

# From Quarterbacks to Humpbacks!

Cruising around the reef with family, Shay Bridge, 17, daughter of Courtney and Gardiner Bridge, was lucky (and quick) enough to photograph two adult humpback whales and newborn calf about a mile from Carysfort Lighthouse. The sighting so close to shore is incredibly rare. The adults most likely were a mom and a male escort, not necessarily the father. These humpbacks are part of the January to March migration from Greenland and Labrador, 2000-4000 miles to the Caribbean. (Yes, humpbacks are the ones with the huge, side (pectoral) fins - the whales you see leaping and



twisting out of the water on TV ads.) With her huge, side fin this mom was helping her calf come up to the surface for air every few minutes. The calf will swim near her tail for feeding – mom produces 120 gallons of rich milk a day! Whoa!

Remembering whales are mammals, what you may not know is their species began 50 million years ago, after the dinosaurs became extinct. Their antecedent is related to the horse and cow, ungulates. Its land ancestor returned to the sea: its nose became a blow hole, its hooves and hindlegs disappeared, its forelegs became long fins, and its backbone grew a tail. Viola! Isn't Mother Nature amazing?!

Humpbacks are related to porpoises and dolphins (dolphin, the mammal think Flipper- not the mahi). And like porpoises, you see humpbacks leaping, playing as well. Why do they leap and spin, breaching with huge flops? Hypotheses vary widely: to look for food, to signal two groups merging, to warn others of danger, to attract mates... and on and on. Your guess.

#### **Whale-Watching Tips:**


While it may be tempting to get closer, keep your boat at least 100 yards away, watch for only 30 minutes, and no leapfrogging. Knowing they blow and breathe about every

15 minutes, leaves time for a quick snack in between. Early mornings with calmer water are better for viewing than afternoons. Along with their acrobatics, you may also see a cloud of bubbles appearing. Nope, it's not from their flukes, but the exhalation from their blow hole. It's one of the ways they trap food. They exhale a cloud of bubbles to confuse bait fish which become easy prey. As a large, yummy buffet attracts a crowd, a large school of bait fish will attract up to 30 whales which coordinate to form large clouds of bubbles before scooping confused fishes into their maws.

The killing of humpbacks during the 17-19th centuries for oil, meat, and baleen was banned in 1985.

Seeing whales so close to our home is awesome and rare

### Hear the Buzz!

Bees are essential to our food supply and in recent years huge efforts have been made to restore their stability. However, we are not fond of having bees too close to us, especially when we are sitting down for a lovely lunch. Unfortunately, a few days ago, some hungry bees discovered some sweets on Buccaneer Island and there the tale begins.

#### **Lunch for the Bees**

The bee story from Eduardo Perez, Director of Engineering at Ocean Reef Club, really does have a happy ending. Recently, Associates at Palm Court and the Beach Bar reported an unusual invasion of bees. Not eager to cause a problem, the bees were happily savoring some syrupy ingredient leaking from two different beverage machines. As Eduardo explained, "Although the area has a lot of nectar available in the surrounding landscape, the delicious and easy to drink syrup was attracting the bees". Evidently, it made for

a delectable lunch—for the bees, not for Members and Associates though! The areas were temporarily closed.

#### To the Rescue

Luckily, Eduardo knew exactly what to do as he is quite experienced with the process of bee control. First of all, he identified the insects as honey bees out for a free lunch. Then he contacted "Tabas Working Ladies" in nearby Homestead. They are one of a few local businesses that specialize in removing bees responsibly. Later that day, the beekeeper arrived with special equipment to take care of the bees. First, the technician carefully removed the "queen bee" and then utilizing a friendly bee vacuum, he collected the other bees safely. No bee or human was harmed.

#### The Happy Ending

All of the bees were then taken by the trained beekeeper on a journey to a farm about 25 miles away to create their own hives. In their new homes, the bees will travel to other farms in South Florida to pollinate flowers, fruits, vegetables and more. Some will even produce honey. So instead of "farm to table", in this case it is "The Reef to the farm". So everyone was a winner, the beverage machines were fixed and all was calm on Buccaneer once again.

