Ocean Reef Club Forges 2nd Partnership With Coral Restoration Foundation

It has been eight years since Ocean Reef Club entered into its first partnership with the Coral Restoration FoundationTM (CRFTM) to help rebuild the corals and reefs that play such an

important role in life at Ocean Reef and in the Florida Keys. Today, the Club is proud to announce it has committed to another five-year partnership with CRF to continue the support of coral reef restoration.

The Coral Restoration
Foundation, founded in
2007, is a Key Largo-based
nonprofit created to develop
offshore coral nurseries and
restoration strategies for
critically endangered coral
reefs. What began as a local
effort, has grown into a globally
recognized organization. CRF
has been successfully growing
and transplanting corals for more
than a decade throughout the
Keys and beyond, supporting

international restoration efforts. The restoration process involves growing staghorn, elkhorn and boulder corals for about a year in an underwater nursery until they are large enough to be outplanted on a reef.


Ocean Reef Club's relationship with Coral Restoration
Foundation first began in 2013
through an innovative program in which Members could "adopt a coral" and watch it grow for a year in one of Coral Restoration Foundation's nurseries. With this relationship, the Club and the Ocean Reef Conservation Association became CRF's first community donors. Then in 2015, the Club committed to a groundbreaking five-year

collaboration with CRF to bring Carysfort Reef, one of the world's most iconic reefs that lies just five miles from Ocean Reef's shore, back to life. Called "Carysfort 2020", the goal was to outplant 30,000 corals at Carysfort Reef over the span of five years. By 2020's end, not only had CRF exceeded their

Gotta Question?

Do we need to make reservations for Equity-Only Nights? And when booking online, how will other Members know those nights are Equity-Only?



Non-Equity Members looking to book reservations will not be given the option to book a reservation on an Equity-Only Night. Because you are logged in with your Member number, the system recognizes your Member type and therefore only shows what is available to that Member type. For example, if a Legacy Member is logged



into the website and visits oceanreef.com/Dining and selects Gianni Ristorante, they will not be shown any availability on a Monday, which is Gianni's Equity-Only Night. The same goes for the other three nights — Ocean Room on Tuesdays, CH Prime on Wednesdays, and Islander on Thursdays.

Also of note, while these are considered Equity-only nights, Equity Members may host non-Equity Members and/or guests during these reservations as long as the Equity Member that booked the reservation is present.

Coral Restoration Foundation

Continued from | 1 goal with 35,108 corals being outplanted, effectively saving Carysfort Reef from extinction, but the efforts have paved the way for large-scale reef restoration, providing hope for coral reefs around the world.

"For so many of our Members, the Florida Keys environment is a primary reason they choose Ocean Reef Club," said Ocean Reef Club President Alex Tonarelli. "Therefore, the Club recognizes how important it is to our Members to preserve and enhance our environment for many future generations to enjoy. That is the reason the Club partnered with CRF back in 2015, and coupled with the tremendous success, why the Club Board has agreed to do so again."

The impact of the initial partnership with CRF provided



inspiration for launching Floridabased Mission: Iconic Reefs, a collaborative effort facilitated by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to coordinate the work of different restoration organizations in the Florida Keys under a unified plan, along with proving that large-scale restoration work can improve livelihoods and diversify the local economy.

Additionally, the success of the ORC/CRF project has helped to attract investments from other

public and private organizations. The project has bi-partisan support in the federal government and is a model for similar restoration projects around the globe. In fact, the U.S. Congress recently passed a bill, co-sponsored by U.S. Senator Marco Rubio, that significantly increases federal funding to coral restoration projects. Mission: Iconic Reefs will restore almost three million square feet of Florida's coral reef, about the size of 52 football fields, at seven key reef sites. As a direct result of the success of Carysfort 2020, Carysfort Reef is at the heart of Mission: Iconic Reefs, receiving the bulk of the restoration work outlined in the plan.

"Ocean Reef Club has consistently demonstrated their commitment to the community of the Florida Keys through their support of our critical coral reef ecosystem," said Dr. R. Scott Winters, CEO, Coral Restoration Foundation. "The impact they made through the five-year Carysfort 2020

initiative, hosting Raise the Reef and the Reef Futures symposium, is also having an incredible, global ripple effect; the work we are doing together has inspired not only the Florida-based Mission: Iconic Reefs plan but also a wave of large-scale coral restoration initiatives worldwide. We are thrilled that we will be continuing to build this legacy together."

The Club's five-year commitment will be used exclusively for coral restoration at Carysfort Reef, which lies right in Ocean Reef's own backyard, and will include site preparation, the removal of some nuisance species, outplanting of approximately 14,000 genetically diverse reef-building corals, and post-outplanting site maintenance and monitoring.

