Vintage Weekend

History on Display

Each and every year, an overarching theme emerges by the conclusion of Vintage Weekend. Past years have revealed – great things come in threes, it's a family affair, and of course, the year of singing in the rain.

This year, as Vintage
Committee member **Lenny Sikora** addressed the room of exhibitors at Sunday's Awards
Breakfast, he said, "Through your spirit for what you do, whether it's automobiles, aircraft or yachts, you not only have this passion for restoring and keeping the conveyances in such fine order, but also for sharing that passion with others."

This passion for sharing and preserving a bit of history became the most prominent theme of the 27th annual Vintage Weekend.

AUTOMOBILES - The Best of Both Worlds

"When the car hobby first started, it was with intent to take cars back to their original form, as perfectly as possible," said Committee member Bill Parfet. "Not anymore. Many collectors are now opting to take a historical car, and customize it to make it more comfortable or easy to run, creating something even better than the original. You've got the best of both worlds - the nostalgia of what a vintage car looked like, with the zip, power and attraction to make it fun and drivable for everybody."

An example of this on the Concours was the 1975 Chevrolet El Camino Pickup resto-mod, a form of restoration that **Bill Johnston** defined as taking a

car of historical significance and putting a modern chassis underneath (ex, disc brakes, fuel injection, big horsepower, air conditioning), making it more comfortable to drive. While the exterior of the truck replicates the 1975 El Camino, it has been restomoded with the drivetrain of a 1995 Camaro Z28, making it a fun daily driver as described by owner Steve White.

For many collectors, restoring to original is still the priority and that was surely the case for Don Ghareeb who brought a 1934 and 1935 Cadillac V16 Coupe – the former of which was awarded Best in Show. In 1971, Ghareeb found both cars in a barn that had flooded twice, and "it was quite an effort to get the Cadillacs up and running."

Among this sea of restorations and resto-mods, the rare original was found. No example was more unique than the 1980 Mercedes 450 SL Coach Builder, which was lost for 20 years in the living room of a home, covered in blankets and cushions from the original estate that owned it. It was discovered in perfect condition, pristine with 18,000 original miles and is in the care of its second owners.

"Anything's possible with these old cars," said Parfet, "but the one common denominator is... they're fun."

YACHTS - History Preserved

The yachts this year demonstrated an interesting contrast between proactive and reactive preservation. "On the one hand, we have Aphrodite, which is a complete and extensive restoration," said Vintage Founder and Committee member **Vicki Goldstein**. "On the other, we have Shark, completely untouched and in perfect condition."

The 74-foot Aphrodite, an iconic commuter yacht, was built in 1937 for Jock Whitney, who used the yacht to shuttle from his Long Island home to his office on Wall Street. After the attack on Pearl Harbor, Aphrodite was commissioned as a Coast Guard auxiliary vessel before going through a series of owners where her condition deteriorated. After spending years ashore with barnacles and weeds sprouting out of her hull. Brooklin Boat Yard had the privilege in 2004 and 2005 of doing her restoration, using the original boat as a template from which to create what would become the reborn Aphrodite.

"This boat is an extraordinary part of yachting history,"
Goldstein said as she presented Aphrodite with both the Spectator's Choice and Best Restoration awards. "She was virtually going to be lost if not for several people in this room. It's taken 27 years, but we finally got her to Vintage Weekend."

At the other end of the spectrum, Shark, the largest Rybovich motor yacht ever built at 75 feet, has never been restored. Incredibly, this gorgeous yacht has had two owners in 51 years, both committed to meticulously maintaining the boat, keeping every part of it pristine. Current owner Peter Vlasov brings Shark back to its manufacturer every year for a tune-up, but as a nautical engineer himself, when he steps aboard his yacht, he knows how it works and he knows how to fix it.

Members who boarded Shark commented on the intimate feel and impeccable maintenance, all in its original form from the day it left the boatyard. Shark was honored with this year's Trumpy Award

AIRCRAFT - Upkeep & Outfitting

The Best Restoration award this year went to RT Dickson's 1944 North American P-51D Mustang, which Sikora admitted is his favorite airplane. This P-51 underwent a complete restoration from 2007 to 2012. Through thorough upkeep, RT performs aerobatics across the country and aims to preserve this important piece of history by honoring all those past, present and future serving in the US Armed Forces.

