New Dining Guidelines Announced

Last month, the Club shared the new dining reservations guidelines that will be going into effect this upcoming season. Thoughtful changes were made in an effort to improve the current dining reservations process, decrease cancellations, and address the increased demand for dining at the Club.Ocean Reef's Management Team developed this comprehensive dining plan, which you received in your email last month (also detailed below), after analyzing data from last season and listening to Member feedback. This data showed that the Club experienced record usage last season among Ocean Reef restaurants and amenities across all Member types. The research also revealed a 30% overall reservation cancellation rate. with 40% of those cancellations being within 24 hours or no shows.

With the changes in the new dining reservations plan, along with the expanding of restaurant days/hours and new venues, we are hopeful that Members will have increased opportunity to enjoy the Club's culinary offerings. The Club will begin to implement the following adjustments this October:

Expanded Venues & Hours of Operation:

1. CH Prime will open at 5:30 p.m. Beginning November 2, it will be open five days a week moving to seven days a week in mid-December.

2. CH Prime Private Dining

Room will be available for additional dining if it is not previously booked for a private dinner.

3. CH Lounge will serve small plates, similar to Reef Lounge concept. It will open five days a week beginning October 19, and open seven days a week beginning mid-December.

4. Vine to Table dinners will be held in Carysfort Kitchen opening up dining in CH Prime to Members, seven days a week, beginning in mid-December.

5. Ocean Room dinner menu will include Islander favorites, as well as a Raw Bar and Sushi Bar, along with popular dishes from last season's Ocean Room menu. The Ocean Room, along with the Reef Lounge, will open seven days a week.

Card Sound Road Update Funding for Short-Term Improvements Approved

Earlier this month the Legislative Budget Commission approved \$300,000 for the Card Sound Road project that has been an intense focus of Ocean Reef's Card Sound Road Committee. The funding will be directed to Miami-Dade County by Florida's Department of Transportation (FDOT) to be used during the State's current fiscal year. This means improvements can begin as early as November.

Ocean Reef's Committee is a joint effort committee dedicated to improving the safety of Card Sound Road for all who utilize it. The Committee is co-chaired by Ocean Reef Club's Vice Chairman, **Charlie Johnston** and ORCA Director **Bill Wilson,** and includes ORC President Alex Tonarelli, ORCA President Chip Iglesias, Vice President of Communications Molly Carroll and ORCA Director of Public Safety Juan Perez, along with a state lobbyist contracted to work with the governmental entities.

This past spring, the Committee engaged a countyapproved engineering firm to develop a short-term improvement plan which includes adding signage, reflectors, new striping on the roads and more.

With the strong and necessary support of Florida politicians Representative Jim Mooney and State Senator Ana Maria Rodriguez, the project was one of just two approved for Monroe County.

The Card Sound Road Committee continues to move the plan forward on the long-term and costly strategic replacement of the entire road which spans both Miami-Dade and Monroe County.

The Ocean Reef Card Sound Committee will continue to provide updates on plans, permitting and the projected timeline in upcoming editions of the Ocean Reef Press.

Rules Reminder at Your Club

As Members and Associates prepare to enjoy the active winter season at Ocean Reef, it is important to be reminded of the rules and regulations that govern the Club. These have been set in place to ensure that the cultured family environment is observed and carried forward as both a tradition and an obligation.

Club Management and the Board of Directors want to ensure that everyone has an appreciation and understanding of the Club's rules. You will find amenity-specific handouts around the Club this season along with a general handout that can be picked up at Membership and many of our outlets. Listed below, as the first of an ongoing series, are a few key reminders related to membership and conduct.

Improper Conduct

Any member whose conduct shall be deemed by the Board to be improper or likely to endanger the welfare, safety, harmony or good reputation of the Club or its members, may be reprimanded, fined, suspended or expelled from the Club. The Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes improper conduct or conduct likely to endanger the welfare, safety, harmony or good reputation of the Club or its members.

Members and their guests may not abuse any of the employees, verbally or otherwise. All service employees are under the supervision of the President and no member or guest should reprimand or discipline any employee or send any employee off the Club's facilities for any reason. Any employee not rendering courteous and prompt service should be reported to the President immediately.

Children

Children under 12 years of age are permitted to use the Club's facilities only if accompanied or supervised by an adult, subject to additional limitations set forth in other provisions of these Rules and Regulations. Children under the lawful drinking age are not permitted in any lounge unless accompanied by an adult. Members are responsible for their children when on the Club's facilities.

