### **Bidding Farewell to 2023** Headlines from The Reef

As we close out another year and prepare to welcome 2024, we took a look back at some of the Ocean Reef Press headlines that best represent 2023 – a year that celebrated history, tradition, and a commitment to enhancing the Member experience.

#### The Journey From Ocean Reef to the White House January 6

There was great cause for celebration to start of the new year! Teresa Holmes and Buddy Menn, Club Members and Directors of the Everglades Protection Alliance, announced an Ocean Reef community win for the environment and the Homestead Air Reserve Base (HARB). After two years of intense lobbying with county, state, and federal officials, numerous helicopter tours over the sensitive ecosystem a mere mile and a half from the already endangered waters of Biscayne Bay, and an unforgettable trip to Washington DC, the following defense authorization bill was signed into law on December 23, 2022: SEC. 2874. PROHIBITION ON JOINT USE OF HOMESTEAD AIR RESERVE BASE WITH CIVIL AVIATION. On or before September 30, 2026, the Secretary of the Air Force may not enter into an agreement that would provide for or permit the joint use of Homestead Air Reserve Base, Homestead, Florida, by the Air Force and civil aircraft. **Continued On** | 4

### **Gotta Question?**

How can I get my prescriptions without leaving Ocean Reef?

There are a couple extremely convenient ways Members can get their prescriptions without having to leave Ocean Reef.

The first, the Prescription Delivery Program, has been in place for almost 20 years and is administered by the Medical Center and Public Safety. Every Monday through Friday throughout season, a Public Safety officer travels to CVS, Publix and Walgreens to collect the prescriptions of Members in the program. After the prescriptions are brought back to Ocean Reef, they are logged in a system and Members will receive a call the next day to let them know their prescription is ready for pick-up at Public Safety. Prescriptions not picked up within three or four days are transferred to the front desk at the Medical Center where they can be picked up during regular business hours. The number for the Prescription Delivery Service is 305-367-3401.

The second way to get your prescriptions without having to drive into Key Largo or Homestead is by using the Pharmacy at The Reef. Located on the first floor of the Plaza



Building, Pharmacy at The Reef offers Members an on-property location where they can pick up and drop off prescriptions. The pharmacy also offers over-thecounter as well as compounded medication and provides various other professional pharmaceutical care. The pharmacy team has worked hard to ensure they are on the insurance plans most commonly serving The Reef. The Medical Center can select this pharmacy just like they would any other and send the e-prescription down the street versus to Key Largo. Pharmacy at The Reef is open Mondays through Fridays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., closed Sunday. For the Holiday weekend, they will be closed on Saturday, Dec. 31 and Monday, Jan. 1. Their phone number is 305-780-7136.

#### Ocean Reef Club Forges 2nd Partnership with Coral Restoration Foundation January 20

In 2015, the Club committed to a groundbreaking five-year collaboration with CRF to bring Carysfort Reef, one of the world's most iconic reefs that lies just five miles from Ocean Reef's shore, back to life. Called "Carysfort 2020", the goal was to outplant 30,000 corals at Carysfort Reef over the span of five years. By 2020's end the goal was exceeded with 35,108 corals being outplanted, effectively saving Carysfort Reef from extinction. Recognizing how important it is to Club Members to preserve and enhance the environment for many future generations to enjoy is why the Club partnered with CRF back in 2015, and coupled with the tremendous success, why the Club Board agreed to do so again.

### 50 Years of Member-Guest Tennis January 27

2023 marked some significant Ocean Reef Club milestones - namely reaching 75 years as a Club and 30 as Memberowned. Additionally, one of Ocean Reef Club's oldest and fondest traditions, the Member-Guest Tennis Tournament, also celebrated a historic 50th anniversary. Tennis has been a notable thread in the fabric of the Ocean Reef Community ever since the first court was built in 1955, and for the past 50 years, the Member-Guest Tennis Tournament has been the Tennis season highlight. Founded in 1973 by Bob Ecuyer, Ocean Reef Club's Director of Tennis at the time, and the late **Dick Garbisch**, the Member-Guest Tennis Tournament continues to be a great success.





