Bufo Toads & Your Pets

As we head into South Florida's hot and rainy season, when the Bufo Toads' (aka Cane Toad) mating season is at its peak, we are seeing an increase in Bufo Toad sightings.

The Bufo Toad is an invasive species that is most active during the evening hours and can be found around buildings, in yards, near canals or other bodies of water. To protect itself, the Bufo has toxins in its skin that can cause significant to life-

threatening neurological and cardiovascular symptoms in an animal that licks or picks up a toad in its mouth.

Exposure can also occur if a pet drinks from a water source where

a Bufo has rested. We recommend keeping your pet on a short leash and paying close attention to surroundings to reduce the risk of contact. Most exposures occur when pets are not being supervised. If you are not quite sure what a Bufo looks like and see a toad, it is best to assume it may be a Bufo and avoid any contact.

If there is a chance your pet has had contact with a Bufo, quickly wipe their mouth, including gums, teeth, and corners of mouth to decrease contact time. You can gently rinse your pet's mouth being careful to keep their head lowered to minimize aspirating water or unintentionally rinsing toxin further into the system. Remember, it only takes one lick of the toad's skin to cause toxicosis.

- Symptoms can include, but are not limited to:
 - Excessive drooling
 - Reddened gums
 - Loss of coordination
- Seizures
- Possible death

Veterinary care should be sought immediately as your veterinarian will assess your pet and provide supportive care based on symptoms.

A Well-Deserved Accolade

Sometimes you come across delightful "old news" that should be shared, regardless of its age. Here's an example:

The summer before the advent of COVID-19, the Federal Aviation Administration honored **Capt. Thomas Lindsay Cooper** with the Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award "in recognition of your contributions to building and maintaining the safest aviation system in the world, through practicing and promoting safe aircraft flight operations for 50 years."

In North Key Largo, he's known affectionately as "Tom" and honored as an ace not only on the flight deck of a plane, but also on the tennis, croquet, and bocce courts. When he's not in Wellington, FL, he and his wife, **Jerrie**, live aboard their boat, the T.L. Sea, in the Key Largo Anglers Club Marina, where he has been a member since 1995.

Tom's storied aviation career (about which he has written a book, *The Man in the Arena: An Aviator's Turbulent Roller*

He learned to fly at a small neighborhood airport aboard a Taylorcraft BC-12D and got his pilot's license just after turning 16. Then, while attending the University of North Carolina (where he happened to end up a walk-on letterman in baseball), he earned his commercial license and flight instructor rating, and with those credentials in hand, moved to Miami in 1957.

After instructing at a flight school for a year, Tom was hired to ferry Piper Cubs to points throughout South and Central America for use by local crop dusters, flying for hours over the Caribbean with no navigation or communications systems (some deliveries required flying from Miami over Cuba direct to Panama, a 12-hour stretch). In his book, he terms crossing the Andes between Santiago and Buenos Aires in a Super Cub, at 14,500 feet with no supplemental oxygen, "a learning experience."

Tom is full of extraordinary stories, including running out of fuel yet somehow miraculously managing a safe landing on a beach in Ecuador, and how, in the early 1960s, he served as a crewmember on cargo flights from Miami to Nicaragua in support of the infamous Bay of Pigs invasion.

His commercial career saw him pilot for Regina, Northeast, National, Continental (where, according to that airline, he was the youngest commercial B-707 pilot in the U.S. at the time), and Riddle, until he finally landed his ideal job at Eastern Airlines in 1962 and earned his captain's wings in 1973. In 1991, upon the demise of Eastern, he formed a small commuter airline with a fleet of one: a Cessna 402B; the enterprise eventually expanded into Miami-based Gulfstream International Airlines with operations throughout Florida and flights to Haiti, the Bahamas, and Havana, a place that tugs at his heartstrings. In recent years, Tom and Jerrie have often invited friends to join them on small "person to person" mission trips to Cuba to deliver supplies and gifts and to share their love for its culture and people.

30,000 hours and 50-plus years of safety, plus lots of fun stories ... there's no doubt, that Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award was well deserved!









Dry Eye Syndrome

The Medical Center's Visiting Specialist Program offers ophthalmology and optometry services with several excellent providers such as Bascom Palmer Eye Institute, Retinal Specialist Zachery Segal, M.D. of MedEye Associates, and optometry services with Lauren Nicholas, O.D. of South Florida Eye Care Center.

Dry eyes affect millions of people nationwide, worsening with age and often causing vision fluctuations, particularly during activities like reading or using a computer. Symptoms include tearing, burning, itching, and occasional or chronic eye redness, sometimes accompanied by crustiness upon waking. Though rarely sight-threatening, it can be a



persistent nuisance. Fortunately, with a deeper understanding of dry eye syndrome (DES), new treatments have emerged.





