Masters Tournament

Each year Chef Eric has returned to Augusta National Golf Course, home of the legendary Masters Tournament. For two weeks, he and his team set up and direct "Spring," the members-only pavilion between holes 4 and 5, serving Sushi along with burgers, tacos, and lobster rolls. This year, he had an even more important role in the Champions Dinner, the gold-star event that opens the Masters week. The reigning champion, this year Hideki Matsuyama, hosts a dinner for all of the previous Master's winners. Hideki wanted to expand from Sushi to Nigiri (rice ball topped by fish) and Sashimi (special raw fish preparations). After consulting with Eric, Hideki had his agent secure the best fresh fish available in Japan – Blue Fin Tuna (Ahi, Toro), Japanese Snapper, Japanese Yellowtail, and freshwater eel – and had it flown in from Japan at \$140 a pound. Chef Eric had a serving station *right in the original Club room*. He calls the event "the greatest experience of my life." He still vibrates like a guitar string as he remembers it. "The most exclusive dinner in the world. Three dozen champions, no one else permitted. Even Hideki's interpreter was not allowed, and I had a live station

where I interacted with each champion as they made their selections. I will never forget it." Writing about the event for *Inside Golf*, Alan Bastable quotes Jack Nicklaus as saying, "Probably the best Champions Dinner ever."

To help with prep and service at Spring, Eric brought along some dependable Ocean Reef stars: Michael Meadows, Sous Chef Ocean Room; Estafania Rangel, Sous Chef Pastry; Breanna Bolden, pastry Cook; and the Islander's well-known Chef Kareem.

With Chef Eric's recommendation, Islander Chef de Cuisine Kareem Anguin was selected to run The Founders Room, the members only breakfast, lunch, and dinner Club restaurant. After pre-tournament set-up, Kareem labored from five a.m. to ten p.m. for the next two weeks, but loved it. "There is nothing like it," Kareem said, "Intense focus and hard work

for two weeks, but incredible satisfaction when the team comes together." Kareem had a staff of fifteen, mostly returning staff from previous years chosen by Augusta National. "Quite a challenge," Kareem admits. "Working with different chefs, all new to each other, in an unfamiliar kitchen, with all the guests arriving at the same time and eager to get back to the course, but we did it." In his "spare time," Kareem produced a banquet for the amateur tournament, and another for the women's tournament.

I asked Eric if he and Kareem interacted much during the tournament. "Yeah," Eric said, "I'd poke my head into his kitchen and laugh at the chaos." Eric and Kareem have a great chemistry and bawdy sense of humor. Even as they joshed each other I could hear the affection in their voices.

"What he won't tell you," Eric says of his friend, "Is he managed

his team so effectively that he plated a 100 person dinner in five minutes – an accomplishment beyond impressive. Kareem also set a new record, the best ever Augusta ticket time (average time from order to table)." "Don't print that," Kareem insists, "Chef Jared will expect that every day."

There was not much time to take in the ambience, but they did get to see Tiger Woods tee off, and waved at Jack Nicklaus at the opening ceremonies. But striking images will remain – the beautiful Augusta National Golf Course in the morning mist at five a.m. "Every morning they vacuum the greens," Kareem says incredulously. And the small memories, "Bubba Watson came every day to get a pimento cheese sandwich, then stopped in the kitchen to hand out hats."

So, Augusta National left its mark on our Ocean Reef Team, and Ocean Reef left its mark on Augusta National. Both Kareem and Eric have already been invited back for next year. Eric was rigged for audio and followed by a Netflix camera crew for several days to document "the making of a champions dinner." It might not be too early to start calling him "Celebrity Chef Eric." Alan Bastable finished his *Inside Golf* report rhapsodizing about the stories, the camaraderie, and the elegance of the original Augusta Club room. "Amazing stuff," he concludes, "Almost as good as the Sashimi."

