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was finding a top-notch Captain and Mate, which is exactly what they found in Remix Captain JC Cleare and Mates Jorge Corzo and Alex Castellanos.

"As a family, we've fished together casually many times, and I've even entered tournaments in Cabo with my cousin and her husband," Caldwell said. "Despite that, this was not only the first time this whole crew fished together, but also the first time, aside from when I won the fishing portion of Grand Masters in 2020, that I've really won a tournament down here. Things came together perfectly."The tournament excitement started right off the bat for Mojo/Remix when they landed a triple within the span of three minutes, 45 minutes after lines in on Day One. "It's amazing that we hit a triple first thing in the morning because there were five boats around us and not one of them got a fish the entire day," said Caldwell. "Everything just worked right for us."

By day's end, they finished near the top with 900 points, thinking they won the day until their good friend **Steve Smith** on Raptor hooked a fish at the last minute, bringing Mojo/Remix to second place for Day One.

Mojo/Remix decided they'd fish Day Two in the same spot they fished at the day prior – a decision that paid off. Day Two would prove to be equally as exciting as they rounded out the day with Kristina Cole hooking a sail at 3:56 p.m. – just four minutes before lines out. This, Caldwell said, was the most memorable moment of the tournament for him. The moment that "sealed the deal"

for having a real chance at the trophy.

How did the Caldwell and Cole families spend Day Three? The answer was "miserable" and by the pool. "It was a long day of checking our phones and refreshing the stats page," said Caldwell. "But the moment Steve Smith texted me 'Congratulations' from aboard Raptor, I knew we had done it. We were all out at The Point watching the boats come back in and it was a cool feeling."

When Caldwell spoke of the Reef Cup, you could feel the

pride and excitement boil up. "I thought I knew what Reef Cup meant before, but until winning the tournament, I realized I didn't fully understand its magnitude," he said. "The number of people that have called and texted me from all over the US has been outstanding. It's neat to know so many people follow the Reef Cup and monitor the stats page, even when they're not here on The Reef.

And then to walk D-Dock where I keep Mojo and be congratulated by the other

captain and crew has been really fun. Even walking into the Raw Bar, all the people I know there are so excited for me. It's bigger than a win, it's a feeling of community and camaraderie."

The Caldwells, who have been Members since 2013, just moved to Ocean Reef full time in September 2022 and said "it's even more special now that we live here and really get to experience the win as a part of the whole community."

In fact, he asked his son if he wanted to take the Reef Cup trophy to The Academy for show and tell. The answer was, "No, dad. I didn't win the trophy, you did," but after his son asked if he could carry it into the house, Caldwell thinks he may change his mind.

The Caldwell's story emphasizes the fact that Reef Cup extends far beyond just a fishing tournament. Yes, it's about competition, but it's also about family, friendships, camaraderie, community, and a love for all things Ocean Reef.

## **Always Faithful**

The United States Marine Corps have a motto: Semper Fi. It means 'always faithful' and it applies to all Marines and their steadfast loyalty to each other.

Back in the late '60's, our own Ray Larkin (Ocean Reef Club Chairman) knew he wanted to be a Marine, so between his junior and senior years at LaSalle University, he chose the PLC (Platoon Leaders Class) path to qualify to become a Marine second lieutenant. During his basic training, Ray recalls that he was presented with an almost infinite number of reasons not to become a Marine. Stalwart, Ray became a Marine and then a second lieutenant passing with flying colors. He was then assigned further training in communications.

Nearly six months later, **Rich Beyer** (ORC Airport Committee Chair and former Board Director) followed a similar path. After graduating from Georgetown University, he went to Officers Candidate School (OCS) at Quantico, Va. to become a Marine officer. Ten weeks later, Rich became a second

Lieutenant and was also assigned to further training in communications.

As the Cold War raged on, NATO planned a huge show of force in Norway and Marine Communications were vital to its success. It was also a chance for Ray and Rich to work together and get to know each other. They became friends. After the operation was over, Ray and wife Maryann would have dinner with Rich and his friend, a Naval nurse. (His wife, **Nikki**, was not yet in the picture.)

