Gotta Question?

When leaving The Reef traveling south on 905 there is an ongoing project installing rubber pipe along the side of the road. What is this project about? I thought we had a new water pipe installed just a few short years ago.

We reached out to Emmy Koenig McDowell from FKAA for the answer! She shared that the project you're thinking of from a few years ago took place between 2019 and 2020 when FKAA installed 16-inch transmission lines along C-905, connecting Key Largo and Ocean Reef. These upgraded lines now play a crucial role in supplying water to the Club.

The current project you're seeing along 905 is also by FKAA. They are using a technique called "pipe bursting" to revitalize a 12-inch pipeline that wasn't in use. The FKAA says this effort will improve the Club's water system by increasing its capacity and



adding a backup line for better reliability.

Come late May through mid-June, the work will extend into Ocean Reef from the Front Gate to the intersection at Gatehouse Road and will be conducted from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Full road closures are not expected. FKAA is also redesigning the interconnection points, which may also extend briefly within Ocean Reef gates at a later date.

Most of the work is anticipated to be completed by mid-June 2024 and the final completion is anticipated for late August 2024. During closeout, there will be pavement restoration taking place mid-June 2024 to mid-July 2024.



LAST CALL for a live theater performance of Side by *Side by Sondheim* Tues. Feb. 13 at the Ocean Reef Cultural Center....

ABOUT THE SHOW

Side by Side by Sondheim does not have a traditional script. Instead, there is wonderful music and lyrics, created by Stephan Sondheim, an undisputed master of the Broadway Theater Musical.

It has been said that every song by Sondheim is a tiny play that tells a complete story. And you can be sure that those stories will be told brilliantly in song and dance by the talented Zoetic cast of four (which includes Stuart Meltzer, who is the director, as well as an actor, in this OR performance).

ABOUT SONDHEIM

The late Stephen Sondheim (he died in November 2021) is to theater buffs what Steven Spielberg is to movie buffs.

Sondheim was the composer, the lyricist, the writer (often, all three) of 16 Broadway shows.

The delightful musical revue Side by Side by Sondheim, presented by Zoetic Stage, is an early work of Sondheim's. It was recently revived on Broadway to rave reviews.

ABOUT ZOETIC STAGE

Zoetic Stage (whose home base is a small theater, located in Miami's Adrienne Arsht Center). is, in a way, Ocean Reef's very own theatrical company. Side by Side by Sondheim is the seventh show that Zoetic has specially produced for a single night at Ocean Reef.

One night only is a pretty

awesome commitment. It means the actors must learn and rehearse their roles. The sets and costumes, the lighting and sound must be designed or redesigned for the Cultural Center stage.

It could be a director's and a producer's nightmare, but lucky for us, **Stuart Meltzer** and **Michael McKeever**, the founders and creative force at Zoetic Stage, welcomed a challenge.

DISCOVERING ZOETIC

In the winter of 2016 **Barbara Olcott**, who was Chairman of the Cultural Center Board, asked my husband Arthur Birsh and me for help in finding a suitable theatrical production for the 2017 season.

Our quest was to discover something that would work physically on the Cultural Center's stage and please an Ocean Reef audience.

Having quickly dismissed the idea of Broadway touring companies (too expensive and too big for our stage), we limited our search to local and regional theatres within a few hours' drive from Ocean Reef.

We saw revivals, original plays, musicals big and small. Some very professional and some not so much.

Then we found **Zoetic Stage** in their small theater, tucked into the large Arsht Center complex. And after seeing Zoetic's productions of *Sunday* in the Park with George (a musical by Stephen Sondheim) and After (an original play by a Zoetic

founder Michael McKeever), we quickly realized we had struck a mother lode, where two men **Michael McKeever** and **Stuart Meltzer**, were extracting theatrical gold.

OR LOVES ZOETIC

After two successful productions at Ocean Reef (Sunday in the Park with George and After), the Cultural Center secured a commitment from Zoetic for one production each season.

This gave John Hunt and the Cultural Center Board a say in selecting the play or musical to be presented by Zoetic at Ocean Reef.

