Gotta Question?

How can I get my prescriptions without leaving Ocean Reef?

There are a couple extremely convenient ways Members can get their prescriptions without having to leave Ocean Reef.

The first, the Prescription Delivery Program, has been in place for almost 20 years and is administered by the Medical Center and Public Safety. Every Monday through Friday throughout season, a Public Safety officer travels to CVS, Publix and Walgreens to collect the prescriptions of Members in the program. After the prescriptions are brought back to Ocean Reef, they are logged in a system and Members will receive a call the next day to let them know their prescription is ready for pick-up at Public Safety. Prescriptions not picked up within three or four days are transferred to the front desk at the Medical Center where they can be picked up during regular business hours. The number for the Prescription Delivery Service is 305-367-3401.

The second way to get your prescriptions without having to drive into Key Largo or Homestead is by using the Pharmacy at The Reef, which held its grand opening in February of this year. Located on the first floor of the Plaza



Building, Pharmacy at The Reef offers Members an on-property location where they can pick up and drop off prescriptions. The pharmacy also offers over-the-counter as well as compounded medication and provides various other professional pharmaceutical care. The pharmacy team has worked hard to ensure they are on the insurance plans most commonly serving The Reef. The Medical Center can select this pharmacy just like they would any other and send the e-prescription down the street versus to Key Largo. Pharmacy at The Reef is open Mondays through Fridays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., closed Sunday. Their phone number is 305-780-7136.

Holiday Taste Treats

I hope you have experienced most of these culinary delights, but if not, I don't

want you to overlook them. Last night I had two first-time taste treats at the Islander. First, I finally got around to trying Executive Sushi Chef Eric's new Sashimi "Blackened Blue Fin Tataki" -- Blue Fin Tuna, blackened and grilled, citrus soy, heirloom tomato, Vidalia onion, sashimi style. What was I waiting for? Look for it at the Sushi Bar, it's wonderful. And

Kareem offered a new (to me) special version of yellowtail snapper – buttermilk fried yellowtail, with jasmine rice and Asian slaw. I loved it.

At the Ocean Room, you can't go wrong with the Ora King Salmon Oscar -- King Crab meat, green and white asparagus, tomato confit, hollandaise. It's a wow.

Fair Patricia and I both enjoyed the Margarita cocktail at Palm Court Nights Cantina - straight up, no salt, with a Grand Marnier floater. It was ice cold and delicious. I usually don't make it to dessert, because I linger over my dinner so long. But the Cantina desserts are outof-this-world. The Churros, impossibly light and crispy, covered with cinnamon and chocolate sauce, are ethereal. The Tarta Plantano Con Dulce de Leche is a walnut crusted banana cream pie that will make you come back.

CH Prime is filled with

treats, but we always look forward to starting with the Parker House rolls. They are created in-house, sprinkled with sea salt, and accompanied by Bordier French butter. They come piping hot in a copper pan. No need to order them, they come with every dinner. Enchanting. CH Prime is famous for their silky potato puree (though they do offer baked potatoes upon request), but I have also liked the Loaded Fingerling Potatoes with crisp bacon bits, Tillamook Cheddar, and green onion. It only needs a glob of sour cream to make it perfect.

Out in the CH Lounge, we have made a number of visits to the lite bites menu. Two of the stand-outs are the Foie Gras Torchon, a mold of fresh foie gras pate, rolled in chopped pistachios, served with brioche and quince jelly. My mouth waters to think of it. And, the crispy Asian

chicken, covered with sesame seeds, orange soy glaze, and Asian slaw. There is more than enough for two.

At Gianni, Patricia got the Vegetarian Lasagna, wondering if a dose of Bolognese sauce would really make it taste like a meat lasagna...it did! And it was large enough for two more lunches at home. It's nice to finally have a baked pasta option. I also got a rave review from frequent dinner companion **Penny** Cunningham for the Veal Scaloppine. Speaking of veal, Patricia brought home a beautiful veal rib chop from Wynn's and broiled it to perfection. So much food, so little time. I am a lucky man. With the variety and number of delights like these, your holidays are sure to be happy.

MAKING HISTORY

How We Got Here

A brisk breeze threatened to blow off the hats of Joe McDonald and Frank Stoneman as they snipped the ribbon on the 2,800-foot Card Sound bridge opening the first road access to the Keys from the South Florida mainland. It was January 25, 1928. The bridge was made of wood and



employed a mechanical section in the middle that swung to the side to allow for boat traffic.

