The holidays are upon us and 'tis the season for celebrating at The Reef. In anticipation, the Club has been eagerly planning, preparing and perfecting its time-honored events for Members and their families to enjoy during the most magical time of the year.

That being said, 'tis also the season for celebrating history and tradition as the Club enters its 75/30 anniversary year, 75 years as a Club and 30 years of Member ownership. This holiday season itself has a host of offerings that are steeped in tradition, with many of them being enjoyed by Members of all ages for decades, some going all the way back to the Member Club buyout in 1993 and beyond. Below, we acknowledge some of the upcoming holiday happenings that have brought smiles to generations of Members.

Oh What Fun!

Held every year on **December 23rd** (that's today!), Gingerbread Tea has grown to become one of the most popular holiday events since its onset more than 17 years ago, with reservations off the charts every year.

Similarly, Super Bingo has become hugely popular since the inaugural event 12 years ago. What began in Heron Hall (now Carysfort Hall) and moved to Town Hall in 2011, has adapted over the years to the casual, fun golf cart drive-in style that was first introduced in 2020. It's become so popular, the Club added a second Super Bingo to the schedule – the first on the traditional **December 26** date and the second on

December 30.

The Reindeer Run 5K, traditionally held on **December 27**, was introduced to the holiday schedule in 2009. While 140 participants was a fantastic showing for the inaugural event, today's winter fun run sees upward of 400 participants.

Always held the evening of **December 27,** records for the Concert On the Beach go back to 2008 when local artist Kokomo performed. The event as it's known today though took off in 2013, when Michael Cavanaugh became the headliner. Cavanaugh has performed at nearly every

Concert on the Beach since then, and will return again this year.

The family-favorite Toucha-Truck, held annually on **December 28**, saw its debut in 2010. The tried and true model has not wavered, remaining a favorite event for Members to bring their kids and grandkids every year to experience not only the heavy machinery itself, but also meet the operators and see behind the scenes, from crime scene investigators to firefighters and more.

Also this **December 28**, the Street Fair tradition returns! A holiday staple for many years, it's believed ORC Street Fairs were in existence prior to the 1993 Member buyout. Back by popular demand, this year's Winter Wonderland theme will be everything you love about the Club's traditional Street Fairs, enhanced with even

Fish Tales

I am bravely pursuing my effort to branch out from a mere meatand-potatoes guy to a better, well-rounded fish lover. Food therapy. This week was my boldest and most courageous step: I went for the Wolf Fish at CH Prime. Ocean Reef's Executive Chef, Jared Reardon, told me, "This is special. We are the only restaurant in Florida to have access to it. We had to challenge all of our purveyors. It was worth it, you'll see."

So, I googled Wolf Fish. This is one ugly fish. Go ahead, look it up. It's hard to imagine someone ever decided to eat it. But Chef Jonathan Kaiser searched it out for the CH Prime menu this year. "We fly it in fresh from Norway. The Wolf is a bottom fish," Chef Jonathan said. "Its diet is shrimp, scallops, oysters, and clams. The fish has powerful jaws that can crush oyster shells." Remind me not to swim where they feed.

Jonathan adds, "The delicate taste reflects what it eats." So, OK, intriguing.

I assembled a panel of experts for our expedition to CH Prime – **Heather** and **JD Dwight** accompanied Fair **Patricia** and me. This was the Dwights'

first visit to CH Prime. They marveled at the décor and the menu. Our waiter Michael did an excellent tour of the menu choices. Heather decided to confirm my suggestion that the Turbot was a winner. JD and Pat mainly stood in readiness for any sign of jaw crushing. And I intrepidly ordered the Wolf Fish.

It looked good – a crispy brown skin over firm white flesh – and smelled heavenly. It had a sweet taste, somewhat like lobster tail, but moister and more tender. The creamy lobster sauce and asparagus was a perfect accompaniment. Heather tasted a sample and agreed it was wonderful. I think I can safely say I have accomplished my mission...I have discovered a variety of favorite fish dishes to broaden my food enjoyment: Turbot and Wolf Fish (CH Prime), Yellowtail Classic (Islander), Ora King Salmon Oscar (Ocean Room), Lobster Night (Raw Bar), and anything from Chef Eric (Sushi Bar).

