
# **Equity Member Social Under the Stars**

# Lagoon Beautification Enters Phase II

Around this time last summer, the Club began Phase I of its two-phase Buccaneer Island Lagoon renourishment and beautification project – a much-anticipated project for many. Through the first threemonth enhancement, Phase I successfully transformed the Lagoon into the desirable swimming and lounging experience of when it was first created in 1952.

This first phase saw the removal of years of accumulated silt and organic matter and the addition of fresh, new sand for a clearer, shallower and more recreationfriendly Lagoon experience. During this initial stage of renourishment, the overall size of the Lagoon was also reduced slightly, allowing for expanded beach and lounging

# On the Radar -Homestead Air Reserve Base

Opposition to Civil Aviation Operations at the Base Gains Major Momentum

Florida Senators Marco Rubio, Rick Scott, along with our local Congressman Carlos Gimenez, recently introduced legislation in the United States Congress to prohibit a Joint Use Agreement (JUA) between Miami Dade County and the U.S. Air Force that would allow for civil aviation operations at the Homestead Air Reserve Base (HARB), citing concerns over a threat to the Everglades Restoration program and national security interests. Gaining the full support of our federally elected officials to preserve HARB as a "military only" facility is a tremendous boost to halting commercial encroachment around the base that jeopardizes two national parks - Everglades and

Biscavne Bay.

For those who are wondering about the significance of this development, you have to appreciate the more than 20-year history of special interests pursuing commercial passenger and cargo aviation at the base. Not since the Air Force concluded in 2001 that HARB property "should not be conveyed for airport purposes," has there been a more forceful pronouncement out of D.C. than the Gimenez/ Rubio/Scott legislation to ban civil aviation at the base. Of note—Congresswoman Debbie Wasserman Schultz from Weston, Florida, joined in support to make the effort bi-partisan. The legislation represents for the first time a unified position by our elected D.C. officials to prevent the base from converting to private use.

"Preserving (HARB) for its original intent and purpose is critical to protecting our national security interests," Gimenez said. "Allowing aircraft not affiliated with our military or armed services to utilize an air reserve facility would compromise our country's national security."

In the months ahead the best prospect of passing the civil



aviation ban is the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), a bill that establishes funding levels and policy priorities for the Department of Defense and must pass Congress each year. Last week we received exciting news the Senate version of the NDAA prohibits the Secretary of the Air Force for the next four years from permitting civil aircraft and the Air Force to jointly use HARB. In announcing this significant development, Senator Scott declared, "I'm committed to preserving and enhancing military readiness on our bases, and as a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee, I was proud to lead the effort to include this provision in the National Defense Authorization Act."

"Civil use of HARB would

harm our military readiness and jeopardize critical Everglades restoration projects," Senator Rubio added. "This bill would ensure that corporate special interests do not come before our national security."

A word of thanks from our Ocean Reef Community to Senators Scott, Rubio and **Congressman Gimenez for** their leadership on protecting mission sustainability at HARB and for sharing our dedication to restoring the **Everglades ecosystem and** Biscayne Bay. We remain committed to doing our part to bring this to a successful conclusion. We are grateful for the generous contributions and support of our members. The Alliance is fortunate to be working on behalf of this exceptional community.

improved accessibility to Buccaneer Island.

Now in Phase II, beautification of this expanded area around the Lagoon is the goal. Members can look forward to an enhanced arrival experience. All of the existing asphalt entryway will be replaced with new brick pavers, greatly improving the aesthetics of the area. In addition, reimagined landscaping, lighting, expanded views and more, will improve the entire experience. All this, while maintaining the additional golf cart parking that Members have proven so valuable.

#### Buccaneer Island Remains Open

If you head out to Buccaneer Island this weekend, you'll see construction fencing has already been placed, though Buccaneer Island and the Lagoon are still available for all to enjoy.

Construction on this final phase will officially begin **Monday, August 1**, though Buccaneer Island will not close throughout the duration of this project – in fact, entry is encouraged. Certain entryways will alternate closing over the coming weeks, but Members will always have an alternative route available to access Buccaneer Island from the Lagoon side. **Beginning August 1**, access via the main drive leading to the backside of the Islander will be closed and Members will be rerouted alongside Marlin Inn for Buccaneer Island access. **Nearing the end of August**, the main road is expected to reopen and access to the Marlin Beach section will close.

**Come mid-September**, the majority of new structural components will be completed with full access to Buccaneer Island returning. Further landscaping and irrigation will be scheduled at that time but will not impact Members' access to Buccaneer Island or the Lagoon.