I grew up in a small town in Texas, not known for anything, other than the sign that hung across main street. That's for another time.

We met in the summer of 1968. I was smitten immediately – she not so much! We were drawn together by two shared passions – our faith and our love of music. We spent the first seven years of life together on the road, traveling in a small music group, representing a faith-based organization headquartered in Chicago. We jokingly say, "We paid rent at O'Hare!"

The cultural artifacts were the first to show up. In Texas, if you couldn't fry it, you couldn't eat it! Crisco 'shortening' was never found on the kitchen shelves of Jane's home – the white pasty version. The first time she cooked chicken, she baked it in the oven! Life Turned Around

When conflict shows up, relationships often break up. Three children and seven grandchildren later, we are both grateful we hung in there. We found growing health and strength from two sources – our faith and determination to work it out.

Like every relationship, we started off thinking how much we are alike! But over time, you realize how different you really are.

The wisdom Book of Ecclesiastes in the Hebrew Scriptures speaks about a "three-fold cord not being easily broken." We will both tell you that the strength of our relationship comes from the silver cord that the cotton strands of our lives are wrapped around. That silver cord is our relationship with God through Christ. That's where the grace comes from.

We also discovered that grace can't go where light doesn't shine. Thankfully, we had wonderful mentors who modeled a healthy marriage and gave us good advice. Then there's the value of working with skilled therapists. Therapy can't heal anyone. But the process allows light to shine on those areas of your life where change, transformation needs to take place. That's where grit is needed and the advice is worked out.

Looking Back

Like every couple, we have those places where the pain of old hurts will always be tender. But what we celebrate on this anniversary is gratitude for the goodness and joys of a life shared together over a lifetime. Another favorite singer-songwriter is Dan Fogelberg. A metaphor, a line from his song 'Longer' describes us today. It goes, "though the binding cracks, and the pages start to yellow, I am in love with you – I'll be in love with you."

The quality of the love we share today is very different from the love we knew when we first met. It has matured, like a fine wine, to be savored in sips. Maybe that's why you have anniversaries. It's a moment to look back and reflect on all that your life together has been, 'through the years.' Another line says, 'I'm so glad you've stayed.' That says it all!

We Mourn the Loss Corinne P. Greenberg

Corinne Phyllis died in Miami on March 17, 2024 from natural causes. She was 95 years old. Passionate about the power of the arts, medicine, and education to enrich the lives of so many, she was a dedicated philanthropist and volunteer who felt a profound obligation to improve the world around her. But perhaps most importantly, Corinne was a devoted wife, mother, grandmother, and greatgrandmother whose love and empathy defined the larger Greenberg family for decades.

Known to her family and friends as "Corky", Corinne believed deeply in the importance of philanthropy as a way to enhance the lives of the underprivileged. As long-time directors of The Starr Foundation, she and her husband Maurice R. Greenberg sought to support countless medical, social, and cultural institutions around the world, but particularly in New York City where she and her husband proudly resided.

The breadth and depth of her philanthropic activities were a sign of her true focus on having a tangible impact above anything else. In fact, to those who knew her closely, she was regularly self-effacing, eschewing the publicity that such charitable efforts often draw. However, there were some causes and organizations that were especially close to her heart. Corinne was Chair



of the National Board of Young Audiences/Arts-for-Learning, having started serving on their board in 1984. As a strong proponent of public education, she cherished this work because she believed in the transformative power that the performing arts can have on children from all walks of lifeshe wanted students to have as much exposure as possible to the arts because of the joy it brings and the impact it can have on the ability to learn and grow. Her contributions to culture in NYC also included her service on the boards of the 92nd Street Y and the Orchestra of St. Luke's.

Drawing on her background in and knowledge of science, Corinne recognized the paramount importance of medicine as a way of serving her city and those who sought treatment there. She was a member of several volunteer committees at New York Presbyterian-Weill Cornell Medical Center, including as a charter member of the Executive Committee of the Lying-In-Hospital in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, and as a member



of the New York Presbyterian-Weill Cornell Medical Center Council. She also served on the Executive Committee of the Iris Cantor Women's Health Center and was a founding member of the Women & Science Committee at Rockefeller University.

Corinne Greenberg, nee Zuckerman, was born in New York City on December 26, 1928, and raised in the Bronx with her brother Donald Zuckerman. Corinne possessed a special blend of vivaciousness, talent, and kindness. Her love of music was lifelong, playing both the piano and flute as a child, she graduated from the High School of Music and Art with a major in voice and later studied piano at the Manhattan School of Music. Her zest for life was also evident in her love of the outdoors. She was an avid skier and tennis player throughout her life-both family and friends fondly remember spending hours with her on the slopes and court.

