

50 Years of Member-Guest Tennis

2023 marks some significant Ocean Reef Club milestones – namely reaching 75 years as a Club and 30 as Member-owned - but another milestone fitting of this historic anniversary year is approaching. **February 3-5**, one of Ocean Reef Club's oldest and fondest traditions, the Member-Guest Tennis Tournament, will turn 50.

Tennis has been a notable thread in the fabric of the Ocean Reef Community ever since the first court was built in 1955, and for the past 50 years, the Member-Guest Tennis Tournament has been the Tennis season highlight. Founded in 1973 by **Bob Ecuyer**, Ocean Reef Club's Director of Tennis at the time, and the late **Dick Garbisch**, the Member-Guest Tennis Tournament quickly became and has remained a great success.

In fact, the tournament has unique origins, as it once effectively aimed to not only provide another way for Members to compete in the game they loved, but to also expose tennis-playing potential Members to Ocean Reef Club and entice them to join. After a potential Member visited their friend at Ocean Reef for a weekend of great food, great parties, great tennis, and great fun, how could they not want to join?

Maybe that's why earlier years of the tournament focused so much on the "party" aspect. When reflecting on


Love is in the Air

In those early days of Ocean Reef Club's operations, Morris Baker recognized the need for guests to be able to do things other than fishing. In 1955, he built a single tennis court and probably never realized the approaching tennis craze. That court was placed directly across Ocean Reef Drive from the concrete block Villa Cay homes also being constructed. In 1966, Juan Weiss, five-time National Tennis Champion in Cuba, was hired as the first Director of Tennis. Soon, two more courts were added with a tennis pavilion. In 1969 after the Bakers sold out to a firm headed by Harper Sibley, **Bob Ecuyer**, a highly-rated tennis pro from New Orleans, joined Weiss and became Director of Tennis in 1972.

Over the next several years, more courts were added, all in the central core area, bringing the total to fifteen. But still, court time remained a premium causing the Club to limit play to one hour at a time. In 1974, a group of homeowners led by the late **Dick Garbisch** approached Sibley asking to purchase some land to form their own club in the same way the group from Card Sound Golf Club had done. Sibley was very receptive to the idea, but his creditors, who held liens on the entire property, would not allow the sale of any portion. An agreement was struck with the new group in which a parcel of land would be leased at a very minimal charge. The new group, now The Ocean Reef Racquet Club, built twelve hard courts and a clubhouse. The Racquet Club quickly sold out their memberships and

had a waiting list to get in. In 1993, they hired Jim Morton, the then assistant to Ecuyer at Ocean Reef, as Head Tennis Professional.

Another group of Members headed by Ed Sabol, driven by the demand for even more courts, formed the Health and Tennis Club. To attract members, they built a new clubhouse featuring a whirlpool, sauna, player's lounge and juice bar. This club opened in 1980.

In 1993, after the buyout, Bob Ecuyer became Director of Recreation for Ocean Reef and Jim Morton was hired as Director of Tennis.

In the meantime, the Ocean Reef Club courts were being encroached upon by the expansion of facilities such as Town Hall. Constructed in 2005, Town Hall eliminated eight courts and the tennis pavilion, leaving only five courts. With continued demand for space in the central core area, in 2012 Ocean Reef purchased the Health and Tennis Club with its twelve courts and clubhouse. The structure was improved to include a much-needed card and game center and is today called the Tennis & Games Center. The last two courts remaining in the core area were removed in 2020 when Waterside took its place.

Over the years, the Ocean Reef tennis program has hosted a myriad of top players in the world such as: Margaret Court (1975), Stan Smith (1987), Arthur Ashe (1988), Gabriella Sabatini (1989), Mary Jo Fernandez (1990), Pam Shriver (1990), Cliff Drysdale (1998), Andy Roddick (1998), Monica Seles (2014) and Mats Wilander (2014).

Jim Morton retired as Director of Tennis in 2022 and now teaches tennis seasonally at the Tennis & Games Center. Bob Ecuyer now leads the real estate firm Swenson & Ecuyer.



Frank Lloyd Wright, whose homes transformed the way we live, has been called the greatest American architect of the first half of the 20th century. During a career that spanned seven decades, he designed over a thousand projects: homes, office buildings, churches, and museums.

Wright's tumultuous personal life was punctuated by many professional vicissitudes and scandals. And so the telling of his story - as Mr. Silvin will illustrate - unfolds like a dramatic work of fiction. Born in rural Wisconsin in 1867, Wright married three times, fathered eight children, and remained productive and creative until the day he died in 1959 at age 91. René Silvin uses over 200 pictures and videos to give a modern context to Wright's extraordinary life and body of work.