"The progress made during the first phase of Lagoon beautification and renourishment was invigorating and we've been thrilled to see Members enjoying the refreshed area in increased numbers over the past year," said Mic O'Keeffe, Vice President of Sports & Amenities. "With the completion of the second and final phase on the horizon, we are excited to present a beautified area for the benefit of all Members, whether enjoying the Lagoon itself, accessing Buccaneer Island from the Lagoon side, or appreciating the view during a night out at the Islander."



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# An In-between Time

This is the first year we have spent extended time at Ocean Reef during the summer. It is an 'in between time' summer for us. We've sold our home in Idaho, but the home we're building in Florida is not yet completed. And there is much that needs to be done in our new home in the chapel. So, we're grateful for this different rhythm to our lives.

How is life different in the summer at Ocean Reef Club – besides the weather! First, it's very quiet on our cul-de-sac during the week. The pace of life during the summer is what driving at Ocean Reef is supposed to be – more leisurely. But that all changes on the weekends. The parking places fill up, and there are many more people at the Club – many more families! The Club's great camps are teeming with kids!

We offer a weekly worship service in the new chapel each summer Sunday at 10 a.m. It meets as a smaller gathering in the Fellowship Hall. Each week, we have visitors who come – singles, couples, grandparents, parents with kids. The summer environment in the chapel is very casual – come as you are.

Over breakfast this morning, my wife's and my conversation turned to the topic of families – our families. Our eldest granddaughter starts her university studies this fall, and our youngest turns seven – she wants a funky haircut. Really? Oh well.... We are grateful that each of our children and their families are thriving amidst the dynamics and drama typical of every family with growing kids.



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However, I am reminded that the state of the family in our culture today is in a state of flux. A recent Pew Research study described these changing patterns of family life. Twoparent households are on the decline as divorce, remarriage and cohabitation are on the rise. Families are smaller now. Americans are having fewer children, and the circumstances surrounding parenthood have changed. In the early 1960s, babies typically arrived within a marriage. But today, fully fourin-ten births occur to women who are single or living with a non-marital partner. As a result of these, and other changes, there is no longer one dominant form of the family today.

First, hat's off to all parents! No family is perfect – the perfect family is a myth. The best any of us will ever be as parents is just 'good enough!' The challenges facing parents today are daunting, far more complex than when we raised our kids in the seventies and eighties.

As my family therapist wife will tell you, making blended families work successfully takes great effort. Some of our greatest satisfaction in church leadership has been creating thriving support groups for single adults and single parents, integrating them into the life of the faith community. They are too often overlooked, yet represent such great strength in vital faith families.

However, there are destructive dynamics surreptitiously working in the midst of this flux of family patterns. Beyond the stressors all parents face, there are some who seem intent on denying the importance of family altogether, and diminishing parental influence.

When institutions like school boards and teacher unions claim primacy over parents, something has gone terribly wrong. When social media platforms align with those institutions to monitor parental communication, everyone should be alarmed. It is every

parent's right and responsibility to respectfully express legitimate concern with the content their children are being taught in the classroom.

God established the family as the foundational unit of any thriving society. We do not live in collectives. We live in families. While we may debate the changing forms of the family, there should be no debate as to the essential nature and importance of the family. The well-being of our children depends upon it.

People of faith, and our institutions – our churches and synagogues – have a responsibility to support persons who experience the pain and devastation of human brokenness within their families.

But people of faith, and our institutions – our churches and synagogues – also have a responsibility to raise our voice in the public square. God ordained families for well-being of human society, and for the birth and nurture of children.

All of us know the challenge of seeking to live our lives as well as possible within that order. But we all have a responsibility to speak up when that order is deliberately being undermined. Our future wellbeing is at stake.

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# The Mosquito Battle—YOU CAN HELP!

Monroe County is definitely a subtropical paradise where people love to live, but unfortunately mosquitoes feel quite comfortable in our environment, too. The Florida Keys Mosquito Control District is here to lead the battle against these pests, but they need our support.

#### Watch For These...

There are about 46 species of mosquitoes in Monroe County and three of these types are a not just a common nuisance at The Reef; they can also cause health issues. The Black Salt Marsh mosquito is a biter that comes in with the wind from the Everglades and is generally the most bothersome. The Brown Southern House mosquito is active at dusk and dawn. Lastly, the Aedes Aegypti is mostly around people and homes and they breed readily in standing water. All of these mosquitoes can give you itchy bumps and can cause several diseases.