More than 900 tails are wagging at Ocean Reef after the completion of renovations and improvements to our Dog Park.





# Summer Travels... Season Rewards...

It's hard to believe that this past summer was our 8th trip to Louisville, Kentucky to source bourbon barrels for the Club. In all those years we have procured 33 barrels of bourbon. With each trip over the years we have learned so much and built strong relationships with the distilleries. We have always tried to have something to please every Member's palate. From single barrels to blended barrels, and from low proof to high proof, the

choices have been endless. We recently received not one, but four Ocean Reef Club barrel selections. With that none of the new ones replicate any of the previous ones. These new barrels were all selected by your very own Ocean Reef Club "Master Tasters" - Erwin Pals, Chris Patterson and yours truly.

#### **ORC Woodford Reserve Batch #8 Bourbon**

If you have never been to the

I encourage you to make the trip. The art of making fine bourbon first took place on the site of the Woodford Reserve Distillery, a National Historic Landmark, in 1812. Their distillers, Chris Morris and Elizabeth McCall, have been integral in driving innovation and shaping the story of Woodford Reserve, sharing the belief that the keys to making the World's Finest Bourbon are not only time and patience, but science and art. Chris began his career in bourbon in 1976, while Elizabeth moved from her 9-year tenure in R&D to Assistant Master Distiller in 2018. For this year's barrel blending in October, we were able to spend time with Chris to develop our new blend. Our blending choices ranged from a 6 year/126.2 barrel, a 5 year/129.3 barrel and a 5 year/130.2 barrel. We went back and forth discussing the numerous variations until finally coming to an agreement on the perfect blend. After that it was in Chris' hands to match our blend and bottle it at the traditional 90.4 proof. It was exhausting work so we headed across the street to their new Woodford Reserve Welcome Center for a few handcrafted

cocktails. We always plan ahead

and had a driver for the day...

I have a special place in my heart for Maker's Mark. In

my previous life I worked for Jim Beam Brands, owners of Maker's Mark. Having visited the distillery numerous times, we were delighted to do our tasting in their brand-new tasting room overlooking one of their water reservoirs. This is the most unique blending process as we are able to choose from five different stave profiles (Baked American Pure, Seared French Cuvée, Maker's Mark 46, Roasted French Mendiant, Toasted French Spice) with ten in total. As mentioned we did not want to create something we previously had so after some back and forth we went with five Toasted French Spice, four Roasted French Mendiant and one Maker's Mark 46. Once the selection is made we went to the barrel filling room where we placed the ten stave profiles into a new charred oak barrel and filled it with cask strength Maker's Mark. The barrel rested until late December of 2023

#### ORC Angel's Envy Batch #3 Bourbon

Talk about a bourbon that has grown leaps and bounds over the years - that is Angel's Envy. With over eight different bourbon/rye releases the choices are endless. Angel's Envy is now paving the path for the future of bourbon.

They continue to challenge the status quo, always searching for what's next and inspiring new possibilities in the world



before bottling at 111.6 proof.

of bourbon. Our choice for our barrel selection was their traditional Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey finished in Port Wine barrels. The difference from our previous two barrels (Woodford/Maker's Mark) is that this is a Single Barrel, meaning no blending on our end. We do the blending in a hidden room not available to most anyone called Bar Ten. We chose between three different barrels and then they were cut with water to bring them to our desired 110 proof.

#### **ORC Old Forester Batch #3 Bourbon**

This distillery is state of the art, a culmination of a nearly 150-year legacy that began in

1870. It is located on Louisville's Main Street - dubbed Whiskey Row – the hub of the Bourbon business in Kentucky. There was no blending of bourbons in this tasting, we just chose from three single barrels. The Single Barrels were chosen from the various Rackhouses where they age their bourbon. This was important because each of these barrels has a different taste due to how high or low they are stored in the Rackhouse and the fluctuation in temperature in Kentucky between winter and summer. The barrel we ended up choosing was from Rackhouse I and was on the fifth floor. It rested for close to five years and is bottled at 100 proof.

