

Neither the Cultural Center Library nor the Key Largo Public Library will accept school textbooks, encyclopedias, medical books or similar items, regardless of condition or age.



Ukraine – You Have Made a Difference!

Just about a month ago, I received a call from a friend, a concerned Equity Member of the Club. His intent, expressed in that call, was to make a matching gift donation of \$100,000 to support Ukrainian relief. His desire was to invite support from participants of the congregations of the chapel, and the Members of the Club.

An All-Out Club Effort

When I submitted the article to the Ocean Reef Press, inviting your financial support, initially it appeared to be a non-starter. The reason being, a well-established policy that all fundraising within the Club is conducted through the All Charities Event.

However, being Ocean Reef, and knowing the unprecedented global crisis facing the Ukrainian people, whose lives are caught up in this conflict, what appeared to be a non-starter became instead, an all-out community effort!

With the blessing of the Community Foundation Board, an exception to this important policy was granted, and the article was published.

Their support made the effort possible, and I get to give you a report on the difference you have made!

The Results

As of this past Sunday, you have given \$301,215 – to date, including the matching gift. There are still a few gifts that are coming in. What you have done has more than tripled the generous matching gift that started this outpouring of support.

Who Receives the Money?

A committee composed of **Dave Meredith, Jeannie Schiavone, Candy Sutfin**, and chaired by **Pack St. Clair**, conducted the research into possible recipients, and made the final determination.

As I indicated in my initial article, the goal of this team was to be able to "move the needle" through the support provided to a designated organization.

After considering five different organizations, all having a four-star Charity Navigator rating, they settled on two – Convoy of Hope and Americares. The funds will be divided equally between the two, in support of their work that is already taking place on the ground.

Convoy of Hope is a faith-based organization with a driving passion to feed the world. With a long history as an early responder in times of natural disasters, Convoy has served more than 193 million people since its founding in 1994.

Through partners across Europe and teams on the ground, Convoy of Hope is providing shelter, food, water, hygiene kits and other necessities to Ukrainian refugees in Poland and other strategic locations. Since a team from Convoy arrived in Poland on March 1, they have procured a warehouse in which to store incoming supplies and organize a full-scale response to facilitate the distribution of much-needed aid.

Go to their website, convoyofhope.org, to see first-person reports of the impact of their work.

Americares is a global nonprofit organization focused on health and development that responds to individuals affected by poverty, disaster, or crisis. The organization addresses these needs by providing medicine, medical supplies and health programs.

Americares has emergency response teams in Poland and Romania to support health services for families affected

by the escalating humanitarian crisis in Ukraine. Their teams have expertise in coordinating large-scale shipments of medicine and relief supplies, and mobilizing emergency medical teams in crisis situations.

To date, Americares has shipped or delivered more than 37 tons of medicine and relief supplies to 8 partners responding in Ukraine and at least a dozen more shipments are underway or planned.

In addition, the Poland team has successfully completed the first local procurement of supplies valued at more than \$100,000 and weighing 12.5 tons to be distributed to local partners. They are also providing emergency funding to local organizations supporting children and adults caught in the crisis in Poland, Ukraine and Romania.

Final Thoughts

Will the generosity of the matching gift donor, and all the gifts we have given, meet every need? The answer obviously is, "Of course not." But to those who are the recipients of the resources provided, it will be life-changing, to each one of them.

Sadly, the brutality being inflicted by the Russian military, is now in its 60th day. It shows no end of letting up. Yet neither does the resilience and courage of the Ukrainian people, their leaders, and their military!

There is still one other resource everyone can provide. Our prayers. Never take for granted the immense power of God in response to the cries and prayers of his people for compassion and justice in the face of such needless bloodshed and disruption of life.

One more thing. Never take for granted the generosity and compassion of the Ocean Reef Community. You are a community that makes a difference!


Thomas Bell

Celebrating 40 Years at ORC

Dr. Brian Tschirhart remembers a few of the frantic phone calls – the excruciating abscessed tooth in the middle of the night on a holiday weekend (of course); or then there was the mother of the bride who accidentally knocked out her front teeth the day before the wedding. Yikes. Both patients were expertly rescued.

