### The Journey From Ocean Reef to the White House

A Great Start to the New Year

There's cause for celebration! The Ocean Reef community scored a win for the environment and the Homestead Air Reserve Base (HARB). Here are the waypoints that guided us on our journey to protect two national parks — Biscayne Bay and Everglades - and keeping the air base as a "military only" facility.

The starting point was October 8, 2020 when the Miami-Dade County Commission declared it would soon enter negotiations with the U.S. Air Force to allow for civil air operations at HARB. Many environmental groups, including the Ocean Reef community, were caught off-guard and immediately began waving red flags.

Several commissioners argued the goal was to move quickly on development of a fixed base operator (FBO) with limited general aviation, but the long-term vision was transforming the air base to become "the gateway to South America, the Caribbean, and Africa." Their remarks and actions were not aligned.

What's more, they cleared an immediate pathway for a one million square foot Amazon distribution facility to be built—just a stone's throw from the air base and next door to a newly constructed Fed Ex distribution center.

# The Journey From Ocean Reef To The White House

Ocean Reef was all too familiar with Miami-Dade ambitions to develop HARB into a commercial air hub. In the late 1990's, our community successfully led a charge to stop Miami-Dade's then plan to convert the air base into a full-blown commercial airport. Following years of public outcry over environmental and life quality concerns, the U.S. Air Force ultimately rendered a Record of Decision in January 2001 that prohibited nonmilitary use of the air base and finding "a commercial airport would not be consistent with Everglades restoration."

Knowing the history well, a small Ocean Reef group formed a non-profit organization called the Everglades Protection Alliance, and with the initial support of ORC and ORCA, set out to educate elected officials and other environmental organizations on the threat civil aviation at HARB posed to the surrounding ecosystem.

After two years of intense lobbying our county, state, and federal officials, hosting numerous helicopter tours over the sensitive ecosystem a mere mile and a half from the already endangered waters of Biscayne Bay, and an unforgettable trip to Washington DC -- a federal legislative solution began to take shape. Fortunately for the Ocean Reef community, our two U.S. Senators, Marco Rubio and Rick Scott, along with the South Florida congressional delegation led by U.S. Representatives Carlos Gimenez and Debbie Wasserman-Schultz, didn't hesitate to take up our cause and pursue a civil aviation ban in the annual must-pass defense authorization bill (NDAA).

As a member of the Committee on Armed Services, Senator Scott was proud to lead the effort this summer to include the ban in the NDAA that was subsequently embraced by Ranking **Member James Inhofe** (OK) and Chairman Jack Reed (RI). Scott declared he is "committed to preserving and enhancing military readiness on our bases..." and Senator Rubio noted "[c]ivil use of HARB would harm our military readiness and jeopardize critical Everglades restoration projects".

Along the way, members of the Ocean Reef Community responded to our call to action and opened several doors for us in Washington. This put the wind in our sails to expand congressional support and propel the provision forward.

There were enough twists and turns to write a book, but here's the happy ending. The Ocean Reef community got an early holiday present....

President Joe Biden signed into law the defense authorization bill on December 23 that included our provision which reads as follows:

SEC. 2874. PROHIBITION ON JOINT USE OF HOMESTEAD AIR RESERVE BASE WITH CIVIL AVIATION. On or before September 30, 2026, the Secretary of the Air Force may not enter into an agreement that would provide for or permit the joint use of Homestead Air Reserve Base, Homestead, Florida, by the Air Force and civil aircraft.

Upon passage of the bill, US Representative Gimenez commented that "preserving the Homestead Air Reserve Base for its original intent and purpose is critical to protecting our national security interests."

While a remarkable win for now -- the journey continues. We look forward to working with the Ocean Reef Community to build upon our recent success. Happy New Year!