The 33 barrels we have sourced for the Club averages out to 7,920 bottles of Bourbon which is an astonishing number. With each barrel selected over the years we have held back an average of 24 bottles of each for future generations to enjoy (however we will never disclose

where they are stored). We are anxiously awaiting two more barrels to arrive which are our ORC Knob Creek Batch #4 Rye (predominately used in our Smoked Old Fashioned in the Reef Lounge) and our ORC Elijah Craig Batch #2 Bourbon. More on those in the future.

With the strong relationships we have built with our distillery friends through the years, one came up with a new name for us...the ORC Barrel Bois. As always, it is truly an honor to be a part of the Ocean Reef Club Food & Beverage team and we take great pride in providing these unique offerings to our Members. They will be available in all F&B locations today as well as Port O' Call. October 2024 cannot get here soon enough so we can see what new offerings are out there. Until then...enjoy!





# A Reminder of Reality

"By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are and to dust you will return." Genesis 3:19

Perhaps you saw someone this past Wednesday with a dark smudge on their forehead and wondered what it was. It was there because the person had invited a priest or pastor to put it there on a day known as Ash Wednesday.

If you looked carefully, you could see that the smudge is a small cross. This symbolic act is known as 'the imposition of ashes.' The symbol is a reminder of our mortality. It is enacted with the words from Genesis, reminding us that these bodies of ours are dust and will someday return to dust.

It is not morbid. Instead, it grounds us in life, by facing a reality that we go to great lengths to ignore or deny. It also grounds us in hope.

Most of us know someone who has received a psychological diagnosis known as bipolar. It is a mental health condition marked by behavior that swings between two extremes. It is not something a person chooses to be and thankfully, can be managed

therapeutically.

However, it appears we are living in a bipolar world of extremes politically, economically, and in how we value human worth and dignity. On the one hand, we seem to be living in a culture of death.

This past October 7th, we witnessed acts of evil perpetrated by demented members of the extremist Islamist group Hamas. The group's stated intent is to destroy every Jew living between the 'river and the sea.' Those who march under that banner mistakenly think it is a cry for justice. It is instead, a call for annihilation.

The war in Ukraine, once top of mind, has now become the topic of a funding debate in the halls of Congress. I have no idea what the right answer is. But the blue and yellow ribbon is a continuing reminder that dictators the world over are willing to sacrifice the lives of others to achieve their self-centered ambitions of power and domination.

The streets of our cities and the halls of our schools too often are running red with the blood of the victims of violence. Life is cheap and death is meted out with callous indifference.

Women's reproductive rights are at the center of political debate as we approach another presidential election. Whatever your position on abortion may be, those who promote the right to abort a healthy child at full term for any reason are promoting a culture of death and injustice for the rights of the unborn.

On the other hand, we are at the same time, a culture

obsessed with the denial of death. We are whistling past the graveyard, pretending it's not there.

Don't get me wrong. I'm grateful for all the medical advances that promote a longer, healthy life. However, we spend a fortune on treatments and services that mask the inevitable reality of aging and the ultimate demise of our physical bodies. It is a form of denial.

All this is a reminder that the world as it is, is not the world as it should be. The reality of aging, suffering, violence, and death is a reminder that we are not as we should be. Something has gone terribly wrong and needs to be set right.

The smudge of Ash Wednesday matters because it first connects us to our deepest yearning – the yearning that death will not have the final word.

In the wisdom writings of the Hebrew Scriptures, you find the Book of Job. In the middle

of the book, amid the agony of Job's sufferings, you read these words:

"I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand upon the earth.

And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God; I myself will see him with my own eyes – I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me."

The smudge of Ash Wednesday also matters because it connects us to genuine hope – the hope of life beyond death.