Sometimes the choices, like the current Side by Side by Sondheim, are productions that Zoetic has presented at their own theater in the Arsht Center. Sometimes they are plays like Deathtrap (the 2022 OR/Zoetic production), that are exciting old favorites. And sometimes they are an original play like After, the brilliant awardwinning play written by Zoetic's co-founder and Producing Director Michael McKeever. (The multi-talented Michael McKeever is also a set designer and an actor, who frequently appears in Zoetic productions.)

Stuart Meltzer, Michael's co-founder and partner – in life as well as Zoetic – is also multitalented.

Stuart is an amazing director, a playwright, and a performer. (He's one of the cast of four in *Side by Side*).

Both Michael and Stuart are

Floridians, Michael was born into a big Italian family in North Miami Beach. Stuart lost his mother when he was a small child and was raised by his father in Kendall.

Michael was a design graduate from the Art Institute of Fort Lauderdale and had an early career in advertising.

Stuart, who was singing from age five, says that he "never thought of doing anything but working in show business."

After earning a degree first in Theater and later in Directing, he became Head of Theater at Gulliver Preparatory and then for many years he was on the faculty of the New World School of the Arts.

In 2010 Stuart Meltzer and Michael McKeever founded Zoetic Stage.

PAST AND PRESENT

On February 7, 2017 Zoetic Stage presented Stephen Sondheim's musical Sunday in the Park with George at the Ocean Reef Cultural Center. **Stuart Meltzer** directed the 15 cast members and 6 musicians with unmatched professionalism.

The next season Zoetic Stage presented *After*, a five-character award-winning play written by **Michael McKeever**, who also was one of the actors.

In the seasons that followed Zoetic at Ocean Reef produced Incident of the Dog in the Nighttime, Deathtrap, The Gin Game, 39 Steps.

And now it is Last Call for another incredible Zoetic Stage production.

ORCA Welcomes New CustomMade Fire Assets Donated by Monroe County

A traditional "push-in" ceremony on February 6 marked a significant milestone at ORCA's Public Safety Fire Station 26, celebrating the arrival of a custom-built Rescue Ambulance and a multipurpose Rapid Intervention Vehicle (RIV) designed for various emergency scenarios.

Design and construction of both vehicles over a two-year period was fully funded through a generous grant from Monroe County. "We have a remarkable relationship with Monroe County officials and these donations in the form of funding grants highlight the collaboration toward community safety," said ORCA President Juan Perez.

Enhanced Safety and Comfort

The ambulance, a Freightliner M2 medium duty module, was designed by ORCA Fire-Rescue leadership with safety, efficiency, reliability, and patient comfort in mind. The ergonomics of the ambulance's patient compartment allow for Firefighters and Paramedics

to travel safely and seated during patient transports while providing the highest levels of care and comfort to their patient.

An improved air-cushioned suspension system will significantly improve the ride while the interior lighting, compartmentation, and communications systems all contribute to an enhanced patient experience.

Expanding Fire-Rescue Capabilities

The multipurpose Rapid Intervention Vehicle, an Oshkosh Stinger Q4TM, is built on a Ford F55O Super Cab chassis. The addition of the RIV to the ORCA Fire-Rescue fleet fills a critical void in the capability to respond to aircraft, fire and related rescue scenarios.

"Having a third fire apparatus capable of supplying hose lines for a structural fire attack will better prepare us for aircraft and structural fires as well as for the potential of separate, simultaneous fire incidents," said ORCA Fire Chief John Flynn. "The addition of these vehicles demonstrates the

commitment of the ORCA Fire Department to the highest level of safety and service for the entire Ocean Reef community and the well-being of its citizens."

The RIV carries 500 lbs. of dry chemical agent, 40 gallons of firefighting foam, and 300 gallons of water. These extinguishing agents can be delivered individually or in tandem through a bumper-mounted, remotecontrolled turret, and/or through preconnected hose lines on the rear and side of the apparatus.


A forward-looking infrared

(FLIR) camera is mounted to the bumper turret, allowing for the operator to "see" in low-light or smoky conditions. An electric winch capable of moving loads up to 12,000 pounds is mounted to the front bumper as well.

The firefighting foam and dry chemical agents carried by this apparatus are the appropriate extinguishing agents not only for aircraft fires, but also for near-shore vessel fires, as well as for advanced electrical fires, such as in electric vehicles that have occurred with greater frequency throughout the U.S.

