As Spring Break '24 Enters Its Peak, Some Safety Reminders

The concept of spring break originated slightly more than 90 miles north of Ocean Reef with a 1938 swim forum event in Ft. Lauderdale. By 1960, a substantial number of students had started flocking to the town, and local businesses capitalized on this surge by offering special promotions.

At Ocean Reef, sun-soaked days punctuate life year-round, so when spring approaches and schools let out, it's no surprise members' children and their friends enjoy maximizing their spring break experience at our club.

This year, mid-to-late March is the projected peak spring break time for most schools across the United States. Some schools, particularly in the northern states, will have their spring break in April.

"We want our members and their guests to enjoy themselves safely and make lasting memories during spring break," said Ariel Artime, ORCA's Vice President and Director of Public Safety and Operations. "We ask them to adhere to the community's rules and regulations to ensure the well-being of everyone on The Reef."

It's important to remember that Members are accountable for the actions of their children and guests. Therefore, we encourage Members to ensure their guests are aware of and adhere to all community rules and recommended safety

guidelines. This includes asking them to respect our local marine habitats and maintain a safe distance to prevent unintentional harm, to remain aware of weather conditions, tides, currents, and any other factors that can significantly impact water activities, and to swim in designated areas only. Jumping off bridges can be dangerous and is strongly discouraged.

While moving around The Reef in golf carts, it is essential that everyone adhere to the rules, especially after hours. Avoid joyriding late at night and stay on the designated golf cart paths. Overloading golf carts can lead to accidents, so it's crucial to follow occupancy limits for everyone's safety.

It is important to stay hydrated, use sunscreen, and remain mindful of alcohol consumption. Please remember the legal age to consume alcoholic beverages in the state of Florida is 21. All Ocean Reef Club venues serving alcohol will ask for proper identification. Additionally, members will be subject to fines for any use of fake IDs, whether by family members or by their guests.

To ensure a safe and fun spring break adventure and avoid run-ins with Public Safety officers at The Reef, we remind members to refer to the community rules included in the Member Handbook and share the rules and safety reminders with their children and guests.





A Cross Crosswind

A brisk wind blew from the east as Nelson Sims and his two guests, Mike Ellis and Ron Haynes, teed off on the No. 6 hole at Card Sound Club. All three found the fairway and were about to hit their second shots when suddenly an airplane skimmed over palm trees and crashed nose down within one hundred feet of their standing. They could see the pilot slumped over, and Sims yelled to Haynes to call 911 and, at the same time, ran



toward the plane.

"Are you okay?" Nelson asked, and the reply was positive. Fuel poured out of the ruptured wing tank and flowed toward the engine. Thinking they had to get the pilot out as soon as possible, they grabbed him by the shoulders, but the impact had jammed his foot under the seat. The pilot, with a severe laceration on his forehead and possibly in shock, said,

"Well, I guess my flying days are over." Finally, the two men were able to extricate the pilot, and they dragged him away from the plane.

Meanwhile, when Haynes called 911, the dispatcher asked him where the plane crashed, to which Haynes replied that it was on hole #6. The dispatcher then asked which golf course, and Haynes, being a guest, did not know the answer. He

quickly went to their golf card and read the scorecard. "Card Sound Club," he replied.

Within several minutes, the Ocean Reef Firefighters/ Paramedics arrived. After making their analysis, they worked to check the pilot's vital signs, determine mobility, stabilize and carefully transfer him onto a gurney. Other firefighter/ paramedic team members called for air rescue and cordoned off the area with yellow tape. The air rescue helicopter arrived shortly and air-flighted him to the hospital.

The plane was a popular single-engine Cirrus S.R. 20. The exact cause of the accident has not yet been determined. Later, Sims and his guests changed out of their blood-splattered clothing and enjoyed a stiff

The pilot is recovering.

Presidential Primary is Tuesday, March 19

Vote at Florida Keys Community College

For those Ocean Reef residents registered to the Republican party in the State of Florida, the precinct location is the College of the Florida Keys, located at 106040 Overseas Highway. Voting will open at 7:00 a.m. on Tuesday, March 19 and close at 7:00 p.m.

Early voting is now open at the Murray Nelson Government Center located at 102050 Overseas Highway from 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

The Presidential Preference Primary (PPP) Election is a closed primary, so only registered party members can vote for their preferred presidential nominee. The Democratic Party submitted only one candidate, so there will not be a PPP ballot for the Democratic Party on March 19.

