## Reef Cup Goes Down to the Wire

Since the inaugural tournament in 1986, the Reef Cup Invitational Sailfish Tournament has become The Reef's most anticipated fishing tournament of the season. The sailfishing is serious, the competition is fierce, and the tournament trophy coveted. Talking to two of this year's big tournament winners, who were neck in neck in many ways throughout the tournament, shows how quickly everything can change, sometimes in the last 10 minutes.

# **Team Warbird, 1st Place Overall**For **Roger Ward** and his Warbird crew, the excitement began Day 1 and never let up. Ending each day at the top of the leaderboard made them the boat to beat – a thrilling place to be with everything to lose.

While this was Ward's third year fishing Reef Cup, his crew was anything but new to him. He's fished with anglers Marc Granet, Mike Bondurant and Erin Clampett for 13 years, mates Johnny Villario and Fred David for five, and Captain Brett Dudas for 13 years – who Continued On | 3

# Preparedness at Ocean Reef

In all coastal areas the word "preparedness" is almost always paired with "hurricane." However, over the past few years as migrant landings increased all along the South Florida coastline, the concept of preparedness has been given a much broader meaning.

Understanding the past experiences at Ocean Reef involving the Haitian and Cuban landings, ORCA and the Club developed operational plans to deal with such events. Should new information be received, the Club and ORCA collaborate on a review of the preparedness protocols. There

is consistent communication with federal, state, and local first responders, with ORCA receiving updates on the latest intelligence and situational awareness. Additionally, ORCA and the Club have hosted joint meetings with authorities to strengthen relationships and coordinate responses to Ocean Reef should another event occur. ORCA has also met with US Congressman Carlos Gimenez, who sits on the Homeland Security Committee, and who has expressed his commitment along with Gov. DeSantis, to support the various federal and state agencies.

With the Florida Governor's office recent citing of the "potential for invasion" by Haitian migrants due to the

current conditions, ORCA and the Club are closely monitoring the situation recognizing that every event can be different. Efforts have long been underway by authorities to intercept migrant vessels and additional resources have been ordered by Governor DeSantis to assist in the already heightened posture. ORCA, via Public Safety, will continue to communicate with the law enforcement partners to ensure a seamless response if a landing does occur.

The safety of our Members and Associates will always be paramount and first concern.

If you observe a migrant vessel in the water approaching Ocean Reef while boating or from land, quickly contact 911

or call in on radio channel 16 describing the situation. In both cases, advise the dispatcher you are calling from Ocean Reef or your current location, describe your observations. include GPS coordinates if known, and the direction of travel on the vessel and any other pertinent information. Do not approach the migrants and allow the authorities or Public Safety to handle the incident unless there is no other option. The best practice is to remain at a distance and observe from a safe location, if possible. Always remember that most of the migrants are coming due to a humanitarian crisis and are seeking asylum. However, the individuals have not yet been vetted by the authorities.

he says is a great captain, friend and part of the family. This experienced and familiar crew undoubtedly contributed to Warbird successfully going 15 for 15, meaning each sail they went for, they caught. An impressive record.

Marc Granet caught Warbird's first sail of the tournament, Ward himself caught five others, and Mike Bondurant caught the remaining nine – putting him in Top Angler territory which was hotly contested with our next interviewee.

Despite three consecutive days on the water, Ward said "the hardest day of fishing was not fishing at all, but sitting at the dock on Day 4, our Lay Day. The competition was tough in this tournament and no one gave up chasing us."

Saturday was emotional as they watched their lead diminish. "We probably cleaned the boat four or five times just to keep busy," he said. "We followed the CatchStat reports, which showed us the show was



not over until the bell rang at 4 p.m. Brett and I went to the bridge to listen to the last five minutes on the radio."

When that bell finally did ring... an emotional rush of "wow, our team really did it." Warbird held onto their lead, becoming the 39th Annual Reef Cup Champions. Ward said, "Reef Cup is one of the most prestigious tournaments in the country and I am honored and humbled to be amongst 39 years of winners."

## Jodi Zifferer, Catchin' Z's, Top Angler

Jodi Zifferer and crew -Captain Tucker Ersek, Mate Andres Garcia, and Scott, Mort, and Graham Zifferer never gave up chasing Warbird to the finish line.

Catchin' Z's spent their Day 1 Lay Day eagerly following live CatchStat updates as Warbird set the pace for the tournament. Jodi followed suit, catching five of her team's six fish on outrigger, earning her 200 points per fish. The sail that made all the difference came in at 3:17 p.m. on Day 4.

From atop the tower, Captain Ersek spotted a free-jumping sailfish. Following it, he guided Jodi where to cast and the sail took the bait. "It's really exciting," she said. "The line gets tight and you know you're on. Your heart starts racing and you tell yourself, don't screw this up. Especially when it's the last part of the day. That fish was mine to lose."

Indeed, with only minutes to go, that final fish put Jodi ahead of Warbird's Mike Bondurant for Top Angler, who was in the lead at the time with 900 points, and propelled Catchin' Z's into second place with 1200 points.

"The last 5 to 10 minutes were the most tense," said Jodi. "The final call came over the radio and for the next seven minutes, radio silence. We held our breath, hoping to hold onto our lead, before all of a sudden everyone started calling in their hookups."