This weekend, Reef buzz centered around Most Exciting Aerobatic Show winner Nate Hammond in his 1956 deHavilland Super Chipmunk, which made the aircraft restoration story also about the outfitting of a vintage plane to create an aircraft no one thought was possible (or advisable!). Originally designed as a trainer for the Royal Canadian Air Force, nearly 3,000 man-hours over two years went into specially modifying the "GhostWriter" into the plane Hammond used for Friday night's show performance with a magnificent display of pyrotechnics.

In Sikora's words, "I can just imagine a couple guys getting together and thinking, let's take this 1956 deHavilland Chipmunk, take the little tiny engine out of it, put in an engine about twice the size and three times as powerful, and we'll call it a Super Chipmunk.

Then we'll fill it up with highly volatile, 100 octane low lead aviation gas. Right next to these fuel tanks, we'll put these high explosives, and then we'll go up and do an aerobatics show at night over water."

Just when you thought you've seen it all at Vintage Weekend, the Committee wowed again with Friday night's air show grand finale.

Look to the Future

Vintage Weekend gets better year after year and it's not only because of new acts or events. It's because "of people's passion about history, about the story to be told, about the memories that can be made by continuing to support, renew and use these artifacts," said Parfet. "This commitment to keeping these histories alive is what continues to grow us, giving us the opportunity to not only reminisce about the past, but also recognize that there is still so much opportunity for a great future ahead."

Gene McNeely Performs Farewell Airshow

Aerobatic pilot Gene McNeely has been coming to Vintage Weekend for years, and for the second year in a row, was given the Spirit of Vintage Weekend award. "Gene has the spirit of Vintage Weekend in that he's willing to share his passion," said Vintage Weekend Committee member Lenny Sikora. "The first thing he said to me when he stepped down off his plane was, 'I want to give some rides.' He's such a gracious man."

Spectators know him as the 83-year-old aerobatic pilot who defies all odds in his T-6, performing the most advanced

aerobatic maneuvers with as much precision as his younger counterparts.

McNeely's interest in flying peaked in high school. He earned his private pilot certificate, joined the Navy, and used the GI Bill to get his ratings. In conjunction with a career as a commercial agricultural pilot and owner of a small cargo hauling business, he began flying his

own aerobatic solo routine in air shows before joining what would eventually become the Aeroshell Aerobatic Team.

McNeely spent 24 years flying "slot" with the Aeroshell Team before retiring in 2017. But he didn't really retire, he continued performing his solo routine at many of the same air shows Aeroshell was performing at, including Vintage Weekend.


Now, this is McNeely's third attempt at retiring. "I failed the first two times," he said as he accepted his award at the Sunday breakfast, "but I'm announcing that I'm going to try to retire one more time."

Speaking of last hurrahs, the 2023 Vintage Weekend was also the farewell airshow for the Aeroshell Aerobatic Team, but not to worry! They'll be back in action as the Titan Aerobatic Team. And who knows, maybe we'll be lucky enough to see McNeely back again.

Connecting the Dots – Global Conflicts & the Future of Democracy

Global politics has seen a sharp increase in wars, authoritarian governments and a shifting world order. To make sense of these seminal changes, Congregation Ocean Reef invites the entire ORC community to the Chapel at 5pm on Sunday, December **10th** to hear Kenneth Wollack, Chair of the National Endowment for Democracy, and a member of the George W. Bush Institute's Advisory Council, speak on "Connecting the Dots - Global Conflicts, Authoritarianism, and the Future of Democracy."

Whether it is Hamas seeking to cleanse the Jewish people from

Israel, Vladimir Putin's Russia fighting to eliminate Ukrainian control over its own nation, or Xi Jinping ending democracy in Hong Kong, threatening the same for Taiwan – these alarming trends in democratic decline and the rise of populist politics with authoritarian tendencies raise significant questions.

Can the United States relentlessly pursue our positive vision for the future, or will those who do not share western values drag the world to a more dangerous and divided place?

Is democracy itself at risk because of a problem staring us right in our face? Has the United States lost some of its moral authority to lead the world in protecting and expanding democracy?