MAKING HISTORY

By Land, Sea and... Air

Officially opened for business in 1951, Ocean Reef Club was off and running. The Club was accessible by land and many drove down from southern Florida. Access was also gained by water as many yachts found their way south from the Florida coast. But Morris Baker, always thinking ahead, wanted access by air. He envisioned members from the north, such as himself being able to jump in a plane and land at Ocean Reef, spend a few days and go home. He thought an airport



would be crown jewel of the Club's attributes.

The original plan was to build a 2,000 foot runway adjacent to Barracuda Lane. (Remember, the Barracuda Golf Course, now known as Card Sound was not yet constructed.) The exact orientation of the runway has its own unique story. At that time, different proposals were being offered on how best the Keys could be accessed by land. One of the proposals was a highway from Key Biscayne to Key Largo

that would pass over Elliot Key and directly through Ocean Reef. Baker saw such a highway as potentially very disruptive to his plans for further development as it would split his property in two. At that time, the specific route of the highway through Ocean Reef was not known, so Mr. Baker aligned the runway with an orientation he hoped the highway would take to minimize the effect it would have. Fortunately, the choice was made to construct the highway the way it is now, a wise choice that benefits us today.

The 3,000 foot landing strip was completed and dedicated May 18, 1956 fulfilling Baker's dream of the Club being accessible by land, sea and air. A grass hut served as the terminal building and featured a sign that said: 'Elevation: 1 foot 5 3/4 inches'. (Note: Monroe County records indicate the length as 2,000 feet, but 3,000 feet is more likely accurate.)

In the ensuing years, the popularity of the airport grew and it was lengthened in 1967 to its present 4,456 feet and a terminal building was constructed which remains today. Small airline companies that normally flew in the northeast in the summer considered using our airfield. One such company was Montauk Caribbean Airways of New York who formed a southern division

actually called Ocean Reef Airways. Operating flights between Miami and ORC, all passengers had to be members or guests. They flew Piper Navajos and Beech Barons.

Later, another airline, Provincetown-Boston (PBA) began a scheduled service flying between Key West and Miami stopping at ORC. They also offered service to Nassau for a short time. Into ORC, they used Cessna 402's. After several accidents, none of which was at Ocean Reef, PBA was sold to Bar Harbor Airlines and service to ORC was halted.

Today, our airport is a testament to Morris Baker's vision and the phenomenal success of our Club. It remains today as one of the very few exclusive Club's in the world with modern airport access.

(Interesting detail: One of many special quests that arrived at our airport was Jackie Onassis in 1978. With her son John and daughter Caroline, they had requested strict privacy. Sonny Vasquez greeted her at the airport but the first thing Jackie saw was a photographer from The Enquirer who Sonny quickly dispatched. After a couple days, Jackie called Harper Sibley and said she would like to meet some people so he took her to a cocktail party at Don Hindman's house that night. She stayed the whole evening, drank club soda, and everyone enjoyed each other's company.)

His scholarship was taken note of by Rome, and he was invited to the Gregorian University there where he earned a second Bachelor's and a Licentiate in Sacred Theology as well as a Doctorate in Philosophy, summa cum laude. Msgr Cleves has developed an understanding of multiple languages including Italian, German, French, Spanish, Portuguese, Dutch, and Latin.

While in Rome, Monsignor Cleves was offered a position in the Vatican Diplomatic Corps, but he chose to return to Kentucky in 1992 to become president of St. Thomas More College where he remained for 18 years.

Monsignor Cleves is very much a part of our day-to-day world. You can find his podcast, Catholic Soup, on Holy Spirit Catholic Parish website; each episode has a timely and clear message for us. He is also the author of several books, including *Stories in Glass*, a tour of the stained glass at the Cathedral Basilica of the Assumption in Covington, KY.

We look forward to welcoming him to our community.

- Rich and Margo Miller's great-grandson – Richard


Miller Roehrborn. This was a celebration of the goodness of faith and family legacy that is such a value here at Ocean Reef.


Farmer's Market Favorites





Keep Your **Head Still**



"Tennis Tip" by Ricardo Martin, Tennis Professional

It is important to remember to keep your head still when contacting the ball.

The main reason to focus on keeping a still head is that it helps us hit more shots in the "sweet spot". Keeping your head still during contact also allows

you to keep your balance.

If you are pulling away your head during contact, you will be miss-hitting the ball slightly. This results in a bad shot because the racket doesn't give the ball enough power. Hitting by only a few centimeters off of the center gives you 30 or 40 percent less power.

If we jerkily move the head at the moment of contact, we disturb our balance, which affects our ability to hit a good shot.

Next time you go on the tennis court, make sure to focus on this tip. I promise you will notice a positive difference in your game!

