

Gotta Question?

At Ocean Reef, is it appropriate for bikers to ride against traffic or with traffic?

The rules of the road for cyclists, as established by Florida Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (FLHSMV), says that cyclists should ride in the same direction as traffic and stay as far to the right as possible, using bike lanes whenever available. This too goes for Ocean Reef, whether riding in the car lane or golf cart lane.

Bicyclists should also obey all traffic laws, including signs, signals and lane markings, when riding on the roadway.

Additional guidelines provided by FLHSMV apply to those driving a car or golf cart:

• Drivers must give bicyclists a minimum of three feet of clearance when driving



alongside or passing them.

• When turning, yield to any bicyclist in the car or cart lane and make your turn behind the cyclist.

• Avoid using high beam headlights when you see a bicyclist approaching.

• Before opening a car door, check for bicyclists who may be approaching from behind.





Faces of Safety: Getting to Know Ariel Artime

Get to know Ariel Artime, Vice President and Director of ORCA Public Safety and Operations! His extensive background in law enforcement as Division Chief of the Miami-Dade Police Department, and his in-depth understanding of our community gained through nearly two years as ORCA Director of Operations brings unparalleled expertise to our community.







marriage. Alas, I am neither young nor handsome, and sadly, Cat endures the most devastating food allergies that render dinners decidedly unromantic. "My problems began more than three years ago when I contracted Lyme disease and the Epstein-Barr virus. This created a cascade of food allergies. I can't drink alcohol, so the fun begins with sparkling water," Cat says." It is usually pointless to study the menu because it's impossible to know all the ingredients that are used." She enjoys dinner with family and friends for the company but rarely enjoys any food. "I bring my paper that lists my food allergies. I end up getting a piece of lettuce and some fruit, or a little kid's lunch box. Ingredients instead of a meal. It's depressing at Ocean Reef when everyone else is enjoying a fantastic dinner."

Then came Christmas at CH Prime. "It was my first time at CH Prime. Christmas dinner with my family, how wonderful. I sent my little paper to the kitchen and Chef Ian came out to meet my family." "How can we make this special for you?" lan asked. Cat opened her purse and pulled out a flashfrozen steak. She smiled at lan's surprise. Cat is also histamine intolerant. Flash-freezing meat or fish limits the development of histamines. Ian took it all in stride. He cooked Cat's steak with a bespoke salad. "It was a real meal," Cat enthused. "A perfect steak and a great salad with pistachio maple dressing, filled with things I could eat." Ian came back out and took the time to describe his creation. "He wrote down everything he had used so I could try it at home. It's the best dinner I have had in three years." Cat said. "It made the holidays for the Castellanos family."

It is rare to have such a complicated allergic response. Medical diagnosis to find out which foods might cause you to have an allergic reaction and strictly avoiding those foods are important ways to prevent serious adverse health effects. And, if you plan to propose to Cat, start by making good friends with Chef Ian.



The Ocean Reef Anchor

Ocean Reef's best-known intersection is where the two, busiest avenues, Ocean Reef Drive and Anchor Drive, cross - often described as the "four corners". In any other community, it would be where "Main" and "State" meet. At one corner, essentially hidden by lush tropical plants, is a three-story multi-use building that does house a major national bank that is still hard to find even if you are in its parking lot at the corner. Two other corners sport golf greens and the last corner is simply a pretty green field often occupied by farmers.

The four, ordinary "stop" signs get all the attention as this is where the locals play "chicken," an automobile versus golf cart game that one loses when the surrounding corners are admired for more than a millisecond. Unviewed, but lucky for golf cart safety, amongst the greenery on one corner, as if an afterthought to hide the golf green behind it, is the "four corners" only real, community monument, The Ocean Reef Anchor, deserving attention but which also stands unidentified.

