# 30 <sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting Report

As Carysfort Ballroom filled last week, there was a distinct buzz in the air for the 30th Annual Meeting. In part because it was truly a return to "normal" with more than 200 in attendance, no limits on the number of attendees, no masks or social distancing required.

Chairman **Ray Larkin** opened with the agenda, reminding Members that the Annual Meeting is two part, there are the formal requirements as well as the informal which includes a review of the past year, both the highlights and the challenges.

#### **Formal Business**

In official business, Chairman Ray Larkin announced the election of new director, **Sarah Cart** onto the Ocean Reef Club Board of Directors, along with the reelection of Michael Heaney and **Joe Urbinati**. Retiring director **Terry Ferrarone** was recognized for three years of service, most notably as a very active Chair of the Social Committee.

#### State of the Club

Mr. Larkin then moved to the informal portion of the meeting and his State of the Club address. He began with the 2020 total Club shut down due, reminding Members that within days Ocean Reef was able to provide services and activities that provided normalcy under the craziest of circumstances. The picture Larkin painted was that this kind of response from Management only happens in a Club environment.

Mr. Larkin next went on to lay out what he hopes will be the four key takeaways from the Meeting:

-We are members of the finest Club, created by the Members, created by our kids, created by the Associates.

- The Club is in really good financial condition which has permitted us to build beautiful new facilities that we are all benefitting from and enjoying.

- The significant growth in Equity and Legacy memberships has created a burden on the entire Membership in all Club amenities.

-As we go through the information today, please know that "we understand it, we get it, we are working on it!"

Mr. Larkin reiterated this point by reminding Members that the increase and the busyness is the Equity and Legacy membership, "it is us." Adding, "But that's what a Club is about, that's the way it should be. It should be about our family. In turn, that creates interesting things for your Board to address. We are going to be careful and thoughtful in everything we do. Everything is on the table."

#### Membership

Vice Chairman Charlie **Johnston**, who serves as Chairman of the Membership Committee, walked Members through a series of slides demonstrating the number of Members and Members in Waiting and each category's impact on Club usage. As had been previously mentioned by Mr. Larkin, the data shows that Equity and Legacy categories are up as is Club usage for these Member types. In contrast, Social memberships have decreased over the past seven years and usage is also down from both 2015 and 2019. Also of note, Members in Waiting, while continuing to grow in number are not utilizing the Club in any impactful numbers and Conference Groups have also been decreasing in a deliberate effort to ensure lodging and amenities are available for Members first.

Johnston closed with an assurance, "We clearly have our challenges ahead of us, but our continued focus on Equity Member satisfaction will remain our number one focus. You have a very committed Board who is on it and will be working over the summer to improve and enhance your Equity experience."

#### **Finance**

Board Director and Chair

of the Finance Committee, Michael Heaney, opened by stating that it is the incredible support by the Ocean Reef membership that has led to the strong 2021 financial results, which are continuing into 2022, reminding Members of the incredible headwinds faced in the past year. Heaney highlighted that, "while the Club's cash position is quite strong today, with zero debt, the circumstances leading to this, (a record number of real estate sales and the subsequent membership sales), are extraordinary and unlikely to be repeated." Therefore, he pointed out that through the strategic review of the Club's master plan, a number of infrastructure improvements are being considered and will be necessary, stating, "given the uncertainties in the current environment, we believe prudent cash management suggests maintaining the historical cash levels of \$20 -40million."

The financial data presented at the Meeting shows that the Club is in a strong financial position from both an operating and balance sheet perspective. The past year's financial report will be available at the end of the month in both digital and printed form.

#### **Season Overview**

Club President Alex Tonarelli opened with a thank you to the Board for always being available as the Club navigated through all the uncertainties of the past year and a thank you to the Membership for their patience through the construction and pandemic. Mr. Tonarelli took a quick look back at the priorities for this past season which included:

-Complete all Club construction projects and get all of the venues opened up in the right way, as soon as possible so you could have them to enjoy this season.

-Restore all of our important Club traditions and events, that we couldn't do the past couple of years due to Covid -Operate the Club as safely as possible through Covid while keeping all of our Member events and amenities open.

Mr. Tonarelli highlighted that, "despite Covid, labor shortages and construction delays, we did not shut down any venue this season while still opening up two new buildings, two bars / lounges, three new restaurants and a new golf shop. Our management team and Associates are proud of this fact."

