## Dolphin Course Re-Grassing Commences

Since mid-April, our Golf Course Maintenance Team has been hard at work on the Dolphin Course re-grass - a project that stemmed from years of storm damage creating cross-contamination of the grass on the Dolphin Course and hindering its playing conditions. As our team takes pride in maintaining worldclass course conditions for our Members, this re-grassing project is one of utmost importance to us and we know Members will experience the difference come next season.

In the meantime, the Dolphin Course is officially closed while the re-grassing is underway, and the Hammock Course will alternate having nine holes open at a time to accommodate Members and their guests who want to play this summer. (See page 37 for the course closure schedule).

At this point, if you've been at The Reef over the last month, you've likely noticed the Dolphin Course has turned brown. This is due to the non-selective herbicide applications that were first applied April 17 in order to kill the grass. Our team is now in the

process of removing one inch of turf and thatch, while turf around fairways, roughs, tees, greens and irrigation heads are also being removed.

The project will progress six holes at a time. The first six holes – numbers 1, 2, 6, 15, 17 and 18 – will follow the following process:

- May 15: Begin adding one inch of soil to all areas and start incorporating that soil into our own
- May 29: Make our final nonselective herbicide application
- June 2: Apply an herbicide to prevent weeds
- June 5: Plant sods and sprigs The remaining 12 holes will

follow the same process at slightly later dates.

When all is said and done, our team is confident the Dolphin Course will be in top condition that Ocean Reef golfers and nongolfers will surely admire.

# Construction Begins on The Marina Seawall

Last week marked the beginning of the summer construction project on our Marina seawall. As cited by two independent surveyors, the seawall had exceeded its useful life and replacement was necessary as improvements to it were last made around four decades ago. The project, which entails replacing 1,100 feet of seawall from the Marina Fuel Dock to H Dock, will improve and greatly extend the life of the seawall for use by our Members and their families for

many more years to come.

#### **Current Progress**

At present, the D Dock and Fuel Dock have been disabled, and our Dock Office Team has moved to a temporary location in the Marina Fitness Center lobby. Our team will operate in this area for a few weeks so stop by and visit us.

Additionally at this time, if you venture by the Marina, you'll see construction fencing set up in Yachtsman Parking Lot, the adjacent cart parking lot which has become an area for equipment staging, and a

large barge (pictured here) that will play a significant role in the seawall replacement.

While our Fuel Dock is disabled, our team is happy to be able to provide Members with diesel fuel for purchase at a temporary G Dock facility. If you're looking for diesel fuel services, call us at 305-367-5908 or radio Channel 16 prior to arriving at G Dock. Diesel fuel is available from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily while MarineMax continues to offer gas at their location.

#### **Looking Into the Future**

Completion of the Marina seawall enhancement project is slated for November 2023. In addition to replacing the seawall itself, by the project's end, the height of the seawall will also be increased, the electrical hardware will be replaced, bringing it up to current code, and the landscaping and driveways will be improved. Our team looks forward to providing an enhanced experienced for all of our Marina members once we reopen to our full capacity in time for season.





# Women of Influence — Moms!

Let me be one of the first to wish all moms Happy Mother's Day! I invite you to join us as we celebrate **Mother's Day in the Chapel at Ocean Reef** this Sunday at 10 a.m.

#### **Origins**

I've always assumed the origins of Mother's Day came from the creative minds at one of the greeting card companies! But a search on the web revealed otherwise. The history is fascinating.

During the Civil War, a woman named Ann Jarvis became known as 'Mother' Jarvis. She organized women's brigades throughout the war to do all they could for those fighting, no matter which side they were on. After the war ended, she worked tirelessly to heal the division between her Confederate and Union neighbors.

'Mother' Jarvis taught Sunday School as well. Her daughter Anna listened as her mother taught lessons on the influence of mothers in the Bible. Her teaching included the desire for a memorial in recognition of Mother's Day. Many days celebrated fathers and men, but none for women and mothers. It was an idea her daughter never forgot.

Following her mother's death, Anna began to write letters to prominent leaders, seeking their support in recognizing Mother's Day. Her correspondence reached out to presidents, and importantly to the Philadelphia merchant, John Wannamaker.