A matter of minutes pushed Catchin' Z's from second to third place, but Jodi held on to her lead making her the second woman to ever be crowned Reef Cup Top Angler.

"If you told me 10 years ago this is what I'd be doing now, I wouldn't have believed you!" said Zifferer who has only been fishing for the past five or six years.

She attributes her win and her love of fishing to Tucker and Andres. "They are the reason I enjoy fishing so much. Their enthusiasm is infectious. They've taught me how to be a really good angler and set the standard for women in fishing."

## Reef Speak Part Two

Do You Speak Reef?

Back in November, we wrote a list of more than 40 terms only used at The Reef to serve as a translation guide to our unique ORC language. (Read the original in the November 17, 2023 edition.) Here are more words and phrases native to our Club culture.

**Leisurely:** A term describing our speed limit. (Somewhere between 1 and 15 mph)

**Ocean Grief:** The feeling you get in your stomach after your property tax (or any

other) bill comes. Also, used by people to describe our unique way of life who, in reality, wish they were here.

Half and Half: Not the cream you add to your coffee, but a term often used by Reef Old Timers (people who have been here awhile) when ordering a non-alcoholic cold beverage that's half lemonade and half iced tea. Everywhere else you'd call it an Arnold Palmer.

Tiffany's: Before our grocery store was called Wynn's, it was called Gardners, and before that, it was Tiffany's. People joked that because it was expensive, the name was apropos.

Mainland: Miami.

The Stretch: Not a physical move, but the term we use to describe an alternative route to using Card Sound Road, taking you from Route 1 in Florida City to Key Largo. You might consider The Stretch if you are scared of driving Card Sound. It adds 15 minutes to

your commute but often, less anxiety.

It's Closed/Shut Down: A frightening phrase to let us know we can't use Card Sound Road. Next step: Refer to The Stretch.

M3: The nickname for Moorey-Margaret Myers, a medical fitness therapist and yoga instructor at the Member Fitness Center. She's from Monroe, Michigan. When she talks about The Stretch, she is talking about the physical one.

The White Orchid: "Our state" flower.

**Tip of the Island:** Another term for The Point.

**Patron:** Not a saint or a regular restaurant guest, but a term to describe a founding Club Member.

Bridge, The Bridge: Could be a dental bridge, but more often refers to Card Sound Bridge or Sunrise Cay Bridge (formerly known as the Bridge to Nowhere, now known as the currently undergoing restoration). Could also mean Duplicate Bridge hosted at the Card & Games Center.

What Day is It? A question most commonly asked by the second day of a visit to Ocean Reef (or the third cocktail at Everton's Rum Bar). Also asked when trying to figure out the Member's daily special.

What Time is It? A rhetorical question.

Claws: Stone crabs.

**Gumbo Limbo:** Not a plant, but the former name of the Rod and Gun Club.

Going Into Town: A phrase explaining you're leaving The Gates and driving to Key Largo.

Going Down: This is a phrase used by Northern Members explaining they are going to The Reef. Are you going down? I'm going down. Younger members might say I'm down for going down.


## How We Got Here

Our beloved Ocean Reef Club, nestled in the heart of the Florida Keys, has many street names most easily relatable to our location. We have Andros, Exuma, South, Halfway, Ocean Reef Drive, Country Club, Anchor, Barracuda, Perky, Grayvik. Wait a minute! Perky? Grayvik? These two names, seemingly out of place, hold a fascinating mystery. What could be the intriguing stories behind these names, located in the heart of our community?

In the mid '20s, one of the largest landowners in the Keys owned a resort/fishing camp near the 17-mile marker now called Sugarloaf Key. The fishing was terrific, but voracious mosquitoes kept many potential guests away. The owner had heard that bats were an effective way to fend them off and, using plans from

a successful entrepreneur from Texas, constructed a vast louvered bat roost and baited it with a very smelly substance. After many iterations of other baits, including ground-up parts of bats, none worked. The mosquitoes thrived, and ultimately, the business failed to prosper, but the structure remained and was a tourist attraction until Hurricane Irma toppled it in 2017. The fishing camp was in a town called Perky, named after the owner, Richter Clyde Perky.

Several years later, Mr. Perky, a man with a vision as a real estate developer in Miami, purchased 700 acres of land in North Key Largo. With the goal of selling lots for houses, he platted some of the land, assigning names to

the streets, one of which was Perky Road. When the stock market crashed, Mr. Perky lost the property due to unpaid back taxes, leaving behind a legacy as a street name.

In 1935, eighty acres of Mr. Perky's platted land was purchased by a fascinating man who was well-known outside the United States. His name was Ivor Thord Gray. Originally from Sweden, he was likely a

soldier of fortune. He worked in different armies in South Africa, the Philippines, Malaysia, Mexico, Britain, and Russia. He had been attached to more than ten armies in sixteen wars and conflicts. He was a Merchant Marine, a prison guard, a militia captain, a constable, and an artillery specialist. While in Mexico, he joined Pancho Villa as captain and commander of artillery. After moving to the United States, he settled down with homes in Coral Gables and Connecticut after becoming very rich via nebulous possession of gold notes. He loved the Keys and decided to build another smaller home, which he did. He named it Grayvik. In Swedish, 'gra' means gray, and 'vic' means a wide inward bend of coastline, 'Grayvik.'