How We Got Here

At one time not so long ago, the thirty-three islands from Elliot Key north to Key Biscayne was called Islandia. Back in the mid-1800's, this area became a haven for shipwreck survivors who encountered the Native American Tequesta tribe who inhabited the area. Bahamians who wanted to farm replaced the Tequestas, but raising crops proved to be near impossible due to the lack of productive soil.

But native Floridians with better techniques found the way there and by the early 1900's, Islandia had more than one hundred residents and its own school district. Islandia has always been part of Miami-Dade County and in 1950 the Dade County Planning Board announced a plan to build a highway connecting Card Sound Road through Ocean Reef to

Key Biscayne. This highway would entail numerous bridges and cross the Safety Valve which is the series of shoals commonly known as the Raggeds. The intent was to create an accessible sub-tropical getaway for the many tourists South Florida was attracting. The photo shows how close it came to happening when a large bulldozer cleared a wide space directly across Elliot Key (now grown over). Another part of this plan was the construction of "Seadade", a major seaport requiring the dredging of a forty-foot channel through Biscayne Bay.

Environmentalists objected saying that the Safety Valve was a valuable strip of shallows that protected the mainland from Hurricane induced sea surges. They called it the 'Spite Highway' and also said it would deface the whole area. A bill was proposed to the U.S. Congress that would create the Biscayne National Monument and kill this project. It became law in 1968 signed by Lyndon Johnson. In 1980, Congress elevated the area to Biscayne National Park. In 2012 with a population of five, Islandia was

officially unincorporated. The proposed highway had a significant effect on Ocean Reef, however. When the highway was proposed, the Club was considering a landing strip for airplanes. The direction of the strip from northeast to southwest was the exact direction of the proposed highway and the landing strip was constructed possibly as an obstruction to the creation of the highway. Luckily, that orientation is also the direction of our prevailing winds making our landing field much safer.

Jim Morton... Ocean Reef's Mr. Tennis

Jim Morton, our Club's legendary Director of Tennis, is retiring.... For 35 years Jim has taught, coached, encouraged Ocean Reef Members (in some cases three generations) to play and enjoy the game.... Jim plans to take summers off, but during the season he will continue teaching at the Tennis & Games Center as an assistant pro.... Jim's retirement celebration is scheduled for April 23 at 6 p.m. on the Sailfish Patio.

Let the Games Begin

Jim Morton played a big part in my move to Ocean Reef....

In the early 90's my husband and I bought a small vacation home in Key Largo. Whenever we visited, I would have to drive miles to play tennis at the closest public court south of Tavernier. Then at a Step Aerobics class in Key Largo an OR Member (taking an off-Reef class back before the Fitness Center was built) invited me to play tennis on Ladies Day at Ocean Reef. Since my (albeit vague and false) impression of Ocean Reef was of an exclusive club where the men all wore neon-green golf pants, I was nervous about how I would be received.

I need not have worried. I was warmly welcomed by Jim (in those days we called him "Jimmy") Morton, who looked more like a 14-year-old boy than a head tennis pro.

I was never a particularly good tennis player, though I did have a fairly formidable lob. But more important – I enjoyed playing tennis on the OR courts. And in 1992 we decided to build a



house in Ocean Reef, where I continued to play tennis regularly and even improved a little under Jim Morton's expert tutelage.

A Perfect Match

How did Jim Morton get to Ocean Reef? In 1986 he just happened to be visiting a friend at OR at the very moment the Racquet Club (a private Ocean Reef tennis club) was looking for a new pro. Jim applied for the job and the 26-year-old club manager Helena Macedo hired him.

Always a charmer, always smiling, always determined to make tennis serious fun, the new young pro became an instant hit with the Racquet Club members. It took their manager Helena a little more time before she accepted Jim first as a smitten suitor and then in 1989 as a devoted husband. who agreed not only to love and obey, but to teach his bride how to play tennis.

Both the marriage and the tennis lessons were a success. The couple recently celebrated their 33rd anniversary and Helena (who subsequently became an OR realtor) was for many years among Ocean Reef's top women players. In off hours Jim also taught his daughter Tamara and son William to play tennis.

