### 39th Annual Reef Cup Underway

Warbird Holds Lead After Day Two

The 2024 Reef Cup Invitational Sailfish Tournament has begun with anglers taking to the waters in search of the elusive sailfish. The first two days of fishing saw a total of 65 sailfish – 46 on kite and 19 on outrigger. Here are the standings as of Day Two.

Day One
John Swift of Huntress had the

first release of the tournament at 9:20 a.m., followed just one minute later by Eric Yonke on Trips + 1 with his first of two releases. The final release of the day went to Ed Dunn on Irish Twin at 4:05 p.m. As for Top Angler, Warbird's Mike Bondurant had the most catch and releases of the day with four on kite totaling 400 points, but Yonke's two catches on outrigger brought him to 400 points as well (200 per sailfish caught on outrigger), placing him in the top spot for the day with time of release being the differentiator in scoring. Still, Day One saw Roger Ward's Warbird in the top spot with 600 points.

### **Day Two**

Day Two saw its first catch and release of the day on outrigger by **Jodi Zifferer**, *Catchin Z's*, with the day's final sailfish coming in at 4:02 p.m. by James Huffman of *Days Like This*. Willy Underwood on *Palawan* is Day Two's Top Angler with 400 points.

At the end of Day Two, Warbird holds the top spot with 800 points – a solid start to their tournament – with Carl Lindner's Seraphim in second place and TJ Ely's Irish Twin in third place, both with 500 points.

With two days left, will Warbird remain on the top of the leaderboard? On Saturday at 4 p.m., we will know the answer!

Chef Norman Van Aken Headlines Food & Wine Weekend

Will you be at Food & Wine Weekend **April 11-14**? If not, you're missing out on an unparalleled four-day celebration of culinary, wine and spirit excellence, and the opportunity to delight in an acclaimed chef like Norman Van Aken.

For many Ocean Reef Members, Chef Van Aken needs no introduction; and not only because he's a culinary "who's who" as the only Floridian chef inducted into the James Beard Foundation's list of "Who's Who in American Food and Beverage".

Chef Van Aken has roots at Ocean Reef Club and no shortage of fond memories. For three years, he was at the helm of the Carysfort Grille, the Club's premier restaurant at that time. He's excited for his return this April as the featured chef for Food & Wine's 10th anniversary.

In fact, upon receiving the invitation, he shared, "I have been having memories of ORC since the call. I am sure very much of it will be new to me! It was a special time for me, my wife, and our teams at Carysfort. And you know my long history, indeed my culinary start, was in the Keys. Cayo Hueso."

So who better to help us celebrate this 10-year Food & Wine tradition? In anticipation of the Weekend, we asked Chef Van Aken a few questions:

### What is your fondest memory of your time at Ocean Reef?

I loved waking up there, getting my coffee and walking the sands in the very quiet hours as the sun rose. My fondest singular memory might be the private dinner the Academy Awarded actress **Liv Ullmann** asked me to cook personally

to celebrate her husband's birthday! I have a very special note in her handwriting framed in our home thanking me for the night in her exquisite and charming way.

### Has your culinary style changed since then, and if yes, how so?

My culinary style has been "New World Cuisine" ever since I created that vision around 1987 in Key West. That being said, the term was chosen for the elasticity it allows. In the last decade, I would say two major things have been part of my culinary evolution. Having done the 20-year ongoing project - NORMAN'S in Central Florida - has allowed me to bring more Southern nuances to my menus. And the second being a purposeful lighter and less complicated way of conceptualizing and plating my dishes.

### Why did you want to be a part of the Club's Food & Wine Weekend?

I am very pleased to be part of this celebratory weekend because of the long, elegant history of ORC, my deep love of the Florida Keys, and the chance to make new friends and reconnect with those from our time there.

#### **More About Chef Van Aken**

Norman Van Aken is a culinary trailblazer, credited with the concept of "fusion" cuisine and known as "the founding father of New World Cuisine" - a celebration of Latin, Caribbean, Asian, American and African flavors.

His namesake restaurant NORMAN'S, in Coral Gables, was a finalist for "Outstanding Restaurant in America" - the only one thus far in the entire state. His second outpost, after years at the Ritz-Carlton Grande Lakes Orlando, has a new home at the Dellagio Town Center in Orlando and was just named Southern Living Magazine's 2024 Best New Restaurants for the entire state

of Florida.

