So, I decided to begin compiling some of these questions in hopes that the answers may help even more of my fellow Ocean Reef Members. This first round of Q&As below ultimately answers the overarching question: "Do I need my wallet?"

How can my guest(s) pay for Salon & Spa services?

Guests must have a guest card to book an appointment or a Member may book the appointment on their behalf. When that number is verified, they may pay with any credit card or an Ocean Reef gift card. The Spa does not accept cash or checks.

How do guests pay for specialty classes at the Fitness Center?

Guest card, Ocean Reef gift card or credit card will do. Members may also book classes on their behalf. They do not accept cash or checks.

How do I pay at...

...the Farmer's Market?

No Ocean Reef Member card accepted. These are independent



vendors. Use cash or credit card. The one exception is r.f. Orchids who does accept Member cards.

...the UPS store?

The UPS store takes cash and credit cards.

...PakMail?

PakMail takes cash, credit cards, Ocean Reef Member card or check, unless you're buying stamps, in which they can only accept cash or check.

...Wynn's Market?

Cash, credit card, or Ocean Reef Member card.

...Reef Hut?

Reef Hut will accept cash, your Ocean Reef Member card, or an Ocean Reef gift card, but no credit cards.

...Reef Treats?

Reef Treats also accepts your Ocean Reef Member card, gift card and cash. No credit cards here either.

...Fishing Village stores?

All of the retailers in the Fishing Village accept credit cards, though you'll only receive your Member discount when paying with your Ocean Reef Member card! The Burgee Shop and Peter Millar will also accept Ocean Reef gift cards.

Restoring America's Everglades: 30 Years of Progress

Presentation at 4:30 p.m. Tues., Feb. 28 at Cultural Center

The world's largest ecosystem restoration project started right here in the Keys.

Outraged over the demise of their beloved fishing grounds in Florida Bay, two outdoor enthusiasts – Paul Tudor Jones II and the late George Barley – co-founded The Everglades Foundation, an environmental organization focused on restoring and protecting America's Everglades.

Three decades later, The Everglades Foundation has become the leading champion of Everglades restoration. Significant milestones have marked the road to restoration, including historic new rules for managing Lake Okeechobee, and the bridging of Tamiami Trail, which removed a 100-year-old barrier to water flow into Everglades National Park.

As The Everglades Foundation celebrates its 30th anniversary, its Chief Executive Officer Eric Eikenberg and Chief Science Officer Dr. Steve Davis will provide an update on the progress of Everglades restoration at 4:30 p.m. on **Tuesday, February 28**, at the Cultural Center at Ocean Reef

They will be joined by the Foundation's Vice President of Education Jennifer Diaz, who oversees a free, statewide pre-K-12 Everglades education program that has impacted 175,000 students and trained 5,000 teachers to educate and empower the next generation of Everglades stewards — including right here at The Academy at Ocean Reef and other schools in Key Largo.

Following their updates, celebrated nature photographer and videographer Luca Martinez will present "The Wonders of the Wetlands." A shining example of that next generation of stewards, Martinez's mesmerizing work is featured in a new digital exhibit, "The River of Grass," created in partnership with The Everglades Foundation and VISIT FLORIDA for the UNESCO World Heritage Collection on the Google Arts and Culture platform.

All images and videos in the online exhibit – launched during the 75th anniversary of Everglades National Park – were shot by Martinez to illustrate the ecosystem's various habitats, wildlife, hydrological systems, its history, and connection to the South Florida communities


that surround it.

"Everglades National Park is a global treasure," said Eikenberg. "It has been an honor to showcase this UNESCO World Heritage Site, the only U.S. location on the List of World Heritage in Danger due to the serious and continuing degradation of its aquatic ecosystem."

Scott D. Farmer



Spotlight on Ocean Reef Members

The Irrepressible Barbara Olcott

A mainstay of the Cultural Center at Ocean Reef

I have never met anyone with as much energy as Barbara Olcott. This petite blonde, who might possibly be mistaken for a teenager, has been a leader and an influential force at Ocean Reef for nearly four decades. She has served on the Board of the Ocean Reef Club and on numerous committees. And for 19 years Barbara has been the guiding light of the Entertainment Committee at the Cultural Center. (For the last five she was chairman.) This year she took on the additional task of co-chair of the 2023 All Charities Auction and Gala, the premiere event on the OR calendar.

Barbara and her husband Emery discovered Ocean Reef in the early 80's. Without giving it a second thought, they quickly settled into a "much too small" condo in The Landings with their brood of five young children. (The melded family included *His*: two boys and a girl. *Hers*: one boy. *Theirs*: a baby boy).

