Ocean Reef Club Chairman
Ray Larkin opened the first
Town Hall Meeting of the
new season Friday, November
18 with a nod to the historic
anniversary year. "I am thrilled
to say on behalf of our Board,
how honored and privileged we
are to be your Board of Directors
during our 75th anniversary of
Ocean Reef's founding and the
30th anniversary of Member
ownership," said Larkin. "It's a
true honor. Alan Goldstein,
Tom Davidson and Dick

Farmer, beginning in 1992, had the foresight to look at Ocean Reef and say, we should turn this into a private club. Fast forward 30 years, Ocean Reef is the finest private club in the United States, if not the world. So thank you for your vision, thank you for your persistence."

Before moving on to the business portion of the meeting, Larkin went through the agenda, reiterating the commitment to no construction this season, while noting that there is focus on the Club's master plan and the projects being considered for the next 3-5 years, including Associate housing and The Spa expansion. He also shared that the Club will leave no stone unturned in the effort toward improving the Equity Member experience, "So you feel like this is your Club, you are happy and comfortable, and you are able to do what you want when you want to do it."

Member Usage & Satisfaction ORC Vice Chairman Charlie Johnston, who serves as Chair of the Membership Committee, demonstrated that the Club

continues to show strong usage by Equity and Legacy Members, strong demand for Membership overall, and a downward trend in Social Member usage. With the strong desire for Social Membership displayed over the past several years, Johnston announced the Club's decision to freeze the Social Member Waitlist, adding an even greater emphasis on Equity Member satisfaction.

In terms of Member usage and demand, Johnston reported that Equity Memberships have only increased about 147 since 2015.

While Legacy Membership appears to be growing, Johnston reminds everyone that "Legacy Members are our children and grandchildren. They come for holidays, they come for long weekends with their parents and grandparents and they would typically be here anyway even if they didn't have a Legacy Membership, so it's not as if there's a surge of new people coming." The Social Membership category continues to remain at 2,350 since the cap was put in place in 2015.

Johnston also reported that historically, the busiest months of the year are between January and March, and the average of Members here during that time are Equity and Legacy Members, with Social Members actually

Rare Member-Owned Fighters Debut at Vintage Weekend

Jim Slattery and his wife Jane became Ocean Reef Club Equity Members in 2020 when they purchased a home at Ocean Reef, rather than continuing on the Social Member Waitlist – a decision they couldn't possibly be happier with.

"My wife and I absolutely love Ocean Reef," Jim said.
"We first came here for lunch with a Member friend when we were living in Fort Lauderdale and fell in love. The people we've met are fabulous and all of the opportunities... it is just spectacular."

After attending Vintage Weekend last year as a spectator, and enjoying it so much, Jim was inspired to participate this year as an exhibitor, bringing three extremely rare and unique twinengine fighters that have never before been seen at Vintage Weekend – the P-38 Lightning and two F7F Tigercats.

What makes these planes so special is their rarity. Jim owns the only flying P-38 in the world with combat history. He and his restoration team, led by Bill Klairs, President and CEO of the National Museum of WWII

Aviation, literally dug out it out of the ground in New Guinea in the 90s. After an eight-year-long restoration process, Jim's "White 33" is the only flying P-38 restored to as-new condition with a combat history, including seven victories in the Pacific.

The two Tigercats are nearly as rare, with only five or six that still exist in the world. These WWII era planes were created with one mission – to intercept Kamikaze suicide bombers. As Jim describes, "These particular Tigercats were the most sophisticated and the fastest airplanes of their day."

Jim, who is also on the Ocean Reef Airport Committee, has been passionate about aviation for most of his life. "I became a pilot at 16 before I even got my driver's license," he said. "I was always fascinated with flying and back in the early 1980s, I went to Oshkosh for the biggest air show in the US. I got a chance to ride in a warbird and I got hooked.

That's when I began collecting and restoring airplanes. My first was the C-47 transport plane. Each restoration process takes five to seven years with a lot of dedicated manpower. The planes are historical treasures really."