One of our most productive and popular outlets, the Raw Bar relies on a roll call of unsung heroes. Barry Reed has been at Ocean Reef for 35 years. He began bussing tables in the Ocean Room, but within a year was the manager of the Raw Bar. "It was a tiny little thing," Reed said. "A tin roof, four tables, no screens, but we made it our own until Hurricane Andrew wiped it out. Now at the created-fromscratch 'new' Raw Bar, Reed directs an efficient team of cooks and servers that keeps the customers lined up at the door. Reed is proud of them – "three or four of our guys have been here more than 10 years." Working back-toback in a tightly coordinated choreography, they turn out a mountain of Member favorites in short order. "We have a great crew, dependable and compatible in spite of the tight space. We may be the only outlet open for 10 hours straight. Yesterday we served 730 covers. We are never completely empty," Reed said.

Chef Jazz King, ending her first year as Chef de Cuisine at the Burgee Bar, has revitalized the menu with real regional

Spotlight on Ocean Reef Members

### For Pete's Sake

### Peter Shields' book documents his life in words and pictures

For Pete's Sake — A Life Beyond My Wildest Dreams is a big and beautiful coffee-table book created by long-time Ocean Reef Member and former ORC Board Chairman, Peter F. Shields (with plenty of input from his wife Suzy Shields and the help of Glenn Plaskin, a professional ghostwriter).


From the beginning, Pete has claimed that he wrote For Pete's Sake for only one audience, and that was his family – albeit with 5 children and their spouses, plus 17 grandchildren, that adds up to a sizable number of dedicated readers.

Though you may never have an opportunity to read For Pete's Sake, I believe many Ocean Reef Members might appreciate what Pete has to say about his ancestry, his career, and above all his family.

### **ANCESTRY** – Pete's

ancestry is surprisingly well documented. His relatives had big Catholic families, so Pete and his two siblings had an abundance of aunts, uncles, and cousins – most of them diligent about preserving photographs, letters, and journals.

Pete's maternal grandfather Peter J. Little was a huge presence in Pete's life.





He came from modest circumstances, but in time he became a very successful and prominent lawyer. His wife Bertha Mae was the first woman principal of Cambria County. AND she raised a brood of eight children (including Pete's mother Frances).

Pete's Mom and Dad both started out as high school teachers. Pete's dad eventually became director of an organization with jurisdiction over 1500 teachers and 20,000 students.

Pete's parents had high expectations for their children and Pete and his brother Tom did not disappoint. Both were good students, who also excelled in sports. In high school, they lettered in football, baseball, and basketball. They taught little sister Mary to shoot baskets and in college, she was a star of the women's basketball team.

When it came time for college, Pete was offered football scholarships to several prestigious universities. He chose the US Naval Academy, a choice that he later said had changed his life.

### LOVE and MARRIAGE

Suzy is a major character in For Pete's Sake. For 68 years, she has been Pete's cheerleader, advisor, organizer, tennis partner, caregiver, and the love of his life. On their first date, he whispered to her – "I'm going to marry you."

Suzy was an only child, whose adoring father died suddenly when she was 16, leaving Suzy with just her grieving mother. Suzy prayed "to get out and find a good husband and have a wonderful large family."

Peter Shields appeared to be the answer to her prayers, and in 1959 after his graduation from the Naval Academy, Suzy and Pete were married at the Blessed Sacrament Church.

Ten days after the wedding, Pete (who had a degree in engineering) was hired by US Steel in their management training program and the newlyweds moved into a small one-bedroom apartment in Pittsburgh.

To supplement their income beyond Pete's starting salary of \$490 a month, Pete got a part-time job stocking shelves at the local A&P. Then for a little extra change, the couple volunteered for bomb-shelter research (a big deal in that Cold War era). "We lived underground in a local bomb shelter from Friday to Sunday."

The "extra change" became especially important when a month after they moved into their apartment, Suzy, who planned to teach high school in the area, found out she was pregnant.

### **THE PRICE OF SUCCESS**During his long stint at U.S.

Steel, Pete moved up in the ranks and was eventually appointed director of marketing and sales for the Homes Division.

This advancement came at a price, which was four years of hard work during the day and then night school to obtain an MBA. It was a grueling period, where Pete scarcely saw his growing family.

After 14 years at U.S. Steel, Pete was ready to move on. When he was offered the chance to join *Production Finishing*, a small company that specialized in polished chrome for car bumpers, he immediately said "yes".