Even this beautiful example of "Admiralty Anchors" forged centuries ago in England should suffice alone as a monument. That The Anchor served faithfully aboard the HMS WINCHESTER, a 60 cannon English sailing battleship protecting English interests in the Bahamas and Carolinas from growing Spanish influence in Florida and Louisiana. The Anchor probably failed 320 years ago to save the already grounded Winchester on Carvsfort Reef in a storm. As a punishment,

The Anchor spent three centuries completely buried near the present Carysfort Lighthouse while the wreck continued to disintegrate and move in subsequent winds and waves to its final resting point, lifeless, rotting and scattering her cannons as she moved some mile and a half to the southwest.

A warning light was needed on this most dangerous reef in the Keys based on the number of groundings. In subsequent construction of a light, Carysfort Reef was found to be a coral "egg shell" over loose sand. This unstable condition was discovered by Lt. George Meade who later became Lincoln's General of the Army of the Potomac on an earlier assignment in charge of building the present Carysfort Lighthouse and discovering that large circular discs were needed to keep the eight "screwed in" legs of the original design from sinking into the lower sand. Congress donated an additional \$20,000 to finish Meade's light in 1852.

It is reasonable that The Anchor we momentarily view as we dash across the four corners did not really fail the Winchester but rather sank below the shell, ripping it up and almost disappeared some fourteen feet below sea level. Measurements of the anchor by Ray Leenhouts and his father determined the anchor weighed, as seen, 5,123 pounds – not including 150 pounds of rust lost and 300 pounds of the wood and iron of the missing "stock" that attached to the square top of the anchor at right angles to cause the anchor flukes to "dig in" and crack through the thin coral shell.

Had the Winchester been just one mile north of her grounding, The Anchor would have held, she would have been saved and discovered Ocean Reef, set up her cannons and we might have to have British visas to visit ourselves, there would be a roundabout featuring the Anchor and "Brexit" to worry about.

An Interesting Announcement, An Old Story, & A Great Hope

For many years, as we all know, one of the major news magazines has announced their choice for the 'person of the year.' It would be interesting to discover the matrix of values that informs their selection. This year's pick was Taylor Swift!

But did you know that Merriam-Webster, the wellknown dictionary company, annually announces their pick for the 'word of the year?' Neither did I until I came across an article today.

Matthew Cantor, writing in "The Guardian: last month reports, "The moment we've all breathlessly waited for is finally here – the announcement of the word of the year!"

I was expecting the writer to report that an arcane group of philologists working in the bowels of the British Museum had chosen some esoteric word no one has ever heard of or could have any reason to care about. Wrong on my part!

Instead, he reports that the decision makers at Merriam-Webster based their choice on a word that had "seen a big jump" in online searches this year. The searches were related to "AI, celebrity culture, identity, and social media."

Open the envelope please! Their word choice – "authentic."

The word was chosen because they believe it "sits at the intersection of what's been on our collective minds." They



suggest these increased clicks are indicative of "our biggest fears."

Significant trends have created an environment of disease and fear they say. "Large language models like ChatGPT and image generators like Dall-E have left us uncertain about what's genuine, from student essays to the pope's fashion choices." Both "online mis- and disinformation, along with armies of bots, have us operating under a different set of facts."

Those issues are factors influencing the environment in which we live. These trends are also influencing how we live our lives in this environment.

Merriam-Webster points out that "authenticity itself has become a performance. In other words, we're getting very good at pretending to be real."

While the technology shaping our world may be new, pretending to be real has been a challenge confronting us ever since Adam and Eve sewed fig leaves in the garden.

This need to be real reminds me of Margery Williams' wonderful children's novel, "The Velveteen Rabbit." It was published just over a century ago, in 1922. The message of the book is worth considering, and not just for children, given the concern the folks at Merriam-Webster have identified.

The story, as you will recall, is about a stuffed rabbit, sewn from velveteen, who was given to a small boy as a Christmas present. Like many of us and our children, the boy was more intrigued by and interested in other presents that were more high-tech and entertaining.

To comfort Rabbit's rejection, his friend Skin Horse, owned by the boy's uncle, tells Rabbit how toys become real. He says, "Real isn't how you are made... It's a thing that happens to you. When a child loves you for a long, long time, not just to play with, but really loves you, then you become real."

Rabbit seems skeptical that he could ever be loved in such

a way that he would become real. Yet in time, through the love of the boy, it happens – he becomes real.