Two years ago, an opinion issued by the state Division of Elections provided clarification on voting precincts being accessible to the public. This in turn meant voting could no longer take place at The Academy at Ocean Reef unless it was agreed that the gates would stay open during the entire voting process. Your ORPAC Committee is working on a solution with the Monroe County Supervisor of Elections.

Everglades Restoration Builds Environmental & Economic Resilience

Last year, we published an article about the importance of the Everglades Agricultural Area (EAA) Reservoir to Florida Bay. Last month at the Cultural Center, we learned more from The Everglades Foundation about the vital Everglades restoration project and its impact on South Florida's economy. The following is a brief summary.

If you follow news of importance to our South Florida environment, you know that, once again, high water in Lake Okeechobee, combined with

a wetter-than-average winter, resulted in a need for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to dump large volumes of polluted lake water to Florida's east and west coasts. The discharges that began February 17 have averaged about 4 billion gallons per day to both coasts.

The goal with the discharges is to lower lake levels before the warmer, longer days of the wet season when the risk of toxic blue-green algae blooms increases. Using past years as a

guide, these discharges and the blue-green algae blooms they cause can have a lasting impact on our coastal ecosystems and our economy.

The good news is, the EAA Reservoir and stormwater treatment area under construction – together representing the most important Everglades restoration project – will provide the necessary water storage and treatment south of Lake Okeechobee to minimize polluted discharges while also providing much-needed clean freshwater flow to the Everglades and Florida Bay. It is critical to send that water south where it belongs.

It's not just a matter of environmental importance. The Everglades ecosystem is inextricably linked to Florida's economy. In 2022, Monroe and the other 15 counties in the Greater Everglades System had a GDP of \$791 billion dollars – larger than more than 40 U.S. states! An important part of this economy – the Clean Water Economy – is directly or

indirectly harmed by changes in the health of the Everglades. Polluted discharges and harmful algae blooms hurt key economic sectors like tourism, outdoor recreation, and real estate. Recent studies showed that harmful algal blooms in 2018 cost tourism-related industries \$2.7 billion, and the businesses that rely on that income can't buy insurance to mitigate the risks.

Everglades restoration increases our economic resiliency. It reduces such harmful events and helps protect the ecosystem on which the Clean Water Economy relies. Restoring the flow of water through the Everglades and into Florida Bay benefits our fishing industry, waterbased recreation and real estate, and protects us from natural hazards. In 2017, our extensive mangrove system reduced property damage by at least \$1.5 billion. Our extensive freshwater marshes, mangroves, and seagrasses sequester carbon dioxide from the air and store it, helping reduce the impacts of climate change. Simply put, Everglades restoration benefits our 21st-century economy and guides us toward a more resilient and sustainable future.


The Indrani Mukerjea Story: Buried Truth Netflix; 4 episodes

India's most famous female media tycoon, Indrani Mukerjea, is caught up in a web of deceit, murder, complex bloodlines, and headlinegrabbing conspiracy theories in this gripping four-part docuseries. Follow her social climb as one of the country's most famous TV executives to her descent as one of its most infamous accused killers. It's a fascinating true-life crime series on the 2012 disappearance of Sheena Bora as told by family members, friends, and reporters.

American Conspiracy: The Octopus Murders Netflix; 4 episodes

The true story of the curious death of investigative journalist Danny Casolaro has been told before, but that shouldn't stop you from sitting down for this intriguing version. Casolaro thought he was about to get the last piece and final set of answers detailing a wideranging U.S. government-led international conspiracy when he winds up dead in a West-Virginia hotel bathtub. There were so many arms to Casolaro's unfinished investigation that he dubbed his own work the Octopus report. This story follows a fresh look at the case from another investigative reporter, Christian Hansen who oddly bears a resemblance to his subject.

A fire, a disappearance, scary stalking, and many lives permanently damaged, his story will make sure you never make any quick assessments on anyone again as well as add a talented tech expert to your contact list.

American Nightmare Netflix; 3 episodes

A couple goes from victims to alleged master minds after they experience a horrifying home invasion where one of them gets kidnapped. At first, you won't know whose side to take, then things get complicated when the victim reappears outwardly unharmed. Once you're done watching this true-crime story, you should triple check that your video cameras and alarms are fully functioning.