Jim is the Chairman of the Board and main benefactor of the National Museum of World War II Aviation in Colorado Springs. He and his wife currently own at least 50 restored planes, with 28 of them, including the three he's bringing to Vintage Weekend, being displayed in the museum.

Jim's P-38 and two Tigercats are being housed at Wings Over Miami Air Museum while they await their Vintage Weekend debut on Thursday. They are guaranteed to awe from both land and air, when they take flight in Saturday's air show. In fact, Vintage Weekend Chair **Lenny Sikora** sounds like a kid in a candy store when he talks about these planes. His excitement is palpable.

"Jim Slattery is my new best friend," said Lenny. "He is so generous to bring these planes to Vintage Weekend. It's the first time these types of planes have ever been displayed and flown here so this will be a real highlight of the weekend. Needless to say, I'm stoked!"

Despite aviation being Jim's passion, his favorite part of Vintage Weekend is "everything," saying, "You don't get to see such a fine collection of cars very often and I've been a boater all my life, owning many, so the yachts that come in are very exciting as well."

What Chefs Do On Their Summer Vacation

Executive Chef Jared Reardon knows that chefs are creative and need stimulation, so he encourages them to reach out to peers around the globe. The summer breaks are the best opportunity. They study menus, taste preparations, and explore kitchen techniques and vendors. This enriches our culinary experience here at Ocean Reef and improves the quality.

Members can play an important part in the process. Julia and Steve Rushmore bonded with star Sushi Chef Eric Andreu over conversations around the Islander Sushi Bar. The Rushmores invited Eric to visit them in New York City to tour some of their favorite restaurants. Le Bernadin, widely considered the best restaurant in the city, was one of the evenings they got to visit with the chef and enjoyed a fabulous dinner.

On his return to Ocean Reef, Eric regaled his friend and teammate Chef Kareem, Chef de Cuisine of the Islander, with the wonders of the Bernadin kitchen. A few phone calls from Chef Jared and an endorsement from the Rushmores lead to a coveted invitation to a dinner and a chance to work a shift in the Le Bernadin kitchen. Kareem called it the "Chance of a lifetime."

"It was instructive to observe a set-up like the original French Brigade," Kareem said. The Brigade system was developed by Escoffier in the 1800's to bring order to the hectic kitchen at the Savoy. Escoffier delegated the key elements of dinner service to a hierarchy of trained

purpose."

I asked Chef Eric if he uses the Brigade system in the Sushi Bar. "Yes," he quipped, "They tell me what to do and I do it."

Jared took Kareem and Eric to the Japanese Food Show in New York City. They found new products, utensils, and vendors. Eric is ordering a new salmon strain flown in fresh from New Zealand. It is farm-raised in the sea, nurtured by ocean currents and nutrients. He admired the milder taste. Kareem found King Crab from Norway, shipped live. We have the large live tank required to keep it fresh.

After the show Jared took them to a Korean BBQ. "It's pretty close, let's walk," Jared said. Kareem and Eric have a rapid-fire repartee with jabs and smiles. "Chef Jared is a walker," Eric said. "It must have been twenty blocks." "More like fifty blocks," said Kareem. "And Jared has long legs," finished Eric. "It was a forced march."

"We joke, but we always stick together," Eric said. They call themselves "Shake and Bake" after the goofy characters in "Talladega Nights." Bake is portrayed as the dimmer of the two, so I asked which of them is Shake. "I am," they both said at once.

"Don't even start," said Kareem.

Next week Eric will introduce a new dish he is excited about – Pacific Blue Fin Tataki: Blue Fin Tuna, blackened and grilled, citrus soy, heirloom tomato, Vidalia onion, Sashimi Style. Look for it at the Sushi Bar.

chefs. He designated them: The Chef de Cuisine (Chief of the kitchen); Sous Chef (Deputy or "under chief"); Saucier (sauce maker, sauté cook); Rotisseur (roast cook); Poissier (fish cook); Garde Manger (salads and cold food items); and Patissier (desserts and other meal-end treats). The system was widely adopted. We use many of the same terms at Ocean Reef.