For most people being a mom to a family of seven would be exhausting, but Barbara Olcott did it all and still had energy enough for tennis, pickleball and golf.

It was a formidable schedule, but Barbara felt keenly that something was missing.

All of Barbara's life she had

loved the arts. Before coming to the Reef, she had been a professional photographer and an amateur theatrical producer. Twenty-seven years ago, along with founder Gerry Mack, Barbara effectively raised the necessary funds and launched the Great Water Music Festival in Wolfeboro NH, located near a family compound, created years ago by her great grandfather, the founder of Filene's, the famed Boston department store.

The Music Festival experience had given Barbara Olcott a taste for what she liked best and felt most qualified to do – that is, to raise the finances for an artistic endeavor and then to gather the talent that could bring it to fruition.

Barbara needed an involving project, where she could be a producer. She found it at the Cultural Center at Ocean Reef,

Cultural Center – love at first site....

Forgive the pun, but Barbara became involved with Ocean Reef's Cultural Center shortly after it opened the doors of its beautiful new building in 2001.

The Cultural Center was the vision of three members – Tom Davidson, Alan Goldstein and the late Dick Farmer. They raised the money to build it; supervised the construction; and ultimately planned the programming, which was designed to entertain and sometimes educate the Ocean Reef Club membership.

Quick to spot help, where it could be useful, "the

boys" (a fond nickname for the remarkable triumvirate) recognized that Barbara had learned interesting lessons in establishing the music festival in New Hampshire. "I certainly found out that classical music and dance don't sell," says Barbara. When Tom asked her how to arrange for first run movies, she promptly came up with a list of film brokers. "In the end Tom knew the head of Sony, who made sure we got our movies."

Barbara began her official connection with the Cultural Center as a valued member of the Entertainment Committee. "It was the only committee we had. We picked the shows, movies, lectures. A few years later Alan Goldstein asked me to chair that committee." (Barbara ultimately was tapped to be Chairman of the Cultural Center.

One of Barbara's first tasks as Chair was to create new committees for the diverse activities that had formerly been lumped together in the Entertainment Committee. Also along with John Hunt, the Cultural Center president, she continued to choose the live performances. "We often traveled to New York to see for ourselves potential Cultural Center attractions."

Come to the Cabaret

A few years ago, Barbara – who has been passionate about Broadway musicals from the time she was eight and her mother took her to see Mary Martin in *Peter Pan* – had an inspiration.

Rules Reminder:

On-Time Payment

All food, beverage, merchandise and services of the Club charged to the member's account shall be billed monthly and each member's account shall be due and payable upon receipt of the monthly statement.

If a member has not paid all charges within 60 days from the end of the month in which the charges were incurred, the account shall be deemed delinquent and charge privileges will be suspended.



Savoring Time & Finding Rest

On my first visit to Ocean Reef, I had breakfast with a couple whose friendship has become a gift. As we ate our meal, I was asking questions about what life was like for them during the season at the Club. I'll never forget their answer. They said, "We go home to rest!"

A friend of mine reached the summit of Mount Everest when he was in his thirties. He described the demanding process of becoming acclimatized to physical exertion in the thin air. A climber doesn't simply arrive at base camp, don their gear, and immediately head to the summit of the highest point on earth called the 'death zone.' You must take the journey in stages. Each stage requires rest before moving on. Without it, my friend would never have savored that moment he describes. literally "sitting on top of the world."

The richness of music is the result of a composer or song writer's placement of what are called 'rest notes.' The term refers to an interval of time when a player is not sounding a note on their instrument or with

their voice. Without rest notes, there would be no memorable melodies or complex rhythms to be enjoyed.

We were created in the likeness and image of God to be productively engaged, to enjoy the satisfaction of accomplishment, the goodness of friendship, and the gift of shared love. However, if our lives become compulsively driven, we become like those who guzzle great Scotch or gulp fine wine. We miss true goodness of life found in savoring moments of rest and repose.

Mental health workers are reporting an epidemic of exhaustion and fatigue in the culture today. It seems to be more than just the fatigue associated with long COVID. It is associated with the unrelenting pace of life and the rapidity with which we are being confronted by the uncertainty of change.

You may not be familiar with it, but we are entering into a season in the life of Christian faith known as the Lenten season. It began this past Tuesday, known as 'fat Tuesday,' or Mardi Gras. We all know about that!

