Trends Emerge in All Categories

Always held in mid-November, the Town Hall meeting serves as a means to look back at the summer months, welcome Members to the winter season, and highlight what's to come. What also emerges at these meetings are demonstrated trends related to the state of the Club, membership and financial standing.

Ocean Reef Club Chairman Charlie Johnston opened the meeting and set the stage for the meeting's topics, Membership, Club Overview, Financials and Cash Flow. Before turning the meeting over, he reminded the Membership of the "simple but brilliant" Vision, Mission and Guiding Principles that are at the core of Club governance. Mr. Johnston saying, "The last two years under Chairman Ray Larkin, we shifted towards a major focus on Equity Member Experience. You will see the results of that today as a theme that is very much alive." Through the improvements made over the summer, strong financial discipline and an attentiveness to compaction levels the meeting went on to prove the number one guiding principle, First and foremost, we are a Club.

Membership Overview

Club President Alex Tonarelli began with a comparison of overall Membership levels going back to 2015. The data shows that while Social membership remains capped at 2,350, Equity membership grew by 23 and Legacy membership continues to grow at a rapid pace, "a **Continued On** | 3

consistent trend that speaks to the DNA of Ocean Reef Club and the family environment", Mr. Tonarelli stated. Also, Tonarelli covered Club usage this past summer, which was less than 2022 and seems be reverting back to 2019 levels. Tonarelli reminded the Membership that with the major capital projects taking place, the Marina seawall replacement and the re-grass of the Dolphin Course, the Club anticipated some of the decline. Compounded with that, as Mr. Tonarelli explained, was the increase in international travel after a few years of Covid restrictions and the "return to work" policies instituted across the country. Many of our Legacy and Social members are no longer able to spend as much time working remotely. Lastly, Tonarelli said, "The guidelines and policies put in place last season to enhance Equity Member Experience are working."

Mr. Tonarelli followed that statement by highlighting the Member satisfaction results which reflect that the efforts by the Board of Directors and Club Management to embrace feedback and implement positive change are making a difference. He pointed out, "We generated a full point improvement in satisfaction results, which is very difficult to do when your starting point was a 92 percent the year prior". In addition, Tonarelli thanked the Members for taking the time to complete the survey and provide the management team with valuable feedback.

In the second portion of Mr. Tonarelli's presentation to the Membership, projects large and small that were completed this summer were highlighted. Most of which, like the improvements at the Clubhouse, were a result of valuable Member feedback. He also announced a few exciting new things for Members to look forward to; Waterside enhancements and now permanent status, Everton's Rum Bar, a newly created "Pool Experience Supervisor" position for Buccaneer Island rule enforcement, and lastly, the announcement which received a healthy and spontaneous round of applause – a new \$10 wine by the glass tier and reduced pricing on the top 5 most popular wines by the glass.

Mr. Tonarelli thanked the Membership for their unwavering support and reminded everyone that he welcomes their ideas.

Financial Report

"There's no bad news right now." That was Michael Heaney's opening statement. As Board Director and Chairman of the Finance Committee, Mr. Heaney said unequivocally, "We are fortunate to be able to say that the Club remains in a very strong financial position." Mr. Heaney reported on the 2023 forecasted results which align with the themes in the Membership presentation that demonstrate usage returning to 2018-2019 levels. He pointed out that while there is a leveling effect of revenue, there is also a nagging effect from the increase in underlying expenses. Heaney concluded with the 2024 budget stating, "First and foremost, the Equity Member Experience was a part of the budgeting process. Things that we put in place over the last 12 - 18 months will not be taken away just for the benefit of the bottom line."

\$100 Million Dollar Question

In closing, Chairman Johnston covered a topic that may certainly have bucked the trends and that is the \$100 million dollar question: what will the Club do with the cash on hand?