Kareem said, "CH Prime is closest to a classic French Brigade. It specializes in fine cuisine. The order tickets come right to Chef de Cuisine, Jonathan Kaiser, and he calls out the order to the cooking staff. The Islander is more "fast casual," but still refined. The tickets go directly to each station, fry, grill, or so on." Kareem was impressed with how the Brigade and ladder system helps develops chefs. "The training system is far more rigorous and demanding. As the cooks work up the ladder, they learn craft, precision, and repetition - good habits from the start," Kareem observed. "They taste each other's prep. It has to be perfect." Kareem concluded he "had to push the boundaries and introduce more new things. Cooks need to be motivated not to become stagnant. I want more satisfaction and clarity of

MEMBERABILIA A Raised Paddle for Pickleball

This sport is here to stay

Members returning to Ocean Reef for the new season are frequently asked —"Are you still playing tennis?" More often than not, the answer is "Yes, but I'm also playing Pickleball."

The Club anticipated that response and over the summer added three pickleball courts. That gives Pickleball, the scrappy little newcomer, nine courts, same number as its older and more established Tennis elder.

And, if you are either a confirmed Pickleball convert or a switch hitter, who carries a Pickleball paddle along with his Tennis racquet, you will be happy to hear that there is now LED lighting on the courts ("so let the night games begin"). There's also a new pickleball professional (Frankie Ngo) at the Tennis Center. Frankie will share the action with returning pro Kevin Girard. And be assured that Justin Romero, the Director of Racquet Sports at the Tennis & Games Center, will keep you in the swing of things with a whole lot of interesting Pickleball programs.

A Little History

When and where did Pickleball start? DATE: 1965. LOCATION: the backyard of Washington State Congressman Joel Pritchard's home on Bainbridge Island (near Seattle).



INSPIRATION: a couple of bored kids on a hot summer's day looking for something to do. SOLUTION: Pritchard and his friend Bill Bell considered badminton on an old, seldom used court that existed on the property. INCENTIVE: When no badminton equipment could be found, the players improvised with ping-pong paddles and a whiffle ball. As the ball bounced on the asphalt, the adults, as well as the children, bounced with excitement at having found a game the whole family could play together.

How did Pickleball get that dopey name?

There are two versions. The one that I prefer is that the game was named for the Prichard's dog, who was fond of chasing the errant shots of the pickleball players.

The second version of the name Pickleball claims that this new game, which is a conglomeration of a couple of different sports (badminton, volleyball, ping pong and tennis), brings to mind the "pickle boat" in Crew, where the oarsmen were chosen from the leftover rowers of other boats.

Who is playing Pickleball?

I got this answer from Kevin Girard, the returning Pickleball Pro at the Tennis & Games Center. In a word it is "everybody".

Kevin, who started at the Tennis & Games Center last year, says he has worked with hundreds of players, and they are all ages and aptitudes. It appeals to everyone from older people in their 70's and 80's to little kids from The Academy. Family Pickleball is very popular and groups visiting Ocean Reef find Pickleball a wonderful diversion. Kevin said they recently had a wedding party of 40. Everybody played, many for the first time.

Do you have to be a tennis player to play pickleball?

There is agreement among the staff that the answer is "no". They all assured me that there are plenty of novices, "who just get out there and play with family or friends".

Kelly Jones, the young woman who won the Ladies Division Member/Guest Championship last year, never held a racquet until her father encouraged her to try Pickleball. On the other hand, Suzy Shields, who has played tennis at Ocean Reef since 1980, found Pickleball five years ago and it was love at first dink.

"Pickleball is more of a social activity," says Suzy. "There's more talk and joking around than you find on a tennis court. And a new player can learn to play in 20 minutes."

What is the all-important dress code for Pickleball?

Last season 31% of the sales at the Pro Shop were for Pickleball clothes and equipment. The only prohibition in the dress code is that unhemmed sleeveless tops for men are a no-no. In my Joan the Shopper guise, I have observed that Pickleball clothes tend to be a little edgier and more fun than traditional tennis attire.

Is Pickleball likely to become an Olympic Sport?

At the rate the sport is growing (21% increase last year) it seems possible that down the road Pickleball could qualify for the Olympics, though keep your paddles crossed – it won't be anytime soon.