Years later, Morris Baker, the founder of the Ocean Reef Club, purchased the house and used it to house the offices of Seaboard Properties, which acted as the construction arm for Mr. Baker's development.

## Pasta Perfection

I recently met Emilio Miti in the production room of the Gianni kitchen. He was installing a new machine of his design to make fresh pasta. Waving to his impressive apparatus he said, "Chefs love new toys," This was not news to me. Your crack team of Ocean Reef Press investigative journalists, Food Division, have followed these developments for years -- Chef Philippe's Food Truck and portable Pizza Oven; Chef Jonathan's Wood-fired Grill; Chef Cataline's Multi-featured Banquet Ovens. Each innovation improved Member experience, reduced costs, increased speed, or

saved money, or perhaps all four. And here in the Gianni kitchen, Chefs Jared, Ryan, Roma, Michael and Sous Chef Nelio were "test driving" the latest advance.

Emilio's creation is made in Rome, then shipped to California for the electronic controls to be installed. The elaborate dies that form each style of pasta are made in Como, Italy. They are precision machined in a food-certified alloy of brass. A demonstration run was just beginning as I pulled out my

camera.

First, about the ingredients. Wheat is one of the oldest cultivated crops. It is a grass grown for its seed, a cereal grain that is a world-wide staple food. Wheat gives us bread, breakfast cereals, biscuits, crackers, scones, pancakes, pizza, and...pasta. Pasta is simplicity itself: Durum wheat flour (semolina) and water. That's it. Emilio's machine mixes the water and flour, then forces the dough through the chosen die via a stainless-steel auger to create a wide variety of pastas (there are more than 300 pasta shapes). Chef Ryan has a collection of dies to make about a dozen different types.

With our current small pasta maker, Chef Ryan can make about three kilos per production run. Emilio's machine will produce fifty kilos per run. Using our own fresh pasta rather than importing pasta as we do now will save enough to pay for the machine in about a year. And our own pasta will have

17% protein compared to 10% with packaged pasta. Cheaper, faster, and more nutritious. The pasta made in the Gianni kitchen will be also supplied to all the other Ocean Reef venues.

Now the final test. Cooking the pasta. Italy, where pasta is the national dish, claims the standard for how pasta should be cooked: al dente (to the tooth). It is about texture, not taste. Al dente pasta should have a little resistance when you bite into it. The texture should be tender but firm and chewy. It's about timing and testing, a challenge for the chef. Chef Ryan aims for classic al dente. But Emilio laughs. He says German, Swiss, and Dutch tourists often say, "cook my pasta longer," even in Italy. He calls this "stracotto" (overcooked), or even more disdainfully "Olive Garden Pasta." Never the less, Chef Ryan tries to accommodate every request that comes to the kitchen. Even if you are not German, Swiss, or Dutch, permit yourself to enjoy your own style of pasta perfection at Gianni.

## Upgrade Your Safety: Modernize Your Smoke and CO Alarms

Many modern carbon monoxide (CO) detectors now come equipped with sealed, long-life lithium batteries lasting up to 10 years, eliminating the need for annual battery changes. This advancement provides convenience for homeowners and ensures continuous protection against fire and carbon monoxide hazards.

Correctly placed and properly functioning smoke and CO alarms in your home here on The Reef are critical to detect any potential harm long before it can affect you, your family, or friends. Smoke and CO are known as "silent killers" because they can swiftly

incapacitate and cause death without warning.

There are a variety of types of smoke and CO alarms and detectors available. Some are hardwired to AC power with battery backups, and some are battery-powered only. Some smoke and CO alarms are powered by sealed, long-life lithium batteries for 10 years, with the entire unit being replaced at the end of the 10 years. The ORCA Fire-Rescue Department recommends their use in locations where it is not feasible to place a hard-wired smoke or CO detector.

Smoke and CO alarms should be installed in key locations throughout the home. Place smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area, and every level of your home, including the garage. Carbon monoxide alarms should be installed on each level of the home and near sleeping areas.

"While it is true that natural gas, a typical source of carbon monoxide, is not used in Ocean

Reef, dramatically reducing the chances of dangerous levels of CO within one's home, there are a variety of potential sources of dangerous carbon monoxide in and around homes in our community, making CO alarms equally as necessary as smoke alarms," said ORCA Fire Chief John Flynn.

Since kitchens tend to produce occasional smoke and steam, avoid placing smoke alarms too close to cooking appliances to prevent nuisance alarms. Bathroom showers may also produce steam which will unnecessarily activate a smoke alarm. In both kitchens and bathrooms, place detectors a safe distance away and consider installing a heat alarm in these areas for more accurate detection.

Test your alarms monthly to ensure functionality by pressing the test button and listening for a beep. For older model smoke and CO alarms with replaceable batteries, it's advisable to change the battery annually, ideally during the

spring or fall time changes when we adjust our clocks. However, considering the convenience and enhanced safety features of newer models with long-life batteries, it might be worth considering an upgrade for added peace of mind.

Smoke alarms should be replaced every 10 years and carbon monoxide alarms every five to seven years (depending on the model and manufacturer) to ensure proper performance.

Carbon monoxide is invisible, odorless, and tasteless. Prolonged exposure to small quantities of CO can cause severe heart problems and brain damage. Exposure to high concentrations of carbon monoxide can lead to death within minutes.