None of this new-found pleasure will diminish my love for steak (CH Prime), Chicken Parm (Gianni), Prime Rib (Islander), Mexican (Palm


Anna Lichvar has been working on The Reef since Halloween 1992. Her husband, Stefan, came to Ocean Reef 3 years prior.

children with her in-laws in Slovakia, Anna joined Stefan at The Reef after Hurricane Andrew hit the Keys in 1992. There was a lot of work to be done, and Anna and Stefan were up to the task. Anna did not speak a word of English, but she was willing and able to learn. Kind of like a baptism of fire, she jumped in to tackle any task that was required. The Lichvars saw the opportunity for the American Dream, and they both



embraced it with hard work and sacrifice. Anna traveled back to Slovakia to be with her children during the summer. It was very difficult to leave them for such a stretch of time, but the opportunity to work was here in America, and she knew she must take advantage of it in order to make a better life for her family.

Working behind the scenes was Stefan, who was applying for a Green Card lottery for his immediate young family. In 1995, the Lichvars had to decide whether to come back to the USA or stay in Slovakia. Anna had a teaching job in Slovakia, and the children were nearing school age and a decision was imminent. The Green Card lottery was very difficult. The doctors each family member had to see were in Prague, and lots of palms had to be greased in order to get appointments. The paperwork was endless. Just as they were weighing their options about staying in Slovakia, Stefan received a yellow envelope saying he had won the lottery. "I guess God planned for us to go to America," Anna exclaimed. Finally, the family would be united. After 5 years, both Stefan and Anna became American citizens with their children.

In those days, Associate Staff Housing was available for a family of four. The children were bussed to school in Key Largo while the parents worked. Many young families were in the same boat, and they all helped one another. Anna and Stefan forged some mighty strong and long friendships. Many have lasted these past 27 years.

One season, Stefan's dad came to Florida to help with the kids. This was a dream come true because grandpa took over the care of Simona and Tomas while their parents worked the Ocean Room, Raw Bar, Banquet Dinners, etc. Anna said she would write the orders in English cursive in order to improve her skills.

Around 2000, Stefan left

Ocean Reef to work in the Keys. By 2001, he returned and today, works for the Club as a Banquet Bartender. In 2019, Anna left the Raw Bar, where she had been since 1997, and took a job with Ocean Reef Vacation Rentals. Before long, she realized she missed the interaction with the Members. She missed her "peeps" in the Raw Bar. It was time to get back in the swing of things. She was grateful for the experience at Vacation Rentals, but she knew her heart belonged to the Raw Bar.

"Seeing the grown grandchildren of the grandparents I came to love as my own is so gratifying. Hearing about families I have known for almost 30 years is priceless. That is my favorite part of my job. I am a people person," Anna exclaims.

"My two children, Simona is 33, and works as a Marketing Strategist at Harte Hanks in Philadelphia. She is a graduate of Furman College in South Carolina and presently lives in Ft. Lauderdale. Tomes is 32 and graduated from FIU. He is an IT technician for a hospital in Philadelphia." The proud parents worked tirelessly to give their two children the opportunity of a good education and the ability to lead productive and prosperous lives.

"I am so grateful for all the blessings I've had living and working at Ocean Reef. The people I have met along the way, the families I have come to love as my own, the beautiful landscape and blue skies. I have an amazing view from my 'office'."

Anna has left an indelible trail of "footprints of kindness" in her journey through life. As Members we have benefitted by just knowing her.


(gifts can go anywhere in the nation), we'll do the work and you'll get the credit and consolidated records of all your giving.

If the barrage of donations to our existing charitable funds each December is any indication, this flexibility is needed and very much appreciated well after the fund is established!

2023 will see the addition of a new Donor Portal, which will give our Advised Fund Donors real-time access to information about their funds 24/7 with a secure login via the internet. New features will include the ability to submit grant requests online by choosing from a list of past grants and searching for new IRS-qualified organizations via Candid GuideStar, and seeing the real-time status of gift requests.





A Gift Disguised

My hunch is that most families have unique holiday traditions. For some, it might be how the family gathers to open gifts – everyone wearing matching pajamas. For others it might be a special meal that the family shares only at the holidays. Or perhaps it's a special place where everyone gathers.

When I think back to my childhood, a memorable family tradition was the way our family disguised gifts. Let me explain.

When my dad was serving in the Navy during World War II, his father – my grandad whom we called Papa Shorty – he was tall and slender – bought a small, hometown hardware store. It was known locally as Henley Hardware. My dad and grandad ran the business together.

It was a real hardware store - with electrical supplies, pipe fittings, bolts and nails, barb wire, rope, paint, tools – you name it! You could buy one of something if that's all you needed.

The boxes from the hardware store – the kind that merchandise had been shipped in – they became the source of the disguise.

