Rules Reminder: Suspension & Termination of Membership Privileges


MAKING HISTORY

Forty Acres Here – Forty Acres There

By the mid-1950's, Morris Baker's Ocean Reef Club was coming into its own. Advertising was mostly by word of mouth, but the boaters who came for their first season enjoyed the old Florida ambiance and the fishing so much that they returned the following year and brought their friends. Bone fishing and deep-sea fishing were still Ocean Reef's main attractions, but Baker was always keenly aware that additional amenities would be needed especially to drive future real estate success.

In 1954, Morris Baker finally built his own residence on North Key Largo's only hill. Moreover, because his feet were always planted firmly in the present while his head and heart lived in the future. Baker designed their home on Card Sound so that it could easily be converted into a clubhouse for the Ocean Reef Golf and Country Club he'd had in mind since the very beginning. The home was located next to Baker Harbor, now the location of Card Sound Sailing Club, which he had dredged so he could dock his boat nearby. He'd begun purchasing land for the golf course several years earlier and had obtained the only high ground available.

Morris' son Roger Baker described those acquisitions saying, "You have to understand that development money was not available in wholesale quantity. This was kind of bottle fed to take a piece and develop it, and

take another piece. The land acquisition was tracking along the same way, 40 acres here, and 40 acres there."

One of the forty-acre plots was acquired from the Reimersbug (Pennsylvania) Coal Company, but the largest - seven hundred acres was purchased from the Crane plumbing family of Minneapolis. Concerning the dredge and fill operations, Baker said, "Let me put it this way. There will never be another Ocean Reef. You would never be able to do it today because of the new regulations." According to Mrs. Baker, those seven hundred acres had first been platted and owned by wealthy Miami developer Richter Clyde Perky during the real estate boom of the 1920s. Today Perky is mainly remembered for a plan he devised to control mosquitoes. Basing his plan on research done by a Texas physician, he built two towers on Sugarloaf Key and lead them with bat bait. The idea was to lure large numbers of bats to the towers. Since mosquitoes comprised a major staple of the bats' diet, he felt sure having a lot of bats in the area would

drastically reduce the mosquito population. Unfortunately, a hurricane in 1929 severely damaged the towers and his scheme failed.

Through no fault of his own, Mr. Perky, who had been a very successful developer in Miami, had no luck in real estate in the Keys. On Key Largo, he built a road that ended at his platted lots near Pumpkin Creek where he sold a few parcels, but he lost most of the land for back taxes when Florida's real estate market tanked. Mrs. Baker also recalled that eighty-acres of Mr. Perky's land were purchased by General Ivor-Thorn Gray, a storied mercenary who served with Swedish, British, and Chinese armies. In 1935, then-Florida Governor David Scholz named him major general of the Florida militia and chief of the governor's personal staff. On this land, General Gray built a three-bedroom home he named Grayvik. He later sold the home to the Horace Hills Irvine lumber family of St. Paul, Minnesota. Morris Baker later purchased the land from the Irvine family and used the home as an office building.

And the Winners Are...

Of the many wonderful events that take place during All Charities Weekend, one of the Members' favorites is voting on what new wines will be featured property-wide on all Club wine lists. As in year's past, there were 10 white wines and 10 red wines to choose from. It was a wonderful turnout last Friday, keeping up with Ocean Reef traditions. So here are your 2023 All Charities wines:

2022 Long Meadow Ranch Sauvignon Blanc, Rutherford, California

In the late 1800s, the majestic Long Meadow Ranch property thrived with vineyards, apple orchards, olive groves, hay and a goat milk dairy until farming fell dormant during Prohibition. Over the following years, the property became swallowed by the encroaching forest until the Halls bought the property in 1989. The Hall family carefully breathed life back into the land, nurturing it back to its glory, and then some, by cutting back the abandoned olive trees and replanting the vineyards and apple orchards as you see them growing today. Home to the Mayacamas Estate, the rugged 650-acre landscape nestled in the foothills of the Mayacamas Mountains also gave way to a long, sweeping meadow, thus the name Long

Meadow Ranch was born. An excellent Rutherford growing season produced lovely uniform Sauvignon Blanc fruit that resulted in an outstanding wine full of concentration and complexity. A mouthwatering acidity adds energy to elegant aromas of lemongrass, grapefruit, Bearss lime, honeydew melon, and kiwi that were retained in the precision of a slow cold fermentation.

