# 19th Annual Catwalk

Bryan revealed that Ocean Reef Club and ORCAT have agreed that construction of the new Grayvik Animal Center will commence this summer in a prime location at the corner of Marina Drive and Gatehouse Road.

The Grayvik Center has been providing veterinary services to the Ocean Reef community since 2006 and is





currently Home of ORCAT, Inc., a not-for-profit 501(c) (3) organized exclusively for charitable purposes and for the prevention of cruelty to animals. Dr. Lora Cummings heads Grayvik and manages the veterinary care of more than 1,200 patients with services including wellness care, diagnostic testing, and general surgical and dental needs. The Grayvik Center also houses a cat adoption center and has over 3,000 cat visitations annually.

The clinic currently handles approximately 2,500 visits per season, with dedicated surgery days limiting other visits because there is no room to treat other pets. "There is so much more we

can do, and this new facility will enable us to do it," said Dr. Cummings about the need to meet increasing demand for care.

The new, two-story Grayvik Center will include a veterinary clinic, grooming

facility and cat adoption center, and will encompass 6,000 plus square feet. Tax deductible donations and fundraising events such as the Catwalk will assist with the new facility's capital costs.

Paul Bishop, the Master of Ceremonies, graced the fundraiser event with his signature charm. He introduced board member Annie Stamps, who presented the Penny W. Stamps Award to John Storm, in recognition of his loving support of Ocean Reef's feline community.

For the third consecutive year, ORCAT partnered with fashion powerhouse Neiman Marcus Coral Gables, which showcased 42 looks featuring Spring 2024 creations of renowned designers such as Ferragamo, Dolce & Gabbana, Carolina Herrera, Valentino, Oscar de la Renta, Ralph Lauren, Burberry, Zimmermann, and other esteemed fashion houses. home with All Charities Director Lesa Crayne.

Winners of raffle items at the Catwalk who were not able to pick up their prizes may do so at the ORCA office.

ORCAT's mission is to humanely reduce and control Ocean Reef's feral cat population through an aggressive Trap-Neuter-Release (TNR) program of spaying, neutering, and maintaining existing small, managed, nonbreeding feral cat colonies (collectively referred to as working cats) and by maintaining an effective adoption program. Working cats effectively manage the vermin population, which was previously a nuisance in Ocean Reef. Their presence has reduced the need for potentially harmful baits or rodenticides that could pose risks to pets and endangered species bordering the Ocean Reef community.

Thanks to ORCAT's efforts, Ocean Reef's cat population has been reduced from thousands in the 1990s to a healthier population that includes 106 cats in the adoption centers and 211 working cats in small, controlled colonies.



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## Then & Now

Ocean Reef's First Chairman Reminisces

How fortunate we are. My wife **Sally** and I came to Ocean Reef over 45 years ago. Long enough ago that our four children were still in our household. Today three of our four children have places of their own at ORC and the family with significant others adds to about 30.

Although it was a far different place 45 years ago it was still a very, very special place, even then.

The Club was developerowned in those days and had just started charging dues a few years before, the dues were \$250.00. (That would be nice.)

Our first property purchase was at Fisherman's

Cove (which was just built). We invited three Canadian friends to join us and collectively we purchased a four-unit building for about \$200k/unit.

In those days there was no Clubhouse, Cultural Center, Town Hall and The Medical Center was at a different location, very small and mostly handed out band-aids and directed you to one of the hospitals. Card Sound Golf Club was here but was recently opened. The entry was \$25,000 and there were still spots available.

Rich, poor, or boat captain, made no difference we were all here together. And we played and dined together.

The Islander was here and very popular even then, but The Galley, which was where the Burgee and Gianni are today, was the most popular spot on The Reef. It was a one-story

building with screens instead of windows. It was the first place you went when you arrived in the fall and the last place in the spring.

There were no reservations, no crowding at the four-corners and the vehicle of choice was your golf cart (very vanilla) or the two-year-old station wagon you brought down from up north. The boat of choice was a 25-foot Mako but we still caught lots of fish. There were a few sport fishing boats and only a couple of flat boats with poling towers.

The majority of owners in those days were from The Midwest and many had flyit-yourself planes that they kept right on the grass along the runway.

No fitness center (can you believe it) but we did have a skeet range where the fitness center is today. We had two golf courses that seemed to

grow more rocks than grass.

