Card Sound Road Toll Rate Adjustment

On October 1, 2023, Card Sound Road implemented new toll rates based on the Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index. These adjustments aim to support road maintenance and future bridge repairs. Here's a breakdown of the new rates for SunPass and Toll-By-Plate users:

Sunpass Rates:

- Two-axle vehicles (cars, pickups, motorcycles): \$2.00
- Three-axle vehicles: \$3.84
- Each additional axle: \$1.28

Toll-By-Plate Rates:

• Two-axle vehicles (cars, pickups, motorcycles): \$3.00

- Three-axle vehicles: \$5.76
- Each additional axle: \$1.92

Please note that the toll collection is entirely electronic, accepting payments through Toll-By-Plate, SunPass, E-Pass, or EZ-Pass. Cash payments will not be accepted. The generated toll revenue will be allocated towards maintaining the road and addressing the repair and replacement needs of the five bridges along Card Sound Road.



Community Unites in Solidarity: Remembering Kristallnacht & Support of Israel at Ocean Reef Chapel & Fellowship Center

In a profound demonstration of unity, the Ocean Reef Chapel and Fellowship Center are set to host an interfaith service event, **Remembering Kristallnacht** and Support of Israel, led by Pastor Bob Henley and Rabbi Anne Feibelman. The event, scheduled for November 9th at 6 pm, serves as a solemn reminder of the atrocities of the past and a collective stand against the continuing struggles faced by Jewish communities worldwide, particularly amid the current conflicts in Israel.

Kristallnacht, or the "Night of Broken Glass," was a pogrom against Jews carried out by SA paramilitary forces and civilians throughout Nazi Germany on November 9-10, 1938. The name refers to the shattered glass from the windows of synagogues, homes, and Jewishowned businesses plundered and destroyed during the violence. This event marked a significant escalation in the Nazi regime's policies of persecution against Jews, leading up to the Holocaust.

The lasting significance of Kristallnacht is immense. It stands as a powerful symbol of the destructive path to which discrimination, hate, and unchecked power can lead. The Nazis' state-sponsored pogrom was a critical juncture in the lead-up to the Holocaust, a systematic, state-sponsored genocide in which six million Jews were murdered. This dark era in history is a stark reminder of the profound consequences of antisemitism, bigotry, and hatefueled ideologies.

The term "Never Again" has since been adopted by Jewish communities and others around the world as a rallying cry, not only remembering the horrors of the Holocaust but also insisting on vigilance and action to prevent such atrocities from occurring again. It's a universal promise to reject hate in all forms and a commitment to preserve humanity even in times of profound conflict and challenge.

Today, these historical lessons hold critical relevance in light of the ongoing conflict in Israel. The tensions and violent confrontations, particularly involving Hamas, an organization that the U.S., EU, and other countries have designated as a terrorist group. resonate with the trauma of persecution experienced during the darkest days of Jewish history. The rocket attacks, suicide bombings, and other acts of terrorism perpetrated by Hamas threaten the safety and security of people in Israel and undermine peace efforts in the region.

However, history has shown that there is resilience in the face

This resilience is mirrored in events like **Remembering** Kristallnacht and Support of Israel, where community members, regardless of faith, will come together in solidarity. The service aims not only to honor the memories of those lost during the Holocaust and other tragedies but also to reaffirm a collective stand against hate and violence in all their manifestations. It serves as a reminder that the actions of communities and individuals matter and that support, unity, and vigilance can uphold the ideals of peace and justice.

The gathering at the Ocean Reef Chapel and Fellowship

Center, therefore, represents more than an interfaith service. It is a testament to the human spirit's ability to overcome, forge alliances in the face of adversity, and build hope from past lessons. Pastor Bob Henley and Rabbi Anne Feibelman will lead the service as spiritual guides and as community leaders ushering in a message of unity, strength, and resilience.

In conclusion, the event encapsulates a spirit of hope, a commitment that, although the path is fraught with challenges, the journey toward peace and mutual respect is a worthy pursuit. By coming together, people of all faiths demonstrate the power of solidarity and the unwavering belief that, despite the darkest chapters of history, the human spirit can and will strive toward light. In these moments, the community finds its strength, ensuring that "Never Again" is a promise upheld and a future of harmony is a vision towards which we all tirelessly work.