#### Our Control System


The Mosquito Control District utilizes a number of methods to protect us from these pesky critters. There are a number of techniques in place that help keep our mosquito population down. "Source Reduction" goes after breeding areas with inspectors looking for any standing water in pots, trashcans, or other containers. Chad Huff, Public Education/ Information Manager, explained that mosquitoes lay 100's of eggs in one ounce of water. So, any tiny bit of water can breed these rascals. These inspectors are on the lookout for water sources. "Larval Control" targets immature mosquitoes with an environmentally safe bacterium that is applied by air or ground. This can only be used when weather conditions are appropriate based on data collection and research. Another effective approach is "Adult Surveillance" which is staffed by inspectors that visit count stations daily throughout the Keys along with monitoring a variety of traps for mosquito count.

#### How You Can Help

We all need to take consistent basic precautions to help the Mosquito Control District, especially after a rain event. Checking our yards, pool areas, and docks for standing water is a must. Emptying any plant saucers or equipment that can collect water can stop mosquitoes from hatching. Notifying any managers or gardeners to be alert for these areas can really help. When you are outside, especially in the early morning or at sunset, it is also advised to wear protective clothing and use insect repellant.

#### **Most Importantly!**

Call 305-292-7190 or go online at <u>www.keysmosquito.org</u> to do a service request when you do have a mosquito problem. Staying vigilant and assisting the District is our responsibility, too. More information regarding spray schedules and even a video is available on the website. Working together we can win the mosquito battle.

This year, Director of Racquet Sports Justin Romero and Assistant Pro Warren Fulgenzi, Jr. offered a Tween Pickleball Camp to children ages 8-12 years for a fun-filled week of advancing their pickleball skills. Every day, the Ocean Reef Pros provided on-court instruction and facilitated exciting games and activities. For example, the first day included learning to dink.

In the game, a point is distilled into dinkers and bangers. To dink is to gently and repeatedly lob the perforated ball over the net, almost lulling your opponent and spectators—to sleep. Dinks are why a single point can last upward of 50 shots. Eventually,

As part of learning the game, players were also reminded that before serving, players are required to shout out the score. Well, observing the kids on Monday was a far cry from observing the same kids on Friday. In just a week, the shots were crisper, the rallies longer, and scores were shouted out loud and clear. A novice like myself could see a vast improvement in all the campers.

A credit to the teaching skills of Justin and Warren, and making a fun experience for the children. The kids stayed longer to practice every day with new friends, even in the 90-plus temperatures.

#### **Pickleball's Picking Up Swing**

For those who don't know about pickleball, here is a quick history of the game: In 1965, three dads in Washington state wanted to keep their kids active and entertained. They threw together wooden paddles, a badminton net, and a perforated plastic ball in a backyard – the sport pickleball was born! The name was derived from a dog named Pickles who kept running away with the ball.

Today pickleball, a hybrid of tennis, badminton and ping-

pong, is the fastest-growing sport in America. Due to Covid-19, the sport has picked up even more swing. When quarantines went into effect and gyms closed, portable pickleball nets sold out. Players set up courts, which are half the size of tennis courts. Ocean Reef has even decided to put in three more pickleball courts to accommodate the growing demand.

The sport itself is pretty remarkable – so remarkable that more than 4 million people are playing the sport in this country. At least 5 million are playing it around the world.

Events and revelries will be held August 17 - 21 at the splendid seaside city of Victoria to be followed by an optional twelve-day flotilla of chartered vessels navigating the wild waters of Desolation Sound.

Commodore **Don** and Commodora **Denise Bermant** have planned four entertaining days of escapades 3,000 miles north by northwest from Key Largo. The group anticipates sunny days, festive nights and a favorable exchange rate.

Victoria, on the southern tip of Vancouver Island, is an attractive provincial capital boasting Canada's most temperate climate and a heritage of First Nation peoples, British colonials, natural resources, and international cultures.

"We have arranged cocktail receptions, local wines, yacht designer Tony Fleming presenting at the Royal Victoria Yacht Club, a gala dinner dance at the Hotel Grand Pacific, whale and wildlife cruises, floatplane flights to Saltspring Island, historical tours, an evening at Butchart Gardens, and more optional excursions, fine shopping and dining than can be imagined," says Don.

At the conclusion of the Victoria event, 33 venturesome ORYC mariners will explore islands, fjords, and remote destinations within Desolation

Sound and the Discovery Islands. Seven chartered power boats, two members' local yachts, and one lead vessel will form an expeditionary flotilla to visit eleven destinations. Following a challenging itinerary, boat crews will discover remote anchorages, wilderness marinas, celebrated resorts and small shoreside communities.