Fast forward, add a Clubhouse, Cultural Center, Fitness Center, expanded Art League, Town Hall, upgraded golf courses, the Chapel and the best-of-breed Medical Center. And we have the paradise of today.

We loved it back then and we still love it now. We feel multi-blessed that we have been able to raise our family here and also watch their families grow up here.

How lucky we are to live on The Reef and with very competent community and Club leaders focused on sustaining the dream.

competitiveness and quality of life. By "fixing" Florida's water, Everglades restoration is creating a healthy environment and healthy economy. The Everglades also replenish the Biscayne Aquifer, the source of drinking water for 9 million South Floridians.

Learn about Everglades restoration progress and


its ramifications for our economy, real estate values and freshwater supply at a presentation from The Everglades Foundation at 4:30 p.m. on **Wednesday**, **February 28**, **2024**, at the Cultural Center at Ocean Reef. panel of state and local economic and real estate experts.

"Increased freshwater flow helps restore the vital salinity balance in Florida Bay that has made it the Fishing Capital of the World," Eikenberg said. "The bay currently suffers from too much saltwater that has led to massive seagrass dieoffs, which severely harm the ecosystem – and our economy. We are at a critical juncture on Everglades restoration, and the stakes are high."

The February 28 presentation is hosted by the Ocean Reef Conservation Association and the Cultural Center at Ocean Reef. Northern Trust is sponsoring the event, which will be followed by a wine and cheese reception.








#### **Father Jim Shea**



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

I pointed out that chicken fighting was outlawed years ago and I was having no part of this feathered scheme.

into this rooster ruckus. When I went to the trusty Google with "keys chickens" it was immediately obvious that Key West had cornered the keys publicity coop for virtually all things "chicken". 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# Look What the Wind Blew In!



"Nature Notes" by Nancy Zakon

I'd never heard or seen them, but they blew into the Ocean Reef Press office one morning after a January heavy rain. Have you ever seen little shrimp-shaped critters on your front porch or in your pool? They are about a half inch long. These are called "Lawn Shrimp", and their harmless existence is fascinating. Their ancestors (cousins of the crab, shrimp, crayfish, land crab) began in the sea some 500 mil years ago, and found a niche of survival on land, but in wet conditions. They live just under the soil about half an inch, in damp land areas like Florida.

You'll see them under potted plants and foliage ground cover. They are the Goldilocks of crustaceans: environment must be not too wet or too dry, but just right. Lacking the waxy shell (exoskeleton) of an insect, they don't hold moisture and dry out quickly. If the soil is too dry, they move to wetter areas (that could be to your pool – too wet, and they die). If the land is too wet as in the rains we had in January, they move to drier turf

(that could be to your porch or patio – where they dry out and die). Poor dears!

Are they harmful? Not at all. Since they eat rotted flora and fauna, they help in soil formation. They don't eat your plants, your home or bother your dog. Do they bite? No, not unless you are a moldering leaf or decayed piece of wood. Do you need an exterminator? No, again. Just a broom or vacuum will do the job. As to their life underground, Lawn

Shrimp are active at night and that is why they can be found dead in mornings after a storm - often in masses – on porches and patios. Generally, only one brood is made per year and the eggs are laid in a pouch. The babies look like the adult. The complete life cycle is one year but numbers can get into the thousands with extremely wet seasons. Fair notice! These land-dwelling Lawn Shrimp are found in Australia and nearby areas of the Pacific. They have been introduced to other places, like California in 1967, New Zealand, the British Isles, North Carolina, and Florida (an unusual assortment of locations)!

Since they look like shrimp, you may gingerly...hesitantly ask if they are edible? Native Americans roasted them over coals and ate them like popcorn. They do turn pink and taste like their larger cousins, I read. I'd choose them over crickets... perhaps...

One can never guess what the wind blows in!



The guys then headed to Georgia's room with chicken wings, fried macaroni bites, and wine. Not especially fancy for an experienced chef, but it was all he could buy in town. His charms worked.

The two chefs spent the summer working for the same property, but at different restaurants. Once summer started wrapping up, Howie decided he didn't want his

Since then, the two have been rotating their time between summer jobs in Jamaica and in the U.S. with winters working at The Reef, where the couple have spent the last five seasons. Georgia is a chef in Banquets and Howie is a sushi chef at The Islander.