A Second Set

In 1992, after the buy-out of the Club by the Members, Jim left the Racquet Club to take over the Ocean Reef courts.

For many years Jim Morton's



office was never spacious. At one point he worked out of a trailer. Jim never complained. He was king with his own courts and his mission was to build a thriving tennis community. To judge how well he succeeded check out the list that follows:

- Encouraged beginners and coached promising high school and college team players
- Planned and promoted tournaments and frequently occupied the referee's chair
- Developed synchronized practice drills where as many as 10 players run in different directions on the same court –
- Aided and abetted the talents and careers of many of his young assistants
- Invented games to make learning tennis fun for children
- Helped establish the summer camps that have given OR a whole new season
- Created social events like the annual Harvest Moon Party
- Reported on tennis every week in an article for the Ocean Reef Press

A Third Set?

Why is the king vacating the throne? In 2015 Jim Morton and the tennis department moved into the beautiful new Tennis & Games Center. At last Jim had a proper office, an attractive and spacious tennis shop and 10 state-of-the-art tennis courts. It's

the Versailles of Tennis Centers. So why is he retiring?

I believe Jim Morton wants to spend less time in the castle and more with his family. He has accomplished what he set out to do. He has made tennis an essential element of life at Ocean Reef. Now he will enjoy teaching and coaching seasonally, the part of the job he has always liked the best.

For Jim the game has never just been about who wins and who loses, but about whether everybody is having fun on the court.

You might say his score has always been "love-love."

A Memorable Date

One recent date stands out in my memory – March 15, 2020. It was a Sunday. That morning marked the beginning of the disruption of our lives in the chapel by something called a ‘novel’ coronavirus – what we have come to know as COVID.

The advent of the virus challenged us with the need to adapt to this rapid, unpredictable, disruptive change.

On that Sunday, in March of 2020, the congregations of the Chapel were preparing to celebrate either Passover or Easter, only four weeks away. Everything changed.

Suddenly, Congregation Ocean Reef had to cancel the Passover Seder. The club leadership reluctantly but

correctly made the decision to cancel the Easter Sunrise Service on Buccaneer Island that year.

Businesses adapted by having people work remotely. Travel and conferences were replaced by Zoom meetings. Many parents of school-aged children were forced to add a new dimension of responsibility to their multi-tasking way-of-life.

But what does a faith community do? How do the members and participants stay connected to each other when they can no longer gather face-to-face?

Much to our surprise, we, like many congregations across the country, were able to adapt by developing ‘online worship services.’ Mega-churches had invested heavily in sophisticated technology. The chapel is no mega-church.

However, we soon discovered the amazing capability of what you can do, using a smart phone and cloud technology. These online services created an important sense of being connected to each other, even though we were unable to gather corporately.

A Connected Community

Thankfully, the limitations brought on by the virus seem to be diminishing. People are returning to their offices. Airplanes are full of business travelers. And the sanctuaries and auditoriums of synagogues and churches are filling up again.

However, the importance of staying connected through technology is an enhancement to our experience of community that will remain a permanent priority. This is especially true of our Ocean Reef Community and the Congregations of the Chapel.

We Mourn the Loss

Tony Medaglia, family man, lawyer, sailor, golfer, philanthropist, patron of the arts, died on Thursday, April 14, 2022 at home after a long illness. Tony was a devoted husband, loving father, and beloved grandfather. He is survived by his wife, Catherine, his love of 65 years, and their three children, Christian Medaglia, Elizabeth Medaglia and her husband Mark Grindle, and Justin Medaglia and his wife Kirstin Medaglia, and his five grandchildren, Isabella Luna Medaglia-Grindle, Ophelia Autumn Medaglia-Grindle, Mary Grace Medaglia, John Anthony Medaglia, and Rhys Alexander Medaglia, and his sister, Anne Medaglia Haugh, and predeceased by his parents, Anthony J. Medaglia and Mary (Frango) Medaglia. He also leaves many loving nieces and nephews and many loyal friends.

