Epic Sailfish Days at Ocean Reef

Fish Counts Are Way Up!

In what can only be described as the best week of fishing for sailfish ever seen in Club history, a number of boats from Ocean Reef participated with distinction in posting record numbers of sailfish caught. By my informal survey,

the headcount of fish caught midweek, February 20 and 21, ranged from **Carl Tallardy** with 22 to Carl Lindner's "Seraphim's" one-day catch of 31, or to 37 for Tom Ripley's "Bad Fish" (who ran out of bait — and flags!), or **Benson** Ford's "Sweet Release" taking in 47, again in just one day, or "Double Take's" 50 or even better, "Jolene's" 61."Or the amazing record of 96 sails caught by Carmen Sferrazza's "Carma" over two consecutive days — one day alone catching 65. The previous record was held by **Rob Gothier's** "Bar South" with 45, so the record's been broken by 50 percent! This suggests that fishing in these waters is getting better and better...

What Happened?

An early predictor of last week's epic fishing was Tucker Ersek, a professional captain who has spent his life in Ocean Reef. His study of weather, current and seasonal aspects led him to conclude early on that this week's conditions would be ideal, and he acted accordingly,

How Sarah Cart helped save her husband's life....

In her book ON MY WAY BACK TO YOU, Sarah Cart gives a day-by-day account of the unimaginable challenges presented by her husband Ben's fight against a devastating disease, where the only possible cure lay in a heart transplant.

Sarah did not save husband Ben from an ocean's surge, or a forest fire, or a sniper's bullet. She saved Ben's life (like many other men and women who were forced by time or circumstance into the role of nurse and caregiver) by supervising medical treatments, organizing and administering the countless prescriptions, probing for answers from the internet and (often reluctant) medical practitioners; and by providing homecare between and after Ben's hospital stays. when professionals were either unsatisfactory or unavailable. Then there were also all those additional chores (bills, taxes, endless medical forms). For Sarah, this meant putting her own life on hold and overcoming a forever aversion to needles and blood

Though Sarah did the expected and a whole lot more, her most important contribution to Ben's survival was an optimistic spirit. She was aware that the odds of Ben's receiving the heart transplant essential to his recovery weren't good, but she continued to believe that in time it would happen - Ben would be able to keep his promise to be "On my way back to you". It was a phrase that subsequently became the title

of Sarah's detailed account of the torturous (for both of them) daily saga of Ben's three-year fight for life.

THE BOOK & THE AUTHOR.... I found On My Way Back to You by Sarah Cart intriguing, informative, sometimes suspenseful, and often heart-rending. I read it in two nights. On the second night, it was 1 a.m. when I finished the last chapter which ended with these words. "Ben is home. Thanks be to God."

I have known Ben and Sarah Cart, not as close friends but more as valued acquaintances. The Carts have been Ocean Reef Members since 2007. By OR standards they are a young couple (late 60s), the parents of four sons and grandparents to three girls and one more boy. At Ocean Reef, Sarah has been a frequent contributor to the Ocean Reef Press (her coverage of All Charities was awesome). She has also served as Commodore of the Yacht Club and as a Director on the Ocean Reef Club Board.

Ben co-founded a successful company, which resurrects defunct oil wells. He is an outdoorsman, who is an amateur expert in marine biology. Note: He is also a snake man, who is always on call for neighbors and friends who happen to come upon a serpent of any kind.

THE UNEXPECTED.... When Ben became ill, Sarah and Ben

were at the age where they were no longer saddled with young children and business worries. They had a full calendar of social activities and were often spotlighted on the dance floor at black-tie events at Ocean Reef and the neighboring Anglers Club.

Then in a routine visit to the OR Medical Center for their annual flu shot, Sarah mentioned Ben's swollen hands and feet and their doctor/friend Carlos Smith suggested that Ben skip the flu shot and instead have a blood

A few days later, Ben was diagnosed with a rare autoimmune condition called systemic sclerosis. This dire diagnosis was an event that could accurately be described as "a strike when you least expect it" – a favorite Cart phrase, which they had picked up fishing for salmon.

