### ORCF Announces New Record for Off-Reef Grants

The Ocean Reef Community Foundation's annual grants program will provide more than \$1.74 million to nonprofit organizations serving neighboring areas this year thanks to the Ocean Reef community's generous participation in the 2022 All Charities effort.

ORCF's Community Grants Program funds dozens of worthy charities in the interest areas of Education, Youth, Health & Family Services and Community in the Upper Keys, Homestead and Florida City each spring. Including 2022 grants, this particular Foundation program will have donated \$14.3 million to improve the quality of life in the communities where Ocean Reef employee families live since the All Charities collaboration began in 2008.

Grants Committee Chair Janie Sims notes that, "In addition to a new record for funding going off The Reef, our committee vetted a record number of more than 100 applications requesting another record of \$3.5 million. # Passover and Easter

The history of the relationship between Judaism and Christianity is littered with the detritus of centuries of conflict.

The theological legacy of Christian faith has been tainted with strains of anti-Semitism, from the first tragic instance when a follower of Jesus wrongly labeled a Jewish person a "Christ killer."

Like the COVID virus, some strains have been virulent and deadly. Other outbreaks have been more nuanced, and not so easily detected, because the symptoms did not appear as severe.

Historically, as the Christian church expanded numerically and extended geographically into the non-Jewish, Graeco-Roman world of the first century, it gradually lost touch with the family that nourished it in its infancy.

As the success of the church increased, and its influence broadened, a separate identity gradually emerged. There were moments of extremis during the time of Nero, when through political advantage and for self-survival, the synagogue denied any relationship with the fledgling faith community associated with Jesus.

To borrow the language of family systems theory, this younger child in the family emotionally and spiritually 'cutof" from its family of origin. At times, there was overt hostility between the two. Gradually, the relationship settled into something of a standoff. And in time, the only communication became toxic.

One way of thinking about it is that, in our worst moments, we have related to one another, Jews and Christians, like scornful children in a dysfunctional family -

Abraham's family.

As some of us can attest, painful crises within a family can sometimes become an 'aha' moment of recognizing relational brokenness. The alienation that has developed is necessarily acknowledged. Then, a moment of crisis can become an opportunity to take first steps toward healing and hopefully, some expression of reconciliation.

That moment of recognition for many people of Christian faith occurred when the depths of the horror perpetrated on the Jewish people by the Third Reich's 'final solution' became public.

The realization that we each confessed faith in one and the same God, whose children were being gassed and burned, simply because of their family of origin, shook Christians to the core.

Something began to change. In the shadow of Auschwitz, Christian leaders slowly began to step out into the light and acknowledge complicity at worst, or complacency at best. There were small bright lights, a few righteous Gentiles. But their light shone only against the darkness.

The individual alienated members of the family slowly expressed a desire to re-connect with other family members, in small ways at first. People had to be free to share their hurt, their grief, their pain. Some were understandably reluctant to respond at all.

But members of the family from both sides have persisted. We have come to accept that our faith systems, that have emerged from our story, can't be completely homogenized.

Yet we have come to recognize our relatedness. Christians realize we would have no faith at all if it were not for our family of origin – the Jewish people. As Christian writer Edith Schaffer titled one of her books, Christianity is Jewish.

That's why you see both the Star of David and the Christian cross atop the new chapel. For Christians, one without the other fails to tell the whole story.

Next weekend, each of our communities will celebrate the defining events that gave birth to our faith.

On Friday evening, the members of Congregation Ocean Reef will celebrate Passover. Passover recalls the act of God in history through which the Israelites were redeemed from their bondage of slavery in Egypt. God set them free through the Exodus to become the people through whom the one, true God would reveal himself, and his salvation, to the world.

Christians call that same Friday, Good Friday. It recalls the act of God in history when the redemption of all creation and all nations was accomplished through the death of Jesus on the cross. Christians call him the Messiah.

And then on Sunday, our Christian congregations will celebrate Easter. Sunday gave birth to the indomitable hope of His resurrection, and the unquenchable message of His love for the world.

We both, Jews and Christians, await the only source of ultimate hope for our world the day when the Messianic reign of God will bring about a new order – one that will embody the highest and best longings of every human heart.

Until that day, we're both waiting and hoping, grateful to recognize that we are part of the same family.

#### **R.F. Orchids**





After hours at the beach, golf course, tennis court, or on a boat, there is still lots of time left in the day to have some indoor family fun. Plus, it is wise to get out of the afternoon sun and have some "cool time". On those days, we often head to the kitchen with eager grandchildren in tow all ready to concoct some cuisine together. Always looking for inspiration, I recently asked Chef Philippe Reynaud, Senior Director of Culinary Operations, for advice. Of course, being an amazing chef and a father who spends time cooking with his two young daughters, he had great ideas to share.

