### **Q&A:** Dolphin Course **Re-grassing**

By Eric Bennett, Director of Agronomy

Since the re-grassing of the Dolphin Course began in April, our dedicated Golf Course Maintenance Team has been putting in maximum effort to restore these 18 holes to the superior conditions that our Members expect. The project is well underway and is on track to be completed before the next season begins. To keep

you informed on the project, below is a Q&A to address some of our most frequently asked questions.

Why was re-grassing necessary for the Dolphin Course? The Dolphin Course fairways were last re-grassed in 2011,

and since then, the Club has experienced several storms that submerged many holes for extended periods. This led to seeds from the rough being washed into the fairways, resulting in significant crosscontamination that proved



### Marina Seawall Enhancement Project

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On Monday, June 12, E Dock and all its utility connections were disconnected. Steel sheet piling has now been installed to the north of E Dock, with concrete and walkway installation being the next phase there. Simultaneously, electrical work is progressing in both areas, with the aim of reopening the fuel and D Dock in early July. Looking ahead, construction will progressively move northward, with F Dock now slated to be disabled in late July and H Dock scheduled for early September.

Meanwhile, our marina team is operating daily from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. out of the Marina Fitness Center lobby. We continue to offer diesel fuel for sale at G Dock from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Please call us at 305-367-5908 or radio Channel 16 prior to docking.

We will continue to keep you informed about the progress through future articles in the Ocean Reef Press.

### Q&A: Dolphin Re-grassing

challenging to address. After attempting various methods without success, the decision was made to completely re-grass the tees, fairways, collars, and rough on the Dolphin Course.

### Is re-grassing the same as golf course aeration?

No, golf course aeration, which is typically carried out annually on each course, is a process that refreshes the existing grass and ensures the courses maintain their top condition throughout the season.

#### I recently noticed some maintenance on the Hammock Course. Is it also being re-grassed? The Hammock Course is not undergoing re-grassing; instead, it is receiving its regular summer aeration, as mentioned above.

To accommodate Members and their guests who wish to play golf at Ocean Reef this summer, at least nine holes on the Hammock will remain open throughout the remainder of the summer. You may refer to page 33 for the Hammock Course closure schedule.

### Which type of grass will be used for the Dolphin Course?

We are using Celebration Bermudagrass. This is the same grass that was on the Dolphin fairways and tees, and what is "wall to wall" on the Hammock Course.

Celebration Bermudagrass is a great choice for our needs at Ocean Reef as it recovers well from wear and tear and is highly tolerant of the South Florida sun and heat.

### Are you re-grassing the entire course at once?

The project is progressing in sets of six holes at a time. With the first set, consisting of holes 1, 2, 6, 15, 17 and 18, in its final stages, our focus has shifted to the second (holes 3, 4, 8, 10, 12 and 16) and third (holes 5, 7, 13, 14 and 11) sets of holes.

#### Where are we now with the project?

Over the past couple of months, our Golf Course Maintenance Team has removed one inch of turf and thatch from the fairways, roughs, tees, greens, and irrigation heads, while incorporating new soil into these areas. With this stage completed, the primary focus is now on grassing. The second set of six holes has officially entered the grassing phase, with the planting of sod and sprigs commencing this past week.

### What can we expect in the coming weeks?

Soon, Members will start to notice improvements in the first two sets of holes, beginning with the green surrounds and bunkers, followed by the tees. The third set of holes will undergo a similar process, including a final application of herbicide to combat regrowth.

### When is the project scheduled to be completed?

Despite some challenging weather over the past month, the golf course maintenance team has worked extra hours to keep the project on track. We will continue to keep you up-to-date on the project in the coming months. Stay tuned for more articles and progress photos in the Ocean Reef Press.

This year, 45 wedding weekends are scheduled, up from the typical 25 to 30, because of a backlog of matrimonies interrupted by Covid. By next year, things should return to normal flow, said Antonella Bruno, Assistant Director of Catering at Ocean Reef.

The Point remains the top spot to say, "I do" with cocktails either at the pool, beach, or a short walk away to the Sailfish Patio. Receptions are usually held at the main beach, in Carysfort Hall, or in Town Hall.

Most weddings take on an elegant island feel, with some steering toward the creative. Once a groom rode a white horse onto Buccaneer Island

and another time a bride added some glam to The Point by having white carpet installed over its pavers.