Can I Tell You a Secret? Netflix; 2 episodes

In Can I Tell You a Secret? three unrelated women in the U.K. tell their cyberstalking stories. Until they find out about each other and the many others creeped out by a prolific

If after watching these dark docs, you need to get in a laugh, catch up on the 12th and (allegedly) final season of Curb Your Enthusiasm, now airing Sundays on HBO Max. It's a great opportunity to see comedian Richard Lewis, who died on February 27th, in some of his final performances. Ironically, in a recently aired episode (S12, E3), Lewis shares with his long-time friend, Larry David, that he's putting him in his will. 



C.S. Lewis Scholar to Speak

It was sometime during the college term of 1966-1967 that I first heard the name C.S. Lewis. My newfound faith had led me to transfer from a state school in Texas to a small Christian liberal arts college in Kentucky. Several of my fellow students were reading Lewis' Space Trilogy. I was intrigued. I began reading the first volume, Out of the Silent Planet.

This marked my introduction to two new worlds. The first was into the imaginative world of C.S. Lewis. His protagonist in the book is a philologist, a word-lover like Lewis himself, named Elwin Ransom. Ransom is kidnapped, taken aboard a spaceship to the planet Malacandra where he encounters beings known as hrossa. At first, I honestly wasn't sure what to make of it.

Looking back now, that first encounter with Lewis was like the children who discovered another world through the magic wardrobe in The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe. His Space Trilogy opened the door into a wonderful world I

never knew existed. It was the world of thoughtful writers, who creatively used imagination to engage topics like good and evil, through story, and with a Biblical faith perspective.

My next foray into Lewis' works took place a decade later during a Christmas break from my theological studies in California. During those two weeks, I immersed myself in the world of Narnia in Lewis' series, The Chronicles of Narnia. I read all seven volumes, nonstop. The powers of Lewis' imagination were on full display in his brilliant storytelling, which also artfully reveals the depths of his understanding of the Christian faith.

One of the most brilliant preachers I have known was the late Earl Palmer. He was for many years the pastor of University Presbyterian Church in Seattle. It was said of Earl that he never delivered a sermon that didn't include some reference to the Chronicles of Narnia.

Subsequently through the

years, in no particular order, I have read and re-read A Greif Observed, God in the Dock, The Great Divorce, Mere Christianity, Miracles, The Problem of Pain, The Screwtape Letters, Surprised By Joy (the account of his conversion from atheism), The Weight of Glory, and others.

Having said that, my comprehension of Lewis is like a day hiker who picnics at the head of a mountain trail and thinks he has explored the mountains. To mix my metaphor, the truth is you've only waded in the shallows. When you talk to someone who has spent countless days living on the trail, you realize how meagre your understanding really is.

That's why I'm grateful for friends like Dr. Jerry Root. Jerry is professor emeritus at Wheaton College outside Chicago. He has been studying C.S. Lewis and related topics since 1970. He has shared his extensive knowledge through teaching many C.S. Lewis focused courses for forty-one years, lecturing on Lewis at seventy-eight universities in eighteen countries

He is one of those who has explored the world of Lewis extensively. In addition to writing numerous articles on Lewis, Jerry's books include the bestselling and award winning The Quotable C.S. Lewis, The Soul of C.S. Lewis, co-authored with Wayne Martindale, C.S. Lewis and the Problem of Evil, and the Surprising Imagination of C.S. Lewis. He also co-edited the C.S. Lewis Bible

with Douglas Gresham, Lewis' stepson.

Not only is Jerry a renown Lewis scholar, unlike some scholars, he is an engaging communicator. He conveys his grasp of Lewis with genuine warmth, self-effacing humor, depth of faith, and love of teaching.

Jerry will be leading a conversation about Lewis's book Letters to Malcolm on Saturday, March 9th, from 2:00 until 4:00 in the Fellowship Hall of the Ocean Reef Chapel and Fellowship Center. Everyone is invited to attend at no charge. Whether you're simply interested in learning about Lewis, or an avid reader wanting a deeper grasp of his thought, you will both enjoy and benefit from Jerry's presentation.

Jerry says that in addition to Lewis, he loves conquering fear through experiencing adrenaline inducing activities including skydiving, spelunking, swimming with sharks, roller-coasters, flying in vintage airplanes, hammerhead stalls in biplanes, and turbulence on commercial airplanes.

Jerry will also be speaking at the 9:00 AM worship service of the Protestant Congregation at Ocean Reef in the Chapel on Sunday morning, March 10th.

He and his wife Claudia have been married for forty-five years, have four married children, and fifteen grandchildren.