Corinne was ahead of her time in several ways, particularly in her professional pursuits. She was an outstanding student and perpetually curious, embracing computers before many others did. Having graduated with a B.B.A., magna cum laude, from the University of Miami, Corinne studied systems design and computer programming at IBM, and she worked as a programmer and systems designer at Fiduciary Trust Company and The New York Hospital.

She met her husband Maurice when they were students at the University of Miami, and they married in 1950. They spent many years together in New York City, in Brewster, NY, at their home in Florida, and traveling the world. Even amid her many pursuits, her family was always her top priority. Corinne had an uncanny ability to make everyone feel special; she made sure to commemorate every family milestonebirthdays, school performances, sporting events, graduations, and more.

Corinne and her husband were the first buyers at Ocean Reef's Sanctuary Condo and her input greatly enhanced the project. Her philanthropic support of the Cultural Center, Medical Center, Academy and the donation of Greenberg Park will leave a lasting legacy at Ocean Reef.

Corinne is survived by her husband Maurice; her brother Donald; her children Jeffrey, Evan, Scott, and Cathleen; her grandchildren Caroline, Elizabeth, Matthew, Jacob, Ben, Annabel, Noah, Julia, Alleta, and Ana; and six greatgrandchildren.



A Eye-Opening Visit to Israel

I recently returned from a 3-day trip to Israel, which began at the Tel Aviv airport. The typically vibrant terminal was eerily quiet. Pictures of hostages lined the corridors.

Our first stop was hostage square, where we met family members of Israelis held hostage by Hamas. The families provided emotional stories about their loved ones being kidnapped and not knowing whether they were alive. The hostage families had one agenda -- the return of their family members. The war strategy was secondary to the goals of the families. This visit highlighted the impossible position Israeli leaders are in. The goals of destruction of the tunnels in Gaza and saving the hostages who are likely being held in these tunnels are plainly at odds with one another.

Our next day started with a visit to a makeshift kindergarten class in an old storage facility. The students were displaced from the Gaza border to the south and the Lebanese border to the north. These families (200,000 Israel citizens) were forced to leave their homes with no plan of return. Communities throughout Israel are making sacrifices to care for others who have been displaced.

We arrived at the Sheeba hospital. The director of the rehabilitation facility described the daily onslaught of patients injured in the war. We met with soldiers whose lives were permanently impacted by the war. We saw soldiers with missing limbs. One young man had large casts on both arms and his hands were mangled from holding a door for hours as he fought with terrorists attempting to harm his family. An area of the hospital was reserved for returned



women hostages who were impregnated by their captors in Gaza.

That night we had dinner with an Israeli family on a kibbutz in the middle of the country. The family I had dinner with had many children and grandchildren living in this kibbutz that their parents had settled decades before. The residents of this kibbutz had taken in families from the north and south who had been affected by the events of October 7. It was uplifting to see Israelis helping one another.

The next day we met with the spokesman for the Israeli government. He regularly appears on CNN, FOX, BBC and other news outlets. He told us about being introduced to the daughter of a friend. His friend explained to the daughter that their guest was an important man. The daughter, a woman in her early 20s, told the guest he was "irrelevant." Her father was mortified at this insult, but she explained by saying people under 30 do not get their news from CNN or similar outlets but from TikTok.

The last day began with a bus ride to the Gaza border. We arrived at Kibbutz Be'Eri., a community that had hundreds of families. Gaza was easily visible in the distance. This is where the massacre started. Despite wearing bulletproof vests, we were told not to worry about hearing bombing because the bombs we would

hear were going from Israel into Gaza. The bomb sounds continued as we toured the kibbutz. At one point an air raid siren sounded and we were told to run to a shelter. That was a moment I longed for the comfort of the Dolphin Course and Fitness Center.

Our guide at the kibbutz was a resident who was there with his family the morning of the invasion. He described in detail the events of October 7, explaining the terrorists looked for homes where there were tricycles and basketball hoops so they could kill as many children as possible. He took us to his in-law's home where his children played every day and described how the terrorists shot his in-laws in the head and killed them. We went to the dentist's office on the kibbutz and saw the bullet holes and pictures of

patients killed there. Over 100 people were killed and many were taken hostage from this kibbutz.

