

Rules Reminder:

Guests of Members

As a private club there are a host of rules surrounding sponsored guests, several of which are specific to the membership category of the sponsoring member. Below are select rules from the Club's Rules & Regulations. For the full document, visit oceanreef.com/rules.

The sponsoring member shall be responsible for the conduct of his or her guests. If the manner, deportment or

appearance of any guests is deemed to be unsatisfactory, the sponsoring member shall, at the request of the Club cause such guests to leave the Club.

The Club reserves the right to limit the number of guests that may accompany a member on any given day or the number of times guests other than member's house guests may use the Club's facilities. Currently, guests, other than member's house guests, are limited to using the Club's facilities for no more than two 14-day periods during any five-year period.

Guests of equity members are to register in advance of

their arrival. Guest cards will be issued by the Reservations Department at the Inn.

Guest privileges may be extended under the rules and regulations established by the Club from time to time. Guests of social, local and legacy members must be accompanied and registered to stay overnight at the Club.

A social, local or legacy member of the Club shall be permitted to bring up to six (6) day guests to the Club at one time. Social, local and legacy members must accompany their day guests. Social, local and legacy members cannot provide Club access when they are not at

Best Sellers

Over the last few months I have written a number of columns about our vibrant culinary scene: our remarkable chefs, menus new and old, and dishes that I liked. You are surely bored with my opinions. So today I come armed with facts, laboriously compiled by Chris Patterson, Executive Director of Food & Beverage. Many thanks, Chris. He scoured our records for the most popular dishes in each of our venues. Not by survey comments, but by what Members have actually ordered over the last two months. The results might help you discover some



Islander favorite - the Melanie Roll

Member favorites you have never tried.

The number one crowd-pleasing venue? The Ocean Room Breakfast Buffet with 3416 patrons in the last two months. Ocean Reef's best selling entrée can be found at the Islander, the Melanie Roll (2153 ordered). This is no surprise, as the Ocean Reef classic has been honored as far as the Master's Tournament where it is called the "Augusta Roll." Tiger

Woods requested it for his Champions Dinner. Congrats Sushi Chef Eric. The fish favorites at the Islander are Yellowtail followed by Hogfish.

For the Ocean Room dinner menu, Pad Thai is **number one.** Who knew? I'll have to try it. The Red Snapper is a close second. At Palm Court lunch, the Chinese Chicken Salad is number one (this is Fair Patricia's favorite. I'll have to find out what I have been missing). Second favorite is Mahi Tacos, and third is Spicy Tuna Roll. At **Palm** Court Nights Cantina, Tacos de Tinga is the favorite, followed by the Guacamole and the Steak Taco. Nachos have been added to the menu too recently to measure, but they are terrific. Ask for extra cheese sauce, it's habit forming.

At **Gianni** their most popular item is **Caesar Salad**,

one of the best on The Reef. And top entrée is **Chicken Parmesan**, my long-term favorite. Third, which I haven't tried, but have heard raves, is the Yellowtail Dentice. That leaves plenty of fresh pastas still to explore.

At **CH Prime**, the top three scores describe my favorite dinner perfectly. The **6oz filet** (1437 ordered), the Wedge Salad (928 served), and the Oysters Rockefeller (920). **My two cents**; the food is as beautiful as the new Clubhouse. CH Prime has expanded their days of service this season to meet the growing demand.

If Ocean Reef were a country, our national dish would be... a cheeseburger! The Raw Bar sold nearly 3000 in the last two months. Add the cheeseburgers ordered at the Burgee Bar (1400, their number one item, where wings and French Onion soup are also popular); the Beach Grill (945 cheeseburgers, their #3 scorer just behind the Tender Bucket and Mahi Tacos); and the Grill Room (866 cheeseburgers, their #2 item, where Mahi Tacos and ORC Club also star). There are also untold sliders at the Ocean Reef Lounge and the CH Lounge. It is clear that cows are endangered at Ocean Reef. Oh, and the favorite order from Reef Eats? You guessed it – a cheeseburger. Jimmy Buffet would be proud.







OK, maybe my title is a little extreme, but I really want to urge you not to miss this splendid production of the zany awardwinning comedy 39 Steps.

