To ensure your number is never duplicated, Member numbers are generated through our Club's Encompass program. While the number itself doesn't indicate Member type, your Membership Card color does say a lot about your Membership. Gold cards indicate Equity Membership, blue cards indicate Social and Social Local Membership, sea foam green cards indicate Legacy Membership, Tower cards indicate Inn guests, and white cards indicate Social Lodging Guests. There

The Club's Newest Acquisition: The Plaza Building

Announced just ahead of the New Year, December 29, 2023 was the Club's official closing date on the purchase of the Plaza Building, the commercial property located at the fourway intersection of Ocean Reef Drive and Anchor Drive.

The Club spent four weeks performing due diligence on the Building to make sure there wouldn't be any surprises. The inspections proved that there were no areas of concern, including that a new roof had been installed in the past few years. Based on this thorough review, the Club does not anticipate any major expenses and has no plans of making



any significant changes to the building at this time.

The Plaza Building has more than 40 tenants with two spaces currently available for lease. For many years, it has been home to shops and services highly valued and frequently used by Members, including UPS, Bank of America, the Pharmacy at the Reef, and more. Marquis Management along with Manager Karina Dominguez will also remain as the management team for the near term.

Questions Answered

Upon announcing the purchase

of the Plaza, Club Chairman Charlie Johnston and President Alex Tonarelli set up a conference line for any Equity Members looking for more information or to ask questions about the purchase. After recapping the purchase process and reasons behind the decision, Charlie opened the floor for questions, all of which were positive.

Johnston and Tonarelli have also since held a well-received Meet & Greet with the tenants of the Plaza Building. Tonarelli said, "We felt it was important for us to not only match faces with names, but

to also share with the tenants that we are excited to own the building, here to support them, and available to answer any questions."

Going forward, Gemma Matthews, the Club's Commercial Property Manager, will work closely with the tenants in the same way that she does the other Club tenants in the Fishing Village and Business Center – liaising between them and the Club and providing the necessary assistance to help them provide the quality services our Members have come to expect.

"In every decision we make, our priority is to serve the needs of our Members," said Johnston. "With the Club's ownership of the Plaza Building, we've now secured the ability to protect and preserve the best interests of the Membership by avoiding all potential for incompatible development. We are excited to now own one of the most frequented buildings on The Reef."

Israeli Ambassador Michael Oren to Visit Ocean Reef Club

It is with great pleasure we welcome former Israeli Ambassador Michael Oren to address our entire Ocean Reef community on January 28, 5 pm at the Ocean Reef Chapel and Fellowship Center.

Ambassador Oren, renowned for his multifaceted career as a statesman, historian, soldier, author, and ambassador, has been a prominent contributor to both

Israeli and international affairs. Born in New York, educated at Princeton and Columbia, and having held professorships at Harvard, Yale, and Georgetown. Oren's academic accolades also include fellowships from the US State Department and the British and Canadian governments. He received four honorary doctorates and holds four degrees in Middle East history.

Ambassador Oren's journey took a significant turn in the 1970s when he moved to Israel and joined the Israel Defense Forces (IDF). Serving as a lone soldier in the paratroopers, he fought in the 1982 Lebanon War and later held the role of army spokesman, achieving the rank of major.

His diplomatic career is marked by pivotal roles, including advisor to Israel's delegation to the UN, former Foreign Minister Abba Evan, and Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin. Notably, in 2009, Oren was appointed Israel's ambassador to the United States, a role in which he interacted with major American institutions over strategic issues like the Iron Dome defense system and the Iran nuclear threat.

Oren's tenure in politics continued with his election to the Knesset, where he served as Deputy Minister in the Prime Minister's Office, overseeing diplomacy. His international influence has been recognized by *Politico*, the *Forward*, and *the Jerusalem Post*, ranking him among the most influential thinkers

in both America and worldwide.

The Ambassador is an accomplished author of both non-fiction and fiction. His awardwinning *New York Times* bestsellers include *Six Days of War, Power, Faith, and Fantasy,* and *Ally: My Journey Across the American-Israeli Divide*.