SO NOTED.... Sarah is a prodigious notetaker. Over the last 20 years, she has kept daily journals and religiously recorded events in her life as well as her thoughts and feelings. In the summer of 2017, Sarah's journal reflected in minute detail the progression and treatment of Ben's disease and her own evolving dedication as his caretaker. It is these notes that give immediacy and a compassionate insight to Sarah's story. On My Way Back to You is a book that can be truthfully described "in her own words".

Because Sarah's notes are so specific, personal and wellwritten, the reader becomes Sarah's companion on the harrowing medical journey that lasted the better (or worse) part of four years.

The details of that journey, as reflected in Sarah's journal entries (later edited for her book), began with the account of the diagnosis of Ben's autoimmune condition, which was followed by an increasing number of distressing symptoms that led to myriad other doctors and yet another frightening diagnosis - Congestive heart failure.

Though no one was quite sure whether the heart failure was the result of the autoimmune condition or if they were just co-existing horrors with similar symptoms (breathlessness, interrupted sleep, wounds to the feet and ankles that failed to heal, extreme fatigue and increasing confusion), for the first time the words "heart transplant" were uttered and the very slim chance of getting "on the list" was fantasized.

A NEW HEART.... Ben's long stay in the ICU at Cleveland Clinic began in late March 2020.

At first, Sarah looked on this quiet period at home as an opportunity to acquaint herself with all the things Ben had handled: household accounts, general finances, insurance, taxes, etc. But with the advent

of Covid, all hospital visits were prohibited. For 10 weeks, all communication with her critically ill husband and the numerous doctors, nurses and hospital staff that were caring for him was limited to Facetime conversations.

As Ben's condition became increasingly serious with several near-death episodes, it became clear that his only hope for recovery lay in securing a new heart. Being on the "list" meant you were in line for a heart from a donor of the right blood type. Sometimes there can be a wait for years, but Ben (possibly because he had been in the hospital with no contact with the Covid-ridden outside world) put him in line for a heart.

On April 15th Ben and Sarah were told that a heart with a possible match was available. The next day at 10 a.m., Ben was in the operating room and at 3:15 the doctor called Sarah and announced that "The surgery went well. It is a good heart and a good fit."


HOMECOMING.... On June 3, 2020, Ben came home.

For months Ben's care had been the responsibility of a team of doctors, nurses, therapists, nutritionists, and pharmacists. Sarah described all these burdens that now lay on her shoulders "like the lead cape they drape over you for X-rays at the dentist's office". Her situation was not helped by a series of home health personnel, who failed to show up; left unexpectedly after one visit; or quit when the Carts refused to meet halfway to Miami in an empty office instead of at their home. Ultimately a nice nurse provided the necessary help and trained Sarah to do much of the daily routine like changing bandages.

Ben in the early days at home was confused and subsequently unreasonable and grumpy. Sarah felt unappreciated and angry when Ben immersed in paperwork at his desk, ignored a meal she had prepared or neglected to take the meds she had carefully selected and scheduled. But both of them were so glad to be together again, that issues were negotiated, and differences settled. Sarah admits she actually welcomed the normality of a few squabbles.

LAST WORD.... On My Way Back to You, in addition to being a riveting medical odyssey, is also a love story. Ben and Sarah Cart are a devoted couple, who both came away from a traumatic experience with physical and emotional wounds. But with patience, determination, courage and love, they found their way back to one another.



Vote at Florida Keys Community College



Early voting is open every day from 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. beginning Monday, March 4 through Saturday, March 16 at the Murray Nelson Government Center located at 102050 Overseas Highway.

