Gotta Question?

Do we need to make reservations for Equity-Only Nights? And when booking online, how will other Members know those nights are Equity-Only?

Reservations are required when booking dinner for any of the four Equity-Only Nights. These reservations are done the same way all regular dining reservations are made - through the Online Reservations Platform at <u>oceanreef</u>. <u>com/Dining</u>. Additionally, the standard reservation window rules apply - Equity Members can see available Equity-Only Night dining reservations a maximum of 14 days out.

Non-Equity Members looking to book reservations will not be given the option to book a reservation on an Equity-Only Night. Because you are logged in with your Member number, the system recognizes your Member type and therefore only shows what is available to that Member type. For example, if a Legacy



Member is logged into the website and visits <u>oceanreef.com/Dining</u> and selects Gianni Ristorante, they will not be shown any availability on a Monday, which is Gianni's Equity-Only Night. The same goes for the other three nights

– Ocean Room on Tuesdays, CH Prime on Wednesdays, and Islander on Thursdays.

Also of note, while these are considered Equity-only nights, Equity Members may host non-Equity Members and/or guests during these reservations as long as the Equity Member that booked the reservation is present.

38th Annual Reef Cup Underway *Raptor* Holds Lead After Day One

The 2023 Reef Cup Invitational Sailfish Tournament has begun with the first day of fishing on Thursday, March 16 seeing a total of 67 sailfish. Of the 59boat fleet, 44 took to the waters on Thursday in search of the elusive sailfish, with 15 boats taking Day One as their lay day.

Gio Cobielles of *Triggers N Riggers* had the first release of the day at 9:06 a.m. Just 12 minutes later, Triggers N Riggers had their second release, by **Finn Banigan**. The final release of the day went to Brett Kaufman on *Unbridled* at 4:08 p.m., but the angler who ended Day One in the top spot was **Steve Smith Jr** on *Raptor* with 8 catch and releases. At the end of Day One, **Smith's** *Raptor* was in the top spot with 1000 points – a very solid start to their tournament – and Captain Zane Albury at the helm. First place was followed by the **Colin Caldwell's** *Mojo/ Remix* in second place with 900 points and **Sean Brighton's** *Thomas Flyer* in third place with 600 points. Despite this early lead in rankings, two other boats also ended the day with 600 points (with time of release being the differentiator in scoring).

With two days left, will *Raptor* remain on the top of the leaderboard? On Saturday at 4 p.m., we will know the answer!

March 3, 1969 was the date that Minneapolis developer Morris Baker's family sold its interest in Ocean Reef to an investor group led by Ocean Reef Property owner Harper Sibley and Miami developer Morris Burk. This sale represented the single largest real estate transaction in Monroe County history. The price tag was eight million dollars. Thus began an extraordinary decade of growth for Ocean Reef Club, under the guidance of Harper Sibley. A visionary leader with a hands-on entrepreneurial spirit, Harper



ushered in the era of our modern-day Ocean Reef community and charted our pathway forward.

Wine & Dine – Port O' Call

The Port O' Call has emerged as another fine spot to enjoy a casual al fresco sojourn. The tastefully remolded retail shop has a comfortable and inviting wine bar with wines by the glass on offer. Or you can sit out on the deck with the marina as a backdrop, or one of the patio tables under an umbrella. Wait staff serves all areas.

The charcuterie platter introduced earlier this season has been augmented with a sophisticated selection of lite bites recommended by Jonathan Kaiser, Executive Chef of the Clubhouse (who knows his stuff). The menu includes a Foie Gras Torchon (pate) with toasted brioche and quince spread, Pan Con

Tomate (a toasted baguette with a Homemade Savory Tomato Jam (an ounce of Iberico Jambon can be added); a Caviar Menu served with Chips, Crème Fraiche, and Chives. A complementary serving of White Sturgeon Caviar accompanies the purchase of a 750ml bottle of Champagne.

Chef Jonathan has also stocked his personal selection of Seafood "Conservas" served with thin sliced baguettes. Conservas are the celebrated seafood delicacies of Spain and Portugal preserved in olive oil or brine. The Conserva menu includes Razor Clams in Brine, Mussels in Pickled Sauce, Cockles in Brine, Ventresca White Tuna in Olive Oil, Octopus in Olive Oil with Garlic, Sardines in Tomato Sauce, Spiced Calamari in Ragout Sauce, and Atlantic Horse Mackerel in Olive Oil. Mix and match to share with your friends. Wyatt and Micah can suggest wines to enhance your experience.