NEWS FROM THE MEDICAL CENTER

Medicare Open Enrollment is Now

October 15 to December 7, 2023, is Medicare's open enrollment period. This is a chance to reevaluate your Medicare insurances, which typically consist of Part A, Part B, a Medigap or Medicare Advantage policy and a Part D Drug plan.

Medicare Part A- is the hospital coverage insurance. If you or a spouse have worked 10 years or more, you are not charged a premium for Part A.

Medicare Part B*- covers non-hospital (medical) services. Social Security recipients will see this as a monthly deduction from their benefits. 2024's monthly premiums will be \$174.70 *.



There is an annual deductible of \$240.00 (for 2024) and co-insurance of 20% on covered services the patient is responsible for.

Choices for Gap Premium Coverages – Gap coverages pay the 20% Part B deductibles for covered medical services and drug costs, depending on the plan.

Medicare Part C – This is an option sometimes referred to as a "Medicare Advantage Plan." These plans work similar to an HMO or PPO plan with varied deductibles and are less expensive than a traditional Medigap plan. They sometimes provide other benefits such as drug, vision, dental and hearing coverage all wrapped into one plan.

Medigap Coverage*-This is a second option (in place of Medicare Part C) and only works with original Medicare. Medigap policies are standardized, and in most states are named by letters, Plans A-N. Compare the benefits each plan helps pay for and choose a plan that covers what you need. Premiums will vary county by county in the State of Florida. A popular Medigap Plan is through AARP United Healthcare. These do not provide drug, vision, dental or hearing coverage. Unlike Medicare Part C you are not

restricted to plan participants and can see any healthcare provider who takes Medicare.

Medicare Part D^{*} – Part D drug plans help cover your drug costs for those who have an original Medicare and a Medigap Plan (not Medicare Advantage). Signing up for Part D when you sign up for Medicare will save you a late penalty charge of around 12%.

If you don't want to change your insurances during open enrollment, then simply do nothing and your insurance will remain the same. However, if you wish to explore other options, go to <u>www.medicare.gov</u> for further information.

*If your modified adjusted gross income (MAGA) is over \$97,000 a year Medicare will assess an income related monthly adjustment (IRMA).

Your information will be directed to the appropriate ORCA personnel for handling, and you'll receive updates on the progress of your request. Upon completion, a final email will include a survey for your feedback.

A Taste...of Failure

It was May 2005 and my manager at the local Ruby Tuesday told me I was a "back of house guy". A week later, I was catching a ride with a friend who had to make a stop at Linville Ridge Country Club where he'd worked the previous two summers. I planned on waiting in the car at Linville. Fortunately, my friend JC made me go in and the moment their GM saw me, he said I should be a busboy. I felt dumb because I had to ask him what that was, to which GM Keith replied, "You pick up plates and make sure tables have bread and water." Little did I know that would be the moment my career would start.

Back to the Present – the Master Sommelier Exam

As many of you know, I have been studying for the Court of Master Sommeliers (CMS) Master Sommelier exam since passing the Advanced exam in 2018. I was initially slated to sit the MS (Master Sommelier) exam in 2020 but as we know all too well, that wasn't what the world had in store. After declining my invitation to take the test in 2021 and 2022, I decided this may as well be the year.

I've been asked quite often about how it went. Well, I hate to disappoint, but I failed. I scored a 55% and you need a 75% to pass and have the opportunity to take the Tasting and Service portions of the exam. It was humbling. In the 21 years I've worked in restaurants, I only experienced true failure one other time. Despite the failure, I'm confident that this time next vear. I'll be telling a different story and hopefully have a cool new plaque next to my diplomas and a shiny pin on my suit at dinners.

How the Exam Process Works

There are 4 levels: Introductory, Certified, Advanced and Master. Introductory typically has an 85% pass rate and consists of a multiple-choice exam. The Certified exam generally has a 60% pass rate and includes Theory, Tasting (written notes on paper), and a Service portion. Advanced has a 30% pass rate and is often called the "mini master" as you have to blind taste 6 wines using verbal calls, an intense theory portion that is mostly fill-in-the-blanks, and a service exam that requires you to serve beer, decant wine, open Champagne, and even mix a cocktail while answering questions from two tables. The Master Exam has a 5% pass rate on average and every portion of the test is verbal. You must pass the Theory portion before being allowed to attempt the Tasting and Service portions. Since the CMS was established

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in 1969, around 800 individuals have passed the Advanced exam and 273 have passed the Master exam (globally).