Her efforts coalesced on the second Sunday of May 1907. A Mother's Day service was observed at the Methodist Church in West Virginia where her mother had taught Sunday School. On that same day, 15,000 people turned out at the Wannamaker Auditorium in Philadelphia for a Mother's Day celebration.

The observance soon spread to 45 states, Puerto Rico, Hawaii, Mexico, and Canada. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a Congressional Resolution, officially establishing the observance of Mother's Day. Thanks to her daughter's efforts, 'Mother' Jarvis' desire had been realized.

#### Issue

It seems a bit anachronistic and old-fashioned to write about Mother's Day in a time when some people are reluctant to define or identify womanhood.

I am thankful for an understanding of personhood rooted in the image of the God whose likeness we all bear. It can be a sea-keeper for the soul, giving stability as we endure the peaks and troughs of relentless massive swells of cultural change.

June Cleaver and Harriet Nelson embodied idealized womanhood and motherhood through television shows in the 1950s. This idealization triggered the response of the feminist movement, some elements of which denigrated the importance of motherhood altogether.

We easily forget what life was like for a generation of mothers before life in 'Progressland,' as the General Electric pavilion predicted at the 1964 World's Fair. As a young boy, I remember watching my maternal grandmother in her bonnet, pushing a hand plow, breaking up the sun-hardened soil of the large garden she planted each year.

Over time, experience confirms repeatedly that one of the most powerful shaping influences in the development of a healthy sense of identity in the life of a child comes from the impact of a mother's life and love.

#### **Final Thoughts**

On this Mother's Day, we must keep in mind the reality that some women have never given birth to children. For some of them, Mother's Day can be an acute, painful reminder of an unfulfilled longing.

Some women have courageously rejected the notion that if you don't work outside the home, you can't possibly be fulfilled. Their greatest fulfillment and contribution often comes from their identity as a homemaker and mother.

Other women, like my wife, our daughter, and both daughters-in-law, are women who can manage the challenge of a successful career and being great moms as well.

And we all know moms who are single because of death or divorce. These women face the challenge of sometimes feeling like they don't fit, as they daily face the responsibility of leading a

household, 'flying solo.'

I find myself wishing that someone had kept 'Mother' Jarvis' notes from her study of mothers in the Bible. My hunch is she would have concluded that there is no "one size fits all" model to be found in the Scriptures. There are many common qualities, but no one defined role.

Let me wrap it up this way. If you and I are living and breathing, it's because someone loved us enough to bring us into this world, or to make us a chosen child through adoption. Whichever it is, you call that woman by a title of honor. You call her "Mom."

I'm grateful to "Mother" Jarvis for what she started! Because of her influence and her daughter's determination, we call this Sunday, Mother's Day. It's a day to honor all the women in our lives who nurture their families, their communities, their countries, and the larger world!


## We Mourn the Loss

Once picked up by Public Safety they cannot be returned or refilled by another pharmacy. This could leave you in a dilemma, especially when it's a critically needed medication. The Medical Center can support your off-season prescription needs through electronic communication with your

preferred pharmacy.

#### **Travel Planning**

A great feature of mobile phones is the various health options. IPhones come preloaded with a Health app that can store your medical history and medications, which is useful and very important in the event of a health emergency when traveling. It's also prudent to carry a listing of medications and an emergency contact in your handbag or wallet in the event you lose your mobile phone.

#### **Check for Expired Medications**

Review your medication cabinet before leaving for the summer. Solid dose over-the-counter medications such as tablets and capsules appear to be the most stable past their expiration



date. However, medications can and do change in potency depending on heat, light and humidity factors.

It's a good practice to check the expiration dates on all medications and properly dispose of those past their prime. Be kind to the environment and don't flush or pour any type of medication

into drains. The Medical Center can properly dispose of unwanted prescriptions unless they are controlled medications such as opioids or other narcotics. Controlled medications can be taken to Public Safety for proper disposal. Public Safety also has a medication drop-off box for your convenience.

## **Hot Topic**

Like a friend showing off a flashy German-engineered sports car, Executive Banquet Chef Catalin Munteanu proudly called me to present his newest catering addition — ovens. Not just any ovens, but cutting-edge culinary bad boys. German-engineered of course. Flashy too. Chef Catalin has two shiny new Rational Combi Pro ovens. He explained why they are so special.