Like the rest of ORCA's Engine and Ladder apparatuses, the Rapid Intervention Vehicle is capable of pumping water to supply hose lines for a structural fire attack.

How Long is Your Commute?






or George Bush. For a dollar fifty, you get me."

Late August, 1992

Hurricane Andrew Makes Landfall

During the late summer months, the South Florida weatherman becomes very popular. It is the heart of hurricane season, and Ocean Reefers watch the news reports for disturbances forming in the tropical divergence zone, where many hurricanes are formed. One such disturbance formed on August 16th and was designated Tropical Depression Three. As it churned past Barbados several days later, it was reclassified as Tropical Storm Andrew. Atmospheric conditions kept the storm from intensifying for the next few days, but when it was 650 miles southeast of Nassau, winds had strengthened to 100mph, and it became a hurricane with a predicted path turning north, making landfall near Jupiter, Florida, on August 25th.

Sally Davidson, who lived in a new house on Sunrise Cay, decided to stay at The Reef and weather the storm. With her was her daughter, **Jennifer**, and Bob and Clair Wilkerson, who worked for the Davidsons. Also on The Reef was Russ Post, who agreed by phone to stay at the Davidson's house. On the evening of August 23rd, Russ parked his car in the Davidson's driveway. The night sky was clear with only a wisp of breeze, which added to everybody's sense of well-being.

Earlier that day, Merle Prebel, the contractor who had constructed the Davidson house, ensured everything was bolted down and secure for

the expected storm. He later went to his home on Harbor Course (now called Hammock Course), had a casual meal, and went to bed, all the time believing the computer models that showed the storm turning north.

The storm failed to turn north and intensified as it barreled across Cat Cay in the Bahamas and headed straight toward South Florida.

As everything was so quiet outside, everybody in the Davidson house decided to try to get some sleep and reconnoiter later, around 1 a.m., which they did. They gathered in the living room then, and things had dramatically changed. The wind blew, and rain beat against the windows and sliding glass doors. Then the power blinked off and on and finally off, leaving the entire house pitch black.

Armed with flashlights, everybody moved to a lower recreation room with three concrete block walls. The storm intensified. Russ moved an easy chair and propped it against the room's only door. The wind started to shriek. Glass crashed to the floor. The sound of a broken skylight. Glass sliding doors being lifted from the walls and crashing. The solid wood door started to heave, and Russ braced against it. Water began to pour through an electrical fixture in the ceiling. Somebody suggested a prayer, and they did but could barely be heard above the freight train roar.

By 8 a.m. the following day, the storm center had moved

away, and they emerged from their room, thankful, tired, and possibly in shock. The house was devastated, but they had survived and would rebuild. Russ's car looked like it had been in a Bonnie and Clyde movie covered with dents from flying roof tiles that also broke all the windows. During the peak of the storm, being outside must have been similar to a killing zone. Jean Hunt, another Sunrise resident, came back to a damaged house highlighted by a neighbor's roof tile buried in their refrigerator door. Some streets were impassable due to fallen trees and debris. Golf courses looked like war zones. The wind had blown the Har Tru surfaces on tennis courts into piles baring the subsurfaces. The stop sign at the four corners was bent into an upside-down position (dots).

Ironically, Merle Prebel woke and had incurred very little damage, as had most other residences on the southern side of Ocean Reef. Hurricane Andrew was a Category 5 with a small diameter, the center of which made landfall south of Florida

City. Winds had exceeded 165 miles per hour with embedded tornados.

Two days later, while flying down to Ocean Reef with this writer, Bob Morgan (past Club Chairman, now deceased), noticed the mangroves north of Ocean Reef were almost totally defoliated and twisted into grotesque shapes. The Airport runway was littered with destroyed airplane parts, with an airplane engine in the middle. Food stations, one at the Racquet Club, had been set up and distributed free food. People helped each other. Some, whose houses were not habitable, stayed with others whose homes had avoided extensive damage. Work crews from northern states began to arrive to assist those that needed help.

Ocean Reef would rebuild.
Monroe County would
revise home specification

high winds. And best of all,

Kids & Valentines

Early in February, we would carefully choose a shoebox and artfully transform it into a 'Valentine's Day Box.' A hole would be carefully cut in the lid - just large enough to accommodate the many valentines your friends would




It's springtime in 1965. Beautiful Elizabeth "Betty" Foster, 23, an American Airlines stewardess and pediatric nurse, and her roommates are planning a party in their New York City apartment. She asks a male friend to bring over some "nice guys."