Guests

A sponsoring member shall be responsible for the conduct of his or her guests. If the manner, deportment or appearance of any guests is deemed to be unsatisfactory, the sponsoring member shall, at the request of the Club cause such guests to leave the Club.

Guests may not use Member cards. Social and Legacy members are not permitted to sponsor day guests and may only sponsor up to three accompanied guests.

Two-visit Rule

No person, other than a house guest, or child of a Club member, as set forth herein in the sections entitled "Guests" and "Children," shall be permitted to visit the Club more than two times in any five year period, with each visit to be limited to a maximum of 14 days, without becoming a member of the Club. This shall be known as the "two visit rule."

Membership Cards

A membership card reflecting an account number and the category of membership shall be issued to the member as well as to his or her immediate family upon payment by the member of the required membership contribution, Capital Contribution (if applicable), and all dues. Membership cards must be presented upon request when signing in for use of the Club's facilities. Membership cards are not transferable.

Social Media Policy

Posting of information relating to the Club on social media sites is permissible so long as nothing is posted which is detrimental to or which would harm the reputation or good will of the Club.

Privacy Policy

Privacy at the Club includes proper deportment at all times by all members and their guests so as to avoid causing any undue notoriety for the Club, and having a continuous mutual respect for the absolute privacy of the Club's members.

Nuisance Policy

In an effort to maintain the peace and quiet enjoyment of the Club and its facilities and in recognition of the expectation of reasonable privacy of members and guests of the Club, no individual shall be permitted to commit any nuisance within the Club.

7. Town Hall Waterside will be open five days a week, Wednesday – Sunday, starting in mid-November.

Dining Reservation Adjustments

1. Equity Members may make all restaurant reservations

14 days in advance, Legacy and Social Members 3 days in advance beginning October 1.

2. Equity Members holiday event reservations open October 3. November 1 opening for Legacy and Social Members.

3. Equity Member Only Nights begin November 14. (All other Members and guests must be accompanied by an Equity Member to dine in the restaurant on that evening.) Monday – Gianni Ristorante Tuesday - Ocean Room Wednesday - CH Prime Thursday – Islander 4. Vine to Table dinners, held January – April, will first be made available to Equity Members in November. Beginning January 5, any available reservations will be open to Legacy and Social Members.

5. Specialty Wine & Spirits Dinners, held January – April, will first be made available to Equity Members. Beginning January 5, any available reservations will be open to Legacy and Social Members.

Updated Cancellation Policy

1. Reservations must be cancelled by midnight the evening prior to the reservation.

2. All dining reservations cancelled on the same day will incur a \$40++ per person cancellation fee, no exceptions. 3. All no-show parties will incur a \$50++ per person charge, no exceptions.

Among other things, this past season proved that Ocean Reef Members love the Club and its restaurants, and they desire to share these pleasures with their friends and family now more than ever. Through the detailed dining reservation policy changes, the Club strives to provide all Members with the greatest opportunity to enjoy its special amenities.

Memberabilia An Eye-Opener

Last season my son Tom Rubin spent several months with me at my home in Ocean Reef. During his stay, Tom walked many miles each day happily exploring Ocean Reef. His enthusiastic accounts of his travels were for me something of an eye-opener. Suspecting that other longtime ORC Members, busy and distracted by all the wonderful activities our Club has to offer, might also enjoy being reminded of the natural beauty of our surroundings, I asked Tom to share his impressions with Ocean Reef Press readers. – JOAN BIRSH

GUEST COLUMN – by Tom Rubin

Until last April, I hadn't spent more than ten days at a time on The Reef. Every year, my wife and two kids and I would make a week-long holiday visit to the lovely home my parents built here in the 1990s. They were amazing visits-we'd play tennis and golf, eat like royalty, and watch the kids grow from toddlers splashing in the lagoon to teens nervously navigating the golf-cart driving test, to young adults who now like to join us for well-garnished OR cocktails in the Reef Lounge.

My takeaway was that Ocean Reef was the perfect vacation spot--great weather, great people, great food, and magical white guest credit cards that made everything seem free (except, of course, to my parents).

But these quick glimpses weren't the full picture. What I (along with many of Ocean Reef's other shorttime residents) didn't have the time to appreciate is that OR is so much more than an Instagram playground. You need to settle in for a spell to appreciate this place for what it truly is: a thriving small town, a fascinating ecosystem, a welcoming home.

I was only able to take the long view after two extended, months-long stays over the last year, first to help my newly



widowed mother cope with her loss, and then to recuperate from a hip replacement. I won't lie: As a lifelong New York City boy and a recent retiree with a travel addiction, I wasn't sure if I could truly adjust to living "leisurely".

