It's Tee Time

Bag Room Open Begins Today

Today is the day – the 47th annual Bag Room Open is teeing off! This morning (Friday, March 3), Ocean Reef Club and Card Sound Golf Club Golf Professionals took to the tee for the first round of the 2023 Bag Room tournament. Play continues every Friday and Saturday (1 p.m. on the Dolphin Course), now through the Finals on

Saturday, April 1. The Bag Room Open is a tradition that has grown to become one of the most followed and anticipated golf events on the Club's calendar. It began in 1977 as a way for golf staff from Ocean Reef and Card Sound to determine the best player on The Reef and saw 20 to 30 golf carts following the final match. Now, the tournament finals regularly surpass 100 carts and the Member involvement is unparalleled, and that is what Zach Haynes, Ocean Reef's First Assistant Golf Professional and reigning Bag Room Champion, believes makes the tournament so fulfilling.

"Nothing is more exciting than coming off the 13th green, turning down 14 fairway and having a sea of carts lining the fairway and green," he said.

Excitement for this year's tournament has been building, but perhaps no one is quite as excited as new Bag Room Open Chair **J Guarch**, who follows in the well-laid

"It's \$58 million, take it or leave it."

Those were the words spoken in 1992 to the co-chairs of the Ocean Reef Acquisition Committee, Tom Davidson and Bob Kilby, who were negotiating the sale of Ocean Reef on behalf of the membership. They had ninety days to raise the money. The Committee was soon expanded to include Alan Goldstein and Howard K Howard, with a goal of uniting homeowners

together behind a single concept.

Here's what happened next as told in On the Reef: The Legendary Ocean Reef Club and the People Who Made it Great:

The acquisition committee decided they would have to sell one thousand equity memberships at \$60,000 a piece. Looking at it realistically, because Ocean Reef has such a diverse membership and wide range of property values, they realized they probably couldn't sell more than four to five hundred memberships

at that price. The solution was to create two levels of membership: a charter equity and a patron equity.

The next step was to sell the

concept to members, and the acquisition committee got right to work. The fledgling committee activities were aggravated by the ongoing post Hurricane Andrew physical conditions. They met for long hours in an empty room in the bottom of the art league building. There were lights but no air conditioning and some of the broken windows were still covered with plywood. Tee shirts and shorts were the uniform of the day to try to beat the still, hot, humid, early fall weather.

A thermometer went up in front of the ORCA office with the goal of \$58 million at the top and was updated

daily. Members signed up for meetings with the acquisition committee sixty to eighty at a time in a small stuffy room. To reach more people quicker, several meetings a day were scheduled.

Less than six weeks into the ninety

days since the acquisition committee shook hands with the owner's representative, \$52 million had been raised and was enough to insure the funds required for the purchase.

At the same time, the acquisition committee also recognized the critical need to create a new set of club bylaws and rules and regulations. The drafting of the documents was a slow, painstaking process.

Ocean Reef has so many unique characteristics that

the committee spent hours pouring over each draft, redrafting and looking for gaps and conflicting rules.

It was this incredible commitment to ensuring a strong and stable future for the club that is why these bylaws and rules and regulations still stand, thirty years later.

On March 3, 1993 the chapel bells rang out to let the property owners know they were now the proud owners of the new Ocean Reef Club.

The South Harbor Bridge Rehabilitation Project is scheduled to start **Monday**, **March 6**, and last for approximately three months. During this time, the southeast cart path on the left side as you travel towards the Member Fitness Center will be closed from Monday, March 6 to Thursday, April 6, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. As you travel to the Member Fitness Center, the northwest cart lane on the right side will be closed from Tuesday, April 11 to Thursday, May 11, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. We appreciate your understanding while we work to secure the safety and longevity of the South Harbor Bridge.

Permitted mangrove trimming on South Harbor also begins next week and will require the southeast roadway lane to be closed from Monday, March 6 to Friday, March 10.

CARD SOUND ROAD CLOSURE MARCH 12

On **Sunday, March 12th,** an endurance triathlon (called CLASH Endurance) will commence at Homestead Miami Speedway. This endurance race involves a 56-mile bike ride and will impact your travel if you plan to drive to or leave ORC that day.

The bike course will be on Palm Avenue in Homestead, US 1 Northbound in Florida City and Card Sound Road and will impact roads in the following ways:

- Card Sound Road will be closed to vehicular traffic in both directions from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m.
- US 1 (northbound) 2 northbound lanes will be occupied by cyclists and one northbound lane will remain open to vehicular traffic.
- Palm Avenue: Riders will occupy the eastbound lane (traveling westbound to US 1). On the return, bikes will be traveling eastbound to return to Homestead Miami Speedway. Palm Avenue will remain open to westbound and eastbound vehicular traffic.