John "Jack" Marquardt, 27, a tall, handsome medical student with a full head of thick brown hair is the first one to arrive. Betty answered the door. She took one look at him and felt instant chemistry. "I said to myself, I'll take him," she recalled.

Wasting no time, Jack, attending Cornell University New York Hospital Medical School in Manhattan, asked Betty on a date for the next day. Not to come empty handed, Jack brought the only thing he had in his kitchen: A single Yellow Delicious apple. The two spent the day walking along the East River.

It gave Jack all the confirmation he needed. "If we could share one apple, we could share anything," he

A few years back the couple sold their farm, but their Ohio Eye Associates has long since expanded its eye-care services with locations throughout central Ohio. Their son, Richard, an optometrist, has his practice there.

Celebrating their 57th anniversary this summer, the grandparents of 16 and greatgrandparents of two, attribute their love story to a shared Catholic faith and values. Nearly six decades together, the two have some great tips for couples.

"Put a sticky note on your bathroom mirror and ask yourself on a daily basis, 'Am I fun to live with?' If you're feeling grouchy or in a bad mood, it really does make you think. You have to be happy with yourself first," said Betty. 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





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Whistlepig Pete?



'Nature Notes" by Nancy Zakon

Not exactly. It's Punxsutawney Phil. Last week's celebration prompts questions of origin and history of this odd tradition. It begins further back than expected. As with many holidays, Groundhog Day is an ancient overlay of several cultural traditions. To quickly summarize: the beginning of Spring is an inspiration, and for Celtic Pagans, a celebration. As Christianity spread across Europe, the early Spring celebration coincided with Candlemas (denoting Jesus' first visit to the Temple) exactly 40 days after Christmas. In parts of Europe people believed a sunny day for Candlemas meant 40 more days of snow and cold. German folk carried it further: it was a sunny day only if small animals like badgers saw their shadows. The Germans brought along this tradition when they immigrated to Pennsylvania in 1700-1800's. They chose groundhogs, native to the area for their "weather forecasting".

The nationwide celebration of Groundhog Day began in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania on February 2, 1887. A local newspaper editor pitched the idea of a celebration to a group named Punxsutawney Groundhog Club, a fun group of businessmen and groundhog hunters. Hunters? Yep. They hosted a summertime groundhog hunt and picnic. Are you tempted? The menu included cooked groundhog meat (tastes "between pork and chicken") and something called "groundhog punch," a combination of vodka, milk, eggs, orange juice, "and other

ingredients." That should fix you up!

Where is Punxsutawney?

The map shows 84 miles northeast of Pittsburgh. The Delaware tribe of Native Americans initially settled there naming a campsite halfway between the Allegheny and the Susquehanna Rivers, the name meaning "the town of the sand flies".

Finally, a note or two on groundhogs: amazing, tough critters, regardless of their eating your gardens! Because they inhabit a swath from mid- to northern US, lower Canada and even Alaska, they are called a variety of names including whistlepigs (whistling when in danger), a chuck, wood-shock, groundpig and Canada marmot. Groundhog tunnels can be 50 feet long, include a water trap, a series of sleeping rooms and a separate bathroom! In winter, a groundhog truly hibernates: his body temperature lowers from 100 to 35 degrees, as opposed to a bear's temperature that doesn't lower at all.

Phil's real name is 'Punxsutawney Phil, Seer of Seers, Sage of Sages, Prognosticator of Prognosticators, and Weather Prophet Extraordinary'. Not to spoil a great party or fun tradition, Phil's accuracy is 38%. Pass the Punxsutawney punch!




