His accolades extend globally for representing the US as one of the "Founders of New American Cuisine" at Spain's International Summit of Gastronomy 'Madrid Fusión' (2006), representing Florida at EXPO Milano/World's Fair USA Pavilion, and becoming the first Chef to sit on the James Beard Foundation's Board of Directors.

Van Aken has authored six cookbooks and a memoir, with his latest, "Norman Van Aken's My Florida Kitchen," winning the Florida Book Award's Gold Medal for Cooking.

In 2022, Van Aken became the 'Culinary Director' for the non-profit Camillus House to help with the homeless, formerly homeless and food insecure families of South Florida.

When not in the kitchen, he can be found spending time with his wife, Janet; son, Justin; and granddaughter, Audrey Quinn Van Aken.





### Ocean Reef's Innovative Water Management

Ocean Reef stands as a model of sustainable living and responsible water management. The Ocean Reef Community Association (ORCA) plays a pivotal role in overseeing its crucial water sources, ensuring the well-being of both The Reef's residents and the Florida Keys ecosystem.

Behind the scenes, the North Key Largo Utility Corporation (NKLUC) delivers essential irrigation and wastewater services to the Ocean Reef and Angler's Club communities. NKLUC is a not-for-profit organization managed by ORCA, providing a seamless integration of water services for the community.

"The dedicated team at NKLUC effectively manages both the State-regulated Advanced Wastewater Treatment Plant (AWWTP) and the Reverse Osmosis (RO) irrigation water plant, which is vital to maintaining the golf courses and landscaping," says Jeff Oeltjen, P.E., ORCA's Vice President of Public Works and Utilities.

At the heart of Ocean Reef's water sustainability lies the Reverse Osmosis (RO) water treatment plant. Using brackish

groundwater from several wells over 1,000 feet deep as a feed, reverse osmosis is a sophisticated filtration method. Pressure is applied to force water through a very small pore semipermeable membrane, so that contaminants, dissolved salts, and minerals are effectively filtered out. The concentrate with the contaminants is disposed of by wells. The clean water from the RO process meets all regulatory requirements and is completely suitable for irrigation.

Located at 2 Service Village Lane, across from the Ocean Reef Club Airport, NKLUC's state-of-the-art RO facility boasts a total daily capacity of 2.3 million gallons of water, including a three-train recovery system with capacity of 600,000 gallons per day for each train and a fourth train contributing up to 510,000 gallons per day. This ensures a steady supply of water for irrigating the Dolphin, Hammock, and Card Sound Golf Courses, as well as common areas and some Club and ORCA

buildings.

The Florida Keys Aqueduct Authority (FKAA), provides potable water to the community and irrigation water to members. "This partnership ensures that the community receives clean and safe drinking water and improved water pressure," added Oeltjen.

Spearheading the charge is the plant's dedicated Wastewater Treatment Superintendent, Bill Midling, who has been serving the Ocean Reef community since 2013. During peak seasons, Bill and his staff of three certified operators and two collection technicians ensure that the wastewater is fully treated before undergoing the reverse osmosis process. The resulting purified water is then stored in the holding pond, catering to the irrigation needs of the community.

In off-seasons and periods of low flow, the treated wastewater finds its way to injection wells underground, guaranteeing a responsible disposal method. Resiliency is an ongoing concern, and staff plans continuously to ensure adequate supplies and equipment are available.

ORCA is committed to remaining a steward of water sustainability. It is not just a necessity but a way of life. And that makes it a true paradise.

### Memberabilia My Famous Friend...

One of the nice things about writing a column called Memberabilia is that you can sometimes make it personal. And this column about my friendship with Ann Roth is a little about me and a lot about Ann.

#### Who is Ann Roth?

You may not have a clue but I'll bet if you ask a friend or relative with any connection to film, theatre, television, they will tell you that Ann Roth is this century's most famous, creative and endeared costume designer, who has earned every conceivable theatrical award, including two Oscars (2021 for Ma Rainey's Black Bottom and 1997 for The Enalish Patient).

Ann has created costumes for well over 200 major productions. Her objective in designing a costume never involves trying to make the star look glamourous. She believes that what an actor wears onstage has nothing to do with the person she or he is in real life and everything to do with the character they are portraying.