During the next seven years, Pete was instrumental in *Production Finishing's* growth and when the company was sold, the new owner, Dean Rhoads, promised Pete a significant future bonus to encourage him to stay on. It was a promise that was never fulfilled, a betrayal that Pete would never forget.

Vowing that from now on he would be his own boss, Pete left *Production Finishing* and founded his own business *Flat Rock Metal*. The company got a jump start when it was granted a contract from Ford Motors and in 1981, *Flat Rock* established a large plant and hired 21 workers (a number that two years later grew to more than 100 and eventually to 600).

Unfortunately, Pete's ability to enjoy the success

of Flat Rock was seriously hampered by a lawsuit. Pete was sued by his old nemesis Dean Rhoads, who claimed that by accepting Ford's business, Pete's new company had usurped the corporate opportunity of Production Finishing. It was a court case that dragged on for nine years with endless appeals.

Finally in March of 1987, after many back-and-forth rulings, Pete agreed to pay a greatly reduced fine to Dean Rhodes. Though the money was not significant, the years Pete had devoted to this court case, while simultaneously building his own business, robbed him of what should have been rewarding time with his growing family and finally resulted in his experiencing a crippling depression, which required a brief hospitalization and a long period of treatment.

#### THE HOME FRONT

Ocean Reef, which in the early '70s became the Shields' winter residence, had everything this "tennisloving, golf-loving, swimloving, outdoor-oriented family" could want, except for a proper house. And after five years of squeezing into a two-bedroom Pumpkin Cay condo, Pete, who looked at a building project like a 5-yearold with his first set of blocks, built a big and beautiful house on a 100-foot oceanfront lot on Sunrise Cay.

Ocean Reef was great for the fall and winter months, but for the off-season, Suzy and Pete eventually decided they needed something more. The result: two extraordinary family compounds. One was a ranch in Idaho. The other was a waterside compound on Walloon Lake in Michigan. Both contained individual dwellings for each of their children, as well as — tennis courts, screening rooms, swimming pools, workout areas, mess halls, guest quarters. And best of all — room to roam on foot, bicycles, or horseback.

Imagine a Four Seasons resort that is luxurious, yet remains personal, comfortable, family-oriented, and always compatible with the location's extraordinary landscape.

Of course, in time the 17 grandchildren became young adults involved in school, sports, careers. The ranch in Idaho was too far away for short visits. The original house in Ocean Reef was sold and replaced by a smaller house and recently by a lovely condo in the Sanctuary, a relatively new area of Ocean Reef. The glorious compound at

Walloon Lake is still the Shields' summer residence.

#### **FAMILY FIRST**

The final segment of For Pete's Sake is devoted to personal bios and family photographs of each of the Shields' five children. That is followed by little vignettes in which the 17 grandchildren describe choice memories of family life.

It is a fitting climax to this remarkable chronicle in which Suzy and Pete Shields share their reflections on life and family in their own words and beautiful photographs. The book offers their children and grandchildren (and the descendants who will follow them) a rare opportunity to really get to know and appreciate the two wonderful people, who always tried to help "the kids" find a life "beyond their wildest dreams."

### MAKING HISTORY

### He Named His Vision Ocean Reef

In 1942, the property that would become Ocean Reef Club was known as the Dispatch Creek Fishing Camp boasting four ramshackle cabins, several docks and a small harbor. The site was only accessible via the water or a dirt road (now County Road 905) that led from US 1 in Key Largo to the fishing camp. There would have been nothing glamorous about this fishing camp, nothing to presage its future as an upscale private club.