When Rich received his honorable discharge several years later, he moved to New York, got his Masters degree in Russian and eventually worked for Burroughs. Ray stayed in the Corps, retired '75 as a captain five years later and moved to Philadelphia. He worked for a medical device company and ended up in California.

In 2016, Ray was looking for a table where he and Maryann could join at that year's Gala. **Tom** and **Sally Davidson** had an opening and asked them to join. When the guests were being seated, Ray noticed the name 'Rich Beyer' and thought of his old buddy never thinking it was really him. But then Rich showed up...an aha moment. They embraced and talked well into the night. A friendship rekindled and a bow to the true meaning of 'Semper Fi'.

## Marina Seawall Replacement Planned for Summer

With improvements last made in the 1980s, this past year the Club contracted two independent surveyors to examine the condition of the Marina Seawall. Both determined that the seawall had reached its useful life and was in need of replacement, prompting the Board of Directors to approve the construction project for the summer of 2023. The replacement will run from the Marina Fuel Dock to H Dock, highlighted in the image pictured.

Recognizing that this project will be intrusive to dock owners and Marina users, construction is scheduled to begin in May when



Member usage decreases. The Management and Marina teams have worked with the contractor to create a timeline that minimizes the disruption to Members wherever possible however availability for Member dock rentals this summer will be limited.

Work is slated to commence on May 1, with the Fuel Dock and D Dock being removed from operation at that time. Preliminary staging work will begin the week before, with construction fencing, and equipment staging. The project will continue from south to north, with each dock out of order for approximately 6 to 8 weeks. Additionally, our Marina Team will operate from the lobby of the Marina Fitness Center for a few weeks in the later part of May, into early June, as the work takes place around the Dock Office area.

In addition to replacing the 1,100 feet of seawall, the height will be increased, the electrical service will be upgraded and the landscape and driveways will be improved. The Club anticipates a November 2023 completion of this significant project, and looks forward to providing an enhanced experience for this important Member amenity.

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
# Streaming Redux

Friends Jerry and Judy Jared told me they couldn't find one of my streaming suggestions, The **Bear.** Here is what I said several weeks ago: "The Bear (Netflix) has just streamed its second season with ten new episodes. A young chef from the fine dining world comes home to Chicago to run his family sandwich shop after a heartbreaking death in his family." The Jared's searched Netflix and found many bear projects. They found bear

hunts, bear cartoons, and bear documentaries. They watched the trailer for The Cocaine Bear and concluded it could not be the program I had touted. Judy said, "We couldn't believe you would like a drug-crazed bear chewing up the scenery and people." True Judy, thank you. The (TV Chef) Bear is on Hulu. My mistake. Sorry folks.



I decided I should stick with Netflix and Amazon Prime offerings, which most streamers subscribe to. That means you can still enjoy **Lupin**, **Jody Steele's** recommendation on Netflix, and 24 episodes of








Jack Ryan on Prime Video. My most recent favorite, The Offer, about the making of The Godfather, was streamed on Paramount+. But with a little tweaking you can watch Paramount+ on Amazon Prime. Amazon Prime members can access Paramount Plus by adding its channel. To do it through a desktop computer, launch Prime Video on a web browser, sign in, find Paramount+ through the list of featured channels, and click on its channel graphic. Next, click 'Learn more' within the Paramount+ banner on top of the page. Click 'Start your 7-day free trial,' confirm payment details, then hit 'Start your free trial' at the bottom of the page to immediately begin watching Paramount+ movies and TV shows. Note that once the free trial period elapses, charges for the subscription will be billed through the user's Amazon account. At \$9.95 a month, it's cheaper that a monthly movie date.



You will also be ready to tune in to the **Rabbit Hole** premiere on March 26th with eight episodes to follow. The series stars Kiefer Sutherland as a private espionage agent framed for murder. (Paramount+). Two other Prime Video series are worth your consideration: Drive to Survive and Your Honor.



**Drive to Survive**, (Prime) (five seasons, ten episodes each). This is the docudrama that has created millions of new Formula One Grand Prix fans around the world. Unprecedented camera access to racing footage, team garages, driver interviews and home visits brings new meaning to the high-octane competition. The season has just begun on track, and on air for season five of *Drive to Survive*.