As a frequent Middle East analyst for CNN and CBS and in print publications across the globe, Michael Oren's expertise speaks to a career that is a rare blend of diplomatic service, scholarly achievement, military dedication, and literary talent. His contributions to Israeli and global discourse on key issues continue to resonate, making him a figure of lasting influence and respect.

As a preview of his visit, I am pleased to share one of his latest articles concerning the war and the impact felt throughout the country on the grim milestone of the 100th day of fighting.

Conversation on the Hundredth Day

Today marks the hundredth-day anniversary of the atrocities of October 7th, the massacre of 1200 Israelis by Hamas and the taking of more than 240 hostages, 132 of whom remain in captivity. Their suffering is incalculable, brought on by torture, deprivation of lifesaving medication, and sexual abuse. The mere thought of what they have endured for those 100 days torments every Israeli.

Yesterday, on Shabbat, I sat for lunch with a typical Israeli family and had what's become an inescapable Israeli conversation. The topic was not, as might be expected, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken's recent criticism of Israel's conduct in the Gaza war or even Israel's need to defend itself against the charges of genocide in the International Court of Justice. The sole subject was the hostages.

"The government has to do everything in its power to bring the hostages home," began the mother as she laid bowls of hummus and tahini before us. "The state sent those people to live on the Gaza border and didn't protect them and now it must get them home even if it means freeing all the Palestinian terrorists in our jails."

The father agreed, stressing, "If the state fails to redeem the hostages, no one will be able to send their children to the army again. Pidyon shivuim," he noted, the redemption of captives, "is the most sacred Jewish value."

"No way," the daughter interjected while passing around the kebabs. "We know what happened the last time we released prisoners in exchange for one hostage, Gilad Shalit. They all became the leaders of Hamas and killed even more Jews." Her hand landed flat on the table. "In ten years from now, I'll have to fear that the terrorists we release today will kill my children. I am unwilling to live with that fear."

Then came my turn to comment. The terrorists, I noted, are in jail because they killed Israelis. And in releasing them, the state would have to explain to the bereaved families why the murderers of their loved ones get to go free. "The terrorists will go home to a hero's welcome while those they killed will never

come home at all." The effects on Israel's national morale would be devastating, I predicted, but not as harmful as the encouragement it would give to terror. "Hamas will conclude that taking hostages pays off and will seek to take even more of them in the future. Terrorists will kill Jews knowing that they'll only spend a few years in prison before they are released in a prisoner-for-hostage exchange."

My remarks should have been an appetite-killer but, this being an Israeli family, nothing deterred us from proceeding with the Shabbat meal. Only when dessert came, did the son hasten to add that Hamas leader Yahya Sinwar showed no signs of being interested in any exchange agreement whatsoever but rather seemed intent on achieving either victory or martyrdom. "We're all talking as if there is actually a deal on the table," he said sadly. "There may be, in fact, no deal. There may not even be a table."

This, finally, ended the conversation and, with it, most of the meal. Dessert and coffee were served in silence.

No doubt similar discussions were conducted around Shabbat tables throughout Israel, and perhaps even around the Jewish world. Frustratingly, excruciatingly, everyone's position is right, and yet no one answer is correct. This is the horrendous dilemma that has fettered Israel for the last hundred days and seems destined to shackle us for the foreseeable future. It appears we have no choice but to continue our campaign to corner Hamas and force it to release hostages and end the terrorists' rule over Gaza.

Today, some 120,000 Israelis gathered in Hostage Square for a 24-hour assembly demanding the hostages' release. Among the posters and exhibits profiling each of the 132, was a table set with a similar number of settings and chairs—all of them empty. For those who still have the privilege of sitting freely around their tables, we ask one thing.

We ask American and all Diaspora Jews to understand the depths of our dilemma and to continue to stand by us in our hour of pain. While much of the world condemns us for war crimes and denies us the right to self-defense, Jews everywhere must remember the words of Rachel Goldberg-Polin, mother of hostage Hersh Golberg-Polin. "It will take a molecule of the weight that I am carrying off of me knowing that you are carrying it as well." January 14, 2024.

Revel in what's next.