The 2023 MS Theory Exam was held in Portland. Oregon. When it's time to take the test, you wait in the hotel lobby until you're greeted by the host. You then embark on the longest 4-floor elevator ride ever and step into a mezzanine where 12 Master Sommeliers stand in a line to meet the 6 candidates they will be grilling. At that point, you walk into a small office room with two proctors who outline the parameters of the exam. "Welcome to the MS exam, it's an incredible accomplishment just to be here. You will be asked 105 questions over the next 50 minutes. You may not go back once you answer a question. You are allowed to ask for the question to be repeated once. Please speak clearly as we are writing the answers to your questions." The next 50 minutes were a blur as I sat there answering some of the most obscure questions about wine, like why is Tokaji Essencia aged in glass bonne bonnes instead of oak barrels and where is the sparkling wine hub of Romania.

There's a Lesson in Every Failure

In case you were wondering about the other time I had truly failed, it was my first day serving at Linville Ridge Country Club when I was 22 years old. I had been a busboy for 2 years before that. The previous Lead Server wasn't returning so the Manager told me I was the new Lead. "Keith, I've never served in my life and really am not that personable." He told me, "Good bussers make good servers. You're taking the Lead section tonight." Three hours, 11 tables and 34 covers later, I had successfully ruined 32 people's dining experience and been verbally berated by a few Members and Keith multiple times. I told him he made a mistake picking me but Keith said, "Micah, I fed you to the wolves on purpose. I yelled at you throughout service,

the kitchen yelled at you, the Members yelled at you, and to be honest you messed pretty much everything up. However, you never lost your cool and never broke down. We don't have another person working that can handle that pressure, the job is yours."

This same sentiment applies to my experience taking the Master Sommelier Exam under no circumstance will the pressure ever be the problem. Ocean Reef Club is the best club in the world. If I can meet the expectations here, no test is going to make me break. I just simply have to study harder this year and will pass the Theory portion in 2024.

• Snorkel at the Coral Restoration Foundation's coral nursery.


• Participate in coastal cleanups on land and in water via kayaks.

Wynn's Is My Kitchen.... It is difficult to imagine life at Ocean Reef without this amazing store. We all depend on Wynn's for the groceries and household products that stock our cupboards. But because I don't cook, Wynn's is quite often my kitchen. **Dinner:** For the big meal of the day, I generally choose one of Wynn's gourmet cooked items (e.g., chicken, crab cake, salmon, meatloaf, assorted pasta and vegetable dishes). These often benefit from sauces so tasty that I am sure that somewhere Wynn's has a master chef lurking over a saucepan (probably in Naples, FL, which is the store's home base). ... Lunch: Wynn's has introduced a sign-up form where you can choose exactly what you want on your sandwich. This avoids lines and speeds up the order process. A good idea but I personally prefer making my sandwich at home with the incomparable Wynn's chicken salad or my most recent discovery -Wynn's egg salad topped with a nice portion of pickled herring. I developed a taste for herring on a trip to Denmark and was thrilled to find jars of various kinds on a top shelf in Wynn's. Breakfast: Wynn's has all the fresh and frozen healthy ingredients for my breakfast "smoothie" (including the dreaded kale, which happily loses flavor in the blender).



From Wynn's bakery, there is a plentiful supply of breakfast goodies - bagels, muffins, donuts and, my favorite, raisin/ walnut bread.... **Unexpected:** In addition to being a "food" store, I've found a surprising variety of inedible necessities on the shelves at Wynn's. For instance: Wynn's has cut flowers, cough medicine, reading glasses, batteries, tote bags, face cream, hair dye, wrapping paper, toys, brushless toothpaste for dogs. (Note: I've purchased everything on the list, except the last item.) My Best Buy at Wynn's – Two years ago I bought my dog at Wynn's. I named him Shopper and he goes everywhere with me on the back seat of my golf cart. Shopper requires no feeding or walking and never barks. Nor is he ever in need of a dog's toothpaste.... A woman's best friend is a dog – especially one like Shopper, that is not real but convincingly realistic. by Joan Birsh



Your Fitness and Wellness Checklist



"Fitness Focus" by Luis Bracamonte, Director of Fitness & Wellness

Taking care of our bodies takes time and effort, but it is an investment that pays back in quality of life and longevity. Here is a list of things you should be doing to keep your body young.