### Bob Toski Ocean Reef's First Director of Golf February 3

Bob Toski's love affair with Ocean Reef has not wavered as evidenced by his visit to Ocean Reef this past February. It is an annual trip the now 96-yearold Toski makes, arranged by long-time friend **Lida Tingley.** (Mrs. Tingley started her Ocean Reef journey as the Golf Hostess in the 1960s and now enjoys the Club as a Member).

While here, Mr. Toski sat for brunch at the Grill Room, caught up with Sonny Vasquez (who also worked here during his tenure) and Mike Leone, visited Card Sound Golf Club and the staff, and then ventured over to the Ocean Reef Museum. It is at the Museum where Mr. Toski beamed with pride and perhaps some astonishment saying, "It is wonderful to live long enough to see yourself in a museum."

Replicated in 2023 with "Rock the Block Parties" throughout the community, they brought neighbors together in celebration of the anniversary much like was done 30 years before.

### All Charities Does It Again ("Thank You, Ocean Reef!") March 31

It was another record year for All Charities resulting in the largest distribution to date to each of the not-for-profit recipient partners at Ocean Reef [Medical Center, Cultural Center, Academy, Art League, ORCAT and Conservation Association]. Each fall we converge on Ocean Reef from every direction. The most pleasant trip south might be by boat. Steve said, "Off-airport landings are more memorable. Once we landed next to an outbuilding in western Nebraska. The owner moseyed over and said 'Welcome to the Parker Ranch,' a pure coincidence. He called his wife a said, 'A helicopter just landed next to the birthing barn.' They invited us in. We have stayed in touch for years."

The Parkers first came to Ocean Reef for a medical conference in 1994. Steve said, "As we drove in, Maggie said, 'I could live here.' Fateful words. We joined the same day we came to look." By a stroke of luck, Steve met Lenny Sikora (who expertly arranges the aviation part of Vintage Weekend). Lenny took the Parkers to Marathon by helicopter for lunch. "How cool is that?" Steve enthused. "It's the best way to see the Keys." He learned that Sikora flew all the way to Wisconsin each year. Before long, Steve became a licensed pilot with a helicopter of his own, and started thinking about a cross-country jaunt. After upgrading to a Bell 505 high altitude five-seater, they have followed their whims every year since 2011.

New to this year's itinerary was Apalachicola (the real Old





### Nathan Hammond's Pyrotechnic Airshow How Does He Do It?!

Those of you who attended the Friday Night Airshow at Buccaneer Island during the last Vintage Weekend had the pleasure of witnessing an amazing performance and grand finale by Nathan Hammond of GhostWriters Airshows. I think you will agree his aerobatic display, along with the amazing pyrotechnics involved, was over the top.

Since the airshow, I have been asked by many people here how he does it. Some even suggested he must use a cigarette lighter to light the fireworks in his cockpit and throw them out the window. I assured them that he didn't do that but then it got me thinking, how does he do that? I contacted Nathan several days ago and he was happy to share exactly how it's done. He also sent a few pictures of his set-up to help explain this marvelous feat of engineering.

### From the GhostWriter:

"We use two types of pyro during the performance; Gerbs (wrapped in blue

tape), the silver sparks that trail behind the airplane, and Comets (the black multi-tube racks) which shoot colored shells away from the airplane. Both products were originally designed and used for indoor theatre because of their 'close proximity' and 'cold burn' qualities. We chose them because of the small aerodynamic profile.

Both products ignite electronically with a device similarly used in model rockets. The individual products are loaded and wired to a specific circuit on a

telephone distribution block that correlates to a switch position inside the cockpit.

Once loaded and wired, we install the pyro mounts on the wingtips and electrically bond the mounts to the aircraft prior to takeoff. In total, it requires 8 hours of preparation.