Tony was born February 16, 1937 in Brighton. He grew up in Newton and advanced through the Elliot, Weeks, and Newton High schools. As a recipient of a Navy ROTC scholarship, Tony excelled at Harvard College, graduating cum laude, class of 1959, with a Bachelor of Arts in Economics. Tony was then commissioned as an Ensign in the U.S. Navy, serving 1959-62, which placed him directly in the drama unfolding in the Bay of



Pigs during the Cuban Missile Crisis. He went on to serve in the Naval Reserve for over a decade. In 1965 Tony earned his Bachelor of Laws from Harvard Law School. He was active and devoted for many years in organizing alumni events for the Harvard College class of 1959, serving as chairman of his 35th reunion, which he truly loved. He served with many Harvard organizations over the years, and he and Catherine established a scholarship in their names for undergraduate students in need.

Tony was recognized for over 20 years as a Best Lawyer in America in the corporate field of law. Tony was a member, supporter, and officer of a number of organizations, including his beloved Brae Burn Country Club, where he had served as president, Oyster Harbors Golf Club, Windsor Club, where he had served as president, Harvard Club of Boston, Ocean Reef Club, where he had served as Board Member, Card Sound Golf Club, Scituate Yacht Club,

Ocean Reef Yacht Club, Dana Hall School, where he had served as Board Member, and Belmont Hill and Fessenden Schools, where he had served as Parents Committee Member. Tony was known for his colorful bowties, radiant smile, and joyful whistling. His great fun was had on the golf course and in a sailboat. As steady captain of his ship, he boldly led his young family on yearly adventures on the open sea. Tony's mastery of navigation, perfected in The Navy, was put to the test the first year in a sailboat with no instrumentation to guide him; he sailed the family to their destination solely by markers and checkpoints he hand-charted on paper. Together, the family weathered storms, dodged buoys and rocks, survived a smoking engine, and even had a near-miss with a looming lighthouse, rising out of the sea and engulfed in dense fog. They encountered Andre the Seal, several pods

of dolphins, and even a whale, who knocked the boat up and out of the sea, leaving behind its evidence, discovered in dry dock: a deep gash in the bottom of the boat. Through it all, Tony was the steady hand and fearless leader. The qualities he brought to seafaring defined every aspect of his life: mastery, boldness, a sense of adventure, and pure joy in the things he loved to do. He will be greatly missed and always loved.

A memorial mass will be celebrated on Friday, April 22, at 10:30 am at Our Lady Help of Christians Parish on Washington Street in Newton, followed by a reception at Brae Burn Country Club on Fuller Street in Newton. 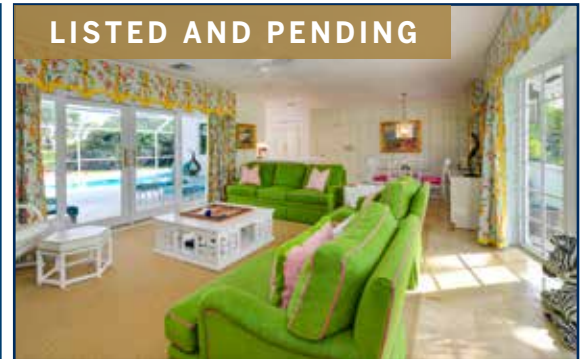

Get Ready for Summer with FitMed

This past October the Medical Center launched a weight loss, weight management program called "FitMed" for patients interested in achieving their weight goals. The program has been a resounding success for the participants.

In the past 6 months since the program started, participants have lost a collective total of 707.99 pounds, averaging about 20 pounds per patient.

What is FitMed?

People who struggle with weight loss often have impaired metabolic pathways that cause a decrease in their basal metabolic rate (BMR). The



FitMed program works with patients to understand why they are struggling with their weight, including any potential medical issues, and formulates a plan to lose and maintain their weight going forward. The eight-week weight loss phase is followed by a four-week maintenance phase.