"Years ago I worked with the early version of the Combi Ovens when I did banquets for the Ritz Carlton. They were amazing even then, but now they have many more features." He walked me over to two tall, side-by-side units gleaming in the Town Hall kitchen. "They cut labor. The temperature is consistently perfect," he said. Catalin rolled up a six-foot serving cart and pulled back the heat shield. "This cart can hold six plates to a tier. With 14 tiers we can retherm 84 plates at once."

Retherm? "Yes, we assemble a banquet serving, cooking each entree by precisely the right method - grilling, roasting, searing - to 90% of its serving temperature. The same for the side dishes, each cooked as most appropriate. Then we plate the food. We have time to do it carefully with attention to presentation. After a close scrutiny, the plates are loaded into the serving cart." Catalin opens the Combi Pro oven and demonstrates how the entire serving cart rolls inside.

"The oven uses convection heat or steam, or a combination. Each tier of the cart can be programmed individually to reach the serving temperature for the food in that tier. For instance, we could have beef in the top several tiers, salmon in the next few, and chicken in the bottom. All would be perfectly

finished, simultaneously, in eight minutes." With a flourish, Catalin wipes his hands on a dishtowel. "We pull out the carts, close up the heat shields, and roll a cart to each end of the banquet hall for service. In eight minutes another 168 plates can be in the hands of servers on the other side of the room. Three hundred and forty diners can have their meals warm from the oven in the time we can plate a single cart now." The ovens are even portable so they can be easily repositioned to where they are needed.

My mouth must have been hanging open. Catalin crosses his arms with a satisfied smile. "Yes, it is a game changer. Over my 25 years in kitchens, Ocean Reef is by far the first place to actively accommodate me with the tools to do the job properly. The Board and Management care about the Member experience, which is every chef's dream. We are grateful for what Ocean Reef does to make our jobs easier. Our reward is when a crowd of people enjoys a good experience. I can feel the reaction in the room. Just the

sounds of knives and forks and a contented murmur—that's what puts a smile on my face."

#### **Summer Plans**

The crowds may have thinned, but challenges remain undiminished. Summer is a time for equipment upgrades and service, and recruiting new kitchen staff to cover inevitable departures. I recently sat in on one of Executive Chef Jared Reardon's regular debriefs for his team of chefs. Jared noted several Sous Chef and Chef de Cuisine vacancies. He

encouraged any of the chefs interested to submit their names.

In-depth interviews and intense cooking demos are a well-known part of the process.

Jared congratulated the team for finishing the season strongly. "Nearly every restaurant was in the green," he said, meaning a satisfaction score on the Club survey of 90% or more. "Nearly every outlet improved their score from last year, some dramatically so like the Ocean Room." (Give Chefs Josh, Michael, Ryan, and Kimmi a pat on the back). Jared emphasized the training and education opportunities, and the available chef-to-chef demos on such topics as Charcuterie or Fish Butchery. Jared said, "We have student chefs who have mastered slicing raw fish into immaculate thin Sushi, but have never learned how to break down a whole fish. We need to expand their horizons. This is the time to refresh, train, participate in seminars, and get out in the field to visit farms and other venues to observe and learn "

Jared noted that Chef Michael (Ocean Room) just completed his MBA degree, and Chef Catalin is pursuing the Certified Executive Chef program from the American Culinary Federation. Jared said, "I take pride in each chef's progress. I expect Catalin will earn the certification by the end of the summer – an impressive multiyear achievement."

I am almost embarrassed to merely be "On Vacation" this summer.



Our typical trip planning consists of overpacking the night before and standing in the boarding line scrambling for titles to download for on-flight bingeing. Since the adrenaline rush of last-minute preparedness is how we've successfully navigated life so far, we don't see that bad habit changing any time soon. But we will help you planners with various titles to consider for late spring streaming:



#### Jury Duty 8-episodes; Amazon Freevee

Landing somewhere between hilarious and ridiculous, *Jury Duty* follows Ronald Gladden, a construction manager, who thinks he's on a documentary following a court case from a juror's point of view. Everyone -- the judge, the attorneys, the plaintiff, the defendant, and the courthouse security-are all actors. Gladden is the only one unaware he's being pranked. The well-orchestrated mockumentary was co-created by the team behind *The Office*.