When cleared into the aerobatic area by airshow control, the system is armed inside the cockpit, and circuit one is triggered at a predetermined location. From then on, it's the best rollercoaster you can imagine! I'll cycle through all 15 circuits, roughly 200 lbs. of pyro, in the next 4 minutes all while flying aerobatics above the water.

Thanks again to the Committee for hosting an incredible weekend! Everyone at the Club made us feel welcomed and appreciated. I can honestly say Vintage Weekend was the highlight of our year."

Well, there you have it! A huge thank you to ORC Member **David Stallings** for making it possible for Nathan to attend this year's Vintage Weekend.

### Canine Respiratory Illness

In recent weeks, a mysterious respiratory illness has been on the rise among canines, spreading concern across the country, including Florida. While exhibiting symptoms similar to common respiratory infections, such as coughing, sneezing, nasal/eye discharge, and lethargy, this unidentified illness in dogs has raised alarms due to prolonged clinical signs and an increased risk of pneumonia development.

Amidst concerns about this respiratory illness circulating among dogs, residents are kindly reminded to adhere to leash rules within common areas of the community. Keeping your dog on a leash not only safeguards their well-being but also allows owners to control interactions, minimizing the risk of potential exposure to illnesses in shared spaces. Unleashed dogs may cause discomfort or anxiety to others, and it is essential to be mindful of this. Additionally, never leave dogs unattended in yards or common spaces, as it poses risks both to the pet and the community. Responsible pet ownership contributes to a harmonious living environment, fostering a sense of community and consideration for one another.

### **Giving Hope**

Two stories – worlds apart in space and time. Each in its own way a picture of giving hope.

The first is about a site in Jerusalem we visit on each of our trips to Israel. That site is Yad Vashem – the Holocaust Museum. Through media and exhibits, it tells the horrendous story of the murder of six million Jews and others, at the hands of the Third Reich during World War II. Architecturally, the building moves you from light through darkness and back into light.

Outside, on the grounds of the museum, there is a street telling the stories of people who gave hope, often at the cost of their lives. That street is the tree-lined Avenue of the Righteous Among the Nations. It was dedicated on Holocaust Remembrance Day in 1962.

At the dedication, Golda Meir said, "The Jewish people remember not only the villains but also every small detail of the rescue attempts." She compared the Righteous Among the Nations to "drops of love in an ocean of poison," saying their acts rescued not only the lives of Jews but saved hope and faith in the human spirit.

Each tree on that street honors the memory of some non-Jewish person who gave hope by rescuing Jews during seemingly hopeless times. Trees continue to be added and dedicated as more stories become known.

There are well-known names there, like Oscar Schindler, the courageous businessman whose story was captured in Steven Spielberg's movie "Schindler's List." Another tree honors Corrie Ten Boom, a Christian from Haarlem in the Netherlands, whom we were privileged to know. Her story was told in the movie "The Hiding Place."

Yet there are many names whose stories of giving hope may never be known in this life. One thought haunts me. It is wondering if in similar circumstances, I could find the hope to give hope as they did. One never knows.

The second story is not as outwardly dramatic but is equally a powerful story of giving hope.

In case you haven't noticed, let me state the obvious. Our world today is a mess. The Southern border is in crisis. China is a confrontational superpower. Supporting Ukraine is said to be the only way to block Russian expansionism. War is raging in Gaza. Environmental activists propose solving a climate crisis with a costly green revolution. Democrats and Republicans agree on little save that the other side is the problem. Racism is the new original sin. Personal pronouns seem more important than personal responsibility. Our national debt is ballooning. The present forecast for the 2024 presidential election is for a re-run of 2020...etc.

What happens to hope in a time like this? If you're like me, it easily gets buried under a mountain of concern and fear, often expressed as anger. In the Gospel, Jesus described the impact of times like these saying, "When wickedness increases, love grows cold." Hope doesn't flourish in cold hearts.

