Relief Effort Update for Haiti Disaster: One Year Out

A year ago this month the Ocean Reef community came together to respond to a devastating 7.2 magnitude earthquake in southwestern Haiti, home to the families of many of the Club's more than 120 Haitian-American employees. The Foundation's Haiti Disaster Relief Fund, initiated after the massive 2010 earthquake and again after Hurricane Matthew in 2016, was guickly activated and funded by the Membership's response to an appeal sent by the Club.

Thanks to the community's generosity, within a week of the appeal we were able to wire \$70,000 in emergency relief in a timely and efficient manner. With a focus on supporting Haiti-based agencies with healthcare capabilities to provide general aid, treat injuries, and address the ongoing COVID-19 crisis throughout the affected areas, strategic grants went to Hope for Haiti (\$25,000), Health Equity International (\$10,000 for St. Boniface Hospital), the Haitian Health Foundation (\$10,000), and the Haiti Development Institute of Boston Foundation (\$25,000 for small clinics).

Our practice in disaster relief has been to meet urgent needs straightaway, reserving some

Flag Protocol at The Point

Why Does the Burgee Fly Higher Than the American Flag?

While it may seem confusing to see the American flag flown below the Club burgee at The Point, this is actually proper maritime protocol. It's true that no flag is meant to be flown in a position of greater honor than the American flag, but what's not widely known is that the highest point on a nautical flagpole is not considered the place of greatest honor.

A nautical or yacht club flagpole like that at The Point differs from a conventional land flagpole because of its yardarm (the horizontal pole) and the gaff (the angled pole), which are meant to mimic the aft mast of a sailing ship. On a ship, the gaff is considered the place of highest honor because it is the aft-most (or rear-most) point of the ship. This is why in the naval world, national flags are flown from the gaff, and the same



reason why the gaff is considered the place of greatest honor on a nautical flagpole. You can see the American flag properly flown from the gaff on the nautical flagpoles stationed at The Point, near the Raw Bar, and above the Dockmaster's Office.

Wondering what the other positions on The Point flagpole represent? The flag at the top of the nautical pole designates the owner of the mast and explains why the Club burgee is flown there. The other flags, which are attached to the flagpole "spreaders," are meant to contain useful information using burgees or alphabet letters. At The Point, these flags spell out "Ocean Reef."

Gotta Question?

What are some outdoor, on-shore sports our family can enjoy at The Reef?

Aside from the obvious golf, tennis, pickleball and croquet, there's plenty more to do on land! First, you can enjoy the Mini Golf Course, located by the Marina Fitness Center. Just ask Bellstand for balls and clubs.

Second, you can take your family to Buccaneer Island for beach volleyball. Volleyballs will be on Marlin Beach or available at the Pool Desk.

Third, the Field at Four Corners has soccer goals set up, a Teqball table, and also provides the capability for a variety of different grass sports to be played there.

Lastly, there are bocce courts and basketball courts, both



with equipment on site, available for the community's use and located by the Associate Parking Garage. In fact, if you're looking for people to play with, members of the community – Associates, Public Safety personnel, and the like – get together Monday evenings at 5 p.m. for pick-up games.

parents and grandparents, are afforded the opportunity to learn and grow in the game from ORC's team of expert professionals. Director of Golf Mike Leone encourages his team to get involved with the camp programs recognizing that it is equally as rewarding for the pro as for the kids.

The pro at the helm of this year's golf camps was Assistant Golf Professional Justin Seybuck. Entering his fourth season with Ocean Reef, Seybuck's summer golf camp

Continued from | 1 funds to meet targeted and emerging needs as we learn more and, wherever possible, support longer-term solutions. When all was said and done, the Foundation collected almost \$160,000 to that end.

Our second round of grants totaled \$50,000 and was more specific to reaching families of employees. Through information gathered by the Club's Human Resources team, we were able to confirm that the highest concentrations of employee families are in hard-hit and hard-to-reach, remote areas in the city of Pestel and the adjacent Los Cayemites islands.

When roads were impassable and dangerous, Pointe Sable En Action used boats to procure and distribute \$25,000 in rice, cooking oil, and tarps to both areas, going to great lengths to reach out to the family members of Club employees in doing so. The second \$25,000 grant went to ESPWA (meaning hope in Creole) in collaboration with the Haiti Community Foundation Network to build two neighborhood cisterns in the city of Pestel, which lost its water infrastructure in the quake and identified clean water solutions as the highest priority for the community.