The cruising route follows that of George Vancouver's explorations in 1792, surveying deep mountain fjords and open waters, crossing tidal rapids, entering narrow channels, and everywhere involving challenging Pacific tides and currents. The float plan covers 350 nautical miles with pilotage led by a Fleet Captain provided by charter outfitter, NWExplorations. Accompanying naturalist, technician and crew will provide cultural and natural interpretation and assist with mechanical concerns and unusual northwest anchoring and mooring practices.

Along the way flotilla participants will enjoy a moveable feast of shoreside hospitality: barbecues, banquets and epicurean farm and sea cuisine. Deep fjord fishing and an extraordinary jetboat foray into one of the world's most dramatic tidal whirlpools are two optional



# What to Know Before You Go Regular Lobster Season Begins August 6

As the Club closes out Lobstermania, and with the regular Lobster Season approaching on Saturday, August 6, the Ocean Reef Press compiled some important rules to help you have an enjoyable, safe, and environmentally responsible lobster season:

• Prior to heading out on the water, visit myfwc.com to get your recreational saltwater fishing license and lobster permit.

• Use a dive flag when in the water and stay within 300 feet of the dive flag (100 feet if in a channel).



• Do not touch coral, bump coral with dive fins, or anchor on coral.

• Egg-bearing lobsters must be released unharmed, regardless of size.

• Check equipment and always exercise proper snorkeling and scuba safety measures.

#### Can I dive for lobster at night?

Yes during regular season, which begins at 12:01 a.m. on August 6 and ends at midnight on March 31.

# What is legal size and how do l measure?

The lobster's carapace – the main body shell extending from a lobster's eyes to the place where the tail begins – must measure greater than

# What is the daily limit in the Keys?

Six lobsters per person, per day in Monroe County.

#### What areas are restricted?

No snorkeling or diving is allowed within 300 feet of residential or commercial shoreline – so no lobstering allowed in Ocean Reef canals!

Also closed to harvesting – National Marine Sanctuary marked by yellow buoys, John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park, Sanctuary Presentation Areas including Carsyfort Reef, The Elbow, Key Largo Dry Rocks, and Everglades National Park.



Results can be generated and reproduced through good programming and habits. Every person who has at some point achieved a higher level of personal fitness did it through improving specific habits in areas including nutrition, movement and recovery. Nevertheless, because of so many reasons including work, injuries, travel, and lifestyle changes, anyone can fall off the wagon and get out of shape. To get back on the path of your fitness journey, follow these strategies:

1. Define your goals and why they are important. Not only is it key to know the direction we are taking but why. Every time we set sails for a new destination we open opportunities to learn more about ourselves. The process of working towards a goal is as important and in most cases even more important than the achievement itself. That is why challenging ourselves to go beyond what we are currently capable of leads to growth regardless of the outcome. If the goal is one we have pursued before such as

weight loss, muscle toning, or skill improvement, we should use the knowledge acquired from our previous experiences to create a more efficient and effective plan. Consistency is key and because motivation is ephemeral, is it crucial to know your why and program the habits that keep you moving forward.

2. Learn from previous victories and defeats. Every experience can lead to growth regardless of the outcome. By analyzing our plans, strategies and execution, we gain valuable information that should make the next attempt at the same goal easier and increase our chances of success. Experience is a master teacher if we are willing to pay attention and learn.

#### 3. Create accountability.

This is where enlisting coaches, training partners, and surrounding ourselves with like-minded individuals can kick our fitness journey into a higher gear. One of the most common phrases personal trainers hear is, "I wouldn't be in the gym today if I did not have an appointment" or "I would have not done another set if vou were not here." Human nature is to avoid discomfort and to do only what we are motivated to do, so having a plan to do what we need to do in times we do not feel like doing them can make a significant difference and lead to many positive outcomes.

4. Expect setbacks and plateaus. It is unlikely to coast towards a challenging goal



without setbacks or plateaus. Therefore, it is wise to mentally prepare for them and accept them as part of the process. Mental resilience is one of the most relevant attributes anyone can have when seeking personal growth. Those who are willing to push beyond setbacks and plateaus are often those who end up improving the most. 5. Take a holistic approach. There is a physical, mental, nutritional, and recovery component in the pursuit of all fitness and wellness goals. To get back in shape or to get in great shape for the first time, make sure to understand the habits needed in every area to achieve each specific goal. Examples of habits in nutrition include increasing consumption of foods from plant sources, reducing sugar intake, and managing portion control; training habits include implementing the proper amount and type of cardio, strength, and flexibility components in a program, and

recovery habits include regular massage, stretching, and getting enough sleep each night.