Last week, Port O' Call hosted Brian Ball, the General Manager of Skipstone Vineyards, to demonstrate

their collectable red wines in an intimate tasting. Skipstone is a small boutique winery in the Alexander Valley of Sonoma County, California. Their winemaking consultant, Philippe Melke, is considered a "Bordeaux Blending Legend." Their vines grow on steep mountain slopes that produce intense flavor and complexity. The label's total production is less than 2500 cases, which has created a cult following. Knowledgeable collectors snap up most of each vintage. So we are lucky that Port O' Call has cornered several cases for us.

The *New York Times* suggested this year's toast to St Patrick feature Rye Whiskey. Powers, a distiller of Irish Whiskey since 1791, has introduced Irish Rye. The *Times* says, "It leaves your palate kissed with sweetness; it also makes a lovely Manhattan."



New Reentry Stickers Available for Monroe County Residents

The Atlantic hurricane season begins June 1 and runs through December 1.

Monroe County residents may now obtain one sticker for each registered vehicle by providing proof of residency at a Monroe County Tax Collector's office. Proof of residency includes a Florida Driver's License and vehicle registration, or a property bill with an out-of-county vehicle registration for out-of-county residents who own a home in Monroe County. These stickers make reentry easier if checkpoints are required to assure safe re-entry into the Keys following a destructive storm that causes a public safety issue.

The new system is barcoded with color-coded stickers for zone-by-zone reentry.

*Please note: the re-entry sticker zones are different than evacuation zones before a hurricane, which uses five zones in the event of an evacuation. Evacuation zones can be found at <u>www.</u> <u>monroecountyem.com/</u> <u>evacuation.</u>

Ocean Reef is considered Zone 3, which encompasses Upper Keys residents from the county line including Ocean Reef to the north end of the Long Key Bridge (MM 113 to MM 47), and will have purple decals.

Where to Get Reentry Stickers For residents who live in Ocean Reef, stickers are available at ORCA Public Safety, 110 Anchor Dr., Key Largo from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. then again from 2 p.m. until 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. They can also be picked up at the tax collector locations throughout the Keys Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. The Key Largo location is 101487 Overseas Hwy.

Don't wait until a storm is approaching to pick up a sticker, they are not available once a state of emergency is declared in Monroe County, which occurs several days before a storm is forecast to strike.



Can Somebody Tell Me What's Going On?

Marvin Gaye's song, "What's Going On?" first hit the airwaves in January of 1971. It sold 200,000 records (remember those) in the first week. The event that gave rise to the song was a violent clash between police and antiwar protesters at People's Park in Berkely. The song was an attempt to make sense of the conflict, and to express the hope, the need of finding a better way forward.

During the fifty plus years since the song first aired, there have been countless events, both here at home and around the world, where the song's title seems just as relevant as it did when it was first heard in the tumultuous early seventies.

One particularly perplexing issue has embroiled people and nations perennially for more than three millennia. That is the issue of antisemitism.

Can somebody tell me, "What's Going On?"

Just this month, film maker Steven Spielberg, who produced Schindler's List, did an interview with TV host Stephen Colbert. Spielberg said, "Antisemitism has always been there – it's either just around the corner and slightly out of sight but always lurking, or it has been much more overt like in Germany in the 30's."

"But," Spielberg says further, "not since Germany in the 30's have I witnessed antisemitism no longer lurking, but standing proud with hands on hips like Hitler and Mussolini, kind of daring us to defy it. I've never experienced this in my entire life, especially in this country."

Can somebody tell me, "What's Going On?"

The Holocaust was the Nazi's wicked, demented attempt to

purify the human race by ridding it of Jews. Areas that had been 'cleansed' of Jews were said to be 'Judenfrie.' The 'final solution' to the Jewish 'problem' was camps, gas chambers and crematoriums.

The Holocaust represents the tragic culmination of anti-Jewish attitudes and practices which had been allowed to manifest themselves – largely unchecked – in the church, for two thousand years. It is to the shame of Christians everywhere that the established Church did so little to prevent or protest the slaughter. *Can somebody tell me, "What's Going*

On?"

At present antisemitism persists wherever Jews are found. The human rights group The Simon Wiesenthal Center listed their top ten worst outbreaks of antisemitism for 2022. Their report stated that attacks on openly Orthodox Jews in New York City were 'the highest they have been in decades.'