For example: Dustin Hoffman's purple suit and Jon Voight's fringed suede jacket in *Midnight Cowboy* made those actors feel like the drifters they were portraying. Jane Fonda's sequined cocktail dress and boa in *Klute*, helped her morph into her role as a call girl. Nicole Kidman's latex nose convinced her that she really was Virginia Woolf in *The Hours*.

Ann is dedicated to the authentic. This means her costumes often contain details that might never be seen by the audience but are felt by

the actor. She has gone so far as to put 18th Century undergarments on cast members in a period drama, even though the script never calls for any of them to be seen undressed.

Ann's best friend Meryl (OK, I'm willing to be second "bested" by Meryl Streep) claims that Ann doesn't just design costumes – she works with the actor and director to build a believable onstage character. Ann is certain that what you choose to put on in the morning has a lot to do with who you are.

### **Best Friends Forever**

Ann Roth and I grew up in the same small town of Hanover, PA. We bonded in kindergarten, when we were asked to guess whether a stone would sink or float in a bucket of water, we both voted for "float."

Our shared optimism and mild humiliation marked the beginning of a long friendship – though, as 5-year-olds I don't think either of us had any idea that in our nineties we would still be "besties".

In junior high and high school Ann and I saw each other nearly every day. When we were 13 only Ann could have convinced me that we should both dye all our cotton panties and unnecessary bras black (the resulting color was a dirty military green). A neighbor shocked at the sight of our intimate apparel hanging on the clothesline called my

mother and we got a deserved "dressing down."

Ann's flair for costume design flourished in a 7th grade biology class where instead of drawing bugs she did alluring sketches of Gibson Girls (those big-haired 40's pin-up girls). These drawings were coveted by 13-year-old football players. who needed decoration for their lockers. Ann and I both took painting lessons at the local Catholic school but as I recall we painted apples, and I don't think Sister Mary Elizabeth contributed much to Ann's impressive career.

### **Early Days**

Ann and I graduated from Hanover High School in 1949 with top honors and an expectation of college. Though compared to what my children and grandchildren went through, our college selection and acceptance was a breeze. Ann went to Carnegie Tech in Pittsburgh and I went to William and Mary in Williamsburg, VA. I don't know what Ann was officially majoring in, but she soon switched to Carnegie's excellent Drama Department. I started out as an English major and then changed my major to Philosophy.

During our college years, we saw one another infrequently, mostly at Christmas vacation, where we hooked up with former high school boyfriends for holiday parties. After

graduation we emigrated from Hanover, as fast as we could – me to New York City, Ann to NYC and California.

I went to work at Mademoiselle Magazine (now defunct but important then). I had a dream job as an assistant to the Arts Editor, Leo Lerman. Leo was a big, bearded, Gay man. A sort of modern-day Proust. He was loved and admired by everyone who was up-and-coming, or already hugely successful, in the arts and entertainment arena. He was always helpful in finding jobs in his world for friends. (It was Leo who was instrumental in getting me the job of editor-in-chief of Playbill, a position I held for over 30 years.)

One of Leo Lerman's closest friends was the legendary costume designer, Irene Sharaff. She frequently visited Leo at the office. On one of her visits, I overheard a comment she made to Leo. "My new assistant Ann Roth is wonderful," said Irene. "She looks like a little 11-year-old boy. But she can do anything."

I think I knew then that my best friend was going to be a famous costume designer.

#### **Onward and Upward**

In 1964 Ann had her first breakthrough with the Peter Sellers' comedy *The World* of *Henry Orient*. There's a wonderful Ann Roth costume moment in this film when



In the years that followed *The World of Henry Orient* Ann worked with every major director (e.g., Spielberg, Minghella, Ephron). She had a symbiotic relationship with director Mike Nichols for nearly five decades. She did six plays with him, starting with *The Odd Couple* in 1965, and 13 films including *Heartburn*, *The Birdcage* and *Working Girl*.

Ann created costumes for a galaxy of Hollywood and Broadway stars (e.g. Nathan Lane, Jane Fonda, John

Travolta, Nicole Kidman). She worked with Meryl Streep on a dozen or so films (e.g. *Postcards from the Edge, Julie & Julia, The Post, Mamma Mia*).

It's now 2024 and Ann is still

working. (So am I, but mainly unpaid for the Ocean Reef Press). Though Ann swears she is retired, her retirement plans are constantly being undercut by top directors or producers

who won't accept no as an answer. Or even more difficult, dear friends like Meryl, whose pleas are impossible to resist.