Zoetic Stage, whose home base is the Adrienne Arsht Center in Miami, is presenting 39 Steps for one night only and for one audience only – members and guests of Ocean Reef Club.

That's right. The actors have learned and rehearsed their roles:



the set, costumes, lighting and sound experts have made their magic; and the esteemed Zoetic director Stuart Meltzer has put it all together – just for us! The result, I assure you, will be an amazing night of live theatre.

"The Play's the Thing"

That's Hamlet, not Hitchcock. And I am pretty sure that, were I to quote Hitchcock, he would say "The Movie's the Thing."

The play 39 Steps is in fact a spoof on the 1959 Hitchcock film North by Northwest, starring Cary Grant and Eva Marie Saint. The plot follows an advertising exec, who goes on the run after being mistaken for a government agent by a group of foreign spies. He falls for a woman, whose loyalties he begins to doubt.

There's food for farce in that plot and in 2008, the adaptation by Patrick Barlow, which featured a cast of four, won the Tony for Best Play.

The Cast of Four

In Zoetic's production one actor (Gabriell Saigado) plays the hero and one actress (Lindsey Corey) plays the three women with whom he becomes romantically involved. The other two actors (Jeni Hacker and Michael McKeever) play every other character in the show — men, women, children, heroes, villains, even the occasional inanimate object.

Michael McKeever is not only

an actor and the scenic designer of the Zoetic production of 39 Steps, he is also a successful playwright. And along with the equally acclaimed Artistic Director Stuart Meltzer, he is the founder of Zoetic Stage.

Michael told me that there were two things that convinced him that 39 Steps would be popular at Ocean Reef. The first: "Stuart and I and the other three actors laughed throughout every rehearsal. The second: "When I am acting in someone else's plays, the playwright in me is always on the lookout for something I might steal and adapt." Michael then confessed that 39 Steps offered some very good loot.

1948

Minneapolis developer Morris Baker opens his fishing camp. It consists of an inn, some small yachtels, a coffee shop, a lounge, a gas station, a few rental boats and the water tower.



1952

Using fill from the dredged channel and marina, the beach and swimming lagoon are created.

1955

A nine-hole golf course opens and Dolphin #14 is the original first hole.

1956

A two thousand foot airstrip is built.



1959

Three hundred home sites become available; priced from \$4,750 to \$17,500.

1960

The Ocean Reef Golf & Country Club opens. The Baker home becomes The Clubhouse and Bob Toski is named Director of Golf.

The Madeira Room and Reef Lounge open on the site of the Ocean Room.



1964

Ocean Reef's first wedding joined Constance Hughes and Kenneth Montgomery at the home of Bob and Betsy Trier.

1965

The first dolphins, Angel and Caesar, arrive. Dolphin performances would continue for the next twenty-nine years at the inlet next to the bridge at Buccaneer Island.

1969

The Tennis Pavilion is built and the first Ocean Reef Tennis Center opens.

The Christmas Caroling Boat makes its inaugural musical voyage.

The Fishing Village construction begins.

1970

Ocean Reef's first resident physician is hired and a medical office opens.

1971

The Ocean Reef Chapel opens.

1976

The Ocean Reef Art League is formed and given the use of a trailer on Barracuda Lane.

The Sunrise Bridge is built.

1977

The first Bag Room Open Tournament is held.



1986

The Reef Cup Invitational Sailfish Tournament debuts with 25 boats.

The fire department and security force are combined and named "Public Safety."

1989

The Little Red Schoolhouse opens with 12 students.



1990

Grass croquet courts are built.

Chef Jacque Pepin instructs a cooking class and the culinary school is born.

First edition of the Ocean Reef Press is published.

1993

The privatization of the Club is completed on March I. The sale of Patron and Charter equities fund the purchase. A parade and celebration are held to honor member ownership.



1994

Vintage Weekend debuts displaying antique yachts, later adding automobiles and aircraft.

The Ocean Reef Foundation is established.



1998

The 4 year \$18 million capital improvement plan is complete including a Member Fitness Center, The Wine Cellar at Carysfort Grille, and a new building for a food market, post office, dry cleaners and entertainment room.