Anyone who knows Member **Jacquie Whitten** has experienced her bright smile, high energy and thoughtful demeanor. But what you might now know is even after her recent accident, it was others she was thinking about, not herself.

#### What Happened

About two weeks ago she became lightheaded as she leaned over her open dishwasher and fell causing heavy facial bruising and a large gash over her left eye. Within minutes of her husband's 911 call Public Safety was there tending to her while alerting the helicopter which would airlift her to Jackson Memorial's Trauma Center and arranging for a neighbor to take her husband to meet them. Luckily two CT scans were clean and a facial plastic surgeon was available to place the many tiny stiches to avoid a large scar. Shortly after another neighbor brought her home the next morning, she headed to The Spa where her hair and scalp were carefully cleaned while avoiding the extensive stiches.

#### On the Mend

All this would have most of us take to our beds immediately, but not Jacquie. She was most concerned that Members know how wonderful everyone was throughout. "All I can do is smile and not feel sorry for myself. The good people who tended to me were caring and kind. Kevin Hulse, of Public Safety, even returned to my home that night to clean up all the blood. Since I take blood thinners, it was quite a scene. Julie and Maria at The Spa made me feel almost normal after they caringly cleaned me up. I emailed Mic O'Keeffe knowing he would be able to contact the appropriate departments to thank them on my behalf."

#### Words to Live By

Jacquie quoted me paraphrased

lines from a G.B. Shaw play which she has laminated in her wallet from 50 years ago and reads often, "This is the true joy in life, the being used for a purpose recognized by yourself as a mighty one; being thoroughly worn out before you are thrown on the scrap heap; being a force of nature instead of a selfish little clod of ailments and grievances complaining the world will not devote itself to making you happy."

The bruises are fading, the stiches are gone and her stamina has returned. The memory of extreme kindness by capable ORC and ORCA staff will remain. As Jacquie noted, "Hopefully no one will go through what I did but knowing the level of excellence here can give us all comfort."

## Robust State and Federal Funding for Everglades Restoration is Good News for Florida Bay

message was that Everglades
restoration benefits our
21stcenturyeconomy and guides
us toward a more resilient and
sustainable future. Restoring
the flow of water through the
Everglades and into Florida Bay
benefits our fishing industry,
water-based recreation and real

estate, and protects us from natural hazards.

The last few weeks brought more good news for Everglades restoration, and therefore, for Florida Bay. President Biden on March 11 announced his budget request to Congress of \$444 million in funding for Everglades restoration in Fiscal Year 2025. In our last article, we noted the vital importance of the Everglades Agricultural Area (EAA) Reservoir, and this budget request is critical to ensure that construction of the reservoir stays on track for completion in 2030. Once complete, the reservoir will

store, clean, and send lake water south to the Everglades and Florida Bay, reduce harmful discharges to coastal communities, replenish the Biscayne Aquifer, and fortify Florida's already strong clean water economy.


Congress also provided \$425 million to fund Everglades restoration projects in its Fiscal Year 2024 budget. This muchneeded investment will build on strong funding in previous years and continue generational progress on Everglades restoration.

On the state side, only one week prior to the President's

budget request, the Florida Legislature passed \$740 million for Everglades restoration in the Fiscal Year '24-25 budget. This complements Governor DeSantis' request for robust Everglades funding in his second term.

With many thanks to The Everglades Foundation's relentless advocacy, these funds are critical to maintain momentum in restoring one of the world's ecological treasures. The Everglades is also the source of drinking water for millions, and the backbone of Florida's clean water economy. It matters for Florida Bay, so it matters for all of us here at Ocean Reef.





# A Week of Significance

This coming week is one of great significance. It is so first because we will welcome the newly called Chaplain in Residence. Dr. Daniel Meyer, and his wife Amy.

Dr. Meyer will be preaching this **Sunday**, **March 24** at the 9:00 a.m. worship service of the Protestant Congregation. Chuck Hartz, the chair of the search committee, will introduce Dan to the congregation and speak about the process leading to Dan's call. Then, at the 10:30 a.m., Dan and Bob Henley will sit down together for an informal get-acquainted session with the congregation.

#### **Family History and Education**

Dan grew up in Chappaqua,

New York, the son of a state senator and nephew of a U.S. senator and ambassador. Over the course of his young adult years, Dan gained varied life experiences working on an offshore oil rig, in a maximum-security prison, at IBM's world corporate headquarters, and on a farm.

He acquired an early interest in politics and public service. While a student at Yale University, Dan served two terms as head of the student government, received the John C. Schroeder Prize for Leadership, rowed on a Henley-finalist crew team, and graduated in 1981 with honors and distinction in the field of Political Science.

## **Introduction to Ministry**

Following college, Dan spent two years serving alongside the pastor and people of the Duncairn Presbyterian Church, in Belfast, Northern Ireland. At the height of the 'Troubles' there, Dan worked among the area's youth and senior adults, helped to start an ecumenical community service center, served as a part-time hospital chaplain, and played semi-pro basketball on one of the province's few Protestant-Catholic teams. This pastoral experience was the beginning of what would become his life's work.

## Theological Education and Marriage

Upon returning to the United States, Dan earned a Master of Divinity degree at Princeton Theological Seminary. He was awarded the Senior Prize for Excellence in Preaching. In 2008, he earned his Doctor of Ministry degree from Fuller Theological Seminary.

