Sign Up for Your Vote By Mail (VBM) Ballot Now!

Friends and neighbors - our Supervisor of Elections (SOE) reminds voters to make their requests for VBMs now. The law has changed - and some (many?) may not be aware that they can no longer have a "standing" request for VBMs for all elections. Individual voters must make a request for every election cycle. The SOE pointed out that at this point in the prior cycle, the Elections Office had requests for 11,000 ballots and currently there are only 6000. Most likely, a good portion of the 5000 "missing" requests are from folks who don't realize the law has changed and they need

However, what we've seen in too many locations across the

However, what we've seen in too many locations across the country is that well-intentioned voters can't make it to the polls on Election Day – so it's good insurance in case one can't get to the polls due to some last minute situation.

The Elections Office recently mailed to every registered voter a form to complete and return to request a VBM. You can also go to the Elections Office website, <u>keyselections.org</u>, and request one online. If you've moved, make sure you update your address as well.

Please share this information and get your VBM requests in asap! Ballots for the March Presidential Primary will be mailed in January.

Dolphin Course Re-grass Makes Strides

Our Golf Course Maintenance Team is proud to share that we've successfully sprigged and sodded all 18 holes of the Dolphin Course. You'll notice the biggest difference in the first six holes that were planted seven weeks ago. These are now about 90% grown in with Celebration Bermuda Grass coverage. With the second six planted five weeks ago and much better weather since, these sprigs are already about 80% grown in. Weather permitting, we are well on schedule to have the Dolphin

With all 18 holes sprigged and sodded, the next 14 weeks will focus much of our efforts on the landscaping and detail work that will be necessary to return the course to world-class condition. Our Golf Course Maintenance Team will conduct extensive bunker and waste bunker maintenance and will add sand top-dressing to all sprigs and sod to provide a consistently smooth surface. Most importantly, we will add sod to areas that we feel may not be strong enough, to ensure every lie is a good lie. When all is said and done, we are confident our Members will be able to see the difference in both aesthetics and playability.

Reminder: Reentry Sticker Vehicle Windshield Decals are available for Monroe County Residents

Hurricane season is here. Monroe County residents are reminded to pick up one reentry sticker for each registered vehicle by providing proof of residency at a Monroe County Tax Collector's office. Proof of residency includes a Florida Driver's License or a property bill with a local address, and vehicle registration. For homeowners with a vehicle registered outside of Monroe County, bring your local property tax bill with the out-of-county vehicle registration. A decal is not required for reentry, proof of residency can be provided at the checkpoint; however, stickers make reentry easier if checkpoints are required to ensure safe reentry into the Florida Keys following a destructive storm.

The sticker is color-coded for zone-by-zone reentry. Monroe County reentry stickers are barcoded to verify authenticity. Upper Keys residents including Ocean Reef have a purple decal.

Where to Get Reentry Stickers Residents from Ocean Reef: Stickers are available at the Monroe County Tax Collector's office from 8 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. Monday through Friday. Stickers are

also available at Ocean Reef Public Safety, 110 Anchor Dr., Key Largo.

Tax Collector Locations:

• Key Largo - 101487 Overseas Hwy Stickers are available throughout the year but do not wait until a storm is approaching to pick up a sticker. Stickers will not be available once a state of emergency is declared in Monroe County, which occurs several days before a storm is forecast to strike. She and her husband developed the local Post-Cursillo program, and in the late 1960s and 1970s, they worked to grow the Cursillo movement through their service in the Leaders' School and Secretariat.

Sue cherished her family and friends above everything. She prioritized relationships and spending time with people she loves, especially her four grandchildren. When not spending cherished time with her grandchildren, Sue's favorite hobby was needlepoint. She took great joy in lovingly stitching countless, personalized creations for all of her loved ones. Sam valued his ties to LSU and was a zealous Tiger fan all his life. He continued to support his alma mater after graduation, working extensively with the LSU Alumni Association to develop Lod Cook Hotel on campus in 2000, which still operates successfully today.

In 1988, Sam formed Dimension Development with the mission of developing primarily extended-stay, suite hotels. He first focused on Homewood Suites, an emerging conceptual hotel still in development, and subsequently served as a founding member and Chairman of the Homewood Suites by Hilton Franchise Advisory Council for 17 years until he retired as Chair Emeritus.

Today Dimension operates 80 hotels in 15 states. The thriving company recently held a leadership conference in New Orleans that coincided with Sam's 50th anniversary in the hotel business. Sam was feted with an evening of tributes toasting his vast accomplishments and contributions to the hospitality industry.