While very limited electricity,

runaway inflation, fuel shortages, gang activity, and other complications make recovery efforts challenging, our strategy of working with organizations that have a longtime presence on the ground with largely local, Haitian staff and investing in institutions that will remain long-term to meet needs as prioritized by the Haitian people themselves, continues to serve us well.

After closely following the successful completion of the two cisterns, each providing clean water to about 4,000 families, we have found the organization that successfully managed the projects to be a reliable partner under very difficult circumstances.

I am pleased to report that the final \$40,000 grant went to another collaboration of ESPWA and the Haiti Community Foundation Network for repairs to the large primary water cistern for the city of Pestel, which will provide a sustainable source of clean water for more than 24,400 residents, as well as those in surrounding communities. So, a year out from the initial disaster, we are funding a major project that will have a huge and long-term impact on a whole community that we know includes many near and dear to employees. As always, we'll stay on top of it and share the results.





The Foundation monitored the progress of the two smaller cistern projects with frequent photos from the ground in Haiti and will continue the practice with the larger project.





Flu & Cold Season is Approaching

September is a good time to prepare for the upcoming cold and flu season. The influenza season will be starting soon and generally peaks around January. Flu vaccine takes approximately two weeks for antibodies to build.

The Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) states, "For people younger than 65 years, there is no preference for any one vaccine over another. Beginning with the 2022-2023 flu season, there are three flu vaccines that are preferentially recommended for people aged 65 and older. These are Fluzone High-Dose Quadrivalent vaccine, Flublok Quadrivalent recombinant flu vaccine or Fluad Quadrivalent adjuvanted flu vaccine."

What is FLUAD Quadrivalent?

FLUAD Quadrivalent is a standard-dose, inactivated influenza (flu) vaccine that contains an adjuvant. Adjuvanted quadrivalent flu vaccine is approved for people 65 years and older. It is manufactured using an egg-based process (like most flu vaccines) and includes an adjuvant ingredient which helps create a stronger immune response to vaccination. FLUAD Quadrivalent is approved for use among people 65 years and older, who often have a lower protective immune response

after flu vaccination compared to younger, healthier people.

What is Recombinant Flu Vaccine?

Recombinant influenza (flu) vaccines are produced using recombinant technology. This method does not require an egg-grown vaccine virus and does not use chicken eggs in the production process. Currently, the recombinant flu vaccine and the cell culture-based flu vaccine are the only egg-free flu vaccines licensed for use in the United States. There is one quadrivalent recombinant flu shot (Flublok Quadrivalent) available for the 2022-2023 influenza season.

"FACTS" Is it Cold or Flu?

This simple acronym "FACTS" can help to distinguish between cold and flu symptoms.

"F" is for fever. Not present in colds but is present in flu and frequently in COVID.

"A" is for aches. This is another likely sign that your

discomfort is flu related. Colds can sometimes make you feel achy; however, flu aches and headache are a symptom that happens with the immediate onset of flu.

"C" is for chills. Chills can be the result of a fever, a sign not associated with colds. The combination of chills and a fever are signs you need to see a doctor before your condition worsens. Your physician may also wish to rule out COVID exposure.

"T" is for tired. Fatigue is more likely a symptom of the flu or COVID.

"S" is for sneezing. Sneezing is cold associated. Sinus congestion and cough can also be present in COVID. If mucus discharge is thick or colored, it can be indicative of a more severe cold or sinus infection.

Marine Sanctuary Superintendent to Speak Sept. 7

Florida Keys National Marine
Sanctuary Superintendent
Sarah Fangman is to speak at
the upcoming **Wednesday**, **September 7** Ocean Reef
Chamber of Commerce
Luncheon at the Cultural
Center. Ocean Reef Members
are encouraged to attend where
they will be treated to a concise
and tailored version of National
Oceanic & Atmospheric
Administration's (NOAA)
Restoration Blueprint.

The presentation will articulate the "whys" behind one of the most significant marine conservation initiatives in the world, which aims to restore sensitive habitats and manage

resources within the sanctuary. First pitched in 2019 with four alternatives, this latest iteration, referred to as the "proposed rule," features a single proposal that has been distilled following more than 30,000 public comments. But it remains a proposal, and more feedback is needed during a 100-day public comment period that closes on October 26, 2022.

"It's a natural human instinct to confront challenges in their simplest form; to distill complex problems into single solutions," said Fangman. "But there is no simple solution to what is happening with the complex issues affecting the Florida Keys, and certainly no miracle cure that will return our ecosystem to what it was like, or how it functioned 50 years ago. What is needed is a multi-disciplinary approach, one where the 'whole is greater than the sum of the parts.""