Your Honor (Showtime on demand, Prime Video) (two seasons). Fan favorite Bryan Cranston trades in Walter White (*Breaking Bad*) for judge's robes. He faces a tightening Gordian knot of moral dilemmas. Season two begins slowly while Cranston deals with the crushing fallout from season one, but is now building to an explosive finale of the series this week.

### Memberabilia An Eye-Opener

Last season my son Tom Rubin spent several months with me at my home in Ocean Reef. During his stay, Tom walked many miles each day happily exploring Ocean Reef. His enthusiastic accounts of his travels were for me something of an eye-opener. Suspecting that other longtime ORC Members, busy and distracted by all the wonderful activities our Club has to offer, might also enjoy being reminded of the natural beauty of our surroundings, I asked Tom to share his impressions with Ocean Reef Press readers. – JOAN BIRSH

#### GUEST COLUMN – by Tom Rubin

Until last April, I hadn't spent more than ten days at a time on The Reef. Every year, my wife and two kids and I would make a week-long holiday visit to the lovely home my parents built here in the 1990s. They were amazing visits-we'd play tennis and golf, eat like royalty, and watch the kids grow from toddlers splashing in the lagoon to teens nervously navigating the golf-cart driving test, to young adults who now like to join us for well-garnished OR cocktails in the Reef Lounge.

My takeaway was that Ocean Reef was the perfect vacation spot--great weather, great people, great food, and magical white guest credit cards that made everything seem free (except, of course, to my parents).

But these quick glimpses weren't the full picture. What I (along with many of Ocean Reef's other shorttime residents) didn't have the time to appreciate is that OR is so much more than an Instagram playground. You need to settle in for a spell to appreciate this place for what it truly is: a thriving small town, a fascinating ecosystem, a welcoming home.

I was only able to take the long view after two extended, months-long stays over the last year, first to help my newly



widowed mother cope with her loss, and then to recuperate from a hip replacement. I won't lie: As a lifelong New York City boy and a recent retiree with a travel addiction, I wasn't sure if I could truly adjust to living "leisurely".

But it only took a few days for the gentle rhythms of OR life to seduce me (it helps that the Reef Treats cappuccino is superior to anything Starbucks can whip up). With more time on my hands, I wasn't at the mercy of a manic "one-week-in-paradise" activity schedule. And though I had concerns that living on The Reef might frustrate my innate preference for walking. Says who? I was under surgeon's orders to put my new hip to work, so I forced myself to take longer and longer strolls around streets that for decades I'd been golf-carting through without ever really seeing.

These walks gave me an entirely new perspective on OR's natural beauty. As a visitor, I never really gave The Reef's botanical life much thought beyond the freshness of the mint in my mojito. It was only after living here across the seasons that I got to appreciate the full natural spectacle The Reef offers. Who knew that there were trees here with boughs sleeved in pink blossoms that would make a geisha swoon? And what about that annual riotous carnival of bougainvillea and other tropical flowering plants? Walking a bit farther into some of the Reef's older neighborhoods, I started to notice the incredible variety of orchids hidden in shadows

in most of the yards, not to mention palm trees whose height defied belief.

It was the same with the animal life. We've all caught glimpse of the tiny lizards that are always scurrying away just before you step on them. Now I began to notice their larger, dinosaur-like cousins with their inflatable rainbow chin bladders. Or more than a few basking iguanas, seemingly unperturbed that they had a bounty on their invasive heads. And while you don't see nearly as many unhoused cats on The Reef as in the old days, being a semi-local gave me the chance to become familiar, if not friendly, with a few of them.

But the greatest revelation about OR's green side came when I finally made a few kayak trips through the expanse of the surrounding mangrove forests--something I never seemed to have the time for as a transient visitor. I hadn't realized that within earshot of the Jimmy Buffet tunes playing at the Lagoon, there are mangrove islands filled with scores of nests of the local cormorant colony. Kayaking between the walls of impossibly convoluted mangrove roots is a surreal experienceyou can spend hours drifting in and out of their silent shadowy recesses, an entire alien terrain made out of... plants.