From Schindler's List to the Shoah Foundation

Preserving the Untold Histories of Holocaust Survivors — Including My Grandfather

Emmy Award winning producer Louis Schmidt will visit Ocean Reef on Thursday, February 16 to share his experiences as an interviewer with the Stephen Spielberg USC Shoah Foundation. I sincerely hope that all of you will be able to attend "The Untold Stories of How the Stories Were Told" at 5:00 pm in the Sanctuary of the Ocean Reef Chapel. This event is complimentary and open to the entire ORC community.

Launched by Spielberg in 1994, the Shoah Foundation is dedicated to recording and sharing the stories of Holocaust survivors, educating the public about these atrocities, and creating a historical record to ensure that it will never happen again. As Spielberg has said, "It's not about archiving the past, but it's about understanding, empathy and using testimony to shine a light."

Louis Schmidt has interviewed hundreds of Holocaust survivors. These video testimonies are a crucial part of preserving the historical record which might otherwise be lost with the passing of time.

As the acclaimed author, Nobel Laureate and Holocaust survivor Elie Wiesel explained, "Whoever hears a witness becomes a witness themselves. These stories must not die with them."

The Holocaust is a central



aspect of our shared history, and the first-hand accounts of survivors reveal a sharper focus than any book or movie

possibly could.

In many ways, this is the story of my life. My maternal grandparents, Isidor and Lillie Schonberger (Bubbie and Zeide, Yiddish for Grandmother and Grandfather), were Holocaust survivors. They met in an internment camp after their liberation from the concentration camps. They were both born in Czechoslovakia and deported from their childhood homes with nothing more than the clothes on their backs following Germany's invasion in 1938. My Bubbie was born into a well-to-do Jewish family and sent directly to Auschwitz at the start of the War. I know that her parents were immediately sent to the gas chambers, and my Bubbie was tattooed and put to work in concentration camps for most of her teenage years. Like many survivors, she never talked about her history, and I'm sure there was a good reason for that. But when she died suddenly in 1995, so too did her story, another missing piece in the larger story of the Holocaust.

When I was a child, my Zeide never talked about the Holocaust either, but he agreed to be interviewed by the Shoah Foundation after Bubbie died. I still remember when he was interviewed at

my house in 1996. I was 12. The interview lasted 9 hours, and at the end, my sisters, mother, aunt, and I appeared on camera with Zeide. I remember how proud he was to have lived to pass his life on to future generations.

I never watched the interview until 2011. My mother kept the tapes in a safe and could barely acknowledge their existence, much less share them with me. So, when I became pregnant and was considering names for my little boy, I contacted Shoah directly and received copies, which my husband and I watched over the course of the next three nights with our jaws on the floor throughout.

Today, the Shoah
Foundation's Holocaust
Survivors Database

summarizes my Zeide's story by listing the ghetto to which he was deported as a 14-yearold, his escape during his deportation and subsequent hiding in cellars, the eight concentration camps he survived in Hungary, Austria, Germany, Czechoslovakia, and Poland, and his "forced (death) marches" as the War was ending. That was his childhood. When the War ended, my Zeide was 21, but the tapes go further by describing how he met my Bubbie, how they ended up in America, and how he found success as a nightclub and liquor store owner in Washington, D.C. with a loving family surrounding him.

Watching the recording of his Shoah interview opened a new layer of my relationship with my Zeide, one where we could talk about his experience -- although he would always prefer to do so with as few words as possible. It was through this experience that Zeide chose the name Joseph for our son, in honor of his eldest brother, Joseph, who ended up in Russia after liberation. When our son Joseph was born, he and Zeide established a deep and instant bond. I'll always remember the light in Zeide's eyes seeing baby Joseph, the first male descendant of Zeide's family since before the War (complete with blonde hair and bright blue eyes just like a young Zeide).

Zeide died in 2015 when Joseph was only 3. I will always be grateful for the time they had together, and my pictures and videos of Zeide looking happier than I had ever seen him. I am also eternally grateful to the **Shoah Foundation**, for capturing my Zeide's history, allowing us to talk about it, and for preserving a critical part of human history that connects us all.