Meanwhile there is money in the game. Annual prize money on the PPA (Pickleball Professional Association) circuit has gone from \$500,000 in 2019 to more than \$2.5 million last year. And there is an increasing number of tournaments where amateurs pay an entrance fee to play against their peers. The pros compete for cash prizes and the tour points that determine their national rankings.

How does Pickleball measure up as a Spectator Sport?

Last year I watched the Men's and Women's Finals of the Member/Guest Tournament at the Tennis & Games Center, so I can personally attest to the fact that Pickleball is a nail-biting crowd pleaser.

Because the set is short (2 games out of 3) and each game requires only 11 winning shots, watching a 3-game set of Pickleball gives you the kind of excitement you get from a tiebreaker in tennis.

Even from the sidelines you can understand the attraction of this game. The shots are often dramatic and emphasize skill and strategy rather than power (goodbye to male domination). And Pickleball has that welcome component of fun and joy, which makes each player feel like a winner, regardless of the score.

That's Pickleball! Just another reason to be thankful for Ocean Reef.

Thankful for Past, Present & Future

With Ocean Reef Club celebrating 75 years as a Club and 30 of Member ownership, the theme for this season's All Charities Weekend (ACW), **February 10-12, 2023**, will be "Honoring the Past, Building for the Future."

Roots: All Charities was conceived in 2008 as a fun and effective way to minimize the number of charity events held each season (there were nearly 30 at the time). Since then, the monies raised in conjunction with the annual auction weekends have enabled the Ocean Reef Community Foundation (ORCF) to provide millions of dollars in the form of financial grants with an emphasis on youth, education, community, and health and family services to assist thousands of our neighbors in Key Largo, Homestead and Florida City, as well as to support and strengthen the non-profit entities here on The Reef that are vital to our "unique way of life": the Medical Center, Cultural Center, Academy, Art League, ORCAT and Conservation Association.

The growth has been remarkable. Back in 2009, ORCF awarded 17 grants totaling \$365,000; this past spring, 75

grants totaling \$1,740,000 were awarded – a nearly five-fold increase. Several of those original off-Reef charities continue to receive ORCF support, and through the past decade and a half have been able to multiply the services they offer, and in many cases, ORCF has been able to double or triple the grants awarded. Meanwhile, on The Reef our own non-profits received \$1,320,000 back in 2009. After the 2022 gala, those local nonprofits received \$5,720,000, more than a four-fold increase.

All in all, over 15 years, over \$50 million has been raised and \$14 million passed through to our neighboring communities. As the Foundation's fundraising event, ACW honors the past, and ORCF is grateful that The Reef's generosity makes that possible.

Wings: More recently, the Foundation created a Special Projects/Impact Fund to better support larger scale opportunities in our surrounding communities and respond more quickly in the future to crises like Haitian earthquakes and Hurricane Irma. Additionally, the fund has helped

finance unique projects including the helipad at Baptist Hospital and the College of the Florida Keys Upper Keys Campus.





trending down over the past years. The Club has also ceased large group business during this time, accepting only Member weddings and smaller corporate groups, which mainly eat in banquets and not the restaurants.

To further enhance Equity Member satisfaction, Johnston announced important changes to Social and Legacy Membership. On top of freezing the Waitlist, the Club decided to activate new Social Members from the Waitlist in May instead of January, avoiding an influx of new Members in January. Additionally, all guests of Social and Legacy Members must be accompanied by the sponsoring Member throughout the duration of the guest stay. The maximum number of day guests a Social or Legacy Member may sponsor at any one time has been reduced to six. The two-visit rule still applies, which means sponsored guests may visit twice in a period of five years.

State of the Club

Michael Heaney, Finance Committee Chairman, went on to highlight the successful financial year Ocean Reef has experienced, saying, "The Club is in terrific financial condition with the Ocean Reef Membership being the driving force behind these financial results." Heaney reported the Club benefited most from high usage among restaurants, retail outlets, and most other Ocean Reef services and amenities. Heaney also reported that 2022 should produce record results, with 2021 being the previous record year, and the Club continues to have no debt.

