#### **Gotta Question?**

Is there a golf cart speed limit and is it different than cars?

Yes, there is a golf cart speed limit, and no, it is not different than that of cars. The max speed limit for both cars and golf carts within the Ocean Reef community is 25mph. While many golf carts, including Ocean Reef's Cart Rental fleet, max out at a speed below the 25mph limit, there are certain carts that have the ability to cruise above 25mph. These carts in question must also abide by the set speed limit and not exceed 25mph in either the car or cart lane.

Carts that do cruise at 18mph or higher, considered "fast carts," are required to exclusively drive in the car lane and behave like a regular car on the road. "Slow carts," or any cart that travels at 17mph or lower, should drive in the dedicated golf cart lane. The



only time these carts should venture into the car lane is when making a left-hand turn, in which case they should use their signals to merge into the car lane.

All carts should follow typical car rules of the road and should not assume right of way.

#### **MAKING HISTORY**

#### How We Got Here

After Ocean Reef Club's initial opening in 1951, Morris Baker, always thinking way ahead, was planning for additional activities for guests other than fishing and boating. He acquired two plots of land, one from the Crane Plumbing Company (later merged with American Standard) and the other from the Horace Hills Irvine family (from St. Paul, Minnesota). Mr. Baker now had the land to build a golf course.

Baker hired Mark Mahannah, a south Florida groundskeeper who had experience with course construction on coral based land. He designed the first nine and then the second nine shortly after. The original first hole was our present number 14 on Dolphin and Baker's home was the clubhouse located near Baker Harbor which had recently been dredged for Mr. Baker's boats. The Ocean Reef Course opened in 1955. Mark Mahannah went on to become a much sought-after course architect, Lost Tree in North Palm Beach being one of his best known.

During the next 15 years, the Ocean Reef Club kept growing with more and more visitors each year. In 1969, the Club was sold to a real estate investor group headed by Harper Sibley from Rochester,

N.Y. and Morris Burk, a Miami developer. The demand for good tee times was so high, the new owners realized they needed another golf course. Mr. Sibley immediately hired Bruce Devlin and Bob Von Hagge to design and build nine more holes near the airport, appropriately called the "Airport Nine" but that wasn't enough so another nine was constructed and the 18 hole course was called the Barracuda Course.

The original Mark Mahannah course, then called the Dolphin Course, was still the favorite course for Members and tee times were difficult to get plus play was very slow. Mr. Sibley contracted to build another course that would become the Harbor Course (now known as the Hammock Course), but construction languished because of lack of financing.

Meantime, a few Members started to talk about the possibility of a private golf course with no tee times. They formed a group and acquired forty acres outside our gate but soon discovered that enough land to build another course was not available, so they began discussions with Mr. Sibley. Eventually, and over time, they agreed on a complicated arrangement wherein the new group would finance the construction of the Harbor Course, cede over the forty acres they had purchased to the Club and trade for the Barracuda Course.

The deal was sealed with a handshake. Ocean Reef now had two very good golf courses and the Barracuda Course became the private Card Sound Club.

It started as a primitive fishing camp in 1948 ... Was purchased by its Members in 1993 ...

The time has come to honor these two important milestones!


Reef day. I am confident Dad won't mind that I scooped him on this story. I hope Mr. Brewer likes my report.

If you are taking your golf cart in for service, sitting on the Airport runway, or even visiting Waste Management, you might have noticed a large, light green building with some delivery trucks in the driveway. It is sometimes referred to as "Reef Central," but is really the Ocean Reef Commissary that consists of three warehouses and much more. The Bake Shop, all those yummy desserts, and the Banquet Kitchens all reside in this nondescript building, too-but, that is another story! You would not believe

that this building, tucked away behind the Airport for 24 years, is such an important part of Ocean Reef Club and thus all of our lives.

#### So what is inside those walls?

Dan Taylor, Director of Purchasing, met me outside of Reef Central and then we cautiously went in to see one of the warehouse areas that consists of enormous shelves of goods, five coolers (huge refrigerators), two freezers, and especially designed storage

spaces for wine, produce, china, cooking supplies, and everything our restaurants need on a daily basis. It is impressive to see the large quantity of supplies stacked almost to the ceiling and that is just the first floor! Then directly upstairs on the second floor are areas for retail and paper goods. This means all you see and purchase at the Golf Shop, The Burgee Shop, the Gift Shop, the Tennis Pro Shop and Port O' Call Wine and Spirits come to the Commissary first for processing.

#### How does this all work-so seamlessly?

The Commissary is open seven days a week year-round. Orders from all venues are emailed nightly and then printed out at 6 a.m. for the famous "clipboards" that hang on the warehouse wall. Every morning this talented team of 13 gets to work filling those orders for delivery around The Reef. Smaller box trucks, vans, and golf carts take the filled orders to the shops and the restaurants. Lazaro Martinez, Commissary



Manager, and Will Davis, Purchasing Manager, coordinate this complicated process and competent team.