"Ocean Reef began because my father (Morris Baker) wanted a fishing camp in the Keys," Roger Baker explained. "He heard from Uncle Allen, who lived in Homestead, that the Key Largo Anglers Club was on the market, but he thought



the price was too high so they kept looking until they heard about a fishing camp over on the ocean side. That year, 1945, they made an offer and sight unseen acquired something less than 40 acres." The owners of the 7 1/2-acre fishing camp within those 40 acres were a group of Miami businessmen including brothers John and James Knight

whose family owned the Miami Herald

In a 1960 interview, Alice E. Baker, Morris Baker's widow, shared her first impressions of Ocean Reef when she drove down with her husband from Minneapolis in 1946. "We drove 11 miles from the main highway over a narrow, rutty road with trees touching above in many places. Raccoons and night birds were everywhere, we thought it was the end of the world." It was on that drive, according to Mary Baker Philbin, Roger Baker's daughter, that her grandfather's plans changed. Morris Baker was stunned and intrigued by the primitive beauty of the site and instead of a fishing camp, Mrs. Philbin said, "He saw the crocodiles, the mangroves and the coral rock and had this vision of building something that would last forever." He named his vision Ocean Reef.

Above is an excerpt from "On the

### **DATELINE 1948**

By 1948, Ocean Reef consisted of an inn, some small yachtels, a coffee shop, a gas station, a few rental boats, and the water tower. In 1969 when the Baker family sold Ocean Reef to a real estate investment group led by Harper Sibley, Jr. and Morris Burk, Ocean Reef had added a beach and swim lagoon, dining room and lounge, golf, tennis, an airstrip and terminal, and even a pair of dolphins. At that time, the \$8 million transaction was the largest real estate purchase in the history of the Florida Keys.

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# What's Your Investment Strategy?

Teach us to number our days that we may gain a heart of wisdom

Psalm 90:12

Just think about it. You and I are given 31,536,000 seconds in the next 525,600 minutes of the 8,760 hours we will live in the 365 days of the

52 weeks during the next 12 months. And by the time you read this, the first five days will already be in the books! *Tempus fugit!* 

Time is after all the most precious commodity we are given. The possession arrow in the game of life never changes. It relentlessly moves only in one direction.

The question I invite you to consider is this. "How will you and I invest the time we have been given? What do you hope to gain with the time entrusted to you in the coming year?"

Clayton M. Christensen was a professor in the Harvard Business School until his death in 2020. He was regarded as one of the top management thinkers in the world. His numerous books addressed the theme of innovation.

In 2012, eight years before his death, he and two associates published a book titled, How Will You Measure Your Life?

Christensen applies his management research technique to the life of individuals. He claims that just as articulating a purpose is essential for any company to be successful, so he says, it is crucial for any individual. We need to live with a clear sense of purpose if we want to produce a good return on our investment of time.

He reminds us that cogent rewarding purposes are not "delivered' like food from Reef Eats. Cultivating a rewarding life purpose is the outcome of a deliberately conceived, chosen, and managed process, which must be pursued. It is too important to leave to chance.

That intentionality reflects the wisdom of the Psalmist in the epigraph. The Message puts it this way. Oh! Teach us to live well! Teach us to live wisely and well.

What are the steps in the process of defining a life purpose? What does it take to live wisely and well with the time we are given?

Christensen says there are three parts to understand when composing a life purpose. They are what he calls – a likeness, a commitment, and a metric.

The likeness is the process of drawing up the kind of person we want to become. This then becomes the shop drawings or the sketches from which we build a life of purpose.

When at Oxford as a Rhodes Scholar, he spent an hour each day reading the Scriptures and praying, wrestling to know if the things he held in his hand were true. He recalled the intensity with which he focused on seeking to know if his likeness was right.
Assured, he then began the process of devoting his life to becoming that person.

Christensen took the parts of life from his family and his faith. He distilled those assets into three statements that gave shape to his living. They were:

A man who is dedicated to helping improve the lives of other people. A kind, honest, forgiving, and selfless husband, father, and friend. A man who just doesn't believe in God, but who believes God.

We all know aspirations are one thing – execution is another. Christensen asks, "How do you become so deeply committed to these things that they guide what you prioritize on a daily basis – drive what you will do, and what you will not do?"

He acknowledges that we each may have a different process for committing to our likeness. But what is universal is that our intent must be to answer the question, "Who do I truly want to become?"

The final step was finding what he called the metric by which his life would be measured

Through time, he came to understand that measuring our lives by summary statistics of sphere of influence, awards, or wealth were not sufficient.