Because it's set in Los Angeles, and actors, too, get called to serve, it's not all that strange to see James Marsden show up in a lot of potential jurors. Lesserknown actors make up a motley crew of supporting cast who join Gladden in the jury box.

California Judge Alan Rosen (Alan Barinholtz) is probably the most convincing, as he's both an improv actor and an actual attorney. But his midwestern accent and oddlytimed calls for extra-long lunch and coffee breaks are just some of the clues that Gladden doesn't quite pick up on.

What makes Gladden the perfect stooge is that he's an everyday nice guy. Rather than be annoyed at the oddball behaviors of his fellow jurors, he embraces them. When Todd Gregory (David Brown) comes to court wearing a pair of pants that doubles as a self-adhered chair he calls "chants," Gladden chalks it up to being eccentric.

When the case details are presented in the form of video reenactments from each party's point of view, nothing short of amateurish Beavis and Butt-Head-style animation, is when you start to think this absolute wackiness may just be worth sticking around to see.

#### Accused

#### Season 1: 15 episodes on Hulu

Impatient streamers will enjoy single-show stories revolving around someone who is accused of a crime. You just don't know if they're innocent or guilty until the end of the episode. While you won't get the character development you might get from a multi-episode multi-season show, if you don't like waiting for answers, *Accused* is worth exploring.

What we liked about Accused, based on a 2010 British series, is whatever it sometimes lacks in intricate crime telling, it makes up for in its casting of superb and familiar talent. In episode one, Scott's Story, a surgeon (Michael Chiklis) suspects his son is going to commit a horrible crime and considers killing his son himself. His wife (Jill Hennessy) prefers to put her head in the sand and not consider her husband's suspicions. In Jessie's Story, a teenager (Bebe Wood) is accused of breaking into a sperm bank to find out the identity of her biological father after she discovers her mother (Betsy Brandt) fabricated documents in a failed effort to quench her curiosity. You'll recognize Jessie's partner in crime Will (Skylar Gaertner) as Jonah Byrde from Ozark.

And if you're someone who does love over-the-top drama a la Lifetime, check out Danny's Story, where a beautiful aide (Rachel Bilson) may or may not be after her employer's money.



#### Rough Diamonds 8 episodes on Netflix

Unless you don't mind the sweet sounds of Flemish, set your tv for English dubbing with an added layer of English subtitle reinforcement. Now get ready to enter a thrill ride into the world of diamond dealing in Antwerp Belgium, the diamond capital of the world.

Rough Diamonds peels back the curtain on Antwerp's diamond trading businesses, where most of the city's Jewish population work. The series centers around

the ultra-orthodox Wolfson family, who owns Wolfson Diamonds, a 100-year-old renowned dealer.

Signs of cracking in the fiscal foundation of the family business begin to surface with the suicide of Wolfson's son, Yanki (Vincent Van Sande), who leaves loved ones in serious debt. The sect's strict beliefs weigh on their reaction to the return of another son, Noah Wolfson (Kevin Janssens), who they consider equally dead, as their levels of religious observance do not align. But soon the family will find themselves needing Noah's help at every turn.

This never-ending roller coaster features an unrelenting prosecutor, non-forgiving suppliers, family in fighting, lost love, and a host of scary money-laundering Albanian mobsters - for starters.

# Registration Open for 2024 Vote-by-Mail Ballots

Your Ocean Reef Political Action Committee wanted to share this notice regarding vote-by-mail ballots:

Supervisor of Elections Joyce Griffin is reminding Monroe County voters that they must request vote-by-mail ballots through her office's website or in person at her offices if they wish to receive ballots in the mail for upcoming elections. In prior years, requests for mail-in ballots covered two years of elections. That is no longer the case. The need to re-register for vote-by-mail ballots is due to a change in the law that states, "One request is deemed sufficient to receive a vote-by-mail ballot for all elections through the end of the calendar year of the next regularly scheduled general election."

Griffin's office is now taking vote-by-mail requests for the 2024 election cycle.

# The Mosquito Battle

Monroe County is a subtropical paradise where people love to live, but unfortunately mosquitoes feel quite comfortable in our environment, too. We have recently had an enormous influx of the dreaded Black Salt Marsh mosquito. Chad Huff, Florida Keys Mosquito Control District, Public Education/Information Manager, explained that the rain event here and in the Everglades caused a "boom of millions of mosquitoes" that blew in to Ocean Reef with a west wind. He shared that we can all take precautions to help the Mosquito Control District in the battle against these biting pests!