He then moved on to a topic that is top of mind for everyone in the room, "Dining". He noted that strategic plans and adjustments developed last summer for this season, were geared to accommodate the anticipated demand and volume – but the ideas and plans were not enough. Mr. Tonarelli shared the various data points that the Board and Management are looking at and will continue to look at to reprioritize the Equity experience.

Also highlighted through several data points was the unexpected trend in the high volume of canceled reservations. Tonarelli said, "we need to look at this, recognizing changes are needed to the reservation process - not only dining but all Club amenities that require reservations and appointments."

He closed with a the message that had been consistent throughout the presentation — there is a commitment to Equity member value and satisfaction, and a promise that Members will hear much more about it over the next few months.

Chairman Larkin next closed the meeting officially and opened up the floor for questions. An important series of questions and comments came about, ranging from Member satisfaction, the capital assessment, the cash balance and a few others. All have been recorded and are available on the website.

Eight years ago, the Spirit of Ocean Reef award was introduced, and with it, "a tradition that would remain tradition forever." ORC Chairman Ray Larkin, said at the Annual Meeting, "Year after year, recipients are selected because they've gone above and beyond in their contribution to our Club and community. These annual recipients have each made very special and out of the ordinary contributions that the Club will remember forever. This year's award especially is going to get me a little choked up."

Past winners have implemented new programs to The Reef, been extraordinarily dedicated to community organizations, enriched the lives of Members through writing and the arts, and altruistically supported

foundations in the surrounding Keys community – but the 2022 winners are especially unique in terms of their service to the Club. Their contributions are seen and felt Club-wide on a daily basis, but this year's honorees took that service to new heights on Sunday, March 6 when a boat carrying 356 Haitian migrants (the second Ocean Reef landing of the year) ran aground just off Buccaneer Island.

"On this day, hundreds of Haitians, tired, worn out, were


trying to get from that boat to a place where they hoped they might live. And when I say live, I mean survive the day," said Larkin as he presented the award. "They were struggling against brutal winds and current, with some so weak they could hardly make it across the channel. I witnessed this group of Club Associates heroically and selflessly dive in to help these migrants get through what could have been a life-challenging and life-costing event. That action, without motivation and without direction. epitomizes the spirit of Ocean Reef."

The following Ocean Reef Club Associates were presented with the 2022 Spirit of Ocean Reef award for their actions that day - Beach Bar's Sarai Bolanos, Rosy Gordon, Peterson McClisse, Bemelyn Pucholos, JC Rios, Cynthia Zamudio, and Recreation's Sam Bauer, Alexis Burton, Doug LaFond, Brandon Lanier, Molly Lechelt, Tori Mann. On their plaque, it reads, "This award is presented to the Ocean Reef Associates that acted

selflessly without hesitation to assist the Haitian migrants coming ashore on Buccaneer Island. Your efforts to assist these individuals in dire circumstance went far beyond your call of service to Ocean Reef Club. We would like to recognize and thank you for your overwhelming spirit and strength in that time of need. You are inspiration to us all."

In recognizing those Associates who truly went the extra mile, we'd be remiss not to also acknowledge the dozens of other Associates who assisted that day in various additional ways. The Club Associates on-scene responded immediately to the situation, which saw 158 migrants flee to shore while 198 others were transported to land via US Coast Guard. There on The Point, Associates were at the ready to render assistance of all kinds, from pulling people out of the water, to offering warm beach towels, food and even translating.

All Associates who assisted that day on Buccaneer Island were recognized with a special breakfast this week, where Club President Alex Tonarelli said, "I look around at the faces in this room and I am proud at the way our Club and all of you handled such an event. The selflessness showed that day is inspiring. Thank you to all of you who had a hand in assisting by all means necessary. You showed bravery, a willingness to act while in the face of turmoil, and an ability to respond in an urgent situation. For that, you all deserve recognition."

# Easter Sunrise Service – Special Guest Appearance!

On Sunday nights, back in the day, many of us can recall watching a popular television show on CBS, "What's My Line?" It ran for seventeen seasons. At our house, color television sets came late, so we watched in something called "black and white!"

The format of the show was quite simple. A mystery guest would be invited to sign in, writing their signature as they came on stage. Only the audience would know the identity of the guest.

The panel members were tasked with asking questions

while blindfolded. John Charles Daly moderated the questions as the panelists attempted to determine the line of work, and then the identity of that night's mystery guests.

Each guest could only answer with "Yes" or "No" in response. Sometimes, the panel members were successful. Other times, they were stumped, and surprised when they removed the blind folds.

This year, our guest speaker, Tom Tewell, will be there in living color to introduce a special guest at the Easter Sunrise Service. And weather permitting, he'll arrive by boat.