The Presidential Preference Primary (PPP) Election is a closed primary, so only registered party members can vote for their preferred presidential nominee. The Democratic Party submitted only one candidate, so there will not be a PPP ballot for the Democratic Party on March 19

Two years ago, an opinion issued by the state Division of Elections provided clarification on voting precincts being accessible to the public. This in turn meant voting could no longer take place at The Academy at Ocean Reef unless it was agreed that the gates would stay open during the entire voting process. Journalist Lauren Green to Speak in the Chapel

Fox News Channel's chief religion correspondent, Lauren Green, will be speaking at the Protestant Congregation's 9 a.m. worship service in the Ocean Reef Chapel and Fellowship Center this **Sunday, March 3rd.**

Family Story

Lauren's family was from south Minneapolis, Minnesota. She was the youngest of five children who grew up in a three-bedroom home. Her father, Robert Grissam was a welder/janitor and her mother, Bessie Grissam Green, a teacher's assistant.

What her family lacked in monetary resources she says they made up for in an enormous emphasis on all areas of learning. Lauren developed an interest in music and art through her older sibling's studies in everything from painting to piano. As a teenager, she was a 'tomboy,' competing on her school's gymnastics team. She used

her height and striking beauty to earn her way, working as a model in local department stores.

Education

Lauren earned her Bachelor's degree in piano performance from the University of Minnesota in 1980. After college, she made her way to Los Angeles to pursue a modeling career and explore the world of acting. She enjoyed some success but returned to her home in Minneapolis.

In 1984, she competed in the Miss Minnesota pageant and became the state's first African American Miss Minnesota. She took third place in the Miss America competition in Atlantic City. Looking back, she says that without losing the competition, she might never have attended graduate school.

Career Path

Her graduate studies took her to the highly regarded Medill School of Journalism at Northwestern University, and then, she became an intern at KSTP television back in the Twin Cities. While there, an old friend and high school classmate, Prince, invited her to appear with Kirstie Alley in his "My Name Is Prince" video.

After earning an on-air position in the Twin Cities, Lauren then moved on to WBBM in Chicago, and became the first talent to be

hired through the then new Fox News Channel.

Reporting

Lauren has been privileged to cover numerous major stories in her career at Fox. Among them, in 2006, she provided live coverage of Pope Benedict XVI's visit to the United States, and in Rome, the beatification of Pope John Paul II in 2011. Again in Rome in 2013, she reported the election of Pope Francis, as well as the retirement of Pope Benedict XVI.

Controversial Advocacy

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, Lauren took the controversial stance of advocating for churches who defied court orders to stop large gatherings. She penned an editorial accompanied by a stock photo of people holding hands when CDC guidelines advised against it. In the article she labeled washing hands, sanitizing homes, and practicing social distancing a "temporary or flimsy barrier to a raging tsunami." She strongly opposed closing churches because they were the one place where people turned for comfort and found spiritual strength.

Music and Writing

Lauren has released an album of classical piano music titled *Classic Beauty*. She has also played keyboards with former governor Mike Huckabee's band, *The Little Rockers*, on his program *Huckabee*. In 2014,

she performed in the 90th birthday concert for George Ratzinger, the brother of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, describing this a "the honor of a lifetime."

She is also the author of two books. Her first, Lighthouse Faith, was published in 2017. The subtitle, God as a Living Reality in a World Immersed in Fog, reflects her deep desire that people understand the work of God in their everyday lives, and not just an hour or so out of their week. Our temptation she says is to "make God a concept" that we can control instead of "the living reality" who can mold our lives.

Her latest book, published in February of this year, is titled Light for Today. Lauren explains that she "wanted to increase her faith through writing." Her writing took the form of reflections she shared on social media. When a publisher asked if she would consider writing a devotional, she realized she had already done a lot of the work. She said, "It just so happens that I have these thoughts for the day that probably could be edited very well into a 365day devotional." Her aim is to drive home the point that "God is a living reality" for our lives.







Are We a Club or a Community

In trying to describe Ocean Reef Club to friends and neighbors from afar with the vast array of offerings and activities available, it often brings into question, is it a club or is it a community.