2021 Orin Swift "Abstract" Red Blend, California

One of many definitions of the word abstract, is a summary of something larger, encompassing the crucial elements, making it easy to comprehend on the fly. Abstract, in its own way, is an abstract of Orin Swifts winemaking mission. It will always have his signature drinkability, comprised of fruit from quality vineyards across California and creates conversations—be it about the wine or the label. For those new to Orin Swift. Abstract is a beloved starting point. An opaque purple core with a glowing mauve rim, the 2021 Abstract brings forth opening aromas of muddled blue and blackberries with a frame of dark chocolate brownie and seasoned leather. The wine enters with class, being soft and lush, with notes of ripe plum, boysenberry and Santa Maria tri-tip. Grippy, chewy tannins, the wine closes with pleasing sarsaparilla and blackcurrant. It is a blend of Grenache, Petite Sirah and Syrah.

These wines will be making their debut in all outlets starting next week as we get new wine lists printed throughout property. As always, they will be in Port O' Call as well.

Age Old Concerns

My daughter Ashley was sure her life was over when she was about to turn thirty... thirty was SO OLD. I repeated the usual platitude -- age is just a number. In her birthday card I told her, "When you were born, I was 29 times your age. When you were 10, I was only four times your age. Now that you are 30, I am less than twice your age. Before you know it, we will be THE SAME AGE!" She shrugged it off as "goofy Dad math." She survived crashing through the age-thirty barrier with no discernable impairment.

But now, as I contemplate the current situation, I seem to be aging. I have noticed that all our friends are aging. Even our young friends go on getting older with alarming regularity. It's like Mark Twain said about the weather, "Everyone complains about

it, but nobody does anything about it." Fortunately, Ed and **Barbara Hajim** (who are both ageless) are helping to address our plight. They are generously sponsoring the Ocean Reef visit of friend and noted expert Dr. Annette Medina-Walpole, Chief of Geriatrics and Director of the University of Rochester Aging Institute. Dr. Walpole will present a free lecture in the Cultural Center, February 22nd, at 3 p.m. She will talk about what helps us to be young -- hobbies, physical activities, creative endeavors, social engagement -- and details the research to back it up.

Aging is an inevitable, natural and lifelong process that each of us will experience. Many factors influence the way we age. Some of these, such as genetics, are not in our control. Others like exercise, diet, social engagement, and addressing our mental health — are within our reach. There is no 'Fountain of Youth', so we must take charge of our own health and lives as we age. Dr. Medina-Walpole will share her expertise and the science behind how each of us can ensure that we age with vitality.

Ann Patchett is a celebrated author, devoted reader, and a champion of literary culture. She published her first story in *The Paris Review*, while still a student at Sarah Lawrence College. She has now written 13 books and is the recipient of numerous awards and fellowships, including the PEN/Faulkner Award, and a Guggenheim Fellowship.

In 2011, when the last of Nashville's bookstores closed, Ann said, "I have no interest in living in a city without a bookstore." In November of that year, she opened Parnassus Books, and has since become a spokesperson for independent booksellers.

In 2012, *TIME* named Ann one of the 100 Most Influential People in the World for her efforts on behalf of the literary community. Novelist Elizabeth Gilbert described Ann as a "woman of wisdom, determination, generosity and courage."

Ann's novel, "Bel Canto," was awarded both the Orange Prize and the PEN/Faulkner Award. The renowned Lyric Opera Company of Chicago commissioned a production based on the novel that the *Chicago Tribune* called "a thoughtprovoking production worthy of a world-class opera company."