It is widely known that the Club has incredible financial strength, further supported in Michael Heaney's presentation. It is because of this solid foundation that the Club has been able to weather several storms, namely Covid. Mr. Johnston proceeded to demonstrate the specifics on how the Club got to this envious position, and the process for deciding what will be done with the cash on hand. He detailed the four windfalls, direct results of the pandemic and likely never to be seen again, that led to this surplus in cash; the increase of the Social member waitlist prior to it being capped in December 2022, the increase in Equity certificates, a record year in real estate and the tremendous usage by Members and extended family during the Covid time period.

Johnston then reminded Membership that there is always a disciplined approach in all financial decisions and "We never spend money unless it is a part of the Master planning process. We don't do special assessments and whatever we decide has to fit in with our Mission Statement and be good for the Membership." For example, the next two projects on the horizon are a Staff Housing building and Spa expansion, both of which have been under review for several years. He added, we also want to have one year of operating cash so that

we can sustain the Club should any uncertainties arise. Johnston illustrated that the Club has a plan that will ensure the Club's future, keep dues low and maintain the world-class amenities and Club no matter what may transpire. Adding, "I feel good that we have done something that will preserve the present and the future."

In addition to summing up the question of cash on hand, the Chairman did a generous round of thank you's including Alex Tonarelli and his staff, the membership for their support and care for the Club, the current Board and most notably, the very distinguished group of former Chairmen. "The longer I am in this role the more I realize that whoever stands in this role stands on the shoulders of those that came before them. There's no one chairman, no one Board that made this a great place, it's a collective effort of a lot of people."

New & Improved Communication Management System Coming Soon

In our ongoing commitment to bolster community security, Front Gate and Welcome Center Officers are gearing up to transition to a state-of-theart Community Management System (CMS). After a thorough evaluation last spring, it was decided to upgrade the existing CMS, originally installed in 2001, as it has reached the end of its useful life. The upcoming installation promises increased efficiency and collaborations with top-tier software providers.

A standout feature of the new system is the introduction of a "Traffic Viewer," offering detailed information about each vehicle. This enhancement will streamline the screening process for occupants entering the community. The upgraded system will seamlessly integrate with the existing Gate Card Readers and Member/Vendor ID access control technologies.

The anticipated go-live date for the new system is mid-January. This carefully selected time aims to minimize disruptions for members and guests, considering that the holidays have concluded. Extra Front Gate staff and representatives from multiple vendors will be available throughout the day to troubleshoot unexpected issues.

While the transition takes place, delays at the Front Gate are expected as staff acclimates to the new system. Here are some


recommendations for streamlining the process for members' guests and deliveries: First, refrain from using nicknames when providing gate clearances for guests. Second, inform all guests who are over 16 years old that a valid governmentissued identification is required at the gate. Third, ask guests to use the inbound window lane when arriving at the Front Gate.

During the transition to the upgraded system, the current webbased guest clearance system will be temporarily down. Members should utilize the automated clearance system at 305-367-2263, email the front gate at frontgate@ orcareef.com, or call the Front Gate at 305-367-4992.

As the transition date approaches, ORCA will provide timely updates. We appreciate your support and patience as we modernize the security system, ensuring a safer and more efficient community for everyone.

Historical Yacht Aphrodite Comes to Vintage Weekend

When Members **Roz** and **Tony Smith** mentioned their friends Deborah and Chuck Royce were returning to The Reef and bringing their yacht Aphrodite to Vintage Weekend, I knew many attendees would want to know about this special yacht.

If you've spent as much time as I have around boats in Newport, RI, you will see

why. I remembered attending the Wooden Boat Show in Newport in the mid-1980's to see a wooden sailboat. But it was the lines of this 74ft yacht that caught my eye.