Another Hero in our Midst

Garden Group Tours Viscaya Museum & Gardens

If you enjoy the charm and the beauty of Renaissance Italy, it lies delightfully within your reach just an hour from Ocean Reef. The beautiful Vizcaya Museum and Gardens in Coconut Grove is a stunning display of the opulence of the early 1900s and was the impressive setting for the February meeting of the Garden Group at Ocean Reef. The estate was built on Biscayne Bay by industrialist and conservationist James Deering, of the Deering McCormick-International Harvester fortune, in an effort to conserve the landscape of the area and protect the wildlife and plants. He also chose the location because he suffered with pernicious anemia, for which doctors recommended sunshine and a warm climate. Vizcaya took years to build and the artistic supervisor for all phases of the design and furnishing of the home was Paul Chalfin, a young painter and designer. Deering chose the Caravel, a Spanish sailing ship, as his emblem for Vizcaya because it

was the vessel that Spain used to conquer the world. Although a Spanish architectural motif seemed the obvious choice for the home, considering Florida's Spanish heritage, Deering was fascinated by Italian villas which became his inspiration. Vizcaya was influenced by the Veneto and Tuscan Italian Renaissance models and also incorporates Baroque, Rococo and Neo-classic

garden elements were combined with Cuban limestone and Floridian coral architectural trim and landscaped with native plants suited to the habitat and climate. The villa's museum contains 34 decorated rooms of distinctive furnishings with an emphasis on 15th-19th century art. Garden Group members enjoyed an hour-long tour of the first floor of the villa, and then spent their remaining time exploring the rest of the house and the gardens. For member Loretta Mackay, it was particularly special, as she fondly recalled the wedding of her son 17 years ago, which was held in both the villa and the gardens. "Vizcaya was a magical setting for the wedding, and our trip today



Of the many wonderful events that take place during All Charities Weekend, one of the Members' favorites is voting on which new wines will be featured property-wide on all of the wine lists. As in years past, there were 10 white wines and 10 red wines to taste and vote on. It was a wonderful turnout last Friday, with so many visiting the wine tasting in between bidding. So here are your 2024 All Charities Wines:

2022 Rombauer Sauvignon Blanc, Sonoma & Napa, California

In 1972, when Koerner and

Joan Rombauer moved their two children, two horses and five dogs to Napa Valley, they were already well acquainted with the natural relationship between food and wine. Koerner and Joan established Rombauer Vineyards in 1980, and in 1984 they released their first California-style Chardonnay and Cabernet Sauvignon wines. Over four

decades later, the winery has become widely acclaimed for its distinctive, fruit-driven expressions of these beloved varieties and more. The fruit for the Rombauer Sauvignon Blanc comes from premium growing sites in Sonoma and Napa counties that offer abundant sunshine vet moderate temperatures - ideal conditions. Lifted aromas of key lime, honeydew melon, and passionfruit all jump out of the glass supported by hints of freshly cut grass in the background. Those fresh lime and honeydew flavors continue to the palate, joined by kiwi and subtle herbaceous notes, all mingling together in a lively way. The wine is linear and focused, ending with enticing, mouthwatering acidity that will leave you wanting more.

2020 Beringer "Q" Red Blend, Napa Valley, California


The history of Beringer wines dates back to 1868, when Jacob Beringer, enticed by the opportunities of the new world, sailed from his home in Mainz, Germany, to New York. However, after hearing that the rocky hillside soil and fertile valley floor of Napa Valley resembled that of vineyards back home in Germany, Jacob made his way to California in 1869. He became cellar foreman for Charles Krug, one of the first commercial winemakers in Napa Valley. A few years later, in 1875, Jacob and his

brother, Frederick, purchased 215 acres, right next door to Charles Krug in St. Helena, for \$14,500. This parcel of land, known as Los Hermanos (the brothers), became the heart of the Beringer estate. On this estate, the Beringer Brothers oversaw their first harvest and crush in 1876. With Jacob serving as winemaker and Frederick as financier, the brothers made approximately 40,000 gallons of wine, or 18,000 cases, that first year. Today, like its investments in innovations, Beringer has invested deeply in its winemakers, with an average tenure of almost 16 years per winemaker. The Q Red Blend showcases traditional Bordeaux varietals with a foundation of Cabernet Sauvignon, the backbone and undisputed star of Beringer. In this vintage, the blend anchors with 86% Cabernet Sauvignon, with Merlot, Petit Verdot and Cabernet Franc. Merlot contributes to a round mouthfeel and soft tannins, Cabernet Franc adds great color and unique aromatics, Petit Verdot adds fullness and complexity, while a touch of Malbec adds a beautiful silkiness and depth of color to the final blend. Aromas of high-tone black fruits, maraschino cherries and brown spice are pronounced. The blueberry and red fruit notes are accented by notes of espresso and brown spice. The wine is juicy and plush on the palate with blackberry, tea and spice notes evident. The velvet tannins are mouthcoating and leave and almost chocolate note on the long, juicy fruit finish.