The Club will once again provide tables, chairs and linens delivered to your location at no charge. Additional elements like lighting or speakers can be



How We Got Here

Celle, Germany 1945

Little Ulrich Westen was playing in his front yard when he noticed a man slowly walking down the street toward him. Ulrich's first thought was the man had to be a vagrant or a beggar, of which there were more than a few who had lost everything in the war. The man was emaciated and wore ragged clothes covered with grime and coal dust. His cheeks were hollow, and his shoulders slumped. Ulrich thought of running into the house, but the man's eyes froze him in his tracks.

"I'm your father," the man said simply. Ulrich stood there, frozen, his young mind struggling to comprehend the weight of the man's words. The father he had only known through stories and faded photographs was standing right before him, a living testament to the resilience of the human spirit.

It was a day Ulrich would remember forever. His father had been imprisoned in a Russian labor camp for the past four years, and his mother had given up looking for him, assuming he was dead like most of the others who had the same plight. But he wasn't, and the family thrived. The father had been a language teacher and knew the value of an education. As time went by, Ulrich studied at Sorbonne University in Paris, studied business, and worked as a bellhop part-time, his first exposure to the hospitality business. He promptly enrolled at the famed École hôtelière de Lausanne in Switzerland.

After getting married in Gibraltar to an English woman,

University of Miami, earning a degree in Oceanography and a master's in Geological Engineering from Texas A&M. There, she met another young geologist, Keith Hill. They were married and enjoyed traveling and working in many different corners of the world.

Years later, the Hill's found their way back to Ocean Reef, almost full circle for Diane. When she learned there were plans for a new Ocean Room/

Reef Lounge she instantly thought about the magic and long-standing tradition of the aquariums in that space. Diane spoke with then Chairman Bob Manzo who assured her that aquariums were a part of the renovated space. He also quickly recognized her passion for aquariums and invited her to be a part of the design process. The circle was complete.

Joan, they embarked on a new journey, moving to New York City. It was a city of dreams, a place where opportunities in the hospitality field were readily available. His first big job was as a manager at a large hotel in Puerto Rico, a stepping stone that led him to become the Dorado Beach Hotel (Ritz Carlton) manager,

marking a significant milestone in his career. Then, Ulrich received an important phone call. It was from Roger Baker, then owner of the Ocean Reef Club, who realized his rapidly growing club in North Key Largo needed its first professional manager. It was 1964, and the Ulrich moved into a cinder

The results of a search for organizations aspiring to change the world can generate a list several pages long. Given the breadth of challenges faced in our world, it seems obvious the scope of need is beyond the capacity of any one organization to meet the needs, much less change 'the world.'

That's why I'm so impressed with the work Ed Glover and his wife Tammy have accomplished in the city of Pittsburgh since 1995.

An Outstanding Organization...

Ed founded Urban Impact
Foundation in 1995 to help
address the profound and unique
challenges facing today's urban
communities, like we saw in Los
Angeles. Ed witnessed it firsthand every day for over nine
years as a resident of Pittsburgh's
North Side as pastor at Allegheny
Center Alliance Church.

With A Focused Purpose...

Ed realized that changing the world of our urban communities was like the proverbial challenge of eating an elephant – one bite

at a time. He realized that the trials of children and families in urban communities could only be effectively addressed through holistic development of the mind, body, and spirit through Christ — one person, one family, one block at a time. That's how Urban Impact was born.

What have the results been? Has their work made any difference? Have they made an impact on the world of Pittsburgh's North Side? Or are they like the little boy sticking his finger in the dike?

Producing Extraordinary Outcomes...

Today, Urban Impact has a ministry site in 15 of the 18 North Side neighborhoods. Each point of interest represents an Urban Ministry home, a ballfield, school, church, or other program site where they operate. Each touchpoint deepens the impact of their ability to reach the hearts of students and their families.

Urban Impact's goal is to create and grow generational change for the Kingdom of God. Whether students are plugged in to Performing Arts, Athletics, Education, or Options, this holistic, Gospel-centered ministry helps kids discover their true identity in Christ, rather than having their culture tell them who they are.

The special events outreach of Urban Impact now involves many of the professional athletes from the Pittsburgh sports teams.

Urban Impact has changed the world of thousands of students and families so far and are looking forward to serving thousands more in the future.