But along with a new appreciation of The Reef's natural life, I began to take notice of The Reef's unique folk culture. For one thing, this is golf cart-based society--what pickups trucks are to Texas, golf carts are to Ocean Reef. There is Golf Cart Trick-or-Treating; Golf Cart Shopping Sprees; Golf Cart Scavenger Hunts (e.g. to find the many wacky mailbox designs, another Reef idiosyncrasy). During the Covid lockdown my parents and their friends kept their sanity by meeting for socially-distanced Golf Cart-tail parties.

And then there are the coconuts. In my walks, I started to notice brightly painted coconuts that were randomly, but deliberately, placed in the unlikeliest locations. Coconuts with abstract designs, or flags, or weird bug-eyed faces found balanced on a fence pole or in the jaws of the crocodile statue off Anchor Drive. To this day no one seems to have a clue where they came from or what they mean, but I hope they aren't scaring all those little kids at The Academy, though most likely they are finding them amusing just like the rest of the OR residents.

One thing I shouldn't have found surprising (but I did nonetheless) is how friendly and kind residents are to visitors and to one another. But being here over time and seeing the same friendliness day-in and day-out, it dawned on me that I wasn't simply enjoying "good service", I was enjoying being part of a true community of OR Members, who like and respect each other, who watch each other's backs.

There's an old joke about the Bostonian who, 30 years after moving to a renovated farmhouse in New Hampshire, finally gets up the nerve to tell his neighbor, a crusty tenthgeneration dairy farmer, that he now considers himself a "local". The old Yankee disagrees: "Just because yuh put a biscuit in the oven doesn't mean yuh'll get a turkey out of it."

Maybe so, but I'm ready to claim that after my own thirty years of knowing Ocean Reef only as a once-a-year visitor, I've found that OR's warmth is enough to turn biscuits into turkeys.


### What is the future for relations between Iran and the U.S.?

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### Introducing Huntley Brown... Again!

Here's a question for trivia buffs. It's not one you'll likely find in the New York Times Crossword Puzzles. Some local Ocean Reef knowledge is required. The question is this. "Who was the guest artist and speaker in the Chapel at Ocean Reef three years ago this month when COVID-19 restrictions were first implemented?"

The answer of course is in the header – it was the Jamaican-born artist, author, and pastor, Huntley Brown.

#### **Coping with COVID-19**

It was a morning I'll never forget. The sun was shining brightly as we gathered in the beloved old chapel. The brave souls who attended that morning had to sit six feet apart, in alternating rows of pews. A TV monitor stood outside with twenty or so chairs under the trees facing it in the parking lot. We thought some might want to attend but prefer to stay out of an enclosed space.

The morning proved to be our first attempt at streaming a service. I asked our admin person at the time, Claudia Romero, if it could be done? She replied, "I think so!" And with that, and her iPhone, it marked the beginning of an online presence for our worship services. (We've become more proficient, but the iPhone is still the camera of choice!)

It's amazing how much can change in such a short period of time – three years. While the COVID-19 virus is still lurking, the restrictions are thankfully, a distant memory. But for those who lost a loved-one during that time, the grief, like the tide, still

ebbs and flows.

Now three years later, we gather weekly during the season in the beautiful new Ocean Reef Chapel and Fellowship Center. For each of our four congregations, and the groups who meet there, it is becoming our familiar new home.

Why bring all this up? The answer is simple. Huntley's coming back! He will be our worship leader and guest speaker this **Sunday, March 26th**, in the 9 a.m. service. And in case you've forgotten, let me remind you why Huntley is a such a special guest!

#### Huntley's Journey

Huntley Brown is an internationally acclaimed pianist, author, and martial arts black belt. A native of Jamaica, Brown grew up in a Christian home. Without knowing how to read music, he learned to play the piano by imitating his brothers and his father who played the accordion and on a small piano. Mostly, he learned by listening to different recordings.

After graduation from high school, he played keyboard in hotel bands and piano bars in Jamaica. Dissatisfied with the club scene, he dedicated his life to Christ and began to seek God's direction for his life.

That decision led him to the United States, where he earned a bachelor's degree from Judson University in Elgin, Illinois, and a master's degree from Northern Illinois University in DeKalb. While at Northern Illinois University, Brown met Annette Chestnut, a fellow Caribbean student from Barbados. Following graduation, he and Annette were married. They reside in Aurora, Illinois, have four daughters.