Never Forget

Memories are the storehouse of human experience.
Memory according to a Harvard University study is "the ongoing process of information retention over time." This ongoing process of neural activity in our brain first records, then stores, and finally retrieves (sometimes) the information stored there. How it all works is still something of a mystery.

As you reach a certain age, the retrieval mechanism seems to develop a 'short' in the circuitry. You walk into a room and stand there for a moment trying to remember why the heck you came there! Those are affectionately referred to as "senior moments." As we all say, "It's real."

Many of us have friends or loved ones who have experienced or are experiencing some degree of dementia or Alzheimer's disease. It is painful to watch as the light of recognition slowly dims from the eyes of a loved one or friend. My paternal grandmother spent the final 25 years of her life, sitting in a rocking chair, patting her knee. My grandfather always called her his "sweetie."

There are many wonderful experiences in life we want to always remember, to treasure. There are also painful experiences that we must never forget. Some of those painful experiences can be so severe that we repress them, hide them in some neural closet and throw away the key.

What is true of our lives as individuals also applies to events taking place on a larger, societal scale.

One such event was the diabolical "final solution" of Hitler's Third Reich. Their unconscionable goal was to make the world *Judenfrie* – to "cleanse" the world of Jews. The Holocaust, or *shoah*, resulted in the death of more than six-million Jews – women, men, and children.

What is sobering is the alarming rise of anti-Semitism today, both in the United States and across the world. Particularly distressing is the increasing number of those who deny that the Holocaust took place at all.

My wife and I have walked in stunned silence through the ovens of Auschwitz, and along the rail tracks leading to the acres of barracks and remains of the gas chambers at Birkenau.

On every visit to Israel, we take our groups to Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Museum in Jerusalem where the horrific reality of the shoah is on full display.

The holocaust is an abomination in human history that must never be forgotten, never allowed to be removed from our collective memory.

Thankfully, one man has made it his mission to "Never Forget." That man is Louis Schmidt, and he is coming to speak at Ocean Reef.

Schmidt is a former Emmy winning producer at NFL films. His career spanned 30 years. Beginning in the 1990s, he trained to record testimony of Holocaust Survivors for the USC Shoah Foundation, then a project of filmmaker Steven Spielberg's DreamWorks Studios.

Mr. Schmidt has interviewed dozens of Holocaust Survivors.
Despite the horror of their experiences, he was instructed to remain as professionally detached as possible. In this way, the testimonies he recorded would be as objective as possible and preserved for later generations.

Elie Wiesel, a survivor of

the camps, in his book Night, wrote, "For the survivor who chooses to testify, it is clear: his duty to bear witness for the dead and for the living. He has no right to deprive future generations of a past that belongs to our collective memory. To forget would be not only dangerous but offensive; to forget the dead would be akin to killing them a second time."

Only recently has Mr. Schmidt begun to speak about his experiences. We are grateful that he is coming to the Ocean Reef Chapel & Fellowship Center to speak about his own journey on **Thursday, February 16** at **5 p.m.** His presentation, sponsored by Congregation Ocean Reef, will be entitled, "The Untold Story of How the Stories are Told."

Preserving these stories and educating others is

incumbent, not only upon Jews of every generation, but every person of moral conscience. Remembering the atrocities inflicted upon European Jewry in World War II is a moral obligation upon all, in-order-to stand guard against the rise of tyranny in this and future generations.

My hope is that the chapel will be filled to overflowing to hear this timely presentation of such great consequence. With the death of survivors, these events are beginning to erode from the storehouse of our collective memory.

My encouragement, whether a person of faith, or no faith, is to attend this presentation, first to understand, and then be prepared to speak so that the reality of this tragic memory is never forgotten. This must never happen again.



The Future is Now: OpenAl's ChatGBT & Dall-e 2

If you live on planet Earth, then there is no way to avoid hearing about Artificial Intelligence (AI). It's a term first coined in the 1950s but has embedded itself in our lives in so many ways; it's a future that technology naysayers have predicted for decades -- you know, the one where computers take over the world.

we predict if something has been generated by AI? In milliseconds it responded:

It also raises concerns about privacy and security, job displacement, and ethical considerations. There are various techniques to monitor AI-generated images and writings. One approach is using machine learning algorithms to detect it as synthetic. Another approach involves creating digital fingerprints of AI-generated content."