Event decor is trending maximalist, meaning more is more. Indulgent amounts of all-white or rich-colored orchids, dancefloors personalized with the couple's names or initials, elaborate lighting effects, several musical performances, and lavish ceiling treatments, are just some of the over-the-top trends. Non-flammable cold sparklers add a bit of glitz, replacing firework and drone shows no longer allowed.

Effortless chic is the buzz term. Updos are loose and not overly structured, said Lisa Griffitts-Flynn, nail and make-up artist at The Spa. Nails are almond shaped, shaded in nudes and whites. Makeup is light and natural with bolder brides wearing red lipstick or shimmery shadows.

Saturday scheduling at The Ocean Reef Chapel & Fellowship Center has recently been updated to keep ceremonies closer to reception times, said Chapel Director Jessica Poitevin. Couples can opt for either a 2 p.m. or 5:30 p.m. ceremony (Catholic Mass remains at 4 p.m.) and decorators can come in early to style the sanctuary. The new Chapel, which has both a bridal suite and groomsmen living room, was also designed to be used by its Jewish congregation for weddings, bar/bat mitzvahs, holidays, and Sabbath services. A custom shade lowers to cover the Protestant cross above the altar. The Torah Ark (containing the first five books of the Hebrew bible) is rolled up a ramp onto the elevated stage, called the bimah.

Helping his and her sides get acquainted is an addon entertainment option offered by the Recreation Department. Glow Chip, where guests launch glowstick-infused golf balls into the Lagoon, is one of the most requested activities at rehearsal dinners on Marlin Beach. Hula dancers, fire throwers, and bonfires, can also impress.

### A 'Hope-timist' - Looking Forward

Our almost fifteen-year-old granddaughter flew in to spend a week with us. Driving home from the airport, we caught up on the family's move to Colorado, her school, her classes, and her friends. Then we talked about her summer plans and future dreams. It reminded me that a fifteenyear-old relates to life, looking forward.

As we age, we build a reservoir of experience from the past. It colors our perspective. One can easily become jaundiced, looking at the mounting issues confronting us at present. There is a distinction between an optimist and a pessimist. An optimist looks at the future confidently. The most beloved pessimist is A.A. Milne's charming character - Eeyore. The sad-eyed donkey replies to Winnie's, "It's a lovely day, isn't it?" saying, "Wish I could say yes, but I can't."

A friend from high school has recently published a book, *The Potentialist*. His experience of success frames his view of the future in glowing terms. My inner Eeyore responds, "Wish I could say yes, but I'm not so sure."

Are there bright shiny, hopeful things on the horizon of the future? Without question. Our granddaughter wants to become an astronaut. We'll visit Kennedy Space Center while she's here. I grew up in an age of poor special effects - she in the age of Space X.

Fictional pessimists like Eeyore are charming in a children's story. However, the ones you meet in real life are generally a downer – more to be endured than enjoyed.

Perhaps you share my ambivalence, looking for a



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third alternative – a different perspective. The notion of being a 'hope-timist' occurred to me. What's the difference?

Optimism is an attitude about the future. It's full of confidence in ourselves. We'll work it through, and it will all be good in the end.

A hope-timist can look at our world and see the tragedy, the pain, the suffering, the sobering human propensity to turn good things bad – and still not lose hope.

The difference between the two is the source that shapes your perspective. A hope-timist does not place ultimate confidence in our human capacities.

I consider the singer Bono a hope-timist. His lyrics express the gritty reality of our world without capitulating to gloomy pessimism. A person of faith, he formed a friendship with the Christian pastor and author Eugene Peterson. Bono had read Peterson's translation of the Bible, **The Message** – particularly drawn to the Psalms. The band would read one of those Psalms in the green room each night just before taking the stage.

Here's a sample of Peterson's language. It expresses the foundation of being a hopetimist. It's from Psalm 46.

Attention, all! See the marvels of God! He plants flowers and trees all over the earth, bans war from pole to pole, breaks all the weapons across his knee. "Step out of the traffic! Take a long, loving look at me, your High God, above politics, above everything."

We all know past performance is generally the best predictor of future success. The God revealed in Scripture, through Israel and in the person of Jesus, has a remarkable track record of faithfulness. It is one that can be easily misunderstood or distorted by those who haven't taken the time to get acquainted with God, or with His story.