We would gather on Christmas afternoon at my grandparent's small home on the edge of town. Ten of us, packed into a tiny living room – the five from my family, an aunt, uncle, and cousin, and Papa Shorty and Mamaw.

The Christmas tree stood in the corner by the window that faced the highway. Across the room was a mantlepiece with a fancy clock on top, and a small gas stove instead of a real fireplace. And of course, there were the packages.

As kids bolt boxes quickly became our favorite. It didn't

You see, hidden inside those bolt boxes, stuffed with tissue paper was cold, hard cash – never a lot – but we loved it. We would yell with delight – "I got a bolt box too!" They had us as conditioned as Pavlov's dog!

The adult gifts were where the creative disguises happened.

The size of the box was not a reliable indicator of what was inside. A beautifully wrapped box might be big enough to hold a small pony! But then, there would be boxes inside boxes, like a Russian doll. Finally, as everyone laughed, the treasure inside was discovered – perhaps a watch or small piece of jewelry.

If the size of the box didn't matter, neither did the weight. One Christmas, it took my dad and my uncle both to bring in a gift box! What was on the inside? As best I can recall was a 'hightech,' eight-millimeter movie camera, weighing maybe twelve ounces.

Why so heavy? Someone had lined the bottom of the box with one-inch steel plates weighing ten pounds each.

You never knew what was going to be inside!

Thinking back on those family Christmas gatherings fills me with gratitude and nostalgia. They were simple times, wonderful times. We experienced the closeness of living and working together. So different from many of us today, our family included.

We still laugh about the boxes disguising the gifts. But looking back on it now, I also see that there was something profound about what we did. It was unintentional, but true. It's this.

The greatest gift of all, the gift of God's love at Christmas came disguised – not in a box – but in a baby. By all outward appearances, the gift looked vulnerable, weak, and small. But lying in that manger, in a stable in Bethlehem, was the tiny life of Jesus. Who the infant Jesus was and is – God the Son - is beyond the capacity of human words to adequately convey or human thought to fully comprehend.

His coming into the world, disguised as one of us, is shrouded in mystery. Did his infant eyes still reflect the brightness of the moment of creation? Did his infant mind recall the Word he spoke that brought life into being? As his eyes focused on the tender face of his mother Mary, did he recall the face of God the Father, that only He had ever beheld, from all eternity?

I never thought of those things in my grandparent's home, as year after year we delighted in those disguised gifts at Christmas.

But I do now, and the thoughts fill me with wonder. Maybe you'll think about it this week too. Merry Christmas!

High Blood Pressure & Over-the-Counter Cold Medications

It's cold and flu season and if you have high blood pressure, be sure to check the ingredients and warning labels on over-the-counter remedies. Decongestants cause the most concern for people who have high blood pressure. Decongestants relieve nasal stuffiness by narrowing blood vessels and reducing swelling in the nose. This narrowing can affect other blood vessels as well, which can increase blood pressure.



Avoid over-the-counter cold remedies that contain decongestants such as: pseudoephedrine, ephedrine, phenylephrine, naphazoline and oxymetazoline. Many of these also contain high sodium content, which can also raise blood pressure.

Instead, choose a cold medication designed for people with high blood pressure or talk to your physician about what medications are appropriate for you to relieve cold symptoms.

Helpful Reminder - Cold or Flu?

This simple acronym "FACTS" can help to distinguish between cold and flu symptoms.

•"F" is for fever. Not present in colds but is present in flu and frequently in COVID.

•"A" is for aches. This is another likely sign that your discomfort is flu related. Colds can sometimes make you feel achy; however, flu aches and headache are a symptom that happens with the immediate onset of flu.

•"**C**" is for chills. Chills can be the result of a fever, a sign not associated with colds. The combination of

chills and a fever are signs you need to see a doctor before your condition worsens. Your physician may also wish to rule out COVID exposure.

•"**T**" **is for tired.** Fatigue is more likely a symptom of the flu or COVID.

•"S" is for sneezing. Sneezing is cold associated. Sinus congestion and cough can also be present in COVID. If mucus discharge is thick or colored, it can be indicative of a more severe cold or sinus infection.



In all, Susan Swope's horses brought home nine world titles for 2022. Congratulations!