Members of Ocean Reef Club have historically had the advantage of being allowed to join with other members of The Club to negotiate conditions and purchase property from The Club to build and operate their own private equity clubs. Their effort has created the Racquet Club at Ocean Reef and the Card Sound Golf Club, which are both pleasantly intermingled within the boundaries of the Ocean Reef Club property. These members still retain membership and joint use of social and athletic facilities of Ocean Reef's Club's tennis courts or golf courses. The latter tennis courts are so nearby that errant tennis balls can possibly travel between the two clubs' tennis courts.

There is a long list of other clubs incorporated into the fabric of Ocean Reef, such as the Ocean Reef Yacht Club, that do not require property but, if or when needed, can utilize space from The Club for their annual or monthly activities that will include bars, dining space, servers, food and party help. The Ocean Reef Yacht Club thus saves the cost of a clubhouse and can still offer its members a local venue for their famous annual Valentine's party with extravagant dining and dancing to a full orchestra.

Should an imaginary couple fail to complete a dance

step and seriously fall, an ambulance from the Ocean Reef Community Association, abbreviated ORCA, also supported by The Club's homeowners, would respond with a team of trained first responders to treat the injured and provide transportation to The Medical Center at Ocean Reef, or hospital.

Likewise, the weekly editions of the locally published and distributed Ocean Reef Press. sponsored and edited by The Club, are filled with articles and photos of social and newsworthy items at Ocean Reef Club that include both events from the various amenities across The Club as well as from Member-organized clubs. The authors of these articles, as herein, generally simply use "The Club" to indicate if there is an event connection with "The Ocean Reef Club". Topics cover golf, tennis, sailing, fishing, yachts, model yachts, cards, religion, cooking, art, sorority, flying, swimming, pets, politics, health, knitting, sobriety, wine and age, to promote the interests and members of their Club within The Club.

The Club also offers a wide variety of social events such as

a vintage car and boat weekend, sailfish tournaments and multiple visits from Santa Claus. Decorated golf cart parades are popular through defined street routes to celebrate Halloween or other holidays with judges and a prize to the winner for dining at one of a dozen or so of The Club's restaurants. Such an event might bring hundreds of Members to line the streets and cheer their families along.

There's also the Ocean Reef Community Foundation, which holds an annual gala to raise money for the non-profits at Ocean Reef as well as for the surrounding communities.

The purpose of this article is not to distinguish between "clubs" and "community", but to praise and commend the long-running, successful quest of the management of Ocean Reef Club to provide, perhaps, a nationally unique and successful social club expanded with private clubs within a social community that members are very fortunate to live, either, in or at




Leaping Lizards!

It's Leap Year



'Nature Notes" by Nancy Zakon

Why do we have a "leap year" every four years? Here's the story. Our ancient ancestors had quite a challenge to devise a yearly calendar that matched the same dates to the seasons - year after year, for centuries. Let's begin about 700 B.C. when an early Roman king created a calendar for agriculture – planting to harvesting – a calendar from March to December – 10 months. The months of January and February didn't exist, reason being – no growing or harvesting, so no calendar months! (Don't you love it!) Next, they tried a calendar based on cycles of the

moon... twelve in all. Ah, now we're getting somewhere. We get to add two missing months, January, and February. However, a calendar based on lunar (moon)-cycles is only 354 days. Oops... We're missing 11 days. Other civilizations tried the solar (sun) calendar: one had a dozen months of 30 days each, giving 360 days/year – missing only 5 days. Getting better, it's getting better all the time! And how did they make up the missing 5 days

– why, those Egyptians partied for five days at year's end. Way to go! So now, we have 12 months, but how do we get to 365 days? We discovered the Earth rotates around the Sun in 365.2422 days. Julius Caesar refined his calendar to include 365.25 days/year. You'd think that would work, but from Julius Caesar's time to the 16th century, seasons were off one day every 128 years – the calendar had "drifted". Pope Gregory XIII came to the rescue in 1582 with the Gregorian

Calendar, the one we live by today. He developed a new leap year system that added one leap day every four years and dropped three leap days every 400 years to keep the calendar from drifting. It sounds confusing, but the system has kept the calendar and the seasons in sync for more than 400 years. The Gregorian calendar isn't perfect—there's still a 30-second drift every year. But even with that, the calendar won't be off for more than a day for another 3,300 years!