So put me down – neither an optimist nor a pessimist. Mark me as an unapologetic hopetimist – one whose perspective is shaped by having taken a long, loving look at the High God, and looking ahead, finding in God the source of ultimate hope.

Are we responsible for doing our part to care for our world? Of course. Our actions in the present matter. But does it all rest on our shoulders, as many fearful for the future claim? I hope not! Our track record is not all that great.

If you're looking for a source to explore this third alternative, Eugene Peterson's The Message is a good place to start. Bono would certainly agree.

Another good place is to participate in our **In Person Worship** in the Chapel each week of the summer. It takes place in the **Fellowship Hall each Sunday at 10:00 a.m.** You don't have to be dressed up to attend!

Speaking of looking ahead, we're going to have **two special worship services in the Chapel during July.**



### Emergency Preparedness

Highlights from the Tropics Update & Emergency Management Presentation

As the summer months approach, so does the annual hurricane season. While it's crucial to stay informed and prepared for potential storms, it's equally important to approach hurricane preparedness with a positive mindset. In this article, we aim to highlight the importance of being proactive and resilient, emphasizing that preparedness goes a long way. Let's explore how we can face the hurricane season with confidence and a sense of



community.

On Monday, June 5, 2023, the Ocean Reef Community Association hosted a Tropics Update and Emergency Management presentation to give homeowners an overview of the upcoming hurricane season and the emergency management response process. One of the key elements of hurricane preparedness is having the right information.

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Stay updated with reliable weather forecasts and local advisories. Learning about different hurricane categories, evacuation routes, and emergency resources will empower you to face any situation with confidence.

Our presenter, Jonathan Rizzo from the NOAA/ National Weather Service shared with us that fewer storms are expected to develop near the African coast this hurricane season. However, he warned that predictive forecasting indicates tropical storm systems may develop in the Gulf of Mexico and over the Caribbean Sea, which he warned gives our community less time to prepare for impact.

Rizzo also reminded homeowners of the potential for rapid intensification, as recent storms have proven, which can leave people less time to prepare for a significant impact. For this reason, ORCA encourages all its members to be vigilant and do what they can to prepare before a storm threatens our area. Guidelines on preparing for a tropical disturbance of any size can be found on the Monroe County website.

Monroe County Emergency Management Director, Shannon Davis-Weiner, also presented and covered the county's disaster management cycle that focuses on mitigation, preparation, response, and recovery. She also discussed important partnerships and post-storm re-entry steps. As a reminder, **Ocean Reef homeowners may collect vehicle re-entry stickers at ORCA Public Safety.** 

For more information, ORCA has posted the National Weather Service PowerPoint and Monroe County Emergency Management PowerPoint on its website. Further, homeowners will receive timely notifications regarding an impending hurricane through the ORCA News and ORCA Alerts.

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
### OFF THE REEF



#### 510 lb. Swordfish on "Lyonfish"



"We left the dock at 12:30 p.m. hoping to catch an afternoon swordfish bite on the moon set. We were on the 47 Freeman "Lyonfish" with Sean Lyons, Lori Lyons, Stone Lyons, Oscar Torres, Sebastian Poorani, and Nash Tackett. We were about 20 miles offshore of Ocean Reef and on our first drop of the day we instantly got tight and landed a 80lb swordfish. We decided to go for another drop hoping there were some more fish down there. It was in 1800ft down, and before we could even get the second line out, our bait was getting whacked. After a few minutes of dropping the bait back and reeling the bait up, the fish finally grabbed the bait. The rod went slack and the fish started swimming up the lead to the surface. We were able to get the lead off and the fish made a jump on the surface. The fight was on! We fought the fish for over 5 1/2 hours up and down 1000ft of water and drifted over 17 miles during the fight. We finally got a harpoon and some gaffs in the fish and landed the massive swordfish at 7:30 p.m. The fish measured 108 inches LJFL (Lower Jaw Fork Length) and came in at a weight of 510 lbs. 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### **Reading The** Grain



"Swing Tip" by Derek Swoboda, Director of Instruction

Playing golf in South Florida presents a different set of challenges than we see in the northern states. Chipping and pitching the ball from around the greens can get sticky..... literally. How do you read the grain and what do we do in different situations on the golf course? How do you tell what the grain is doing?