Sam viewed his time on earth as a great adventure and life, a wilderness to be explored. He loved mountains and lakes, salt water and deep-sea fishing, fine wine, sparkling conversation, and he was a connoisseur of anything culinary-related. He was in his element when he was entertaining, and he excelled at it. He was the consummate host, bon vivant, and good friend. With his charisma and unparalleled gift of storytelling, he worked a room, much to the delight of everyone in it. It has been said that if you choose your passion as your job, you will never work a day in your life. When Sam found the hotel business, he discovered his passion and spent his personal and professional life doing what

He was also an animal lover and advocate and, through the years, made room in his home and his life for countless dogs, cats, birds, and various species of wildlife. Recently, Edwina and Sam saw a need for a shelter and pet adoption center to serve Natchitoches Parish and donated land to the animal rescue group, Friends All United for Natchitoches Animals (FAUNA), to expedite the project. 
MARK DUANE DANNELS







Engineering Teamwork

Did you hear about the five tortoises who were not happy about getting moved indoors away from bad weather into the Reef Club Kids bathroom? True story. They were so annoyed with their new digs, they chewed out the drywall and knocked down a toilet, causing a flood in an office next door. The mess left Reef engineer Tate Matheny stunned and naturalist Jeanette Rivera apologizing on the turtles' behalf.

Then there was this time when engineer Rohan Walker, leaving Town Hall after fixing a leak, spotted a German shepherd sitting alone in the passenger side of a moving golf cart. The owner forgot to put on the parking brake when he got out for coffee. With his Spidey-Senses tingling, Walker jumped into the cart, heading backwards toward the marina, slammed on the brakes, and saved the dog and the cart.

Job Description?

When it comes to defining the role of an Ocean Reef Club engineer, it's not as simple as it sounds. Because a day at work can mean fixing a water leak, installing a new deck at the Fishing Village, making sure the generators are maintained for hurricane season, fixing a broken gas line, replacing an air filter, or rescuing a possum trapped under a building.

At the heart of keeping everything humming at the Club is its Engineering Department, responsible for all the details involved in maintaining 68 buildings on property. The team is staffed by 41 full-timers, made up of general mechanics, electricians, carpenters, plumbers, air condition and

refrigeration experts, painters, and dispatchers.

In Everyone's Business

With 12 restaurants, 185 hotel rooms, 85 vacation rentals, the airport building and runway, Buccaneer and fitness pools, meeting rooms, and more, two shifts run between 8 a.m. and 11:30 p.m. daily, answering more than 3,000 work orders a month, plus special projects.

Restaurant managers like Danielle Turner, say that having an in-house engineering department is indispensable, saving her team many times from appliance, refrigeration, fryer, or grill issues to water leaks, electrical shorts, and failed bulbs.

"They really have our backs," said Turner, a manager at Palm Court and the Islander. "We are so lucky because they can get here right away. You really feel taken care of."

Three key components keep the Engineering Department on top of their game. A large inventory of supplies, a work order collection software program, and regular communications and meetings among themselves and with other departments, said Eduardo "Ed" Perez, assistant director of engineering, who has worked at ORC for 15 years.

Perez's office shares a door with a parts shop that resembles a local hardware store. Shelves of dozens and dozens of different types of A/C filters, gas valves, pipes, hoses, paints, ice machine and appliance parts, are available for the many buildings on property that vary greatly in age.

Each department's staff from housekeeping, golf, lodging, food and beverage, and banquets to the commissary, staff housing, the Airport, Marina, and Cultural Center, logs in their requests each day, which gets filtered out by request type and assigned to the appropriate engineer.

On any given day, engineer Ricardo "Rick" Marques said, you never know what kind of call could come in. Once, he got an urgent plea to break up a cat fight at the Inn. He wasn't sure if it was of the human or feline kind. Turned out that a handful of catnip was all he needed to restore the peace.


Here to Stay

The Engineering Department boasts one of the most seasoned staffs on The Reef, with a majority being on the job 5 or more years.





Friendly Reminders for Safe Boating

As you explore the stunning waters surrounding Ocean Reef, your Ocean Reef Community Association reminds you to boat safely. To protect yourself and ensure a memorable and incident-free experience, follow these friendly reminders:

Equip Your Boat with Safety Essentials:

Ensure you have all the necessary safety equipment aboard your vessel. In addition to the required safety essentials such as life jackets for all passengers, a throwable flotation device, fire extinguishers, distress signals (flares, whistles, or air horns), keep a well-stocked first aid kit on hand, stay hydrated and don't forget sunscreen. In case of an emergency, always have a fully charged cell phone or marine radio with you and ensure everyone on board knows how to use the devices.

Stay Informed about Weather Conditions:

The weather in the Florida Keys can change rapidly, and being caught in adverse conditions on the water can be dangerous. Check weather forecasts before heading out on the water and regularly monitor updates during your voyage. Avoid boating during severe storms, high winds, or heavy rainfall. If you notice sudden deteriorating weather, put your safety first and return to shore promptly.