We encourage you to join us. You won't be disappointed! Who knows, it might open your mind and heart to a new world as well!

Jerry H. Jared, 78, passed away on February 28, 2024 at Miami Baptist Hospital due to complications of lung cancer. He was surrounded by his family at his side.

Jerry was born in Jacksonville, Florida on March 19, 1945 to Ed and Celeste Jared. His younger years were spent in Gainesville, Georgia, where he met and married his high school sweetheart, Judy Betts. They recently celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary together. Jerry and Judy had two sons, Todd and Tim. The family moved to England and Germany in the early years of Jerry's business career.

Over a span of six decades, Jerry committed his professional career to improving the quality of life for America's active duty and retired personnel and

their families. In his role in the 1980's as the President of the American Logistic Association, Jerry became the Icon of the Military Resale industry with his relentless pursuit to innovate and improve performance and efficiencies for all players.

As a natural-born salesman and motivator, in the late 1960's Jerry quickly took the helm as the European Sales Manager for Wilson Harrell and Company, a major worldwide sales organization serving the

US military commissaries and exchanges. In the early 1970's, he returned stateside and joined Military Distributors of Virginia. In 1983, he assumed the role of CEO and Chairman of the Board where he molded the company into the world's largest exclusive military food distributor. In 1986, with his brother David, Jerry founded Coastal Pacific Food Distributors. As the Board Chairman until his recent passing, Jerry shepherded Coastal into its current position as the major player in the food distribution network supporting West Coast and Far East commissaries and exchanges, as well as the US Navy's 7th fleet ships throughout the entire Pacific Realm.

For Jerry, the secret of his success as an entrepreneur and industry leader was never a mystery. He always understood the playing field and never took his eye off the ball and its relative position to the goal line. He knew the goal for his companies was to profitably fulfill the customers' needs better than anyone else in the game. To that end and throughout his entire career, Jerry confidently coached and motivated his partners and associates to challenge themselves, giving them the

latitude to take risks, to learn from mistakes, and always to share the rewards of a team win. Jerry was truly the Lombardi of his chosen profession.

Jerry had many passions in his life, none more important than his family. When he wasn't in pursuit of business excellence, he loved to play golf and travel the world. In recent years, he took his family to destinations such as Rome, London, Salzburg, Amsterdam, Barbados, and Costa Rica. Jerry played golf at some of the most incredible courses in the world, including Augusta National, Pine Valley, and Pebble Beach. He took his sons to St. Andrews twice, and accompanied by Royal and Ancient members, the trips were epic. Jerry was a member at Ocean Reef Club, Card Sound Golf Club, Anglers Club, Greenbrier Sporting Club, and the Olde Farm.

Left to cherish his memory are his wife Judy, sons Todd (Nancy) and Tim (Meigan), and grandchildren Lindsay, Connor, Ashland, and Allison.



Please join us on **March 12 at 5 p.m.** at the Cultural Center with Tom Nguyen, M.D. for an informative lecture on the use of artificial intelligence (A.I.) as it relates to the scope of medicine. Dr. Nguyen is the Director of minimally invasive valve surgery and Chief Medical Executive of

Baptist Health Miami Cardiac & Vascular Institute, Barry T. Katzen Medical Director Endowed Chair.

He is an internationally recognized minimally invasive heart surgeon and believes that small incisions make a big difference. His outcomes score in the top 98.7% in the National Society of Thoracic

Surgeons database.

He graduated from Rice University in Houston, Texas and then worked in Switzerland at the World Health Organization. Although he was awarded the Fulbright Scholarship, he decided to pursue medicine at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. He completed his surgery training at Stanford, where he received the Outstanding ICU award and the Intern of the Year Award and then completed a fellowship in cardiothoracic surgery at Columbia University as well as a transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) fellowship at Emory.

During a recent TikTok video, Dr. Nguyen stated the following: "We can only recognize things that we are aware of – whether we feel like we are dizzy, we have a fever or we are short of breath. But there

might be subtle things you are not aware of that's happening to you. And using A.I. we can pick up on some of these things, so for example, maybe there might be a subtle twitch in your left eye, and you don't realize it, and that could be a sign of something else that's foreshadowing that something is coming. That's the power of A.I., to pick up on those subtle patterns and have that pattern recognition to make a potential diagnosis. In heart disease and pretty much any medical condition out there."



In addition to our regular service we are hosting two (possibly more) events in March, so mark your calendars for Wednesday, March 13th and Saturday, March 16th.

