### **Back To Basics**

I love Italian food. At least once every 10 days I order the Chicken Parmigiana at Gianni and go home with a satisfied smile. I customize the order slightly by substituting angel hair in pink sauce for the spaghetti marinara pasta. The wait staff and kitchen graciously accommodate me without a raised eyebrow.

Gianni Chef de Cuisine Andrea Rodella says, "We are here to serve. I have learned one thing. If there is a constant pattern of requests, we have every reason to be flexible. I keep three pans ready on the stove to make pink, vodka, or alfredo sauce if that's what would please a Member."

Chef Andrea and Gianni Manager Luca Papini spent every night last season reviewing Members' feedback and suggestions. The initial concept for the Gianni menu was for "elevated Italian." But, many Members were used to more approachable food. Andrea said, "Luca and I worked hand-in-hand talking about improvements." Luca said, "We decided we had to create more recognizable dishes so the Members would know what to expect, more old school Italian."

Over the summer, Chef Andrea returned to his hometown in Italy, Mantova, in Lombardy. He surprised his mother after living several years in America. They toured the local restaurants, "Sometimes multiple places on the same day. Trattorias, basic rustic food. They use the fresh local ingredients – tomato, basil, pasta, mozzarella – simple and not over worked." He said he wished Ocean Reef

Members could enjoy this authentic comfort food. So he brought some of it home.

When Chef returned to Ocean Reef, the kitchen staff tested 30 new items between the seasons, which has led to a greatly expanded Gianni menu. Seven different fresh pastas are made in-house. Recently I tried the Burrata Ravioli with tomato ragu, pistachio, and parmesan. The ragu takes hours to perfect, with five different tomato variants blended to balance the acidity. It was wonderful. Andrea has added Vegetarian Lasagna, which can be "beefed up" with a Bolognese sauce to satisfy meat lovers. He has brought back the popular pan seared veal chop, which was only available intermittently last year. He has introduced Zuppa Di Pesce, an Italian seafood stew. He calls it, "authentic, simple, and approachable. I let the seafood speak." And, Gianni offers "Joe Maiuro Pizza," the All-Charities-Winning-Specialty-Pizza. It features ricotta, truffle, pecorino, parmigiano, basil pesto, confit garlic, oven tomatoes, with poached lobster, shrimp, and scallops. Yikes.

Overall, there are five salads, 10 antipasti small plates, eleven pasta dishes, seven pizza choices, five seafood dishes, and nine chicken, veal, beef, or pork preparations. Comfort food indeed.

Before I finish, I need

to salute the serving staff. "Serving" is almost too demeaning a term. They are ambassadors for the food – knowledgeable, friendly, and efficient – quite a change from my summer experience in New Hampshire where half the restaurants were closed

or on half-week service due to worker shortages. Ocean Reef does a spectacular job of recruiting good people, instilling the Ocean Reef ethic, and imparting the culinary traditions for each particular venue. We are lucky diners. Buon Appetito.

### MAKING HISTORY

## Ocean Room Carries on Club History

The Ocean Room is a true Ocean Reef icon, steeped in decades of Club history having survived hurricanes, fires, and multiple renovations. This dining tradition dates back to December of 1960 when it was known as the Madeira Room. At the time, the new 225-seat dining room was warm, elegant, and named for the stand of mahogany trees originally located on the site that were used for the restaurant's wood paneling and cocktail tables. The Madeira Room had a coral fireplace often home to a roaring fire, and waiters tossed Caesar salad with an egg at the table and served flaming Cherries Jubilee for dessert.

In Ocean Reef's earliest days,

the Madeira Room functioned as not only the primary dining room at The Reef, but the only dining room. (To think the Club now boasts more than 15 restaurants and lounges!). The Madeira Room and neighboring Reef Room bar, known for many years now as Reef Lounge, were

the ultimate social gathering spots for decades.

Fast forward to 2022 and these two classic locations are once again the place to be for music, cocktails, light bites and elegant dinners. Perhaps in the biggest nod to history was last Saturday night's return of the Grand Seafood Buffet, offering incredible displays of stone crabs, caviar, snow crab, sushi boats filled with Member favorites, and even a dedicated oyster bar where they are hand-selected and delivered to vour table. The 1960's Cherries Jubilee has been replaced with specialty Flambé desserts made to order.

If you were to read the front page article of the 1985 Reef Review, pictured here, you'd see the Saturday night Ocean Room Buffet was, even then, considered a "long-standing tradition." Now, 37 years later, the Grand Seafood Buffet is

still an Ocean Reef staple and easily the Club's most treasured dining tradition. On Saturday, December 24, you can again step foot inside the Ocean Room for the next Grand Seafood Buffet, and experience the exquisite blend of tradition and elegant, elevated flair that is synonymous with the modern day Ocean Room.