"We recognize this is your money," said Heaney. "It's all of our money collectively as equity holders, and the Board recognizes the fiduciary responsibility to invest this money back into the Club in ways that create greater Member experiences, as well as enhancing the value of our equity. That's exactly what we have done over the past few years with the renovation of the Clubhouse,

the Ocean Room, and Buccaneer Island Lagoon, and it's certainly the game plan going forward."

Overall, Heaney reported that operating results and liquidity remain at historic highs.

Capital Projects & Dining Changes

Club President Alex Tonarelli shared Club Management's three key objectives for this past summer - to complete open projects to avoid disruption in the season, to enhance the Equity Member experience, and to find and train the best Associates.

First, Tonarelli shared the status of the Club projects from the year. The first being the Buccaneer Island Lagoon – a project which began last year with the Club's effort to improve the water quality in the Lagoon. This summer, the focus shifted to beautifying the Lagoon, enhancing the arrival experience, and improving the aesthetics of the road that leads to the Islander.

Next, was the Clubhouse, which opened during the holidays last year to add additional dining seats, but without some of the permanent furniture intended for the space. Now, after this summer, the proper furnishings are in place and the final touches complete, "making it really feel like a Member's Clubhouse."

There are plenty of other ways the Club looked to enhance popular Member spaces this summer, including adding a Putting Lab with "Putt View Technology" at the Academy of Golf, adding three additional Pickleball courts to the Tennis & Games Center, updating the Raw Bar bathrooms, and renovating the Member Dry Cleaning space with the addition of a full-time tailor.

Equity Member Experience

For the next portion of Tonarelli's presentation, the objective he called the most important, he spoke of enhancing the Equity Member experience, starting by thanking those Members who filled out Member surveys. "We read every single survey and we act on each one," he said. "When they're positive, we recognize the Associates you mention. When

there are opportunities to improve, we review those and take action as best we can. We finished this year with a 92% overall Club score. By any measure, this is a very good score that we are proud of. That being said, there were opportunities to improve on from last year – one of those being the dining reservations process. This is where Club Management and the Board focused most of our time, really revamping the dining program and creating additional venues."

Among the changes that came from this analysis, Equity Members can now make dining reservations 14 days out – the number one request from last year - with Legacy and Social Members three days out. Holiday dining and Vine to Table and Specialty Dinner reservations have also been opened for Equity Members only at this time. And the most noteworthy change of all is the addition of Equity Member Only Nights at Gianni. Islander, CH Prime and the Ocean Room - "one easy way for us to give you that opportunity to have the restaurants for yourself."

Another emphasis of the dining policy changes, was to increase the number of available seats per night, giving all Members a greater opportunity to enjoy the dining offerings. "Three new concepts right off the bat is that food is now being served at CH Lounge, we have Mexican cuisine that has opened up at Palm Court Nights, and we've revamped the Ocean Room menu to have some of the best dishes from last season, but more importantly, to have all of the Islander favorite dishes as well as sushi and raw bar items," said Tonarelli.

Additionally, most of the restaurants have added an extra night, with many of them now open seven days a week, totaling an additional 2,400 dining seats on a weekly basis. Nightly seating is up 400 seats from last year. Another change positively impacting the availability of seats is the updated cancellation policy. An analysis of last season showed 30% cancellation rate with 40% of those within 24 hours of the reservation. After shortening

the reservation window and revising the cancellation fee, the Club already sees improvement with a nearly 80% reduction in cancellations year over year.

"I appreciate every Member's support on this," said Tonarelli. "We've worked hard to create this plan. We're going to see where it goes, listen to your feedback, and then make adjustments as we see necessary."

Following the dining discussion. Tonarelli shifted gears to Member Events and the milestone anniversary season that has just begun. The Club has already celebrated traditions like the tennis and pickleball Member-Associate Tournaments, the 50th annual Member-Guest Golf Tournament with a record 106 teams, and Equity Welcome Back with more than 700 Members in attendance, but there is so much more to look forward to, culminating with the April 13-15 anniversary celebration.