To connect these many dots, we are fortunate to have Mr. Wollack speak about the relationship between all these challenges and suggest how trends and opportunities will influence the course of democracy in the coming years.

Mr. Wollack has been actively involved in foreign affairs, journalism, and politics over the past five decades. For over 25 years, he served as president of the National Democratic Institute (NDI), a nongovernmental organization dedicated to advancing democracy worldwide. NDI maintains offices in more than 50 countries and works to support democratic elections, political parties, parliaments, civic engagement and women's political empowerment.

Before joining NDI, Mr. Wollack co-edited the Middle East Policy Survey and wrote regularly on foreign affairs for the Los Angeles Times. From 1973 to 1980, he served as legislative director of the American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC) and has been active in American politics since the 1970's.

He has served on task forces sponsored by the Brookings Institution, the United States Institute of Peace, the Council on Foreign Relations, the Center for U.S. Global Engagement, the Bipartisan Policy Center and the Atlantic Council. He chaired the U.S. Committee for the United Nations Development Program, served on the Secretary of State's Advisory Committee on Democracy Promotion, and was a member of the advisory committee for the U.S. Agency for International Development and a senior associate at the Center for Strategic and International Studies. He co-chaired the Ronald Reagan Institute's bi-partisan Working Group on advancing freedom and promoting democracy in the 21st century.

For his efforts on behalf of democracy, Mr. Wollack was the recipient of NDI's W. Averell Harriman Democracy Award, the Presidential Order of Excellence as well as Honorary Citizenship from the Republic of Georgia, the National Order "Faithful Service" from the government of Romania, and the Medal of Honor "Lithuanian Millennium Star" from the government of Lithuania.

1. Choose Secure Websites

Second Round of Israel Relief Fund Grants Made Ahead of Chanukah

While researching our Israel Relief Fund project helping the survivors of the Kibbutz Be'eri massacre, I came across a photo of a blackened, mangled menorah in the wreckage of one of the burned homes. It was striking, and a grim reminder that so many families would mark the start

of Chanukah on December 7, two months after the horrific October 7 attacks, missing their murdered and kidnapped family members and, often, the comforts of home.

To date, the Ocean Reef community has donated more than \$500,000 to the Israel Relief Fund. Our first \$300,000 in donations for humanitarian aid previously announced went out quickly to our three partner organizations. A second slate of \$120,000 in grants to the same partners has now gone out ahead of the start of Chanukah, with some special designations related to the holiday, as follows.

American Friends of Magen David Adom - \$10,000

This gift provides more general support of the Israeli equivalent of the Red Cross' mission to support blood supply and EMT/paramedics

for injured civilians, bringing total support to \$35,000.

The Isaiah Projects - \$10,000

The additional \$10,000 brings total grants to \$85,000, with original amount going to help survivors of the Kibbutz Be'eri massacre. Half of our latest donation will fund two Chanukah events to uplift families with parents who are away serving in the military on the front lines of the war. Each gathering will host 50 families (175 people).

Greater Miami Jewish Federation - \$100.000

Our additional distribution of \$100,000 brings our total grants to GMJF to \$300,000, and includes measured grants to two initiatives helping families displaced by the war observe Chanukah together, with the majority going to the previously supported Israel Emergency Fund offering a broad scope of humanitarian aid.

GMJF has a sister community in Israel called Yerucham where a large number of families who have been displaced due to the destruction of their homes and communities are now living. Part of our gift will make Chanukah gatherings and observances possible for the children relocated to Yerucham.

Miami is now a "host community" for 220 affected

Israeli families seeking respite from the war. The GMJF Israeli Division is coordinating services for the families, including finding temporary housing, arranging counseling and medical treatment for children and adults, and opening day schools and JCC's to the children. GMJF is underwriting the cost of Chanukah celebrations for this community and part of our donation will help to provide gift cards, allowing them to purchase what they need for their family traditions.

Our Chanukah grants are offered in the spirit of the Festival of Light, with the hope that a little light will make a difference at a dark time.