In 2016, Ann released her seventh novel, "Commonwealth," which was selected as a *New York Times* Best Book of the Year, a *TIME* Magazine Top 10 Selection, and was a NBCC Award Finalist. In 2019, Ann published her first children's book, "Lambslide," and a novel, "The Dutch House," which was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize and sold more than a million copies. Ann's latest, "These Precious Days: Essays," is a collection that reflects on home, family, friendships and writing.

The American Heart Association recommends a group of key measures called "Life's Essential 8" for better cardiovascular health and to lower the risk of heart attack, stroke and other major health problems.

Eat Better

Eat whole foods, fruits and vegetables, lean proteins, limit sugar, alcohol and red meat, and avoid tropical oils like coconut and palm oil.

Be More Active

Strive for two and a half hours of moderate exercise per week. Sit less and move more!

Quit Tobacco

Within one year of quitting, your risk of heart disease goes down by half.

Get Healthy Sleep

Aim for 7 to 9 hours of sleep daily. Good sleep promotes healing, improves brain function and reduces the risk of chronic disease.

Manage Weight

Control your portions, stay active, and eat a healthy diet.

Control Cholesterol

Your healthcare professional can measure blood cholesterol and help you understand what the levels mean. Track your cholesterol levels over time and take steps to reduce high cholesterol. •HDL = GOOD: High-density lipoprotein is known as "good" •LDL = BAD: Low-density lipoprotein is known as "bad" cholesterol.

•HDL: Helps keep LDL from sticking to artery walls and reduces plaque buildup. This process can lower the risk of heart disease and stroke.

Triglycerides: The most common type of fat in the body.
Total Cholesterol: HDL level + LDL level + 1/5th of triglyceride level = total cholesterol level.

Manage Blood Sugar

Your healthcare professionals can take blood glucose readings and provide recommendations. If you're diagnosed with Type 2 diabetes, you will need to monitor your blood sugar level regularly. Lower than 100 mg/ dl is considered a normal healthy range.

Manage Blood Pressure

Know your blood pressure levels. A diagnosis of high blood pressure must be confirmed with a medical professional. A doctor should also evaluate any unusually low blood pressure readings.



The Most Perplexing Question?

Fifty years ago this November, I was ordained a pastor by a small, growing congregation in suburban Milwaukee. I didn't expect it, and my wife didn't want it. She had declared emphatically she would never be a pastor's wife, having not seen an appealing example in her formative years. She's done well, all things considered!

What does that mean for me? It means I'm getting old. Fifty years doing anything is a lot of time. It also means I've seen a lot of things – many wonderful, some wacky, and a few you'd have to call terrible.

There was a nurse suffering rheumatoid arthritis who chose to end the pain. Rosy was a beautiful young woman whose brain aneurysm burst while brushing her teeth. John was a college freshman out on a morning run who failed to see a train coming on the second track. Odie, Martha, and their daughter hydroplaned, crossed the median, and had a head-on collision. An eight-year-old boy named Trey had an inoperable egg-shaped tumor in his brain stem. A daring young man unsuccessfully attempted a maneuver flying a parasail off our ski-mountain. A promising teen took the partydrug 'molly' on Friday and took his own life on Monday. My brother died of a rare cancer while in his thirties, leaving four children. There was the trip to the morgue with a federal judge and his wife to identify the body of their murdered son.

I could go on with these and many other tragic stories that I have experienced first-hand. My purpose is neither to be morbid nor gloomy.

It is to say that as a pastor, like first responders, trauma physicians, and other care providers, you see human suffering up close and personal. It is not an academic question. Suffering always has a face and a name. The inevitable companions of suffering are unwelcomed grief and often, unanswered questions.

When in the presence of human suffering, the best response is not to be like Job's friends, offering trite advice that provides little comfort. Initially, it is best to simply sit alongside in silence, and like Jesus at Lazarus' tomb, weep with your friends.

