While honors are due to the 2023 All Charities Weekend co-chairs Anne Marie Peretz, Barbara Olcott and Kelly Hertzman, their committees, the Preferred Partners and the staff, Weinstein looks to the Members, noting, "Everyone's generosity shows the passion that the Membership shares, including Social and Legacy contributing through the dues check-off, to ensure that this special place and our neighboring communities remain vibrant. 

Rules Reminder:

Children

levels, and in their wake, many new Members added their energy, enthusiasm, and bids to the weekend's success. Pointing out that this year's end-of-the-evening "Raise the Paddle," when everyone gives in recognition of the need, was the third highest ever, Weinstein applauded "the way people raised their paddles — an astonishing show of support." Details of those distributions will be forthcoming soon.

In the meantime, also deserving of applause are the many representatives of the Ocean Reef Chamber of Commerce who come through the gate every day and offered up dozens of exciting packages for bid, as well as ACW's 14 Preferred Partners, whose steadfast support, through their cash and auction item donations (valued this season at nearly \$2 million), ensure that the monies raised at the Silent and Live Auctions enable ORCF to give 100 percent of the donations made by Club Members to non-profits.

As Weinstein points out, "While our Preferred Partners help us to accomplish so much, we can also help them by returning that support whenever we have a need, whether while we're here on The Reef or elsewhere." So cheers to Baer's

Dolphin Course to Undergo Re-Grass Next Month

In a few weeks' time, Members will begin to notice the Dolphin Course looking a little different. For the avid golfer, you're likely familiar with this already as the Club conducts golf course aeration every summer, but the re-grass project beginning next week is much more intensive than aeration. That is why the Club is sharing with you the details of what it's doing this summer to uphold the world-class standards of our golf courses at Ocean Reef:

On Wednesday, April 5, re-grassing of the Dolphin Course will begin. The Dolphin Course fairways were last re-grassed in 2011, and in the years since, the Club has experienced several storms,

including Hurricane Irma, that left many holes under water for extended periods of time. This has led to seeds from the rough washing into the fairways and germinating, or growing, resulting in significant cross-contamination that has been very difficult to combat. After many other methods have been tried and failed, the solution, which is being implemented this April, is to completely re-grass all Dolphin Course tees, fairways, collars and rough.

The Club's Golf Course Maintenance Team will begin spraying of the Dolphin Course on April 5, which will essentially kill all of the grass currently there. Members and their pets should stay off the Dolphin Course on this day, but may safely return to the course by the morning of April 6. Within two weeks, you will notice the grass beginning to turn brown, however it will still be playable. Come May 1, the Dolphin Course will close for six months. The Hammock Course will also close periodically this summer for its regular aeration - the annual course treatment that ensures the courses remain in top condition during the season. Because of the re-grassing of the Dolphin and the regularly-scheduled aeration of the Hammock, only nine holes will be open on the Hammock at any given time this summer. To complete an 18-hole round, golfers will have to play those nine holes twice.

Beginning June 7, the Hammock back nine will close for maintenance. From there, the closure schedule will alternate between the front and the back nine of the Hammock throughout the summer. Stay tuned for the aeration schedule, to be published in upcoming editions of the Press.

"Our two championship golf courses are highly-valued parts of life at Ocean Reef for golfers and non-golfers alike," said Director of Agronomy Eric Bennett. "Our Maintenance Team is prepared for the extensive summer-long process and dedicated to returning the course to the superior playing conditions our Members expect and are accustomed to. While we apologize for the inconvenience this treatment will cause for golfers this summer, we are confident our Members will be able to see the difference, in both aesthetics and playability, when the Dolphin Course reopens in time for next season."

MAKING HISTORY

Ocean Reef Season Busy... Rendezvous, Wedding and Parties Summer, 1964

The social season went along beautifully with a wedding, gala luncheon parties and many beautiful cocktail and dinner affairs.

The wedding, Ocean Reef's first, was that of Miss Constance Pierce Hughes, of Dubuque, Iowa to Mr. Kenneth Allen Montgomery, also of Dubuque, Iowa. The ceremony took place on March 20th and was held in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Robert C. Trier, Jr.

In 2014, Ocean Reef's first bride and groom celebrated their golden anniversary at Ocean Reef. The late **Gertrude Mann** interviewed Connie and Ken Montgomery for the Ocean Reef Press and they recalled the event as follows:

While Ken was in graduate school, they decided to get married. Connie's mother, Mrs. Herbert Hughes, was a renowned hostess and party giver. She began planning an elaborate wedding in Dubuque, Iowa, but Connie, the oldest of three daughters, insisted on a small wedding. They immediately switched direction and called their dear friends Dorry and Bill Baker, at the place where they were spending the winter in the Florida Keys. Bill was the son of Ocean Reef founder Morris Baker, and they agreed Ocean Reef would be an ideal place for a wedding.