So here's an abbreviated history: "Aphrodite" was built in Long Island by the Purdy Boat Company for John Hay "Jock" Whitney, financier, philanthropist and future

Ambassador in the late 1930's. It was a "Commuter" design which was exactly what Whitney used it for as he traveled between his home in Manhasset, Long Island (often still in his pajamas) to his Wall Street office and to Fisher's Island off the coast of Connecticut on summer weekends. He was also known to have entertained a long list of Who's Who in Hollywood. All that ceased shortly after Pearl Harbor when Whitney offered his fast yacht to the Military where it was used to shadow President Roosevelt's special weekend train along the Hudson River to his weekend home in Hyde Park as well as escort the Queen Mary on its maiden voyage to avoid enemy submarines off the Northeast coastline! It was also rumored that secret war strategy discussions took place on board. Jock Whitney reunited with "Aphrodite" until the late 1960's when he donated it to charity after which it changed ownership numerous times. In the 1970's it even had a temporary name change to "Moonfire".

Enter Chuck Royce, a former Fund Manager, who appreciates fine boats. He has been involved with the prestigious Herreshoff Marine Museum and owns many classic boats, one of which was donated to the International Yacht Restoration School in Newport (where I first heard of him). He also led the effort to restore the beautiful Ocean House in Watch Hill. RI which is one the finest places in New England. It was his Fleet Captain, Kirk Reynolds who introduced him to "Aphrodite" when they were searching for a larger boat to add to his collection in 1999. Although both men realized the boat, then docked in Florida, was in bad shape, they knew it was an important piece in America's yachting past. As Chuck Royce has said, "If it wasn't saved right then, it would be lost forever."

It took many years at the Brooklin Boat Yard in Maine to restore and, according to John Maxwell of Soundings Magazine, "...Aphrodite is an exact duplicate of the original head-turning yacht. Her sleek black hull is accented by a white boot stripe at the waterline and her distinctive carved gold-leaf scroll.... her new teak decks, the trunk cabin and pilothouse rise in an expanse of varnished African mahogany cabin sides, off-white cabin top, bronze hardware and gleaming, vintage green glass.

So do not miss seeing this extraordinary American motor yacht. Both Captain Kirk Reynolds and Steve White who ushered it through its years of restoration, will be on board to elaborate on its history as well as correct any of my historical errors! Thank you to **Vicki Goldstein** for making this visit possible.

Memberabilia My Husband – The Cook

According to *The Washington Post*, 43 percent of American men are now the cooks in their households. According to my informal *Memberabilia* survey of Ocean Reef friends and neighbors, the percentage is much higher. Over and over again women of all ages told me – "My husband is the cook. Me – I'm in charge of cleanup."

To learn more about these "at-home" male chefs. I asked three ORC Members – Larry Finley > Tim Flynn > Leonard Perfido – to tell me in their own words (or in the words of their grateful wives) how they became intrigued by the culinary arts and what it has meant to them.

I've preceded each of their accounts with highlights of their previous working lives.

Larry Finley – Highlight: After graduation with a degree in Mining Engineering and Civil Engineering, Larry went to work for Peabody Coal. He rose in the ranks and eventually became the owner and operator of his own company Sugar Camp Coal Co.

He is the cook! (In wife Darla's own words)

"Larry's first experiment with cooking came when, as a 14-year-old Eagle Scout, he was eager to earn a Cooking Merit Badge and he chose his grandmother's Blackberry Cobbler as his project.

He went into the woods and selected pristine blackberries. He fashioned a perfect crust and put his creation into a

Dutch Oven to bake over the campfire. The result would have made his grandmother proud.

Then his camp counselor was honored with the first slice. One taste and Larry could tell by her face that his Merit Badge was in jeopardy. 'It looks great, Larry. But you left out one ingredient – the sugar.'

Lucky for me, this teenage culinary tragedy did not destroy Larry's interest in cooking. He collects recipes from the *New York Times, Ina Garten* and *YouTube*. He will research one particular dish and see how each of the food critics prepares it. Then he will make his own creation.

Here's what we had for dinner last night – Southern Fried Chicken, Mashed Potatoes with Milk Gravy, Smashed Brussel Sprouts. What a luxury to have an "In

House Chef"!

Tim Flynn – Higblight: Tim, along with his brother **Tom**, is a partner in Continental Datalabel, Inc., which specializes in manufacturing labels of all kinds.