"Wines of the World" Tasting on Port O' Call Patio

While we have had a great response to the sit-down tasting format implemented since opening the new shop, some Members miss the old walk around tastings we used to host on the patio. They provide

a fun, casual environment to stimulate your taste buds and meet fellow oenophiles. Those yearning for the past will be pleased with our **March 13th** "Wines of the World" tasting. Most of our tastings are focused on a specific winery or region of the world, but this time we are shaking things up.

Are you aware there are over 10,000 different grape varietals used to make wine, that over 29 countries account for 94% of global wine production, or that there are over 100,000 wineries worldwide? I certainly didn't until a quick Google search opened my eyes. The vast majority of wine is produced from the 9 "classic" varieties we commonly see in stores and on wine lists. Perhaps naming them will be a question for the next Trivia Night, however, Wyatt is the trivia master, not myself.

As with most things, the classics are classic for a reason. That doesn't mean there aren't plenty of gems among the other 9,991 plus varietals. This tasting will include the classics but also delve into the unknown. Final wines are yet to be selected but you can look forward to tasting a minimum of 24 wines and 15 varietals from over 10 countries! As I said before, the set-up will hearken back to the days of old POC when Wyatt and I operated out of a space smaller than many closets. Tables will be set up around the patio with plenty of wine to taste accompanied by light bites. Cost for this event is \$25++ and you may taste at your leisure from 5-7pm.

Champagne Henriot "Party on the Patio"

We are following up "Wines of the World" with a Champagne Henriot "Party on the Patio" with Regional Sales Director, Kelly McFadden telling the house's story. Henriot was established in Reims in 1808 by Apolline Henriot. Champagne is one of the few famous wines of the world where women have historically been at the forefront of advancement and quality improvements. It was Barbe-Nicole Ponsardin (the "Widow" Clicquot) who created the method of removing that pesky sediment which forms in Champagne bottles during its unique fermentation process (called remuage or riddling). This development lead to the style of Champagne we know today. The Henriot house has been back under family ownership since 1994 when Joseph Henriot left his post at Veuve Clicquot to manage the estate. In the words of Henriot's current cellar master

Laurent Fresnet, "What makes our champagne so special is that it is sourced from beautiful terroirs, mostly Grand & Premier Cru vineyards. Thanks to our independent status, I can dedicate the time and care they require to craft the most luminous champagnes and perpetuate the unique style of the House." This is unique as many Champagne brands are owned by large conglomerates like LVMH (Moet & Chandon, Dom Perignon, Veuve Clicquot, Ruinart, Krug) or co-ops (Nicolas Feuillatte).

This will be an entertaining and casual gathering showcasing 3 different cuvees from Champagne Henriot, snacks, live music and patio games. Event will be held on **Saturday, March 16th** from 3-5pm. 

There are so many wonderful places to dine here at The Reef to please every palate. While some of us enjoy the spontaneity and flexibility of joining friends last minute, others prefer to plan ahead knowing that a reservation is on the calendar for that special occasion or particular time and ambiance of a favorite restaurant.

Management knew changes needed to be made in order to combat the lack of availability, vague cancellation policies and "no shows", so in fall of 2020, they turned to Jacqueline Dobson (now Hosmer since she married Wyatt Hosmer from Port O' Call almost two years ago). With a day's notice, she returned

from her Covid furlough to this newly-created position where she would address the Member feedback and work with Management and other Associates to create a system that would work efficiently.

Jackie first joined Ocean
Reef as a seasonal Concierge
in 2015 and gradually
moved around in various
positions in both Catering
and Reservations, giving
her unique insight into
both the problems and
possible solutions. "The most
important part of this new job
was to centralize reservations
and create an online system
that would allow Equity
Members to book two weeks

ahead for a restaurant on a day and time of their choosing. If their first choice was not available, they could clearly see what was and plan accordingly," describes Jackie. This means if timing is more important than restaurant, you can choose a different restaurant at your desired time. But if the restaurant is the priority, your best bet is to be more flexible in timing.

Another benefit of the new system is that a file can be created by Member number to notify each restaurant of Members' needs: Are there any allergies? Are there mobility issues? Do vou like to sit by the window or in the middle of the room to see your friends? Do you linger over coffee so a slightly longer time slot is best? Many other needs and habits can be included as well. And this Valentine's Day there were so many requests for tables for two that Jackie arranged to open the Private Dining Room in CH Prime and set up smaller tables to accommodate the additional reservations so no one would be disappointed.