Seeing pictures of a war zone and being in one are two very different things. These families will never return to what was once their peaceful world. The communal areas where the kids did ballet, theatre and played no longer exist. We were told the massacre started at 6:30 a.m. and the Israeli military did not arrive until around 9:30 a.m. - 3 hours of sheer terror for hundreds of families. We saw homes destroyed by gunfire and grenades and others where fire was set in order to burn the residents inside alive.

We then traveled to the site of the Nova music festival. The festival began Friday night October 6 and was A Eye-Opening Visit to Israel

still going on at 6:30 a.m. October 7 when the terrorists arrived. Approximately 400 concertgoers were killed and 40 or so taken hostage. The concert site is now a memorial with their pictures.

We then went to another nearby area where many people in this quiet neighborhood were killed. We met one woman who described her husband answering a knock on the door. He was dragged by terrorists into their small courtyard and shot in the head. While he lay bleeding, the woman took her three children into a safe room where they remained for 19 hours. During this time, they heard terrorists walking on the roof of their home. She was too frightened and focused on saving her children to try and rescue her husband.

At last we headed back toward Tel Aviv. The people living in Israel were profoundly appreciative of our visit. The Israelis we met felt isolated, betrayed and confused at how the world could not side with them in light of the horrors of October 7.

In the end the simple answer to why we came is that just showing up matters. It mattered for Israeli citizens to feel they weren't completely alone. That people come from other parts of the world to bear witness to what really happened October 7.

I learned of a Palestinian who lives in Gaza with his family. Before October 7, he would come to Israel daily to work in a hotel. This man explained he can no longer enter Israel. He has lost his job. His ability to earn money and provide for his family is destroyed. He despises Hamas because he says they have ruined his life. While I am sure not every resident of Gaza feels the way this man does, some do, and they cannot and do not speak out.

I have lots of takeaways from this trip – one being there is no compromise with Hamas. They have no desire to live side by side in peace with Israel. There is a fundamental question whether Israel has the right to exist as a country pursuant to the United Nations vote in 1948. Israel says yes. Hamas (and its benefactor Iran) savs no. There is no grey area on that issue. Hamas chose to spend hundreds of millions of dollars in aid money to build tunnels for war. Israel knows it is creating a generation of potential terrorists by its actions but is willing to trade that for destroying a group committed to its destruction. Whether Israel will succeed is unknown, but it was transformational to witness this firsthand.


Who Turned Off the Light?

Eclipses – what happens in a total solar eclipse? The moon crosses right in front of the sun casting a shadow on the Earth - darker than anything humans can create.

Florida residents should start to see our partial eclipse on Monday, April 8, beginning around 1:35 p.m. with the midpoint at 2:55 p.m. We at Ocean Reef will see the light dimming 40-50%, meaning it won't be totally dark where we are. Even so ... WARNING - wear your solar glasses! Wearing regular sunglasses or makeshift filters can cause



retinal damage. The retina has no sensitivity to pain. Since the effects of retinal damage may not appear for hours, there is no warning that an injury to your eye has occurred. Protect those precious eyes of yours. IMPORTANT: anticipating taking photos on your phone? First, go to "Solar Snap Eclipse App." YouTube videos are also useful.

Back to the science.... Why doesn't an eclipse happen every year? Because the moon and Earth orbits are rotating at different angles – they're wonky. It's comparable to getting the family together for Easter... each family member has their own activity orbit and timing of that orbit, and trying to get family members aligned happens only occasionally!

Other than degrees of darkness, what happens on Earth during a solar eclipse? From folks like us, lots of ooh's and aah's are heard! For scientists, it gives a rare opportunity to observe the sun's corona in exquisite detail. The corona is the sun's outer most ring, which (lucky for us) is now in the active part of its elevenyear cycle. (I know, you knew that!) On the Sun's surface giant blobs of magnetized plasma erupt from sunspots shooting this plasma into the corona. Corona flares cause larger than normal amounts of energy to zap our ionosphere (30-60 miles up) says NASA, causing electronic signal fading, affecting shortwave and satellite communication systems. That includes radio (might fade in and out)– not internet and not GPS. The Aurora Borealis will be fantastic.

Bugs and animals are also affected by a total eclipse - total darkness. AudioMoths (tiny microphones widely distributed to individuals) will listen for the changing noises of animals and insects. Crickets think it's night and begin chirping in search of a mate. Birds quiet for twilight, nocturnal owls and bats begin to awake. Critters will think it's a short night! Just 2-4 minutes of total darkness!

The next total eclipse in the US is in 2044. Enjoy this one!





How to Cook a Wahoo?