At this year's Turkey Carving Demonstration, Carysfort Kitchen Chef de Cuisine Betania Salles' strawberry chocolate turkeys were a hit! One Member said that not only did they look adorable, but they also tasted delicious. Here is Chef Betania's recipe:

STRAWBERRY CHOCOLATE TURKEYS

Makes 10 turkeys



Ingredients:

10 Medium size strawberries
25 Mini marshmallows
10 Pretzel sticks
2 cups Semi dark chocolate melted
1/2 cup White chocolate melted
Gold dust (optional)
10 skewers 4"

Directions:

- 1 Stick a skewer on the core of the strawberry, between the leaves, making sure is very secure
- 2 Cut the pretzel into 2" sticks (2 for each strawberry the legs)
 - 3 Lightly wet the cut side of the pretzel and insert inside one mini marshmallow
- 4 Using a scissor, remove a little piece of the side of the marshmallow
- 5 Lightly smudge the cut side of the marshmallow with melted semi-sweet chocolate and glue one in each side of the strawberry for the legs. Wait for the chocolate to dry
- 6 Using a scissor, cut one mini marshmallow in half on diagonal
- 7 Glue each piece of the cut marshmallow on the sides of the strawberry a little below the leaves for the wings
 - 8 Cover a tray with parchment paper
- 9 Once legs and wings are secure, hold the strawberry by the skewer and the leaves (lift the leaves so they don't get covered in chocolate), and dip into the melted semi-sweet chocolate, hold until all the extra chocolate drips way then place it on the lined tray
- 10 Once the chocolate has dried out (you can put in the refrigerator), dip the tips of the legs into the white chocolate. You will have to do it couple times.
- 11 After the chocolate is completely dry, brush the chest with golden dust.

Smart Dining: Let Us Know Your Food **Allergies**

Stopping by a smoothie stand in Mexico where he was attending a wedding, Jared Reardon noticed bee pollen on their menu. Sounding like something fun to try, he asked that it be tossed in with his fruit blend. That decision turned into two days of him battling body hives. He never knew he was allergic.

As the Executive Chef for Ocean Reef Club, Chef Jared doesn't want people with allergies or dietary restrictions to feel any different or to have anything less than excellent food and service.

"I want the Member experience to be the same for everyone," he said. "Anyone should be able to find something to eat. You can think of our menus as your refrigerator. We can take any ingredient from any entrée we have and build a dish for you."

At least twice a day per outlet, Members who are vegans, gluten intolerant, and those with common allergies, such as to nuts, dairy, shellfish, eggs, soy, and sesame, come in with their concerns, said Mandy Fescina, ORC's Food & Beverage Quality Control Manager.

Communication is Key

While options and precautions are taken to accommodate Members and guests, what matters the most, especially for those with severe or multiple food allergies, is that they share them with dining reservations and restaurant managers, she

As a former manager at The Islander and Palm Court, Fescina



Food & Beverage Quality Control Manager Mandy Fescina and Executive Chef Jared

is so in-tuned to Members, she sometimes remembers their list of sensitivities better than they do. She also advises that all managers go the extra step to make these patrons feel comfortable about what's in their food.

'We may have a packaged product we use all the time, like waffle fries," says Fescina. "But even with the same vendor, the ingredients can change. We are happy to take any ingredient label off a product and bring it to the Member's table. "

Members making reservations to places such as Gianni, CH Prime, or the Islander, can add their allergies to the reservation notes, where it will remain on their profile. (Confirming at arrival that the notes are re-read is a must). But when going to places not on the reservation system, such as the Burgee Bar, Palm Court, Waterside, Reef Hut, and the Grill Room, Members need to alert their server, the manager, or the Chef. Members should never be afraid to overcommunicate or even bring a list with them outlining their allergies.

Someone in town for a few days, for example, who is aware ahead of time where they will be eating, whether it takes reservations or not, can also request that the corresponding restaurant manager receive an email about their allergies, Fescina said.

Aside from peanut and tree nut-free items, gluten-free options are the most commonly requested food.

"We can turn anything into

a gluten-free item," said Chef Jared, whose father is gluten intolerant. "In a soup, for example, we will remove the flour and add a thickening agent, a rice or a potato, that naturally thickens."

All outlets that sell pizza can make them gluten-free upon request by using a cauliflower base, he added.