The symbol that the imposition of ashes marks on our forehead is the symbol of the cross – a reminder of an actual historical event. That event was God's act of redemption for us and all creation through the death and the resurrection of Jesus.

What if those smudges are not a symbol of religion, but rather, a profound symbol of reality? Something to think about.


# Visiting Priests to Lead Catholic Masses



# The Incredible Story of Mara Cakans

At a very young age (4 years old), Mara Cakans learned to water ski. Water skiing was a family tradition; her parents were two of the original Min-Aqua Bats performers in Minocqua, Wisconsin. The Min-Aqua Bats Water Show is the world's oldest continually running amateur water ski show. Mara would be the pivot performer in the show during the summers. She would retain her love for all outside sports as she grew up, particularly running, which kept her fit.

Five years ago, Mara, now married (Willie) with two daughters, Marlie and Macy, noticed a pain in her right leg while running. It was an intermittent pain, but one day, Mara, a twenty-year nurse practitioner, working at our Medical Center, decided to take an MRI to check it out. The result was that she had a tumor on top of her left femur above the knee and was later diagnosed as osteosarcoma, a rare cancer typically found in children and young adults. After four months of painful chemotherapy, the tumor had not shrunk, so she underwent an eight-hour surgery during which the knee was replaced and a rod was inserted up her femur. Tests indicated success, and after therapy, Mara resumed regular physical activity, which included a lot of biking.

Later, in 2022, Mara noticed a bulge above her left knee, not a good omen. Scans indicated that her cancer had returned, so they determined the best facility for treatment was Sloan-Kettering in New York City. Surgeons there told her options were either a high amputation or a rarely done rotation plasty. Rotation plasty is a

complicated procedure in which the doctors remove the diseased part of the leg from above the knee to above the ankle. The ankle and foot are then attached to the femur in reverse so that the ankle becomes the patient's new knee.

Mara weighed her options. The amputation would mean a complete prosthesis with an artificial foot with no knee. The rotationplasty, while much more complicated and risky, offered the chance of having a knee joint with the rest of her leg being a prosthesis, which meant she could do many of the things she used to do. Together with her husband Willie, the girls, and Dr. Rene Fernandez, they decided on the more complicated procedure.

On November 1, 2022, Mara underwent the major surgery. It took a vascular surgeon, two special surgeons, and a plastic surgeon 16 hours, during which 12 units of blood were required. When she finally awoke from the anesthetic, and with her family, friends, and surgeons all watching, they asked her to move her toes. With her re-attached foot now backward, she had to concentrate on exactly what she wanted her brain to tell her toes what to do. But she did! Each toe worked! Imagine the hundreds of nerves and blood vessels that had to be precisely reconnected to make that possible. A miracle indeed. Now, Mara had to get a prosthesis and learn to walk again. She would spend ten days in the hospital and six weeks of therapy, after which she flew home and then endured eight hours of therapy three times per week for four weeks.

The Hanger Company, the largest prosthetic maker in the world, agreed to make Mara the leg she needed to walk. In April of 2023, she had to make six trips to New York City, each time fine-tuning adjustments were made by specialists to ensure her new leg fit properly. Then she was sent to the Mayo Clinic, to rotationplasty experts for fitting and adaptation. This process took several months, but

Mara could go back and forth from Mayo to their cabin in Minocqua.

Unfortunately, near the end of August, her leg fractured and Mara was back on the operating table. This time, a rod was inserted into her femur from her knee to her hip. The procedure took six hours, and after some rehab, she finally came back to Ocean Reef and tried to find some normalcy.

During this tribulation, Mara had decided to be a victor instead of a victim and found strength and courage from her faith, family, and friends. She recalls waking up in her hospital bed during one of her most difficult times to find Rene Fernandez sleeping on the floor next to her bed. An Ocean Reef member gave her their apartment in New York, saving her from going to a hotel and she was able to fly back to Ocean Reef in a private jet provided by an Ocean Reef member.