Stoneman, the first editor of the Miami Herald, whose daughter was Marjory Stoneman Douglas, and McDonald, who was Henry Flagler's right-hand man, were original members of the Miami Club, a group of businessmen whose purpose was to promote Miami as a business location and also as a tourist destination. The bridge would give access to fertile fishing and recreational areas and further the desirability of living in South Florida. (Effectively, they were a modern Chamber of Commerce). Prior to this bridge, automotive access was primarily by ferry.

This bridge was not the first attempt, however, because the original bridge was started in 1920. When it was nearly completed in 1926, a major hurricane called 'The Great Miami Hurricane' seriously damaged the low-slung structure which had only a five-foot clearance over the water. The new design featured a nine-foot clearance and proved effective for the next 20 years.

During the 1940s the importance of the bridge began to diminish. In 1941, a pipeline was installed along the old Flagler railroad right-of-way to assure a good water supply to the Naval Base in Key West. A new road was constructed the next year over this same right-of-way and US1 was rerouted causing the usage of the Card Sound bridge to drop dramatically. The

wooden bridge had become oil soaked through the years and in 1944, a fire caused considerable damage compounded by a 1947 hurricane. In 1947, the Bridge was closed permanently and partially removed as were the other bridges across Steamboat, Tubby's and Mosquito Creeks. If you navigate through Steamboat Creek between Barnes Sound and Card Sound, evidence of the old bridge still exists (beware).

In the ensuing years, several different ideas for another bridge were formulated. The southernmost point of the mainland of the United States is Cape Sable and one proposal was to build a 22-mile bridge connecting Cape Sable to No Name Key just west of Marathon. The creation of the Everglades National Park nixed the idea. Then a monorail concept from Miami through Cape Sable to Key West met the same demise. Possibly the most interesting proposal was to connect Biscayne Bay to Northern Key Largo through Elliott Key. The plan was called 'Islandia' and named after a small community then on Elliott Key. After moving the land demarcation point near Turkey Point, this plan failed - partially because Monroe and Dade counties could not agree on the sharing of toll revenues.

One part of the 'Islandia' plan survived, the 65-foot causeway over Card Sound we now enjoy. The Capeletti Brothers, Inc. completed the work for \$1.95 million and bridge tolls were collected to repay the bonds. Opened for traffic in 1969, the graceful bridge is crossed by more than 3,500 vehicles per day.

Additionally, if the specific restaurant and time are not available, the system will show you other available reservations on that same date.

For example, if you request a 6:30 p.m. reservation at the Islander, but that time is not available, the system will tell you what time(s) are available. So your 6:30 p.m. reservation may not be available, but a 6 p.m. or 7 p.m. reservation

might be. Additionally, it lets you know whether Gianni, Ocean Room or CH Prime have reservations available around your requested time.

Accessing online dining reservations:

- **1.** Visit oceanreef.com and log in to the Members' side of the website.
- **2.** Go to "Quick Links" and select "Dining".
- **3**. Find the restaurant you want to make a reservation for Islander, Gianni Ristorante, Ocean Room or CH Prime and click "Reservations" underneath it.
- **4.** Select the desired date, number of guests, and desired time.
- **5.** You will now see the available reservations at all four restaurants around your desired time.
- **6.** Select one, input your information, and press "Book Reservation".
- 7. You're done!


Film Society: Food & Film



Black-eyed Peas, Anyone?

Hope you had a great Christmas, wherever you were. For me, Christmas Eve this year is one for the memories. The reason? If you were not at Ocean Reef, the temperature at nine o'clock in the evening was fifty degrees – 'brutally cold' by Keys standards.

I didn't personally witness any iguanas falling out of trees. But I'm sure they did. (And if they did, it brings the old philosophical conundrum to mind. If an iguana falls out of a tree, and no one is there to hear it, did it make a sound?) Speaking of iguanas, my friends encountered one they claimed was six feet long. It had taken refuge from the cold in the warmth of their kitchen! Public Safety bravely came to the rescue!

What I did witness at the Christmas Eve service in the Fishing Village, were more blankets and heavy coats than I knew existed at the Club. But not even the 'brutally cold' winter weather could dampen the spirits of those who came to join in the celebration of Christ's birth.