"I've worked at many clubs and no other place has such caring staff and Members as we do here," said Georgia, who calls Ocean Reef their second home outside Jamaica. "The housing is great, people are happy to see you, the Members care about us."

#### Winters at The Reef

Howie and Georgia are among more than 180 associates in the Club's Food and Beverage division in the International Professional Visa program (H-2b). It offers participants, encompassing line cooks, servers, hosts, bussers, and dishwashers, continued employment throughout the year with seasonal positions in both winter and summer at private clubs and resorts. Associates can remain in the program for up to three years. Once the 36 months expire, they're required to go back to their countries for a 95-day reset period. Then they are eligible to start the cycle all over again.

"This continued alliance allows us to retain top talent that share and understand the unique-way-of-life philosophy with service and professionalism visible throughout our community," said Tammy Adams, the Club's Director of Talent Acquisition and Retention, whose team fosters strong relationships with more than 15 other luxury clubs by hosting and participating in job fairs and other meetings. "We can elevate and customize overall Club experiences each year," she said.

#### **Roots in Jamaican Cooking**

Howie grew up in Kingston and Georgia in St. Ann. They each developed their love for cooking at a young age. Georgia's grandmother insisted that everyone in the family learn how to cook or bake something so that they could always fend for themselves.

For Howie, learning how to cook came out of necessity. He lost his father, a chef with a catering business, in a car crash when he was 11 years old. His mother rented out

their catering equipment to help ends meet. Howie took food and nutrition classes in high school and went on to college for hospitality. He started his own business catering Christmas dinners, funerals, and parties. One special 10-year-anniversary dinner he cooked for a local man he knew from church was particularly gratifying.

"He knew my father well," said Howie, who used all his father's equipment from chaffing pans, to glassware to pots and pans to prepare the meal. "He told me how proud my father would have been to see that he inspired my passion for cooking."

In addition to being a chef, Howie is a talented photographer. He's often seen around The Reef with his Nikon Z62 in hand. He loves capturing candid moments of Members and special events like the air show on Vintage Weekend, Festival on The Green, and concerts on Buccaneer Island.

Last June, Howie and Georgia married. Some of their friends who they met at Ocean Reef flew to Ocho Rios for their wedding. In fact, Howie's boss Eric Andreu, who taught him everything he knows about preparing sushi, was one of his groomsmen.

Up next for the Dennises: Parenthood. The couple are expecting their first child, due in July.

We had some of our regular 'artists' submit their new works as well as new Art League members submit for the first time ever. As I visited around the room, guests shared which pieces they voted





### Hooked on Patagonia

A Father-Son Fishing Journey

After an overnight stay in Santiago, my son and I took a 6:59 a.m. flight to Balmaceda, Chile, 900 miles to the south. We were greeted by Sebastian, one of the owners of the Cinco Rios Lodge, and after an hour's drive, we found ourselves on the outskirts of Coyhaigue, Chile, our home for the next three days of fishing.

Fishing here is done with inflatable pontoon boats, some equipped with small motors for the high-altitude lakes in the area, but most with oars. Our target species were large rainbow and brown trout, and we were there for hopper season. Grasshoppers were hatching in the area, and the larger fish were rising to the top to feed on these large insects.

This isn't a numbers game. We targeted the larger fish with larger flies. The majority of fish were 18 to 22 inches, nice trophies.

We then moved an hour and a half east to their other lodge,

La Estancia del Zorro. Here the fishing is done from the land, and we waded in the numerous rivers and creeks in the area. The fishing here was very good, and my son (who is a much better fly fisherman than myself) caught over 30 large trout in a day.

We were preparing for our 6th and final day of fishing when our guide, Christian, came over to us after dinner. "Señor Miguel, would you like to go hunting tomorrow?" Confused, I said, "Well, no Christian, we are only interested in fishing." Christian laughed and said, "No, Señor Miguel, we will be hunting for brown trout." Christian continued, "There is an area where we can fish that is very shallow, only one to one

and a half feet deep. We walk the banks and look for a feeding fish or a fish we can see in the water, then we try to get into position to make a cast without spooking the fish. You usually only get one cast at the fish; it is very challenging, but to watch a 20-inch trout hit your dry fly in a foot of water is really spectacular."