Uh-oh. Visions of a dystopic Orwellian future and a computer named HAL 9000 washed over me. Would scientists safeguard our future?



by a colorful coral reef or upload vour own photo and create new backgrounds. It's fun for creating party invitations, for social media, and more; sign in and receive 15 free images each month.


While I have not turned to Al to write my column (this one doesn't count) OpenAI's Chat GBT and Dall-e 2 are great sites for graphics or to

it was perfect. Lincoln was never satisfied with "good enough." Good whiskey is always worth waiting for, and we never want to forget that.



TRX Training at Member **Fitness**


The TRX training system, also known as Total Resistance Exercises, was developed in 2005 by former U.S. Navy SEAL Randy Hetrick. TRX is a form of suspension training that uses body weight exercises to develop strength, balance, flexibility and core stability simultaneously. It requires the use of the TRX Suspension Trainer, a performance training tool that turns every exercise into a challenge for your core by using two simple resources: gravity and your body weight. TRX Training can improve mobility and stability, increase metabolic results, build lean muscle, and develop functional strength. Even if you have never used a TRX training system before, you can start by incorporating these 5 moves into your next workout, or join trainer Hannah Whistler at the Member Fitness Center for a TRX strength class offered Wednesdays at 11 a.m. in the outdoor gym to learn more.

1. Move: TRX Low Row

Targets: Back, lats, biceps, abdominals

Difficulty: Beginner

How-to: Stand facing the TRX straps, and grab the handles with palms facing each other. Lean all the way back until your weight is driving down through your heels. Extend arms in front of you and engage your core. Squeeze shoulder blades together and keep core tight as you bend your elbows and pull your torso towards the straps at the belly button or just above. Slowly lower to return to the starting position. To make this exercise more challenging, step

closer to the straps creating a steeper angle.

2. Move: TRX Chest Press

Targets: Chest, triceps, shoulders, abdominals Difficulty: Beginner

How-to: Stand facing the TRX straps, with feet shoulder-width apart. Grab the handles with an overhand grip and extend your arms in front of you at shoulder height. With your core engaged. lean forward so your body is at a slight angle. Bend your elbows and lower chest between hands. Mimicking a push up, engage your chest and arms as you push vourself back up to the starting position. To make this exercise more challenging, step further back to creating a steeper angle.

3. Move: TRX Reverse Lunge

Targets: Glutes, quads, abdominals

Difficulty: Beginner

How-to: Stand facing the TRX, holding both handles in front of your waist with elbows bent by your sides. Engage through the core, step one foot back, while bringing the knee to a hover above the ground and extend your arms at eye level. As you drive through the heel of the front foot, bring the back foot up to the starting position. To make this exercise more challenging, drive the back knee upwards toward your chest instead of placing the foot on the ground after standing up.

4. Move: TRX Squat

Targets: Quads, glutes, hamstrings, abdominals

Difficulty: Beginner

How-to: Stand facing the TRX, holding both handles in front of your waist with elbows bent by your sides. Lower into a squat, extending arms in front of you at eye level. Drive through your heels to return

to the starting position. Avoid pulling yourself up with the straps, and focus on squeezing your glutes to help you stand up. To make this exercise more challenging, add a jump while standing up.

5. Move: TRX Ab Rollout

Targets: Abdominals, shoulders

Difficulty: Intermediate

How-to: Stand facing the TRX straps, grabbing the handles in front of your hips with an overhand grip. Engage your core and slowly start to lift your arms keeping the palms facing down, creating an angled straight line with your body. Keep the core engaged the entire time, not allowing hips to drop. Engaging through the shoulders and keeping arms straight, drive hands towards the floor to return to starting position. Do not 'rollout' further than you are able to pull yourself back up. To make this exercise more challenging, step further back to create a steeper angle.

Safe Boating Tip #12: Personal Flotation Device (PFD)

Have you ever offered a PFD to a family member or guest on your boat only to have them say something like, thanks, but I don't need one right now; or I'm a great swimmer, or some other excuse? So what do you do?