Tonarelli also touched on Associate training and the Club's efforts to look for and hire the best full-time and seasonal staff. "One important way of doing this," Tonarelli said, "is through our Associate Season Kick-Off sessions, with the goal of making sure each and every Associate understands all the unique elements of our Club, and ensuring they share in the enthusiasm for a wonderful season ahead. Most importantly, it's a great opportunity for myself and our Leadership Team to help them understand the special relationship between you, our Members, and our Associates. That relationship is the reason so many of our 600+ loyal full-time Associates have been here for, in some case, over 50 years. I'm not sure how many places, clubs or businesses can say they enjoy that kind of loyalty and I thank you because in large part, that's due to you."

In closing, Larkin returned to the stand to introduce and thank the Board of Directors, reiterating how very proud and honored they are to be on the Board for the historic 75/30 anniversary.

Get Ready... Here Come the Holidays

Let's face it, those Thanksgiving recipes tasted so delicious because they are usually high in salt, butter and sugar and it's hard not to overindulge-"Second helping, please?"

Medical Center physician Dr. Carlos Smith offers the following advice: "In between the big events and travel, try to maintain a regular routine as much as possible during the holidays. This should include regular exercise (simply going for a walk has many benefits). Focusing on healthy food choices when you can, will help counter the negative effects from overindulging during holiday events."

People with hypertension



(high blood pressure) should moderate their choices during the Holidays. Avoid the salt and opt for a mimosa instead of a Bloody Mary during a luncheon and resist buying the processed, prepared foods- they have high salt (and usually fat) content. If you do buy prepared foods, check the ingredients and labels for salt, sugar and fat content and, if possible, choose an alternative.

Spending time with family and friends is wonderful- good for the soul. It can likewise

be pretty chaotic and create heightened stress for some individuals, thus, taxing the immune system, raising blood pressure and leaving you fatigued.

Examine your Holiday planning and eliminate stressful or unnecessary activities or chores. Remind yourself to take a break with a solitary walk, a nap or skip a social engagement and recharge.

If you have out of town family or friends coming to visit and they arrive ill or become ill, be proactive and wear a mask. The Medical Center has in-house testing for influenza A & B and COVID-19. Increase sanitizing around the house with antiviral wipes. Lysol and Clorox brands make handy containers with pull -out wipes. Remember to wipe down door, kitchen, bath and refrigerator handlesanywhere that is frequently touched.

In the summer of 1879, John Muir sailed to Alaska in the company of three Presbyterian clergy. They had come to visit a young, green seminary graduate, Samuel Hall Young. Upon meeting, Muir and Young formed an immediate connection that turned into a lasting friendship.

Hall joined the group, and by steamboat, they journeyed south through the inside passage toward Glenora, in British Columbia. The ship docked in Glenora one afternoon, awaiting favorable conditions before sailing a dangerous passage known as the Canyon.

Muir, not one to waste an opportunity, saw a distant crown of peaks in a cirque. He quickly invited Hall to join him on the

climb. When Hall asked how far, Muir estimated some eight-thousand vertical feet, and perhaps ten miles - each way.

Greatness

Hall describes Muir on the climb, celebrating God's greatness in creation. He writes, "So absorbed was he in this amatory botany that he seemed to forget my existence." He described Muir's "spiritual insight into Nature's lore, which is granted only to those who love and woo her in her great outdoor palaces."

Late that afternoon, Muir realized they must rush to make the summit and see the sunset. The summit involved climbing a sheer face, some nine-hundred fifty feet high. With no climbing protection, no coat and wearing hob-nail boots, they went from handhold to handhold until they came within a few feet of the top, only to face a dangerous leap across a precipitous gravel slide.

Muir made the jump effortlessly. Hall did not. His fall left both shoulders separated, and his feet dangling over the edge at the bottom of the slide.

Goodness

What happened next is

extraordinary. Muir made his way to Hall's precarious position. Standing on a narrow ledge, Muir rescued Hall with his teeth! He gripped the man's shirt in his teeth, swinging him out and up until Hall stood next to him on the ledge. Through the long night and bitter cold, Muir, step by precarious step, brought Hall down off the mountain.

Hall writes saying, "My eyes brim with tears even now when I think of his utter self-abandon as he ministered to my infirmities."