Are You Missing the Grand Seafood Buffet?

When we first came to Ocean Reef almost 20 years ago, there was already a satisfying variety of good food - the old Islander was a first-class fish house in a charming setting, the Burgee Bar and Raw Bar were burger and pizza standouts, and the Galley produced a pleasing array of comfort foods. The two WOW venues were the old Clubhouse. particularly on Vine to Table nights, and the Ocean Room, particularly on the evenings of the Grand Seafood Buffet. My grandchildren always reminded me to book a buffet reservation

like saucers.

Now, of course, we are surrounded by WOW venues.
The rebuilt Islander is gorgeous and in sell-out demand. The leading edge Sushi Bar is a double WOW. The new Clubhouse is a proper showcase of high cuisine and outstanding

service. Gianni has replaced the Galley with crowd-pleasing Italian, and old favorites have continued their fine traditions. Now the remodeled Ocean Room has restored the Grand Seafood Buffet to a WOW.

The vibe is elegant, but not stuffy. You can enjoy quiet

corners and good conversation. The presentation has been re-thought and improved. The central raw bar offers caviar with all the sides, stone crab, iced shrimp, and Alaskan crab legs. The side alcove presents oysters and clams on the half shell and lobster tail. Another side room holds too much to remember, but include soups, salads, smoked salmon & fixings, fruit, cheese, bread and crackers, and sweets. The fully staffed Sushi Bar displayed all the usual Club favorites and stood ready to improvise on demand. Master Sushi Chef Eric Andreu (not exactly his real title, but how could it be anything less?) calls Ocean Room Sushi Chef Kimmi Grey his star pupil. "When she started working in the Islander Sushi Bar three years ago, she came to me and said, 'I don't think I can

do this.' But with a few months of intense work, she was turning out wonders. It's been amazing to see her growth. At the Ocean Room bar she perfects everything." Chef Eric is introducing an Omakase (Chef's choice) menu for the Ocean Room on Tuesday nights. "Best of the best," he says. It features a six-course dinner built around a single type of fish -- for instance Madai (Japanese snapper) flown fresh from Japan and prepared six different ways. He is excited to bring this concept to the Ocean Room.

But wait, there's more. In the past, hot buffet items were presented in steam trays around the room along with a carving station. Let's be honest, a steam tray buffet does few favors to food however carefully it has been prepared. So the Ocean Room Team (Manager Nico DiPerna, Assistant Manager Alain Piloto Rios, Chef Michael Meadows and Chef Josh Bettsack) decided to keep the hot dishes in the kitchen where they can be prepared to order. The hot plates included slowroasted prime rib with loaded baked potato and asparagus, lobster thermidor, Alaskan king crab (1 pound!), Ora king salmon with crabmeat, Yukon gold potato and spinach, and red snapper with Himalayan red rice and heirloom tomato. My friends Susan and Alex **Castellanos** were trying the Grand Seafood Buffet for the first time this season. Alex said, "We are having a wonderful time - a great Ocean Reef tradition has gotten even better. Next time we'll come with plastic pockets to stuff our pants with goodies."

I don't usually make it until dessert, but the berry bread pudding with shimmering crème anglaise custard sauce looked devastating...it was. Yikes. I think I have established that a WOW is in order. The Ocean Room Grand Seafood Buffet is biweekly on Saturday nights. The next is scheduled for Saturday, March 4th (TOMORROW!). Bring your appetite and plastic pockets.

One Man's Remarkable Journey

Conventional wisdom would suggest that the odds of achieving any kind of success in life for a young man - one growing up in a single parent home, and having little interest in learning - those odds are stacked against him.

Erik Thoennes' life journey is one that sets that conventional wisdom on its head. He found early success by excelling in sports. An outstanding high school athlete in three sports, he went on to play college football at Central Connecticut University, setting records as a wide receiver.

After tryouts with two NFL teams, he went on to play American football in Europe. In an article in a local Connecticut newspaper, the writer reported that he found "instant fame" there, and earned the nickname, "Erik the Warrior."

Erik credits his experience playing football as the source of lessons that many young men learn in their home. He says, "Football taught me a lot: to be tough, to be part of something bigger than myself, to work hard, to achieve, to take the backseat for others to excel, to set goals and accomplish them, to be responsible, and to plan ahead. It's amazing the things I learned."

Thoennes has developed a realistic perspective on sports. He says, "They have the potential to help us build character. Christians tend to either trivialize sports and not see sports as something with

great value, or they tend to fall into idolatry of sports in our culture."