In 2011, Ed received the

prestigious 'Restoring Places Award' at the Epoch Missions Gala in Atlanta, GA. In 2014, Urban Impact was also awarded the inaugural 'True Inspiration Award' for the northeast region by the Chick-fil-A Foundation in recognition of their "groundbreaking practices and visionary leadership" with innovative education.

Working Local – Growing Global

Ed founded Global Impact USA as well. This annual, one-day mission event has given students the charge to respond to the call of God in their lives and put it into practice. For 24 years, his leadership has inspired more than 55,000 kids from 19 cities to participate in Global Impact Mission. Because of this event, there are over one thousand pastors and missionaries serving around the world.

Wintertime Dry Skin

It only takes a few low humidity, cool days to bring on dry skin conditions. Aging also plays a big part in dry skin as the skin's epidermis begins to lose elasticity and collagen. Dry skin in the winter can feel itchy, also known as winter xerosis. Since the water content of the outermost layer of skin reacts to the level of humidity around it, there are a few things you can do to help alleviate dry, itchy skin.

- Limit yourself to one 5–10-minute bath or shower daily and use lukewarm instead of hot water. Hot water strips away the natural oil in skin.
- Minimize soap and try a moisturizing soap, such as Dove, or any of the other moisturizing soaps on the market. Limit the use of scratchy bath sponges,



loofahs and overly scented soap.

- It's helpful to moisturize skin immediately after bathing to help seal in the moisture.
- Frequent hand washing, while important during cold and flu season, is particularly rough on wintertime hands. Follow up with a good moisturizer after washing and reapply several times a day. Extremely dry hands can progress to cracked

or bleeding skin. An effective hand moisturizer is Aquaphor, a petroleum product, which is clinically proven to restore smooth skin. It is also fragrance and preservative free for those with sensitive skin.

• If the humidity level in your home is low (under 60%) try using a humidifier to increase moisture in the air. This also helps if you suffer from dry eyes.

• Stay hydrated – drink water throughout the day.

Farm to Table at Ocean Reef

The phrase, "farm to table" means that the food on the table is locally sourced, fresh, and comes directly from farms without going to a market or store.

Location, Location, Location

Ocean Reef Club is fortunate enough to be perched on the edge of rich farmland in Homestead and the Redlands, not far from our Front Gate. We are also within a few hours' drive from the Loxahatchee family farms area in South Florida. The seasonal array of produce is delivered from these farms, sometimes even by the owners themselves to our Commissary within hours of being harvested. Aren't we lucky?

The Team

Recently, I met with Chef Philippe Reynaud, Senior Director of Culinary Operations, and Chef Jackie Pena, Chef de Cuisine of Banquets, to find out more about our local farm program. They explained that this trend is based on building relationships with local farmers. Chef Jackie and Chef Betania visit these nearby farms to see crops grow from the beginning

of the planting season to the time they are ready to be picked. This commitment strengthens the respect between farmer and chef along with building an awareness of the produce available for all of our Ocean Reef Chefs.

The Farms

Chef Jackie shared that in the last ten years, the number of local farms that supply our Ocean Reef Culinary Department has grown immensely. One of the first was Michael Borek Farms who still delivers weekly some of the best Heirloom tomatoes found anywhere; planted in October these special tomatoes are now arriving at The Reef. Mr. Greens is a source for melons, pink pineapple, and other specialty fruit you might not have known existed. Gratitude Garden Farms is the best place for mushrooms, but they also supply okra, turmeric, and exotic fruits. Another great supplier is Harpke Farms that supplies edible flowers to decorate your plates, micro produce, and a variety of unusual

greens. This is just a sampling of our local South Florida farms that deliver their produce by truck to our door. Boxes of glistening produce of assorted colors and shapes arrive and are quickly sorted and delivered to the kitchens at The Reef.

Our Chefs

These farms send their lists of what produce is available weekly to our Culinary Department. This array of fresh ingredients inspires our chefs to design

special dishes. They also rely on this bounty to utilize the best seasonal produce for their menus as they each create their own order for the week and send it on to the farmer.