I still wondered why add the extra day to February.... here's that story. Because Romans believed "odd numbers" were lucky, they assigned either 29 or 31 days to their months. When January and February were added to the calendar, January got a lucky number of 31 days. That left February short, with only 28 days. It seemed only fair to add the extra day to dear old February. At last, the month has a "lucky" number of days (29) this year!

Fun Fact: Leap years are evenly divisible by four.





Good "Carma"

Record-Setting Sailfishing

The stars had to align for a group of anglers on Wednesday, February 21, and align they did. A boat named "Carma" received good karma, landing 65 sailfish in one day.

The captain, Tucker Ersek, and first mate Andres Garcia had been preparing for this day for more than a week, as they saw conditions develop for a midweek opportunity to land a lot of sailfish. Those conditions included opposing wind and current, which created the short wave rhythm that sailfish love called "riding the waves." resulting in fish on the surface. The son of Members, Tucker has been fishing at Ocean Reef since he was 11 and captaining since he was 18 (now 25). Andres has been fishing since 2019 and has excelled at this sport after giving his tennis racquet a rest.

Being a sought-after captain and crew, they were both booked with different clients on Tuesday and Wednesday and it took some friendly horse trading with those clients to get both days scheduled with Carmen Sferrazza on the Carma, which was equipped with the tower and Seakeeper (a stabilizing gyro) that Tucker and Andres considered critical to the job. It's a testimonial to the sense of fair play shared by all Ocean Reef Members that the original clients Davo Johnson and George Blaha were both invited Wednesday to fish on the Carma, although the three had never fished together before. This was going to be an interesting day.

On Tuesday, the boat with

Carmen and its frequent anglers **Angela Basciano** and **Jodi Zifferer**, went out and got 31 sails, so Tucker and Andres were excited for Wednesday like kids on Christmas morning. In preparation, they spent the night before and the morning of catching more bait - pilchers and goggle eyes. Andres had been preparing leaders for months before this day in hopes of it happening.

Lines went in a little after 7:30 a.m. and by 10 a.m., they had landed over 13 and switched from kite fishing to sight fishing - just chasing the fish by sight. This technique worked better as by noon, they had almost 40.

Carmen said the fish were spooling together in packs of up to 10 at times, and as the anglers pitched baits to them, there was an instant bite with many times up to five fish on and only three anglers to reel them all in. It was chaos, but Tucker orchestrated the cockpit calmly and instructed

who should go where and do what from his perch up top in the 39' Sea Vee.

"The Seakeeper and tower were key in stabilizing the boat and letting Tucker see the fish," said Johnson. "Tucker is an amazing man with great goals and the discipline to go along with it. He is going to go far in life."

As the afternoon went on, the fish count kept piling up with Tucker shouting, "Let's stay 'til we hit 70!" However, as the sun began to set we thought it was time to get in to find additional sailfish flags, which were gladly provided by friends and family who met the tired, salty fishermen at the dock with libations and celebration. All three anglers were so grateful for the efforts of Tucker and Andres. They are true professionals.

With 65 sails in a day and 96 for two consecutive days, this was one for the record books. Only at Ocean Reef!

from accumulating extra bait of a specific kind to borrowing more flags. Capt Ersek says it was the combination of springtime, winds and current that set the stage — winds out of the north go against the northbound currents and create huge wave action that the sailfish love to "surf". Tucker said he had seen free-jumping sailfish earlier and knew the scenario was setting up. What no one had expected was the sheer number of fish. Packs of 6-8 fish fighting each other for the bait and having all lines hooked up, more lines than there were anglers on the boat, was a new experience. Just think of catching 65 in a day as Carma did with three anglers. That works out to a fish every

seven minutes for eight hours. I am reminded of the Lucille Ball comedy routine at the cake factory with the conveyor belt bringing a new cake, one after another, whether she was ready or not...