### **Feel the Grain in Your Practice** Swing

The easiest way to know what the grain is doing is by taking a practice swing and hitting the ground when doing so. If the grass feels smooth and easy to get through, there are no worries and your shot should be simple and straight forward. If you feel the grass grab the club or the club sticks into the ground a little bit, you may want to take less loft and open the club face.

Taking less loft and opening the club face is a great way to expose the bounce of the club. In an effort to escape the digging of the club into the grass, you will need to let



the bottom of the club hit the ground instead of the leading edge.

### Why Take Less Loft?

When you open the club face, you will add loft back to the club and the ball will go higher and shorter. Due to this, we will need to use the club with a lesser amount of loft so we can get the ball to our target simply.

### **Can You See the Grain?**

Always look for darker vs lighter shades of grass. The easiest way to know where the grain is, is to hit the ground near your ball in a practice swing, but you certainly can see it in the color of the turf. The darker shade of grass shows you going against the grain, while the lighter shade of grass shows you going with the grain.

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### Training Principles for a Toned and Lean Body

Summer is here, so let's review the principles and strategies that create toned and lean bodies. To create science-based programs, the following principles must be followed:

#### **Principle of Specificity:**

The exercises, activities, and intensities should be specific to the desired goal. For instance, someone training to be more agile and faster should focus on short bursts of speed, strength, and power rather than long, steady-pace exercises. Resistance training with free weights, bands, machines, and body weight at moderate to heavy loads with moderate sets and repetitions three or more times per week is the most effective method to build toned and lean muscle.

#### **Principle of Overload:**

Muscles should be challenged with a stimulus or loads greater than what is used to produce new adaptions such as muscle fiber growth. To take advantage of this principle, work with moderate to difficult resistances. Light weights are appropriate for developing muscular endurance but are less effective for increasing muscle tone and strength. Men's and women's differences in hormones will make it easier for men to grow bigger muscles. Both sexes can develop lean and toned bodies at any age with

the appropriate training resistance loads, volume, and frequency.

### Principle of Progression:

Training must gradually and constantly increase to create new adaptations. Good form and technique should be observed to reduce the risk of injuries. A common error is to progress too fast, which leads to training injuries and lesser results in the long term. One of a personal trainer's most important jobs is to create a rate of progression that maximizes results while reducing the risk of injuries.

### **Principle of Diminishing**

Returns: beginners will experience the best results in less time due to the amount of potential for improvement. Training gains will become harder as a person gets closer to his/ her potential. Almost every person in the general population is far from reaching their genetic potential, meaning they can achieve significant results with a dedicated and consistent program.

### Principle of Reversibility:

When training stops, the body returns to its original level over time. It does not happen immediately but it happens eventually. To prevent this, make exercise a permanent habit.

In conclusion, if your goal is to be leaner and toned, apply these principles to your strength and conditioning program. For optimal results, work out three or more times per week with moderate to heavy weight

loads and use interval and steady pace exercise for cardio conditioning. Your diet should consist of lean proteins, vegetables, and healthy fats. When building muscle, increase your protein intake to around 0.5 to 1.0 grams per pound of body weight. Changes in body composition, such as more muscle and less fat, take time, so hard work and consistency are necessary. ## Master Your Doubles Game by Being Aggressive



'Tennis Tip" by Jose Vacabustamante, Assistant Tennis Professional

This week's tennis tip focuses on becoming more aggressive in doubles. We will start by being mindful of when to be aggressive and when to be conservative.

How many times you had a ball floating at the net only to let it bounce? Take this opportunity to be aggressive by going for those balls and making contact in the

air. Whether it's a volley or a swinging volley, the idea is not to strike the ball forcefully, but rather to react promptly to those specific floating balls.

The most common mistake that people make is hanging out at the baseline when starting points in doubles and staying there. I would recommend to come forward as soon as you can to create pressure on your opponents. An excellent strategy to come in on a short ball, which is called an approach shot. A good approach shot is the key to doubles. Be aggressive by looking for opportunities to come in to the net and find balls to attack. This will put you in a position to open the court, creating opportunities to win points for yourself and your partner. However, once at the net, it's crucial to recognize when a more conservative approach

is warranted, focusing on ball placement rather than attempting to end the point.