And, if you have yet to enjoy the new offerings of the Ocean Room nightly dinner menu which includes a few select Islander favorites along with a sushi bar and raw bar, now is the time to make your reservation. Enjoy a step back in time while also indulging in the modern pleasures offered by the Club's talented culinary team.

The menus and décor may change but the history and tradition that prevails in the Ocean Room represents where we've been as a Club, and where we are going.

First, a brief overview of the ongoing benefits of centralizing your giving with a Foundation DAF:

We will roll out the new program next year with some "how-to" educational opportunities. Donors who are more inclined to a full-service, lower-tech approach can continue to have it their way. (Yes, we will still take your gift requests scrawled on the envelope of a snail-mail appeal and research the new charity you heard about for you with pleasure!)

You could say the portal will put our DAF amenities on par with the big commercial providers of DAFs. But considering that they charge fees we don't and can't offer the choice of personalized service or knowledge of our local

philanthropic landscape we do, I'd argue we actually have the advantage.

While the new portal is still in the works, I thought it important information for the community to have when making year-end giving decisions. A named DAF can be opened as late as New Year's Eve in just a few minutes and give you all the time you need to decide how to donate. To

## Hanukkah – A Moment in Time

Tucked away in the Boll Garden of the Chapel and Fellowship Center at Ocean Reef are two symbols of this holiday season - the Menorah and the Creche.

#### **Christmas**

The Creche recalls the birth of the Christ-child, literally from the womb of Israel, through the humility and devotion of a young Jewish woman, Mary from Nazareth. Culturally, no season is more widely observed in our country than Christmas. Not even the bright lights and cheerful sounds of the 'holiday' can completely over-shadow the event that is at the heart of it all – the birth of Christ.

#### Hanukkah

But what is the response if you ask someone about Hanukkah, and the significance of the Menorah? Unless they're familiar with Jewish history and culture, they'll likely admit they really don't have an idea what it's about. Because they share the same space in time, anyone can be forgiven for thinking that Hanukkah is the Jewish alternative to Christmas. Far from it!

Hanukkah is the celebration of a moment in time in the life of the Jewish people. It should matter to all of us, because it is a moment in time that radiates hope in God's faithfulness, even in the darkest of times.

### The History

The roots of Hanukkah are in a place and time, hundreds of years before the birth of Christ. While the names Babylon, Persia, and Greece may be ancient, they are integrally part of the story of God and the Jewish people.

The Babylonians demolished the walls of Jerusalem, and destroyed the first temple. They took the Jews who survived into captivity in Babylon – a period of 70 years, called, the exile. The Jewish prophet Jeremiah wrote to them saying, "Remember the Lord in a distant land, and call to mind Jerusalem." It was never forgotten, and never will be.

The Persian king, Cyrus the Great, returned them to the land, and substantially underwrote the cost of reconstructing the city walls and rebuilding what is known as the second temple.

History has been far from kind to the Jewish people. Yet seen from a distance, God's greater purpose can be discerned in this ancient time of their suffering.

In 175 BC, a Darth Vader like figure, Antiochus IV Epiphanes, invaded the land of Judah. A Seleucid ruler, he sought to force Greek culture on the Jewish people. He confiscated the Torah scrolls, murdered the high priest, brutalized the people, banned the Sabbath, and suppressed observance of the Jewish law.

Most egregious of all, he erected an idol of the Greek 'god' Zeus in the temple, and desecrated it by sacrificing a pig on the altar of incense.

#### **The Hammer**

Judas Maccabeus, aka, the Hammer, led the revolt against the Seleucid Empire. He and his fighters defeated an overwhelming military force. Following their victory, and the cleansing of the temple, it was rededicated in 165 BC.

At the time of the rededication, there was only one day's supply of sacred oil found for lighting the golden, seven-branched Menorah, that stood prominently in the temple. However, miraculously, that supply of oil is said to have lasted for eight days.

### **Recalling the Miracle**

The lights of the Hanukkah Menorah celebrate the miracle that took place in that moment in time, those eight days. The eight lights remind us of the power of hope to shine in the darkest of circumstances in our lives, and in our world. That hope is rooted in the faithfulness of the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob to his people – forever. And through them, the light of God's hope continues to shine, giving hope to the whole world.

The members of Congregation Ocean Reef will be celebrating the lighting of the Menorah each evening of Hannukah at 6 p.m. May those lights engender a greater sense of hope in God's faithfulness in each of our lives at this important time of year.