A Ministry of Goodness

Few of us will ever experience the in-extremis circumstances confronting Muir and Hall on that mountain in British Columbia. Yet none of us is exempt from the need, at some point in our lives, to have God's goodness extended through the care of another.

Perhaps you remember seeing the name, Team Timothy, in the Ocean Reef Press. To refresh your memory, Team Timothy is an organization coordinated through the Ocean Reef Chapel. It is not the outreach of any one congregation, but rather of the four congregations of the one community of The Chapel and Fellowship Center at Ocean Reef.

Lori Cilley, DO, is the leader and coordinator of Team Timothy. The purpose, Dr. Cilley says, is "To bring the love of God through acts of care." Our mission is to help support the work of the Ocean Reef chaplain in ways that do not require formal training in either religion or counseling.

Team Timothy can provide visitation with a sympathetic ear (including in-hospital), and

practical help with small errands, etc., to the entire Ocean Reef community.

Lori and her husband **Jon** are equity members. Experience has taught them that though we have "A UNIQUE WAY OF LIFE," we are not immune to the very ordinary "slings and arrows" of living.

The demands on a chaplain, she observes, are many and varied. One individual cannot adequately meet the needs of all. Consider that a round trip hospital visit to Baptist Homestead takes a couple of hours, and a trip to Baptist Kendall is a three-hour tour.

That's why there is **Team Timothy.** If you have a need, you can find information about Team Timothy on the chapel website, www.orcchapel.org. Click the Team Timothy tab, where you can make a request for service or help.

Dot.calm: Phone Apps & Cool Websites

What3words



'Dot.calm" by Jane Silverman

Have you ever had to explain to someone where you were? EXACTLY where you were? For instance, let's say in a car stalled on Card Sound Road, in the Bahamas on a boat with its anchor stuck in shark-infested waters, or while abandoning ship in a fire at sea? Too extreme? How about meeting someone at a large beach or a music festival? If you said "yes" to any (or all) of the above (like me), then you should download the free what3words app www.what3words.com.



Meet me at the Beach Grill. I will be at anchoring.schedule.galloping.

The what3words app turns the entire world into a grid of 57 trillion 3-meter squares (that's 10ft squares for you and me); each square on the grid was assigned three unique groupings of words to create a precise geolocation service.

It is such a simple and

ingenious concept: find any location on earth with just three words. Open the app on your phone or computer and tap on any square on the grid to see its designated three-letter word combination. Tap on the arrow in the corner to show exactly where you are or use the search bar to locate any place on earth. Share, navigate to, label, or save the location (click on the circle in the bottom corner to see the map with satellite imagery).

When would you use what3words? It is a great tool to share your location with friends: Buccaneer Island https://w3w.co/magnificence.refuses.fizzy, at the Festival on the Green https://w3w.co/skim.surfer.clicked, the vintage car show https://w3w.co/sitcom.greatness.flinching, or when going for a walk or bike ride. Log the exact spot of the perfect fishing hole, snorkeling site, waterfall on a hike, or even where you parked your golf cart.


This crazy but very cool idea was created by former music

industry tour manager, Chris Sheldrick. This British inventor was tired of equipment, tour buses, and band members showing up at the wrong door or location even with the correct street address and found dictating latitude and longitude coordinates cumbersome.

Today millions of people and thousands of companies in 193 countries are turning to this innovative technology for precise geolocating for drone deliveries, taxi and ride-hailing services, and e-commerce; automakers Jaguar, Land Rover, and Mercedes-Benz, among others, are starting to incorporate this technology into their navigation systems.

What3words also takes the "search" out of "search and rescue"; 911 Emergency Communications Centers across the US are accepting what3words for emergencies, reporting wildfires, and tracking lost kayakers and hikers.

What me worry? Not when I have what3words.

There were some great mysteries added to the Library Collection over the summer. Here are a few of my personal favorites:

"The 6:20 Man" by David Baldacci

Complex layers of twists and turns in the world of corporate conspiracies, corruption and murder





SWING TIP

Green Side Bunker Play

To Hold or To Throw....
That is the Question



by Derek Swoboda, Director of Instruction

When we are in a green side bunker, we are often faced with a high lip which we need to carry. The most important thing to remember from this position is you need to get the ball out and onto the green! How do we attack the green side bunker shot and what should our setup position look like? Some of the best in the world do it all differently regarding their set up but there is one single similarity among them all!