Many would say that the most perplexing question any thoughtful person can wrestle with is the problem of human suffering. This "problem of evil" is perhaps the most frequent objection to the existence of God. It is probably the top reason many people give for their unbelief.

"Objectors argue that since there are so many cases of significant pain and suffering in the world, that God could easily prevent, the fact that all this evil was not prevented means it is very unlikely (if not impossible) that God exists.... If God existed, he would be powerful enough to prevent such evil, and good enough to want to prevent such evil."

My intent is not to attempt to answer the question within the generous limits of space I am afforded each week for this column. There's simply not enough of it. And I'm not sure I'm up to the challenge. But I know someone who is!

Dr. Jerry Root is making

a return visit to Ocean Reef this weekend. Jerry is a retired professor from Chicago, who with his wife Claudia, now spend part of their year living in one of those architecturally designed small homes in Santa Barbara, California.

Jerry, who inaccurately describes himself as a 'dufus,' is recognized as one of the most knowledgeable authorities of the works of C.S. Lewis. Lewis saw human suffering up-close and personal in the horrendous conditions he endured as a soldier fighting in the trenches on the front lines in Europe during World War I. He wrestled with what he saw honestly in his writing. suffering is one that either intrigues you or troubles you, let me invite you to come to the **Ocean Reef Chapel** & Fellowship Center this Saturday afternoon. Dr. Root will be leading a conversation on 'C.S. Lewis and the Problem of Evil.' His engaging, thoughtful, and compassionate presentation will begin at 2 p.m.

As I think back on all I have seen during these past 50 years, no one has been more helpful in wrestling with this question of human suffering than C.S. Lewis. And no one has helped me understand Lewis more than Dr. Jerry Root. He'll also be speaking in the **9 a.m. worship service on Sunday morning.**


In the summer of 2018, the university undertook a major institutional restructuring. The ultimate goal of the restructuring was to keep a Saint Francis University education affordable



Each of the servers either pick up a Daily Packet at the Banquet Office or access it online. It lists their event, location, times and even the uniform required (there are six choices). This is a team of 40 full-time servers with most being here at The Reef for over 20 years. Dan proudly shared that these servers have special qualities that go beyond the typical skills of serving. They are a "tenured team" that exemplifies teamwork and passion for their role at every event. This feeling is genuine and the camaraderie is exceptional. They not only care about each other, they care about Ocean Reef Club Members. This positive attitude and general TLC is what makes every event a success.



Most Common Issues Found During Vessel Safety Checks

We are about halfway through the season and I have performed a number of USCG Auxiliary vessel safety checks and have taken a number of cruises on Members' boats. I'd like to review with you a few recurring issues that I have experienced which can lead to unintended problems on the water.

• No boat registration. All

boats are required to have a registration on the boat, just as you have in your car. Likewise, you must also have the current Florida state yearly sticker on the port side of the hull after the registration numbers. This is the number one problem for incomplete vessel checks!

• Life jackets buried in the center console. We have a large number of center consoles here at ORC, and the jackets seem to wind up in the center console storage area, under the towels, boat covers, purses, etc. And, of course, being on the bottom of the pile, they are usually wet and mildewed. These jackets can save your life so please don't put them on the bottom of the pile where they cannot be easily accessed in an emergency!

• Number of life jackets and size. You are required to have one life jacket for every person on board and it must be the proper size and in good condition. Usually most boats have the traditional orange vest, but that is not intended for children.

• No knowledge of how to use the VHF radio or if it even works. As I mention my classes, you have to know how to use channel 16 in an emergency. It is the number one way to reach the USCG as well as other federal and state agencies. It's instant communication for everyone! Also, make sure the volume is up so you can hear the USCG talking to you.

I hope your season on the water has been safe and uneventful. Please feel free to call me or any other Flotilla members with questions or comments. We are here to help you enjoy your boating in the Keys, and educate you on safe boating practices!