#### Huntley's Credits

Huntley's passport is a record of all the places his music and speaking ministry has taken him through the years. He has been seen and heard through television, on radio, and in concert appearances in Austria, Bahamas, Barbados, Canada, China, England, Estonia, France, Germany, Grenada, Holland, Hong Kong, Hungary, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Indonesia, Japan, Jordan, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Russia, Palestine, Singapore, South Africa, Singapore, South Korea, Spain, St. Maarten, St. Vincent, Slovakia, Switzerland, Taiwan, Ukraine, and Wales.

Here at home, he has performed from coast to coast in major congregations and events. For many years, Huntley was the artist in residence for the Total Living Network in Chicago with host Jerry and Shirley Rose. He was also a lecturer and performer at the First International Gospel Music Festival in Italy and has worked with the Billy Graham association.

Huntley is a major recording artist with thirteen CDs to his credit, in a variety of musical styles. One person described Huntley's musical gifts saying, "Huntley plays as if God is whispering in his ears."

On this coming Sunday morning, the seats will not be six feet apart, and there will likely be no empty rows. We will all finally be able to enjoy Huntley's gifted artistry and his engaging preaching – in person. We will be blessed by the way Huntley's love for our God shines through his life. 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### Opportunity to Hear About Exploring Mars with the Curiosity Rover

The Ocean Reef community is invited to hear geologist John Grotzinger talk about "Mars Rover Mission: Challenges, Teamwork, Leadership" at the Cultural Center from 4 to 5 p.m. **Tuesday, March 28.** The free event will be followed by a complimentary wine and cheese gathering.

Dr. Grotzinger, a member of the U.S. National Academy of Sciences, is the Harold Brown Professor of Geology and division chair for Geological and Planetary Sciences at the California Institute of Technology. A field geologist, his interests include the

evolution of sedimentary basins, hydrocarbon reservoir systems, and the robotic exploration of Mars.

His research addresses the chemical development of the early oceans and atmosphere, the environmental context of early animal evolution, and the geologic factors that regulate sedimentary basins. Studies of the basic geologic framework of northwest Canada, northern Siberia, southern Africa, and the western United States are a





starting point for more topical laboratory-based studies. Because Mars and Earth are thought to have had similar early climates and geologic conditions, his work on the early Earth may help guide the analysis of early environments on Mars.

He strives, as he notes, "to make sure my work stays interesting and fun by finding new problems to work on, new countries to work in, and new colleagues to interact with. The Mars Exploration Rover (MER) mission provides me with all of this," and he envisions "planetary exploration as a time machine. Planets like Mars are (literally) in a frozen state of development and provide glimpses of what the Earth may have looked like billions of years ago."

"I still find it hard to believe that we can so precisely land a vehicle on another planet and then ask it to do many of the same things that we do here in earth. It's thrilling to imagine it collecting data on Mars," and he observes that the process requires balancing short-term vs. long-term objectives, concluding, "It's the bite-size discoveries along the way that keep momentum up to deliver on the longterm plan."

As for the importance of exploring Mars, he hypothesizes that "the early history of Mars is likely to have been very similar to that of Earth. So it's possible we may gain insight into processes that operated early on for both planets."

Prior to moving to Caltech in 2005, Dr. Grotzinger spent 18 years as a member of the faculty at MIT. Between 2007 and 2014 he served as the Chief Scientist for NASA's Curiosity Mars rover mission for which he received NASA's Distinguished Public Service Medal in 2013.



## A Modern Fable told by Ed Hajim

In "The Island of the Four P's: A Modern Fable About Preparing for Your Future", Member Ed Hajim has written a follow-up to his bestseller, "On the Road Less Travelled", in the form of a fable. Geared toward the individual ready to begin a career or in need of a change in direction, he invites the reader on a quest for what is important. As he explains, "It is a fable about the huge, scary challenge we all face: carving our path to success and happiness. It uses fiction to capture the truth of human experience – our striving



and yearning, our courage, joys and fears.

The strength of the book is that its very meaningful points are masked in a non-preachy tone. He admits there are many ways to find success and that luck is not to be overlooked. But his 4 P's, which he has lived by, can be adapted easily if you are open to them.