While a student at Central Connecticut, he also discovered the spark of learning to love learning. It was a biology course that changed his life. His prof was an atheist, but he says, "It was incredibly worshipful, so I just learned to love to learn." As a student, he caught a vision for thinking deeply and studying hard and the joy that goes with it.

His eagerness to pass on what he learned through sports has led to frequent research, writing, and speaking on the relationship between God and sports.

And now the kid who didn't love to learn has been teaching at Biola University for over two decades. After earning two Master's Degrees from Wheaton College, he went on to earn his doctorate from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School.

Thoennes says that he sometimes, part jokingly, tells his students, "I loved college so much I figured out a way to stay in it the rest of my life."

But his life is far more than just academia. He is also the pastor of Grace Evangelical Free Church in La Mirada, CA. He never had the intention of going into pastoral ministry. He says, "God opened the doors for that to be a more significant commitment as things went on."

This pastor-theologian sees both the ministry and the academy as integral to his faithfulness in the other. "The overlap between the two," he says, "helps keep me honest in both places, and it brings more integrity to my role in each place than I'd have otherwise. My students need to know I love the church and that I'm involved in the lives of real people, and it's good for the folks in my church to know that I'm thinking hard and writing and contributing to scholarship."

Married to his wife Donna

for over 30 years, one of life's disappointments was their inability to have children. But that struggle changed when they visited India in 2005. Erik says, "God broke our heart for orphans."

That broken heart became an open heart as they have adopted four children — three from Taiwan and one from China. He says his love for children, and his burden to see them rescued and protected, is in part, a reflection of his upbringing in a single-parent home, an experience that "deepened my appreciation for what God intends a family to be."

The heart of his life and ministry, this 'warrior-like-drive and disposition' is "an intense, jealous passion for God to be glorified in everything."

Erik's life is one of those great 'against the odds' stories! He has lived a remarkable journey.

NEWS FROM THE MEDICAL CENTER

Increased Fall & Cart Injuries for 2023

The Medical Center has been seeing an increase in golf cart injuries and fall related injuries for 2023, as compared to 2022. The injuries are ranging from scrapes, bruises, and/or lacerations as some of the more common injuries. There have also been some serious emergency injuries related to falling like fractures and dislocations.

Public Safety responded to forty-nine cart accidents in 2022, five of which were critical. Of these forty-nine, twenty-six were caused by roll-overs, crashes and falls.

Vice President & Director of Public Safety and Operations,



Ariel Artime offers the following safety advice: "No objects or clothing articles should protrude from the cart, including limbs, that could cause injury if impacted by an item. To avoid falling from a cart, it is recommended that all passengers, including the driver, should use seat belts and avoid making sharp turns. Since the Medical Center is not staffed 24/7, it

is recommended that 911 be called and that you wait on the scene to be treated for any injuries resulting from a golf cart related crash or incident.

When dialing 911 always identify that you are calling from Ocean Reef."

As we age our balance, steadiness and gait can change- all of which can contribute to a fall. Be aware of tripping hazards in the home, like scatter rugs, items moved out of their usual places and electrical or extension cords that cross your path. Always wear shoes but choose footwear that is appropriate for the activity. If they have laces be sure they haven't become untied. Backless slip-on shoes like flip-flops or crocs are not appropriate for many activities and can create a higher risk of falling.

I am decidedly old school in many ways, including enjoying the tactile nature of printed cookbooks stuffed with handwritten recipes (I still delight in using my mother's stained and earmarked "Joy of Cooking" from 1975). But there is no denying the variety of recipes at your fingertips when you search online.

With the astounding **Recipe**

All your recipes in one place



The Recipe Keeper app acts as a digital file for all your favorite recipes.

Keeper app you can easily create a filing system on your smart device. Here's how easy: just copy and paste recipes from website addresses or upload your photos or screenshots of recipes from books, magazines, grandma's handwritten scraps of paper, or even the ORC Cooking School recipe printouts.

Through the magic of modern technology*** the recipes populate the app with all the ingredients, cooking directions, and nutritional info just like that (cue finger snapping noise) -- just from a photo or website address. Wow.





Ocean Currents

Offshore piloting will frequently require knowledge and consideration of ocean currents. These currents result from relatively constant winds such as the "trade winds" and "prevailing westerlies." The rotation of the earth and variations in the water density are also factors in the patterns of ocean currents. The ocean currents of greatest interest to boatmen are the Gulf Stream and the California Current. The Gulf Stream is a northerly and easterly

flow of warm water along the Atlantic Coast of the United States. It is quite close to shore along the southern part of Florida, but moves progressively further to sea as it flows northward, where it both broadens and slows. The California Current flows generally southward and a bit eastward along the Pacific Coast of Canada and the United States, turning sharply westward off Baja California (Mexico). It is a flow of colder water and, in general, is slower and less sharply defined than the Gulf Stream.