Wright is the inventor of "organic architecture" and the open plan for family life,

expressed in different ways through his horizontal Prairie Style homes, the textile-block structures, the carport, and the more affordable "Usonian" houses.

Wright's most famous residence - Fallingwater in Mill Run, Pennsylvania - was named by The American Institute of Architects the "best all-time work of American architecture." The Smithsonian Institution lists it as "one of the 28 places to see before you die." Built in 1935, the breathtaking structure is still studied by dozens of architecture students and visited by hundreds of thousands of tourists yearly.

Wright is also known for the controversial Solomon R. Guggenbeim Museum, which he claimed would make the nearby Metropolitan Museum of Art "look like a Protestant barn." His work on the unique, cylindrical structure began in 1943 and opened six months after Wright's death in 1959.

Wright's legacy lives on due to the unique contribution of

his styles and because of the on-going work of his many disciples, who studied at *Taliesin West*, Wright's former winter home and desert laboratory in Scottsdale, Arizona.





His Life Cast a Long Shadow

There is a figure of speech that best describes the life of a person who has had considerable influence on other people or events. You say their life cast a long shadow.

One of the distinguishing features of Ocean Reef Club is the remarkable concentration of such people who comprise this community. The other is how unpretentiously many go about the business of living their lives.

A great privilege of serving as Chaplain in Residence is the opportunity of coming to know both the person and the story of some of those remarkable people. One such person was **John Boll**.

John's story is well known. The child of Dutch immigrants, John fell head-over-heels for a beautiful Rockette, **Marlene Miller**, while he was serving in the Army. He inflated his resume a bit when they first met. Rather than admitting he and his buddies were training to be medics, he told Marlene they were all in medical school, hoping to become doctors!

John and 'Mar' as he affectionately called her, went on to create a success story that as John loved to say, could take place "only in America."

John began his work with a "wheelbarrow and a shovel in the trunk of his powderblue 1949 Mercury." Those humble beginnings, his Dutch determination, and their creative partnership went on to re-define the image of manufactured home communities across the country.

The accolades the Bolls have received for their philanthropic work through the John A. and Marlene L. Boll Foundation are numerous. My wife and I saw some of it firsthand during a visit to their beloved Detroit several



years ago.

But there is one moment that stands out among many during that visit. It was a personal moment that gave a window into the mind and heart of who John was.

The two of us sat in the media room of their home at the end of a day touring the city. Their daughter Kris had produced a 35-minute video highlighting all the organizations and places John and Marlene had supported through the years. Many tributes expressed gratitude for the positive impact their influence and investment had made.

As the video ended, I looked over at John. The expression on his face seemed to capture a sense of his being stunned by the cumulative story that he saw. All he could say was, "Oh my."

It became clear to me in that moment that John had not done any of this to make a name for himself. He did it because he believed in the work of those many organizations he and Marlene supported. In lending his name and support, his great hope was that it would inspire others to join in. And it did.

The last great project John undertook was the new Chapel and Fellowship Center at Ocean Reef. He willingly served as the Honorary Chair. He and Marlene gave the first major gift, in hopes many others would join them. And they have.

Anyone who knew John knew that his faith in Christ motivated everything he did. He had a God-





Counting One Too Many Sheep?

About 70 million adults suffer from sleep disorders. According to Cleveland Clinic, there are approximately 80 different types of sleep disorders. Three of the top ones are:

Insomnia

This is the most common sleep problem, classified by shortterm insomnia and chronic insomnia. Short-term tends to be triggered by stress and is generally short-lived. Chronic insomnia is identified when it occurs three times a week and lasts longer than three months.

Sleep Apnea

A condition that causes you to stop breathing while you're sleeping. It can be due to



a blockage in your airway (obstructive sleep apnea) or because your brain isn't controlling your breathing correctly. The word "apnea" is Greek for breathless. Survival instincts wake you up to breathe and in turn causes sleep disruption. Sleep apnea can place stress on your heart and create other serious health problems.

Restless Leg Syndrome (RLS)

This usually occurs at bedtime and creates an uncontrollable

urge to move your legs or sometimes arms. Because of these uncomfortable feelings, the need to move disrupts your ability to fall asleep. RLS can be managed and is sometimes due to low iron or other healthrelated factors.