Following studies at Princeton, Dan served as an Associate Pastor of the *First Presbyterian Church of Burlingame*, California. While there, in 1988, he married his wife, Amy. They are the parents of three sons, one of whom is married.

#### **Pastoral Leadership**

In 1991, the Meyer's were called to the *Village Community Presbyterian Church* of Rancho Santa Fe, north of San Diego.

Since 1997, Dan has been Lead Pastor of Christ Church, a nondenominational, multisite church with locations in Oak Brook and Lombard, just west of Chicago. An average of 3,000 people participate each weekend in the church's children's ministry and five worship services, in-person or online. The church has an operating budget of \$11M and invests an additional \$1.5M annually in 70 domestic and global mission partnerships that multiply churches, lift women and children, transform communities, relieve suffering and develop leaders. The ministry is supported by a full and part-time staff of 148 persons and hundreds of volunteer servant-leaders.

## **Recognition and Writing**

Dan has served as Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Fuller Theological Seminary since 2018. He has moderated the Executives Breakfast Club (a forum for business leaders) and is the recipient of four regional Emmy Awards for his role as host of Life Focus — a television newsmagazine. Additionally,

he has authored three books
-- Discovering God (Waterfall
Press, 2014), Witness Essentials
(InterVarsity Press, 2012), and
Leadership Essentials (IVP, 2007,
with Greg Ogden).

Dan's commitments at Christ Church will continue through January 2025. The plan is for him to assume responsibilities as Chaplain in the Ocean Reef Chapel and Fellowship Center in February 2025. Bob Henley will continue to serve in his role until that time.

#### **Palm Sunday**

It is significant that Dan will be preaching on Palm Sunday, March 24 the day that marks the beginning of the most momentous week in human history – the week of Easter. On Palm Sunday, Jesus of Nazareth descended the narrow road that wound down the Mount of Olives. His entry was hailed by throngs of worshippers who had come to Jerusalem to celebrate the feast of Passover. Their cries of 'Hosanna' echoed across the city as they laid branches and cloaks in the road he descended, riding on the foal of a donkey.

#### **Maundy Thursday**

Finally, on Thursday, March 28 evening of this week, at 8:00 p.m., we will observe a Tenebrae Service of Darkness. This significant, somber service is based on the account of Jesus' last hours from the Gospel of Mark. Mark's narrative leads us from the Upper Room, through Jesus' arrest, his trial before Pilate and Herod, the brutal flogging, and then to Golgotha and his crucifixion. This service leads us through the darkness to the unfathomable experience of Easter Sunday.



## **NEWS FROM THE MEDICAL CENTER**

## Medicare Coverage for Vaccines

The Medical Center administers most vaccines including Influenza vaccines, Pneumonia vaccines, Comirnaty (COVID vaccine), Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis vaccine), Td (tetanus, diphtheria vaccine), Hepatitis A, B, and A+B, Shingrix (shingles vaccine), and Arexvy (RSV vaccine).

The Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 brought some good news for people with Medicare. Vaccines under Medicare prescription drug plans (Part D) are covered without co-pays since 2023.

For those with Medicare, some vaccines are covered under Medicare part B and



others are covered under Medicare Part D. Medicare B covers COVID, Influenza, Pneumonia, and Hepatitis B vaccines. Medicare Part D covers Tdap, Shingles, RSV, and Hepatitis A vaccines at retail pharmacies.

Commercial insurances cover vaccines, as well as most of the Medicare Advantage Plans (Part C) offered by private companies that contract with Medicare. These plans are inclusive of Parts A & B and usually Part D.

Medicare D previously did not cover some vaccines when given at a doctor's office unless the office utilized web-based portals for submission.

The Medical Center has acquired new software,
TransactRx, in order to verify eligibility and assist in billing
Medicare part D for vaccines.
Now, patients can receive their vaccines here at the Medical
Center instead of leaving Ocean
Reef to go to a local pharmacy.
For those who want to get their vaccines at retail pharmacies, you may still do so.





# Easter is So Early?

Blame It on the Moon!

More than once this season someone has said to me, "Why is Easter so early this year?" I knew that it had something to do with church calendars and the moon but really never had a good answer. So, with Easter on March 31st this year and April 20th in 2025, I decided to do a little googling and see what's up.

The Easter holiday, which celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ following his crucifixion, varies because

it is set to coincide with the first Sunday after the Paschal Full Moon, which is the first full moon after the vernal equinox. (Say what?) The vernal equinox is the two moments in the year when the sun is exactly above the Equator, and day and night are of equal length. In layman's terms, it's the first day of Spring. In truth, scientifically, the first day of Spring or vernal equinox also changes slightly every year, but the Old Farmer's Almanac and the Christian church recognize it as March 21.

Ok, if you're still with me, Easter is the first Sunday after the first full moon of Spring. This year that is Sunday, March 24th, so Easter is the following Sunday, March 31st. The name "Paschal" is derived from "Pascha," which is Aramaic for Passover, using our alphabet. That makes sense because the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus took

place during the Passover celebration in Jerusalem.