Manatee Safety Guidelines

The next time you see a manatee at Ocean Reef, it's important to remember these animals are threated and must be handled with care. Keep these guidelines in mind the next time you encounter a manatee:

- Keep your distance.

 Manatees are protected by state and federal law, making it illegal to annoy, harass or disturb a manatee in any way. This includes feeding them water from your hose!
- Follow speed signs in channels, canals and regulatory zones. Manatees are slow-moving, swimming on average 3 to 5 mph. When boats are travelling too fast, manatees have a hard time

The Season is Changing

As February turns into March, the sun climbs higher in the sky and the weather gets warmer. Winter quarry is still available on the flats, but permit, cobia, bonefish and the first big tarpon begin to emerge as the water warms up to 70 degrees and above. Permit are the first, and will respond to a live crab, but are still a challenge on the fly. In February, bonefish are known to run the shorelines of Key Largo and Elliot Key to the north, once in epic numbers, but although fewer, are still

larger in size on average than Bahama bones.

As winter wanes, inshore waters begin to reach 75 degrees and days with gentle winds become more common. Big tarpon make their first moves in late February and early March, usually off Key West and then appear in the deeper channels, rolling and busting.

Fishermen need to be ready for the busy season ahead, and that means practicing casting. You want to be able to make a reasonably quick and accurate throw in different directions. You will need the basic double haul to get the fly to the target and be able to backcast without endangering your guide or your buddy in the boat. You don't want to waste valuable time with the boat staked out and the guide giving lessons. Get instructions in person or with a good video and practice before you go. Time is flying by!

Anchors Aweigh 17th Century Style

Magnetotherapy & Biomagnetic




Putting From Off The Green



by Derek Swoboda, Director of Instruction

Judging speed from off the green can be a challenging task given the fairway-height grass we need to roll the ball through. There are many options from off the green but one I have recently learned about from Bruce Rearick is very helpful.

When we use our usual putting stroke, we hit the ball down into the fairway grass and as a result, the ball will actually slow down.



This makes it extremely challenging to find a good way of controlling speeds for this type of shot.

How do we avoid hitting the ball down into the grass? Simply add loft to the putter! When you set up to hit your putt, lean the handle of the putter away from the target to add loft to the club face. This will ensure the golf ball will bounce up and over the

blades of grass in front of it, allowing the ball to roll much more simply.

The speed of this putt will then become more similar to what you are used to on all of the putts you will hit during the round. I have found this to be very helpful and successful when putting from 10 feet off the green and in. Find your perfect distance today!



I Dink I Can, I Dink I Can



"Pickleball Tip" by Kevin Girard, Pickleball Professional

Dinking is such a huge aspect of the game, so let's go over some simple tips to make us all better dinkers.

1. Keep a loose grip.

If a 10 out of 10 is our tightest grip, we are looking for a 3 out of 10 when we dink. The loose grip gives us significantly more control and we can keep our shots softer and closer to the net. The tighter we grip the more likely it is to go deeper in the court allowing our opponents to attack the ball.

2. Use your shoulders and legs when you dink, not your wrist or elbows.

When our wrists and elbows get

involved we tend to flick at the ball causing it to pop up. The ideal motion is fluid and involves lifting the ball with our legs and shoulders.

3. Have little to no takeback with your paddle.

Taking our paddle back at the kitchen line can be very costly. We always want to dink the ball in front of us, so the more takeback we have the deeper our opponents' balls are getting on us. The deeper the ball gets on us, the more likely we are to pop it up. Drop your paddle down from your ready position with your arms extended and you are already in the proper dinking position.

4. Hit the bottom of the ball, not the back of the ball.

We want some arc on our shot, and when we hit our dink it is essentially a scooping motion, so we want to come from underneath the ball. Hitting the bottom of the ball allows us to control the ball better as well, leaving shorter dinks for our

opponents to deal with. Hitting the back of the ball will cause it to go deeper into the court... these are balls that are easily put away by our opponents.

5. Make contact in the middle of your shins.

Since we are hitting underneath the ball it's important to let it get lower to the ground when dinking. We actually want to wait for the ball to pass through its highest point and then make contact with it on its downward path. Then we lift our shot with shoulders and legs for a nice controlled ball. The higher up on my body I make contact the more likely I am to pop the ball up.

Dinking is a great exercise and an extremely effective way to beat players who have little patience or like to hit the ball really hard. Come on down to the Tennis and Games Center and practice those dinks!