#### Where does this all come from?

The volume of deliveries is staggering. Just in the month of December, 1800 dozens of eggs, 12,000 avocados, 3600 pounds of Mahi, and 4600 pounds of chicken tenders were delivered to the Commissary. There are about 40 vendors that arrive at the Commissary weekly and some come daily as produce, seafood, and meat must be fresh and high quality for our chefs. The trucks have their scheduled arrival time and many have been coming to The Reef for years. It is quite a well-organized, but hectic place, especially in the morning as cases of goods arrive, are inspected, logged in, counted, and divided for delivery across The Reef. This centralized delivery limits traffic of these large trucks through The Reef as they enter the Gate, drive down Anchor Drive, and then after Four Corners make a left turn as they drive directly to the Commissary.

It is an amazing group of people that efficiently manage the intake of ALL that Ocean Reef Club needs on a daily basis year around. So next time you sit down to a delicious meal at one of our fine dining venues or buy a gift at one of our Ocean Reef Club stores, remember that everything you see first arrived at the Commissary on the other side of the runway. And a huge thank you to the Commissary team!

# Remembering 1963...

Some memories, like fine wine and good whisky, require aging before they can be tasted and appreciated. One such memory comes from 1963, just weeks before the trauma of that November in Dallas.

My hometown had little to distinguish it from other small towns in east Texas, save one thing. It was the sign strung across main street. Inscribed in colorless white block print were the words, "Welcome to Greenville – Home of the Blackest Land and the Whitest People."

The words of that sign are a reminder that racism is moral cancer. This malignancy of the soul forms and spreads unnoticed until it slowly destroys the capacity to find wonder and praise for God's creating and delighting in the variegated colors of our shared humanity.

Moments of human experience though, can be like Paul Simon's "stabbing flash of a neon light, splitting the night." A startling event shocks your awareness. You realize something is terribly wrong.

That stabbing flash was a startling event that took place in the fall of my senior year, in 1963. Our schools became racially integrated.

There were no national guard troops forming a protective corridor at the entrance to our school. And there was no George Wallace like official making national news with their protest. But there was pain.

The pain was manifested in the reaction by some in the community to the uncoerced decision to integrate our schools. All the board members were white. One of them was my dad. Known by most as Butch,

he was a quiet man who loved coaching Little League and fishing. To say he was not loquacious is an understatement. It was routinely said of my dad that "he doesn't say much, but when he does, you need to listen."

Like most veterans of that era, he was happy just to be alive, building a family and life as a small-town merchant. His only scars from the war were unseen, hidden on the inside.

How the board's momentous decision came about remains a mystery to me. Dad never spoke about it, that I recall. All I remember were the ugly phone calls and the threats.

My dad was not a physically imposing figure. But he was not one to be pushed around. Undeterred, he and the members of the school board freely chose to confront the powerful current of racism in our schools, in our community, and in our hearts.

The outcome of their decision had a face. He was a seventeenyear-old African American student whose name ironically was, Kenny White. His life merged with ours that fall, both in the halls and on the track and the diamond.

What brought this memory to mind? It was a recent story in our hometown newspaper.

For some unknown reason, like the national merit scholars in Virginia, Kenny never received his varsity letter jacket like the rest of us that year. His athleticism was as outstanding as his person.

So early this fall, some 58 years later, at a very public ceremony, Kenny was awarded his letter jacket from GHS.

Kenny served as a Marine in Vietnam. He and his family regularly show up on Facebook. Now retired, like many of us, his receding hairline is gray, and he's added too many pounds to fit into his old track shorts. He could make the cinders fly in the four-forty back in the day.

What remains unchanged is the quality of his character. In his remarks at the award ceremony, he was far more gracious than others might have been. There was neither suspicion nor resentment in his words. He spoke with great kindness about the reception he received those many years ago.

It was August of that same year that Martin Luther King, Jr. gave his famous "I Have a Dream" speech from the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, DC. There was no causal relationship between the speech and the board's decision, made months earlier.

Dr. King's dream has been

tarnished by recent events. These events remind us that the cancer of racism knows no color limits. It is not in remission, and the pain is still there.

But my memory of what took place those many years ago in my small town reminds me that hope can still be found, and that it still requires courage.

So, what is the curative treatment? It's what Jesus quoted from Torah when asked which of the ten commandments was best. He dodged the questioner's trap and summed them all up, saying, "Love God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. And love your neighbor as you love yourself."