Jackie's title is Food and Beverage Manager, but her responsibilities are so much broader than that. Her expertise has smoothed out a system that many thought was unmanageable. She has also defined the cancellation policy to avoid double booking and last-minute changes, which cut down on those empty tables that were a constant complaint. She has trained her group to be in tune with Members' needs. Coming from a military family, she understands rules without losing a personal touch. In fact, if you have been on the receiving end of a reminder phone call, you will have spoken with Destiny Remigio, Dining Reservations Coordinator, just one of the many capable "behind the scenes" people who are responsible for your dining experience.

Last year, Jackie Hosmer was awarded the Associate of the Quarter award and will no doubt earn many more in the years to come. Still, Jackie emphasizes that the success of Dining Reservations is a team effort.

So, Bon Appetit! Your dining experience is made possible by very capable hands.



Antioxidant Protection for Your Skin

Around this time of year, the sun starts feeling stronger and hotter, and I start paying a lot more attention to it and the harmful effects the UV damage can have on my skin. You may be familiar with the term "free radical damage" because it has been a key buzzword for skin care companies for many years. Free radicals are unstable molecules that can cause damage to our skin or body. They are either produced within our bodies, or introduced from an outside source, such as UV rays, pollution, visible

or infrared light, and cigarette smoke, to name a few. Free radicals can damage your cells and your DNA through a process called oxidation, which can lead to disease and signs of aging. While many of us believe we are taking sufficient precautions by using sunscreen daily, that may not be enough.

So, what can you do to help keep your skin protected from free radical-induced damage, even when the sources of oxidative stress are difficult or even impossible to avoid?




Bag Room Open Kicks Off Play Tomorrow





Mastering Longer Bunker Shots: A Strategy for Success



'Swing Tip" by Brad Pinho, Golf Teaching Professional & Club Fitter

When faced with lengthy bunker shots, many golfers struggle with the challenge of determining how hard to swing or how much sand to take. However, there's a method to eliminate the guesswork. When positioned beyond 30 yards but still in a greenside bunker, consider swapping your sand wedge for a longer club while using the same

technique as a short bunker shot. Begin by opening the face of the chosen club, maybe it is a 9-iron or 8-iron, ensuring it effortlessly glides through the sand beneath the ball. As a reminder of fundamental sand play principles: adopt an open stance, establish a solid footing, strike the sand an inch or two behind the ball, and complete the swing. The extended club length will influence the ball's distance, but with proper execution, it should still check up on the green.

Mastering longer bunker shots can be a daunting task for many golfers, but with the right strategy, it can become a manageable part of your game. By swapping your sand wedge for a longer club and employing the same technique as a short bunker shot, you can eliminate the guesswork and approach these shots with confidence. Remembering fundamental sand play principles such as stance, footing, and striking the

sand behind the ball is crucial for success. With practice and proper execution, you can effectively control the distance and spin of the ball, ensuring it lands softly on the green.

So next time you find yourself faced with a lengthy bunker shot, consider this method to elevate your game and conquer the challenge with ease.

Mother & Son Land 260 lb. Swordfish

Bonefish Bonnie **Carol Berwind** and her son, Dickens, went out recently in their 36' center console, *Raptor*. They were 16 miles off Ocean Reef in 1,700 feet of water hoping to catch a swordfish. They hooked what seemed like a big one on the buoy rod right away and fought it for an hour. While taking the weight off they lost it. It was only 9 a.m. so they decided to set up and try again.

As soon as they were set and got the tip rod to the bottom Dickens called out, "I think we have a fish on". Carol couldn't believe it but he insisted so they brought the tip rod in

and pulled in the buoy. Sure enough, there was some weight but it was coming in until it reached 500 feet and the line started screaming off the reel. It became a real battle. At the time Carol was at the wheel and Dickens was on the reel. Every so often they would switch places to give each other a brief rest. They would get the fish up to about 500 feet and it would steam back down to the bottom. It was a stalemate.

After two hours they got the fish to 200 feet. Dickens rigged the harpoon while Carol got to the weight and started pulling hand over hand as the electric reel at 20 lb. drag was not making much progress. She couldn't believe it when the swordfish came up. She kept pulling and Dickens made a great throw with the harpoon through the gill plate and she went for the gaff.

They had a 260 lb., 80 in. swordfish beside the boat. The