Maintain Vigilance & Stay Alert:

While enjoying the day out on the boat, keep an eye out for other vessels, divers, and marine wildlife that may be sharing the water with you. It's important to be aware of other boaters that may be demonstrating reckless behavior such as excessive speed and erratic maneuvers. Be mindful of hazards such as sandbars, shallow waters, and floating debris.

Maintain Safe Distances in Crowded Waters:

During lobster season and other peak periods of traffic on the water, the Florida Keys can become crowded with other boaters. It's important to exercise

BRIDGE REPAIRS UPDATE

South Harbor and Sunrise Cay Bridges are currently undergoing essential repairs to address maintenance needs. The **South Harbor Bridge** has been under construction since March, with most of the repair work taking place beneath the bridge, out of sight. The contractor is diligently working to complete the repairs efficiently to ensure the bridge's structural integrity is restored. All repairs of the South Harbor Bridge are expected to be completed by September 1st.

The repairs for the **Sunrise Cay Bridge** pose greater complexity due to its size and the type of repairs required. The repair process will be divided into two phases. Phase 1 will commence once the South Harbor Bridge repairs are completed and will involve the creation of engineering drawings, obtaining necessary permits, and replacing several beams on the bridge deck. As extra caution, be aware of those around you and be considerate. Remember to maintain safe distances making a reasonable effort to stay at least 300 feet away from divers-down warning devices such as dive flags.

By following these friendly reminders and prioritizing safety, you can confidently navigate the waters of the Florida Keys and ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all. For more information, visit www.myFWC. com/boating/regulations/.

part of Phase 1, traffic flow on the bridge will be modified to accommodate the repair work. Some of the work will take place during the evening hours and off-season to reduce the disruption. ORCA will keep members posted on any anticipated disruptions to the travel lanes.

Phase 2 of the Sunrise Cay Repairs will focus on the repair activities beneath the bridge with a projected start in early 2024. While the work may not be as visible, lane interruptions might be necessary to ensure the safety of the workers operating underneath the bridge. Both ORCA and the Ad Hoc Bridge Committee are committed to maintaining transparency and efficiency throughout the repair process. Our objective is to undertake the necessary repairs in a responsible and fiscally prudent manner, aiming to not only restore the bridges but also extend their lifespan for the benefit of the community.

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
What to Know Before You Go Regular Lobster Season Begins August 6

As the Club closes out Lobstermania, and with the regular Lobster Season approaching on Sunday, August 6, the Ocean Reef Press compiled some important rules to help you have an enjoyable, safe, and environmentally responsible lobster season:

• Prior to heading out on the water, visit myfwc.com to get your recreational saltwater fishing license and lobster permit.

• Use a dive flag when in the water and stay within 300 feet of the dive flag (100 feet if in a channel).



• Do not touch coral, bump coral with dive fins, or anchor on coral.

• Egg-bearing lobsters must be released unharmed, regardless of size.

• Check equipment and always exercise proper snorkeling and scuba safety measures. Can I dive for lobster at night?

Yes during regular season, which begins at 12:01 a.m. on August 6 and ends at midnight on March 31.

What is legal size and how do l measure?

The lobster's carapace – the main body shell extending from a lobster's eyes to the place where the tail begins must measure greater than three inches. Use a gauge to measure the lobster while still in the water.

What is the daily limit in the Keys?

Six lobsters per person, per day in Monroe County.

What areas are restricted?

No snorkeling or diving is allowed within 300 feet of residential or commercial shoreline – so no lobstering allowed in Ocean Reef canals!

Also closed to harvesting – National Marine Sanctuary marked by yellow buoys, John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park, Sanctuary Presentation Areas including Carysfort Reef, The Elbow, Key Largo Dry Rocks, and Everglades National Park.

Fix Your Short Game



"Swing Tip" by Derek Swoboda, Director of Instruction

Ah, the dreaded chip shot ...

How many times have we hit this shot thin over the green or chunky and the ball has gone nowhere? This week, we are going to help you get rid of the dreaded part of chipping and begin to love hitting these shots around the green!

Weight Distribution

On all chips and pitches, we should have our weight on our front foot. What this allows is for us to swing the club down and through the golf ball instead of swinging up into the ball. Contact in the short game is the most important piece of the puzzle and when you create great contact, you can control your shots more easily.

Proper Chipping Motion

When you set up to a chip shot, you are looking to have your arms and club form a "Y" to the golf ball. With your weight on your forward foot and the ball in the middle of your stance, your goal is to move the shoulders or chest in order to make the ball fly its desired direction. When we make this motion, our chest should continue to rotate toward the target on the way through the golf ball.

Drills

When you set up, you should have your right foot slightly behind you and your right heel up off the ground. This will promote your weight moving toward your front foot as you continue to strike down on the golf ball and generate great contact.

When I'm off the tennis courts I'm either on the pickleball courts or with my big baby bears (my two Bernese mountain dogs).



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
