 a.m. the next morning, and at 7 a.m. we received a call saying the flight was being delayed until 9 a.m. At 8, as we were getting ready to head to the airport, we received a call saying the flight had been cancelled and no other aircraft were available. Our only option was to take a 9 hr. van ride through the jungle, then a 3 hr. boat ride to Apoteri, home to our hosts, of roughly 450 Amerindians...

After 9 grueling hours of heavily potholed dirt roads, our 17 ft aluminum boat with a 25-horse motor was waiting for our journey to Apoteri. It was beginning to get dark as we departed, but the Capt. assured us we could travel at night. Faye, our Indian host, was also taking her 7-monthold daughter, so caution was maintained. After traveling for 1 1/2 hours, an unexpected cloud cover came in and we were forced to stop at a small camp with wooden buildings for the rest of the night...at 5:30 the next morning, just as it was getting light, we were off again.

Another 1 1/2 hours and we arrived at Apoteri...After some greetings from the local chief, whom I had fished with before, we changed engines on our boat, to a smaller 15 HP, to conserve fuel for the following week. 2 1/2 hours more up river, we arrived at our destination camp, home for the next week. A large conservation effort had been in place since my

last visit in 2016, as well as the Amerindians' almost mystical beliefs in the arapaima - the small lagoons we fished had an obvious increase in the number of this species. In our week of fishing we probably saw close to 350 arapaima, which was over double of our previous trips.

We also started with very solid peacock bass fishing but dwindled as the river rose over 4 ft. with some unexpected late season rains. As always there were many piranha, some bicuda, payara (the vampire fish), and fortunately we found 2 groups of Arawana...a rare snake like fish. I had only caught 2 ever before this encounter.

We landed 10 arapaima in our week and hooked over 40 on artificial lures. It's the custom to wear the fish out in the deeper waters, then pull them to shore and after you get in the water, raise them slightly for pictures. As much as you can raise a 300 lb. fish.

The week passed quickly and it was time to head out at 5:30 a.m. to Apoteri for a 9 a.m. charter flight...although we received and email enroute saying the weather wasn't sufficient in Apoteri and we needed to move another 3 1/2 hours downstream to an alternate airstrip. It was supposed to leave at 1:15, and finally arrived at 3:30.


Such is travel in one of the last true frontiers of sport fishing. But if you want the opportunity to wrestle with a dinosaur, you may have to endure an few inconveniences.

Rotate Those Shoulders

"Tennis Tip" by Rob Last, Assistant Tennis Professional

As soon as you decide what side of your body the ball is coming, turn your shoulders. This helps get your racket ready early so you won't be rushed on your shots. Without even moving your arm, your racket is getting set.

A quick shoulder turn allows you to adjust on all the shots you can get - high, low, hard, wide, even a bad bounce.

You know you are setting up well when your opponent hits the net with their shot and you have already turned your shoulders.

Even on an easy shot, set up early with as quick a rotation as you can, as you can't set up too early. Doing this consistently helps it become a very good habit.

Keep moving, hit a ton of balls, and have a great time while playing the great game of tennis.





BRIDGE TIP

Bidding With Interference

Bidding would be a lot easier if the opponents did not interfere, but we know this is not the case. Here are some guidelines when the opponents get in our way:

After a Suit Overcall **Suit Responses**

If your partner opens and the next opponent overcalls in a suit, then 2/1 Game Forcing (including 1NT Forcing) are off. We now revert to Standard Bidding:

- New suit at the 1-level promises 4 pieces (6+ points).
- New suit at the 2-level promises 5 pieces (10 + points).
- 1NT would show a balanced hand with 6-10 HCPs (with stoppers in the opponent's suit).

- Raise in partner's suit would show 3 card support and 7-10 points.
- Double raise in partner's suit would show 4 card support and 6-9 points.
- Triple raise in partner's suit would show 5 card support and 6-9 points.
- Cue Bid would show a Limit Raise (11-12) or better.