Prep Work

Some of the behind-thescenes efforts to avoid cross contaminations include cooks using separate utensils when slicing fish and not cooking meats and fish together. Peanut oil is not used in any restaurant. Clean pitchers, untouched by peanut butter, can be requested for mixing smoothies and shakes. Separate pots, pans, and cutting boards are also on hand. Every restaurant menu, including those online, list items designated as GF (gluten free), DF (dairy free), or V or VG (vegan).

Members with severe allergies, who are either hosting or attending an event catered through the Club are encouraged to call the Catering office to address any concerns. Despite ORC kitchens not being nut or wheat free, banquet chefs are well trained in handling allergens, said Phillipe Reynaud, ORC Executive Director of Culinary. While much effort is put into labeling foods at buffet events, he said, make sure to confirm which foods might contain allergens with managers. All Club events with food have gluten-free and vegan options available, he added.

Training

Educating both front and back house personnel is also a key component in best handling vulnerable guests, said Fescina. Training manuals include photos of menu items with detailed descriptions so servers are equipped to answer all Member questions on how foods are prepared.

"There is a lot more awareness among chefs today where in the past it wasn't always the case," Chef Jared said.

When it comes to sweet treats on The Reef, Members can order nut-free and gluten-free custom baked goodies at Reef Treats. These requests are typically fulfilled by the Club's Bake Shop and sent back to Reef Treats for pick up. Ice cream can be requested served from a nut-free



Are You Willing to Doubt Your Doubts?

A Remarkable Story

In the late 1950s, a pastor and his wife, with three young sons in tow, took on what many would have considered "a fool's errand." The pastor was Tim Keller. His vision was to begin a new church in the middle of New York City. Twenty years later, in 2007, Redeemer Presbyterian Church had grown to more than five thousand multiethnic attendees, who were mostly young, and more than two-thirds single. During that time, they spawned a dozen daughter congregations in the immediate metropolitan area.

Keller was quite the contrast to the stereotypical 'mega-church pastor' in looks, manner and message. This balding, humble, brilliant pastor presented an Orthodox Christian faith that reached the hearts and minds of high-achieving young New Yorkers.

An Unusual Approach

Keller's approach was unique – no gimmicks, no frills. He realized that both religious belief and radical skepticism were on the rise. He recognized that each side's self-talk, claiming the other would soon be extinct and overrun by the opposition, was simply not true. He understood that if the two sides stopped saying things like that to themselves, it might make everyone more civil and generous toward opposing views.

Keller's recommendation was to encourage each side to doubt in a radical new way. He claimed that only if you struggle long and hard with objections to your faith will you be able to provide grounds for your belief to skeptics, including yourself, that

are plausible rather than ridiculous or offensive. He said that such a process will lead you, even after you come to a position of strong faith, to respect and understand those who doubt!

He challenged people with this question. "How do you know your belief is true?" He explained that it would be inconsistent to require more justification for Christian belief than a skeptic does for their own, but says, that is rarely what happens. He says to each side, in fairness, you must doubt your doubts!

Two Recommendations

Keller encourages skeptics to wrestle with the unexamined 'blind faith' on which skepticism is based, and to see how hard it is to justify those beliefs to those who don't share them. On the other hand, he then encourages believers to wrestle with their personal and culture's objections to faith.

A Remarkable Outcome

What's the outcome? It's this. At the end of each process, even if you remain the skeptic or believer you have been, you will hold your position with greater clarity and greater humility. There will then be an understanding, sympathy, and respect for the other side that did not exist before.

Believers and non-believers will rise to the level of disagreement rather than simply denouncing one another. This happens, Keller has discovered, when each side has learned to represent the other's argument in its strongest and most positive form. Only then is it safe and fair to disagree with it. That achieves civility in a pluralistic society, which is no small thing.

An Invitation to Join the Conversation

Beginning **Thursday morning**, **December 14th**, at 8 a.m., a Men's Group is going to work through Keller's book, "The Reason for God: Belief in an Age of Skepticism." We will meet in The Fellowship Hall of the Chapel. The group's facilitator is Peter Raffalski, one of our local bankers.