How it all Works

- Comprehensive lab work is

provided at the beginning of the process and throughout the program at appropriate intervals.

- Initial comprehensive medical evaluation with the Weight Management Physician and subsequent visits as needed.
- Weekly face to face nutrition counseling sessions with a Health Coach.
- Frequent body composition

assessment and measurements to monitor progress.

- Monitored nutritional guidance and tracking with an app and journal.
- An opportunity to coordinate a meal preparation program through Ocean Reef Club and "Reef Eats" delivery.

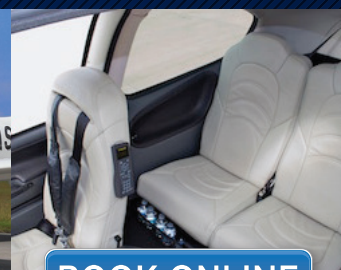

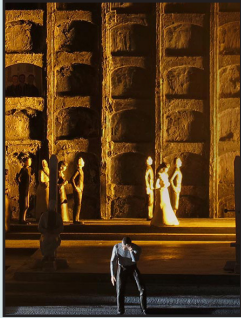

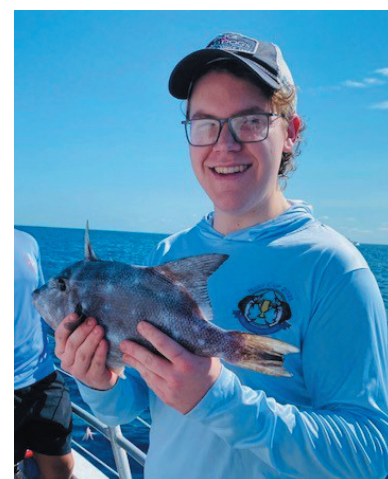
The Keys Environment

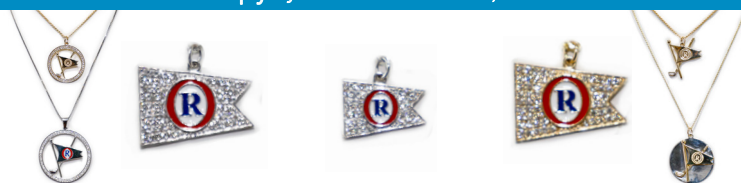

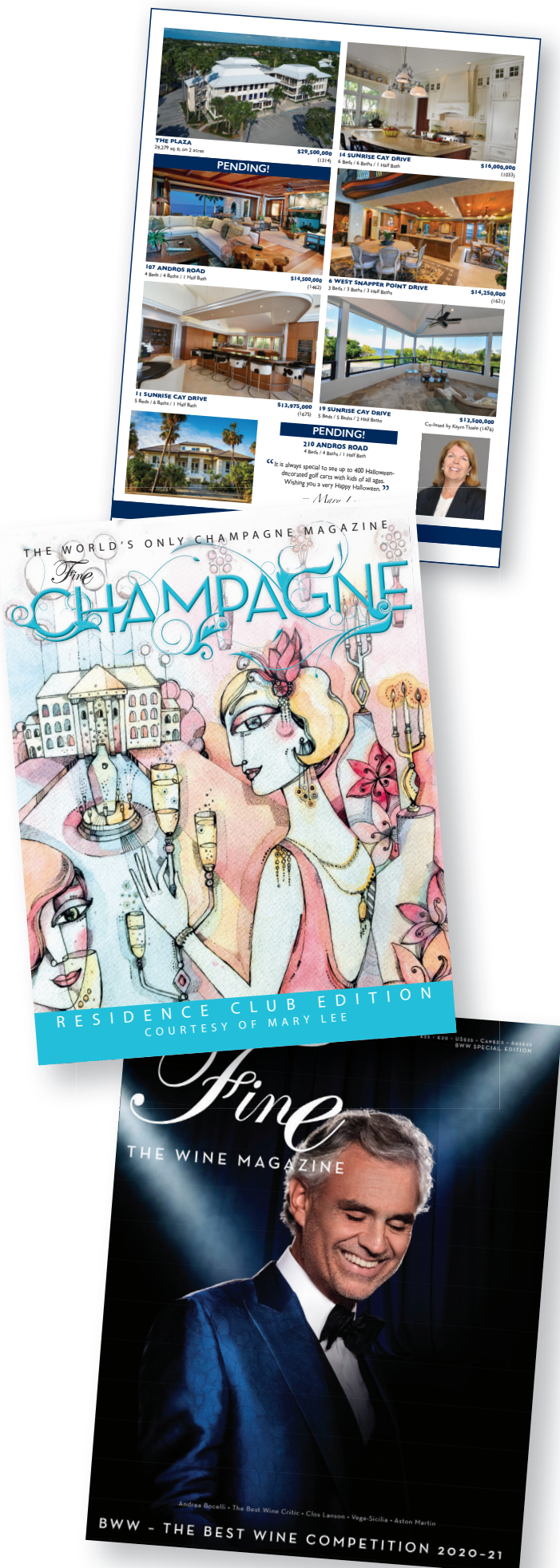

Roxie and Jim Sapp, managers of Wynn's, were gracious to meet with me last week at their tiny office behind the store. Ever cheerful and upbeat, they go about their job with a positive attitude and great sense of humor.

Both Jim and Roxie are seasoned managers of grocery stores, but they confided to me that this store at The Reef is a special one that has touched both their hearts. It is their "baby" metaphorically speaking. Jim has been here for 6 ½ years and Roxie has been here 5. Originally, she managed the Naples store, and would come here just on the weekends. She volunteered, "It has been a fabulous experience

here. The Members are wonderful. As a 7,000-foot store, which includes our deli and back rooms, we are small but we do the best we can with the space we have. It's a good challenge."