The first P is Passion. The protagonist learns from his mentor, "they will be the basis for goals you set and the energy and determination you derive from them will enable you to overcome obstacles and disappointments."

The second P is Principles and its 4 most important components: Self, Family, Work and Community "help define the kind of person you are and the way you live your life."

The third P is Partners. Ed and I discussed this section the longest and in most depth. The book discusses a partner's importance but whether in personal life or business, these form the integral part of how you successfully navigate your life. He commented that once he knew his strengths, he always looked for people who had different skill sets from himself.

The fourth P is Plans that include what he believes are the 4 main drivers in life and its inevitable changes: Economics, Government, Demographics and Technology. He also points out the consistent pattern of change or an "S" curve. The rise and fall of real estate, swings in the stock market and agricultural cycles are just some examples he discusses that can change a planned trajectory.

I tried not to give the complete storyline away but hopefully you can see how Ed Hajim's thought process made him the successful man he became in business and in life. It was not an accident. He also humbly acknowledges those who helped with this book. He has created a "soft sell" on how organizing a life around the above principles and even used names and organizing tools based on names Classics scholars will recognize!

Upon first read, the book seemed lighthearted. But on slowing down and pausing to digest the ideas, it rings with truths and lessons brimming over with deep seeded concepts perfect to read for yourself or gift anyone you know who finds themselves at a crossroads!

**Presentation Offers** Advice Important to All

The Ocean Reef ForgetMeNots, a caregiver support group, sincerely thank Captain Albert Alvarez and Fire-Medic Javier Fernandez of the Ocean Reef **Community Association Public** Safety Department for coming to their March 14th meeting at the Medical Center. The two Fire-Medics presented a very educational review of the crisis calls they respond to on The Reef. They emphasized how all of us are important members of the response team in these challenging

situations. There are important things we can do before help arrives.

These two experienced Fire-Medics immediately engaged the audience with

their approach of asking everyone to name the symptoms for each crisis, starting with heart attacks, then moving onto stroke, dangerous low sugar levels, allergic reactions, bleeding and choking. Both caregivers and care receivers were able to name symptoms but after just naming one, the officers would ask, "what is the first thing you will do" and it was "Call 911 and always immediately tell the call taker that you are

calling from Ocean Reef. This is important because sometimes the ORCA Dispatch call taker will be managing another emergency and unable to answer a 911 call. When this happens the 911 call is routed to Monroe County Dispatch. To avoid confusion and ensure a timely response, always immediately tell the call taker that you are calling from Ocean Reef. If there was anything the audience learned last Tuesday, it was "Call 911". But we learned so much more. The Fire-Medics demonstrated CPR on adult and child mannequins after checking for evidence of breathing and pulse. They showed how to

give the Heimlich maneuver for choking, apply pressure for bleeding, and give a sugary drink to someone showing serious signs of low sugar levels but still able to talk.

The ORCA Public Safety Fire-Medics recommended that caregivers take the complimentary CPR/AED class offered periodically by their department. Call Call Patty Benitez, Ocean Reef's Training & Compliance, for dates and registration at 305-367-5965.





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### Genealogy Enthusiasts Make Fascinating Finds

Have you ever wondered what your great-grandparents were like or what they experienced over 100 years ago? I recently discovered that my maternal great-grandfather, Valentino Azzopardi, left his home on the island of Malta in 1913 for a trip to Alexandria, Egypt, at age 29. How? Because I now have a copy of his passport! This was just one of many discoveries made by Ocean Reef Members who took this spring's genealogy course offered by the Art League.

Professional genealogist and long-time enthusiast of this topic, Tamara Hallo, returned to the Art League to again lead

the class. She has eight years of experience as a professional genealogist and has researched her own family for over 18 years. Hallo is currently president of the Genealogical Society of Greater Miami (GSGM). She also teaches courses relating to the various vehicles available online to enhance an individual's research and get full benefit of what is available. Her vast knowledge, enthusiasm and passion for the field is contagious and inspiring. Reflecting on her personal family research, Tamara



said it has made her the person she is today. "Once you know the stories...that brings a reality to a person that you never knew. It's hard to make that connection with an ancestor, when you don't have their stories. You connect to them, but on a different level." She encouraged the class to interview living relatives and forage boxes in attics and basements of older family members for letters and documents, emphasizing that genealogy is so much more than dates and names.