Unlike so many households in Ocean Reef who have anglers bring home dinner, the flats fisherman doesn't get much practice cooking fish. When we recently had a visitor, who was eager to catch anything with scales, it gave rise to lengthy discussions of not only how to lure and land the fish but also how to prepare and enjoy them. It occurred to me that there are as many ways to cook a fish as there are ways to catch it... Fresh fish is so good all by itself that you don't need to do much to make it edible. With a sheet pan and a 400-degree oven, you can handle just about any fish. What varies is the flavoring that you use to primarily keep the fish moist while it's cooking, but also to give a little extra something to sop up with bread, rice, or potatoes.

One approach is to coat the fish in a creamy coating based on mayonnaise, mixed with a variety of flavorings. Add honey mustard, thyme and red wine vinegar for a Provencal touch. Or add chili sauce, lemon juice, and capers for a spicy taste. Look at those little bottles of condiment that collect in your refrigerator and experiment — barbeque sauce! pickled olives! peach jam? Mix up your concoction and smear it on the skinless side after salt and peppering the fish. Or take an oilbased approach, where the fish is placed in a shallow pool of briny, gingery oil, layered with lemon slices, olives, capers, and grated ginger on top (or anchovies and garlic, or whatever inspires). Alternatively, go in the coconut milk, ginger, turmeric, soy and garlic direction, making a brighttasting Asian-style marinade.

I know these instructions are vague, but believe me, you can't go wrong with any mix that has some fat, some acid, sweet, and hot spice flavorings. Throw in a handful of cherry tomatoes, pieces of scallions, or parboiled cauliflower-ettes, or anything that you like that will cook (or finish cooking) in the same time as the fish.

Bake until barely done —

10 to 20 minutes, depending on the thickness of the cut. Whole fish take longer than those cut into portions. The fish will continue to cook after you take it out of the oven, so err on the underdone side — you can always put it back in the oven for another two minutes! The signs of "doneness" are when the juices leaking out are opaque white, and a touch reveals a solidarity in the flesh.

Don't forget to garnish your fish after cooking — a sprinkling of fresh herbs, just some parsley or dill, or a mix with mint and chives or anything green — or a crunch of toasted bread crumbs or chopped walnuts will add texture and finish. Serve with the rice or bread that will help soak up those flavorful juices, maybe a green salad and a glass of Sancerre...



Bob Schwartz: Six-Time **Fitness Club Champion**

Tell us about your history with fitness and sports: I was never a sports person. In grade school and high school, I was more interested in other things, such as girls, go-carts, ice boats, bicycles, model planes, boats, cars, and girls.

The first time I saw the inside

of a gym was after we moved to Ocean Reef when I was in my 50s. My first exposure to the gym was a core class. And after that, I started doing workouts a couple of times a week with a trainer. The longer I went to the gym, the more I could see the benefits, and the better I felt. I currently take no medications (just some supplements and vitamins) and have the same blood pressure as I did in my 20s.

What got you interested in doing the challenges? Smoothies! I still remember my first challenge. Beth Bielat, my trainer, said if I did a plank for a certain amount of time, I would get a free smoothie. As I was planking, I was about to give up when she whispered in my ear, "A girl just did 7 minutes". So, I went for 7+ minutes, and again before stopping, I asked her how long she could hold a plank. She said 10 minutes, so I went 10 min

and 10 seconds. I guess I just like to test my limits. So that's how "The Plankster" got started.

The challenges provide me with extra motivation and I like to see if I can continue to improve my scores by comparing the prior year's results. My goal is to improve year to year for as long as I can....although it's not getting any easier!

What is your weekly fitness routine?

I currently go to the gym 3 hours per week with a trainer. Up until a few years ago, I would also do a cycle or core class twice a week. While at the gym, I try to work out as hard as I can, which gives me some added cardio benefits. I occasionally like to use the new Electro Stimulation machine, as it seems to also work those little muscles that try to avoid my normal workouts. I also walk 2 miles a day minimum and I try to walk to destinations around The Reef whenever practical.

My summer workouts are pretty wimpy, as where we go in the summer, and when we travel, trainers are not available, and I have a tough time selfmotivating. My summertime goal is just to minimize the losses on my ORC winter gains. We have a home gym and when traveling, I use the TRX strap system. However, my summer workouts are not anywhere near the intensity of the ORC sessions. That's why I appreciate all the great trainers at the Fitness Center. They provide motivation, variety, and encouragement!

What advice do you have for fellow Members who want to get in shape and be healthy?

Just do it! When I first started core classes, I soon realized that kept me from having back spasms, which had plagued me most of my life. The time spent in core classes was less time than I would spend on the floor during the spasms, and a lot less painful. I've told many friends and relatives with back issues this, and it seems that they only try the "exercise cure" as a last resort, rather than as a first option.