He is the cook! (In wife Jackie's own words)

"Tim grew up in a suburb of Chicago. His mother passed away when he was 11 years old. His stepmothers (there were more than one) didn't always know how to cook and Tim realized early on that he had better learn.

Tim's professional culinary education began when he was

in the 6th grade and started working after school at Jakes Pizza. He was taught how to prepare all the ingredients that went into a pizza. After a week of training, he was on his own. He made the dough, cooked the sausage, ground the mozzarella cheese, and cut the toppings.

In the 1980's we were living in California, where Tim decided there was no 'good' pizza. His solution was to make his own. We had parties at our house and friends and family came for what they learned was Good Midwest Pizza.

At Ocean Reef, we continued this pizza party tradition and it was so popular that friends suggested that we offer a Tim Flynn's Pizza Party as an auction item at the Ocean Reef Foundation's annual auction and gala. That was in 2013 and it has proved a lucrative and tasty auction item every year since."

Leonard Perfido – Highlight: Leonard established his Pittsburghbased architectural firm as a sole practitioner in 1975. One of the projects that catalyzed the firm's growth was the Penn-Liberty Historic District, a nine-year visionary effort that recreated and preserved the city's turn-of-the-century retailing district.

I'm the cook! (In Leonard's own words)

"When **Ruth** and I married in 1974 we rented a threestory, 950 square foot, newly renovated steelworkers row house in Pittsburgh, Pa. The

kitchen, no bigger than the galley of a medium-sized boat, was where I quickly learned that 'if I don't cook, we don't eat'. But I must say that Ruth does the clean-up and dishes. I do not know how to use the dishwasher!

I was the creative person of my architectural firm and cooking and presentation became another creative and aesthetic outlet. I originally only cooked from cookbooks feeling that successful cooks who wrote cookbooks had refined their recipes, so I would simply be like an actor understanding and delivering my lines. In time I learned how to adjust recipes to our tastes, and then I became more adventurous.

I developed many simple and quick lunches based on Italian dishes – such as a tuna salad served on a bed of tiny lettuces from the Farmer's Market dribbled with olive oil and Maldon sea salt flakes.

I regularly cooked complete dinner parties for eight, including our traditional Thanksgiving dinner, where the main course (instead of turkey) might be Risotto with Sea Scallops and Saffron from Venetian Taste (a cookbook that features delicious photographs as well as recipes). For dessert (inspired by Rolando Beramendi's Autentico) I serve Pistachio Gelato (Talenti) with Olive Oil and Fleur de Sel. I think it is a perfect ending for a 'home-made' Ocean Reef meal."

Tuna Tales



One of the unique natural bounties of Ocean Reef is the pristine waters right outside our doors. Anglers can enjoy reef, flats, and deep sea fishing literally minutes from our marina. It also means the Ocean Reef chefs enjoy access to a wide range of seafood delicacies fresh from the ocean.

Our kitchens receive deliveries of whole fresh fish daily – sea bass, grouper, snapper, tuna, and more. Cadres of cooks extract the tastiest morsels to present for

Member's dining. Executive Sushi Chef Eric Andreu regularly mentors chefs and cooks in the process.



Task completed. A little too late for Halloween, all that's left is a skeleton.

Several times a week, a large Yellowfin Tuna is dissected until only the bones and skin remain. I recently observed Chef Eric supervise Sous Chef Michael Meadows break down a 66-pound Yellowfin (also called Ahi) Tuna in the Ocean Room kitchen. "We use every part," Eric says. "We supply the fresh tuna to nearly every restaurant in Ocean Reef, almost 2500 pounds a week. The more

people we teach, the more people can help." Executive Chef Jared Reardon says, "We are developing the skills of our staff, and by breaking down whole fish we get a better product and better pricing."