A Win-Win

Chef Philippe and Chef Jackie are happy we can support our local farmers who provide produce that is fresh, high quality,

and nutritional. Chef P said, "It is the right thing to do". The farmers are delighted and proud to sell their produce to a local community that appreciates their dedication to growing outstanding crops. Our chefs are thrilled with the top-quality product. The next time you enjoy fresh produce on your plate at one of our restaurants, think of it as "farm to fork" that was harvested not too many miles away from The Reef.

Honey hoisin duck, filet mignon, coconut-crusted prawns, chicken pad Thai, and vegetable stir fry. We had never been to a buffet within a buffet. Was this a Club within a Club type idea?

Still figuring out our attack plan, we peered over to the center of the room and noticed gatherings of Members around large glass tanks filled with cold crustaceans. Spearing into piles of cold shrimp, mounds of cracked stone crab, and luscious tangled crab legs, everyone was grinning.

We said hello to F&B Big Wigs Chris Patterson, Executive Director of Food and Beverage, and Jared Reardon, ORC's Executive Chef, and headed to the dim-sum station. We quickly found ourselves in a very awkward situation. How many spring rolls can I get you? A large or small portion of edamame? How many dumplings did you need? Pork or vegetable? We were not prepared for such complicated questions. Whatever fits on this plate, we are coming back anyway, we said to inquiring ladies behind the counter.

A few feet down we noticed beckoning bowls of seaweed, classic Caesar, Thai kale, and chopped Asian salads and cold soba noodles. Then we spotted Andres Sagrero, managing the poke and nacho station. He artistically topped our wonton chips with tuna, cucumber, cilantro, and spicy mayo. It was so yummy, we stopped to see Andres a few more times. Nice guy and a helluva listener.

The Ocean Room's General Manager and dapper dresser Nico DiPerna and Chef Rey Alvarez were particularly proud of the matching décor presented at the theme night. Rice farmer hats, Japanese Lucky Cats and a large katana sword were on full display. Sadly, the bonsai tree was on back order.

Three hours after our arrival, it was time to call it a night. But there was one more station that couldn't be left abandoned.

After a couple of bites of Chinese almond cookies, lemon meringue and five-spice cake bites, our youngest guest's eyes lit up when she sampled the warmed spiced toffee date cake she found hiding in a chafing dish. The rest of us thought it would be best to confirm her rating by taking our own forks to it. By far the best dessert of the night!

We left the Ocean Room hoping our golf cart was lost. It wasn't. But we decided it was best to burn off a few of those calories and walk home.

NATURE NOTES

Shooting Stars



"Nature Notes" by Nancy Zakon

Shooting stars- magic! Sign of good luck, of love, of positive futures. Mary Brady's grandson took this photo of a shooting star here at The Reef during the Holidays. Other than magic, what are they and whence do they come? Let's play like giants and look down to see what orbits around the Sun. Planets, sure. Those closest to the Sun are of solid material like ours (Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars). Passing Mars, we see a circular "belt" of leftover solid debris that didn't make it to planet-hood- like crumbs



after eating cookies. This ring of "crumbs" around the Sun is called the Asteroid Belt, made of, you guessed it - asteroids. (You occasionally read about fearing an asteroid that will hit us and smush us like the one that killed all the dinosaurs – but NASA is taking care of this). Only the larger, solid "crumbs" are called asteroids; smaller

crumbs are meteoroids. Back to being a giant, after passing the solid planets (mentioned above) you come to the gaseous, icy, space debris planets (Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune). Out past Neptune are more "crumbs" from the gas-ice planets. These form another "crumb" ring called the Kuiper Belt. Now, we have the picture:

the Asteroid Belt of solid bits, and the Kuiper Belt of gassy, icy, debris bits. And furthest out is the Oort Cloud of icy debris "crumbs" - home of most comets. (But that's another story – you're saying, "Whew!") Now, that we have the Belts in mind, back to our question of shooting stars. These "crumbs" can be bounced out of their Beltrotation, be drawn by gravity towards the Sun, speed at 100,000 mph, go into the Earth's atmosphere, and burn brightly in our oxygen! Ah ha! We see them! It's wonderful! Interestingly, meteoroids (as little as a grain of sand) fall through our atmosphere all the time - they say half-dozen an hour-day and night. Mary's son was lucky to see this very bright one!