It still amazes me how God's desire and Dr. King's dream were lived out all those years ago, in small ways, in my small town. Thanks, dad, for your courage. And thank you Kenny for having the courage to walk through that door.



'From the Gold Tees" by Michael Leone, Director of Golf

The golf season is well underway and we are excited to be hosting some major golf events within the next few weeks. Ocean Reef Club hosts almost 50,000 rounds a year and we still have some of the most immaculate conditions you can find across the country. We are grateful for Director of Agronomy Eric Bennett and his team's efforts. It is the responsibility of all players to help maintain these conditions by doing their part with filling divots, fixing ball marks, raking bunkers, and more.

#### **Filling Divots**

An action such as filling your

own divots and one other that you see will go a long way in keeping our courses in pristine condition. Filling the divot allows the grass to grow in at a much faster pace, keeping the turf smooth for the best playing conditions.

#### **Proper Divot Filling Practice**

When filling a divot, pour the sand mix in the divot until just below the level of the surface. Then, smooth down and press with your foot. It is worth the extra time to do this because not enough mix will create an uneven surface and too much sand may damage mowing equipment. Who knows, the divot you repaired could give you a better lie the next time around!

We encourage everyone to fill their divot and even one more.

#### **Golf Cart Etiquette**

- •Only two carts per group are allowed on the golf course.
- •Please abide by all cart signs put in place by the Golf Course

Maintenance Team.

- •Please enter and exit fairways at 90 degrees. Driving down fairways and rough is very strenuous for the grass.
- •Please keep all four wheels on the cart path to prevent unnecessary wear.

#### Other Course Etiquette to Keep in Mind

- •Please enter and leave bunkers at the nearest level point to the ball. Please smooth over with the rake upon leaving and leave the rake in the bunker with the handle just outside the bunker.
- •Please repair your ball mark on the green and one other. The putting surfaces here at Ocean Reef are second to none. It is very important to fix ball marks for both the playability and health of the putting surfaces.
- •Par three divots will be taken care of by our maintenance team. We ask that all broken tees are placed in the boxes provided on the teeing area.

# The Importance of Putter Fitting



'Swing Tip" by Derek Swoboda, Director of Instruction

Putter fitting is often overlooked though it is the place we use the largest percentage of strokes. This week, we review 5 major factors to take into account when it comes to your putter.

#### Face Balanced vs. Toe Weighted

There are as my types of putters today as there are putting strokes. Putters are made with various versions of toe weight or face balance. This allows the player to best feel the putting stroke they are wishing to accomplish rather than fighting what the putter wants it to do. A good way to determine what type of putter you should use is to place two golf balls side by side while the putter head is perfectly square directly behind it. When you swing the putter back and through, one of the golf balls will travel farther than the other. If the golf ball on the toe of your putter travels farther, you should use more face balanced putters to keep the toe from closing too much. Conversely, if you see the inside golf ball travel farther, you will need more toe weight in the putter to allow the toe to move faster through the ball. See photo on the top right.

#### Length

When choosing the proper length of putter for yourself, you should be able to stand comfortably and feel like your eyes are directly over the golf ball. While doing this, allow your arms to hang freely below your shoulders and bring the insides of your upper arms in so they begin to touch your sides. This is the position to judge your length of putter by.

#### Too Short vs. Too Long

When you have a putter which is too short for you, the arms can extend away from your body easily and create separation. Since the putting stroke is more of a shoulder motion and less hands, we want to feel as "together" as we possibly can. This involves the insides of your upper arms being by your sides and allowing your shoulders to perform the putting motion.

When we have a putter which is too long, we normally see the student standing too tall at address. You can take length away from the putter by sliding your hands down the grip. The longer the putter is, the easier it is to allow the insides of your upper arms to be at your sides.

#### Lines

Lines play a giant part in how every individual is able to see alignment. Personally, I have found that my ability to line up properly is reliant on the number of lines on the top of the putter.

When using one line, my alignment on a straight putt is 2 feet to the right of the target on average. When using two or more lines on the putter, I am able to consistently line up within a half degree of the target. See photo on the top left.

The most accurate way to determine this is to test it our via SAM Putt Lab and a laser exam where we take putters with different shapes, lines and colors to determine which is the most consistent for you.

#### Weight

Weight and speed go hand in hand when controlling our distance in putting. I often find that people use putters that are too heavy. Think about putting with a sledge hammer, the amount of force you need to use in moving the hammer would decrease your ability to control how fast the hammer moves.

The lighter the putter becomes, the more easily you are able to control the speed in which the putter makes contact with the golf ball, as well as the distance and direction.

#### Loft

While we're familiar with loft on drivers, wedges and woods, loft also makes a difference on the putter. Depending on what you naturally do with the putter, you either need to add or decrease the loft it has. For example, if

you naturally add loft to the putter, we will need to take loft away so the ball does not skid or bounce when hit.