I'm on a roll so let's talk
Passover, too. In Judaism, it is
the festival commemorating
the Hebrews' liberation from
slavery in Egypt and the
"passing over" or sparing of
the firstborn of the Israelites
from God's judgment on
Egypt. The date of the
festival is in accordance with
the first full moon in the

Hebrew calendar month, Nissan, so the date changes with the calendar.

I applied the above logic to 2025 and found that the ecclesiastical calendar has an anomaly for 2025, therefore Easter is on the second Sunday after the full moon. And, so I remain, better informed but still confused. Happy Easter and Happy Passover.



A little after 4 p.m., the Associates who staff the Ocean Room for the evening wander into the restaurant's private dining room for their 4:15 pre-shift team meeting. Each receives friendly "hellos" upon entering. Several sit quietly reading, others exchange stories and bits of laughter, one folds dinner napkins. A few have brought a snack, and slices of cold pizza are available for the taking. There is a palpable

undercurrent of camaraderie.

They glance up at unexpected company, and I ask, "Are all of you on the Energy Bus?" Many smile as they say, "Yes!" and around the room, all heads nod in agreement – everyone is along for the ride.

**All aboard!** Author Jon Gordon's *The Energy Bus* is a business fable consisting of ten lessons that highlight the powerful roles positive

energy, mindset, and personal responsibility play in handling all the challenges that life brings. When you join others on the bus, theirs and/or yours, the result is an inspiring blend of trust, faith, enthusiasm, purpose, joy, and happiness.

When General Manager Nico DiPerna first invites Ocean Room Associates to board his Energy Bus, he acknowledges, "It can be incredibly cheesy, but it can also change your life!" And the Ocean Room team members agree instantly about the "cheesy" bit, but they also laugh as they share that "It works!"

Put another way: Imagine an icebreaker that invites you to do two things: First, greet the others in the room as if they are unimportant. After a couple minutes, continue to greet people, but now do so as if coming upon long-lost friends. Which feels better? Which feels like a place where you can achieve more? The icebreaker comes from Kenneth Blanchard, co-author of The One Minute Manager, in his foreword to The Energy Bus, and he uses it to demonstrate that positive thinking energizes.

DiPerna witnessed that when the coach of his younger brother's ice hockey team, the Florida Jr. Panthers, invited all the players to "board his bus," and they went from "meh" to state champs in a season. A year later, Nico's girlfriend was assigned *The Energy Bus* 

in preparation for a new job in the Keys, and so they listened to the audio version as they drove south. By the time he arrived at the Ocean Room, he was driving his own bus, determined to share the positive energy and lessons with his team.

Ready to work: After their 30-minute meeting ("the most important part of a restaurant's day," DiPerna notes), several Associates, including Sophie from Scotland, Kerice from Jamaica, Trinity from New Zealand, Alex from South Africa, Leandra from New Mexico, Lisa from Texas, (each new to Ocean Reef), and veteran Anna from the Philippines, stick around to share how being on the bus impacts their work and daily life: "It brings us together." "We're a tight team." "I'm far from home, but this feels like family." "This will be applicable wherever life takes me." "Riding on the bus makes me part of something."

The wheels on the bus go round and round – enjoy the ride!

The Energy Bus: You'll find this bus button on lapels in the Ocean Room, Reef Lounge, and Reef Eats. You may even receive one as a gift. It's a lovely reminder of various life lessons, beginning with "You are the driver of your bus," through the observation that positive energy is fuel, and the advice to "love your passengers," "drive with purpose," and "have fun!"





## Special Trees on Anchor Drive

How Many Can You Count?

Very special trees live among us. We see them every day, providing shade, standing mute, but full of interesting histories. I first noticed a strange tree at the entrance to the Medical Center. Looking up, I saw these grey-green balls at the ends of high branches. What are those things? They resemble tree decorations at Christmas, though dull in color. Then I began looking while cruising Anchor Drive. (I'm not driving!) Lo and behold I saw more of these trees and began counting them. Try this! You'd be amazed at how many there are just on Anchor Drive, alone. One grows at the four-way stop, across from the anchor.

Rushing home, quick to the computer, I learned these trees are Mahogany, considered one of the most luxurious and beautiful woods in the world. It's named the American, Cuban or West Indies mahogany, and is endangered in the US – much of the original American mahogany was cut by the early 1900's. Just think, the "brown" furniture you grew up with probably came from down the road! The only place in the USA where American mahogany is found is in our neck of the woods, right here in the very southern tip of Florida. The trees need just the soil we have, and just the moisture we have. It's also native to the Caribbean islands and Venezuela.

Mahogany is "the perfect"

wood for furniture craftsmen: doesn't warp, is durable, resistant to termites and moisture, and changes in temperature. Mahogany is easy to work by hand with hand tools, sands easily, turns, glues, stains, and finishes exceptionally well. As to hardness, it's between teak and cedar. A variety of mahogany is used to make string instruments, like the violin and guitar where the wood texture provides a mellow, rich sound. Some mahogany varieties are used for outdoor decking because of their water resistance. The leaves, bark, and fruit of mahoganies are all useful for medical conditions such as anemia, diabetes, cancer, malaria, and diarrhea to name a few. Mahogany wood is renowned across the world for the beauty and resilience it provides. The brownishreddish color of mahogany wood makes it unique.

another delegate's statement," said Edward. His teammate, Natalie, also looked on the bright side: "The best thing about Model UN was learning how to be more confident."