The craziness of Tuesday is followed by a sobering day called 'Ash Wednesday.' Perhaps you've seen friends or newscasters with a smudge of ashes in the shape of a cross on their foreheads. They have received what is called the 'imposition of ashes.' These ashes are imposed at the conclusion of the service when

a priest or pastor looks you in the eye and says, "From dust you have come, and to dust you shall return."

You may not be religious at all. You might think that being reminded of our mortality is morbid. And of course, this observance could be nothing more than an empty ritual - habit or superstition.

But these weeks are and can be more than that. The Christian observance of Lent, leading to Passover and Easter, can be an experience of what Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel called 'architecture in time.' Heschel was referring to the gift of Sabbath in the Jewish community – one day of rest in seven that God the creator has baked into the rhythm of life.

These weeks of Lent are what the poet Malcomb Guite says are "time set aside to reorient ourselves, to clarify our minds, to slow down, to recover from distraction, to focus on the values of God's kingdom and on the value God has set on us and on our neighbors."

These seven weeks can be a season of savoring time that can lead to a deeper experience of faith, stronger friendships, richer love, and greater meaning and direction in the investment of our lives.

If you're in need of physical rest, let me suggest a nap! But if you are looking for that deeper sense of rest for your soul, the deepest part of you, let me encourage you to consider this invitation from Jesus. "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." These weeks of Lent are a time to think about what he offers us all. I hope you'll consider it.





NEWS FROM THE MEDICAL CENTER

"That's a Hard Pill to Swallow"

"That's a hard pill to swallow" isn't just a figure of speech - it's a real-life problem for many people. Difficulty swallowing is called dysphagia. It can be caused by several reasons and is more common in older adults but is not considered a normal part of aging. Swallowing involves many muscles and nerves working together to get food and liquid from the mouth to the stomach. Trouble with swallowing can originate anywhere in the mouth, throat or esophagus.

Swallowing problems can be mild or severe. The treatment varies depending on what's causing the problem.

People with certain neurological or nervous system

disorders are more likely to have difficulty swallowing. When you swallow, the airway closes and you stop breathing for a moment. Trouble with the coordination of any of the nerves and muscles involved in the process can lead to choking or getting food or liquid into your lungs. If you have trouble swallowing, have an evaluation to see what the cause is.

Symptoms associated with dysphagia can include:

- •Pain or inability to swallow
- •A sensation of food getting

stuck in the throat, chest or behind the breastbone

- Drooling
- Hoarseness
- •Food coming back up (regurgitation)
- •Frequent heartburn
- •Food or stomach acid backing up into the throat
- Weight loss

Until you know if there is a problem behind your swallowing difficulties, here are a few things you can try to make swallowing medicine a little easier:

- •Put a pill in applesauce or pudding. The texture can make it easier to swallow pills whole.
- •Grind a pill into a powder and add it to applesauce or pudding.
- •Cut a pill with a pill splitter and swallow the smaller pieces one by one. Pill splitters are available at most pharmacy stores.

•Unless the medications' prescription indicates otherwise, follow up swallowing pills with plenty of

Make sure you ask your pharmacist if it's okay to cut or grind a medication. Timed-release or entericcoated medicines shouldn't be broken apart. It may also be possible to get your medicine in another form, such as a powder, cream, or liquid, so don't hesitate to ask.

So, you have caught up with all of your on-demand network favs, and *House of Dragons* and *Yellowstone* are on intermissions. You even churned through the prequels 1883 and 1923... what now? Well, here are some tasty tidbits.

If you haven't streamed Jack Ryan (Prime video), you have 24 episodes over three seasons to view. The first season follows the titular CIA analyst as he is wrenched from the security of his desk job into the field after discovering a string of dubious bank transfers, which are being carried out by a rising Islamic extremist named Suleiman. The second season sees Jack in the middle of political warfare in a corrupt Venezuela. In the third season, Jack investigates a plot to recreate the former Soviet Union by detonating an untraceable tactical nuclear bomb in a former Soviet country.

The Bear (Netflix) has just streamed its second season with ten new episodes. A young chef from the fine dining

world comes home to Chicago to run his family sandwich shop after a heartbreaking death in his family. The Offer is Oscar-winning producer Albert S. Ruddy's never-beforerevealed experiences of making The Godfather (1972). The Mob threatened, Italian Americans protested, the Studio heads bickered and waffled, writer Mario Puzo debated every scene in the script with director Francis Ford Coppola, and no one could agree on whom to cast for the leads. It was so fascinating we had to rewatch The Godfather immediately.