Over four decades The Tschirhart Family dental practice has served our Ocean Reef Community with uncommon grace, skill, and dedication. Brian and Kathy recently passed the 40th anniversary of establishing their office here at the Plaza Building

My personal experience as a twenty-year patient of Dr. Tschirhart has been unfailingly positive. Treatment has included two extractions accomplished so gently that I had dinner the same evening with no pain. And Brian sacrificed a two-day holiday weekend to correct a poorly done false tooth (work of another dentist up North) for our daughter, Ashley. She went home with a new implant and beautifully matched veneers without even missing a day of work. It was an impressive blend of medical expertise and artistry. 

What do you imagine when you think of summer? Is there a memory that you return to with a smile? Lobster clam bakes at the shore with family? The wind and sun on your face as your sailboat is heeling over? Or perhaps the ocean view of your favorite golf course after playing 18 with friends.

For me, my perfect summer days were spent at Miacomet Beach in Nantucket. Each day we would sunbathe and body surf in the icy ocean waters and then rinse off in the warm freshwater pond just steps away. Invariably, there was always someone with a metal detector sweeping and beeping down the beach hunting treasure. "How cool," I thought and imagined all the treasure I would find if I had one too.

This summer, I plan to use the incredibly clever **Metal Detector app** for iPhone by Alexandr Balyberdin (Android users try Metal Detector by Smart Tools Co). On newer phone models, it uses the phone's built-in magnetometer (used for GPS and the compass) to create a magnetic field and locate metal items. Download

the free app and point the camera toward the ground. Did you drop the back of an earring in your bathroom? No problem! Lost a watch at the beach at Buccaneer Island (me!)? While the range is not long, it works on any magnetic metal (except stainless steel which has poor electrical conductivity). Be sure to shake your phone to recalibrate the detector between

Did vou know the first metal detector was invented in 1881 by Alexander Graham Bell? He rushed to the bedside of US President James Garfield to try and aid the doctors searching for an assassin's fatal bullet. I learned this and much more from the online encyclopedia Wikipedia app and its "simple version" https://simple. wikipedia.org which explains complicated things in a much simpler way (great for Spanish speakers, kids, and people over age 50!). Treasure here I come....

2022 Summer Golf Course Maintenance Schedule

It's that time of year again when the Golf Course
Maintenance Team begins
their summer work of aerating
the Club's golf courses and
green spaces. This year, the
schedule looks a bit different.

On the schedule below, you'll notice each area will close only twice, for a slightly longer period than in year's past. Eric Bennet, ORC Director of Agronomy, says the longer closure will allow for more to be accomplished in that period of time, leading to each course opening up in better condition.

This means, for example, that when the Dolphin reopens August 1 to allow the Maintenance Team the

opportunity to work on the Hammock, the Dolphin will be in better playable condition after its first round of aeration than it would have been under the previous schedule, which would sometimes give the Maintenance Team only 13 days to work before reopening.

As of October 24, the normal summer maintenance, which comprises core aeration of the greens, tees and fairways, will be complete with all courses and green spaces reopened for season.

Use this Quick 4-Step Routine to Ensure Your Posture is Perfect at Address

In the April 15 edition of the Ocean Reef Press, you may remember reading an article, originally published in Golf Magazine's Golf.com, featuring Ocean Reef's own Stefanie Shaw. Well, this ORC Teaching Professional has done it again! The following article, featuring Stefanie, was originally published on Golf.com.

If you're having trouble getting the ball into the air, the problem may not be your swing — it could be your posture!

"Women have a different center of gravity than men,"



On the left: bad posture! On the right: good!

says Stefanie Shaw, a teaching professional at the Ocean Reef Club in Key Largo, Fla. and Sebonack Golf Club in Southampton, N.Y. "For women, it's in our hips, which means we have to stand a little bit differently to keep our balance in the golf swing."

According to Shaw, that means that when you address the ball, the more that you can send your hips back, the better.