Now it's time to turn our focus to the New Year, soon to arrive. Besides watching the ball drop at Times Square, I'm sure those of you from different parts of the country have some unique New Year's traditions.

If you're like me, a native of Texas, our family observed an old Southern tradition - eating black-eyed peas on New Year's Day. A healthy portion was supposed to ensure "good luck" and prosperity for you in the coming year.

Thinking back, I began to wonder about the roots of this tradition. It turns out, for starters, that a 'black-eyed pea' is not actually a pea at all! It's a bean in the cowpea family! Ask yourself, "How can you put your trust in a pea, that's not a pea, to be the source of 'good luck' in the new year?" Talk about shaky foundations!

Historians tell us blackeyed peas made the journey to Americas on slave ships. This bean was brought from West Africa to feed the slaves on the long, tortuous journey across the ocean in the inhuman conditions of the hold of a ship. These victims of injustice probably didn't think about "good luck" and prosperity when eating them in those conditions.

During the Civil War, The Union Army would raid the Confederate Army's food supplies. The men in blue took everything that they considered edible from the

boys in gray, except – you guessed it – black-eyed peas.

The Confederate Army had to eat whatever they could find. They ate the beans out of necessity. African American slaves purportedly ate black-eyed peas when the Emancipation Proclamation became effective on January 1, 1863. Talk about reversal of fortunes!

Based on years of personal observation, anecdotal evidence at best, I would say that there is absolutely no correlation between eating black-eyed peas on New Year's Day and "good luck" or prosperity.

The same goes for any number of our superstitious behaviors. Superstitious behaviors are "ways people think they can control their fate by performing certain tasks in a certain way to either help alleviate anxiety or to simply better their chances in a certain situation."

You know, Friday the

13th, crossing your fingers, knocking on wood, no bananas on fishing boats — wait, wait, wait — forget the last one! Don't ever do it!

Seriously, I do wish you a prosperous, flourishing New Year. But rather than trusting in any superstitious behavior, let me encourage you to consider putting your trust in these words of wisdom from the Book of Proverbs.

Trust in the Lord with all your beart and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight.

Those words from the Hebrew Scriptures of the First Testament have a proven track-record of being trustworthy, because the Lord, of whom they speak, is faithful to his promises, in every way.

I think I'll have a dose of Proverbs and skip the blackeyed peas. I hope you'll consider the same. Happy New Year.



NEWS FROM THE MEDICAL CENTER

Allergic Reactions

A food allergy is an abnormal reaction to certain foods caused by your body's immune system. Foods such as milk, eggs, nuts, shellfish and soy are the most common triggers for an allergic reaction, however, many other foods can be a trigger. Other allergic reactions can be caused by insect stings, a newly prescribed medication or a nutritional supplement.

Signs and Symptoms

Symptoms can differ from person to person and may begin within minutes or an hour or more later. Typical symptoms include hives, itching, skin flushing, swelling of the lips and mouth, throat tightness, or

voice hoarseness. Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, or cramping can also be symptoms.

Anaphylaxis is the most severe allergic reaction and is life-threatening. These symptoms can include the above but also involve difficulty breathing, wheezing, and feeling as if the tongue is swelling and the throat is closing. Severe allergic reactions are an emergency and require calling 911 right away.

Emergency Help - Don't Delay

When allergic reactions, such as the above take place, dial 911. Tell the 911 call taker that you are at Ocean Reef and describe the problem. It is not recommended that you transport the individual experiencing the allergic reaction to either Public Safety or to the Medical




Center by golf cart or motor vehicle, as this will generally delay emergency care. Ocean Reef Firefighter-Paramedics are trained and equipped to treat severe allergic reactions and will transport to an emergency medical facility when necessary.

Many individuals who are aware of their allergic reactions to either food, insect stings, or other triggers carry an Epi-pen, which does require a physician's prescription. Epi-pen prescriptions can be filled at the Pharmacy at The Reef or any of the Key Largo pharmacies.

Dr. Rene Fernandez, Medical Director of the Medical Center, states the following, "Keep in mind that the use of an Epi-Pen may afford someone only a short window of effect and use of this device almost always merits further evaluation and monitoring -- EMS being the best solution for serious allergy reactions as they have specific protocols and supplies to safely handle these issues and escalate management if needed."