Keller's book addresses some of the 'big questions,' and each question is approached as described above. The second part of the book outlines what Keller calls The Reasons for Faith.

Who is This Group For?

This group IS NOT for anyone unwilling to doubt their doubts. This group IS NOT for anyone unwilling to listen and engage constructively with those who may disagree. This group IS NOT for anyone unwilling to respect the integrity of how another person may think about the questions.

This group IS for anyone willing to doubt their doubts. This group IS for those who want to engage these 'big questions' with men in a small group setting in the context of a larger group. The group IS for those who believe, for those who aren't sure what they believe, and for those who are sure they don't believe.

What's the Goal?

It's what I quoted from Keller

earlier. It is that each of us will learn to hold our position with greater clarity and greater humility. The goal is to learn to be more civil and understanding toward those with whom we disagree. When's the last time you were part of an experience like that with other guys?

One final thing – there is coffee! Hope to see you there.

Treasures of Ocean Reef

Moorey-Margaret Myers

Affectionately known to her clients as "M3," Moorey-Margaret Myers is a beloved member of the exceptional staff at the Ocean Reef Fitness Center. Myers' 20 year+ resume in the fitness profession is quite impressive. She is an instructor for yoga classes, barre, and personal training and an enthusiastic ambassador for fitness in general. She incorporates her expertise as a medical fitness therapist into her workouts, specializing in rehab of knees and the back. A cancer survivor and recipient of six knee surgeries herself, she finds it fulfilling to help others in their specific recovery.

M3 followed quite an interesting life path before finding her fitness home at Ocean Reef. Born in Monroe, Michigan, she was a natural athlete. She loved living near the shores of Lake Erie, and developed a passion for the Great Lakes and the sea. A speedy, slender 5' 9", M3 ran the hurdles in high school track. Unfortunately, a torn ACL sidelined her and required significant physical therapy. Depressed that she could not regain her former speed, her physical therapist suggested she try ballet to improve her balance and further her recovery. It was love at first plié.

A self-proclaimed "nerd," she embraced the study of ballet, learning the Russian Vaganova ballet. She toured with the Ann Arbor and

"Fueled & Aflame" dance companies. She was chosen as McNair Scholar, and studied ballet with Dmitri Roudney, a graduate of the Bolshoi Ballet in Moscow, at Michigan State. At the same time, she earned a BA in philosophy and ethics, a minor in biology and completed an Honors program in dance. Her professors praised her creativity and ability to think outside the box. She agrees, describing herself as, "a hibiscus tea in a world of lattés." This may explain why after college she opted to become a flight attendant instead of attending graduate school! She hated that choice so she began work as a hospice and memory care volunteer with geriatric patients. "I love working with people who have life experience," she mused. "They have such interesting stories to share and often a wonderful sense of humor." Myers then met her husband, was married within a year, and moved to Clinton Township, Michigan, where she founded Exodus Dance Company. A touring performance group, their

travels included introducing

classical dance to children in inner-city Detroit. Her strong commitment to her faith and dance led her to spend two summers at Ballet Magnificat in Jackson, Mississippi. There M3 completed an instructor-intensive training program which included, in part, certifications in kinesiology, strength, and conditioning. She then returned to school to earn her personal training certification.

In 2018, Myers' husband of 18 years, Keith, took a job in Miami and they moved south. M3 began working at Key Largo Yoga where a client suggested she would be a perfect fit at Ocean Reef. She emailed her resume to the Director of Fitness and Wellness, Luis Bracamonte, and explained that he needed to hire her! Happily, he did, and she now loves being a part of the Ocean Reef family. The Myers also volunteer at the Everglades with the National Park Service. They do wilderness surveys with people coming out of the back country to collect data on sightings of wildlife and other discoveries. They once rescued a pelican and

recently spotted "Croczilla," a 14' crocodile considered the largest in the state of Florida!

With her dance career behind her, Myers finds her job here fuels the passion that dance once provided. "Working at Ocean Reef Club, feels like a little bit of the Midwest here in Florida," she explained. "My clients are wise, talented and funny and I want to help them improve their quality of life through movement as medicine." She stresses that consistent commitment yields positive results and she couples that with a positive, playful attitude. "Fitness should be fun," she laughs, and is not afraid to add a bit of crazv to her sessions. Ask her clients and co-workers and they will agree that M3 brings her own special kind of joy to the Fitness Center and their lives.