Marina Tip: Cleat Hitches

One of the simplest knots, and certainly the most used aboard a boat, involves nothing more than turns around a cleat. You may not have even thought of this as a knot, but it is.

When fastening a line to a cleat, as with many things at sea. a small error at the start can cause problems later. The image here shows how the dock line at the left comes in at an angle to the base of the cleat. It then goes around the base of the cleat for one full turn. This keeps the strain low on the cleat. The cleat should be mounted at an angle to the direction of strain. Even half a turn plus a firm hold on the line, usually creates enough friction to



hold a boat at a dock until the whole turn can be completed.

In fact, you should always take a half turn around a cleat when a load is coming on the line; this is an essential part of good line handling called "snubbing". Never try to hold a load-bearing line in your bare hands - it can slip and burn your fingers and palm seriously.

The image shows that snubbing is nearly a whole turn; and also that the crossover that will make the figure-eight should be made after the line goes around both horns of the cleat. Two or two-and-a-half figureeights are enough; more would add no additional security and just take more time to undo later.

There are two ways to complete the hitches on a cleat: you can leave the last turn free, perhaps keeping it under your eye if it is a jib sheet, for example. In this way the line can be instantly thrown off if necessary. For more security you can turn the last hitch over, so it is tightened to bind against itself. This might be best for a dock line or halyard, but is not safe if instant release may be necessary. In a small sailboat, in puffy winds, you probably wouldn't cleat the main sheet all the way - you'd take one turn and hold it tight in your hand.

If you would like more help in tying the cleat hitch, stop by the Dockmaster's Office and ask one of the skilled Associates to show you. Look out for more tips like this in upcoming editions of the Ocean Reef Press.

Gusty, Westerly Winds on the Pond

With the passage of the cold front early Sunday morning, the sailors of the Card Sound Model Yacht Club arrived at the Pond later in the morning to sunny skies and building westerly winds. Generally, the sailing was fantastic but some of us (and that includes me) ran into some unexpected equipment issues.

Those westerly winds created a unique arrangement to the way the course was set on the Pond. Very few times have we ever seen a starting line on the eastern side of the Lagoon near

the coral rocks that surround the culvert out to the ocean. This brought the kayak dock into play both at the start and while rounding the leeward mark. Since starboard tack at the start is the right-of-way tack, it meant that most of the boats needed to sail into the tight confines between the dock and the culvert while occasionally a few boats tried the port tack start at the southern end of the line where there was more open water. This is usually a very high-risk maneuver, but those boats that had the right

puff of wind managed to make it work. But after the start, we were all required to round the leeward mark which was closest to the dock. This created a conundrum. Do vou tack soon after the rounding or continue on and hope that you can maneuver around the dock? Both ways seemed to work as long as the wind was favorable. Having said that, you can only take advantage of the favorable winds if you can stay on the course. Both Al Mast and yours truly, Windsor **Coffin**, had different mechanical issues to contend with. Al had issues with sheeting in his sails for most of the race day and I lost my forestay and jib in a particularly strong gust that put my boat completely on its side. With these issues, Al had a DNF and I had a DNF and one missed race as I changed to another rig. With five races on the day it was, once again, Joe Robillard who took the overall win on the day, winning four out of the five races. In second place with some amazing finishes and in a points

tie with the third place boat but holding the advantage with one race win was **Erin Coffin**. Rounding out the top three with a masterful performance despite the disadvantage of not being able to trim his sails properly was the aforementioned Al Mast.

The long-range forecast at the time of this writing is showing breezy conditions once again on the Pond, but this time out of the east-northeast so the velocity should be a bit more consistent.

The Card Sound Model Yacht Club races every Sunday (except Easter Sunday) until the end of April at "the Pond." So, swing by the Buccaneer Island Lagoon if you are curious or have questions. Racing begins at 10 a.m. Our sailors are always willing to discuss our racing model yachts and, for interested sailors, there are even a few currently available for sale here at Ocean Reef. 