Some of us are prone to 'pontification.' The thesaurus

describes a pontificator as someone who likes to 'hold forth' or 'sound off.' Pontificators tend to generate lots of heat and very little light. The heat often manifests itself in disdain toward or conflict with those who hold differing opinions. Pontificators don't seem to be concerned with giving hope – only making their opinion heard on matters they are powerless to change.

However, individual acts of giving hope can transform the lives of others - even in a world that's a mess.

During December, a friend of mine quietly sits near the checkout line of a well-known retailer. This friend is watching for an individual or family whose shopping cart suggests their Christmas could use an infusion of hope.

As their turn comes to make their purchase, this friend quietly approaches and says, "I'd like to buy this for you as a gift of Christmas." Families must leave the store shaking their heads in disbelief. Pretty quickly, all the checkout personnel are waiting to see who's going to be the next recipient of hope! They have no idea who this person is, but even their lives are impacted by those acts of giving hope.

On this last Friday of December in 2023, could I encourage us to make one resolution as we move into 2024? Let's choose to be people who give hope. Giving hope is perhaps the most important thing we can do with our lives.

Like many of those trees at Yad Vashem, or these quiet acts of my friend, each of us can be someone who gives hope to another person through generous acts of kindness and care.

And when you give hope, you find hope! So let's make it a hope-filled New Year, even in a world that's a mess! That's when giving hope means even more!



### Take Back Your Time in 2024

A surefire way to get a chatty friend off the phone when you're calling from The Reef is to tell them you've got a ton of errands to run: Pick up your alterations, make a return, get a flu shot, stop by the bank, and stock up on groceries.

You'll likely hang up feeling a little guilty because our unique way of life is filled with conveniences.

If taking back your time is on your list of New Year's resolutions, The Reef is one of the easiest places to cross multiple things off your to-do list in 60 minutes or less.

#### **12 Errands in an Hour**

By grouping your errands geographically and at the right time of day, you can complete as many as a dozen errands in an hour.

At 10:20 a.m. one morning, we carted over to the Gift Shop for a copy of the *New York Times*, then walked to the Inn's front desk to print out a document, grabbed a cup of coffee, and then over to Cart Rental to make a future reservation. Four errands, one stop.

We got back into our golf cart and headed to the Business Center where we dropped by the Membership Office and then over to the bank for a notary (we called ahead of time, so there was virtually no wait). Two more done.

We then drove over to the Plaza Building to pick up some insurance papers and mail off our packages (taped with pre-printed labels to save time/money). Another two off the list.

Then over to the Fishing Village. We dropped off our dry cleaning, bought milk and bananas at Wynn's, picked a birthday gift at the Burgee Shop, ordered lunch to go from Reef Hut on our cell and picked up our order. With the final four errands done, were back at our desk at 11:20 a.m.

So, if you don't like marathon errand runs, but you do like saving time, what can you do?

#### **Avoid Popular Times:**

If you've ever craved a burrito from Wynn's at 12:30 p.m. on a weekday, bag the idea unless you don't mind standing in a long lunch line. Any place that is frequented by members, guests, associates, *and* contractors alike, such as the market or a bank on property, should be avoided between noon and 2 p.m. or on pay days (typically Fridays).

#### Place Orders at the Right Time:

In general, the shortest wait for a take-out meal is to place the order as soon as the outlet opens or after its busiest period ends. So, for lunch at Palm Court, it's best to place an order to go at 11:30 a.m. or after 2:30 p.m. For dinner at The Islander, call in your take-out order at 5:30 p.m. or after 8:30 p.m. Also, you can save time waiting by picking up the order rather than wait on a Bell Stand delivery. For those who like to lunch leisurely, it's best to schedule sit-in lunch dates during the first part of the week as lunch picks up Thursdays through Sundays during season.