A dedicated account was established as part of the Medical Center Foundation earmarked for Mara to ease the burden of traveling back and forth and housing. Scores of Ocean Reefers contributed, amassing funds well into the six figures. The Racquet Club did the same to help Willie and the family.



# February is American Heart Month

2024 marks the American Heart Association's 100th anniversary - a century of research in helping to save lives from heart disease.

Before the American Heart Association existed. people with heart disease were thought to be doomed to complete bed rest — or destined to imminent death. But a handful of pioneering physicians and social workers believed it didn't have to be that way. They conducted studies to learn more about heart disease, America's No. 1 killer. Then, on June 10, 1924, they met in Chicago to form the American Heart Association — believing that



scientific research could lead the way to better treatment, prevention and ultimately a cure. The early American Heart Association enlisted help from hundreds, then thousands, of physicians and scientists. (1)

#### **Heart Attack vs. Cardiac Arrest**

People often use the terms interchangeably, but they are different. Put simply, cardiac arrest occurs when the electrical system of the heart malfunctions and stops beating unexpectedly. This is an electrical problem. A heart attack occurs when blood flow is blocked to the heart. This is a circulation problem. Early intervention and regular checkups can help to keep your heart healthy and help to avoid either of these incidents from happening.

Gender can often play a part in heart attack symptoms. According to the American Heart Association women are more likely, than men, to have silent heart attacks. Silent heart attacks do not show obvious symptoms and can include:

 Pain in the back, neck, jaw, or throat


- Indigestion

- Extreme fatigue or shortness of breath



### **Dressed Up For** the Valentine Ball

The Northern Cardinal is one of the most familiar birds in North America. Often simply called "the redbird" it is at home in cities and towns, backyards, dense woods, swamps, most anywhere there are weeds, seeds, fruits and grains.

Cardinals have an extensive range from southern Canada throughout the east and central US and down into Mexico. Here at Ocean Reef we have an abundance of

resident Cardinals. Both the male and female are early risers and will begin singing their extensive variety of crystal clear songs at the first hint of light.

The bright red colors of the male Northern Cardinal coupled with the high frequency of sightings often cause birders to overlook other red birds such as

the Summer and Scarlet Tanagers. What cannot be overlooked however is the Cardinal's aggressive defense of its territory including loud singing and sometimes fighting with its own reflected image in a window. These disputes seldom result in much damage other than a tired bird with a sore beak.

During courtship the male will often feed the female and they will sign together. The female does most of the nest building and both supply material. Both parents provide food for the brood as they mature. Some pairs remain together for years.

Whenever you see or hear either a male or female Cardinal alone you can expect that the mate will not be far away. In the photos, taken near the 13th tee on the Hammock Course, is a pair of these beautiful and colorful birds ready for the Valentine's weekend.

Well, it took a little research, but I found the person who can provide some of the answers to those questions. I met **Chip Hillyer**, a long-time Equity Member and Vice Commodore of the Ocean Reef Yacht Club.

#### History

Chip is a self-effacing and understated guy with no personal ego. He was raised in New Jersey. Leaving private high school at 17. Chip bought a gas station. Much to their chagrin, he moved from his parents' house to a small room close to work. An only child of parents who were introverted, well-educated and bordering on genius level, Chip bucked tradition and wanted nothing to do with college. Chip loved the gas station and did everything from oil changes to tires and tune-ups. He was a oneman show.

Soon thereafter he met his wife in a local restaurant, she was a great sailor who introduced him to the Jersey Shore along with boating and sailing. He took to it like a duck to water.

As time went on, Chip did go back to school and earned an Engineering Degree as well as a Manufacturing Degree. With two degrees in hand, his parents were delighted. Chip explains, "Dad asked, 'Are you going to be a corporate man or are you going to go be the entrepreneur you have always been?' I told him, 'I really want to get into the assembly machine business because I think I can make some real changes there."' After

working as project engineer for various companies, his ambition and entrepreneurial spirit kicked in.