Mrs. Hughes organized the wedding event in about 10 days. Because Ken was still in graduate school, he came to the Reef just a few

days before the wedding. He flew into Miami and took a small plane to the Reef. The flight to Miami was late. When the pilot of the small aircraft arrived here, he saw the landing strip had no lights. Emergency! He called for help. The Hughes and Baker families were at dinner but rushed to the airport with their cars, so the car headlights could illuminate the landing strip. The plane landed safely in the first nighttime landing at Ocean Reef.

Thanks to Michael Berman, I just got to experience one of these. Mike arranged for the Wine & Spirit Education Trust (WSET) to present a daylong sommelier class leading to a WSET Level I Certificate. I joined thirty Ocean Reefers looking to expand their appreciation of wine. Sarina Kinney sat to my left, and Teresa Holmes was on my right. They remained impressively attentive and sober through nine glasses of wine and detailed instruction from Rebecca Hodges and Alessandra Esteves, our seasoned wine

experts from WSET.

Fair Patricia and I have enjoyed wine for more than fifty years. We joined Les Amis du Vin when we lived in Washington, D.C. I remember my first Grand Cru (1970 Chateau Palmer, Bordeaux) was \$9 dollars a bottle (now it is \$430). On our first European vacation, we spent several days in the Vineyards of Burgundy and the wine caves under the town of Beaune. Over time, we visited Alsace, Bordeaux, St. Emilion, Provence, Champagne, Chablis, Cognac, Oporto, Tuscany, and Napa and Sonoma. The WSET class revealed how much I didn't know.

Rebecca and Alessandria concentrated on the tasting of wine and appropriate food/ wine pairings. We sampled reds and whites, noting the fruit or the oak, and evaluating the sweetness, acidity, tannin, alcohol content, and body. For instance, sweetness is detected on the tip of your tongue, so Rebecca recommended tilting the glass and extending just the tip your tongue into the wine. Sarina and Teresa cracked each other up trying this maneuver. Winston would have been a whiz; his tongue is two feet long. We got a little basket of food products containing salt, acid, umami, sweet, spicy, or fat. Some surprise pairing results: salty food made both the red and white wines taste better, with more fruit and body. Acid (tomato) also made the red wine taste better, so salt your tomatoes. The demonstrations were fun and eye-opening.

As we departed, Mike

Berman passed out a takehome gift of two Grand Cru wines from Bordeaux, and a red and a white from Magnolia Blossom, a California estate bottling. A very generous finish. Thanks, Mike. You have given a nice boost to All Charities and contributed another enhancement to the rhythms of The Reef.


Short Takes

Easter — Where's the Rabbit?

Growing up in a small East Texas town, my earliest memory of Easter is formed around a question: "Where's the rabbit?"

The Holy Grail

Each year, an Easter egg hunt was held in our city park. As kids, we lined up, waiting to get our share of the sugary bounty. Our focus wasn't just on the easy pickings of the colorful eggs, scattered across the park. No, no! The goal, the ultimate prize, the holy grail, was the one and only golden egg! Not once did I find it – drats!

But what stumped me was the rabbit that laid all those eggs — especially that golden egg! Hence, my question! "Where's the rabbit?" A naïve child indeed!

Many Easters have come and

gone. There's no Easter "bahhumbug" from this grandpa. We celebrate the beauty and bounty of the resurgence of life in the spring.

But through the years, while my enjoyment remains, my questions have changed. One question stands out above all others.

Myth or Reality?

Death and re-birth legends and myths abound, reflecting the cyclical nature of life. They are ubiquitous through time and across cultures. A common assumption is that any one of these cultural stories or myths is as valid as another. Their origins are assumed to be human invention, attempts to explain and/or give meaning to these naturally recurring events.

The well-known English writer, C.S. Lewis, was an atheist for the first 40 years of his life. From childhood, he and his brother were steeped in Norse myths and legends. He assumed that the Easter resurrection story was just another of the myriad death and rising myths.

Lewis was a regular at the gathering of the Inklings, writers who met on Tuesdays at The Eagle and Child Pub in Oxford, for beer and wide-ranging

conversation, as well as sharing their works-in-progress.

A Life Changing Question

Knowing Lewis' view, fellow member and writer, J.R.R. Tolkien, challenged Lewis' thought with this question. "What if the resurrection story of Jesus is the myth that came true?"

Following a deliberate search, his logical process of reason and study led Lewis to conclude that Christ's resurrection indeed, in his words, was "the myth come true." It was the first step in his lifechanging journey of faith.

The New Atheists

There is a contemporary movement of "new atheists." They relentlessly assail religious faith of any kind, especially Judeo-Christian faith. They assert that belief in God makes no more sense than believing in the Easter bunny. In their minds, anyone pursuing faith might as well be engaging in the kind of childish magical thinking that asks, "Where's the rabbit!"