Chef Eric delivered a running dialog as Michael worked. Yellowfin Ahi Tuna is reasonably common in the warm Atlantic waters around Ocean Reef. It is a good game fish for anglers, and a prized food fish in sushi, sashimi, tartar, and steaks. It features a body shape adapted for speed; it can swim up to 47 miles per hour so it can chase and capture prey such as mackerel. And, as Ocean Reef anglers know. can race for the bottom when hooked, creating a surge of adrenaline and a screaming reel.

The Chefs also regularly break down Pacific Bluefin Tuna, which are related, but larger.

In cold water, they develop beautifully marbled belly fat called Toro. The Bluefin is widely regarded as the King of Tuna. The Toro is richly flavored with melt-in-yourmouth texture. It is described as fatty, silky, mild, and savory all at once. Chef Eric imports the whole Bluefin fresh from Japan to create his celebrated sashimi—Toro, thinly sliced across the grain, with a variety of accompaniments.

Back to the dissection. After Chef Michael removes the four loins, only the backbone remains. But the meat closest to the bone is the most flavorful, so he scrapes between the ribs to harvest as much of the tasty scraps as possible. This is called nakaochi. It is deep red and tender. Chef Eric uses it in sushi rolls such as the best-selling Melanie Roll.

Don't try this at home. But then, you don't have to, we do it for you.

And Then It Begins

As I am writing this, Thanksgiving is more than a week away. But our household is already in a flurry – meal reservations, airport pickups, airing out the guest rooms, and multiple last minute adjustments. Details are blurring together. **Fair Patricia** just said, "I'm not sure I will make it through Christmas." And yet, we can't wait for the family to arrive.

For the Ocean Reef Culinary Team it is a similar crunch time -- a looming (and daunting) logistical challenge, a culinary D-Day. They are remarkably calm and upbeat. I sat in on last week's holiday Countdown Meeting with all of Ocean Reef's Chefs. Chef Philippe Reynaud, Senior Director of Culinary, said, "The full season is knocking on our door. All hands on deck." Executive Chef, Jared Reardon, said, "Next week there will be gobblers everywhere. We have ordered three thousand pounds of turkey." Supply chain challenges how been overcome. A hundred hands are processing produce. Chef uniforms are freshly pressed.

For the holiday, the restaurants have adopted a twist on the classic Escoffier "brigade" concept. Instead of five or six stations in a single kitchen where each chef concentrates on his specialty, each restaurant will roast and carve its own whole turkeys. AND, each restaurant will specialize in one of the traditional Thanksgiving sides (cranberry sauce, mashed potatoes, gravy, stuffing, vegetables), which they will provide to all of the other kitchens. The other principal outlets will return the favor by distributing another of the side dishes. By the time you are reading this, you will have experienced the

result. We all hope you have enjoyed a happy and healthy turkey day, with a perfectly satisfying Food & Beverage enhancement.

Banquets and Catering

Executive Banquet Chef Catalin Munteanu is also experiencing an accelerated drumbeat. On Thanksgiving, his team will handle two Thanksgiving Buffet Dinners at the same time, serving 1,200 diners. There are also private home plated events and fifty-five home deliveries. In all Banquets will roast and carve 250 turkeys, starting at 2 a.m. Thursday morning. After Thanksgiving, there is no let up. During December there are 20 to 30 daily events. Chef Catalin says, "This is where the communication and planning have to be incredibly explicit and the execution perfectly timed."

Banquet Innovation

Chef Catalin is ecstatic about how well the Food & Beverage management and the Club supports his efforts by providing the proper equipment to help create his best food. He has just premiered a conveyor system in the Cultural Center kitchen to improve the frequent plated banquets (58 nights are already planned for the season). The typical method would be to plate the finished entree and store the plates in warming racks until service. This inevitably dries the food. which Catalin calls "a sad result." The chef's new process will deliver the food more like a restaurant – no hot boxes or warming racks. A team of four chefs will stand on each side of the new conveyor where the protein and sides will be held in individual hot wells, with moisture and temperature maintained by calibrated bursts of steam. The plates will be assembled as they travel down the short conveyor in the synchronized choreography of experienced artists. No sitting. The plates go right on trays for garnish and service to Cultural Center diners. Catalin hopes patrons will appreciate the improvements.