The creative force behind Knives Out and Glass Onion has just begun streaming **Poker Face** on Peacock. Rotten Tomatoes says, "With the incomparable Natasha Lyonne as an ace up its sleeve, Poker

Face is a puzzle box of modest ambitions working with a full deck." The show follows former poker phenomenon and outlaw Charlie Cale as she travels across the United States, solving mysteries and standing up for the underdog in every town she stops by. Her weapon against criminals? Her innate, inexplicable ability to tell whenever someone is lying. If you're a fan of mystery shows, you should definitely give Poker Face a chance.

I was Seve's PR liaison for a day of interviews following a charity fundraiser in London. He was a charmer! He went into storytelling mode and spoke in bold strokes about his life's struggles, painting a picture of growing up in Spain. He lived next to a course and would watch people play golf during the day and then sneak onto

Try the "... more" in the bottom right corner to test your knowledge with "Quizzes."

Kelly Hertzman is a fan of the USGA's GHIN (Golf Handicap Information Network) www.ghin.com, which connects her to a Handicap Index and community of over 3 million golfers worldwide. Its 3D maps of thousands of course maps offers all kinds of bells and whistles with its GPS technology.

Winter Rules:

Palisades Tahoe (formerly known as Squaw Valley Ski Resort) is home to Snowgolf. For the past 37 years, skiers suit up in their collared shirts and khakis for a top to bottom ski run like none other. The Alpines' Annual Snow Golf Tournament April 15 https://www.palisadestahoe. com/events-and-activities/ events-calendar/snow-golftournament lets you play "the whites" with brightly colored balls and red flagged holes (and no water hazards). Google "Snowgolf" to find other courses around the world from Alaska to St Moritz.

Water Rules:

For something closer to home, try the annual golf-on-the-water **Conch Scramble Charity Golf Tournament** in Islamorada www.conchscramble.com, which has over 50 boats and costumed golfers; each team hits biodegradable golf balls (that turn into fish food) as they race between the 9-hole floating greens. This fun September 29-30 tournament always sells out so mark your calendars for July 17 when tickets go on sale.





As usual, the gathering after the race was a social and happy time as sailors discussed what they may have done wrong



The formal means to handle these issues is for a sailor to announce a protest at the time of the incident and for each of the sailors involved to acknowledge the protest and judge whether or not they obeyed the rules of

racing and decide if they need to take action or not. The boat in the wrong should do a 360 or 720-degree turn (doing your circles) or retire from the race depending on the rule broken. All in all, our Nooners concluded with lots of good discussions and friendly banter.

A few years ago, my dentist sent me to an endodontist for a root canal, the thought of which terrified me right up until the procedure. The doctor's ironic byline is YOU WANT A ROOT CANAL. He is still practicing, and I still have that tooth. No one wants a root canal, but sometimes we need one.

Boat owners and operators at Ocean Reef want and need a Vessel Safety Check. Get one now before you need something you do not have aboard or find something non-functional.

The Ocean Reef Coast Guard Auxiliary offers painless safety checks for your vessel up to 65 feet, your tender or paddlecraft. Checks are free, fast, and a qualified Vessel Examiner comes to your boat at your convenience.

The Examiner works through a short checklist of required safety equipment. This is a courtesy inspection and there are no penalties for defects. This brief review might save a life.

At completion of the safety inspection, you receive a copy of the written report and a handsome decal to affix to your vessel. You also make a friend in the Coast Guard Auxiliary.

Inspections are good for one year and indicate to other agencies that your vessel met Coast Guard and Florida regulations at the time of the safety check.


LGA & 9 Hole LGA Heart Tournament







Good Footwork Will Transform a Player's Game



'Tennis Tip" by Carolina Quevedo, Tennis & Pickleball Concierge

Footwork is the base of a player's game. Good footwork will allow you to cover more court, hit the ball sooner, and be able to produce more power. Repetition and simulation will help the player to integrate all the footwork as something mechanical and automatic in his or her game. The idea is to focus on speed and

reaction. This can be done off the court and then used in on-court training using drills and live scenarios. Off-court repetition will build muscle memory that will help you on the court.

Everything comes from your feet. If you keep making mistakes, it could be related to your positioning. Your positioning will improve significantly with the right footwork.

Ladder drills are great for working on those fasttwitch muscles and your coordination. They will help you improve foot speed, baseline movement, split steps, and more. Examples of ladder drills to improve footwork are shown to the right.



When a 1 club opening bid is passed to you, look at your club length. If you are short, your partner may have a good hand. If you have club


length, there is a good chance your partner is weak.

With (1), pass because your partner is probably short in clubs and too weak not to be able to bid at the one level. The opener most likely has the 18 - 19 point balanced hand and wants to get back into the bidding.