#### **Last Word:**

Is there any question that my best friend is famous?

Addendum: There's a good chance you have recently seen Ann in a movie without realizing it. She had a pivotal scene in "Barbie". It takes place when the forever-young Barbie ventures into the real world and encounters a woman sitting at an LA bus stop reading a newspaper. Barbie has a sudden insight that maybe being human and growing old wasn't such a bad idea. "You're so beautiful," says Barbie. "I know it," replies Ann Roth in character.

Ann told me that the film company flew her to LA for one day to shoot her saying those three words. Later when there was pressure to cut the scene, the director Greta Gerwig, adamantly refused "because without it, I don't know what this movie is about."

### Wimbledon **Tennis** Championship 1983

"YOU CANNOT BE SERIOUS!" John McEnroe said as he rushed toward the line umpire. The umpire calmly pointed to the ball mark left by McEnroe's serve and didn't say a word. He looked at the mark, clearly understanding the umpire was correct, and returned to the baseline, continuing to rant and offer expletives. That cool line umpire was Ocean

From the quaint town of Port Washington on the north shore of Long Island, Diane's journey in tennis began. She learned to play the sport at the prestigious Manhasset Bay Yacht Club. Her passion for the game led her to a tournament at Forest Hills, where she had a chance encounter with Eastern Umpire Tennis Association officials. Intrigued by the prospect, she decided to try her hand at officiating. Starting in junior tournaments, Diane quickly made a name for herself as a solid, unflappable umpire. Later, her reputation caught the attention of the United States Open officials, who invited her to be an umpire at their esteemed event.

The pinnacle of an umpire's career is to officiate at Wimbledon, a dream that Diane was fortunate to realize. She was approached by John Ralph, the then chairman of Wimbledon Tennis, who invited her to



In the mid-nineties, Diane was introduced to Ocean Reef through her friend, Yanna Scalamandre (think exotic fabrics). She was quickly enamored, bought a property, and joined the Racquet Club. And if you're playing tennis against her, she still makes the calls as she sees them.



three years in pre-Wimbledon matches and finally five years at the Wimbledon main event. Diane fondly recalls her first arrival at Heathrow. The stewardess made an announcement in the cabin that Diane would be the first to deplane. Upon Reef's own Diane Petrosino. hearing her name, she was initially filled with dread, thinking something terrible had happened to her family. But she was soon relieved to discover it was a gesture of true British hospitality as she was whisked past customs and onto her hotel. The pay was nominal,

She fondly recalls being a net umpire during Wimbledon. In those days, the net umpire would have her hand on the net to sense a let, and a device would beep if a ball hit it, indicating a let. An umpire could not overcall the beeper. John McEnroe hit an excellent serve during one memorable match, but the beep sounded. Diane called a 'let.' McEnroe, known for his fiery temper, stormed up to her and demanded, "Did you


## Who is St. Patrick?

You think he drove the snakes from Ireland? Think he's Irish? His name is Patrick? Read on.

Let's begin with the world into which he was born... The Romans occupied Britannia (Britain) for three and a half centuries – from 43 CE to 410 CE and, of course, intermarried with the local British Celts. One such couple in 386 CE (near the end of the Roman occupation) had a son named Maewyn Succat. Meanwhile to the west, Ireland had been unconquered by the Romans for political and cost/benefit reasons: no tin or lead mines,





Fortunately, Spring brings a parade of new books. No dud for Michael Connelly. His legal thrillers (the Lincoln








## Preparing to Celebrate Easter

Someone has said that a club without traditions is little more than a resort. As we all know, the rhythm of life in at Ocean Reef Club during the season revolves around many wonderful, cherished traditions.

#### A Historic Partnership

One of these long-standing traditions is the annual Easter Sunrise Service on Buccaneer Island. This year it will be on **Sunday, March 31**, starting at 7 a.m.

The Easter Sunrise Service is an historic partnership between the Ocean Reef Club and The Protestant Congregation of The Ocean Reef Chapel and Fellowship Center. More than twelve hundred people gather to face the dawn at Buccaneer Island on Easter morning.

### **The Arrangements**

As you well know, events of this size don't simply happen. My thought was that perhaps you would enjoy a brief glimpse of what takes place in preparation for the morning. Leaders from the Club and Chapel review the plans and arrangements weeks ahead each year. Some 1,200 chairs that cover Buccaneer Island must be set up on Saturday evening. The damp, early Sunday mornings can require lots of hands and towels to dry them off before you sit down.