Continuing Education

Over the summer, Chef Catalin accomplished a milestone; he completed his Executive Chef Certification from The American Culinary Federation. He completed three months of study for a written exam followed by a rigorous cooking test before a panel of experts. He had three hours to produce a multi-

course dinner with everything created from scratch. "We couldn't even have water boiling at the start," Catalin lamented. "And the panel scrutinized us and questioned us the whole time. I had to describe not only my dish, but the ingredients, the calories, the amount of fat, all the while trying to cook." There were six candidates. Only two received Certification after the practical cooking test.

Catalin received a round of applause at the Countdown meeting. Chef Jared (previously the only Certified Executive Chef at Ocean Reef) encouraged the other qualified chefs around the table to enter the program. "There are multiple opportunities here if you go for it." He said, "Anything you can do to get better, we get better." Catalin said, "I was fortunate to have Jared behind me pushing. Now he has a brother Executive Chef."



A Lesson From Reality?

The Oxford Dictionary defines 'wonder' as a "feeling of surprise mingled with admiration, caused by something beautiful, unexpected, unfamiliar, or inexplicable." As G.K. Chesterton once said, "The world will never starve for want of wonders; but only for want of wonder."

Wonder is elusive. Like bone density, it often seems to diminish with age. Perhaps that explains the popularity of J.K. Rowling's *Harry Potter* series, or C.S. Lewis' *Chronicles of Narnia*. These authors and others, like Madeline L'Engle, have "re-enchanted the world" for their readers.

RECOVERING WONDER

In my final year of undergraduate study, a professor whose name I have forgotten, introduced wonder into the field of science for me. Up until that class, I had a boring caricature of how the sciences work. I thought of scientists, hard or soft, as lab rats, unimaginative people in white coats rigorously pursuing the scientific method of observation, leading methodically and painstakingly, step-by-step, to verifiable hypotheses. (If you're a scientist, please forgive me!)

So, what changed? The professor introduced us to that guy who created the term "paradigm shift." His name was Thomas Kuhn. He wrote the book that defined the shift - *The Structure* of *Scientific Revolutions*. Kuhn's argument was that real scientific breakthroughs – paradigm shifts in our understanding - were not the outcome of my characterization of the process above.

These breakthroughs in understanding happen instead, Kuhn claimed, when someone like Copernicus or Einstein comes along. The rest are just technicians. Einstein understood the old paradigm, the model of how the universe works, thanks to Isaac Newton and an apple – the fruit, not the computer. However, Einstein knew that Newton's understanding had limits.

Hilley The change in how we understand the structure, the reality of the physical world, began one day in Bern, Switzerland, when Einstein thought about trains moving in opposite directions. This shift in understanding was the result of a moment of creative insight – of wonder. These moments of insight are what Kuhn calls scientific revolutions, paradigm shifts.

REALITY FILLED WITH WONDER

All of the above is predicate to an introduction. Perhaps some of you are familiar with the name, Siddhartha Mukherjee. He teaches medicine at Columbia University. He is a cancer physician and researcher. His writing instills wonder into our understanding of biology.

His first book, *The Emperor of All Maladies*, is a biography of cancer, spanning some five-thousand years. He has written another titled *The Gene*, and his latest book published last year, is *The Song of the Cell*.

Many of us can recall reading Jules Verne's novel, *Twenty Thousand Leagues* Under the Sea. Verne's submarine, the Nautilus, manned by Captain Nemo and his crew, took us on a journey of fantasy through the imagined depths of the undersea world.

Dr. Mukherjee takes the reader on a different adventure. This adventure travels through the cell much like Verne did through the sea – only with one difference. The journey through the cell, while filled with imaginative vision, is not fantasy. It is reality, and that reality is full of wonder.