While Wynn's navigated effectively through COVID, the Sapps shared that the aftermath is equally disruptive as certain items are difficult to get in-store right now. For example, Jim said their sunscreen manufacturer has the sunscreen they carry, but the aluminum can to dispense it is not available from China or Russia. "People occasionally ask about items that we already have ordered, but have no control

over receiving," he said. "It is disappointing to our customers to relay the message, but we have no alternative. Thankfully, we are grateful for the loyal employees we have who work to make each shopping experience a positive one regardless of the circumstance."

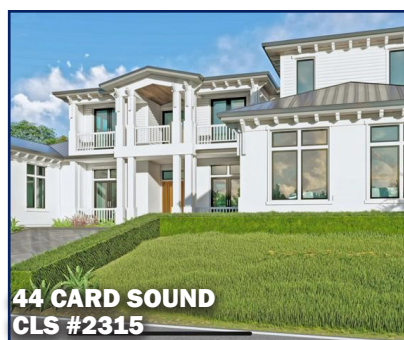

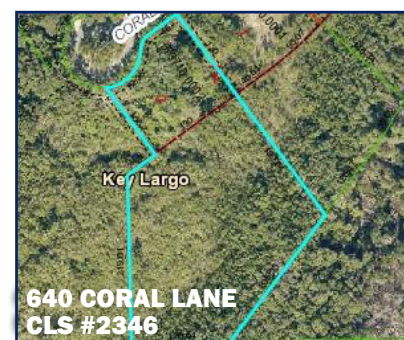

We even had Auxiliarists on hand to explain the importance of having your boat inspected for by our Vessel Examiners to ensure that all is in tip-top shape. The Auxiliary provides a sticker, which indicates to all that your boat has passed inspection and is up to speed. It is extremely helpful when approached by Coast Guard Inspectors on the water. We offer that complimentary service to all who request it here on The Reef.

We also had our rescue dog, Trooper, swim with the children wearing his trusty life vest to promote pet safety on the water; as well as jumping several times from the dock as long as 19 feet 4 inches to retrieve a ball and bring it back to shore. His human, Sue Redding, from Flotilla 13-02, was on hand to supervise the lagoon swims.