Our world is becoming less certain and increasingly threatening. Not even the gates we live behind can protect us from the intrusion of these significant trends Cantor identifies. Most of us are incapable of effecting a change in those trends.

Yet we can effect change in the one part of the world over which we have influence – ourselves, and how we respond.

One of many benefits of living at Ocean Reef, behind the gates, is the experience of living in a safe place, affording the opportunity of being part of a supportive community.

Many of the external barriers and challenges faced finding community in a major metropolitan area are not factors within the life of the club.

Yet proximity cannot guarantee close relationships, even in a supportive community like Ocean Reef. Perhaps the greatest barrier and challenge we face is within ourselves. The fear of becoming real can be just as daunting as any external threat we face.

Only great love can overcome the fear. Knowing, believing that the God who created you loves you unconditionally is the experience of love that can begin to make you real. Like Rabbit and Skin Horse, you'll need to find friends who know the journey well and can encourage you along the way.

In time, as you learn to trust God's love, you find yourself becoming what you thought you might never actually be – what God made you to be. An authentic individual – a real person!

I wonder what the word will be next year? I wonder, what will the world be like? One thing can be sure, and that is what we can become – more loved and more real! Something to consider.







Please join us in welcoming Neurosurgeon, Robert Thomas Wicks, M.D., who will discuss vascular malformations of the brain. Dr. Wicks is the Director of the Neurosurgical Anatomy Laboratory at Baptist Health Miami Neuroscience Institute. He specializes in neurological surgery, skull base surgery and interventional neuroradiology. Dr. Wicks completed a research year in the Hunterian Neurosurgical Laboratory of Johns Hopkins. During that time his research focused on the local delivery of new chemotherapies for brain tumors and the development of a handheld imaging device for the detailed imaging of brain blood vessels during aneurysm surgery. Dr. Wicks states, "I specialize in cerebral vascular neurosurgery and that is an area of neurosurgery that often times is faced with dealing with some of the most critical problems that include stroke or dealing with brain aneurysm. Within neurosurgery I think the future holds that we may be able to use a patient's own cells or their immune system to prevent stroke, prevent rupture of brain aneurysm and then also offer better treatment with improved recovery."

Bird Enthusiast Brewer Entertains & Enlightens Garden Group

A number of fascinating birds are found in the Florida Keys and many were introduced to the Garden Group at their January meeting when they welcomed ORC's resident bird aficionado, Harold Brewer. His presentation, "Common and A Few Uncommon Birds of Ocean Reef," delighted members with informative commentary and incomparable photos to match. As an added bonus, Brewer was joined by his long-time friend and fellow bird expert Ken Janes, author of "Florida Birds: A Birdwatcher Discovers the Sunshine State." Janes, a retired general surgeon, is Brewer's mentor and they have traveled the world together pursuing their interest in the over 10,000 species of birds.

Brewer suggested that birding is a wonderful hobby for seniors and only really requires curiosity, decent binoculars, and in his case, a phenomenal camera lens. He explained that he has always enjoyed being outdoors and likes the hunting aspect of birding using binoculars and a camera instead of a gun. He does some focused birding two or three times a week and is a regular contributor to eBird. It is a site launched by Cornell University 20+ years ago and it makes an immeasurable wealth of knowledge available to scientists and amateurs in this field. He noted that those interested just need to learn the basics and then can enhance their hobby by keeping a record or journal

of what they are seeing, hearing, and observing. Harold and his wife **Mona** enjoy taking birding trips to seek out specific species and added that the travel is fun because birds live in such great places!

The Garden Group had an opportunity to ask questions and learn more about some of the Keys birds, many of which are spotted around Ocean Reef. Pelicans, ibis, osprey, herons and egrets are joined by anhinga, hawks, owls and turkey vultures. Less commonly seen is the painted bunting, captured by Brewer here at ORC. If you notice the many trees around The Reef with multiple rows of small holes, they have been visited by the yellow-bellied sapsucker, one of the four common species of woodpecker in Florida. An amazing photo that Brewer captured of a mother Kildeer and her chicks in now on display in the hotel lobby.