Class member and avid genealogy researcher **Marcia Ryon** enrolled in this class for a second time to continue her studies. She explained, "Although I had already been doing genealogy, Tamara led me to open a lot more doors. I found the manifest of when my greatgrandfather arrived in Baltimore!" Marcia also said she enjoyed being with her classmates and hearing about everyone else's research.

One particularly fun moment in this year's class was the day when one class member discovered that she and our instructor were related! None of us could believe that coincidence and we shared their excitement in this discovery that is one of the incredible perks of doing ancestry research.

**Jean Reed** had her own success story as a rookie in genealogy research. "I signed up for the course to see if I could verify hand-written research from 1981 that related to my mother's family tree and traced her ancestry back to the 1500s. I was amazed each week by the amount and type of information Tamara explained could be found online. By the end of the class, I found an online match for the entire 1981 family tree! I am off to a great start, thanks to this course."

For some, including myself, the class was a chance to quit procrastinating and begin the quest of finding family members of the past. **Lee Westervelt** admitted, "I had intended to start researching my family tree for years. The Art League's genealogy class gave me a jump start, and all the tools necessary to begin my project."

Although I have verified dozens of relatives on my paternal family tree, I personally still face a challenge on my mother's side as many records were destroyed in Malta during the devastation of WWII. Despite the challenges, I am determined to keep digging and unlock my past. As a Chinese proverb suggests, "To forget one's ancestors is to be a brook without a source, a tree without a root." Maybe it's time for you to get started?!



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

# Continued Light Wind Challenges on the Pond

As I mentioned in last week's article, early forecasts were predicting a change in the Sunday weather pattern. We hoped we would move away from the light wind days that had been in place for quite a few successive Sundays to breezier conditions. But the conditions we found this past Sunday morning were anything but breezy. On the positive side there was no rain, just more of the same light wind conditions for another Sunday.

While the wind was light, we did have enough to race... eventually. A 15-minute delay was called from our usual 10:00 a.m. start time while we waited for the wind to come up. In the

meantime, we had to reset the race buoys due to a shift in the wind from a light east-northeast, to a more north-northwesterly direction. This was not in the forecast, but we adapted. Between waiting for the wind and the multiple course resets, we were one hour into our allotted time on the pond and had only completed one race. So, by reducing the number of laps per race after Race #1, coupled with a little cooperation from Mother Nature, who gave us just enough wind to keep

racing, we were able to complete our five-race schedule. Much like the recent Sundays, the course conditions were challenging. Random wind shifts and random patches of no wind meant that continued momentum was the key to success. At the end of the racing day, the top two sailors tied on points which required going to the second tiebreaker determined by the winner of the final race. After applying the tiebreakers, the winner of the day was yours truly, Windsor **Coffin**, as I won the final race of the day. In second place was Al Mast who had two firsts and two thirds, just like I did, but Al finished third in the final race.

Rounding out the top three, and only a couple of points behind, was **Joe Robillard**.

Looking towards this coming Sunday, its looking like the light wind Sunday pattern that we are in will continue. It is fortunate that our East Coast 12 Meter model yachts require very little wind to get going, but a break from the current pattern with stronger more consistent winds would certainly be welcome.




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# Two Big Tournaments in the Books

# Reef Cup Has a History

This year's Reef Cup is complete, and it was a good one. Lots of fish were caught, the weather was challenging, and the participants enjoyed themselves onshore as well as at sea. The size of the field (59 boats) hasn't changed in years. It's always waitlisted and the limitation is more an issue of the size of the onshore activity — the social events run to 500 people — than the offshore. The number of fish caught, 163, was higher than last year,

but records of 300+ were set years ago.

The event is 38 years old, and has seen plenty of changes along the way — it used to be in January, now it's scheduled for March. It was four days, now it's three. Technical innovations like kites have changed scoring systems. But for some participants it's a family tradition, going back years, decades, even to pre-Club buyout days, and they man the boat with sons and daughters, cousins and in-laws. Out of the top five boats, I believe that four were family affairs. All for a trophy and some bragging rights.