But it only took a few days for the gentle rhythms of OR life to seduce me (it helps that the Reef Treats cappuccino is superior to anything Starbucks can whip up). With more time on my hands, I wasn't at the mercy of a manic "one-week-in-paradise" activity schedule. And though I had concerns that living on The Reef might frustrate my innate preference for walking. Says who? I was under surgeon's orders to put my new hip to work, so I forced myself to take longer and longer strolls around streets that for decades I'd been golf-carting through without ever really seeing.

These walks gave me an entirely new perspective on OR's natural beauty. As a visitor, I never really gave The Reef's botanical life much thought beyond the freshness of the mint in my mojito. It was only after living here across the seasons that I got to appreciate the full natural spectacle The Reef offers. Who knew that there were trees here with boughs sleeved in pink blossoms that would make a geisha swoon? And what about that annual riotous carnival of bougainvillea and other tropical flowering plants? Walking a bit farther into some of the Reef's older neighborhoods, I started to notice the incredible variety of orchids hidden in shadows

in most of the yards, not to mention palm trees whose height defied belief.

It was the same with the animal life. We've all caught glimpse of the tiny lizards that are always scurrying away just before you step on them. Now I began to notice their larger, dinosaur-like cousins with their inflatable rainbow chin bladders. Or more than a few basking iguanas, seemingly unperturbed that they had a bounty on their invasive heads. And while you don't see nearly as many unhoused cats on The Reef as in the old days, being a semi-local gave me the chance to become familiar, if not friendly, with a few of them.

But the greatest revelation about OR's green side came when I finally made a few kayak trips through the expanse of the surrounding mangrove forests--something I never seemed to have the time for as a transient visitor. I hadn't realized that within earshot of the Jimmy Buffet tunes playing at the Lagoon, there are mangrove islands filled with scores of nests of the local cormorant colony. Kayaking between the walls of impossibly convoluted mangrove roots is a surreal experienceyou can spend hours drifting in and out of their silent shadowy recesses, an entire alien terrain made out of... plants.

But along with a new appreciation of The Reef's natural life, I began to take notice of The Reef's unique folk culture. For one thing, this is golf cart-based society--what pickups trucks are to Texas, golf carts are to Ocean Reef. There is Golf Cart Trick-or-Treating; Golf Cart Shopping Sprees; Golf Cart Scavenger Hunts (e.g. to find the many wacky mailbox designs, another Reef idiosyncrasy). During the Covid lockdown my parents and their friends kept their sanity by meeting for socially-distanced Golf Cart-tail parties.

And then there are the coconuts. In my walks, I started to notice brightly painted coconuts that were randomly, but deliberately, placed in the unlikeliest locations. Coconuts with abstract designs, or flags, or weird bug-eyed faces found balanced on a fence pole or in the jaws of the crocodile statue off Anchor Drive. To this day no one seems to have a clue where they came from or what they mean, but I hope they aren't scaring all those little kids at The Academy, though most likely they are finding them amusing just like the rest of the OR residents.

One thing I shouldn't have found surprising (but I did nonetheless) is how friendly and kind residents are to visitors and to one another. But being here over time and seeing the same friendliness day-in and day-out, it dawned on me that I wasn't simply enjoying "good service", I was enjoying being part of a true community of OR Members, who like and respect each other, who watch each other's backs.

There's an old joke about the Bostonian who, 30 years after moving to a renovated farmhouse in New Hampshire, finally gets up the nerve to tell his neighbor, a crusty tenthgeneration dairy farmer, that he now considers himself a "local". The old Yankee disagrees: "Just because yuh put a biscuit in the oven doesn't mean yuh'll get a turkey out of it."

Maybe so, but I'm ready to claim that after my own thirty years of knowing Ocean Reef only as a once-a-year visitor, I've found that OR's warmth is enough to turn biscuits into turkeys.

community.


Determine the political offices that can influence those issues.

Florida State Constitutional Amendment Proposals

There are just three on the ballot this year. These represent proposed fundamental law amendments to the Florida State Constitution, and as such should only be thoughtfully amended. Our Steering Committee did our due diligence, explored the pros and cons. Our recommendations represent the consensus and opinions of the committee. the endorsement of federal candidates. With that said, this year our committee concluded it was important to make mention of the efforts by US Congressman Carlos Gimenez and US Senator Marco Rubio, as it relates to their noteworthy efforts in opposing the expansion to civil aviation operations at Homestead Air Reserve Base. In fact, our State Representative Mooney, Congressman Gimenez, and Senator Rubio, all on this midterm ballot, have officially and clearly voiced their opposition as it relates to the threats to the environment and our national security posed by this development.