## Managing Arthritis

In the United States an estimated 58.5 million adults have some type of arthritis. Arthritis is a general term for conditions that affect the joints, tissues around the joint and other connective tissues.

There are more than 100 types of arthritis. The most common form of arthritis is osteoarthritis, occurring mostly in the hands, hips and knees. Other forms include gout, rheumatoid arthritis and lupus. Rheumatoid arthritis and lupus can affect multiple organs and cause widespread symptoms. General symptoms of arthritis are pain, aching, stiffness and swelling in or around the joints, however, specific symptoms can vary depending on the form of arthritis.



Medical Center physician Manuel Torres states; "Osteoarthritis is the wear and tear of your joints and the breaking down of cartilage - sort of like the tread on car tires. This can be prevented with muscle strengthening, flexibility and mobility. Other types of arthritis can be autoimmune related and may require a rheumatology consultation. "

Unfortunately, there is no cure for arthritis and the pain and discomfort can have a negative impact on your mood and quality of life. Learn what type of arthritis you have and whether your joints are damaged. Pay attention to your joints when sitting, standing and during physical activity. Keep your joints moving by daily gentle stretching that moves your joints through their full range of motion. Know your limits and balance activity with rest so you don't overdo it. Frequent repetition of the same movements, like swinging a tennis racquet or golf club, can add to joint pain and swelling.

The holidays frequently involve long periods of car travel. Take periodic breaks from driving and stretch your muscles. Your hips and back will thank you.

Choose the right type of

activities, those that build the muscles around the joints but don't do damage. The Medical Center's Sports Medicine and Physical Therapy department can assist you with an exercise program that works for you.

Consult with your physician if you find yourself using over-the-counter pain relievers regularly without relief or your pain level is changing. Staying ahead of arthritis pain and discomfort, along with lifestyle changes to ease pain, are an important part of managing arthritis.







## Swing Tip of the Week: Chipping

We have a lot of great new technology in the Academy of Golf that everyone should absolutely come and spend some time using. Additionally, we also have some fun new training aids, including one called the Divot Board (pictured here). It is a simple tool made of sequins that shows where the club is hitting the ground.

In chipping, there's one simple thing to remember wherever your head is, that is where the club is going to hit the ground. Here, I've included a few pictures of me using the divot board to show how much of a difference it makes to have your head in the correct position.

The basic, simple set up for chipping is to have your feet closer together. What most people will then tell you, is to make sure that you have a little bit of weight on your left foot. Some people can misinterpret that though by allowing the weight to go left, while their head stays back. If I take a chip shot with that set up, the club will most likely hit the ground behind the golf ball. When I take another chip shot using my similar set up, but this time, allowing my head to move towards the target side of the ball, the club is now able to hit the ground in the correct spot.

# The Treasure of Fisherman's Cove

A combination of natural water flow and man-made dredging created one of the most iconic areas of Ocean Reef. These acres of water are surrounded by 88 residences with docks, all overlooking the cove and its inner island. The key to its success is easy access by water to Pumpkin Creek, Angelfish Creek, Card Sound Intercoastal and the reefs of Key Largo. It is a fragile balance of nature with

man. This balance is being corrupted by unaware boaters.

Cove balance requires NO WAKE. The unnecessary wave action disturbs the coral walls and erodes them from the underside resulting in boulders tumbling into the cove, destroying the shoreline.

Safety is also concern. When leaving the cove by boat, send someone forward to listen first. To prevent collision, a sign is posted, "Narrow passage. Blow horn two long blasts. Slow speed." Sound these blasts



Blast horn 20 feet past the sign.

for two to five seconds and **20 feet PAST the sign** to project the sound outward into the creek - otherwise it is not heard. Sounding too early disturbs the community and is ineffective. When entering from Pumpkin Creek, listen first, then **one loud blast** 

**two to five seconds** directed into the channel before entering. If you hear another boat after entering, use 5 short blasts as a warning. Be sure your horn is loud enough to be heard.

Fisherman's Cove is a treasure - let's keep it that way.

## Pre-match Warmups

One aspect of the game that is often overlooked is your prematch warmup before you play. Make sure that you warmup all of the shots that you plan to hit in the match.

### **Dinking**

Dink back and forth with your partner for at least a minute or so. Keep that ball bouncing in the kitchen. Our touch comes and goes, so make sure you have a good feel with your dinking game before you head to the baseline.

## **Third Shot Drops From the Baseline** Make sure you are confident

with your 3rd shot drops before you begin play. The last thing you want to do is have your first 3rd shot drop of the day be during the match! I recommend getting at least five drops inside the kitchen line on both your forehand and backhand side.