#### Watch For These...

There are about 46 species

of mosquitoes in Monroe County and three of these types are not just a common nuisance at The Reef; they can also cause health issues. The Black Salt Marsh mosquito is a biter that is generally the most bothersome. The Brown Southern House mosquito is active at dusk and dawn. Lastly, the Aedes Aegypti is mostly around people and homes and they breed readily in standing water. None of them are welcomed.

#### **Our Control System**

The Mosquito Control
District utilizes a variety of
methods to protect us from
these pesky critters. There
are a number of techniques
in place that help keep our
mosquito population down.
"Source Reduction" goes after
breeding areas with inspectors
looking for any standing
water in pots, trashcans,
or other containers. Chad
Huff said that mosquitoes
lay hundreds of eggs in one

ounce of water. So, any tiny bit of water can breed these rascals. The inspectors are on the lookout for water sources. "Larval Control" targets immature mosquitoes with an environmentally safe bacterium that is applied by air (helicopter) or ground. This can only be used when weather conditions are appropriate based on data collection and research. Another effective approach is "Adult Surveillance" which is staffed by inspectors that visit count stations daily throughout the Keys along with monitoring a variety of traps for mosquito count.

#### **How You Can Help**

We all need to take consistent basic steps to help the Mosquito Control District, especially after a huge rain event like we had recently all over South Florida. Checking our yards, pool areas, and docks for standing water is a must. Emptying any plant

saucers or equipment that can collect water can stop mosquitoes from hatching. Notifying any managers or gardeners to be alert for these areas can really help. When you are outside, especially in the early morning or at sunset, it is also advised to wear protective clothing and use insect repellant.

#### **Most Importantly!**

Call 305-292-7190 or go online at www.keysmosquito. org to do a service request when you do have a mosquito problem. It is really easy to do on your phone and helps the Mosquito Control District schedule their application of bacterium. Their goal is to react within 24 hours, but when a huge rain event and wind occurs, it could take a bit longer. More information regarding spray schedules and even a video is available on the website. Working together we can win the mosquito battle.

#### LIGHTS OUT DURING PEAK MIGRATION **SEASON**

Now through May 15

The Tropical Audubon Society asks that from 11 p.m. to sunrise, consider turning off or blocking nonessential lights to protect migratory birds traveling through South Florida. From mid-March to mid-May, spring bird migration is at its peak as millions of birds pass through South Florida to their breeding grounds. Migrating birds generally rest and forage during the day and travel at night, using the stars as navigational guides. Bright lights can sometimes impede their vision, steer them off course, and even cause deadly collisions. Please keep in mind, ORCA requires that all exterior lighting must be off by midnight, but please consider turning it off by 11 p.m.



In the Offshore category, with 2,200 points. was Carmen Sferrazza, with a total of 22 sailfish, including his incredible single day of 21 sails at 100 points per sailfish.

In a similarly outstanding style, in the Flats category, **Steve Woodsum** was the

winner. After a slow start with only one tarpon on day one, then three tarpon and two bonefish day two, on day three he had his epic day with 16 tarpon on fly! His three-day total of 6,600 points, all on fly at 300 points per.

Another tournament, not under the auspices of Rod & Gun Club but conducted by the Key Largo Anglers Club, is their annual Flats Tournament. A two-day flatsonly tournament, it is the last of the season and timed to catch the tarpon migration as well as warm waters for the bonefish. This year's winner was a familiar name — Steve Woodsum, with guide Jared Raskob — with a remarkable achievement as they swept the awards in winning first

place Fly, and Spin, Top Captain and Top Boat, with not one but TWO Grand Slams (permit on crab, tarpon and bonefish on fly) on EACH of the two days. Hats off to this team and their impressive angling!