### Pre-Register at MCOR and Pharmacy Pick Ups

Having a Medical Center on property means Reefers save a lot of time. The key is to be sure you've registered as a patient ahead of time (this means you've filled out your patient and privacy forms and had your insurance and ID scanned in person) and avoid busy times. Monday and Friday mornings are typically the busiest. When it comes to getting vaccines, unless it's the Covid vaccine that needs an observation period, most of the time you should be in and out in 10 to 15 minutes. Walk-ins typically wait about 10 minutes to see a provider. A typical appointment from start to finish

takes 30 minutes. Requesting your prescription be filled out at The Pharmacy on property is another perk of life on The Reef. But also keep in mind that Public Safety picks up Member prescriptions Monday through Friday from Walgreens, Publix, and CVS. Just make sure to tell your pharmacy to add you to the Ocean Reef pick up service.

#### Get Breakfast Late, Ice Cream Early:

For those who like sleeping in, but hate missing breakfast, Reef Treats has a new solution. Breakfast is now served until 3 p.m. (with expanded menu specials on the weekends). The best time to pick up breakfast is between 7 a.m. and 8 a.m. or after noon. It's busiest from 9 a.m. to noon. Call a day or two ahead to place large breakfast orders.

Ice cream lovers who want to avoid long lines should stop by between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. It's busiest from 8 p.m. to 9 p.m. weekdays and 8 p.m. to 10 p.m. weekends. Popular flavors, such as peanut-butter fudge, rum raisin, moose tracks, and expresso chip that disappeared during Covid are now back in stock so we expect lines through the season.

#### **Schedule Quick Spa Services**

At The Spa, time savers can get a Healthy Glow Express Facial in 25 minutes, a 25- minute Focus Massage, where your therapist focuses on a single area, or a Buff, Polish & Go (formerly called the express manicure) in 15 to 20 minutes.

#### Work Out During Off Hours:

Schedule your workout during the quietest times at the gym. The slowest periods at the Member Fitness Center are between 6 a.m. and 7 a.m. weekdays, noon to 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. to 5 p.m. Personal training can be made for 30-minute sessions or if you just need help with getting a good stretch, you can schedule a 15-minute session called Assisted Stretch. The Marina Fitness Center is also open 24 hours a day.



### **ORP Through the Years** 2017: Hurricane Irma

While there were 33 editions of the Ocean Reef Press in 2017, those that followed the September 10 hurricane were by far the most profound. Following are excerpts and photos from an array of Ocean Reef Press articles that appeared in October and November of 2017 highlighting resilience, along with a support and love for Ocean Reef Club and everything it stands for.

### October 6, 2017 Associate Town Hall

The first ever "Associate Town Hall Meeting" was called in an effort to ensure that in the wake of Irma, all Associates felt comforted and appreciated, welcomed and needed. At the opening of the Meeting, Leemhuis recognized the handful that stayed through the hurricane, those that cooked and fed the first responders (and continued to cook 1,500 meals a day), those that came in immediately to begin cleaning and clearing, and those that worked on IT and Communications to keep everyone in touch. He also thanked those that stayed home. Those that wanted to help but were told until conditions were better, there was no way to help.

When photos taken immediately following the storm were shown there were gasps, and then when the progress photos came up, there were oohs and aahs, and hope was breathed back into the room. The most incredible message to this room full of Associates was that their Club's Members cared for them. Evidenced by the Board's decision to continue paying all Associates while the Club is closed, evidenced by the hundreds of emails and calls of support from the Membership, and evidenced

Micah describes it as "fresh, simple and a little drier than most Prosecco's that are often found on grocery store shelves." .... The wine cellar at my house (aka a kitchen cupboard) was depleted at Christmas and desperately needed a "stock-up" for 2024, so I asked Micah to suggest a white and a red wine that are in my price range. His suggestions -WHITE: ColleMassari Melacce **Vermentino** (\$20). "A crisp and

refreshing white from Italy similar to Pinot Grigio with flavors of white peach and citrus fruits." RED: The Paring red (\$26) is a Cabernet-inspired blend with classic notes of cassis, tobacco and chocolate..... That sounds sinfully delicious to me.