Monroe County early voting begins on Monday, October 24 and ends on Saturday, November 5 at the Murray Nelson Government Center, 102050 Overseas Highway, Key Largo, open 8:30 am to 5:00 pm. Our November 8 Precinct 33 polling site is now at the College of the Florida Keys, 106040 Overseas Highway, Key Largo. There are several people working to get the voting site moved back on Ocean Reef property by 2024.



We Mourn the Loss John Boll

John Boll, who started his American dream with a wheelbarrow and shovel and built one of the largest manufactured housing companies in the world, died on August 24, 2022. He was surrounded by his loving family in Detroit. He was 93.

All along, Boll tried to build a legacy by living his life for Christ and pointing people toward Him. For anyone who knew him, when Boll said, "Just trust me;" they knew things would get done. He lived life as an adventure and used his time, talents, and resources to glorify God, while trying to engage, empower, and love other people.

While serving in the United States Army, Boll met the love of his life, Marlene Miller, in a serendipitous encounter in Raleigh, NC, in the summer of 1951. She was a beautiful, high-kicking dancer with The Roxyettes, a troupe from the Roxy Theater just off Times Square in New York. She later danced on The Ed Sullivan Show and realized her dream by performing with the Rockettes at Radio City Music Hall.

John and Marlene were married on June 19, 1954. They were a study in contrasts; he a rugged construction worker, as comfortable on a bulldozer as in a boardroom, and she a graceful and elegant dancer by profession, schooled in and appreciative of culture and the arts.

Boll is survived by his wife of 68 years, Marlene (Miller) Boll; his children, John Boll, Jr. (Donna), Lora (Sergio) Mazza and Kristine (Jim) Mestdagh; eight grandchildren, Amanda (Andrei) Sandulescu, Alexandra (Nicklaus) Higgins, Abigail Boll, Anton Boll, Justin (Margot Valladon) Mazza, Giacomo Mazza, Casey Mazza, and JT Mestdagh; and three greatgrandchildren, Lilly Mazza,



Lucy Higgins, and Thea Sandulescu. All of these he loved and touched deeply.

Boll was preceded in death by his parents, Anton and Alberdiena Boll; and two sisters, Weya Alberdiena "Diena" Nelson, and Henderiene "Riene" Wheatley.

Following the American dream that led his parents to leave their native Holland for the United States the day after they were married, Boll built a real estate empire in the most unlikely of ways-by developing and improving manufactured home communities around the country.

Starting with a wheelbarrow and a shovel in the trunk of his powder-blue 1949 Mercury, following his military service, Boll founded Lakeview Excavating Company. In 1964, he launched Chateau Estates, a developer of manufactured housing communities that created more than 100,000 residential home sites consisting of 240 communities in 36 states before selling his company to the State of Washington Pension Fund. He was the first person to take a collection of manufactured housing communities to Wall Street.

Everyone who knew Boll felt his big heart and giving nature. After selling his business, he devoted his life to philanthropy and a life well lived. Active in a number of civic boards, Boll served the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) for many years and was chairman for four years. In 2005, the Boll Family YMCA opened in downtown Detroit, providing educational and athletics opportunities to families in a revitalized urban area. He was a member of Ocean Reef Chapel, Grosse Pointe Memorial Church, and Beaver Creek Chapel. He was also the Honorary Chair of Ocean Reef's New Chapel Committee.

Along with his wife, Boll established the John A. and Marlene L. Boll Foundation. Together they created a legacy that enveloped hard work, pragmatic and honest business practices, beauty, grace, concern for the poor, children, and those who deserve a break, acknowledgement of their faith in a Creator God, and a desire to improve the quality of life for the communities that they loved.

More than anything, Boll enjoyed spending time with his family and hosting friends at his homes in Key Largo; Grosse Pointe Shores, MI, and Beaver Creek, CO. He was an avid sportsman, boater and skier. He brought many people closer to God with the way he lived his life and made them feel like part of his family.

We Mourn the Loss Lucy Fernandez



GEICO and became active in the Washington Junior League and a range of other charitable organizations.



Physical Therapy Department News

The Physical Therapy and Sports Medicine Department is growing again. Along with some interior space modifications, we also welcome Caroline Burke to the Medical Center's physical therapy team. Miguel Gonzalez, PTA, Department Supervisor, states, "Ms. Burke will be handling the departments' administrative duties, which include scheduling, insurance authorizations and referrals. We are also pleased to announce that Adriana Gonzalez, DPT, is working towards certification in the

modality of dry needling. Dry needling is currently offered by Medical Center therapist Meagan Starnes, DPT. This is a technique used to treat pain and movement impairments by targeting trigger points. A trigger point is a taut band of skeletal muscle within a larger muscle group. Trigger points can be tender to the touch. Touching a trigger point may refer pain to other parts of the body.