# In Pursuit of Panamanian Giants

"Fish Tales" By Mike Love

The last week of February, Ocean Reef members, **Dr. Riley Love, Guthrie Allen**, and I traveled to Panama to visit one of our old stomping grounds, Coiba Island. The island served as the country's penal colony from 1919 to 2004. My father, brother, and I actually fished there in the mid-70s while the prison was in operation at the Club Pacifico, built by Bob Griffin (but that's another story).

An early charter flight from Panama City had us landing on the grass strip on Coiba Island at approximately 8:30 a.m., and Capt. Tom Yost of Coiba Adventures picked us up in his 32' Bertram. Coiba Island is now a National Park, and a small post is manned by five men at the old prison site, who gladly helped us carry our bags to the boat area (for a small tip, of course). So, for the next four days, we decided to fish two days inshore and two days on the famous Hannibal Bank about eight miles off the coast of Coiba. The inshore fishing was amazing as we caught wahoo, roosterfish, blue trevally, barred snapper, rainbow runner, mullet snapper, bonito, crevalle jack, and of course sharks, which turned out to be Dr. Love's specialty with two white tips and a bull shark, all large specimens.

Each evening we would make the 40-mile run back to the very small fishing community of Bahia Honda, where Tom has his house with three extra bedrooms, each with its own air conditioner, as temperatures were close to 100 while we were there, and a shared bathroom. Tom uses people from the local

community to cook, serve food, mix drinks (very important), do daily laundry, fuel his boat, rig all tankers, and clean the boat. We were very comfortable in these meager surroundings.

We decided to make the 48-mile run to Hannibal Bank for our second day of fishing. We made a brief stop about halfway to load our six tuna tubes with bonita. As we arrived at the bank, there was much activity. A lot of bait was busting the surface and many birds were working the area. There were a lot of mahi-mahi there that kept hitting our bait (which were much too big for them), but we would just put out some feathers and catch more. We didn't want to bother with the mahi; we had something much larger in mind.

We only had one sail that day, but that night we decided to make the run again back to the Bank; the conditions looked good for something big to happen. The next morning, we had fished only a short while when we had a sailfish strike, but the mate backlashed the reel and it backed off. About an hour later we had another strike. The fish stayed down and never jumped. As I brought him close to the boat, I thought it was a marlin, but the captain confirmed it was a sailfish, close to 200 lbs., which we released to fight again.


The afternoon wore on with no more bites, and the captain asked if we wanted to move in closer to some rocks for more action, but we decided to stay and go for broke. We put out four live large bonita, about 5.6 lbs. each, and stayed the course. About an hour and a half later, there was a huge explosion behind the right-side bait closest to the boat. A large billfish had slashed at

the bait, then attacked. He had two things on his mind: murder and a meal. We let the line peel off for several seconds then went full drag. The fish was close to the boat when it cleared the water. It was huge, he jumped a second time as the line screamed off the reel. He was going sideways from the boat as the captain gunned the boat. It jumped a third time, but had traveled so far, so fast, that it created a huge loop in the line that threw the bait. We were disappointed, of course. I had caught a number of marlin in the area in the 400-500 lb. range, but nothing close to this one; the captain said it had to be well over 800, maybe close to 1000. I guess that's why they get so big, just darn hard to catch! What a thrill to see for even those brief moments.

# Victor Victorious & the Circle of Doom

About 25 years ago my family traveled aboard an ancient Grumman Goose flying boat from Virgin Gorda in the British Virgin Islands. We were bound for Puerto Rico.

After landing on the sound, the Grumman pilot was in a big hurry to depart because the aircraft, without a working bilge pump, was slowly taking on water and quickly approaching max takeoff weight. Victor, a boatman on an island where we lived, delivered us to the aircraft. He held our 17-foot Whaler alongside the plane while luggage and kids were tossed through the door into the cabin.


The takeoff run was alarmingly long, and the windows were mostly below sea level. The event felt more like a submarine dive than an aircraft launch. Eventually we became airborne, and the pilot banked steeply back across the waters where we spotted our island neighbor, Victoria, skimming along in her own small outboard boat.

We did not see that Victoria, a moment later, was tossed overboard by wave or wake. We later learned that she had unintentionally pulled the wheel to starboard on exiting the boat, still running, with no safety lanyard to the kill switch. Now she was in the water with her boat starting an ill-intentioned clockwise circling.

Victoria was no fool and she quickly recollected tales of unmanned boats spiraling out of control, overrunning and chewing up swimmers who were, until moments before, Captains or Commanders. She was also a strong swimmer, and she dove deep and swam far underwater until she was outside her boat's Circle of Doom.

Victor witnessed everything and soon came alongside and stopped Victoria's boat. He hauled her shaking self into his Whaler and returned all to the island. My family, oblivious to the drama, landed at San Juan in the Goose close to running out of fuel.

In 2021 the US Coast Guard mandated that operators of recreational vessels less than 26 feet in length with an engine of 3 HP or more, while planing or above displacement speed, use the installed Engine Cut-Off Switch (ECOS) link—a lanyard attached to the operator's life jacket or clothing—or an electronic "fob" link. This is mandatory.

The rule is clearly justified by Victoria's experience and by numerous fatalities and traumatic injuries caused by boats operating without a helmsman. The Coast Guard reports that a typical three-blade propeller running at 3,200 rpm can inflict 160 impacts in one second.