Janes closed the presentation with amazing photos and information about his latest passion in birding, the hummingbird. Weighing only 2-6 grams with a heart rate of 1200 beats per minute, they can fly forwards, backward, upside down, sideways and hover. With

tiny legs they can't walk or hop so they are in the air almost all the time. They present a particular challenge for experts like Janes to photograph, with wings that beat 80 times per second in a figure-eight pattern. Interestingly, hummingbirds are only found in the Western Hemisphere and only about two dozen species visit the US and Canada. The ruby-throated hummingbird is the only variety commonly found in the eastern US as most species are found in South America. The brilliant color seen in hummingbirds is primarily a reflection of light hitting the bird's iridescent feathers which have a particularly unique structure.







The ORC Early Bird

A unique group of birds leave their Reef nests before the crack of dawn. They hunt for morning caffeine and ocean air to power their wings. Chirping before the sun wakes up, this subspecies of the American Snow Bird is known as The ORC Early Bird.

Feathered in a bright cotton pink blouse with matching pink and blue leggings, Anne "Cookie" Wilson, 83, is one such early riser. When she was in college, she used to set her alarm for 3 a.m. to study because she felt the early hours were the time her brain works best. Not much has changed. She is up no later than 4:30 a.m. daily. Armed with a flashlight and an audiobook on her iPhone, seven days a week, she takes a five-to-six-mile walk around The Reef.

"Everything is so calm in the morning. It's really spiritual," says Wilson, who is in bed by 9 p.m. and avoids napping. She says she also books the first appointments of the day and runs all her

errands early because that's when she feels the most energized.

"It's my ritual and I love it," said Wilson, who grew up the youngest of four siblings, with a sister who always slept until noon.

Morning bird **Colin Caldwell**, 44, said since he was a kid, he always followed what his father, Charlie, did. That meant getting up early.

"I love everything about the mornings. It's my time," he said during a 5:45 a.m. interview at The Inn. "I like to get in my golf cart and drive. I love the wildlife you see. I take out my dogs, check my emails, get in my workout. "

The Early Bird Catches the Urn

Flying solo or in flocks, The ORC Early Bird land predawn at Town Hall or The Inn awaiting the arrival of the first coffee urns. Once their white-paper Burgee cups are filled, some form circles and exchange tales of flights to

faraway places. Most of the time though, they just talk turkey.

From scientists to philosophers, the benefits of being an early bird are well documented.

Accessing more daylight boosts mood, improves sleep, increases focus and alertness. By exercising early, these birds are more likely to stick to their routines, stay in a good mood all day, and are less likely to overeat. These happy-goluckies are also referred to as songbirds or hummingbirds as they cheerfully fly high on morning endorphins.

Bird watchers can find the Early Bird's distant cousins, the snooze-button loving ORC Night Owls, thriving after dark at Watering Holes around The Reef. To keep the family peace, the full flock typically use lunch and cocktail hours as the best time to schedule reunions.

The Early Birds are most proud to be the subject of dozens of famous sayings that have lasted the test of time.

Nineteenth-century economist Richard Whately said, "Lose an hour in the morning, and you will be all day hunting for it."

Modern day motivational speaker Hal Elrod said, "Wake up early every day so that while others are still dreaming, you can make your dreams come true."

SWING TIP OF THE WEEK

Short Game Secrets

By Kalen McDonagh, Teaching Professional

As golfers, we strive for lower scores. Do you struggle with controlling your golf ball around the green? Unsure how to set it up correctly? Understanding the importance of contact - good solid contact will give us repeatable ball flights/feels that can help lower our scores.

What dictates where we make contact with the ground?

Believe it or not, where you position your head at set up will help dictate the low point of your golf swing and control the contact much easier. We struggle with the short game due to inconsistent contact - fat shots, thin shots, etc. All issues were mainly caused by poor setup and head position.