In addition, we had two of our finest 2-legged swimmers, Luis Bracamonte and Casey Culp from the Member Fitness Center, in the pool to show

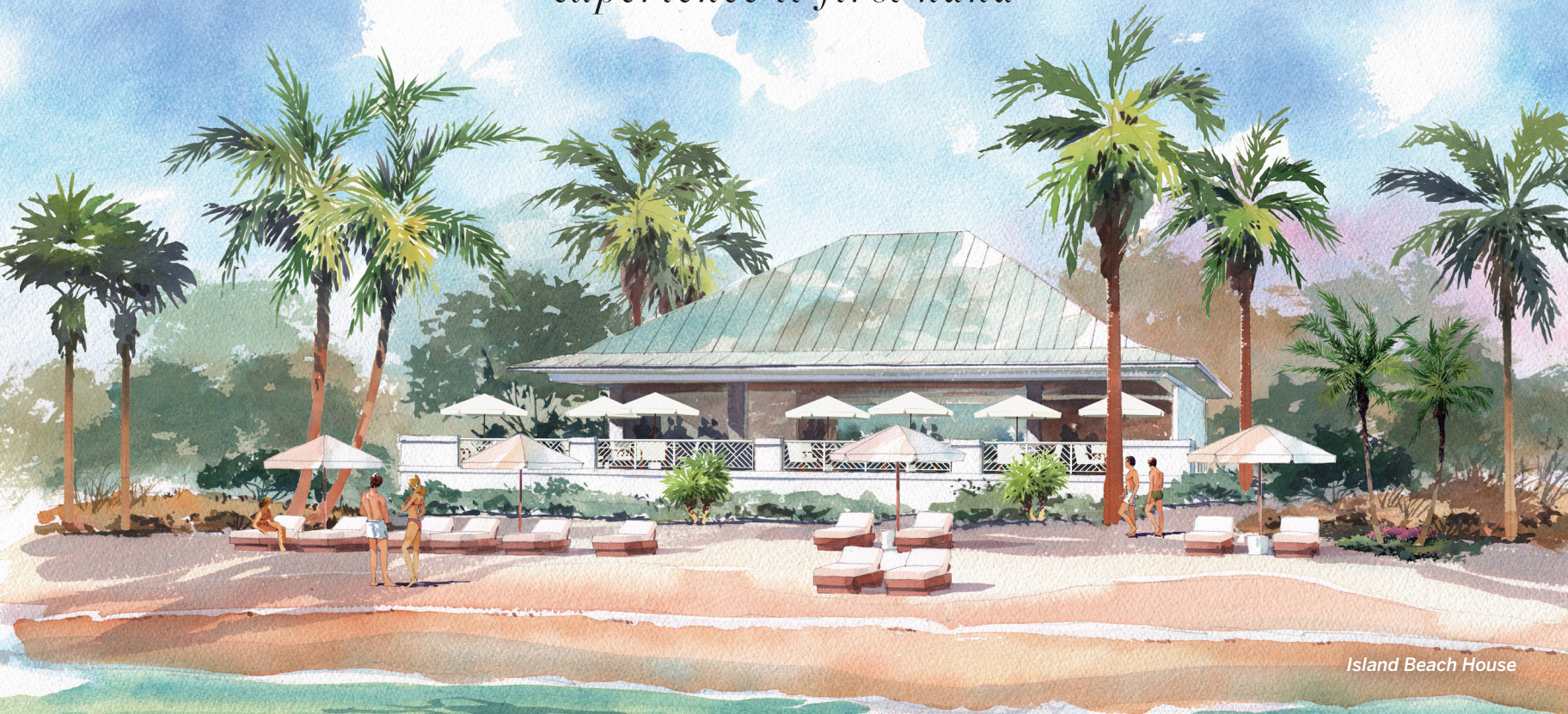