Chip recounts, "A few months later, I quit my job and started my own company. My wife was beside herself. She wanted a house, a country club, and that lifestyle. I asked her to please hold on and wait and trust me. That night I went up to the third floor of our duplex house and started designing index drives for assembly machines." Chip grew the business and explained, "We won the contract to build an assembly machine for Gillette. We embarked on assembling the Mach 3 razor blade cartridges for Gillette at an unbelievable volume and timeline." This would be the company's final job. Chip takes great pride in the fact that they sold the company to the employees in an ESOP (Employee Stock Ownership Plan).

During this time, he also raised his two successful sons by himself. It takes a village," he said, "and I have had many friends that helped me along this journey. I am incredibly proud of the young men I raised.

#### Flags and Burgees

"My mind is always churning. At this time, I was a member of the Island Heights Yacht Club in New Jersey. I walked down to a little ship store, and I saw this sorry-looking burgee. Since I owned an Engineering Company I looked at the label and felt we could enhance the manufacturing of burgees and custom flags. We designed a laser cutter for nylon

so that the flags would no longer tangle. It was such a success that we started manufacturing burgees for yacht clubs, golf flags for golf courses, and custom flags for homeowners. When the Club was having trouble with their inventory and supplier, we were able to fulfill orders so that American flags and burgees flown around the Club could be quickly replaced when needed.

To this day, we manufacture a flag that carries a lifetime

guarantee! My friends always say, 'Whose lifetime?!"

Today, Chip's flags still fly high around Ocean Reef Club – a source of pride for Chip who has been a Member for 13 years. The next time you're admiring the sunrise at The Point or enjoying lunch at the Raw Bar, take a closer look at the flag masts and know they were created with care and fondness for our Club. That's something we can all share!







# The Dive Shop's Commitment to the Environment

As dive operators and community members of the Club and the Florida Keys, we have the privilege of sharing our great experiences in this corner of the world with family and friends. Being able to pass along our knowledge and love for this underwater environment is the reason why the conservation of our reefs is at the forefront and center of all the activities at The Dive Shop at The Reef.

We invite Members to be part of this effort with us. Here are some of the past and continuing environmental efforts that you can take part in:

#### **Coral Restoration Efforts**

Since the introduction of Coral Restoration Foundation (CRF) to the Club nearly a decade ago, and in collaboration with the Ocean Reef Conservation team, we developed a monthly event combining hands-on training and transplanting outings that resulted in the first of such corals at Carysfort. These efforts evolved into an unprecedented investment from the Club to create a coral nursery focusing on restoring Carysfort Reef. This commitment is still in place, and Carysfort is now an example of what great work can be done. It has been selected as one of NOAA's seven iconic reefs. We continue to work with CRF and have additionally partnered with Ken Nedimyer and Reef Renewal USA to help maintain the only pop-up nursery at Carysfort. Members and guests can enjoy tours of the nursery and have the opportunity to help. The Dive Shop at The Reef also donates Cool Coral Cat and crew to help annually with CoralPalooza.

Goal: Clean Seas Florida Keys (NMSF & FKNMSF)

We were lucky to be the first dive shop to receive the National Marine Sanctuary Foundation (NMSF) grant, conducting the first-ever marine debris cleanup in August 2018 under Goal: Clean Seas Florida Keys. The work was essential following Hurricane Irma and the release of 150,000 lobster traps which scattered, furthering the potential for further reef devastation. This program continues, and the shop has now removed thousands of pounds of debris as well as thousands of feet of lines and ropes from our local Turtle and Carysfort Reefs. Our involvement in these efforts and collaboration with these organizations, other than the obvious goal, is to engage the Ocean Reef community and become their vessel to extend their interest and commitment straight into the water through active participation in restoration efforts.


#### **REEF Lionfish Removal**

On my way to the island, I found a toilet seat. When I got to the island, I found animal bones. I will be putting those bones on my shelf tonight."