Check out the main photo above. In the left picture, Shaw is demonstrating bad posture:



upright, with too much knee bend. On the right, you can see the correct, balanced posture at the address position.

"It should feel like you're bowing toward the ground," Shaw says. "That gets your arms, hands and club closer to the grass."

By keeping your hips back, you're making it easier to hit the ground with your club in the correct impact zone, thereby making it easier to get the ball in the air.

Sounds simple, right? It is!

Here's a quick four-step routine, courtesy of Shaw, to help ensure that you're setting up for success when it comes to your posture.

Four Steps to Perfect Posture

- 1. Start with your feet shoulderwidth apart.
- 2. Grip your club and extend your arms in front of you, with your club at a 45-degree angle.
- 3. From here, hinge forward or "bow" to the ground from your hips, allowing your arms to hang directly below your chest.
- 4. Unlock your knees. And there you have it!

One thing to look out for, says Shaw, is to make sure you don't have too much knee bend, because that will pull your chest and arms away from the ground. Keep your arms directly below your chest, and enjoy your newly crisp contact!

These challenges can include organized events such as marathons, triathlons, 5k run/ walks or personal tests such as solo or group hikes, bike rides or swims. Endurance events

are as much mental as they are physical tests. Training to endure a fitness challenge will also increase your capacity to endure other life challenges.

-Test your strength with weightlifting goals, such as testing one, five or ten rep max on classic exercises such as squats, deadlifts, bench presses or military presses. Machines such as the lat pull down, chest press and leg press can also be used to test strength increases. We lose strength as we age if we do not work on slowing down and controlling the road to frailty. We all can and should be strong at any age.

-Test your strength endurance by the number of pushups, pull ups, plank holds or wall sits for time.

The added advantage of training to improve these exercises is that they will also prepare you for our official Club Challenges next season. Current overall records stand at: 111 for pushups, 33 pull ups, 60-minute wall sit and 45-minute plank. How close can you get to the

-Test your skills by either improving a current sport or learning a new one. Also, why not both?

-Improve your body's composition though better exercise and nutrition habits.





Bridge Tip of the Week

Double: A bid technique. Various kinds, however all doubles not for penalty are considered conventional.

Some examples:

Balancing Double/Balancing

Bid: Making a bid in position where passing would end the bidding (i.e.: 1 D P P?).

The requirements for balancing (with a double or otherwise) are always less than bidding in the

middle of a live auction. The reason for this is that here the opponents have given up in a part score, so you can assume that your partner has some good cards. In a live auction they may be going to game and your partner may be totally bust (a really bad hand).

Business Double: Same as a penalty double (i.e. I mean business).

Lead Directing Double: A double which asks partner to lead a specific suit. Often these will be doubles of artificial or Qbids made by your right hand opponent. The most common would be a double of stayman (2C over 1NT) which says, "Partner, I have clubs". A double like this does not usually ask to compete in the auction, but may be made on something like KQTxx of clubs and not much else.

Lightner Double: Almost always used when opponents have bid to a slam. They are made by partner of opening leader and always ask for an unusual lead. Many times that player will be void in a suit. Very often it will specifically ask for the lead of dummy's first bid suit (doubler may have AQ of suit, or K with outside A, or be void).

Negative Double: Used after partner bids and opponents overcall shows 4 cards in the unbid major.

Optional Double: Simply means a double that can be passed, or not, by partner. In a sense, all doubles are optional, but some more so than others.

Penalty Double: Used when you think you can set (prevent them from making) opponents' contract.

Responsive Double: A specialized bid for more advanced players which allows partnerships to decide whether to compete for part score, go to game, or defend.

Support Double: A specialized bid for more advanced players. Used when you have opened the bidding and partner has responded, and your right hand opponent has bid. A double at this point shows 3 cards in partners suit (ie:1 D P 1S 2C X).

To bid 2S would show 4 spades (and no extra values beyond opening hand). To pass or bid anything else would deny having as many as 3 spades.

Takeout Double: Used after opponents bid to indicate support in unbid suits.