Factors that cause sleeplessness can be one or more of the following:

- •Physical (pain)
- Medical
- •Depression/anxiety
- •Environmentally created -

(alcohol or other factors)Circadian rhythm upset (night work schedules)

Medications and aging
Genetic conditions (like narcolepsy)



A Birding Hole In One

About 25 miles from our front gate is one of the many access points to Everglades National Park. Both in the park and in the areas surrounding the park there is an incredible variety of interesting things to see, hear, explore and enjoy.

Early on a recent crystal clear morning, I headed to the southeastern edge of the park hoping to get a photo of a reported "rare" bird in south Florida. (More on that later in another article).

While slowly walking through ankle-deep wet grass,




I noticed a sizable orangecolored shape on a distant fence. My first thought was that it was a bobcat or perhaps a fox. Using several trees for cover I was able to get much closer without disturbing my sighting. I was very surprised to identify a mature male Barn Owl perched on an old fence. Broad daylight and wide open in bright sunlight is definitely not where you would expect to find a Barn Owl. Preening and completely ignoring me while I was snapping photos was a bonus. One in a million opportunity.

Unlike our more familiar local Great-horned Owls, the Barn Owls do not hoot, they hiss and snap their bills. Very skilled hunters facilitated by their sharp hearing and excellent night vison, they can catch and swallow whole up to a thousand mice a year. Yes, swallow whole. Skin, feet, everything down the hatch. Efficient and tidy.

Barn Owls are widely distributed throughout much of the world. In fact, they are considered to be the most widely distributed of all land birds. In spite of this, their secretive and largely nocturnal behavior makes them difficult to spot and even more difficult to photograph. To find a healthy adult male showing off in the morning sun was as much, maybe more, about luck than skill. One thing for sure about a hole-in-one is to make one, you have to be playing golf.

And if you want to get a truly unusual photo of anything wild, you have to be out there looking.





Staying in touch with your community is very grounding. To follow your local news, search for your town's newspaper's website, subscribe to their newsletter or download their app.

The Smartnews: Local Breaking News <u>www.</u> <u>smartnews.com</u> and Newsbreak <u>www.newsbreak.</u> <u>com</u> apps let you receive big news from small papers. It's a great way to connect and strengthen ties to your

Both award-winning local news apps are free (so yes there are ads) and have been downloaded by tens of millions of people. The apps analyze national, international, and local news articles and TV stories each

day and synthesize them into targeted notifications specific to your interests and location. Smartnews has a "News From All Sides" link at the top of the Politics tab which brings you to an option to filter your news from either side of the aisle and political spectrum.

When you click on a local story it takes you right to the actual local newspaper's or TV network's website where you can continue reading the whole publication or live stream. It is a great way to keep track of your communities all in one place.


About Major George Perera

Major George Perera is the Commander of the Miami-Dade Police Department's Strategic Innovation and High Technology Crimes Bureau (SIHTCB) and the South Florida Cyber Crime Task Force, the largest cyber task force in the country. SIHTCB has the primary responsibility of investigating all facets of technology-related crimes as well as identifying new technology for the department. Additionally, he performs special projects of departmental interest and serves as the departmental research body to assist in recommending and establishing new and innovative ideas as well as best practices.

A sworn member of the department for over 30 years, he has worked everything from Patrol to Major Crime Investigations, from Administration to Technology. Perera serves as vice chair of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) Computer Crimes and Digital Evidence (CCDE) Committee and chair of the Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) SAFECOM Cybersecurity working group. He is also a Department of Justice, National Institute of Justice, Technology Grant Evaluator.

The Academy at Ocean Reef has been a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Ocean Guardian school for five years now. We are the first Florida school to be recognized for five years of stewardship protecting the health of our ocean. On January 12, The Academy at Ocean Reef was awarded a recognition plaque and banner by Marlies Tumolo. Education, Interpretation and Outreach Team Lead at the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary.

Reducing the amount of garbage and plastic in the ocean is our goal. So earning this recognition is a big deal. From 2017 to 2022, we were able to collect a whopping 3579 pieces of trash. In our most recent land-based and coastal cleanups, we collected 304 pieces of trash. We have also helped collect and recycle 1,305 lbs of monofilament over the last two years. We did this by sending out 24 monofilament

recycling bins to dockside residents and businesses. These are very useful because people use these to recycle fishing lines. In addition, we cut 53% of plastic waste in our school in only our second year of being an Ocean Guardian school.

The Academy loves to help the environment with frequent coastal and land-based cleanups. The Recreation Team at Ocean Reef also helps us do these coastal cleanups. One thirdgrader named Ionathan Gabriel said, "I just want to help animals" when asked what made him decide he wanted to do the land-based cleanup. This is a main focus for the cleanups because it inspires young people to protect the environment. Spreading awareness is key to success when it comes to a group trying to help the environment.