Restoration Blueprint is a sweeping proposal with many nuanced solutions that balance the needs of diverse user groups. "The end goal is to build the

ecosystem's resilience in such a way that it can better withstand the elements that caused these declines in the first place," says Fangman.

A comprehensive suite of communications tools about Restoration Blueprint is available on the sanctuary's webpage at FloridaKeys.noaa.gov, including information on public comment opportunities.

After two years of waiting, the MGA and LGA were finally able to go on their much-anticipated golf trips to the UK. Zach Haynes, ORC First Assistant Golf Professional, and I accompanied 14 LGA members to Scotland at the end of June. Our group was fortunate enough to stay at the magnificent St. Andrews hotel, but unable to play there as The Old Course at St. Andrews was host to the 150th Open Championship two weeks later. The ladies played some extraordinary courses, including Kingsbarns, Dumbarnie, Carnoustie and Turnberry. All of these renown courses hold

great historical significance for the game of golf. It has been argued that Carnoustie is the birthplace of golf with the first recorded round in 1527. Carnoustie or "Carnasty" is arguably most known for the hardest three finishing holes in all of championship golf. This difficult closing stretch led to the famous collapse of Jean van de Velde in the 1999 Open Championship.

With a nod to the remarkable history of golf in Scotland, we were also able to enjoy some of the new up and coming courses that Scotland has to offer by playing Dumbarnie Golf Links, which opened in 2020.

We had fun on all of the great courses, but the most pictures were certainly snapped at Turnberry. The picturesque Turnberry golf course and hotel

also has compelling history. Established in 1902, it nearly disappeared during WWII due to the land being used as an airbase and the hotel used as a military hospital.

Although the trip was only five days, old friendships were strengthened and new friendships were kindled that will hopefully last a lifetime.

The MGA's trip in July was also rich with history and golfing traditions. Five out of the six courses we played – Formby, Royal Liverpool, Royal Birkdale, Royal Lytham & St. Annes, Prestwick and Turnberry – have hosted an Open Championship. Prestwick hosted 11 of the first 12 Open Championships starting in 1860, and at that time, it was only a 12-hole golf course.

We were also able to get a preview of the 2023 Open Championship venue, Royal Liverpool. It is a gorgeous golf course that makes driving accuracy a must! Ben Claus, Head Golf Professional, and I had a great time playing these treasured courses.

On and off the links, we especially enjoyed spending quality time with our MGA members.

Solutions to Common Fitness Problems

1. I don't have time to work out. Solution: We always have time for our priorities. Make working out a focus and pick your preferred time. Fitness training

enhances our quality of life and increases longevity. It is not a magic pill; it is a magic habit.

2. I'm not motivated.

Solution: Motivation is ephemeral and is not a good predictor of long-term success. A better approach is to build the habits that lead to reaching

3. I don't know how to begin.

7. I am discouraged by my slow progress.

Solution: Fitness progress results from volume, load, frequency, duration, intensity and consistency. If you feel that you are not progressing fast enough, you can adjust one of the variables listed and shift into a higher gear.

8. I am injured or have chronic pain.

Solution: You can work around almost every injury and chronic pain. Staying in shape through injury and chronic pain is possible and worth the extra effort. Make sure to have medical clearance, and it is advisable to consult with a fitness professional with knowledge and understanding of your injury or condition.

Tennis Tip of the Month

A good warm-up can be the basis for a great tennis practice or match. Warming up well is extremely important to play tennis since we prepare the body for the physical activity that we are going to carry out. It is the most effective way to condition the muscles and thus avoid injuries, which prevents us from precisely what we want to do: play tennis.

Warming up is a set of gentle, progressive exercises that we use to get our body going. With this, we increase muscle activation, giving way to better performance by the muscles. We

improve concentration and begin to pay attention to the game situation that is to come. All this helps us to start the main part of the practice or the competition giving 100% effort.

The ideal warm-up should be based on two phases: continuous jogging/dynamic stretching and speed.

Jogging consists of running at a continuous pace for 5 or 7 minutes, a time during which, in addition to running, we perform exercises and dynamic stretches such as lateral shuffle runs, high knee skip, butt kicks, carioca, arm circles, lunges with a twist or "Frankensteins", among others.

After covering this part of the warm-up, we should dive into a short but intense exercise: the speed sprint. Since our muscles will already be warm, we can do small speed sprints over short distances to test our reaction. We can do a series of three sprints of just 15 seconds each.