At the net, you must assess the type of ball coming towards you. If it's high and slow, it's an invitation to act aggressively. On the other hand, if it's fast and low, adopting a conservative approach and using your opponent's power can bounce the ball back deep. However, if it's a low and slow ball, it's best to be conservative and aim to place the ball with an angled shot. Low and slow balls are probably the hardest volleys to return, so you must be conservative and try to place it and direct it with an angle. The most skillful doubles tennis players are the ones that come to the net and recognize what type of ball is coming towards them and act on it I hope these tips help improve your doubles game.

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## Water Road Signs

Boaters from around the nation love visiting our Keys. Some may not be as familiar with the Keys navigation as when in their home port. Ignoring the difference can quickly result in damage or injury. The captain must keep a sharp focus on the surroundings and everyone on board should be alert as well for any potential hazard.

The Keys waters are shallow and following the day beacons is essential. Navigating out of the channel usually results in some grounding in sand, rock, seagrass, etc., which damages the environment and your props,

but that is far better than striking the 12-inch steel beam of a day beacon designed to withstand Cat 5 hurricanes. The Ocean Reef area of responsibility contains 260 day beacons. My similar area north of Chicago in Lake Michigan area has under 10.

Channel widths vary. Though technically no speed limits exist in most channels, higher speed reduces reaction time and increases damage exponentially. Slow down and stay well within the Red and Green Day beacons.

Our own channels enacted restrictions several years ago in Dispatch Creek/Homeowners. The entire lengths are designated "minimum speed/no wake." What has changed are the placement of more signage in the channels to emphasize this policy.

The main channel is of

particular concern because of the increased number of kayaks and paddleboards from Buccaneer Island that go around The Point back to the main marina. Entering channels at speed creates a large wake and can cause these individuals to be thrown up onto the coral surrounding The Point. Also, while the width (beam) of our boats has increased over the years, the width of the channel has not. Speed can create a dangerous passing situation in the channel with the potential of waking the smaller boat out of the channel and onto the unseen shallow bottom.

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#### BRIDGE TIP OF THE MONTH

## **1NT Forcing**

By Gregg Van Dyke, **Director of Card & Games** 

#### **Using 1NT Forcing**

1NT Forcing is the cornerstone of the 2/1bidding system. After partner opens 1♥/♠, a 1NT response shows 6-11 points and is forcing for one round. 1NT must be announced by the opener. Simply state "Forcing" before the next person bids.

(Keep in mind that going to the 2-level promises 12+ points and 2NT is reserved for the Jacoby 2NT convention)

Examples of using 1NT forcing: Partner opens **1**♥

#### in 1st or 2nd position.

#### Hand 1

- ♠ Q52
- ♥ 93
- ♦ A432
- ♣ J987

This is a normal 1NT response in any system (2/1 included)

#### Hand 2

- ♠ K98
- ♥ J5
- ♦ 532

♣ AK986

This is too weak to bid 2 in the 2/1 system.

#### Hand 3

- ♠ 95
- ♥ A52
- ♦ 54
- ♣ JT9765
- In 2/1 we use 1NT to force

partner to bid, then we rebid hearts at the cheapest level to show a weak hand (6 points).

#### Hand 4

- **▲** K95
- ♥ A52
- ♦ K5
- **♣** JT987

We also use 1NT forcing to show a limit raise (10-11 points) with 3 pieces. After partner's response we will jump raise in hearts.

#### **Opener's Rebids** After 1♥ - 1NT! - ?

2♣ May be as short as two clubs, e.g. 4-5-2-2 shape with insufficient strength to make a 2♠ reverse. 2♦ May be as short as three diamonds, e.g. 4-5-3-1 or 3-5-3-2 shape.

2♥ Shows six hearts, may

have a four-card side suit. 2♠ Shows four spades, rarely five if opener is 6-5 in hearts and spades. This is a reverse showing at least 16 points.

2NT Balanced, 18-19 points. Invites partner to bid 3NT.

#### After 1 ♠ - 1NT! - ?

2♣ May be as short as three clubs, e.g. 5-3-2-3 shape. 2♦ May be as short as three diamonds, e.g. 5-3-3-2 shape.

2♥ Shows at least four hearts and 11-15 points. Insufficient strength to jump-rebid 3♥.

2♠ Shows six spades, may have a four-card side suit. 2NT Balanced, 18-19 points. Invites partner to bid 3NT.