On the island in the BVI 25 years ago, these kill switch

devices were already installed on outboard controls. BUT WE NEVER USED THEM. In fact, lanyards were often removed, and a cable tie was cleverly installed to force the kill switch permanently into the ON position—no matter what. Island insanity!

The Coast Guard reports that unexpected entry into the water due to falling overboard, capsizing, flooding/swamping, and ejection from a vessel account for roughly two thirds of all fatal boating accidents.

Consider the wakes, the narrow channels studded with day marks and the winds and waves encountered on Ocean Reef waters. Ejection from a moving vessel is a terrifying event for anyone. A helmsman cast overboard, or away from the helm, is a huge risk for everyone.

A link to the Engine Cut Off Switch is critical safety equipment. Use it.


was a regular, 5-minute-a-day practice that kept the dog mindful of the lessons.



#### 9-Hole LGA 4 Club Scramble



My tip of the week is quite simple, don't believe everything you see on social media.

A part of my new campaign to become a professional pickleball player has been a higher involvement with social media, and while I'm not on these platforms to be a coach, there seems to be a lot of "coaches" that use social media as a resource to reach a bigger audience.

In my time on social media, I have found many "coaches" looking to share their two cents with me about what I'm doing wrong. What I have learned is that these "coaches" don't know the sport they're trying to coach at all. Now, don't get me wrong, there are some amazing coaches on these platforms who provide a number of great tips and a

lot of helpful information for learning or improving on tennis, pickleball, golf, or any other sport you may play. However, not everyone on social media is sharing accurate information.

One thing you will notice about good coaches is that they share a lot of the same information. They may interpret or teach it in a different way but the foundation and pillars of that framework are consistent with each other. Most coaches you see working at clubs and even online have years of experience playing at extremely high levels and they are able to provide insights that a lot of ordinary people may miss. However, to work at a club you must be able to demonstrate your skill as well as your ability to coach before being hired. The same can't be said for online coaches. I'm not saying don't use social media as a resource for coaching tips but definitely consult your wonderful staff on The Reef about it before implementing that information to your game. 

Fifty-seven years ago, in 1967, the Card Sound Sailing Club was organized by a group of talented sailors. A few years into racing, in the fall of 1973, the early sailors settled into choosing the venerable "Bullseye" designed by Nathanael Herreshoff as the club one-design boat for its many advantages including shallow draft, stability and symmetrical spinnaker. Each

year enthusiasm grew and before you knew it there was the establishment of 4 major four-race series (for a total of 16 individual race days) beginning in November and concluding in April. Each series has a uniqueness to it and the current Mills and Metcalf series may be the most unique. You see ALL sailors want to win and take home a winning cup or some CSSC swag! By the time March rolls around many of the same sailors have been filling their selves with cups, highball glasses or even a coveted miniature pumpkin. The Mills and Metcalf series doubles the fun and trophies. For this series, the fleet of 16 to 20 boats is divided in half. The "Bulls" (as in Bullseye boat without the "eve"), who have consistently scored in the top half, and the "Eyes" (as above missing the "bull") who have not scored as well.

This unique format makes for many smiles and twice as many stories of the skipper's winning ways! So with renewed determination, the stage was set this past Saturday for winning! PRO **Jay Beatty** with his race committee and wife, Chloe, Shirley Shumway aboard Chuck and Heather Post's MIM WHIM set the course for the three-race format. Two "safe racing" auxiliary boats patrolled the racing course and set the various marks for the upwind and downwind legs. These attendant boats were piloted and manned by Chuck Cook, Morgan Whiteley, Ken Morse, Chuck Tennent and Will Peterson.

The 3 races saw multiple back-and-forth lead changes as boats jockeyed to take advantage of wind shifts, the current and "right of way" rules of sailing. Due to the new Bulls and Eyes scoring system, the

Now that all of the Bullseye sailors are game to win, the 2nd Mills and Metcalf race #2 will take place **March 23rd**.

# Handling a Mis-Bid with Grace

Have you ever found yourself in a sticky situation after making a bid you didn't intend? Fear not, for the rules of bridge allow for a remedy! Here's a valuable tip on how to handle the disposition of a mis-bid gracefully.

In the world of bridge, once a bid is made, it's expected that players stick to their decision. However, we're all human, and sometimes errors occur, especially with the use of Bidding Boxes. If you mistakenly pull a bidding card that doesn't align with your intended bid, there's a solution at hand.

Here's the golden rule: If you realize you've made a mechanical error in your bid selection, you're entitled to correct it, but timing is key. You can replace the incorrect card with the one you intended, but only if your partner hasn't taken any action yet.

So, what do you do when you find yourself in this predicament? First and foremost, don't panic! Stay calm and collected, and without hesitation, call for the Director. They're there to ensure fair play and will guide you through the process.

By promptly addressing the situation and following the correct protocol, you not only maintain the integrity of the game but also uphold the spirit of sportsmanship. Remember, mistakes happen, but it's how we handle them that truly matters.

Next time you're faced with a mis-bid, remember this valuable tip: Stay composed, call the Director, and rectify the error if it was a mechanical mistake. With this knowledge in your arsenal, you'll navigate the bridge table with confidence and grace. Happy bidding!