#### **Changing Seasons**

## A Guide to Navigating the Rules of the Road

\*Based on the Navigation Rules International – Inland (Commandant Instruction M16672.2D, 1999)

Submitted by Robert Broton, Flotilla Commander, U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary-Ocean Reef

#### **Definitions (From Rule 3)**

• Vessel Engaged in Fishing -

Any vessel fishing with nets, lines, trawls or other fishing apparatus that restricts maneuverability, and excluding vessels fishing with trolling lines or other fishing apparatus that does not restrict maneuverability

- Vessel Not Under Command
- A vessel unable to keep out of the way of other vessels because an exceptional circumstance is

hindering its maneuverability (steering failure, engine breakdown, etc.)

- Vessel Restricted In Its Ability To Maneuver – A vessel unable to keep out of the way of other vessels because the nature of its work is hindering its ability to maneuver (buoy tender picking up a buoy, vessel transferring persons, provisions or cargo while underway, etc.)
- **Underway** A vessel not at anchor, aground or made fast to the shore
- **Give-Way Vessel** A vessel that must change course or speed to avoid a collision with a standon vessel
- Stand-On Vessel A vessel that must maintain course and speed except to avoid collision with another vessel

#### **Lookout (From Rule 5)**

• Every vessel shall at all times maintain a proper lookout.

Safe Speed (From Rule 6)

- All vessels must proceed at a safe speed at all times
- You must go slow enough to prevent a collision no matter what the conditions.

## **Determining Risk of Collision (From Rule 7)**

- Every vessel must use all available means appropriate, including lookout (eyes and ears), radar and radio, to determine if a risk of collision exists
- Steady bearing and decreasing range indicate a risk of collision.

#### **Action to Avoid Collision (From Rule 8)**

 Action to avoid collision should be taken well in advance of any potential meeting. Any course or speed change should be great enough to be obvious to any approaching vessel. Avoid a succession of small alterations of course.

#### Narrow Channels (From Rule 9)

• A vessel engaged in fishing shall not impede the passage of any vessel navigating in a narrow channel or fairway.

## Traffic Separation Schemes (From Rule 10)

• A vessel engaged in fishing shall not impede the passage of any vessel following a traffic lane.

## Overtaking Another Vessel (From Rules 13 and 17)

• A vessel that is being overtaken shall keep its course and speed.

## Responsibilities Between Vessels (From Rules 13, 18)

- To determine which vessel must give-way in an approach situation, it is essential to know the hierarchy established by the Rules:
- 1st Vessel not under command or vessel restricted in its ability to maneuver
- 3rd Any vessel being overtaken
- 4th Vessel engaged in fishing
- 5th Vessel under sail
- 6th Power-driven vessel

## Meeting Another Vessel Head-On (From Rules 14)

• When two power-driven vessels meet on reciprocal (head-on) or nearly reciprocal courses so as to involve the risk of collision, both shall alter course to starboard so that they pass port-to-port (except as provided by Rules 9, 10 and 18)

## Crossing Situation (From Rules 15 and 17)

• When two power-driven vessels are crossing so as to involve the risk of collision, the vessel which has the other on her own starboard side shall keep out of the way and avoid crossing ahead of the other vessel.

## Action by the Give-Way Vessel (From Rule 16)

• Every vessel in sight of another and required to give way to another vessel shall, so far as possible, take early and substantial action to give way.

## Action By The Stand-On Vessel (From Rule 17)

• When one of two vessels is required to give way, the other vessel (the stand-on vessel) shall maintain its course and speed.

# Cuebids: (Slang Obid)



by Gregg Van Dyke, Director of Card & Games

A cuebid is the bid of a suit that is very unlikely to be trump, either because it has been bid by the opponents or because your side has already agreed on trump. There are three types of cuebids:

#### **Cuebids That Promise:**

These usually show first (or sometimes second) round control of the suit bid (i.e. the ace or void for first round control and the king or singleton for second round

control).

(1S P 3S P 4C) shows first round control of clubs.

(1S P 3S P 4C P 5C) shows second round control of clubs but denies first round control in either hearts or diamonds.

#### **Cuebids That Ask:**

Usually looking for a stopper for no trump (1D 2S 3S) or for help in a suit in game.

Try (1S P 2S P 3C,) looking for club help.

#### **General Force:**

Usually showing a limit raise or better (1S 2D 3D) or (1D 1S 1NT 2D), which shows limit raise or better in spades.

Make the most of your summer months by pushing yourself to continue growing physically, intellectually, emotionally and socially using all wellness tools and practices at your disposal.