1. Strength Training: perform two or more sessions per week at moderate intensities, covering the major body parts such as the chest, core, back, arms, and legs. Strength training builds bone and muscle mass, which allows us to move better and be more injury-resilient. Moving better also means being less likely to fall and having a better athletic foundation to play sports.

2. Cardiovascular

conditioning: perform three or more weekly sessions and increase daily movement activity. To develop your anaerobic system, perform intervals or bouts of moderate to high exertion. To develop your aerobic system, perform steady-pace exercise for over 20 minutes three or more days per week. Anaerobic and aerobic sessions can also be combined

in the same workout, such as in a Cycle class. Doing different activities such as walking, jogging, swimming, cycling, hiking, and rowing will ensure that you do not over-train muscles and undertrain others. Cross-training also gives you the advantage of adding variety to your exercise sessions, which makes your exercise program less monotonous.

3. Massage and Stretch:

strength training coupled with massage and stretching is the most optimal way to become stronger, leaner, and more pliable. Regular massage and stretching, which can be done daily, will reduce your risk for overuse injuries and make your body feel better and ready for action.

4. Healthy Eating and

Hydration: what you eat and drink fuels your entire body, including your brain. Make sure to eat foods with good sources of nutrients such as vegetables, lean proteins, and healthy fats. Most of us know the difference between healthy and unhealthy

6. Social Connection:

according to Dan Buettner's famous longevity research initially presented and discussed in his book "The Blue Zones", social connection is a pillar of longevity and fulfillment. Engage in group activities, and attend and participate in social gatherings and club events. While some of us enjoy more time socializing than others, we all need it to thrive.





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SWING TIP

Many Amateurs Don't 'Release' the Club, So Try This For More Distance

Learning how to release the golf club is a skill that every amateur must master to hit better shots.

While many of us average players struggle with our ball-striking ability, by understanding how to close the clubface to hit more of a draw, you'll have more opportunities to hit the sweet spot of the club, resulting in that perfectly flush shot that'll make your playing partners jealous.

So how can you actually become a pure ball-striker?

Teaching professional, Stefanie Shaw, addresses a common problem she sees with many amateur players: Keeping the clubface open at impact.

"There are openers and closers of the golf swing," Shaw says.

"I find that people tend to have too open of a clubface, and the No. 1 thing that they're trying to do is move their hips faster — which is going to only open your clubface more." Essentially, when the swing sequence is off, we try to use our hips to catch up with our hands mid-swing. This is often what causes those slices and mishits — because you lose clubface control.

Try this drill to start releasing the club

"Your feet are going to stay closer together, we're going to totally take your lower body out of it, and we're going to take nice and easy, relaxed swings," Shaw explains. "I want you at a three or four out of 10 on the grip. And I want you to see if you can get that clubface to close."

Next, Shaw says to practice swaying your arms, which

should help give you the feel of releasing the club.

"I want you to tee up a few balls, [put your] feet together, and I'm just going to let my arms sway," she says. "See if I can get that clubface to close and have the ball to start curving left."

By putting this all together, you'll stop opening your clubface, which Shaw says will result in farther, straighter shots.

"Anytime I can get this clubface closing, or another term for that is 'releasing', you're going to get more distance, you're going to stay in the fairway more, and you're going to like the ball flight so much better."





Bidding With Interference

Bidding would be a lot easier if the opponents did not interfere, but we know this is not the case. Here are some guidelines when the opponents get in our way:

After a Suit Overcall Suit Responses

If your partner opens and the next opponent overcalls in a suit, then 2/1 Game Forcing (including 1NT Forcing) are off. We now revert to Standard Bidding:

- New suit at the 1-level promises 4 pieces (6+ points).
- New suit at the 2-level promises 5 pieces (10+ points).
- 1NT would show a balanced hand with 6-10 HCPs (with stoppers in the opponent's suit).

• Raise in partner's suit would show 3 card support and 7-10 points.

BRIDGE TIP

• Double raise in partner's suit would show 4 card support and 6-9 points.

• Triple raise in partner's suit would show 5 card support and 6-9 points.

• Cue Bid would show a Limit Raise (11-12) or better.

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