... LAST WORD: Why should we listen to Micah?.... Micah Winecoff (yes, that's his real last name) is Port O' Call/Wine & Spirits Education Manager. Micah is planning to sit for the Master Sommelier Exam in April, the highest level of achievement in the wine world. (At last count, there were only 230 contenders who earned that honor) .... # A Sense of Order

When I noticed the 200 or so birds perched on the communication tower wires behind the Ocean Reef Club Airport my first thought was that this was an interesting photo opportunity. I went closer to get a better view. As I watched the flock was behaving in a complex manner that I was not expecting.

When one bird would fly off the wire or a new one would arrive the others would move almost in union to restore the original spacing between each other back to approximately

the same as before the new arrival. There was no chirping or fussing. The birds were creating a space or closing of a gap to return things to some semblance of order. Lots of bird species live or migrate in flocks. Not many species keep everything synced like these Starlings were doing. I also realized that despite seeing these birds all of my life I had never once taken a photo of one, treating them more like the grass or trees, a disservice really. Curious, I decided to do some in depth reading on this invasive species from Europe, the European or Common Starling.

The story goes that about 100 Starlings were brought from England to the US and released in New York's Central Park around 1890. They quickly adapted and today they are one of, if not the most, successful bird species to be introduced into North America with estimates that run as high as 200 million birds now scattered across the continent. They are more despised than loved due to the damage they can cause when flocks numbering in the thousands decide to visit property or cropland for a roosting or nesting conclave or just to hang out for dinner

and make an incredible racket. This is not great if it's your property or crops they are visiting.

Love them or not they are here to stay. One positive aspect of their behavior is their sense of order both when perched and when flying. Watch for a large cloud of birds moving quickly turning in a tightly bunched formation at high speed all the while maintaining separation between each other. We can see that behavior with our relatively small flocks here at The Reef when they make a swinging flash into a tree. There is a name for when thousands of them get together and put on one of their incredible aerobatic shows. It is called a murmuration and is a beautiful display of nature's creature's abilities. For some amazing videos on these birds' flying abilities check out Starling murmurations on the web.




This adventure also took the Loves on a land expedition, where they were fortunate to visit to the Hwange National Park in Zimbabwe. This Park is committed to preserving



# **TPI Tip of the Week** Week 1: Pre-Round Warmup and Body Activation

#### By Ryan Lawless, Fitness Specialist

How many pro golfers show up on the first tee and can perform at their peak? The answer is none... unless your name is John Daly. My point is that the body needs to be sufficiently mobile and "warmed up" before we even think about performing an explosive movement like a full golf swing. Think about it, especially if you are consistently sore/ hurt from playing, what are you doing to ensure your body is ready for such a fast, athletic movement?

If you want to play more

like a professional golfer, the first thing you should do is prepare your body the same way they do before playing. Behind the scenes, every professional golfer has an activation routine before heading to the range and upon arriving at the range. To be reasonable, it is beyond expectations for amateur golfers to take these kinds of measures when golf already takes up a large chunk of your day. The solution is to make the most of your time preparing in the 15-30 minutes before tee time. Take control of your golf game, your health and extend your playing capabilities by developing a foundational warm-up for all your future golf rounds. Try some or all of these exercises before your next round (8-10x each).






Standing Figure 4s: using your golf cart for support, stand with one foot placed on the opposite knee and sit into the stretch adding pressure to keep the floating knee





Hip Twisters: using your golf club or cart for upper quarter stability, rotate the hips fully in down to the backswing and downswing motions, perform slowly and fully before picking up the speed to swing tempo.

# TPI Tip of the Week

Torso Turns: place club on top of shoulder/ across upper back, turn the chest fully into the backswing and downswing motions. Add a lead step to this movement to gather a feel for shifting pressure and momentum into the swing.





Standing Arrows: standing in golf posture with arms hanging low and hands together, slide/ pull arm up and back while rotating into the backswing then downswing position. Take note of your shift in pressure from right to left and the full rotation of the torso when performing.