"...Jews... have been beaten, spat upon, their hats torn off their heads, and cursed in a barrage of attacks over the last year. There have been anti-Semitic incidents on college campuses. Celebrities and elected political leaders alike have made antisemitic remarks." *Can somebody tell me, "What's Going*

On?" The modern state of Israel

is always in the news, and in a state of flux. It seems to be in a perpetual state of conflict, not just with the Palestinians, but with some of their Arab neighbors, and within their own government. Forming a 'government' out of the fragmented parties represented in the Knesset seems to be the ultimate challenge of a political Tetris.

Can somebody tell me, "What's Going On?"

I'm happy to tell you that there is someone who can competently address these questions and so many more – someone who can tell us, "What's Going On?" His name is Dr. Ralph Nurnberger. He's going to be at Ocean Reef this weekend.

Imminently qualified in the academy and by personal experience, he is a frequent presenter at the Smithsonian



Library Corner



While the following four books are very different, each has at its core a transformative viewpoint:




"The Extraordinary Life of an Ordinary Man: A Memoir" by Paul Newman





MAKING HISTORY

From Little Red School House to The Academy at Ocean Reef

So many young families are joining our Ocean Reef community, and the thread woven through each of the decisions to move to The Reef full-time is The Academy's excellent curriculum and the one-on-one education that cannot be replicated. Under the fine leadership of Head of School Jerome Murphy and with the onslaught of COVID, many families have moved from across the U.S., doubling the enrollment over the past few years.

Learning this, I became interested in how The Academy came to be...

Sometime in the 1980s, a group of parents were bantering about a school on The Reef. Lots of talk, but no action. Equity Member **Carmen Elio** put down \$50,000 and said to the group, "Put up or shut up!" Here is what followed:

Many of the Member parents knew a school was needed and started rounding up people who might have an interest. Martha **Terry**, former Equity member, made Barbara Taylor an offer she couldn't refuse to leave her school in Key Largo to teach the Montessori method at Ocean Reef's new school, which was originally an old warehouse owned by Pete Perdue, transformed into the Little Red School House. A whopping 12 students comprised the first class in 1989, with grades ranging from preschool to second grade.

Believe it or not, in the fall of

1989, some parents were able to run their businesses remotely. They included **Elaine** and **Carman Elio**, **Connie** and **Tom Flanagan**, **Olivia** and **Vince Kent**, and **Martha** and **Richard Terry.**

As time went on, the school expanded. Tom Flanagan provided a bit of humor when he said, "My six children were half of the student body. If I threw a brick in the schoolyard, I would have hit one of my own!"

The Flanagans, Kents, Lees, and several others got it all started privately. Every week, payroll had to be met and the parents would "chip in" to cover expenses. For 2-3 years, phone calls ensued asking for \$5,000, \$10,000, \$20,000 or more just to meet payroll. Every Friday, they had to come up with the money and that is what they did!

With the school now up to 5th grade, expansion was desired so families didn't have to leave The Reef for middle school. Tennis courts were sacrificed to get the land to build a new school and fundraisers were held. Toward the end of the 1990s, Flanagan and Kent approached the **Dicke** family.

Tom Flanagan and Vince Kent met with the elder Dickes, asking them to be part of the fundraising. It was suggested they speak directly to their daughter-in-law **Janet Dicke**, a school teacher in San Antonio. Vince and Tom met with Janet to discuss a fundraiser. "We invited her to be on the school Board, and told her we wanted a new building," said Tom. **Jim Dicke**, **Jr.** asked, "What is your mortgage?" I will give that to Janet for her birthday present." Success! "It was decided, we would have the 'Janet Dicke' building, the mortgage was paid, and we built the school."

Vince continued, "Fundraisers were still needed, and we started the first wine auction in 1992. We raised \$45,000 or more in the first year. We went house to house ringing doorbells and we tried to raise money in all sorts of ways. We did raffle tickets out at Buccaneer Island, and we raffled off a golf cart."

On June 1, 2001, ground was broken for the new state-of-theart, \$6 million dollar Academy, which would provide for preschool through 8th-grade. In June 2002, students reported to classes in The Academy's magnificent new 23,000-squarefoot facility, the Janet Dicke Building on South Harbor Drive. Janet served as president of The Academy's board of trustees for years, and she and her family devoted their energy, time, and money to the constant improvement and support of The Academy.