Protect & Enjoy Our Vital SPAs

Our coral reefs are particularly fragile diverse ecosystems of plants and sea creatures. In the spring of 1960, President Dwight D. Eisenhower proclaimed an area as Key Largo Coral Reef Preserve, then named it Pennekamp in appreciation of the extensive editorial support that Mr. Pennekamp had given in the Miami Herald. The country's first undersea park encompasses over 75 nautical square miles. Florida has the only living coral reef formations in the continental United States. The Park is a permanent

preserve which was created to monitor, control access, and use by all. In 1990 the National Marine Sanctuary enveloped the Park and was expanded to cover 29,000 square miles from Miami to the Tortugas.

Boaters need to be aware of the proper use of the Park water areas. There are

18 Sanctuary Preservation Areas (SPAs) within the Park to protect shallow reefs along the reef tract. SPAs encompass discrete, biologically important areas that help sustain critical marine species and habitats. No anchoring or fishing is allowed. These are marked on all charts and visibly by 30 inch yellow balls on the corners and along the boundaries. Mooring for boaters and divers in the SPA is provided by NOAA who maintains the 30 inch white mooring balls with tethers. To properly moor your boat, slowly approach the mooring upwind and use one line forward in a bridal configuration attached to two forward cleats. Attach the eye side of the line to one cleat and use a boat hook to retrieve the mooring tether. Run the boat line through the mooring tether eye and return it to the opposite forward cleat. Be aware of your stowed forward anchor as it may catch the line or chafe it, so be sure it's clear.

After mooring, if you plan to dive or snorkel, raise your dive flag one foot above the highest part of your vessel so it can be seen from any angle a full 360 degrees around the boat. My recommendation is to always leave one person who can operate the boat or radio on channel 16 if help is needed. If the current suddenly becomes strong, someone is injured, or the mooring breaks and you can't make it back you are in trouble. At least one diver who could not get back to the boat, dies annually in the Keys.

It's a good idea to turn off all non-essential electronics to minimize drain on the batteries while not being used. When you are ready to depart, take down the dive flag and start the engine. Motor forward slowly to release tension on the bridle, then release one side and retrieve the line. Finally motor back away from the mooring and then proceed at slow speed, watching the depth, until you exit the SPA.

CORRECTION

Editor's Note:

In last week's edition, the Ocean Reef Press incorrectly stated the rules about entering Fisherman's Cove from Pumpkin Creek. The corrected passage is as follows:

When leaving the cove by boat, send someone forward to listen first. To prevent collision, a sign is posted, "Narrow passage. Blow horn two long blasts. Slow speed." Sound these blasts for two to five seconds and 20 feet PAST the sign to project the sound outward into the creek - otherwise it is not heard. Sounding too early disturbs the community and is ineffective. When entering from Pumpkin Creek, listen first, then one loud blast two to five seconds directed into the channel before entering. If you hear another boat after entering, use 5 short blasts as a warning. Be sure your horn is loud enough to be heard.

To summarize, when leaving the cove, blow two long blasts, when entering the cove, blow one long blast. That way, other boats can decipher whether you are entering or leaving the cove and can position themselves accordingly.

History of the Card Sound Sailing Club

This past Saturday, the Bull's Eyes of the Card Sound Sailing Club sat quietly on their moorings at Baker Harbor due to weather and sailors' other commitments for the holidays. So, it's time to revisit the history of our sailing club.

The Card Sound Sailing Club (CSSC) was founded in 1967 by Phil Connors and Nelson Jeffress. They, along with a group of other sailors, began racing with eight 14-foot O'Day Javelin centerboard sloops and by the end of the first season, club membership totaled 35 sailors. Of course, as anyone with nautical interests knows, a sailing club needs a burgee and it was Nelson's wife, Ann Jeffress, who took up that task. Racing continued

and the club grew but after several years of racing Javelins, it was determined that a larger, roomier, and stiffer boat would attract more sailors to the club. After some research, attention quickly focused on Cape Cod Shipbuilding's Cape Cod Bull's Eye. By the fall of 1973, nine Cape Cod Bull's Eyes (Bullseyes, as they're colloquially known) were added to the fleet. Both Bull's Eyes and Javelins sailed for several years, but as time went on the Javelin fleet began to shrink as the Bull's Eye fleet grew. By 1984, the Bull's Eyes' popularity amongst the sailors

had seen that fleet grow to 20_{1} while the Javelins had been completely phased out leaving just the Bull's Eye racing at the CSSC. As the years continued and racing grew, off-the-water social events were added, such as our monthly "Hot Dog Day" (started by Alan Goldstein when he was CSSC Commodore in the early 1990s), the weekly "Nooner's" after racing social, and the annual Angler's Club Luncheon. Sunday radiocontrolled model yacht racing on Buccaneer Island Lagoon was also part of the CSSC's activities from 1983-1994, after which it became its own separate entity, the Card Sound Model Yacht Club. In 1989, the CSSC held its first Bullseye National Championship. This five-race regatta was won by CSSC members Eugene Corley and Owen Coon who competed against 20 other Bull's Eyes with sailors from several clubs from around the country. Since then, the Bullseve Nationals have been hosted by the CSSC five times

and all but one of those regattas were won by local crews. Today, the Ann Jeffress' burgee still flies over the CSSC's Baker Harbor facility. Our club numbers around 60 members and 23 Bull's Eyes racing on Saturday mornings with informal "Beer Can" racing beginning in January on Friday afternoons.