Another area we do not want trash to go is the



mangroves. Mangroves are very important because they are habitat for fish and other sea life. In addition, we have to be careful to not snap any of the branches because they can hold mangrove seeds. Mangroves also are areas where many wildlife such as snails, barnacles, bryozoans, tunicates, mollusks, sponges, polychaete worms, isopods, amphipods, shrimps, crabs, and jellyfish live after they hatch.

In conclusion, helping the environment any way you can - whether you do it via coastal cleanup, land-based clean ups, or just picking up trash if you see it is very important. Don't just leave it, pick it up because it will help keep our wonderful environment clean. Another thing you can do is Zero Waste Week, where you try to use the least amount of plastic at meals. It is also proven that it costs less to use reusable plastic containers at lunch. Remember we are not alone to help and, piece by piece, we will heal the world.

When a 1club opening bid is passed to you, keep in mind partner was not strong enough to overcall 1 Club.

When a 1club opening bid is passed to you, look at your club length. If you are short, partner may yet have a good hand. If you have club length, a good chance partner is weak.

1) S- Q4 H- 876 D- K976 C- AJ95 2) S- Q98 H-A954 D-KJ87 C- 84

With (1), pass because partner is probably short in clubs and probably weak not to be able to bid at the one level. Opener probably has the 18- 19 point balanced hand and wants to get back into the bidding.

With (2), double your club shortness indicates that partner may have a good hand with clubs after all.




MGA Monday

Quick & Easy Speed Drill



by Stefanie Shaw, Golf Teaching Professional

One of the most asked questions I receive is how to hit the golf ball further. Derek and I have a lot of great ways to help you do this, but an easy drill to do on your own is simply flipping the club over.

To the hit the ball further, you need to swing your arms faster. Back faster and through faster. It should be equal both ways.

We find many people trying

to bring the club back slowly and then faster through. Take a driver and flip it over in your hands. Let it hover above the ground and take some swings and see if you can make a "whoosh" sound. If there's no whoosh, let your arms and wrists relax and swing it faster! If there is a whoosh sound, make sure it's happening where the golf ball would be. The sound comes where the fastest part of your swing is happening and we want that to be where the ball is!

Take three or four swings back and forth without stopping, then flip the club back to normal and see if you can recreate it!

To practice hitting the ball further, turn your golf club around and practice making a "whoosh" sound where you would usually make contact with the ball.

Engine Cut-Off Switches (ECOS) & the ECOS Link

Saves Lives if Captain Falls Inside or Off the Boat

The US Coast Guard Boating Safety Division has a recent article on their website about Engine Cut-Off Switches, where as of April 1, 2021, any "Recreational Vessels," which includes "any motorized boat with 3 or more horsepower that is less than 26 feet in length", comes under the Federal law that requires the operator of a boat with an installed Engine

Cut Off Switch (ECOS) to use the ECOS link. Larger vessels have factory switch installations. The link is usually a coiled bungee cord lanyard at the helm or back by the outboards in a stern piloted vessel. This is clipped onto the operator's Personal Flotation Device (PFD), or clothing and the other end attached to the Cut Off Switch. We prefer to add a larger clip to give it noticeable wearing weight and ease of connection/ removal to a belt loop or shoe lace.

The Federal law applies on all "Navigable Waters of the US." Most US boat manufacturers have installed an ECOS on their boats, especially after December 4, 2018 when Congress passed a law requiring that boat manufacturers install an ECOS on new boats.

See the photo of an ECOS and lanyard clipped to the captain's clothing. There are many variations available for purchase, including electronic wireless devices. The latter has a wireless range of about 30 feet. This has advantages when you momentarily leave the helm (in neutral) to grab a dock line. The engines continue, but is not optimal if you fall, pass out from a medical condition or have an accident. Test yours at the dock to be sure you

understand how it works for you.



max out around 120 players, the most memorable parts were often the elaborate, themed Sunday evening awards parties.

"The most fascinating thing I remember," recalled Jim, "was one year when the theme was Hollywood. Everyone at the awards dinner dressed up as a Hollywood celebrity and paraded into Heron Hall as was typical during that time. Then-Tennis Chairman **Bill Sport** and his wife **Brenda** were dressed up as Roy Rogers and Dale Evans. What made the year unusual was that they rode into Heron Hall on a horse. But it gets better..."