#### **Planning Ahead**

grandparents need to consider the age of the children, along with their food preferences. A discussion beforehand with some age appropriate choices is most likely the best way to begin any home cooking adventure. This gives you a shopping list of ingredients to assemble as preparation is the key to success.

#### **Quick and Easy**

Chef Philippe and family are usually on the go, but enjoy making some healthy treats together. The girls like fruit so smoothies are great fun and easily made in a blender or "mini-bullet". Again, fruit

such as apples, strawberries, pineapple, bananas and more are cut up and ready for the kids to select for their own creation. Similar ingredients go in to a milk shake and are also a good afternoon snack.

Of course, you might guess that Chef Philippe makes his own crepes, but fresh and frozen crepes can be bought at the market. Perfect for a main course or dessert, he suggests they can be filled with fruit and yummy sauces, ham and cheese, or prepared chicken and vegetables. The fun for younger children is filling the crepe and then learning how to fold it. Assembling quesadillas are another favorite and after folded can be simply heated on the stove by the adults.

Cookies and cupcakes are a staple afternoon cooking event in our kitchen and Chef again recommends some of the easy to use frosting tubes. The excitement comes together with the frosting and sprinkles along with the mess, but even toddlers get into making and eating their own treat. We usually take a few hysterical pictures.

#### More of a Challenge

So for the older set, more complicated recipes can be on the menu and again the selection can be a family decision. Hopefully, the aspiring chefs can assist in the preparation of the family dinner on those rainy afternoons. Chef Philippe suggests making pizza dough together (or even buying prepared) with everyone creating their own pizza—with lots of toppings available. Meatballs are another hit and one of Chef's favorites. Squishing the ingredients with your hands is a memorable part of the process and those meatballs can go into a homeprepared or a jar of spaghetti sauce.

Chef Philippe has led many cooking classes at Ocean Reef over the holidays and at our Summer Camps. He creates daily themes for the students and is impressed how advanced these younger chefs have become over the years. He recommends getting children involved in the kitchen with supervision at a young age and then nurturing them to more challenging recipes as they develop the necessary skills. Maybe you will be helping to create a future chef along with some special family memories.

Derek Jones is an up and coming superstar in the Recreation Department. Fearless in taking on the Safe Boating Day for our Coast Guard Auxiliary, I personally have worked with him for a few years, and he is a "take charge guy" with a "can do attitude." #### When did you start Safe Boating Day (SBD) for the Coast Guard Auxiliary?

"My first initial 'hello' to SBD was when I was working with Hayley Upton in 2018. She showed me the ropes and the next year, 2019, I was on my own! We shut down the event for a couple years with COVID, but now we are back, bigger and better than ever."

### How did you get to Ocean Reef?

If the boss can do it, there is no reason why you can't do it. I think that is something unique to our team."

### What has kept you at Ocean Reef this long?

"Well, I did not get fired! Just kidding. I stayed because of the room for advancement and working with such an energized team was something that captivated me. Obviously, Ocean Reef is unlike anywhere I have ever been. The Club is magical and also it beats the winters up north. It would be really hard to not stay."

#### **How about Summer Camps?**

### What have you learned from your job here at The Reef?

"People aren't necessarily going to remember your name, but they will remember how you made them feel so you have to make the most of every encounter as well as know how to flip any situation into a positive.

I am so grateful to be working in a place that encourages you to spread your wings and fly. I have helped put on some amazing events and the sky is the limit!"



### A Peeping Tom? Guess again!

Clinging to the window of Sarina Kinney's home was this little frog. What is it and why is it looking in the window? It's a special kind of frog called a tree frog. Why? Because of the suction-cuplike toes that enable him to climb shrubs, trees, windows – even buildings. He's not naughty, just looking for dinner. Lights at night from landscaping and windows attract his diet of insects. Other than climbing, tree frogs have another unique trait: in Gene-Kelly-style they love to sing in the rain.



You've probably heard them sounding like squeaking doors. But why in the rain? Monsieur Tree frog sings then to attract a mate, and once mated, Madame tree frog will lay up to 50 fertile eggs in the rain's newly created puddles and pools. Yes, eggs go through the tadpole stage and then mature, hopping and climbing, as tree frogs for up to four years hoping not to be eaten by a racoon, a skunk or snake. Tree frogs are the cutest creatures with bug eyes, a perpetual smile and miniature size of one inch or more. But this (pictured) tree frog, however cute, is a "bad-y". It's a Cuban tree frog, growing to five inches, the largest of its type in North America. It is invasive, having been introduced by accident in 1925 from the Caribbean. With voracious appetites they eat native tree frogs, bugs, even dog and cat foods left outside. If you see several large tree frogs around your home, best to call an exterminator. Picking them up? No, I wouldn't. The toxic "slime" they exude as protection, though not poisonous, can cause a rash. For all their cuteness, they are solitary creatures. Yes, best leave them that way!