"One Italian Summer" by Rebecca Serle –





This French champagne is a big award winner. It obviously has Micah's vote and that is significant since Micah is just two examinations



away from becoming a Master Sommelier, the highest level of achievement in the wine world. Traffic Road Study CR 905/ **US1 Junction** 16-23 January

Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is conducting a traffic study using road counters and video to determine the root cause of the long backups on the Southbound CR905 where it ends and merges with Southbound US1. During the busy Keys Season, legendry backups at this junction have regularly been up to 4 miles and 40 minutes, impacting local, visitor, and business traffic into Key Largo.

The former County Commissioner implemented a stop-gap change preventing traffic to short cut around the junction and exit through the neighborhoods by closing Loquat Road. Though this did prevent Southbound Traffic from entering the neighborhood, it had a traumatic effect on the local businesses, cutting their revenue by up to 50%. In addition, new delivery and safety concerns surfaced as closure further aggravated the backup delays on CR905. The Commissioner's untimely death resulted in no planned alternative corrective action until now.

Our new County Commissioner, Holly Raschein, has taken up the lead. She has collected almost 300 protest letters to utilize

the existing fully functional traffic light at the CR905/ US1 junction during high traffic times. All this takes is FDOT adjustment to the existing programming. Loquat Road will be reopened (temporarily) to complete the traffic and

alternatives analysis. Thanks to the Commissioner for coordinating the State and County resources for this effort.





Jones has managed all aspects of Golf Shop merchandising since she joined the Club in 2020.



Reading The Grain

Playing golf in South Florida presents a different set of challenges than we see in the northern states. Chipping and pitching the ball from around the greens can get sticky....literally. How do you read the grain and what do we do in different situations on the golf course? How do you tell what the grain is doing?

Feel the Grain in Your Practice Swing

The easiest way to know what the grain is doing is by taking a practice swing and hitting the ground when doing so. If the grass feels smooth and easy to get through, there are no worries and your shot should be simple and straight forward. If you feel the grass grab the club or the club sticks into the ground a little bit, you may want to take less loft and open the club face.

Taking less loft and opening the club face is a great way to expose the bounce of the club. In an effort to escape the digging of the club into the grass, you will need to let the bottom of the club hit the ground instead of the leading edge.

Why Take Less Loft?

When you open the club face, you will add loft back to the club and the ball will go higher and shorter. Due to this, we will need to use the club with a lesser amount of loft so we can get the ball to our target simply.

Can You See the Grain?

Always look for darker vs lighter shades of grass. The easiest way to know where the grain is, is to hit the ground near your ball in a



VHF Radio-Lifeline for Your Passengers & You

One of the most critical safe boating tools on board is your VHF radio. As captain, you should not be using a cell phone. Put it aside. Use your VHF radio. Proper use of the VHF can be found at https://navcen.uscg.gov/radio-information-for-boaters.

VHF radios operate above the top end of the conventional FM radio band. VHF radios have been used ubiquitously by police, fire and other public safety agencies since the 1930s. As an engineer for Motorola, I enjoyed the opportunity to design both

transmitters and receivers from the components to systems. Your onboard radio operates the same way on most channels with one critical exception. This is Digital Selective Calling (DSC) exclusively on channel 70.

DSC was added to marine radios in 1992. All radios built after 1999 have DSC capability. Extensive use of digital signal processing and GPS was made possible by the semiconductor advances in computing power in the 1980s and further advanced for cell phones. The improvement made by this technology is coding and redundancy significantly extending the usable range more



than 3 to 5 times. While no one may hear you on the radio, everyone is repeatedly sent the digital distress signal until its acknowledged. All you need to do is **open the little red door** and push the button firmly once. Most newer radios also have built in GPS and will display if the MMSI has been entered. If your radio and handheld do not have a DSC – get a new one.

Encoded in the DSC signal is your GPS position, identity, description of your vessel and emergency contact information that you entered when you obtained your unique 9 digit number and entered it into the radio. Numbers can be obtained on the web: https://www.boatus.com/MMSI/MMSI/ObtainMMSI. If you need help, get in touch with any of our ORC Coast

Guard Auxiliarists and we will also do a Vessel Safety Check. For convenience, use your phone address book contacts to store under your boat name, state registration numbers, all your MMSI numbers, friends' MMSI numbers and Coast Guard MMSI test as individual phone numbers.