The following year, the theme was Out of Africa. **Fred Baker**, that year's Tennis Chair, was not to be outdone by the year before. As the story goes, Fred rode into Heron Hall that year on an elephant.



Managing Stress on the Court

After another successful ORC Pro-Am Tournament this past weekend, the topic of anxiety seems very relevant. I was so nervous going into the tournament, but this is not something new to me. Managing anxiety is not necessarily about getting rid of it completely - a small amount can be beneficial to performance. Regulating anxiety effectively is essential for performing at a high level as it can increase muscle tension and fatigue, reduce coordination and focus, and impair decisionmaking and confidence. There's no substitute for playing and

practicing under pressure so putting yourself out there should be the first step.

While you're out there, my favorite approach to help with nerves is to focus on proper breathing. In high-pressure situations, players tend to forget to sync their breathing with their strokes. I love to encourage exhaling, or even better, grunting at impact. The mind will never forget to inhale, it's the exhale that needs to be trained. Slowing down, developing routines, and deep belly breathing between points are strategies I like to coach on a daily. This is a game, and games are meant to be fun, so enjoy the moment without focusing on the outcome.



In Search of The Vampire (Fish)

On October 20th, **Dr. Riley Love, Guthrie Allen**, Gary "The Brain" Narramore and myself, traveled to Columbia, South America, for a multispecies trip with a special focus on the payara, also known as the Vampire fish. It is aptly named for its two very large teeth on its lower jaw that actually extends through the top of its head when its mouth is closed.

After an overnight in Bogata, our charter flight the next morning took us to San Jose Del Guaviare. We were met by representatives of Fish Columbia, who were the outfitters. This area has only been recently developed because of warring locals trying to control the drug trade but has been cleaned up by the Columbian Army (we hoped!).

The Fish Columbia reps took us from the grass airfield to the loading area in the towns, and we packed into a small boat for our five-hour journey downstream.

As night fell and we got closer to our camp, we could see lights ahead perched on top of a thirty-foot embankment. After a quick bite and a shot of rum, we were taken to our sleeping area, which consisted of shared tents with mattresses on wooded floors, but each mattress had its own mosquito net.

After a 5:30 am wake-up call, we gathered our gear and tackle (we had to take all of our own on this trip). For the next two days we fished for many species, but the payara fishing was very good. The team of Dr. Love and Guthrie Allen caught eight amazing payara in one day.

On the second day of fishing, our guide asked if we wanted to make an extra 1 ½ hour boat ride to an area he felt was holding many payara. We agreed and were soon in an area where a

small feeder creek emptied into the Rio Guaviare.

I noticed some fish breaking water as we approached. For the next solid hour, my fishing partner Gary and I had many payara strikes. The payara is very difficult to land because of its boney mouth filled with a myriad of teeth.

On one particular cast, I had six strikes and did not land a fish. After retrieving my lure, the majority of the paint had been eaten off the lure and it had to be replaced. On my next cast, I hooked a really nice 30lb payara and was able to land him.

The next day, we moved to a different area at the base of a waterfall on the Mapiriare River. Here we slept in tents with mattresses on the ground, but with our trusty mosquito nets. It was amazing because everything was brought with us. All the kitchen equipment and the four people preparing the

food, guides, boats. All cooking was done on open fires. There was no running water or bathrooms. The restrooms were in the jungle.

The fishing here was very steady, with many varieties. My partner Gary caught a camp record sardinata, while I caught a record Jamu and landed a very nice 20lb orange bellied pacu. The team of Dr. Love and Allen continued to do well on the payara.

We did encounter one particular problem. In one part of this river, there was a particular bush that was flowering. On the bushes were many bees. One must always be ready in the jungle, as these bees could come and land on our shirts and pants. It wasn't uncommon to have 15-20 bees on you at a given time. They wouldn't bother you, except when they would crawl under your shirt or shorts, and you would bump or push them while making a cast or landing a fish. I had emphasized to the group to wear long pants, long sleeve shirts, socks, face mask and hat at all times. Those who failed to heed this advice had considerably more stings. Mr. Allen led the aftermath total with six stings. I had only one when I sat on one that gave me the full wallop. Luckily these looked like the combed honey bee and the effects of the sting were gone in about 30 minutes.

One other encounter with the insect world was when Mr. Narramore exited the boa on a sand bar to relieve himself. Nothing was thought of it until we got back to camp. "Hey Captain, would you look at this?' On the inside of his legs were over 40 sand flea bites per leg. I had some Benadryl lotion and pills, that seemed to keep everything in check.

This was one of our rougher trips, but it is what needs to be done in search of Vampires.