### **Drives From the Baseline**

Hit some hard drives from the baseline with your partner up at the kitchen line. Not only will it help you with your drives, but your partner can practice their volleys on balls that have pace.

### **Volleys**

Stand across from your partner at the kitchen and hit some volleys with pace. This should certainly wake you up while getting your hands ready for the fast paced exchanges.

### **Serves and Returns**

Warm up your serve diagonally with your partner. Have them catch the ball then serve right back to you. After a few good

serves start to return your partners serve back to them concentrating on keeping it deep. Serve and return to both the even and odd sides of the court if you have time.

You want every advantage you can have before you play, so let's make sure we take our pre-match warmup seriously. Get out there and win some matches!

## The Challenge of Staying Fit



"Fitness Focus" by Luis Bracamonte, Director of Fitness & Wellness

Fitness combines several factors, including strength, conditioning, flexibility, mobility, power, agility, and balance. This means that to become fit, we must address several factors. Here is how to develop some of these core factors:

**Strength:** to get stronger, regularly practice lifting moderate to heavy weights. A combination of bodyweight, free weights, and machines are optimal for developing muscular strength. Strength training will increase muscle, bone, joint, and ligament strength and resilience. This makes the body more resistant to injury while increasing the speed

of recovery if injuries do occur. Strength is also the basis for speed, power, balance and agility.

Conditioning: cardiorespiratory conditioning is a marker of how well our heart and lungs work during moderate to high activity. Improving cardio-respiratory conditioning increases our energy levels and desire to be more active, which leads to countless benefits. To improve cardiorespiratory conditioning, focus on developing

aerobic endurance through steady pace exercise and anaerobic endurance through fast-paced strength and conditioning workouts and interval training such as in a cycle, bootcamp or a HIIT class.

Flexibility and Mobility: supple muscles and joints with an optimal range of motion perform better, have greater potential for strength, speed, and power, and are more resilient to injury. Flexibility and mobility are developed through various stretching, massage, specific range of motion exercises, breathing techniques, and overall movement quality. Yoga and Pilates are great ways to work on flexibility and mobility. Booking regular massage and stretching sessions can make a significant difference in our quest to become suppler and decrease

the risk of injuries. **Power:** power is a combination of strength and speed. It is the ability to produce force fast, to be explosive, and overcome resistance in the shortest period of time. Power is an essential quality in almost every sport, including golf and tennis. As we age, we lose power more quickly than we lose strength, making power training an essential factor in our quest to slow down the aging process through fitness. To train power, perform exercises such as medicine ball throws, jumps, fast moderate to heavy lifts, and sprints against resistance, such as pushing a sled.

**Speed and Agility:** speed is the ability to move our body in one direction as fast as possible. Agility is the ability to accelerate,

decelerate and change directions quickly with good form. These two factors benefit greatly from strength training but must be developed separately for the best results. Interval training and multidirectional exercises that work on quickly changing directions are common ways to develop speed and agility. Sports such as pickleball and tennis can improve significantly by becoming more agile.

**Balance:** balance is the ability to control where our bodies are in space. Balance also refers to our ability to regain the desired position after a sudden shift. Essentially, the better our ability to actively and reactively control where our bodies are in space, the fewer chances we have of falling and the greater our ability to perform in sports.

The qualities and skills we can train in a gym are as extensive as our physical potential. When we challenge ourselves to become and stay fit, we embark on a lifetime journey. We are not yet able to stop the aging process, but through fitness, we can keep our bodies strong, flexible, mobile, powerful, fast, agile, well-conditioned, and balanced for as long as we live.

## Bridge Tip of the Week

## Bidding With Interference

Bidding would be a lot easier if the opponents did not interfere. But we know this is not the case. Here are some guidelines when the opponents get in our way:

### After a Suit Overcall

### **Suit Responses:**

If your partner opens and the next opponent overcalls in a suit then 2/1 Game Forcing (including 1NT Forcing) are OFF. We now revert to Standard Bidding:

•New suit at the 1-level promises 4 pieces (6+ points).

- •New suit at the 2-level promises 5 pieces (10+ points).
- •1NT would show a balanced hand with 6-10 HCPs (with stoppers in the opponent's suit)
- •Raise in partner's suit would show 3 card support and 7-10 points
- •Double raise in partner's suit would show 4 card support and 6-9 points
- •Triple raise in partner's suit would show 5 card support and 6-9 points.
- •Cue Bid would show a Limit Raise (11-12) or Better **Examples below:**



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