Questions are good. But what if their conclusions are erroneous. What if the evidence, honestly considered, leads to a different conclusion – to Lewis' conclusion? It changes everything.

The Meaning of Easter

The Biblical witness of Judeo-Christian faith is that the God of all creation revealed himself in history through a people he chose, the Jewish people. It was through them and their Scriptures that God's nature and purposes were first revealed in history.

The core of Christian faith is that the God of Israel assumed our humanity in the incarnation of Jesus of Nazareth.

He lived in obscurity for 30 years. The account of his three-year ministry, recorded in the Gospels, has stirred belief in questioning minds and seeking hearts for centuries. At the age of 33, he was put to death by public, Roman execution.

What happened next totally confounded even his closest followers. On the third day, they found the stone rolled away and the tomb empty. Their eyewitness testimony is the claim of his resurrection. It was the ultimate demonstration of God's power. Death has been destroyed, and the way opened to everlasting life.

That declaration is the shared witness of faith celebrated by Christians of every tradition at Easter. We celebrate "the myth come true."

Educating Future Generations About the Ecosystem in Our Own Backyard

At last month's presentation by The Everglades Foundation at the Ocean Reef Cultural Center, we were reminded of the value of educating future generations about the importance of the Everglades to Florida Bay. The Foundation's Everglades Literacy Program is focused on exactly that. Established in 2014, this program offers the world's only free, preK-12 comprehensive Everglades curriculum. Throughout the state, it has impacted 175,000 students and provided free training to 5,000+ teachers, including several right here at The Academy at Ocean

The most recent training by the Foundation's education team included sample lessons and activities that are part of the free, standards-aligned curriculum. Teachers at The Academy built models of the historic versus altered Everglades watershed to understand historic changes to the ecosystem, learned about the importance of American alligators and threatened or endangered species, and reviewed five habitats and 39 species that live in the Everglades.

Reef.

At neighboring Key Largo School, Ms. Pamela Caputo has been teaching K-5 students for 28 years. We found her comments about the Everglades education program to be inspiring, and as fellow residents of Ocean Reef, we thought you would, too.

Q. How did you first hear of the Everglades Literacy Program?

A. "Years ago, a local motel

hosted the 'Fairchild Challenge,' and offered to also host a training for teachers about the Everglades Literacy Program. We learned so much, we were inspired to do more.

Our school won the challenge, and one of the perks was to have a scientist from Florida International University set up an aquaponics system in two of our classrooms. I've had a system in my classroom ever since. We also had the opportunity to spend a day with our students at Dolphin Research Center. All this opened our eyes to the magical things that live in the seagrass, and how important the Everglades ecosystem is to the Keys.

The 'challenge' and learning about the Everglades inspired me to teach students how to be stewards of our world, starting in our own backyard. The Everglades and Florida Bay are right here, but many kids in Key Largo have never experienced either one. My goal is to provide them with as much access as I can to our amazing ecosystems."

O. How has the Everglades education program benefited you and your students?

A. "I am a firm believer in learning all you can about the beauty of our world, especially right here where we live. I think we are doing an injustice to future leaders by not educating them about one of the most vital and wondrous ecosystems – and lifelines – in Florida: The Everglades.

The program has opened my eyes to the fact that we need to do a better job teaching about

Florida Bay and the Everglades. It's wonderful to see students engaged and wanting to do more, learn more, and get more involved. I've seen students get excited about recycling, doing their own cleanups, asking their parents to take them to the Everglades, and just eager to get involved.

It's up to us as educators to show our students how to be stewards of our environment, to take care of our world and each other, to get outside and look for the beauty, and never stop being curious and asking questions. That's what it's all about."

Medical Lecture Series Presents "Current Concepts & Management of Low Back Pain"

"Back pain is very common, whether it's a chronic

condition as we age or it hits suddenly after improperly straining the spine to pick up something heavy. Whatever the cause – arthritis, spinal stenosis (narrowing around the nerve roots), blunt injury or something else — back pain is one of the most common reasons why Americans over the age of 45 seek medical care, next to the common cold," explains Ronald Tolchin, D.O.

In part of a video presentation, Dr. Tolchin discusses his approach to patient care and stated the following: "I would like my patients to remember me as someone different, someone who thinks outside of the box, someone who is open to alternative avenues of medicine, which I am. So, if they have ideas and they come to me and say, 'I'd

like to try acupuncture or I'd like to try massage or Tai-chai', then we can have that conversation because I understand that, and I'm open-minded about that because I learn from my patients as they learn from me."







A Busy Week for CSSC!