The certified and trained physical therapist inserts a "dry" needle, one without medication or injection, into areas of the muscle. Dry needling, while it may seem a distant cousin to acupuncture, is a part of modern Western medicine and is supported by research.

Why is a Physical Therapist's Role so Important?

A physical therapist must take a look at the big picture and identify how lack of mobility at one joint may be causing pain elsewhere. Assessing how mobility and stability of the entire body plays a role in a patient's pain or dysfunction. For example, too much pronation at the ankle joint while running may cause lateral knee pain. If just the knee pain was treated, without addressing the cause of the problem, then re-occurrence may happen, or worse, the patient would show no improvement. The Medical Center's team of excellent Physical Therapists treat their patients with a "whole body" approach. Please call 305-367-6702 to schedule a consultation.



Two discount programs are available for drivers with a two-axle vehicle and a good-standing SunPass account:

• Monthly Discount Program: Drivers do not need to sign up for the monthly discount program and will automatically receive a 40 percent rebate on their SunPass account after any calendar month that 28 or more one-way trips are made through the toll.

• **Annual Pass:** The annual pass is for frequent users and allows for unlimited trips through the toll. The fee is \$420 annually and runs from Jan. 1 through Dec. 31, 2023. The annual pass will be available for purchase in December 2022 and January 2023. Additional annual pass program details will be released later this year.



Ocean Reef Yacht Club Cruises Desolation Sound

My husband **Don**, current Commodore of the Ocean Reef Yacht Club (ORYC), and I recently discovered the joys of planning a 17-day experience to entertain and inspire members of ORYC.

Two major events back-toback filled half of August: five days of escapades in Victoria, Canada (eloquently covered in August's Ocean Reef Press), followed by a 12-day cruising expedition into the wilds of Desolation Sound.

The Desolation Sound Flotilla consisted of seven bare-boat charters and two personal vessels. As quickly as the Victoria rendezvous concluded, the crews provisioned their boats and got vessel orientations from the charter company, NWExplorations. Highlights included hiking through fern-carpeted forests, kayaking among rocky islets, fishing for salmon with great success, watching whales



Does Your Driver Have Enough Loft?

Many have often thought that less loft equals more distance. Under perfect circumstances with high swing speeds, this may be correct. What if we add in positive and negative attack angles? What happens when swing speed is slower vs. faster and why does that matter? This week, we will explore the reasons you may be playing the wrong loft in your driver.

SWING TIP

Attack Angle Defined

Attack angle is the up or down movement of the club head at the time of maximum compression. Attack angle is measured relative to the horizon.

Why is Attack Angle Important?

In order for you to optimize your driver, we will need to find the proper loft. Finding the proper loft can change based on what your attack angle is. For example, if you have a positive attack angle, you will need less loft. If you have a negative attack angle you will need more loft.

Comparing the Tour Stars

If Justin Thomas has an attack angle of +4, while Brooks Koepka has an attack angle of -4, they should not use the same loft driver. To accommodate his positive attack angle, Justin uses a 9.5 degree driver allowing him to maximize his distance. Brooks uses 10.5 degrees of loft to compensate for his downward attack angle.

Although Brooks has 10.5 degrees of loft on his driver, his launch angle (angle the golf ball flies off the club) is 9.5. This creates a lower more piercing ball flight. While swinging the driver 121 MPH, he is able to produce 320 yards of total distance.

Meanwhile, Justin Thomas has a 13.7 degree launch angle with very minimal spin on the ball allowing him to hit the ball high, increasing his distance that way. While swinging the club at 117 MPH, he is able to produce 317 yards of total distance.

How is this possible with swing speeds that are 4 MPH different? Loft and attack angle have allowed each of these superstars to maximize their potential.

Better Your Volleys With the Handcuffs Tip

"Tennis Tip" by Ricardo Martin, Assistant Tennis Professional

When you're at the net at ready position (hands in front of the belly button and racquet around your nose height), we want to think as if we have handcuffs on while executing the volleys.

Simply semi-turn right for the forehand volley, and left for the backhand volley and hit the ball maintaining handcuffs distance between your wrists. Keep the swing about a foot long and get back to ready position after contact.

The only motion where the handcuffs would break loose is if you have to hit an overhead, which would require you to take the trophy position. Then get back to ready position.