To test to see if the DSC feature is working, do not test **the red distress** button as this will send out an illegal false alarm. Instead, you may run a test call to the Coast Guard MMSI number, 003669999. Enter this number into your radio's calling memory and select the "Test Call" option from the radio's list of individual DSC calls, then press the "call" or "enter" key. Your radio will hail the Coast Guard. If everything is working, your radio will receive the Coast Guard's acknowledgement. You may also test by hailing a friend's MMSI number.

DSC MMSI is better than 911 as it operates with one button push and sends critical information to all vessels within range automatically.




History of the Bull's Eye

With the holidays upon us, the weather outside has indeed been frightful.... well, for the Florida Keys anyway! Unfortunately, these conditions have kept Card Sound Sailing Club's fleet of classic sailboats moored at their dock in Baker Harbor. But, normally, we race on the waters of Card Sound almost every weekend through the beginning of April. As there are no racing results to report on with the cancellation of Christmas Eve's Wreath Cup race, and since I gave you a history of our club last weekend, it seems appropriate to now give you a brief history our classic racing sailboats.

The origins of the boats we race, the Bull's Eye, go all the way back to 1914. The

hull was originally designed by Capt. Nathanael Greene Herreshoff, "The Wizard of Bristol." This design, officially known as the Herreshoff Bull's Eye, was penned as a wooden, gaff or Marconi rigged, open cockpit sailboat with a waterline length of 12 ½ feet and through transom tiller placement. It was that waterline length which gave the boat the nickname for which it is best known. "12 ½". For many years the design remained the same. but in 1938 the Herreshoff Bull's Eye adopted some design tweaks and the tiller placement was moved above the transom. Owing to these changes, this boat became known as the Fisher's Island Sound Bull's Eye. But change again was in the air for the Bull's Eye when in 1947 Cape Cod Shipbuilding (CCSB) purchased the design for the Bull's Eye, among others, from Herreshoff Manufacturing. As one of the early pioneers

"Capt. Nat's" eldest son Sidney, designed a new boat based on the original 12 ½ design. This new boat's hull was essentially the same as the original Herreshoff Bull's Eye but was given a new deck design that added a cuddy, and the original wooden spars were changed to more modern aluminum spars. Also, this new boat was offered only in the Marconi-rig configuration. Subsequently, in 1949 the first fiberglass 12 ½ derivative was born and was dubbed the Cape Cod Bull's Eye. Apart from a few design updates in the intervening years that did not involve anything to do with the hull design or shape, the

Brief History of the CSMYC

Sailing has been a long-time activity at Ocean Reef Club. Whether it be physically on the water over on Card Sound in a Cape Cod Bull's Eye or standing on the lagoon shores of Buccaneer Island racing a radio-controlled sailboat, passionate sailor/members have enjoyed the competition and camaraderie that sailboat racing affords. Since the calendar provided us with Christmas and New Year's Day on Sundays this year, radio-controlled racing is on hold until January 8. In the meantime, here is a brief history of our radio-controlled racing

club here at Ocean Reef.

For 40 years, the Card Sound Model Yacht Club (CSMYC) has offered Ocean Reef Members a fun way to enjoy the passion of sailing without ever setting foot in a boat. Beginning as an activity of the Card Sound Sailing Club (CSSC) in 1983, radio-controlled sailboat racing allowed sailors an entirely different way to experience their passion in the protected waters of the pond behind Fairway Lakes. In time, radio-

controlled sailing moved to the Buccaneer Island Lagoon (also known to us as "The Pond"), which offered a larger venue for the quickly growing fleet. Racing thrived on the Pond through the 1980's and part of the 1990's. Frequently, during that time, the number of sailors who would show up to race would be so great that the fleet would be split in two. There would simply be too many boats to race at one time so there would be double the number of races for the spectators to marvel at. In 1994, the sailors of the radio-controlled fleet formed their own club, the CSMYC, and separated from the CSSC. While the split was a bit acrimonious at the time, the current membership of the CSMYC is almost entirely comprised of current and former CSSC members. Any lingering acrimony has long since been consigned to the history books. We are still racing on the Pond on Sunday mornings to this day.

But the history of radiocontrolled sailboat racing at Ocean Reef does not end there. Our Ocean Reef Press article in next week's issue is devoted to the history of the model yacht that we race, the East Coast 12 Meter.