So, my son and I agreed and

spent the next day in total seclusion, walking the banks of this small creek area. We both caught five, but it was a large brown trout crush your topwater grasshopper fly in a foot of water. If you're a trout fisherperson, I am sure your mouth is watering now, so consider Patagonia, Chile for your next adventure.

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### **Doubles Return** Tactic from the **Deuce Court**

One of the most effective doubles return tactics you can use from the deuce court is the lob down the line. It works well against aggressive net players that position too close to the net or players that serve and volley. The goal is to target the area behind the net player. If you happen to leave the lob to return a little short, but get the direction right, the opponent's net person will have a high backhand volley which most club-level players do not love to hit. If you execute the return correctly, it will force the server to hit a running backhand groundstroke down the line if they want to avoid your partner at the net which is not an easy task. Many times this ball will come back short to your partner to put away. If it comes back to you your best options are to either attack this shot with your forehand or follow the lob in and attack with a volley. In both cases, you want to target the center of the court at the net person's backhand vollev if they're a right-handed player or the open center for a clean winner. One of the best ways for the server to counter this lob is to lob it again back cross-court over your partner's head.

So, next time you're playing against someone aggressive at the net and you're having trouble getting that return cross-court, try a lob down the line.

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#### **SWING TIP**

### Quick & Easy Speed Drill

One of the most asked questions I receive is how to hit the golf ball further. I have a lot of great ways to help you do this, but an easy drill to do on your own is simply flipping the club over.

To the hit the ball further, you need to swing your arms faster. Back faster and through faster. It should be equal both ways.

We find many people trying to bring the club back slowly

and then faster through. Take a driver and flip it over in your hands. Let it hover above the ground and take some swings and see if you can make a "whoosh" sound. If there's no whoosh, let your arms and wrists relax and swing it faster! If there is a whoosh sound, make sure it's happening where the golf ball would be. The sound comes where the fastest part of your swing is happening and we want that to be where the ball is!

Take three or four swings back and forth without stopping, then flip the club back to normal and see if you can recreate it!

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
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### Stef Shaw First Female Invited to PING Program

### BRIDGE TIP OF THE WEEK

### Mastering Cue Bids in Bridge



by Gregg Van Dyke, Director of Card & Games

Cue Bids are versatile tools in the arsenal of bridge players, offering a range of functions to communicate crucial information during the game. Here's a breakdown of their various applications:

1. Showing Control for Slam Purposes: Cue Bids can reveal control, such as holding an ace or a void, in a particular suit. This information helps assess the potential for bidding slam contracts.

- 2. Indicating a Two-Suited Hand: In certain scenarios, Cue Bids can signify a hand with strength and distribution across two suits, aiding in further bidding decisions.
- **3.** Expressing a Strong Raise: They can also convey a strong raise in partner's suit, indicating substantial support and potentially aiming for a higher contract level.
- **4.** Creating a Force: Cue Bids can be employed to force partner to bid further, ensuring that necessary information is exchanged before reaching a final contract.
- **5.** Asking for a Stopper: They serve as a means to inquire about the presence of a stopper in a particular suit, crucial for pursuing no-trump contracts.

**6.** Showing a Stopper: Conversely, Cue Bids can also demonstrate the possession of a stopper in a suit, aiding in determining the viability of certain contract options.

#### **Employing Cue Bids**

When employing Cue Bids, it's essential to understand their timing and context within the bidding sequence. For instance, after a Major Suit agreement at the three level or higher, or after a Minor Suit agreement at the four level or higher, new suits become slam-oriented Cue Bids

For instance, consider the following scenarios:

#### **Major Suit Example:**

Opener: 1DResponder: 1HOpener: 3H

Responder: 4C
 Here, the bid of 4 Clubs by

Responder indicates 1st round control of clubs (ace or void) and expresses slam interest in hearts.

#### **Minor Suit Example:**

Opener: 1CResponder: 1DOpener: 3D

• Responder: 3H

In this scenario, the bid of 3 Hearts by Responder is not a Cue Bid; rather, it aims to reach 3NT by indicating a stopper in hearts. To qualify as a Cue Bid, the agreement in the minor suit must occur at the four level.

By mastering the nuances of Cue Bids and understanding their varied purposes, bridge players can enhance their bidding strategies and improve their chances of success at the table.