Academy Success Stories

After his first introduction to music at The Academy, Darren Castellanos, son of former Dockmaster Fito Castellanos, never knew he had any musical talent. He studied music at The Academy and went on to study music and play at Carnegie Hall.

Another example is Katie (Lee) Borchetta, daughter of John and Mary Lee (one of the original families who helped found the Little Red School

House), who became the Global Head of Electronic trading sales for Bloomberg. One of only 45 women managers in the company.

Many others went to fine universities and became successful in their chosen field. I would like to name more, but time nor space allows.

As **Russell Post**, longtime Chairman of the Academy's board of trustees said, "Like all good things, the idea originated with the homeowners with now full support of the Club. There have been nothing but success stories for both Associate and Member children."

Over the last four years, The Academy has enjoyed an over 90% acceptance rate for students applying to some of the premier independent high schools – Palmer Trinity, Ransom Everglades, Westminster Christian, and Tabor Academy and Culver Academy for boarding – and is proud to provide financial aid to more than 40% of the student population (compared to the 12% national average among independent schools).

It surely was a "team effort" in becoming what it is today. We can be grateful for those that paved the way and excited for the future of The Academy, Jerome Murphy, the teachers and staff, and the students.

And so we end the story, which is really the beginning, let's await what the future holds for our educational system and our beloved Academy!



MARINA TIP

Flag Displays Ashore



There has been some confusion because proper flag etiquette requires no other flag to be flown above the U.S. Ensign, and obviously, another flag, such as a yacht club burgee at the masthead, will be *higher* than the U.S. flag when the latter is at the gaff. This is entirely proper because "above," in flag etiquette, actually means "directly on top of," as would be the case if the burgee were above the U.S. Ensign on the same hoist. The image to the left shows the standard mast and pole displays as if you were ashore, facing seaward. Note that signal flags, such as storm advisory flags, should be flown from a conspicuous hoist; that on national holidays and on days of special yachting significance it is permissible to fly the flags

of the International Code; and that flags flown ashore at private homes may follow the code used for yacht clubs and similar organizations.

Passing **Courtesy & Navigation Aids**

Captains should slow down when overtaking or approaching another vessel to reduce the wake in channels, creeks and particularly narrow passages. Why force your neighbor's vessel to rock and jump through your wake? Boating is a leisure activity, not a roller coaster ride. Though technically there is no minimum wake requirement in many cases, it's courteous to slow down to reduce your wake when approaching another

boat.

On a recent training mission to certify new Aid to Navigation inspectors, we traversed the three creeks, Angelfish, Broad and Caesar to inspect and photograph the essential Daybeacons. It was a pleasant clear day. We did not expect this to be a dangerous challenge with vessels of all sizes blissfully unaware of our situation which required we slow down to photograph both sides of 77 navigational aids and 2 bridges. Only about 1 in 10 vessels slowed down to reduce their wake when crossing. They did however wave hello as they slapped us around, clearly violating two of the three key precepts - situational awareness and safety. My thanks to Fiona Woods who successfully completed the training and Randy Woods who captained the vessel.

We did record and submit

to the Coast Guard, four Navigation Aids that were not compliant. The photos say it all. One was missing. If you see an Aid that is unusable, please report it to us with a photo if you can do it safely from a distance. We have another 200 aids to complete the survey in our ORC area of responsibility. The number is missing on one, one is crushed, and the Card Sound bridge light is damaged. Stay safe.





BRIDGE TIP

Attacking Notrump Contracts

By Gregg Van Dyke, Bridge Director

Notrump contracts usually call for aggressive leads, which is why it's standard to lead from your longest suit. Does this situation warrant making an exception?

West	East
	1D
1S	1NT
2NT	3NT

What's your lead as South holding ♠1072 ♥K3 ♦Q10865 ♣J64 ? Declarer has shown at least four diamonds, so you might allow the old advice of "never lead into declarer's suit" to overrule the "lead your longest and strongest" guideline. The problem here is that the non-diamond alternatives don't offer good potential for establishing tricks, and none are really all that safe.

A diamond lead is ambitious but not unreasonable, as all you need in your partner's hand is any diamond honor. Partner rates to have an entry or two, and if he can return your lead, your good tenace over the declarer's remaining cards may allow you to run the suit.