These wines will be making their debut in all Club locations beginning next week as we update the wine lists printed throughout property. As always, they will be in Port O' Call as well.



muscle fibers, which are essential for quick accelerations and maintaining speed over short distances. Additionally, strength training enables runners to tackle inclines, uneven terrain, and adverse weather conditions more effectively. obstacles they encounter.

Beyond the realm of running performance, strength training contributes to overall health and longevity. It promotes bone density, reduces the risk of osteoporosis, and helps maintain joint health as runners age.

Mother Nature gave her one-two punch to both of Ocean Reef's sailing clubs last weekend, but for two different reasons. As I write this and look ahead to this coming Sunday, the sailing conditions look nearly perfect. We will keep our fingers crossed that it stays that way!

Our first race start is at 10 a.m. and, of course, our sailing is dependent on favorable weather. 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

GOLF CROQUET TIPS

Determining Your Next Shot

The following is a simple fourstep method to help a player determine what their next shot should be.

Consider these four steps to select your shot.

- **1. Make the wicket** make the wicket if you feel you can.
- 2. Hit or block the danger ball the danger ball is the opponent's ball that is up next after you...if it is in scoring position and you are not, you should smash their ball away so they cannot score.
- **3. Help my partner** how can you help your partner ball so they are in an improved position.
- 4. Eliminate any threats think through the order of play moving forward and determine what might help you by eliminating an opponent's next good move.

Three Important Shots

Coach Paul Fecteau continually states the importance of the following three shots in a game.

- First shot to the next wicket: The first player shooting to the hoop has a huge advantage. Place this shot in a position to score. If you can do this, your opponents are forced to try to clear your ball away from scoring position, which is not always easy. Theoretically, the player who has that first shot at a hoop should be able to score on their second shot.
- Clearing: Clearing is the act of knocking your opponent's ball out of scoring position. You must be able to hit straight and sometimes long to clear your opponent's ball away from in front of the hoop.
- Scoring: Obviously one cannot win a game if they cannot score. While defense, including clearing, is huge and important, you still have to ultimately score hoops.


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2024 Old Buddy Tournament

SWING TIP OF THE WEEK

Improve Your Putting Using Your Eyes

When putting, the goal is always to get the ball in the hole in the least number of strokes as possible.

The human brain likes to complicate this task from time to time. We worry about stroke length, stroke direction, moving shoulders, etc.

Your eyes are the secret to better putting. Here's why: Next time you are on



Correct form: eyes on the target, creating awareness.

the practice putting green, follow this routine and see how much your speed and direction improves. We are talking zero swing mechanics here. Simply allow your eyes to send an optimal message to your mind:

• Take 3 practice strokes before setting up to the ball.



Incorrect form: eyes looking down, not creating awareness.

- While taking those 3 practice strokes, keep your eyes firmly on your target.
- We learn nothing from taking practice strokes while looking down at the ball. You might think it's effective, but in truth, it achieves very little. Looking at the hole triggers your mind to get the

ball to the hole using instinct and feel - developing a sense for speed and direction.

Now, for the moment of truth:

- Take your setup behind the ball. and take one last look at your target.
- Once your eyes refocus on the ball, make your stroke! Do not wait to let your mind wander and question the task at hand

Remember, your eyes are the secret. They tell your mind how to achieve the task at hand which is ultimately speed and direction. Try this out, have fun with it, and watch your putting improve almost immediately.

A game of bridge involves communication and cooperation with your partner and interaction with your opponents. There's a special camaraderie among bridge players that develops from the social setting and the game's emphasis on teamwork, ethics, and sportsmanship. And if you play duplicate bridge, you can find new friends and partners at more than 3300 bridge clubs throughout North America.

All you need for a bridge game is a deck of cards and three other people. You don't have to leave your home, and if you have a computer, you don't even need the cards or the people. You can play and practice on your own with bridge software, or you can join in live games with thousands of players from around the world at one of the free online bridge clubs. You can also enter games at your local duplicate club, where you'll enjoy a threehour session of bridge for less than the cost of a movie.