He concludes saying, "When I have my interview with God, our conversation will focus on the individuals whose self-esteem I was able to strengthen, whose faith I was able to reinforce, and whose discomfort I was able to assuage. These are the metrics that ultimately matter in measuring my life."

"How will you and I invest the time we have been given? Whose likeness will you emulate? What are the metrics that will truly matter in the end?"

A good likeness to consider when beginning the process is the one whose life is found in the pages of the Gospels. Have a productive, fulfilling New Year!


# Medical Lecture Series Presents "Gut Microbiome & Neuropsychiatric Disease

January 10, 2023 Cultural Center Theatre – 5 p.m.

In recent years there has been increasing research on the interaction between the brain, the gastrointestinal tract, the bacteria within the gastrointestinal tract, and the bidirectional relationship between these systems: the braingut-microbiome axis.

In a 2020 YouTube presentation by Dr. Madan, he speaks to the Gut Microbiome:

"Our gut and our inner brains



are intimately connected, and it is a two-way street. It is all one closed system. The cool part now is, we have a gateway to what is going on in the gut. The bacteria are about 1,000 or so species. About 3 million different genes are represented; collectively, all those bacteria weigh about 3 pounds, and curiously our brains weigh about 3 pounds. Our gut bacteria develops as we age and there are a lot of things that affect how this looks."


Dollie and Sheldon had two daughters, four grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.







### "Should I Stay or Should I Go"



"Pickleball Tip" by Kevin Girard, Pickleball Professional

One of the tougher challenges we face in pickleball is getting to the kitchen line as a serving team. "Should I Stay or Should I go" by The Clash is a constant song you will hear being sung by many pickleball players as you walk by the courts. One thing I find helpful when determining if a team should advance on the kitchen line is to turn your opponent into a stoplight. Please note that these "stoplight rules" are based on where your opponent will be making contact with the ball when you are attempting a 3rd shot drop.

- •Red Light: Your opponents make contact above their waist (STAY BACK) Do not leave the baseline...don't even take one step forward. Good players will keep their volleys deep so moving into a high-floating ball puts you and your partner in jeopardy.
- •Yellow Light: Your opponents make contact around or below their waist (PROCEED WITH CAUTION) Some players can attack this shot, and others cannot. If they prove they can handle/attack this shot, you and your partner should stay back. If they seem to struggle with it, that's your cue to move to the kitchen line.
- •Green Light: when your opponent makes contact at their knees or below (GET TO THE KITCHEN) Your opponent's paddle faces will now be open meaning the next shot they hit will either be popped up or a dink...either way this is your time to be aggressive and get to that kitchen line!

## What are you most looking forward to this season?





#### **Golf Croquet Tip**

The following is a simple four-step method to help a player determine what their next shot should be.

Consider these four steps to select your shot.

- 1. "Make the wicket"—make the wicket if you feel you can.
- 2. "Hit or block the danger ball"—the danger ball is the opponent's ball that is up next after you...if it is in scoring position and you are not, you should smash their ball away so they cannot score.
- 3. "Help my partner"—how can you help your partner ball so they are in an improved position?
- 4. "Eliminate any threats".





## Helpful Apps for Safety & Fun

On the fun side, safe boating apps on your phone will enhance both your enjoyment and your safety. There are several tools that we recommend, but feel free to suggest others.

Weather is a big factor in all situations. I prefer Windfinder Pro as my first go-to tool. The current and future conditions of a variety of locations can be set up to view the wind speed, direction, wave height and other data at most any location. These are displayed by the hour and a few days forward. Know



before you go.

Sometimes the Windfinder reports can be ambiguous when stormy conditions are approaching. Broaden your spatial view using the latest radar images and forecasts in the area you select. If the rain clouds are fast approaching, be prepared for it with the associated wind shifts. I prefer My Radar as the viewing tool.

Register your vessel and

owner information with the U.S. Coast Guard App. If you see hazards, pollution, need to check navigation rules, review safety equipment or call for Emergency Assistance, this app is for you.