"Dylan and I were just minding our own business when a giant crab jumped onto our boat. I yelled, which scared him. So we fell. We were met by the disturbing and uncomfortable dark water. Soon after, I touched my face and was surprised I felt nothing. My glasses were gone! I looked through the water slamming the kicked-up ocean floor but couldn't see my glasses. Then Tanner from the Recreation Department dove in the water and found them. We also saw a croc."

Siena Wright, Grade 6: "The Coastal Cleanup was some much fun! I mostly collected rope and bottles. I am so happy that I got the chance to make the ocean a better place for animals."

Josh Lyons, Grade 6: "My partner and I went around the mangroves, and we spotted something. As we got closer, we realized it was a giant boat buoy. We tied it to the front of the kayak. It was one of the biggest pieces of trash."





surprise we had. The Norton is a gem of a museum.

In delving into its history, we discovered it opened in 1941. R.H. Norton retired as President of the Acme Steel Company in Chicago and moved to Palm Beach in the late 1930's. He and his wife Charlotte decided to share their art and sculpture collection with the citizens

of the Palm Beaches. The museum building has morphed from a Neoclassical building to a stunning contemporary building. The Norton is now the largest art museum in Florida with 8,000+ objects.



### Return 'Em Right

Do Your Part in Helping Released Fish Survive

Reading the accompanying article from Bonnie **DeeDee Lisenby** on page 47 set off a search for more information about descenders. As anglers, we've been aware of the Keep 'Em Wet program, but are you familiar with Return 'Em Right? Check out returnemright.org for an informative and very well-done four-minute video about returning them right.

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) approved a rule last year that not only requires the possession of a descending device or venting tool that is rigged and ready for use onboard a vessel when fishing

for - including catch and release - reef fish in state waters, but also requires their use if a fish is exhibiting signs of pressure-related injuries known as barotrauma prior to release. The signs include the stomach protruding out of the mouth, bulging eyes, bloated belly, distended intestines and the inability to swim down independently.

If fishing in Gulf federal waters, anglers must have either a descending device or a venting tool that is rigged and ready for use. While in Atlantic federal waters, anglers are required to have a descending device that is readily available for use. Visit MyFWC.com/ ReefFishGear for current reef fish gear requirements in Florida state waters. Another reminder for anyone who plans to fish for certain reef fish species (snappers, groupers, grunts, jacks, porgies, seabass, spadefish, hogfish, triggerfish, and tilefish) from a private recreational vessel (includes anglers over 65 years of age), Florida now requires that you sign up for the free State Reef Fish Angler designation and renew it annually. Sign up at

### GoOutdoorsFlorida.com.

In a blog from the University of Florida, a descending tool is described as a weighted device with either a specialized hook or grip that is attached to the fish lip or gill cover to return a bloated fish to at least 50 feet of water. A venting tool is described as a hollow needle that is inserted into the air bladder at a 45-degree angle just behind the pectoral fins. Knives and ice picks are not legal venting tools and do more harm than good.

Nick Haddad, Communications Director for Return 'Em Right Sustainable Fisheries, wrote an excellent article, "Fact or Fiction: Dispelling Myths About Barotrauma, Venting & Descending" for the Texas Saltwater Fishing Magazine. Here's a brief summary:

**Myth 1:** Just pop the swim bladder sticking out of the mouth.

**Fact:** Don't. It's not a swim bladder. It's the stomach. Doing so harms the fish and doesn't successfully release the gases in the body cavity.

Myth 2: Descending devices spoon-feed sharks and dolphins. Fact: A fish being descended acts nothing like a fish fighting for its life on the way up. Sharks are attracted to the vibrations and struggles of a fish fighting to survive and get off the hook. Data from an ongoing study has shown that incidents of predation were few as compared to letting a fish float off on the surface. A wounded, vented fish still has to swim past predators to the bottom to survive.

**Myth 3:** That fish is dead already.

Fact: No, it's not. A fish that looks fully blown up from barotrauma and that looks lifeless at the surface still has a great chance to survive, to grow, spawn and contribute to the future of the stock. Video releases, acoustic telemetry studies and mark-recapture studies have provided evidence that descending devices are successful in fish recompression.