Tom, as many of us know, is one of the most creative and engaging guest speakers we are privileged to host each season in the Chapel.

The life of the person Tom will be presenting is someone who might well be a 'mystery guest' to many of us. His story is important, because the resurrection changed the course of this man's life.

This mystery guest, in the minds of historians, is one of the most influential persons in

Western history. It has been said of him, western civilization cannot be understood apart from him.

Easter is, as you know, the celebration of the resurrection event. The author, Thomas Cahill, considers it one of the 'hinge-points' of human history.

Easter recalls the astounding historical event when Jesus of Nazareth, who, after being subjected to brutal scourging, chose to give up his life, suffering crucifixion on a cruel Roman cross.

The eyewitness accounts say he was laid in a borrowed tomb, sealed and guarded by soldiers.

A group of women had seen him buried late on Friday. They returned to his tomb on Sunday to complete the burial preparations. When they did, to their shock and initial dismay, they found the tomb empty, and the body missing. Then they encountered Jesus, now risen and very much alive.

Tom's mystery guest was one of the most unlikely persons ever to believe in either the claims of the person of Jesus, or the claims for his resurrection.

In fact, this man did everything he could do to stamp out the very notion of those claims, and the people who believed them and spread them.

Yet in a dramatic encounter with the risen Christ, this man experienced a complete change in his own life.

Who is this mystery guest Tom will present? He is known as Saul of Tarsus, or more commonly, the Apostle Paul. His is a weighty story – one that is teeming with significance, important for us to understand and consider.

No one can relate the story and its significance better than Tom Tewell.

The Easter Sunrise Service begins at 6:45 AM on the beach at Buccaneer Island. (In case of rain, it will be held in Town Hall at the same time.) The beach will be packed. The music will be inspiring. And what Tom has to say, could be life changing.

# Easter Bunny – Origin



Holiday symbols, like that of the Easter Bunny, are ingenious amalgams of ancient beliefs. Let's begin with the word "Easter" – the Saxon pagan goddess of spring and dawn was named Eostre or Eastre. Her name may have referred to East, dawn. (She dates back to - well, waaay back). So, we have a derivation of the word "Easter". What about "Bunny"? In ancient times it was believed widely the hare (rabbit) could reproduce without loss of virginity. This belief later led to the hare's association with the Virgin Mary as seen in medieval paintings. To

early German Protestants, the Easter Hare played the role of judge, much like Santa Claus, rewarding good little children with eggs and candy or gifts at Easter. OK, what about the colored eggs? Eggs have been a symbol of rebirth and fertility since recorded history. In some countries like the Ukraine, egg decorating became an art form. In medieval Europe eggs were forbidden to be eaten during Lent (the 40 days prior to Easter). Understandably at Easter, eggs would be decorated and given as gifts. And who better to bring the eggs, than the Easter Hare? But, isn't it a rabbit? Not quite. A hare is usually larger than a rabbit and builds her nest above ground in a small depression (as opposed to a rabbit's below-ground burrow). Hence, a straw nest with Easter eggs! We won't quibble... "Easter Bunny" works for me.




# AR You Ready for Easter?

It's happening. The perfect storm of spring break, Easter, and the chaos we know and love as "visiting family." That's when Ocean Reef shines. Click on the "View in 3D" button and the screen will pop open with a realistic animal (or object) that you can pet by tapping, pinching, and zooming, turn the image 360 degrees and shrink or enlarge with the tips of

your fingers.

Place the virtual animals or objects anywhere with the magic of augmented reality (AR). Click on the button that reads "View in Your Space" to have it come alive and moving in the palm of your hand, your pool, your car, boat, or plane. A Panda at Reef Treats? A dinosaur emerging from the lagoon? Or a Unicorn at the Easter Egg Hunt? Move, rotate, and resize the animals with the white rectangle at the base. 






















# There are Manatees in My Canal – Am I Lucky or Sad?

My very recent photographs have brought me both joy and sadness.

In my 44 years at Ocean Reef, I have lived on three separate canal-side locations with the same interconnected tidal waters that move in and out through the "Owners Channel" to and from the Hawk Channel. It was not unusual to have manatees swim slowly past my home. When they did, it was common to pause for a long



moment to watch these "lovely", gentle mammals and consider giving them a drink of water until I found this practice was discouraged.