First, make sure you know the rules set by the USCG and the State of Florida, which you can learn by attending classes on boating safety given at Ocean Reef by Dr. **Peter Liashek** of the Ocean Reef Flotilla of the USCGAUX; research the subject online (such as taking the course offered by Boat.Ed/Kalkoney Enterprises LLC); call Commander Bob Broton and schedule a free vessel exam where Bob can help you learn if you have enough PFDs on your vessel (as well as answer questions you may have about the numerous varieties to choose from); attend Safe Boating Day at Buccaneer Island on Thursday, April 6 (where you can see a display of PFDs and get advice from Mary Brady, Chair of the event, regarding a vest for your dog.) Then, help the boat passenger understand all the reasons why they should wear a PFD on your boat, and why they should know where you keep the flotation items that you can throw in the water to help someone.

Tell them about the USCG recreational boating statistics for the year 2021: "Where the

cause of death was known, 81 percent of fatal boating accident victims drowned and 83% of the drowning victims were not wearing a life vest."

Captain Troy Glendye, chief of the Office of Auxiliary and Boating Safety at CG Headquarters, states, "A life jacket is one of the most important safety items on your boat. It is critical to wear one when underway as it may be difficult to don in an emergency. The CG reminds boaters to ensure life jackets are serviceable, properly sized, correctly fastened, and suitable for your activity."

Pickleball Strategy: Return of Serve



"Pickleball Tip" by Frankie Ngo, Pickleball Professional

The three goals for a return of serve in pickleball:

1. Put the ball back in play—This may be obvious, but sometimes we get a little bit overzealous and try to smack the ball back as hard as we can. Work on getting your return of serve to land in the court (and the deeper the better).

2. Get to the net – A strong return of serve that is deep (and in) will help you and your partner get set at the net. It is easier to win points at the net so


the team that gets there first has the advantage.

a short return of serve – Hitting a short return of serve – Hitting a short return gives your opponents (the serving team) a better chance to get to the net quickly. Short returns are typically a result of a hard serve – it can leave you feeling handcuffed and reactive. Position yourself further back to receive when you are expecting a hard serve. It's easier to move forward on a shorter serve than backward on a deeper serve.

Attacking a short return of serve in pickleball

A short return of serve is a gift to the serving team because it sets up a strong third shot. You can do two things when you have a short incoming return of serve: a drop or a drive.

- **3."Help my partner"**—how can you help your partner ball so they are in an improved position?

BRIDGE TIP:

Balancing After Both Opponents Have Bid

When the opponents have stopped at a low-level contract, you will often want to make a balancing bid or takeout double to try to find a contract of your own. Fairly aggressive balancing bids are especially popular at matchpoint (pairs) play, where the rewards can be great. However, there is some risk in entering the auction after the opponents have exchanged information, so you should adopt a more conservative balancing style in IMP (team) games and Rubber Bridge.

To determine whether or not you should reopen the

bidding in these situations, keep these general rules in mind:

THE BEST TIME TO BALANCE IS WHEN:

1. The opponents have stopped in a low-level suit part score (1 or 2) - especially if it's possible that you can find a 2-level contract of your own (they've stopped in 2C, 2D, or 2H or below).

- 2. The opponents have found a trump fit (they have bid and raised a suit).
- 3. The opponents have limited their high-card strength (they have willingly stopped in a part score).
- 4. You have length and highcard strength in the unbid

suit(s).

5. You're not vulnerable. The opponents will be less tempted to double because a set would only score +100 instead of +110 or +140.

THE WORST SITUATIONS FOR BALANCING ARE WHEN:

- 1. You are extremely weak (fewer than 7-8 pts.).
- 2. You have a strong holding in their suit or you suspect they have a better contract available.
- 3. The opponents haven't found a good trump fit (they've stopped in 1NT or had an auction that suggests a misfit). Typical non-fitting auctions are 1H-1NT; 1C-1S-1NT-P; 1C-1H-2C-2H; 1H-1S-2D-P.
- 4. Your honor cards are in the opponents' suits (especially the suit bid on your left).
- 5. You're vulnerable -- the opponents are more likely to double because a one-trick set (+200) will be greater than the value of their part score.