Need a tow? BoatUS it the tool for you.

Finally, for Garmin users, Active Captain provides system component software updates, navigation capability and an anti-theft device through OnDeck Hub. It will report movement of your vessel more than 10 yards and track its location reporting through your cell phone. Add connections to your bilge pumps, AC power, door locks, a camera for a total view and much more. Beware some boat insurance companies deny theft coverage without this device, check your policy.



## History of the **East Coast** 12-Meter Model Yacht

Since model yacht racing began at Ocean Reef 40 years ago the venerable East Coast 12 Meter Model Yacht, or EC-12s as they are commonly known, have been at the center of it. Over the years this 59-inch-long, 22-pound, model yacht with a 72-inch-tall primary mast has seen technology improve the control of the model yacht, and a major action by the class authority to stabilize the rules and specifications. Here at Ocean Reef, there was even an unsuccessful movement to replace the EC-12 with a smaller, decidedly less majestic one-meter Soling class. But EC-12 racing at Ocean Reef has persevered and is currently experiencing a bit of a renaissance. Since the Card Sound Model Yacht Club (CSMYC) did not have any racing on New Year's Day, here is a brief history of the EC-12 model yacht.

The East Coast 12 Meter was developed in the mid-1960s and is based on a 12


Meter design intended to be

a potential defender for the 1964 America's Cup. This original design made it from the drawing board to aerodynamic and hydrodynamic testing using a 9/10 inch = 1-foot scale model during the America's Cup design phase before being rejected and development of this design ceased. It was from this 12 Meter class model that the idea of a large-sized, radio-controlled fiberglass sailboat fleet was born. Over the years, hull manufacturers have come and gone, but in total there have been nearly 30 different entities building hulls for hobbyists to assemble into functioning racing sailboats. During the 1980s, there were two different manufacturers of hulls at Ocean Reef alone. Apart from a few instances of builders trying to gain a competitive advantage over the years by pushing the boundaries of the dictated measurements, the specifications remained similar until 1995. But the class authority realized that

the rules were still too open for interpretation. Having realized that there were too many opportunities for variations of the original hull, the class authority developed a standard hull plug to be used by all manufacturers. By truly standardizing the hull, the class authority ensured that the dimensions of the boat remained consistent no matter who constructed the hull. This truly limited any differences in performance to the sailor and not the boat. Over the years, changes were not solely limited to the hull. While the early boats only carried a single primary 72-inch-tall mast (known now as the "A" rig), most later boats now have alternate, smaller masts and sails (the "B" rig) to manage stronger wind conditions. There is an even smaller rig called the "C" rig for winds over 20 knots, but few sailors have them. In the years that followed, the CSMYC racing fleet began to dwindle as the newer boats

showed parity with one another but a distinct advantage over the older boats. In recent years, growth has returned to the CSMYC as new enthusiastic sailors joined the club, bringing additional post-1995 boats. We have rebuilt the fleet from less than 10 of these newer boats just a few years ago to over 20 today and still growing.

The Card Sound Model Yacht Club races every Sunday (except Easter Sunday) until the end of April at "the Pond." So, swing by the Buccaneer Island lagoon if you are curious or have questions. Racing begins at 10 a.m. Our sailors are always willing to discuss our racing model yachts and, for interested sailors, there are even a few currently available for sale here at Ocean Reef. # Attacking notrump contracts

Notrump contracts usually call for aggressive leads, which is why it's standard to lead from your longest suit. Does this situation warrant making an exception?

West East
1D
1S 1NT
2NT 3NT
What's your lead as South holding ♠1072 ♥K3

**♦**Q10865 **♣**J64?

Declarer has shown at least four diamonds, so you might allow the old advice of "never lead into declarer's suit" to overrule the "lead your longest and strongest" guideline. The problem here is that the non-diamond alternatives don't offer good potential for establishing tricks, and none are really all that safe.

A diamond lead is ambitious but not unreasonable, as all you need in partner's hand is any diamond honor. Partner rates to have an entry or two, and if he can return your lead, your good tenace over declarer's remaining cards may allow you to run the suit.