Member Bill Henneberrv summed up M3's significant impact on his fitness journey in this heartfelt way: "Sometimes your body gets hurt and you are lost and disheartened trying to find your way back to where you once were. You lose strength, flexibility, aerobic capability and most of all hope. I know this too well as I found myself on crutches, hurting to get out of bed, and afraid the pain would never go away. I had to give up my regular fitness classes because I could not keep up. I realized I needed someone specially trained to help me restore my physical self and more importantly, my hope. M3 helped me give me back what I could not get on my own. I am even back to my spin classes! My neurologist at Johns Hopkins saw my progress since I started with M3 and remarked, 'Whatever you do, don't lose that girl!""

BONEFISH BONNIES 25TH ANNIVERSARY FUN FACTS

In 2003 Adelaide Skoglund and Patty Jacobson organized the Bonnies' first Flats Tournament. Something unexpected happened. The team with the most points scored those points on fish not usually targeted in a Flats Tournament while anglers who caught bonefish and permit and snook didn't catch enough to be in the running.

What to do about that? The next year, 2004, Adelaide and Patty added the first No Rules Tournament to the group's schedule. It didn't have rules so much as "guidelines". Anglers were allowed to use the rod of their choice and fish any of the habitats in the waters surrounding Ocean Reef and Anglers Club.

Fast forward to 2021. Over the years the Bonefish Bonnies board had added enough "guidelines" to the No Rules Tournament that members were questioning the relevance of the name. With that in mind and in recognition that the ethics of fishing and the approach to conservation had changed over the past 17 years, the Bonefish Bonnies board changed the name of the tournament to Fishin' Funatics and set new rules in place to guide it. The board also put the emphasis of the tournament on FUN. And, that's what it is today, two days of fishing, fun and friendship.



Strategic Serving in Tennis

The serve is probably the most important shot in tennis, why? It represents statistically at least 50% of your tennis game. It is very important to serve consistent, and depending on your level of tennis, knowing exactly where to place it.

There are three types of serves in tennis; the flat serve, kick serve, and slice serve. It is important to choose which serve you want to utilize against your opponent depending on the situation. Here are two tips for serving in general:

1. When serving you must have

a continental grip, or hammer grip, because you want to be able to control the ball placement and also the contact point. If you manage to learn to serve with a continental grip you have more options later on. A great way to master the continental grip for your serve is by standing at the back fence. Begin by mimicking your serve halfway, starting with your racket behind your back and tossing the ball high, then catching it. While catching the ball high and with your arm extended, focus on pronating your wrist. Repeat this process until you feel confident, ensuring you successfully catch the ball at least ten times in a row. Afterward, move to the baseline and start by practicing the first half of the serve with your racket behind your back before progressing to the full serve. This will help you improve your serve direction and consistency.

2. When serving a second serve, make sure you have a continental grip and utilize the kick serve. This

serve is a defensive and aggressive serve where you guarantee your serve to be in. A good kick serve is when the ball bounces the serve box and hits the back fence. The kick serve bounce is very high and uncomfortable to return, putting you in a great advantage. Mastering the kick serve begins with adopting a continental grip. Start by positioning the racket behind your back and toss the ball slightly behind you. As the ball drops, execute a brushing motion from left to right (for right-handed players), generating a rainbowlike trajectory from the baseline to the service box. After brushing the ball successfully, focus on relaxing your wrist to increase the brushing speed, thus spinning the ball in place with reduced velocity toward the service box.

Once you've achieved this technique, engage your legs to propel yourself forward, generating momentum. This approach ensures a reliable second serve and positions you to take an aggressive stance while approaching the ball.

Overall, by practicing these two types of serves, you will have a huge advantage in your tennis game. The third type of serve is called slicing which could also be used as a strategic second serve, but it's more used for high level competitive players, displacing the opponent outside of the court.

Mastering the serve variations, from the continental grip to the kick and slicing techniques, elevates your tennis game, offering precision, strategic advantages, and a significant competitive edge.