The sunrise service would not be complete without the beautiful lily cross in its place. Easter is nothing apart from the story of how an instrument of alienation and death was transformed into the image of reconciliation and life.

The choir risers, stage, lighting, and sound equipment arrive on a big trailer early on Saturday evening. Everything must be in place and working properly before the choir and musicians arrive before sunrise.

While the musicians are rehearsing, a small platoon of dedicated ushers are sipping coffee and preparing to welcome everyone, distribute programs, and collect the offering.

And then, just as soon as the service concludes, everything is torn down and trucked off so Buccaneer Island can be reset for another great Ocean Reef tradition – the Easter Egg hunt!

#### The Music Team

Weeks ahead, a team from the chapel is at work, planning the program and music for the morning.

He also coordinates the transportation for the busload of students and musicians coming from the University to Ocean Reef on Saturday afternoon. Upon arrival, Wesley rehearses the combined choir from the chapel and the university, plus the musicians who accompany all the music. No small task!

After the rehearsal, a catered dinner is provided for all the musicians. Then members from the chapel arrive and open their homes to house them as guests. After a short night of sleep, the hosts bring them to the beach,

bright and early on Sunday morning.

Following the Sunrise Service, the musicians and ushers enjoy a well-deserved sumptuous breakfast provided by the club. Then after a brief moments rest, they repeat it again at 10 a.m. in the sanctuary of the Ocean Reef Chapel and Fellowship Center.

The Easter service could not be what it is apart from the hours of rehearsing and preparing the glorious music that inspires and punctuates this celebration of the greatest event in history — the resurrection of Jesus.

My hope is that when you take your dry seat this Easter morning, it will be with greater appreciation of all that goes into preparing this beloved Ocean Reef tradition.

Of course, the goal is that your experience of the speaker's message will be deepened and enriched. The historic event we celebrate in word and in song can be summarized using the words of acclamation that have greeted the dawn of Easter from millennia. He is risen! He is risen indeed!

### **VISITING PRIESTS TO LEAD CATHOLIC MASSES**



Bishop Enrique Delgado, auxiliary bishop of Miami, left his professional career as an industrial engineer to become a priest. He is now the first Peruvian to be named a bishop in the US. He considers himself a "late vocation," having entered the seminary at 35. In February 1991, he left Peru and came to live in St. Agnes, in Key Biscayne, for

a month, then Our Lady Queen of Martyrs in Fort Lauderdale, for six months. That fall, he entered St. John Vianney Seminary, followed by more years of study at the major seminary of St. Vincent de Paul in Boynton Beach. He was ordained a priest for the archdiocese June 29, 1996, by Miami's then auxiliary bishop, Agustín Román. In October 2017, after 21 years of service in various archdiocesan parishes, Pope Francis named him a bishop.



### The Early Shift

While most of us are in a deep snooze by 2 a.m., there are dozens of employees around The Reef working through the wee hours to prepare for the day ahead. First shift hours vary by department with the bakers being some of the earliest to arrive.

Enrique Gonzalez has worked a 2 a.m. to 10 a.m. shift at The Bake Shop for the past 30 years. His delicious responsibilities entail preparing 300 to 500 ciabatta rolls for Gianni's, pastries and bread for the Ocean Room, and donuts and croissants for Reef Treats. He also helps set up for the rest of the 15 bakers, who work rotating schedules through 10 p.m.

When Enrique leaves The Reef, he may run an errand or two and usually naps from 11:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. The rest of the afternoon and early evening he spends with his wife and then sleeps again from 8 p.m. to 1 a.m. While he admits working untraditional hours conflicted with spending holidays with his daughters when they were growing up, at 72, he's grateful to still be doing what he loves. The main difference between now and then, he says, is that

he didn't use to need the nap.

One of the things Enrique enjoys most about his work is training younger bakers and pastry chefs. For the past year, he's been working alongside Horlang Blanco, a part-time baker who is seeking his degree in culinary arts from Miami Dade Community College. He hopes to go full time later this year. The father of three boys and one girl, ranging in age from five to 18, says the advantage of an alternative schedule is that he can get to the grocery store, pick up his kids from school, watch his kids play sports, and prepare dinner for his family while his wife is at her banking job.