Split Stance Torso Turns: in a split stance with one leg forward and the other dropped back with the heel raised, extend arms holding the club out in front of the chest and rotate out side to side while maintaining stability in the lower half. 

#### LGA T's & F's







# Bridge Tip of the Week Passive Opening Leads

By Gregg Van Dyke, Director of Card & Games

In other situations, you'll want to be more patient and make declarer work for all his tricks. Your goal on these hands is to make a safe opening lead that won't give declarer a "cheap" or undeserved trick.

A safe lead may also be an attacking combination -such as a suit headed by AK, KQJ or QJ10 -- and these are usually good choices for a lead to any contract. If you aren't dealt these easy holdings, you'll sometimes have to select a passive lead. Passive leads include:

• A lead from a topless suit (such as 8762), especially one in which you don't expect partner to hold an honor.

When in doubt, lead through strength by choosing a suit dummy (rather than declarer) has bid.

• A lead from length -- such as fourth best from Q9653 or K87432. Even though underleading an honor is standard to a notrump contract, it can be risky against a suit contract. Length, however, gives you a margin of safety. The longer your suit, the less likely it will be that declarer needs to develop his own tricks in that suit.

• A trump, in some cases.

How do you know when a passive lead is your best choice? Here are some of the contracts and types of auctions that call for a safe, non-attacking opening lead: **The opponents are in 6NT or a grand slam.** 

An exception is if the opponents bid 6NT after an auction that suggests that their main source of tricks will be a long suit. In this



case, you may want to make an aggressive opening lead (away from an honor) to try to set up a trick you can cash if you get the lead later.

#### The auction tells you that declarer has a strong hand and dummy (and/or partner) will be very weak.

Suppose your RHO opens 2NT (20-22 pts.) and LHO raises to 3NT. What's your lead from ♠986 ♥AQ62 ♦ KQ43♣ Q6 ?

If you follow the "fourth from longest and strongest" rule, you'd choose the ♥2 or the ♦ 3. But with almost all the outstanding honors on your right, either of these leads has a high risk of giving declarer a gift. Partner can't hold more than 2-3 high-card points, so it's not a good idea to count on him for help in a specific suit.

A more attractive choice is a passive \$9. This is unlikely to set up tricks for your side, but it probably won't help declarer. You'll be on lead again soon, and if your spade lead was indeed safe, you should consider continuing the suit. If a switch is necessary, you'll have a better idea of which suit to choose later.

Note that you should not lead a diamond honor. A diamond will probably be right only when partner has the  $\blacklozenge$  J (or the unlikely  $\blacklozenge$ A), so if you do choose a diamond lead, it's better to lead low (the  $\blacklozenge$  3). If partner has no honors (declarer and dummy have any combination of the ( $\blacktriangleleft$ A, J, 10 and 9), leading the  $\blacklozenge$  K will give declarer three eventual tricks. If you instead lead low, declarer can't take more than two tricks in the suit.

#### You're defending a suit contract where the opponents are fairly balanced.

On these hands, declarer will usually have to play the side suits himself, so it's best to sit back and wait for your tricks. Suppose you're on lead as South holding  $\clubsuit$ Q74  $\forall$  5  $\blacklozenge$ 108432) Club) KJ64 after this auction: West East 1H 2NT\* 4H \*(Jacoby 2NT, forcing heart raise) The opponents have shown game-level strength and

game-level strength and their hands rate to be semibalanced. Opener's 4H rebid showed a minimum with no singleton, and responder might have chosen a different way to raise hearts if he had a very distributional hand. You expect that declarer will have to lead the side suits himself, so you want to avoid leading any suit that will make it easier for him to find missing honors.

The singleton trump is probably the most dangerous lead (partners always seem to hold ♥Qxx). It's also risky to lead away from your club or spade honors. That leaves your "nothing" suit -diamonds -- so try the ◆3.