The Record Numbers Don't Stop With Sailfish

There have been consistent reports of increasing fish populations in the Key Largo waters. Russ Fisher, a devoted bonefish chaser, has tracked his favorite quarry over the decades and, as a Founder of Bonefish & Tarpon Trust, has studied the numbers. He has no doubt the bonefish are increasing in the Key Largo area and more significantly, are larger — an important piece of information for scientists studying the species. What I found interesting was that Russ, out in the flats on one of these

remarkable days last week, saw massive numbers of bonefish — schools of 100 to 200! — and caught 12. Not a record, for Russ anyway, and he modestly gives all the credit to his guide, Jared Raskob, who he thinks is superlative. But still...you have to admit that the fishing has been better, year after year and that there seem to be more fish of all kinds in our waters.

Is the sailfish population growing too? These big fish are migratory and their numbers are influenced by a wide range of factors, but last week's activity argues that the numbers are vastly more than we ever suspected. This bodes well for the Reef Cup, the biggest fishing event of the season, which is coming up March 13 to 16 and will bring out the most competitive fishermen.





Avoid Hitting Down on Shoulder Level Balls

Far too often I see players work way too hard to get to pop-ups at the net just to miss the volley into the net. As we are forced to be seven feet away from the net thanks to that No-volley zone (NVZ), when we hit down on the ball a high percentage of the time we are going to miss hit and place it into the net.

Instead, what we want to do is swing up and over the ball. By swinging up from underneath the ball and over it with our follow through we are not only going to avoid missing into the net but we are going to add topspin to our drive volleys making it way more difficult for our opponents to handle.

Despite this information, it's not to say we can't ever swing down on the ball, especially if it's overhead, but what we want to focus on is swinging out (forward) and down to avoid that ball going into the net. The next time you get to watch high-level players, watch how they hit the shoulder level balls, it's one of the biggest differences between beginner/intermediate players and advanced players.

In conclusion, mastering the technique of swinging up and over the ball rather than down can significantly improve volley accuracy and add topspin, essential for navigating the No-volley zone and distinguishing between beginner/intermediate and advanced players.

Golf Croquet Lessons

GOLF CROQUET TIPS

Determining Your Next Shot

The following is a simple four-step method to help players determine their next shot.

- Make the wicket: Make the wicket if you feel you can.
- Hit or block the danger ball: The danger ball is the opponent's ball that is up next after you. If it is in scoring position and you are not, you should smash their ball away so they cannot score.
- **Help my partner:** How can you help your partner ball so they are in an improved position?
- Eliminate any threats: Think through the order of play moving forward and determine what might help you by eliminating an opponent's next good move.

Remember the importance of the following three shots in a game:

- First shot to the next wicket: The first player shooting to the hoop has a huge advantage. Place this shot in a position to score. If you can do this, your opponents are forced to try to clear your ball away from scoring position, which is not always easy. Theoretically, the player who has that first shot at a hoop should be able to score on their second shot.
- Clearing: Clearing is the act of knocking your opponent's ball out of scoring position. You must be able to hit straight and sometimes long to clear your opponent's ball away from in front of the hoop.
- **Scoring:** Obviously one cannot win a game if they cannot score. While defense, including clearing, is huge and important, you still have to ultimately score hoops.

Strength & Conditioning for Hiking

It is possible to get ready to hike mountain trails in Florida. To get in hiking shape, you need the following:

1. Steady pace endurance training or time on your feet:

All activities that improve the cardio-respiratory system will benefit hiking fitness. To develop the muscles we primarily need for hiking, try running, walking on an incline, cycling, and stair climbing.