His exploration of the structure of a cell is enthralling and readable. After bobbing around on the surface with proteins, he has you board "the craft." You then dive into the interior of the cell, entering a liquid world of protoplasmic fluid, dangling proteins, and "a long strand-like molecule called ribonucleic acid, or "RNA." He guides you through the vastness, the wonder of the world contained in each of our cells – some thirty trillion by latest estimates.

A LESSON FROM REALITY?

Dr. Mukherjee's work is anything but political. However, as I read about the structure of the cell, I was struck by what he wrote, and how it might apply to a humanitarian issue that is top of mind. It was unexpected.

He writes, "A bounded autonomous living unit – a 'closed unit' - that bears the laws that govern its existence - must have a boundary. It is the membrane that defines the boundary; the outer limits of the cell. Bodies are bound by a multicellular membrane: the skin. So is the psyche, by another membrane: the self. And so are houses and nations. To define an internal milieu is to define its edge – a place where the inside ends and the outside begins. Without an edge, there is no self.... A perfectly sealed cell is a perfectly dead cell. But unsealing the membrane through portals exposes the cell to potential harm. The cell must embrace both: closed to the outside, yet open to the outside." (pp.76-77)

I found myself surprised by these words. They made me think about what is taking place at our Southern borders, and our need for a healthy immigration policy – a healthy membrane that defines us. Without an edge, there is no nation. Perhaps our political leaders should consider this lesson from the reality and wonder of the cell? It is a lesson from reality that makes you think.



The Turkey Day Stretch

Did you participate in the Gobble Wobble 5k, either walking or running? Maybe you did a few hamstring stretches while getting ready to put in those 5 miles - or maybe not. So, while we might have been working on stretching our stomachs with turkey, other more beneficial stretching is often left out of our exercise routines - but the benefits of stretching have big payoffs.

Research has shown that stretching can help improve flexibility, and as a result, the range of motion of your joints.

Better flexibility may:

• Decrease your risk of injuries



- Help your joints move through their full range of motion
- Increase muscle blood flow
- Enable your muscles to
- work more effectivelyImprove your ability to do daily activities
- Improve sports activity performance

If you are suffering from pain during movement, the Medical Center's Sports Medicine and Physical Therapy department offers the technique of dry needling. The certified and trained physical therapist inserts a "dry" needle, one without medication or injection, into areas of the muscle. Dry needling, while it may seem a distant cousin to acupuncture, is a part of modern Western medicine and is supported by research.

Medical Center therapist Miguel Gonzalez states, "This technique is used to treat pain and movement impairments by targeting trigger points. A trigger point is a taut band of skeletal muscle within a larger muscle group. Trigger points can be tender to the touch and touching a trigger point may refer pain to other parts of the body."

The Turkey Not On Your Table

I was asked recently if the turkey buzzard was related to the turkeys we have for Thanksgiving. This was another reminder that most folks have not spent as much time as I have fooling around with birds. The quick answer to this question is no. A better answer is much more complex.

When Ben Franklin lobbied for the American Wild Turkey to be the "national bird" of the United States rather than the Bald Eagle he was convinced that the Wild Turkey was far more intelligent and honest than the eagle. Turkeys are ground-loving foragers and will eat a variety of grass, seeds, foliage and berries as well as nuts, apples and insects.

Eagles, on the other hand, hunt from the air, sometimes a perch and prefer fish, water birds and ducks as well as small reptiles and mammals. They will also steal food from other species often conducting aerial pursuits of other species with their hardwon prize.

So what about the "buzzard"? First off these black birds we see here at The Reef are not buzzards. They are vultures, all of them. In the earliest days of the settlement of the North American continent the European settlers, not familiar with "vultures" thought that all black soaring birds were buzzards, the old world name of a variety of hawks. The mistaken name has stayed with the birds and with us for more than 400 years! To

more complicate the roots of the family tree recent research has indicated that the vultures are more likely related to storks. One thing for sure is that at least for now they are not related to turkeys.

The Turkey Vulture is so named because

the mature birds, male and female have mostly red, featherless heads. Just like...yep, the Wild Turkey. The other vulture species found in smaller numbers here in South Florida is simply the Black Vulture. No red head

and a different flight pattern along with different foraging tactics.