As a cruising sailor, I knew well that the Florida section of the Intercoastal Waterway had "Manatee Slow Speed Zones" that were very successful in reducing manatee deaths due to boat propeller strikes. These unpopular zones with boaters either gave manatees time to get out of the way (they cannot

turn their heads) or gave boaters time to avoid the animals. In the early 1990s there were only 1200 manatees in Florida, but by 2018 the population had grown to 6500. Still today, only 25% of the Florida manatees are estimated to be without propeller scars. With "No Wake" vessel operation in Ocean Reef canals, Ocean Reef canal-siders could have expected more manatees, but sightings actually became less common. Presently, manatees in

South Florida are starving from red tides pollution affecting the lack of sea bottom grasses and aquatic vegetation – their food.

There is no way to determine how or where the deep propeller wound in the darker skinned manatee (pictured) occurred, but it is true that manatees can recover from greater wounds to layers of fat that would probably kill other animals of similar size who also cannot dial 911.

Ocean Reef boaters in their home canals should remain at slow, no wake speed and if the helmsperson cannot see the waters 10 to 20 feet ahead, post a lookout. Joyfully, you might save the pair I photographed – they are still here and very easy to spot. Maybe they will settle here and raise a family.

If you spot a manatee let Ocean Reef Public Safety know as a variety of agencies are interested in collecting data on manatee health issues.





# How to Decide When to Chip with a High-Loft Wedge

When recreational players are faced with a shot around the green, we tend to rely on a high-loft wedge to execute it, regardless of whether or not that club is the right one for the job.

That's a mistake, says Stefanie Shaw, a teaching professional at the Ocean Reef Club in Key Largo, Fla. and Sebonack Golf Club in Southampton, N.Y.

"You have to take a really big swing to hit a high-lofted club to make it go a very short distance, so there's a lot of room

for error there," Shaw told me at GOLF's recent Top 100 Teacher Summit at Pinehurst. "I like to tell my students: You pitch with a sand wedge and you chip with a pitching wedge. The only time I want to have a high-lofted wedge in my hand is when I need to get over an obstacle in front of me, like a bunker, thick grass, or water."

A high-lofted club is any wedge with a 56-degree loft or more — usually a sand wedge in most players' bags.

So instead of immediately reaching for your sand wedge when you're faced with a chip,

Shaw recommends using a club you can keep low to the ground instead, like a pitching wedge. You can even opt for a midiron or even a hybrid if you're comfortable.

"The lower I can keep a ball to the ground, the more control I have over it," she said.

Next time you have a few extra minutes in the practice area, take a few balls to compare your outcomes with different clubs around the green. Once you get acquainted with the roll-out on your lower-lofted clubs, you'll enjoy the extra control — and the lower scores.







# Bride Tip of the Week

By Gregg Van Dyke, Bridge Director

Bridge players are naturally competitive, so it's not surprising that emotions can run high at the table. They occasionally surface in the form of internalized emotions which are just as distracting. Even if you maintain a calm demeanor on the outside, these feelings can interfere with concentration and cloud your judgment.

Frustration is built into the game of bridge. It's a natural reaction to setbacks, especially those that you believe were out of your control. The feeling itself is harmless unless you allow it to affect your bridge decisions. The temptation to make up for the previous bad board – and make your opponent pay for the "last bad board" – obscured the logical

conclusion that they could have a legitimate bid.

Here's a similar trap that most of us have fallen into:

LHO	Partner	RHO	You
1S	DBL	Pass	2D
2S	3D	Pass	Pass
3S	Pass	Pass	4D
4S	Pass	Pass	?

None vulnerable, what's your call holding ♠J5 ♥4 ♠K87532 ♠Q1073?

Perhaps you're wishing you could take back your 4D bid, but now you're stuck with an unexpected dilemma. There's nothing more demoralizing than pushing your opponents into game and then guessing wrong about whether it's making. Do you panic and bid 5D, even though the vulnerability isn't right for a sacrifice? Or do you choose the vendetta double to punish your opponent for his silly bidding?

Those are both emotional reactions that put you in the

dreaded "last buffoon" position, where you force yourself to make the final, potentially fatal guess in an auction. If you can get past your annoyance with yourself and your opponent, you'll realize that you don't have to be concerned about whether 4S is making. If 4S happens to be the normal contract, passing will get you a near-normal result. If it's a ridiculous contract, you won't have to double to get a good score.

If 4S is abnormal and cold, you have to take your bad score, forgive yourself and regroup for the next board. As obvious as that advice is, it's extremely difficult to follow in the heat of battle.

Good partnerships can recover from bidding disasters. If you can begin to think differently about the psychological elements of the game, you can find yourself bouncing back better from your bad results.