We're always looking for new friends to come join the fun! If you're a seasoned sailor or have an interest in sailing, come visit us. We're located at the corner of Sunset Cay Road and Sailboat Harbor Drive. As always, we invite those interested to visit our Baker Harbor facility any Saturday at Noon for "Nooner's." This is where we gather around to hear the days' racing results and discuss the racing action. 

Starting High on the Low Volley



"Tennis Tip" by Alex Henderson, Assistant Tennis Professional

Something I noticed during my amazing first week back at Ocean Reef is that the low volley is the most challenging shot for most of our Cardio and Gameio participants. I get that! This is a shot that requires careful and consistent preparation. Here are three fundamentals to get you started:

1) Use a continental/hammer grip.

2) Create a 90-degree angle between the racket handle and your forearm. This gives you a strong wrist and makes it easier to keep it locked in position. This angle should put your strings above the wrist and above the ball, around chest/shoulder level. Maintain 90 degrees throughout the entirety of the shot.

3) Open the racket head by either angling your palm (on a forehand) or the back of your hand (on a backhand) to the sky. As you bring the racket to the ball, lead with the outside edge of the racket and knife the ball to get backspin and a lower bounce.







One of the best ways to practice your low volley technique is on the backboard. This forces the racket work to be compact because of how little time there is to react. Think how beautifully it will transfer to the backspin chip/ slice approach, which is so effective in doubles. I'm looking forward to seeing you knifing your volleys like the pros. Thank you for making my first week back so special. I'll see you on the courts!



Hit Solid Shots from Fairway Bunkers



'Swing Tip" by Derek Swoboda, Director of Instruction

We have all been there during our rounds of golf.... Driving the golf ball well and we end up in a fairway bunker. How do we hit solid shots out of these situations and what should you do to improve your fairway bunker game?

Step 1: Choose the right club

You MUST choose a club that will easily clear the lip of the bunker you are in. This is vital for advancing the golf ball even if it does not give you the greatest amount of distance. The goal from these situations is to get the ball out cleanly in one shot as far down the fairway as you are safely able to.

Step 2: Wedge the inside of your back foot

When you set up for your shot you should dig in ONLY the inside portion of your back foot. This will help create leverage and allow you to push as you normally would when you hit a shot. The most common challenge in hitting full shots from fairway bunkers is our feet tend to slip when we use the ground simply due to the sand underneath us.

Stand nice and tall and swing away for success out of the next fairway bunker you find.



Bridge Tip of the Week Responding to 1NT with 5-4 in the Majors

When partner opens 1NT, the idea is to see if you have a fit in the Majors. This is done by using Stayman and Jacoby Transfers. But what happens when you have 5-4 in the Majors? This is where a series of bids would show your shape to the NT Opener.

10+ HCPs (Smolen Convention)

With 10 or more points, you want to go to game. Use Stayman first (2⁽¹⁾) to find a 4-card major fit. Then if partner bids a major, simply raise it to the 4-level. If partner denies a major (rebidding 2⁽¹⁾) then use the Smolen Convention to find a 3-card fit with your 5-card major (since partner denied the 4-card major in either of your majors)

Smolen Convention: Used to show partner 5-4 in the Majors and game going values. Start with Stayman. Then if partner denies a 4-card major, jump to the 3-level with the shorter major (which partner does not have). Partner will go to game with a 3-card fit or simply bid 3NT. The idea behind this convention is to have the stronger hand play the hand.

ALERT! – THE 3-LEVEL BID IN THE SMOLEN CONVENTION REQUIRESAN ALERT FROM PARTNER.

When you are 5-5 in the Majors you can use a convention called Weissburger.

Over 1NT you start with 2C which is Stayman. If partner responds with a Major, Great, you have your fit.

However if Partner bids 2D, then you bid 3D which says you are 5-5 in the Majors and partner should bid their 3 card Major.