Do Not Hold the Angle

The title of "to hold or to throw" is potentially the most important part of hitting this wonderful bunker shot. We have been told not to cast the club our entire lives, we want the club to dig into the sand, etc.... We are going to completely erase those narratives today and encourage you to cast the golf club in the sand. The most important part of a bunker shot like this is that we get the club head moving fast enough under the ball and through the sand so the leading edge doesn't dig too deep. The loft of the club will take care of the height of the ball coming out of the sand.

Set-Up Position

- 1. Feet should be slightly more wide than shoulder width
- 2. Weight should be on your forward foot
- 3. Hands should feel fairly low to the ground, not upright
- 4. Feet should be square to the target, not open

Once you are set in this position, you are free to swing with the hands as active as possible. The feeling I like to think of on the back swing is how can I make the club feel as light as possible, as early as possible? Another way to say that is to hinge your wrists as early as you can on the back swing.

On the way through the ball, I want to feel as though my club head will pass or

outrace my hands. When this is performed properly you will see a beautiful soft sand shot and the bounce of the club will engage with the sand.

The last thing I will leave you with is to be confident and take a bigger, faster swing than you feel is necessary. The brain wants us to swing slowly and softly when we see the short distance we need to go. The sand will act like a pillow and slows the golf club down through it. Swing freely to a full finish and watch the ball fly out of the bunker with ease!

Don't Forget to Lob!

Have you ever gone out to play a set of doubles with a game plan in mind that did not work as you hoped? Were your opponents dominating the net, but you weren't sure what to do? Lob!

Although lobbing can be difficult in windy weather, no one ever likes playing a lobber! Why you ask? Well, to play a lob back, it

takes more footwork, more patience, and less pace. In the realm of doubles, lobbing can be used to keep your opponents honest and off the net because it forces them out of position and onto the defense.

The best way to put this strategy into practice is to hit the lob over the net player's backhand side. By hitting the ball over their backhand side, it keeps the ball away from everyone's favorite finishing shot, the overhead. Once the lob has been successfully hit over the net player's head, look to move forward to the net and finish the point.




US Coast Guard Auxiliary – 50 Years of Service Award to Boaters

Reminder from the ACBL: Be Scent-sitive!

Some people have an extreme sensitivity to fragrances (colognes or perfumes). Many ACBL clubs, units and districts have adopted policies that prohibit players from wearing fragrances. The ACBL has not issued an official policy on the matter, preferring instead to appeal to the goodwill of its members to refrain from using fragrances.

Because duplicate bridge requires players to be in close proximity to each other, individuals who suffer from fragrance-related reactions cannot avoid those who are wearing them. Among the commonly reported symptoms are intense headaches (indeed, fragrances can frequently be a trigger for migraine sufferers) or breathing-related problems. For these individuals, the issue is much more serious than simply disliking a particular smell — it's a real health problem. Please, if you're going to play in a club, don't wear cologne, perfume or scented lotions.

Bridge Tip of the Week

Cuebids: (Slang Qbid)

By Gregg Van Dyke, Bridge Director

A cuebid is the bid of a suit that is very unlikely to be trump, either because it has been bid by the opponents or because your side has already agreed on trump. There are three types of cuebids:

Cuebids That Promise:

These usually show first (or sometimes second) round control of the suit bid (i.e. the ace or void for first round control and the king or singleton for second round control).

(1S P 3S P 4C) shows first round control of clubs.

(1S P 3S P 4C P 5C) shows second round control of clubs but denies first round control in either hearts or diamonds.

Cuebids That Ask:

Usually looking for a stopper for no trump (1D 2S 3S) or for help in a suit in game.

Try (1S P 2S P 3C,) looking for club help.

General Force:

Usually showing a limit raise or better (1S 2D 3D) or (1D 1S 1NT 2D), which shows limit raise or better in spades.