# Safe Boating Tip: Discounts on Manicures & Lines

As Captain, you likely need help leaving and more importantly, docking your vessel. It is your total responsibility to instruct your crew on handling dock lines. Yes, these are lines not ropes! Any rope that has specific function is always called a line. Fenders are not "bumpers." Save bumpers for the amusement park bumper cars.

When preparing to leave the dock, assign firmly and



unambiguously, by name, who shall help on the aft and forward lines. Use your best judgment who has the physical capability and skill level. The holiday boater may be a bad choice because they feel they know what to do in advance - a recipe for an accident. Once complete, instruct your crew to never anticipate a command. Letting you loose from the dock early could be an accident adrift. Communicate loudly. Please and thank you are unnecessary - save it for the dinner table.

Ready to leave the dock, before you release the lines



test the forward and reverse of the motors as well as the thruster (if applicable). Instruct your crew where to leave the lines for easy retrieval on your return. Blast the horn once – standard leaving a dock. Release the lines one at a time, and disembark.

Ready to return after a nice boat trip? Remember folks will be tired. Use only a long boat hook to retrieve the linesdon't hang over the side. Most permanent dock lines use the open-eye side to secure the boat. The major message here is to have your crew simply



place the line "eye" over the cleat. See photo. Then shout the line is ON. The simple objective is to stop the boat. Fancy through cleat looping may qualify you for the 10% off manicure club by quickly severing a finger. After two or three lines are "loosely" attached, the vessel is secure. If your dock lines are bitter ends, one turn around the cleat and cross twice over the top is sufficient. Again keep fingers away from the line to cleat surfaces. Take all the time you need to re-tie securely after the engines are off.



#### Reminder from the ACBL: Be Scent-sitive!

Some people have an extreme sensitivity to fragrances (colognes or perfumes). Many ACBL clubs, units and districts have adopted policies that prohibit players from wearing fragrances. The ACBL has not issued an official policy on the matter, preferring instead to appeal to the goodwill of its members to refrain from using fragrances.

Because duplicate bridge requires players to be in close proximity to each other, individuals who suffer from fragrance-related reactions cannot avoid those who are wearing them. Among the commonly reported symptoms are intense headaches (indeed, fragrances can frequently be a trigger for migraine sufferers) or breathing-related problems. For these individuals, the issue is much more serious than simply disliking a particular smell — it's a real health problem. Please, if you're going to play in a club, don't wear cologne, perfume or scented lotions.

#### BRIDGE TIP OF THE WEEK

# The Mechanics Of Bridge

We are often asked, "Why is contract bridge so avidly enjoyed by so many people?" This question is usually raised by someone who has never learned the game, but whose interest has been piqued by friends who have been bitten by the "bridge bug."

It is not surprising that the game is highly appealing, because it combines so many fascinating features. Some of these are:

#### **SKILL**

A player who has learned well will win more often than one whose technique is inadequate, for bridge is first and foremost a game of skill. It is sufficiently demanding to provide a challenge to all; it requires such abilities as reasoning, memory, and planning. Yet anyone who is willing to invest some time and effort can learn to play, and you need not be an expert to find enjoyment.

#### THE PERSONAL ELEMENT

It is possible to program an electronic computer to play a pretty fair game of chess, but the computer would probably have a nervous breakdown if it tried to learn bridge because it could never master the "personal element." Taking into consideration the behavior patterns of your opponents is yet another intriguing aspect of bridge. For example, some opponents consistently overvalue their cards, and you can let them climb out on a limb and cut it off behind them: others tend to undervalue their cards and should be left strictly alone.

Also, the care and feeding of partners is particularly important. In bridge, you have a partner to assist you in the battle against your two opponents, and partner's habits must also be kept in mind. Thus, a close decision would be resolved differently opposite an aggressive partner (who often announces unpossessed strength) than with a conservative partner (who always turned up with something in reserve). A highly unusual action that might be justified with a clever partner could be extremely foolhardy with one less imaginative. Bridge involves "playing the people" as well as playing the cards.

#### UNIQUENESS

In bridge, exact situations are virtually never duplicated. The reason for this is that there are no fewer than 53,

644,737,765,488,792,8
39,237,440,000 possible situations (deals), so you are most unlikely ever to see the same one recur twice in your lifetime, even if you play every day. Thus, every situation will offer something unique. (Certain general principles, however, are useful in many different situations, and their mastery is rewarding to serious students of the game.)

For reasons such as these, bridge is enjoyed by millions of participants and is commonly regarded as one of the two best card games in existence. Unlike its competitor for the popularity title, poker, bridge need not be played for stakes to be interesting, an advantage that is particularly appealing in an era of rising prices and taxes.