Fitness can significantly improve through focus, consistency, and a proper understanding of what works. Here is some practical advice to make your time in the gym more effective and efficient:

- 1. Prepare your body for each exercise. Start slow and light before progressing to faster-pace movement and heavier resistances for each body part and muscle group you exercise.
- 2.Complete and balanced fitness programs include strength, conditioning, flexibility, and mobility components. The focus of each workout can be different, but these components should all be developed every week.
- 3. The harder we workout, the more time we need to spend in recovery sessions, such as massage and stretching, to avoid overuse injuries and to reduce general fatigue. Ice and compression also play an essential role in recovery. Ask our fitness staff for our new Normatec compression system.

eat provide the type of energy our bodies and brains operate on.

- 7. A massage gun should be as ubiquitous as a toothbrush. Have one at home and use it every day.
- 8. It is ok to workout and be active every day.
 Our bodies perform better when they move often and are pushed to improve. Avoid being sedentary and embrace an active lifestyle.
- 9. Work on weak areas every day. Weak areas are old or recent injuries that can flare if we ignore them. Keep chronic pain at bay with range of motion

exercises, strengthening hip and shoulder stabilizers, increasing core strength, regular massage, and stretching.

10. Work on becoming more aware. Be aware of your posture, your movements, your breath, muscle tension, etc. Awareness is developed through focused and regular introspection. of involving their own bodies and biomechanics to help create more efficiency in their golf swings. The basis is that not everyone is built the same way, so we should all swing according to our individual ways of movement.

How Do We Tailor a Golf Swing to the Individual in Front of Us?

We measure:

- Wing Span vs Height
- Forearm vs Upper Arm
- External Shoulder Rotation
- Grip Style
- Low Body Pivot

Through these measurements, we create a setup or a foundation that is appropriate to the individual, not to the average player. From there, we are able to generate more speed and power as a result of being more efficient.

Elon Musk Lands on **Jupiter**

Whatever you think about Elon Musk, there is little doubt that his SpaceX Starlink satellite communications package is transformative for mariners cruising remote locations.

Last summer we acquired a Starlink (https://www.starlink. com/) bundle of joy aboard our exploration vessel, Jupiter, to provide data and voice connectivity when navigating the wilderness waters of British Columbia and Southeast Alaska. Cellular and wifi data is only occasionally available near larger settlements of the Pacific Northwest and is often of poor quality. Our older KVH sat data and voice system was absurdly

expensive and awkward to use.

We ordered and quickly received a Starlink RV setup which cost \$600 plus \$135 per month for fast and unlimited data, which charge can be suspended when not needed. The Starlink unit is not "marinized" as such but is robust and can be installed easily on a rail or stanchion with PVC pipe and hose clamps.

We opted to have our boatvard in Sidney, BC engineer a permanent installation on Jupiter's electronics mast.

Starlink's rectangular antenna with its flat top and convex underside appears strange on a yacht but has proven to be secure underway and in high winds. The top of the antenna can be heated to melt snow and ice and the bottom acts like an inverted wing creating low air pressure below, forcing the unit down onto its mounting. The motorized antenna continuously seeks satellites while we seek adventure along ragged shores and deep inlets.

Locate a chase for the 75-foot

power and data cable from your on-deck antenna to the Starlink router inside and plug it into to a 120-volt outlet and you are shaking hands with the world! With an HDMI cable we tied Starlink into Jupiter's local wifi router, an umbilical connection to any wireless device or vessel component.

Our Starlink system includes everything we desired: fast and reliable voice and data service, working-from-home ability, zooming kids or grandkids or, better yet, face timing technicians at the boat yard to evaluate equipment failures, getting medical advice, or downloading the thrilling miniseries: Coast Guard Florida, Season 1.

It is said: "be careful what you wish for!" We might soon miss those tranquil weeks off the grid. And the most important communications device aboard Jupiter continues to be our VHF radio tuned to Channel 16.

Don't leave the dock without the VHF antenna vertical, radio turned on, and set to channel 16!





BRIDGE TIP

Responding to 1NT with 5-4 in the Majors

When partner opens 1NT, the idea is to see if you have a fit in the Majors. This is done by using Stayman and Jacoby Transfers. But what happens when you have 5-4 in the Majors? This is where a series of bids would show your shape to the NT Opener.

10+ HCPs (Smolen Convention)

With 10 or more points, you want to go to game. Use Stayman first (2 🌲) to find a 4-card major fit. Then if partner bids a major, simply raise it to the 4-level. If partner denies a major (rebidding 2 ♦) then use the Smolen Convention to find a 3-card fit with your 5-card major (since partner denied the 4-card major in either of your majors)

Smolen Convention: Used

to show partner 5-4 in the Majors and game going values. Start with Stayman. Then if partner denies a 4-card major, jump to the 3-level with the shorter major (which partner does not have). Partner will go to game with a 3-card fit or simply bid 3NT. The idea behind this convention is to have the stronger hand play the hand.