Next time you are at the short game area or faced with a short game shot on the course, follow these simple steps for more success:

- Ball position center
- Head in line with the ballNarrow open stance (left
- foot dropped back for RH

player)

• Swing the club along your shoulder line (do not swing towards the target)

In conclusion, mastering the secrets of the short game is pivotal for any golfer aiming to shave strokes off their scorecard. The key lies not only in the technique of your swing but in the oftenoverlooked details of setup and head position. Achieving good, solid contact is the cornerstone for consistent ball flights and improved scores.



Ten Bonnies (Carolyn Allen, Angela Basciano, Kristina Ersek, Anne Hinkebein, Lynne Jackson, Tina Jones, DeeDee Lisenby, Joyce Neely, Laura Wilson, Jodi Zifferer) and their fearless leader, Bonnies' past president Mona Brewer who put the trip together, hopped on a flight from Miami to Guatemala City last week.

They were off to catch sailfish on fly at Casa Vieja located on Guatemala's

Pacific west coast which is considered to be the #1 billfishing destination in the world. The average size of the Pacific sailfish there is between 80 and 120 pounds.

Casa Vieja has been a leader in billfish conservation efforts having used circle hooks and practicing total release for more than a decade. In fact, Guatemala's national policy makes it illegal to possess a sailfish.

The ten Bonnies, a few of whom had never caught a

sailfish before, fishing three full days, had 378 raises, 305 bites and 183 releases; 44 of them on fly. Add to that total, a tuna and numerous mahi that made for delicious lunches and dinners.

The Guatemala anglers will have the chance to share their fish tales with their fellow Bonnies at the Bonefish Bonnies 25th Anniversary Celebration at the Carysfort Ballroom on **Monday**, Jan. 22nd.





BRIDGE TIP OF THE WEEK

Learning Bridge: Developing Your Card Sense

By Gregg Van Dyke, Director of Card & Games

Read and Deal

Bridge books will teach you how to play card combinations and give you other basic knowledge you need to develop card sense. Reading and practicing don't have to be separate activities, though. Keep a deck of cards with your bridge book and use it to translate the book's diagrammed hands into "real" bridge hands. Deal out the cards to match the example in the book and play it out on a tabletop next to the open book. Replay it as many times as you like until you understand the principle or the technique. This exercise is especially beneficial if you're studying suit combinations or reading a book on declarer play.

Practice Daily

To add continuity to the learning process and keep your brain stimulated, try to spend at least a few minutes with some bridgerelated activity every day. Here are some good practice and study activities that are fun, but not time-consuming:

• Keep a deck of cards handy -- on your desk at work, or on your coffee table or nightstand at home -- and when you have a few minutes (or the boss isn't looking), deal out a practice hand.

• Read the bridge column in the newspaper. Keep in mind that most columnists write for intermediate-level players, so don't be discouraged if some of the bidding and explanations don't make sense. Just use what you know and do your own analysis. Look at the hand diagram and decide what you would bid with each hand, what opening lead you would make, how you would declare or defend the contract, etc.

• Keep your class notes and bridge book accessible. Read a chapter, or even a few pages, during your coffee break, between TV shows, before you go to sleep.

• Bookmark some bridge websites and visit your favorites to see what's new.

• Play a hand or two on your computer. Download the free Learn to Play Bridge programs from ACBL review the lessons and practice hands.

• If your local TV stations are running one of the new bridge programs, tape the weekly show and watch all or part of it whenever it's convenient.

The Play's The Thing.

Experience itself is the best teacher of card sense, so the more time you spend actually playing bridge, the faster you'll develop your abilities. You'll pick up more skills every time you play, especially if you can get some more experienced players to join your game.

Try to keep playing regularly after you've finished your lessons. One option you should consider is a duplicate bridge. Feel free to ask questions after you play or watch a hand; the more experienced players at Ocean Reef will be flattered if you ask for their advice. Although you probably won't win (or even avoid coming in last) the first few times you play, it's a great learning experience.

Try these suggestions to see which works best for you, and use your imagination to identify other learning and practice opportunities. Developing your card sense will take time, but if you're committed enough to put some effort into it, it will come. And with every small step you make, you'll probably find that you enjoy playing bridge even more than before.