Add to the mix the captains and crew, who make critical decisions about where to go, north or south, what depth to fish and exactly where and when. The match up of currents, winds and

temperature that promise the baitfish to lure in the sails is a complex and intuitive calculation that decide a boat's fate.

To be honest, there are a lot of winners. In the field of 59 boats and 299 anglers, there are top men, women, junior anglers and each day has its roster of first, second and third best boat or angler. Many of the participants I spoke to were proud to inform me of their being on the top boat of a certain day, or that they were with an angler who caught the most fish on one of the three days. Some reminded me that they won in prior years, even many years ago. But what struck me were the folks who have fished for 20 vears (the **Zifferers**) or 25+  $(Tom \ Davidson, \ Jr) \ \text{or even}$ all 38 years, not including the boycott year of 1993 (Ken Reda).

Now that's dedication!

#### **History of Croquet**

The ancestral croquet game was introduced to Britain from

France during the 1660–1685 reign of Charles II of England, Scotland and Ireland and was played under the name of *paille-maille* (among other spellings, today usually *pall-mall*), derived ultimately from Latin words for 'ball and mallet' (the latter also found in the name of the earlier French game, jeu de mail). In decades past, Ocean Reef croquet has hosted large tournaments with the top professionals in the world These events were so large and popular, the Inn was full of visiting players and extra temporary croquet courts were cut into the golf course fairways. Card Sound Golf Club once had a beautiful lawn and active croquet club.



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



# Attacking Notrump Contracts Passive opening leads

In some situations, you'll want to be patient and make declarer work for all his tricks. Your goal on these hands is to make a safe opening lead that won't give declarer a "cheap" or undeserved trick.

A safe lead may also be an attacking combination -- such as a suit headed by AK, KQJ or QJ10 -- and these are usually good choices for a lead to any contract. If you aren't dealt these easy holdings, you'll sometimes have to select a passive lead. Passive leads include:

• A lead from a topless suit (such as 8762), especially one in

which you don't expect partner to hold an honor. When in doubt, lead through strength by choosing a suit dummy (rather than declarer) has bid.

• A lead from length -- such as fourth best from Q9653 or K87432. Even though underleading an honor is standard to a notrump contract, it can be risky against a suit contract. Length, however, gives you a margin of safety. The longer your suit, the less likely it will be that declarer needs to develop his own tricks in that suit.

• A trump, in some cases. How do you know when a passive lead is your best choice? Here are some of the contracts and types of auctions that call for a safe, non-attacking opening lead:

The opponents are in 6NT or a grand slam.

An exception is if the opponents bid 6NT after an auction that suggests that their main source of tricks will be a long suit. In this case, you may want to make an aggressive opening lead (away from an honor) to try to set up a trick you can cash if you get the lead later.

## The auction tells you that declarer has a strong hand and dummy (and/ or partner) will be very weak. Suppose your RHO opens 2NT (20-22 pts.) and LHO raises to 3NT. What's your lead from ♠986 ♥AQ62 ♦KQ43 ♣Q6 ?

If you follow the "fourth from longest and strongest" rule, you'd choose the ♥2 or the ◆3. But with almost all the outstanding honors on your right, either of these leads has a high risk of giving declarer a gift. Partner can't hold more than 2-3 high-card points, so it's not a good idea to count on him for help in a specific suit.

A more attractive choice is a passive \$9. This is unlikely to set up tricks for your side, but it probably won't help declarer. You'll be on lead again soon, and if your spade lead was indeed safe, you should consider continuing the suit. If a switch is necessary, you'll have a better idea of which suit to choose later.

Note that you should not lead a diamond honor. A diamond will probably be right only when partner has the  $\blacklozenge J$  (or the unlikely  $\blacklozenge A$ ), so if you do choose a diamond lead, it's better to lead low (the  $\blacklozenge 3$ ). If partner has no honors (declarer and dummy have any combination of the  $\blacklozenge A$ , J, 10 and 9), leading the  $\blacklozenge K$  will give declarer three eventual tricks. If you instead lead low, declarer can't take more than two tricks in the suit.


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


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