Caffeine also plays a big role in each man's life with five to six cups a day of coffee for Horlang and three to four cups of hot tea daily for Enrique. The two work straight from 2 a.m. to 6:30 a.m. when they stop to have breakfast.

#### **Early Greeters**

The Member Fitness Center's Melissa Lazo, 26, wakes up at 4:30 a.m. to be at the front desk by 5:45 a.m. She gives herself a little extra time in the morning driving a dark Card Sound Road into Ocean Reef.

Melissa, who has worked at ORC for five years, points to two advantages of having the morning shift. First, it gives her time to work her second job as a Cheer Coach at her alma mater, Keys Gate Charter in Homestead. Secondly, she loves the morning crowd at the gym, greeting each person with an

energetic "Good Morning."

"We have a steady group of Members who come in early. It allows me more time to build relationships, to talk to them," said Melissa, who calls waking up at 9 a.m. on her days off "sleeping in".

#### Over at The Inn

You can count on a familiar smile at the Inn's entrance from Bellstand's Fenel Kersaint, who starts his shift at 5 a.m. He begins his day reviewing his staff's schedules, greeting Inn guests checking out early and Members coming in for their morning coffee. He does newspaper deliveries to private homes and outlets, but his real claim to fame is a fan club made up of the four-legged friends. He stocks up on boxes of treats he hides behind a podium and keeps an ongoing list of Member names with their corresponding pet's names so that everyone gets a personal greeting.

"I get done with work early, so I have the rest of the day to myself or work a second job," said Fenel, a 25-year associate. "I usually take a nap after work. Just one hour. You get a lot of other opportunities when you have your days free, I prefer this schedule."

Any time Fenel, who walks an hour four times a week in the afternoons, can squeeze in watching an NBA basketball game, he's all in, especially when The Miami Heat is playing. "Win or lose, that's my team," he says.




## Famous Family, Or Not?


## ORC Half Marathon: Run, Walk, or Relay


As the countdown to April 6th begins, the ORC Half Marathon promises to be an exciting event. Whether running, walking, or relaying, all are invited to join in the excitement.





## Daylight Saving Time and Gusty Conditions Affect CSMYC Sailors



#### **Tradition of Golf Croquet**

According to the Encyclopedia Britannica, the ancestral croquet game was introduced to Britain from France during the 1660-1685 reign of Charles II of England, Scotland and Ireland and was played under the name of paille-maille (among other spellings, today usually pall-mall), derived ultimately

from Latin words for 'ball and mallet'.

# Maximizing 5-4 Major Distributions after Partner's 1NT Opening

By Gregg Van Dyke, Director of Card & Games

When your partner opens with 1NT, the objective is to explore potential fits in the major suits, typically facilitated through Stayman and Jacoby Transfers.

However, encountering a 5-4 distribution in the majors presents a unique challenge. Here's how to efficiently communicate your hand shape to the NT opener, especially with 10 or more high card points (HCPs) using the Smolen Convention.

## The Smolen Convention (For 10+ HCPs):

#### 1. Initiate with Stayman

(2♣): Begin by employing Stayman to inquire about a 4-card major fit. If partner responds with a major suit, simply raise it to the 4-level to indicate your preference.

## 2. Utilize Smolen Convention after Denial: If partner rebids 2♦, signaling a lack of a major, it's time to employ the Smolen Convention to uncover a

3-card fit with your 5-card major.

## Executing the Smolen Convention:

#### 1. Start with Stayman:

Begin as usual with Stayman to gauge partner's major holdings.

2. Jump to the 3-Level with the Shorter Major: In response to partner's denial of a 4-card major, jump to the 3-level with your shorter major, which partner does not have. This indicates your 5-4 distribution and game-going values.

#### 3. Partner's Response:

Partner will either bid game with a 3-card fit in your shorter major or opt for 3NT, depending on the overall strength of the combined hands.

#### The Strategy Behind Smolen:

The Smolen Convention aims to efficiently convey a 5-4 distribution in the majors and signal game-going values. By allowing the stronger hand to play the hand, it maximizes the chances of achieving the optimal contract.

In summary, when faced with a 5-4 distribution in the majors after partner's 1NT opening, integrating the Smolen Convention into your bidding sequence can effectively communicate your hand shape and propel your partnership towards a successful contract.