Regardless of which vulture you have in the yard, let's hope it does not wind up on or around your table.

Members returning to Ocean Reef often feel compelled, first thing, to have their boat commissioned for the season. There is nothing more exciting than your own boat at the ready at The Reef. Mechanical equipment is serviced, the hull is cleaned and waxed, and bottom paint is restored. The boat is fueled up and tied up, bobbing outside your residence. You are ready to ride?

Maybe not. Has a thorough check been made of all the onboard safety equipment mandated by Florida and the US Coast Guard?

The Ocean Reef Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla, located within the Club for 50 years, has five affable Vessel Examiners—all Ocean Reef Members available to perform a Vessel Safety Check aboard your boat, at your dock, on your schedule. They will prepare you in advance with a list of items to be verified. The inspection is free, and examiners want your boat to pass. There are no penalties for deficiencies, only opportunities for improved safety for you and your passengers.

A Vessel Check, available for tenders and boats under 65 feet and for all paddle craft, can take 30 minutes or less. On completion, the vessel will be awarded a decal and certificate verifying that it meets all regulatory requirements at the time of inspection.

Coast Guard Auxiliarists at Ocean Reef offer Vessel Safety Checks as a community service and boating amenity—a valuable marine component of our superior residential experience.








Choosing Between Closed and Open Stance in Tennis

For everyone that plays tennis, there is always the question of when you should be hitting closed stance and when you should be hitting open stance. For those of you that are not sure of the difference, closed stance is when your hips are parallel with the side line, your toes are pointed at the side fence and your feet are shoulder distance apart in line with one another. Open stance is when your toes are still pointing at the side fence, but your hips are a bit more open and your feet are staggered. To figure which stance you should be using, follow the below criteria:

- If you are stepping into the court to hit a short or low ball—hit in a closed stance
- If you are rallying from the baseline, especially deep, high balls—hit in an open stance



Bridge Tip of the Week: Different Doubles

Double: A bid technique. Various kinds, however, all doubles not for penalty are considered conventional.

Some examples: Balancing Double/Balancing Bid:

Making a bid in a position where passing would end the bidding (example D P P?).

The requirements for balancing (with a double or otherwise) are always less than bidding in the middle of a live auction. The reason for this is that here the opponents have given up in a part score, so you can assume that your partner has some good cards. In a live auction, they may be going to a game and your partner may be totally busted (a really bad hand).

Business Double:

Same as a penalty double (i.e. I mean business).

Lead Directing Double:

A double asks a partner to lead a specific suit. Often these will be doubles of artificial or Qbids made by your right-hand opponent. The most common would be a double of stayman (2C over 1NT) which says, "Partner, I have clubs". A double like this does not usually ask to compete in the auction but may be made on something like KQTxx of clubs and not much else.

Lightner Double:

Almost always used when opponents have bid to a slam. They are made by the partner of the opening leader and always ask for an unusual lead. Many times that player will be void in a suit. Very often it will specifically ask for the lead of the dummy's first bid suit (doubler may have AQ of suit, or K with outside A, or be void).

Negative Double:

Used after partner bids and opponents overcall shows 4 cards in the unbid major.

Optional double:

Simply means a double that can be passed, or not, by a partner. In a sense, all doubles are optional, but some more so than others.

Penalty Double:

Used when you think you can set (prevent them from making) opponents contract.

Responsive Double:

A specialized bid for more advanced players allows partnerships to decide whether to compete for a part score, go to the game, or defend.

Support Double:

A specialized bid for more advanced players. Used when you have opened the bidding and partner has responded, and your righthand opponent has bid. A double at this point shows 3 cards in the partner's suit (ie:1 D P 1S 2C X).

To bid 2S would show 4 spades (and no extra values beyond opening hand). To pass or bid anything else would deny having as many as 3 spades.

Takeout Double:

Used after opponents bid to indicate support in unbid suits.