Major goals such as achieving good health and fitness are of paramount importance in life. Every time we succeed at getting in shape makes it easier to succeed again due to the accumulation of knowledge through experience. Whether we are trying to get in great shape for the first time or are looking to get back into it, the process is very similar and always worth pursuing. Fitness is a journey and a way of life that enriches all other endeavors. Movement is life so work on moving better and moving often.

# A Warrior's Mentality

Do you feel frustrated with your tennis game or you feel you are not improving fast enough? Let's adopt a warrior's mentality!

Even if you don't play tennis in competition, the mental aspect is still fundamental. In fact, tennis can be more mental than physical. Your mindset, body language and attitude on the court can drastically affect your tennis game. Your tennis level and sensations on the court are different every day. You will not play great all the time and you'll have some good days and some bad days. What matters is how you handle the bad and how calm and mentally strong you remain to turn the situation around. I love this quote from Andy Murray, which perfectly summarizes this idea, "In tennis, it is not the opponent you fear, it is the failure itself, knowing how near you were but just out of reach."

So, how to break this cycle of frustration and negativity?

Adopt a positive attitude! Easier said than done, you might say? Let's start with some small changes.

#### **Practice Positive Affirmations**

The positivity is not only in the attitude or the body language, it is also in the way you talk to yourself. The first step is to transform every negative sentence into affirmative sentences. For example, instead of saying: "I'm bad" or "my forehand is terrible" or "I will never be a good player", use positive words like, "It's okay, you can do it" or "I'll do better on the next point." Even if you are positive and try to cheer yourself up, you need to keep using affirmative phrases. You can say, "My serve will be in" or "I will win the next point" instead of "don't double fault" or "don't lose this point."

#### **Create Routines Between Points**

Another tip to stay positive is to focus on a specific routine or create new habits in between points to help you get out of this cycle and not overthink too much. You can, for instance, pick up the farthest ball, use your towel, straighten up the strings of your racket or more, be creative. It is up to you to find the routine that works and can put you in the best mental condition to start the next point.

And when in doubt, remember this great quote from comedian Mitch Hedberg!

"The depressing thing about tennis is that no matter how good I get, I'll never be as good as a wall."

# Bridge Tip of the Month 1NT Forcing

By Gregg Van Dyke, Director of Card & Games

#### **Using 1NT Forcing**

1NT Forcing is the cornerstone of the 2/1 bidding system. After partner opens 1♥/♠, a 1NT response shows 6-11 points and is forcing for one round. 1NT must be announced by the opener. Simply state "Forcing" before the next person bids.

(Keep in mind that going to the 2-level promises 12+ points and 2NT is reserved for the Jacoby 2NT convention) Examples of using 1NT forcing: Partner opens **1**♥ in 1st or 2nd position.

#### Hand 1

- ▲ Q52♥ 93
- ♦ A432
- **♣** J987

This is a normal 1NT response in any system (2/1 included)

#### Hand 2

- **♦** K98
- ♥ J5
- ♦ 532

★ AK986 This is too weak to bid 2 in the 2/1 system.

#### Hand 3

▲ 95♥ A52

#### ♦ 54

**♣** JT9765

In 2/1 we use 1NT to force partner to bid, then we rebid hearts at the cheapest level to show a weak hand (6 points).

#### Hand 4

- ♠ K95
- ♥ A52
- ♦ K5
- **♣** JT987

We also use 1NT forcing to show a limit raise (10-11 points) with 3 pieces. After partner's response we will jump raise in bearts.

Opener's Rebids After 1♥ - 1NT! - ? 2♣ May be as short as two clubs, e.g. 4-5-2-2 shape with insufficient strength to make a 2♠ reverse. 2♦ May be as short as three diamonds, e.g. 4-5-3-1 or 3-5-3-2 shape.

2♥ Shows six hearts, may have a four-card side suit.
2♠ Shows four spades, rarely five if opener is 6-5 in hearts and spades. This is a reverse showing at least 16 points.
2NT Balanced, 18-19 points. Invites partner to bid 3NT.

#### After 1♠ - 1NT! - ?

2♣ May be as short as three clubs, e.g. 5-3-2-3 shape.
2♦ May be as short as three diamonds, e.g. 5-3-3-2 shape.
2♥ Shows at least four hearts and 11-15 points. Insufficient strength to jump-rebid 3♥.
2▲ Shows six spades, may have a four-card side suit.
2NT Balanced, 18-19 points. Invites partner to bid 3NT.

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