Thursday we had our second "Gathering at Waterside". This event has proven popular with our membership offering opportunities for us to gather outside of the sailing venue and to have spouses join in the fun and camaraderie. Also, it's interesting to see what everyone looks like when not in sailing gear and covered in sunscreen and sunglasses. We really are a handsome group.

Friday we conducted a sailing trial of sorts to explore and test relative performance attributes of rigging the jib with and without "the club". The club is a bowed wooden boom that attaches to the clew (lower edge of the jib where it meets the trailing edge of the sail) and the forestay about 18" above the deck. The club has a turning block on the aft (back) back end which allows the jib to be set on a trim and is self-tacking. Without the club, the jib may be trimmed and tacked by the crew. This is highly preferred by the fleet here at Ocean Reef. The Bullseye Class Association prefers the use of the club and does not sanction direct sheeting during their sponsored National Championship Regatta.

We held this technical trial to determine if there is a discernable performance difference and to provide data in order to request that the class rules allow a hosting club to permit the optional use of the club.

Joining CSSC for this event were former Bullseye National Champions Joan and Ed Tiffany from Beverly Yacht Club of Marion, Mass. We held multiple starts with sprints to the weather mark featuring six boats using the club and six boats using direct sheeting without the club. We then sailed several two-boat sprints between boats with and without the club. This also gave us the opportunity to examine relative sail shape differences and apparent slot variables between the jib and main. One of our members took just over 500 photos of the trial for reference and discussion. We hope to have a follow-up on this effort before the 2023-24 season.

Enough of the technical stuff. We mostly are about fun on the water so on Saturday we were back to racing. We had plenty of wind and our All-Star Race Committee of **Lorne**

Thirty Eight Years

How many times do you hear an Ocean Reef story like this? Born and raised on the water in St Augustine, Peter Menten has been fishing all his life. In 1960, as a junior employee of Ford Motor Company, he was first introduced to Ocean Reef when he was helping transport Benson and Edie Ford to the Anglers Club. Ten years later he was in Fort Lauderdale, married, had a Ford dealership of his own, and was coming down to Key Largo by boat to fish weekends. A Member of OR in 1974, and in the '80's, with the help of **Bill Dickinson** (some things never change!), the proud owner of a Channel Cay home with his 31 ft. Bertram in the canal behind.

The years fly by, but fishing is a regular part of life, and for 38 years annually fishing in the Reef Cup, with wife **Deborah** right by his side and

son **David**, his wife, and then grands, is a regular tradition. The boats may change over time — Pisces III was for the shared zodiac sign of Peter, Deborah and David, and when David married, there was a Pisces IV, finally followed by the current Pisces V, built to be kinder and gentler on the joints, knees and shoulders.

Some things lasted longer, like captains — Matt Shunk was the captain for 25 years, until the call of the seas was drowned out by the siren song of art, such that he is an artist today, and so accomplished that he painted the artwork that was raffled off at the charity

auction at this year's Reef Cup ball! The Mentens didn't have to look far for a new captain — son David's friend since 2nd grade, Greg Graham, has spent his life on the water too and stepped into the job and has held it for years now.

Some years they were winners — Top Boat in 1989 and in 2012 — with multiple Top Angler awards, especially granddaughter **Casey's** Junior Angler trophies. The fishing itself has changed over the years with the technique of kiting and the strategic options it offers. Some years are more about the shared experience of the contest

and enjoyment of the social events — Deborah is always in charge of the costumes, which have sometimes been elaborate, witty and even a little embarrassing for some crew members, but the whole team participates.

But going out fishing is a constant, and it keeps the generations close. When the Mentens go on vacation, they go by water — twice through the Panama Canal — or get back on water when they arrive — Cabo, Hawaii. Fishing may mean diving, too — another attractant of Ocean Reef.

What have you done for as long as 38 years? I've been married that long, but that's about all that has been consistently a part of my life. I've changed lifestyles, homes and jobs, and never looked back. The recent Reef Cup was Peter and Deborah Menten's 38th annual tournament, and it looks to me like dedication, practice and repetition really does pay off — especially if you know what you like and recognize it when you see it.

The International Morse code of dots and dashes is used for flashing light

> signaling. The flashes and space between them are defined in terms of UNITS - a dot is one unit long; a dash is three units; the space between the dots and dashes of a single character (letter or number) is one unit long, between characters it is three, and between words or groups it is five. The length of a "unit" is roughly set by the skill of the

operator and the speed at which he can transmit accurately; it is best to transmit more slowly than your maximum capability, to minimize errors, and to exaggerate the lengths of dashes and spaces slightly rather than shorten them. Morse code letters, numbers, and punctuation marks are signaled by combinations of dots and dashes. Letters have from one to four components, numbers have five, and punctuation symbols have six. The basic Morse code is shown here. Memorizing the Morse Code characters takes time, but it can be done by anyone, and it is well worth the effort. Once learned, and occasionally used, it will not be forgotten.