The Card Sound Model Yacht Club races every Sunday (except Easter Sunday and New Year's Day) from December until the end of April at "the Pond." So, swing by the Buccaneer Island lagoon in the New Year if you are curious and have questions. Our sailors are always willing to discuss our racing sailboats and, for interested sailors, there are even a few currently available for sale here at The Reef. Reminder from the ACBL: Be Scent-sitive!

Some people have an extreme sensitivity to fragrances

(colognes or perfumes). Many ACBL clubs, units and districts have adopted policies that prohibit players from wearing fragrances. The ACBL has not issued an official policy on the matter, preferring instead to appeal to the goodwill of its members to refrain from using fragrances.

Because duplicate bridge requires players to be in close proximity to each other, individuals who suffer from fragrance-related reactions cannot avoid those who are wearing them. Among the commonly reported symptoms are intense headaches (indeed, fragrances can frequently be a trigger for migraine sufferers) or breathing-related problems. For these individuals, the issue is much more serious than simply disliking a particular smell — it's a real health problem. Please, if you're going to play in a club, don't wear cologne, perfume or scented lotions.

Bridge Tip of the Week

Passive Opening Leads

In other situations, you'll want to be more patient and make declarer work for all his tricks. Your goal on these hands is to make a safe opening lead that won't give declarer a "cheap" or undeserved trick.

A safe lead may also be an attacking combination -- such as a suit headed by AK, KQJ or QJ10 -- and these are usually good choices for a lead to any contract. If you aren't dealt these easy holdings, you'll sometimes have to select a passive lead. Passive leads include:

- A lead from a topless suit (such as 8762), especially one in which you don't expect partner to hold an honor. When in doubt, lead through strength by choosing a suit dummy (rather than declarer) has bid.
- A lead from length -- such as fourth best from Q9653 or K87432. Even though underleading an honor is standard to a notrump contract, it can be risky against a suit contract. Length, however, gives you a margin of safety. The longer your suit, the less likely it will be that declarer needs to develop his own tricks in that

suit.

• A trump, in some cases.

How do you know when a passive lead is your best choice? Here are some of the contracts and types of auctions that call for a safe, non-attacking opening lead: **The opponents are in 6NT or a grand slam.**

An exception is if the opponents bid 6NT after an auction that suggests that their main source of tricks will be a long suit. In this case, you may want to make an aggressive opening lead (away from an honor) to try to set up a trick you can cash if you get the lead later.

The auction tells you that declarer has a strong hand and dummy (and/or partner) will be very weak.

Suppose your RHO opens 2NT (20-22 pts.) and LHO raises to 3NT. What's your lead from ♠986 ♥AQ62 ◆ KQ43♣ Q6?

If you follow the "fourth from longest and strongest" rule, you'd choose the ♥2 or the ◆ 3. But with almost all the outstanding honors on your right, either of these leads has a high risk of giving declarer a gift. Partner can't hold more than 2-3 high-card points, so it's not a good idea to count on him for help in a specific suit.

A more attractive choice is a passive \$\hfrac{\lambda}{2}\$9. This is unlikely to set up tricks for your side, but it probably won't help declarer. You'll be on lead

again soon, and if your spade lead was indeed safe, you should consider continuing the suit. If a switch is necessary, you'll have a better idea of which suit to choose later.

Note that you should not lead a diamond honor. A diamond will probably be right only when partner has the ♦ J (or the unlikely ♦ A), so if you do choose a diamond lead, it's better to lead low (the ♦ 3). If partner has no honors (declarer and dummy have any combination of the (VA, J, 10 and 9), leading the • K will give declarer three eventual tricks. If you instead lead low, declarer can't take more than two tricks in the suit.

You're defending a suit contract where the opponents are fairly balanced.

On these hands, declarer will usually have to play the side suits himself, so it's best to sit back and wait for your tricks.

Suppose you're on lead as South holding ♠Q74 ♥ 5 ♦ 108432)

Club) KJ64 after this auction:

West East

2NT* 4H *(Jacoby 2NT, forcing heart raise)

The opponents have shown game-level strength and their hands rate to be semibalanced. Opener's 4H rebid showed a minimum with no singleton, and responder might have chosen a different way to raise hearts if he had a very distributional hand. You expect that declarer will have to lead the side suits himself, so you want to avoid leading any suit that will make it easier for him to find missing honors.

The singleton trump is probably the most dangerous lead (partners always seem to hold ♥Qxx). It's also risky to lead away from your club or spade honors. That leaves your "nothing" suit -- diamonds -- so try the ◆3.