Mr. Haddad offers this moral of the story. "Not every fish will survive release, but it's our responsibility to give each one their best shot!"

Jud grabbed the fish off the surface of the ocean and clipped the descender onto the corner of his mouth, Jud put the hogfish back in the ocean, released the descender down, down, down into the water. When Mr. Hogfish

reached recovery depth, he was able to swim off as the descender does not restrain the fish. We never saw Mr. Hogfish surface again and wished him well as he returned to the comfort of his home deep in the ocean.

Team Presentation sighed in relief and then rejoiced in a job well done by Captain and Mate. Where were we fishing? In 65 feet of water with a coral reef bottom.

Note: Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission requires a descending device to be rigged and ready to use when fishing for reef fish in the state waters of Florida (up to three miles out on the east coast and up to nine miles out on the west coast). Additionally, use is required when a fish is showing signs of barotrauma. Read more in **Mary Bloom's** article on page 45.

# Tennis Technique Essentials



'Tennis Tip" by Hannah Fleckenstein, Head Tennis Professional

Have you ever stopped to think about what each part of your body is doing during a shot on the tennis court? It can be hard because there is not much time to think when you are hitting.

When I break it down for someone in detail, I can talk about everything between your toes and your eyeballs. So instead of detailing every particular movement on the court, I boil it down to two things:

1.Not having conflicting movement: we always want our body and racket moving together, not against each other to accomplish optimal timing and

increase consistency. An example of conflicting movement is when a player moves forward in the court for the ball while simultaneously taking their racket back. To avoid this, split step when your opponent makes contact with the ball and immediately take your racket back once you read what shot you will be hitting next. Regardless of depth, you will be ready to move forward or backward for the ball, and your racket will be ready to swing forward.

2. Timing: Once you get your racket ready early, your timing will improve. You might even feel like you have too much time because you are ready so early. To improve and get comfortable with timing on the court, say to yourself "bounce, hit." Although it sounds simple, it really can do wonders for contact, consistency, and overall focus.



### BRIDGE TIP OF THE WEEK

### Balancing After Both Opponents Have Bid

by Gregg Van Dyke, Director of Card & Games

When the opponents have stopped at a low-level contract, you will often want to make a balancing bid or takeout double to try to find a contract of your own. Fairly aggressive balancing bids are especially popular at matchpoint (pairs) play, where the rewards can be great. However, there is some risk in entering the auction after the opponents have exchanged information, so you should adopt a more conservative balancing style in IMP (team) games and Rubber Bridge.

To determine whether or not you should reopen the bidding in these situations, keep these general rules in mind:

### THE BEST TIME TO BALANCE IS WHEN:

1. The opponents have stopped in a low-level suit part score (1 or 2) - especially if it's possible that you can find a 2-level contract of your own (they've stopped in 2C, 2D, or 2H or below).

- 2. The opponents have found a trump fit (they have bid and raised a suit).
- 3. The opponents have limited their high-card strength (they have willingly stopped in a part score).
- 4. You have length and high-card strength in the unbid suit(s).
- 5. You're not vulnerable.

The opponents will be less tempted to double because a set would only score +100 instead of +110 or +140.

### THE WORST SITUATIONS FOR BALANCING ARE WHEN:

- 1. You are extremely weak (fewer than 7-8 pts.).
- 2. You have a strong holding in their suit or you suspect they have a better contract available.
- 3. The opponents haven't found a good trump fit (they've stopped in 1NT or had an auction that suggests a misfit). Typical non-fitting auctions are 1H-1NT; 1C-1S-1NT-P; 1C-1H-2C-2H; 1H-1S-2D-P.
- 4. Your honor cards are in the opponents' suits (especially the suit bid on your left).
- 5. You're vulnerable -- the opponents are more likely to double because a one-trick set (+200) will be greater than the value of their part score.