The Fairway Finder

Golf is easier from the fairway, we all know that but how can we improve our setup to hit more fairways?

As we know the wind can blow quite strong here on the keys and hitting fairways can become more and more challenging.

Next time you are on the practice tee or out playing make these setup changes to help you find more fairways:

- Tee it lower
- Grip down 2 inches
- Stand closer to the ball
- Flare lead foot (left foot for RH player) towards the target
- Make a free-flowing committed golf swing

These simple setup changes



will help promote better contact and a more consistent ball flight which will enable us to control the golf ball easier and hit more fairways.

Working Out Like an Athlete

An athlete is any person who exercises with purpose and consistency to become better at a specific activity or sport. There is no age limit for who is or can be an athlete. Athletes aim to gain every advantage possible by using the best training and recovery techniques. To get ahead, every athlete must include the following in their exercise routine:

Strength and conditioning: strength is the base for power, speed, and acceleration. Conditioning determines the time an athlete can maintain top form.

Flexibility and mobility: supple muscles and mobile and stable joints perform better and are more resilient to injury.

Sport-specific exercises: rotational sports such as golf and tennis require different movement patterns than linear sports such as running, cycling, and swimming. Adding specific exercises to a gym routine creates a significant sports advantage.


only be hopeful for better winds next year.





Using Depth Instead of Pace in Doubles



"Tennis Tip" by Nick Scheller, Tennis Professional

A simple strategy in doubles is using depth over pace. Depth will result in a more frequent short ball from your opponent inviting you to the net to play more aggressively. The further you push your opponent back the more advantage you create for your team.

For example:

- You'll give your partner more time to poach and put the volley away.
- Your opponent will have fewer angles the further you push them back.

Depth is also a safer option than pace. When you are hitting deep you are generating topspin and height to your ball. This results in a higher percentage of shot over hard and flat balls.

Hard and flat is a lower percentage shot because of its low net clearance and speed.

You can be aggressive in doubles by hitting the ball deep rather than fast.

In summary, favoring depth over pace in doubles tennis offers a strategic advantage. Pushing your opponent back results in more short balls, allowing for aggressive net play and giving your partner time to excel in volleys. This approach also limits your opponent's angles and proves to be a safer option with higher shot success rates due to topspin and height. Opt for depth to dominate in doubles, steering clear of the pitfalls of relying solely on pace.



BRIDGE TIP OF THE WEEK

Unveiling the Smolen Convention

Responding to 1NT With 5-4 in the Majors

Effective communication is crucial in bridge, especially when responding to a 1NT opening bid from your partner. While Stayman and Jacoby Transfers are traditional methods for determining Major fits, what happens when you hold a 5-4 distribution in the Majors? Enter the Smolen Convention – a strategic bidding approach

designed to convey your unique hand shape to the Notrump (NT) opener.

The Smolen Convention - Key Steps:

Activated by a responder with 10 or more High Card Points (HCPs) and a 5-4 Major distribution, the Smolen Convention unfolds as follows:

- Stayman First (2♠): Begin with a Stayman bid (2♠) to explore the potential for a 4-card major fit.
- Raise to the 4-Level with a Major Fit: If your partner bids a major in response, a straightforward raise to the 4-level signals the intent to reach the game.

• Smolen Convention **Activation:**

In case your partner denies a major by rebidding 2

- , trigger the Smolen Convention to reveal a 3-card fit with your 5-card major.
- •Smolen Convention **Steps:** Jump to the 3-level with the shorter major (the one not denied by your partner).

Your partner, holding a 3-card fit, will either bid to the game or opt for 3NT.

•Logic Behind Smolen Convention:

The convention prioritizes allowing the stronger hand to play the hand, maximizing the partnership's chances of a successful game.

Conclusion:

Incorporating the Smolen Convention into your bidding repertoire adds sophistication to your bridge game. When faced with a 5-4 Major distribution after a 1NT opening, mastering this strategic approach can be a game-changer, providing you and your partner with a decisive edge in reaching successful games. The 3-level bid in the Smolen Convention requires an alert, ensuring transparent communication between partners. Elevate your bridge strategy by embracing the nuanced tactics of the Smolen Convention.