2. Strength training for leg, arms, and core: Hiking high elevations can be more demanding on the legs than the arms, but a strong upper body makes hiking easier, especially when using poles. Core training protects the back and provides a stable center from which the legs and arms can produce force. Lower body exercises that are beneficial in preparing for a long hike include step-ups, squats, split squats, lunges, and sled pushing.

3. Flexibility and mobility training: One of the best systems to improve mobility and flexibility is yoga. Pilates also works well as it pays detailed attention to moving with proper alignment and length. No program is complete with mobility and flexibility work in strength and conditioning. Moving with optimal ranges of motion increases performance and reduces the risk of injury.

When doing strength training, add longer sets to develop muscle endurance. Adding a weight vest or any extra load for moderate and advanced exercisers will make the activity more challenging, leading to greater adaptations and increased fitness.

Here is a typical workout from

the Everesting class, which is the strength and conditioning for hiking class we host every Saturday at 8 a.m.:

- 5-minute treadmill walk on a 5.0 to 10.0 incline at easy pace
- Squats for 5 minutes
- Step-Ups for 5 minutes
- Core set for 5 minutes
- Step-Ups for 3 minutes
- 5-minute treadmill walk on 10.0 or higher incline at a moderate pace
- Upper body set for 5 minutes (row and push-ups)
- Mobility and Core for 5 minutes
- 5-minute treadmill at max incline and faster pace

Exercises should be performed with good form at the complexity and intensity that meets your current fitness level. This workout can be done once per week with other forms of strength and endurance training. The more often you train and the more sessions and miles you log, the longer and more difficult hikes you will be ready to enjoy. A very small percentage of people will hike the actual Mount Everest, but there is a

symbolic Everest that represents an ultimate personal challenge. Make the climb.



BRIDGE TIP OF THE WEEK

Learning Bridge

Developing Your Card Sense

Read and Deal

Bridge books will teach you how to play card combinations and give you other basic knowledge you need to develop card sense. Reading and practicing don't have to be separate activities, though. Keep a deck of cards with your bridge book and use it to translate the book's diagrammed hands into "real" bridge hands. Deal out the cards to match the example in the book and play it out on a tabletop next to the open book. Replay it as many times as you like until you understand the principle or the technique. This exercise is especially

beneficial if you're studying suit combinations or reading a book on declarer play.

Practice Daily

To add continuity to the learning process and keep your brain stimulated, try to spend at least a few minutes with some bridge-related activity every day. Here are some good practice and study activities that are fun, but not time-consuming:

- Keep a deck of cards handy on your desk at work, or on your coffee table or nightstand at home, and when you have a few minutes (or the boss isn't looking), deal out a practiced hand.
- Read the bridge column in the newspaper. Keep in mind that most columnists write for intermediate-level players, so don't be discouraged if some of the bidding and explanations don't make sense. Just use what you know and do your own

analysis. Look at the hand diagram and decide what you would bid with each hand, what opening lead you would make, how you would declare or defend the contract, etc.


- Keep your class notes and bridge book accessible. Read a chapter, or even a few pages, during your coffee break, between TV shows, before you go to sleep.
- Bookmark some bridge websites and visit your favorites to see what's new.
- Play a hand or two on your computer. Download the free Learn to Play Bridge programs from ACBL review the lessons and practice hands.
- If your local TV stations are running one of the new bridge programs, tape the weekly show and watch all or part of it whenever it's convenient.

The Play's the Thing

Experience itself is the best

teacher of card sense, so the more time you spend actually playing bridge, the faster you'll develop your abilities. Don't feel like you have to know everything to begin playing. As soon as you've finished a few lessons, organize a weekly game with some friends or the people from your class, or recruit co-workers for a lunchtime game at work. You'll pick up more skills every time you play, especially if you can get some more experienced players to join your game.

Try these suggestions to see which works best for you, and use your imagination to identify other learning and practice opportunities. Developing your card sense will take time, but if you're committed enough to put some effort into it, it will come. And with every small step you make, you'll probably find that you enjoy playing bridge even more than before.