SWING TIP OF THE WEEK

Uphill Lie Shots Around the Green



by Brad Pinho, Golf Teaching Professional & Club Fitter

Florida is widely recognized for its predominantly flat terrain, but some golf architects have incorporated elevated greens, known as crowned greens, to add challenge. Crowned greens, also referred to as domed or turtleback greens, feature a central high point with the surface sloping down towards the edges. The Florida landscape often leads to uphill lie chip shots, necessitating a specific setup for a confident

swing.

When dealing with an uneven lie, especially an uphill one, it is crucial to follow a twostep approach. First, adjust the ball position by placing it further back in the stance. This compensates for the rising slope, encouraging the club to engage with the ground earlier in the swing arc. Secondly, open the stance by moving the lead foot back, opening the hips towards the target. This alignment is particularly important on an uphill lie, as it helps the shoulders align with the slope. Although this may seem complicated, executing these steps correctly can prove highly effective and efficient.

I welcome your feedback as you integrate this method into your game. Feel free to ask for additional recommendations or tips for future content. I trust that this information proves beneficial to your golfing endeavors!







BRIDGE TIP OF THE WEEK

Rules for Opener in Bridge

by Gregg Van Dyke, Director of Card & Games

Rules for Opener (the first player to make a bid other than Pass)

Your first bid: Always open the bidding at the 1-level if you have 13-20 pts. You can open a hand of 11-12 pts. if you have a long suit, distributional strength and/or good quick tricks.

The meanings of your opening bids are:

- 1H or 1S = 13-21 pts. and at least 5 cards in your suit.
- 1NT = Exactly 15-17 pts. and balanced distribution (at least 2-3 cards in every suit). The old-style Goren system specifies 16-18 pts. for a 1NT

opener, but 15-17 is so widely used now that most learners adopt this range.

- 1C or 1D = 13-21 pts. and at least 3 cards in your suit. A 1C or 1D opening is often called a "convenient minor" -- it tells partner you have opening count, but your hand doesn't meet the requirements for 1H, 1S or 1NT. Choose your *longer* minor. If you have two 3-card minors, open 1C to keep the bidding low.
- 2NT = Exactly 20-21 pts. and balanced distribution. (If your 1NT is 16-18 pts., your 2NT range should be 21-22 pts.).
- 2C= A very strong hand (21+ pts.) and a long suit (5+ cards).
- 2D, 2H, 2S = 5-11 HCP (High Card Points) and a 6 card suit. Called a Weak Two Bid
- 3 of a suit = A weak hand (5-9 pts.) with a long, strong

suit (7 cards).

If you have two 5-card suits, open the *bigher-ranking* suit, then rebid the lower-ranking suit (if you have 5 clubs and 5 diamonds, open 1D and bid clubs at your next turn). This allows partner to choose between your two suits without raising the level of the bidding.

Your second bid (after partner responds to your opening bid):

- A new suit (1C-1H-1S)
 -- At least 4 cards in the suit,
 13+ pts.
- Simple rebid of your first suit (1C-1H-2C) -- Extra length (usually a 6+ cards) and a minimum opener (12-16 pts.). To show a stronger hand with a long suit, you can jumprebid your suit -- 1C-1H-3C. (17-18 pts)
- Single raise of partner's suit (1C-1H-2H) -- 4 cards in the suit partner responded and a minimum opener (12-16 pts).

To show a stronger hand with a fit for partner, you can jumpraise his suit -- 1C-1H-3H (17-18 pts) or 4H (19-20) pts.

• Notrump (1C-1H-1NT)
-- A balanced minimum opener (12-14 pts.) WITHOUT 4
cards in partner's suit and without a new 4-card suit you could bid at the 1-level.
To show a stronger balanced hand, you can open 1NT (with 15-17 pts.). To show a very strong balanced hand (18-19 pts.), open a suit bid and then jump in notrump -- 1C-1H-2NT.

As Opener, if you have fewer than 16 pts., DON'T go to the 2-level unless you're:

- 1. Raising partner's suit (to confirm a trump fit); or
- 2. Rebidding your own extralong suit; or
- 3. Showing a 2nd suit of lower rank than your first suit (1D-1S-2C).




